RUDY SLIPS TO THIRD IN NH

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DURHAM, NH – Mitt Romney continues to lead the Republican field in New Hampshire. John McCain has regained some of the ground he had lost over the summer and now is ahead of Rudy Giuliani. However, more than half of Republican voters have yet to decide who they will eventually vote for.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll*** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred four (404) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between November 14 and November 18, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 4.9%.

Republican Primary

Former Massachusetts governor Mitt Romney continues to hold a double digit lead over his nearest Republican rival in New Hampshire, but John McCain has moved ahead of Rudy Giuliani for the second spot. Currently, 33% of likely Republican primary voters say they will vote for Romney, 18% say they will vote for McCain, 16% say they will vote for Giuliani, 8% back Texas Congressman Ron Paul, 5% prefer former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee, 4% favor former Tennessee Senator and actor Fred Thompson, while other candidates, including California Congressman Duncan Hunter and Colorado Congressman Tom Tancredo combine for 2% and 14% say they are undecided.

Support for Romney had dipped in September, but it is back to the levels seen over the summer. McCain continues to rebound after a shaky spring and summer moving up to 18%. But of greatest interest is Giuliani's slide, from 29% in April to 24% in September and down to 16% in the latest CNN / WMUR poll.

"Giuliani has not campaigned in New Hampshire with the intensity of either Romney or McCain," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. "To win in New Hampshire, you have to engage in grass roots campaigning. Both Romney and McCain made strategic decisions to concentrate on early states and to spend a lot of time in New Hampshire. Giuliani decided to run a much more national campaign. As of now, Romney and McCain are benefiting from their decision to focus on New Hampshire."

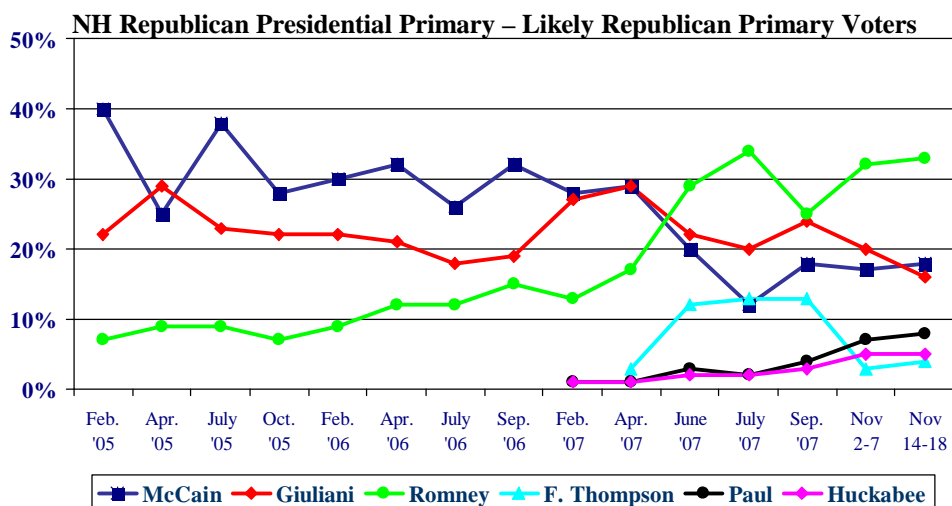
Paul, after his remarkable fundraising success, has slowly been building support in New Hampshire and is now in fourth spot. Huckabee is having a more difficult time in New Hampshire than in Iowa, where he places second, as New Hampshire is largely devoid of social conservative Republican voters.

It is critical to remember that this poll reflects current levels of support and that the race could change dramatically in the coming weeks. Only 14% of likely Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 29% say they are leaning toward a candidate, and 57% say they are still trying to decide who to support.

When asked about candidates they would consider voting for, Paul is the least popular Republican – 61% of likely Republican primary voters say they would not consider voting for Paul under any circumstance, 49% say they would not consider voting for Thompson, 29% say they would not vote for McCain, 28% would not vote for Giuliani, and only 19% say they would not vote for Romney under any circumstances.

Romney is also seen by New Hampshire Republicans as the candidate most likely to win the Republican nomination – 39% think Romney will win the nomination, 26% believe it will be Giuliani, and 8% think it will be McCain.

New Hampshire Republicans are not very enthusiastic about the upcoming presidential election – only 46% say they are more enthusiastic than usual, 29% are less enthusiastic, and 16% are about as enthusiastic as usual. By comparison, two-thirds of likely Democratic primary voters say they are more enthusiastic about this presidential election than usual.

Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary, but two-thirds now say they plan to vote in the Democratic primary. Currently, Romney holds the lead among undeclared voters with 38%, 20% prefer Giuliani, 15% for McCain, 15% for Paul, and 5% for Huckabee.

Issues

The most important issue that likely Republican primary voters believe candidates should be focusing on are the war in Iraq (22%), illegal immigration (16%), the economy (12%), homeland security (12%), and health care (8%). There have been few changes in what voters have seen as important issues over the past several months.

When asked which candidates would do the best job handling issues, Romney is viewed as the candidate who can do the best job handling domestic issues. Almost half of likely Republican primary voters (47%) say that Romney would do the best job handling the economy followed by Giuliani (15%) and McCain (9%). Similarly, Romney is viewed as the candidate who would do the best job handling taxes, mentioned by 43%, followed by Giuliani (13%) and McCain (11%). And Romney is named by 40% as the candidate who would do the best job handling illegal immigration followed by Giuliani (14%) and McCain (13%). Voters are unsure about who is best able to handle abortion with 40% saying they don't know, 21% naming Romney, 12% naming Giuliani, and 7% naming Huckabee.

Republicans are more split over international issues. Giuliani is named as the candidate best able to handle terrorism by 33% of likely Republican primary voters, but almost as many, 31%, name McCain and only 13% name Romney. Forty-two percent think that McCain is best able to handle the war in Iraq followed by Romney (15%) and Giuliani (13%).

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Four hundred-four (404) likely 2008 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 4.9%) were interviewed between November 14 and November 18, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
