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ROMNEY PULLS AHEAD IN NH, IRAQ & IMMIGRATION MOST IMPORTANT GOP ISSUES

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DURHAM, NH – Mitt Romney has pulled ahead of John McCain and Rudy Giuliani among New Hampshire Republicans in the race for the GOP nomination. The most important issues on the minds of Republican voters are the war in Iraq and illegal immigration.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred four (304) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Republican primary voters were interviewed by telephone between June 6 and June 11, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5.6%.

Republican Primary

After the first big event in the New Hampshire primary calendar, the CNN, WMUR, Union Leader debate, former Massachusetts governor Mitt Romney has pulled ahead of his Republican challengers. Arizona Senator John McCain and former New York Mayor Rudy Giuliani had been leading the Republican field for the last several months, but Romney has pulled into the lead. Currently, 28% of Republicans say they will vote for Romney, 20% will vote for Giuliani, and 20% say they support McCain. “Romney has been on TV for the last month and these ads are paying off,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center.

Former Tennessee Senator Fred Thompson recently announced he plans on entering the race and already has the support of 11% of likely Republican primary voters. While many observers believed that Thompson would take support from Romney, he appears to hurt McCain and Giuliani. Support for Romney has increased from 17% in April to 28% in June, while support for both Giuliani and McCain has dropped from 29% to 20%.

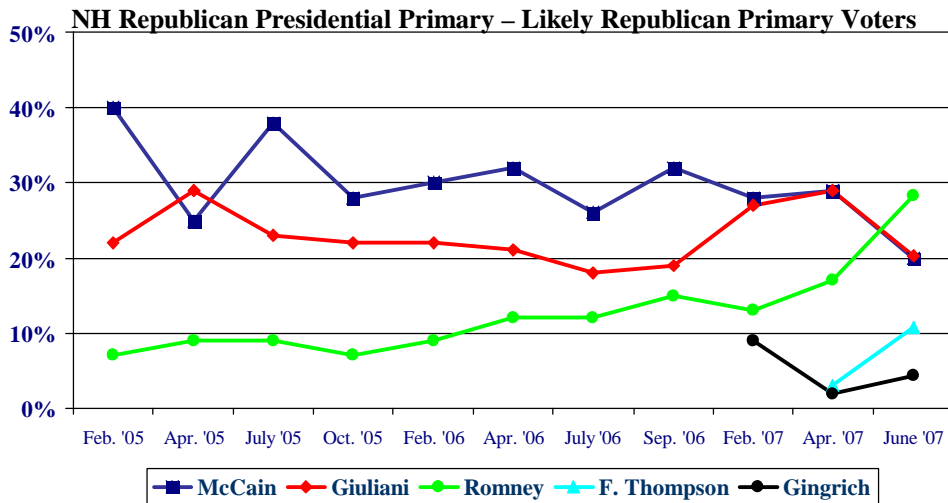
Among other Republican contenders, former Speaker of the House Newt Gingrich is supported by 4% of likely Republican primary voters followed by Texas Congressman Ron Paul (3%), Kansas Senator Sam Brownback (2%), and former Arkansas Governor Mike Huckabee (2%). None of the other Republican challengers gets even 1% support from potential voters and 8% are undecided.

Romney has improved his position in the race by getting the support of conservative Republicans. Romney is currently supported by 34% of self identified conservatives, compared to 17% for Giuliani and 15% for McCain, and 13% for Thompson. Romney also does well among older voters, Catholics, regular church goers, and residents of greater Manchester.

Giuliani does best among young voters (under 35) and non-religious voters. McCain does best among moderates and residents of northern New Hampshire.

When Newt Gingrich is dropped, there is little overall change in the race – Romney still leads (29%), followed by Giuliani (22%), McCain (20%), and Fred Thompson (12%).

It is important to note that the Republican race is far from over. When asked how sure they are in their support, only 6% of likely Republican primary voters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for, 37% say they are leaning toward voting for a candidate, while 57% say they have no idea who they will end up voting for.



New Hampshire Debates

Republican voters are less interested in the campaign than are Democrats – 34% say they are extremely interested, 40% are somewhat interested, and 26% are somewhat or not very interested. When asked about last week’s debates, 13% of likely Republican primary voters said they watched all of the debate, 9% said they watched most of the debate, 31% said they watched at least some of the debate, 28% said they didn’t watch the debate, but they read or heard coverage of the debate, and 19% said they neither saw the debate or coverage of the debate.

Of those voters who said they watched part or all of the debate, 26% support Romney, 24% support Giuliani, 17% support McCain, 14% support Fred Thompson, 10% support some other candidate, and 8% are undecided. Among voters who did not watch the debate, Romney is supported by 31%, followed by McCain (23%), Giuliani (16%), Thompson (7%), some other candidate (16%), while 8% are undecided.

Candidate Qualities

Likely Republican primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Republican candidates. Romney is leading the field, in part, because he is perceived as being the most likeable candidate. When asked which candidate is most likeable, Romney is named by 32% followed by Giuliani (28%), McCain (12%), and Thompson (10%).

McCain is still perceived as the candidate most willing to deliver “straight talk”, but this is not yet translating into votes. Republicans believe McCain is most believable (27%), followed by Giuliani (21%), Romney (19%), and Thompson (6%). They also believe he is most willing to take an unpopular position on an issue if he thinks it is right, named by 36%, followed by Romney (16%), Giuliani (16%), and Thompson (5%).

Republicans are divided over which candidate is the strongest leader with 26% naming Giuliani, 26% naming McCain, and 25% naming Romney. Republicans think Giuliani is best able to win in November 2008, named by 31% followed by Romney (25%), McCain (14%), and Thompson (6%).

Issues

The most important issue in the 2008 Presidential election to New Hampshire Republicans is the war in Iraq, named by 36%, followed by illegal immigration (11%), the economy (9%), health care (8%), homeland security (7%), and foreign policy (3%). When asked what the three most important issues are, 59% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by illegal immigration (36%), the economy (32%), health care (29%), homeland security (16%), and foreign policy (9%).

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred four (304) likely 2008 Republican Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.3%) were interviewed between June 6 and June 11, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
