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CLINTON BUILDS ON DEBATE PERFORMANCE, SEEN AS STRONGEST LEADER

DURHAM, NH – Following the first major debates in New Hampshire, Hillary Clinton has solidified her position as the frontrunner in the Democratic nomination for President. However, most voters are far from deciding on which candidate they will finally vote for. The war in Iraq continues to dominate as the major issue among Democratic primary voters.

These findings are based on the latest **CNN / WMUR New Hampshire Primary Poll** conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred nine (309) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between June 6 and June 10, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5.6%.

Democratic Primary

New York Senator Hillary Clinton has led the field of potential Democratic candidates among likely New Hampshire Democratic Primary voters for more than two years and has solidified her position in recent weeks. The first time New Hampshire Democrats had the chance to see the candidates together occurred last week when CNN, WMUR, and the Union Leader hosted debates in Manchester. In the wake of the debates, Clinton has increased her lead over Illinois Senator Barack Obama and former North Carolina Senator John Edwards. New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson is emerging from the pack. “Richardson has been showing some very funny, but informative ads in New Hampshire and these, along with his debate performance, seem to be resonating among Democratic voters,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center.

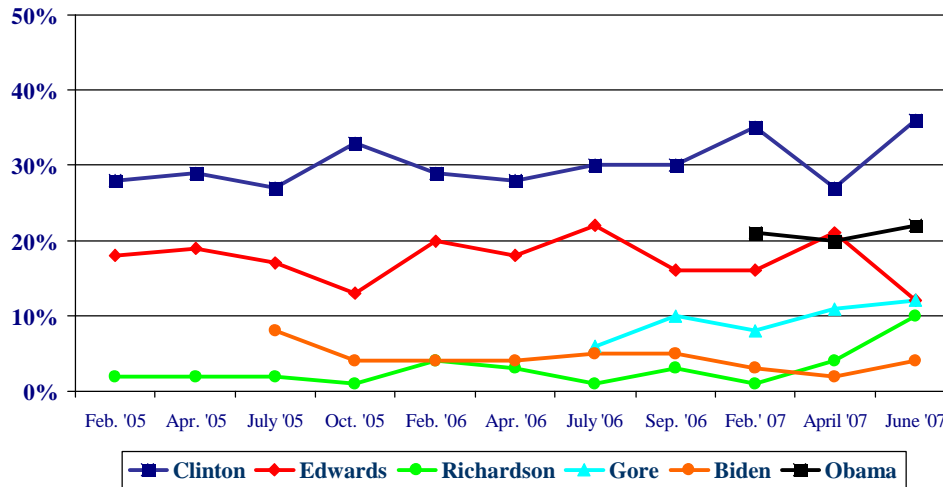
Clinton currently has the support of 36% of likely Democratic Primary voters followed by Obama (22%), Edwards (12%) former Vice President Al Gore (12%), Bill Richardson (10%), Delaware Senator Joe Biden (4%), Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich (1%), some other candidate (2%), and only 1% are undecided. When Gore is dropped from the race, there is little change in the overall race dynamic – Clinton still leads (39%), followed by Obama (24%), Edwards (14%), and Richardson (11%).

Clinton has been the front-runner in New Hampshire and across the country frontrunner. After a dip to 27% in April, her support in New Hampshire is back to the mid-30s, where it has been over the past two years. She gets her strongest support from women and voters living in greater Manchester and in the North Country.

Obama was not able to narrow the gap with Clinton in the wake of the New Hampshire debate. He has had the support of one in five voters since February. Obama’s strongest support comes from liberals, young voters, and voters with post-graduate educations.

Support for Edwards has decreased sharply 21% in April to 12%. He is now tied with Gore and just ahead of Richardson, who was at 4% in April.

Undeclared Voters

Undeclared voters, often referred to as Independents, can vote in either the Democratic or Republican primary. Among those undeclared voters who say they will vote in the Democratic primary election, Clinton holds a narrow lead over Obama – 32% to 28%, with 13% favoring Richardson, 12% supporting Gore, and 11% supporting Edwards. In April, Clinton, Obama and Edwards were essentially tied among undeclared voters.

New Hampshire Debates

Democratic voters are very interested in the campaign – 39% say they are extremely interested, 42% are somewhat interested, and 19% are somewhat or not very interested. Another indication of voter interest is that 75% of likely Democratic primary voters say they will definitely vote in the primary election, 17% say they will vote unless there is an emergency, and 8% say they may vote. When asked about last week’s debates, 19% said they watched all of the debate, 12% said they watched most of the debate, 26% said they watched at least some of the debate, 25% said they didn’t watch the debate, but they read or heard coverage of the debate, and only 18% said they neither saw the debate or coverage of the debate.

Of those voters who said they watched part or all of the debate, 38% say they will vote for Clinton, 19% support Obama, 12% support Richardson, 12% support Gore, 10% support Edwards, and 10% support some other candidate. Among voters who did not watch the debate, Clinton is supported by 33%, followed by Obama (26%), Edwards (15%), Gore (13%), Richardson (7%), some other candidate (5%), while 1% are undecided.

Candidate Qualities

Likely Democratic primary voters were asked several questions about characteristics of the Democratic candidates. Clinton is leading the field, in part, because she is perceived as being the strongest leader and having the best chance of defeating the Republican candidate in the 2008 general election. When asked which candidate is the strongest leader, 48% name Clinton followed by Gore (12%), Obama (12%), Edwards (6%), Biden (6%), Richardson (4%), while 12% are unsure. And when asked which candidate has the best chance of defeating the Republican candidate, 37% name Clinton followed by Obama (15%), Gore (12%), Edwards (10%), Biden (3%), Richardson (3%), some other candidate (1%), while 20% are unsure.

Obama is seen as the more likeable and believable candidate, an area that Clinton is vulnerable. Forty percent of likely Democratic primary voters say Obama is the most likable candidate followed by Edwards (20%), Clinton (14%), Gore (9%), Richardson (6%), Biden (2%), some other candidate (2%), and 8% are unsure. When asked which candidate is most believable, Obama is named by 25% followed by Clinton (20%), Edwards (14%), Gore (10%), Richardson (10%), Kucinich (5%), Biden (4%), Dodd (2%), and 11% are unsure.

Voters are divided as to which candidate is most willing to take an unpopular position on an issue – 20% name Clinton, followed by Obama (18%), Kucinich (12%), Edwards (10%), Biden (8%), Gore (8%), Richardson (5%), Dodd (2%), some other candidate (3%) and 15% are unsure.

Issues

By far the most important issue to New Hampshire Democrats in the 2008 Presidential election is the war in Iraq, named by 57%, followed by health care (8%), the economy (8%), and foreign policy (5%). When asked what the three most important issues are, 76% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by health care (53%), the economy (31%), Social Security (17%), and foreign policy (15%). The percentage naming the war in Iraq as the most important issue in the campaign increased from 39% in April.

CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest CNN / WMUR NH Primary Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Three hundred nine (309) likely 2008 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.6%) were interviewed between June 6 and June 10, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of voters and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
