## CLINTON FALTERS, BUT STILL LEADS AMONG NH DEMOCRATS. EDWARDS MOVES UP

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DURHAM, NH – Hillary Clinton remains the frontrunner among candidates in New Hampshire for the Democratic nomination for President. John Edwards' popularity has increased over the past two months and he has edged ahead of Barack Obama.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,<sup>?</sup> conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by CNN and WMUR-TV, Manchester. Three hundred thirty-nine (339) randomly selected likely New Hampshire Democratic primary voters were interviewed by telephone between March 27 and April 2, 2007. The margin of sampling error is +/- 5.3%.

### Democratic Primary

New York Senator Hillary Clinton has consistently led the field of potential Democratic candidates and continues to in the latest Granite State Poll. However, the percentage of likely voters who say they support Clinton has declined since February. Clinton currently has the support of 27% of likely Democratic Primary voters followed by former North Carolina Senator John Edwards (21%), Illinois Senator Barack Obama (20%), former Vice President Al Gore (11%), New Mexico Governor Bill Richardson (4%), Delaware Senator Joe Biden (2%), Connecticut Senator Chris Dodd (1%), Ohio Congressman Dennis Kucinich (1%), some other candidate (1%), and 12% are undecided.

While Clinton has hovered near 30% for the past two years and remains the frontrunner, her support has dropped considerably since February when 35% of likely Democratic Primary voters said they would vote for her. She gets her strongest support from voters with lower levels of education.

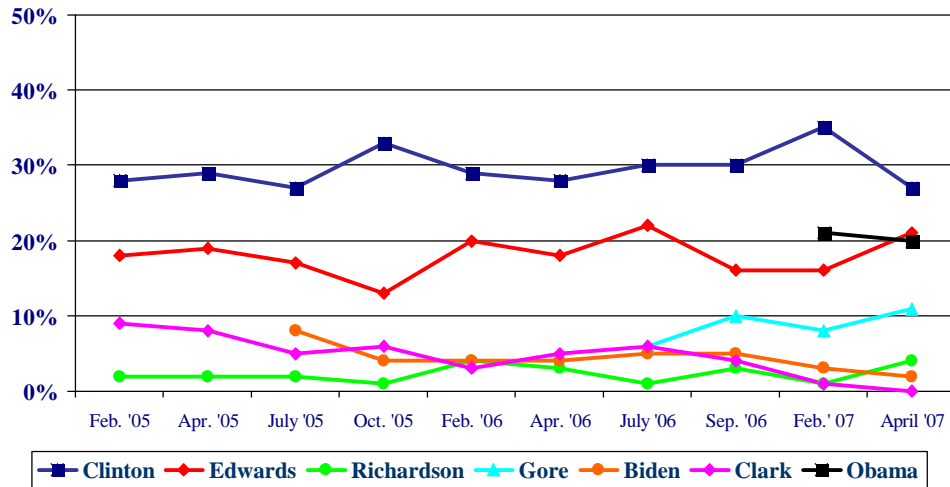
Support for Edwards has increased 5 percentage points since February, from 16% to 21%. Support for Edwards is consistent among all groups of voters. Obama has maintained his level of support among Democrats, evidence that voters believe he is a candidate that needs to be taken seriously. Like Edwards, support for Obama is consistent across demographic groups.

Edwards has received a boost in his position in New Hampshire in part because of the publicity he has received in the wake of the announcement that his wife, Elizabeth, has had a recurrence of cancer. Likely Democratic Primary voters were asked what impact the announcement his wife had cancer had on their opinion of Edwards and 6% say they have a more favorable opinion of Edwards after the announcement, 8% have a less favorable opinion, 85% say it makes no difference and 2% say they don't know. And only 14% say that Edwards should drop out of the race because of his wife's cancer, 69% say he should stay in the race, and 18% say they don't know.

### Democratic Favorability Ratings

The best known and most popular candidates in the Democratic primary are Edwards, Obama, and Clinton. Edwards has the highest favorability rating of any of the Democratic candidates – 80% of likely Democratic Primary voters have a favorable opinion of him, 8% have an unfavorable opinion, 7% are neutral and 4% don't know enough about him to say. His net favorability rating is +72%, up from +61% in February. Edwards has high favorability ratings across all demographic groups.

Obama is viewed favorably by 69% of likely Democratic primary voters, 10% view him unfavorably, 11% are neutral and 10% don't know enough about him to say. Obama's net favorability rating is +59%, up from +55% in February. He has wide support and is viewed most favorably by voters with high levels of income and education, young voters and voters who recently moved to New Hampshire. His lowest favorability ratings come from voters with lower levels of education and income.

Clinton is also popular, but her unfavorables have risen in recent months. Currently, 64% of likely Democratic primary voters have a favorable opinion of Clinton, 24% have an unfavorable opinion, 10% are neutral, and 2% don't know enough about her to say. Her net favorability rating is +40%, a significant drop from +59% in February. Clinton has wide support but is viewed least favorably by independents, those with some college, and residents of northern New Hampshire.

Although he has not declared his candidacy, Gore is viewed favorably by 69% of likely Democratic voters, 21% view him unfavorably, 9% are neutral, and 2% don't know enough about him to say. Gore's net favorability rating is +48%, up from 37% in February.

And though he has made several visits to New Hampshire, Richardson is largely unknown to Democratic primary voters – only 27% have a favorable opinion of him, 12% have an unfavorable opinion, 14% are neutral, and 47% don't know enough about him to say. Richardson's net favorability rating is +15%, up from +9% in February.

Reverend Al Sharpton is the least popular of potential Democratic candidates – only 14% of likely Democratic primary voters have a favorable opinion of him, 62% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 14% are neutral, and 10% don't know enough about him to say. Sharpton's net favorability rating is a very low -48%, down from -43% in February.

Retired General Wes Clark ran for President in 2004 but has not maintained his popularity among New Hampshire Democrats – 34% have a favorable opinion of Clark, 29% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 13% are neutral, and 24% don't know enough about him to say. Clark's net favorability rating is only +5%, down from +8% in February.

Biden has been unable to catch on in New Hampshire – only 30% of likely Democratic primary voters have a favorable opinion of him, 27% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 15% are neutral, and 28% don't know enough about him to say. Biden's net favorability rating is only +3%, essentially unchanged from +4% in February.

Dodd is still largely unknown among New Hampshire Democrats – only 21% of likely Democratic primary voters have a

favorable opinion of Dodd, 25% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 16% are neutral, and 37% don't know enough about him to say. Dodd's net favorability rating is -4%, down from +2% in February.

Kucinich is not viewed favorably by Democrats – 22% have a favorable opinion of him, 30% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 13% are neutral, and 36% don't know enough about him to say. Kucinich's net favorability rating is -8%, unchanged from -7% in February.

Former Alaska Senator Mike Gravel is the least known Democratic candidate – only 3% of likely Democratic primary voters have a favorable opinion of Gravel, 14% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11% are neutral, and 71% don't know enough about him to say. Gravel's net favorability rating is -10%, unchanged since February.

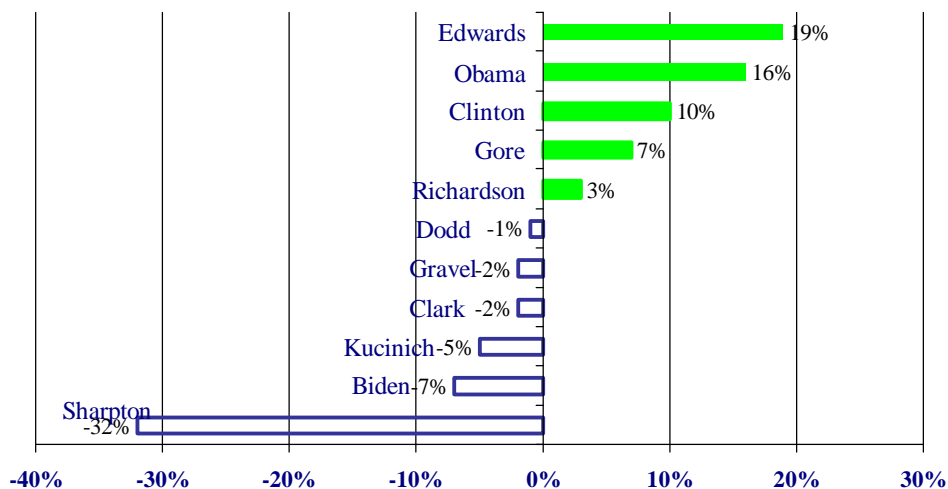
### Least Popular Democratic Candidate

Likely Democratic Primary voters were also asked which candidate they liked the least. Sharpton is least liked of the potential Democratic candidates, named by 32%, followed by Clinton (17%), Biden (9%), Kucinich (6%), Gore (4%), Obama (4%), Clark (3%), Dodd, (2%), Edwards (2%), some other candidate (2%), and 20% don't know.

The percentage of Democrats who named Clinton as the candidate they liked least increased from 9% in February to 17% now. This increase in her unpopularity mirrors the increase in the percentage of Democrats who say they have an unfavorable opinion of Clinton.

A summary measure of popularity can be constructed by subtracting the percentage who dislike a particular candidate from the percentage who say they plan to vote for that candidate. On this measure of net popularity, Edwards is the most popular Democratic candidate with +19%, followed by Obama (+16%), Clinton (+10%), Gore (+7%), and Richardson (+3%). The least popular potential Democratic candidates among likely Democratic Primary voters are Sharpton (-32%), Biden (-7%), Kucinich (-5%), Clark (-2%), Gravel (-2%), and Dodd (-1%).

### Issues

The most important issue to New Hampshire Democrats in the 2008 Presidential election is the war in Iraq, named by 39%, followed by health care (21%), the economy (10%), and foreign policy (7%). When asked what the three most important issues are, 65% said that the war in Iraq is one of the three most important issues, followed by health care (46%), the economy (39%), education (18%), and foreign policy (15%).

### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by CNN and WMUR-TV, Manchester. Three hundred thirty-nine (339) likely 2008 Democratic Primary voters (margin of sampling error +/- 5.3%) were interviewed between March 27 and April 2, 2007. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
