### BUSH APPROVAL STILL LOW HEADING TOWARD NOVEMBER ELECTIONS

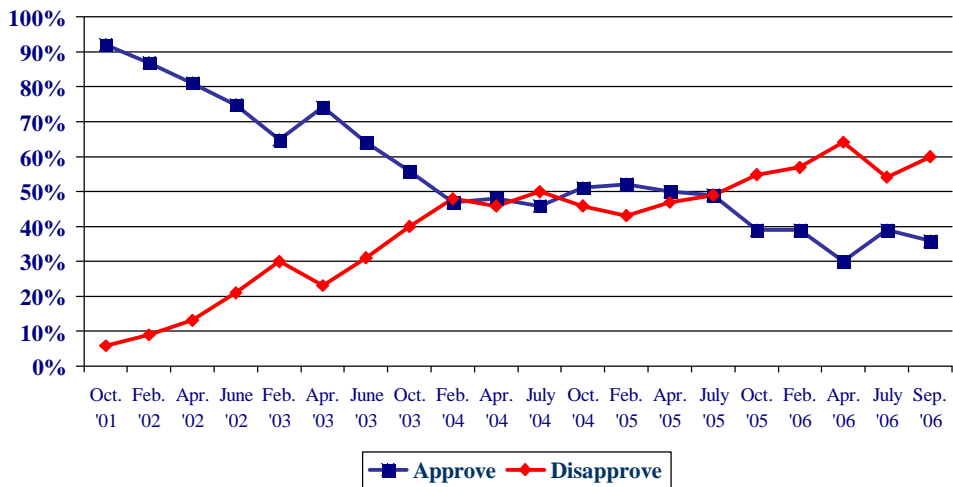
DURHAM, NH – President Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire remain in the mid 30s spelling trouble for GOP candidates in New Hampshire’s 2006 Congressional elections. The conflict in Iraq remains the biggest drag on Bush’s overall ratings.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,<sup>?</sup> conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by WMUR-TV, Manchester. Five hundred fifteen (515) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between September 15 and September 24, 2006. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.3 percent.

#### Presidential Approval

With 5 weeks remaining until the mid-term elections, President George W. Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire remain low and are cause for concern for New Hampshire’s incumbent Republican Congressmen, Jeb Bradley and Charlie Bass, as they look toward reelection. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 36 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Bush is doing as president, 60 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral and represent a slight decline since July. “If Bush’s approval ratings slip any lower, they imperil the reelection chances of Charlie Bass in New Hampshire’s 2<sup>nd</sup> Congressional District.,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “Support for Bass has been closely linked to Bush’s approval ratings and should they dip any lower, Paul Hodes’ chances of upsetting Bass increase.”

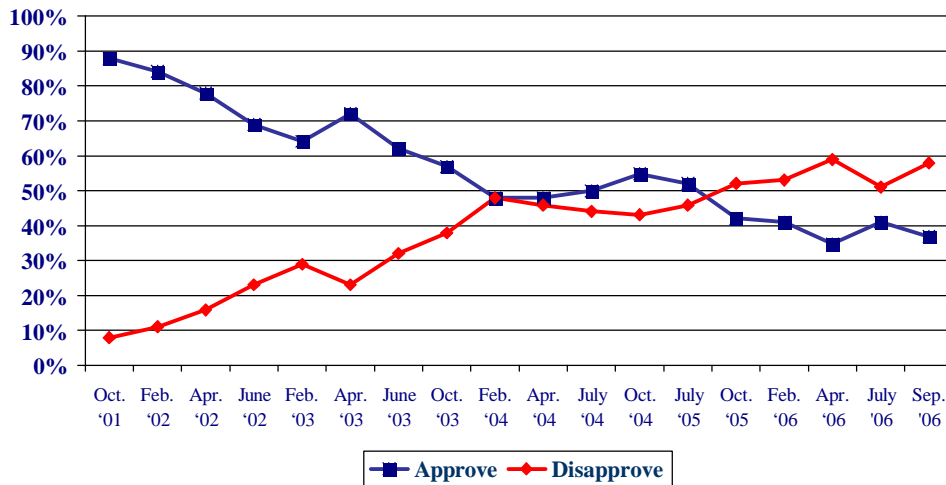
**Presidential Approval – G.W. Bush**

Bush's personal favorability rating are also quite low. Currently, 37 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Bush, 58 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 5 percent are neutral. Bush's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, are a very low -21 percent.

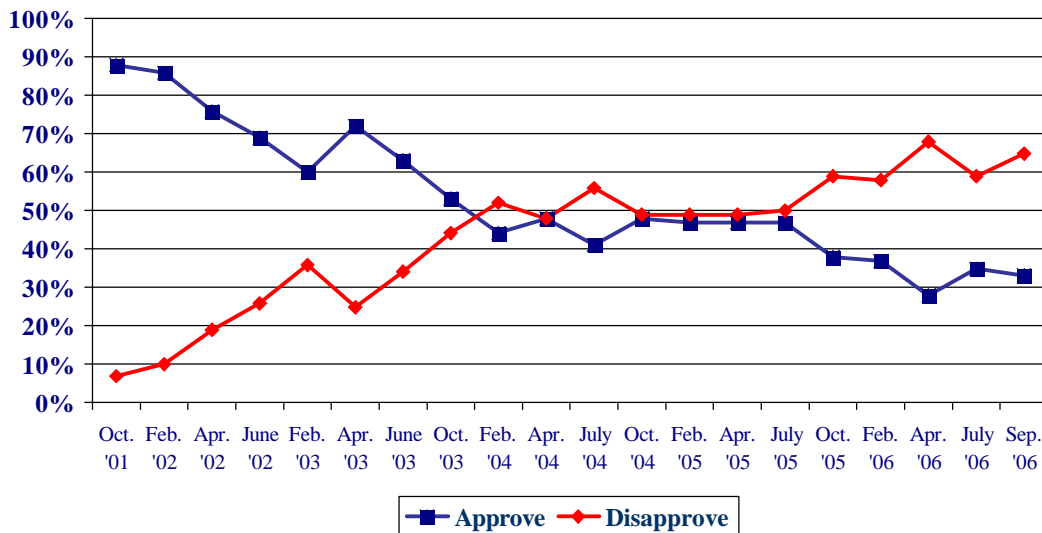
**Favorability Ratings – G.W. Bush**



**Foreign Affairs**

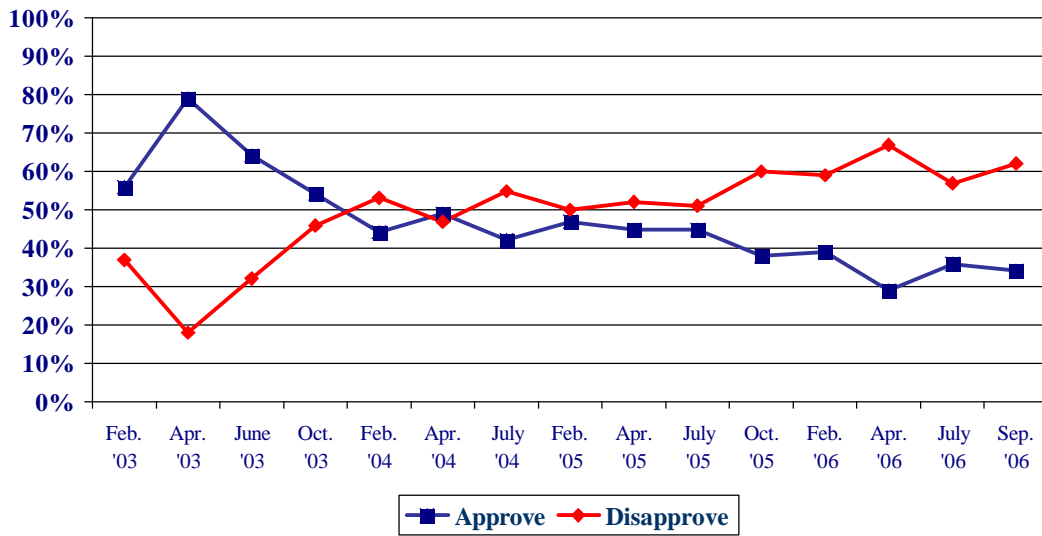
The war in Iraq continues to be the anchor on Bush's approval ratings. When asked about how the President is handling foreign affairs, only 33 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve, 65 percent disapprove, and 2 percent are neutral.

**Bush Approval: Foreign Affairs**



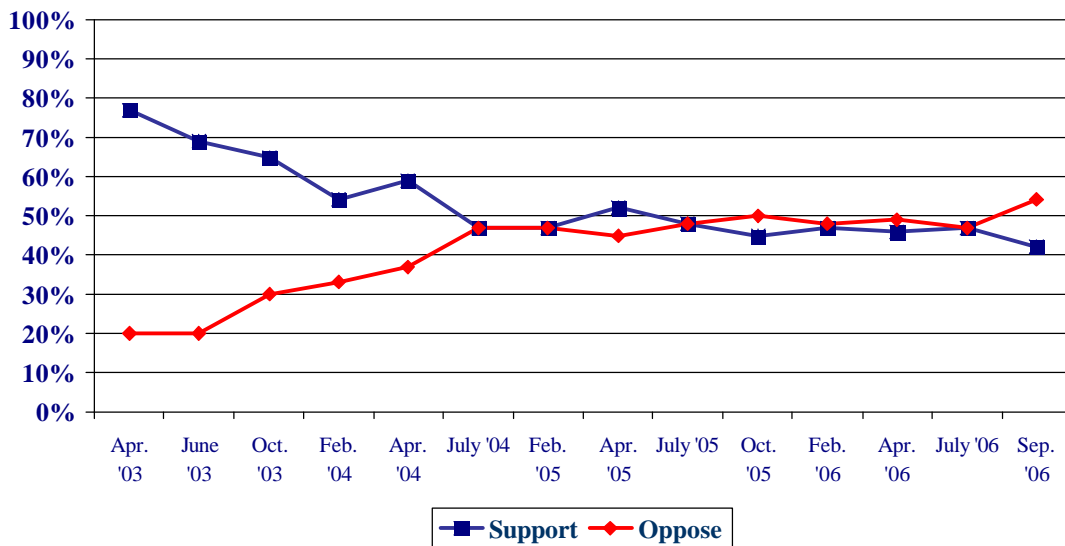
Looking specifically to Iraq, only 34 percent of Granite State adults approve of the way Bush has handled the situation there, 62 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral. The percentage who disapprove of the Bush Administrations handling of Iraq has remained near 60 percent for the past year.

**Bush Approval: Handling Situation In Iraq**

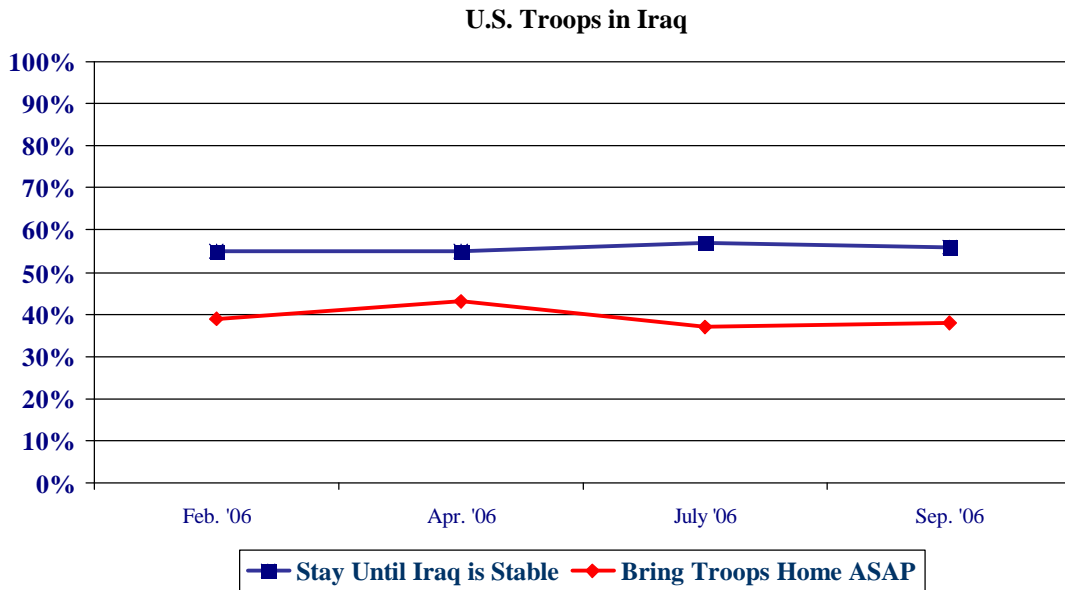


Support for going into Iraq in the first place has also declined in recent months. Currently, only 42 percent support the U.S. having gone to war in Iraq, 54 percent oppose the U.S. having gone to war, and 4 percent are neutral. Support for the U.S. having gone to war with Iraq is at its lowest level since the U.S. invasion.

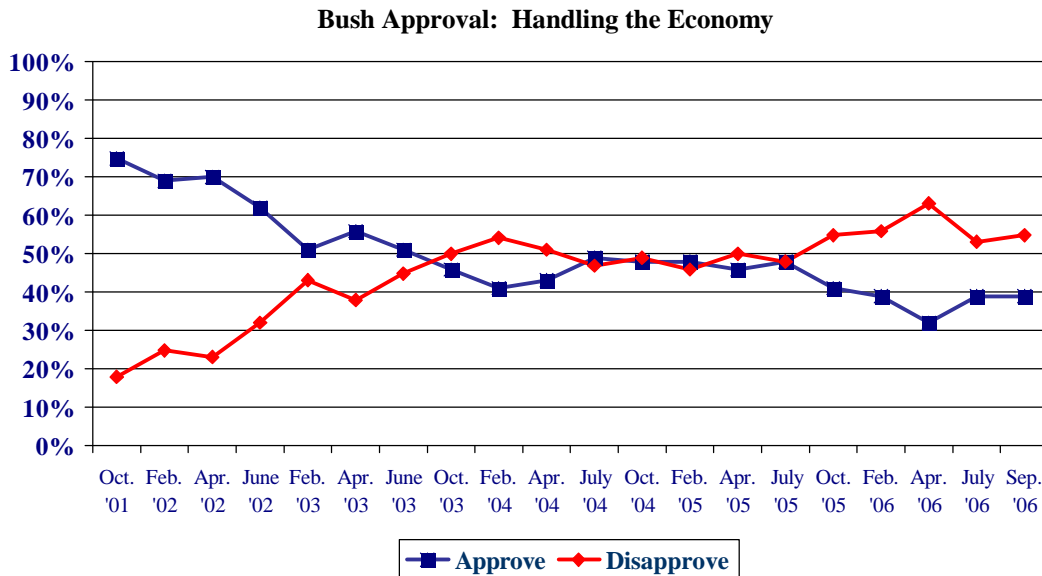
**Support for War In Iraq**



But when asked what U.S. troops should do in Iraq, 56 percent think they should stay until the situation has stabilized, 38 percent think the troops should be brought home as soon as possible, and 5 percent don't know. This has remained unchanged since the Winter 2006 Granite State Poll.



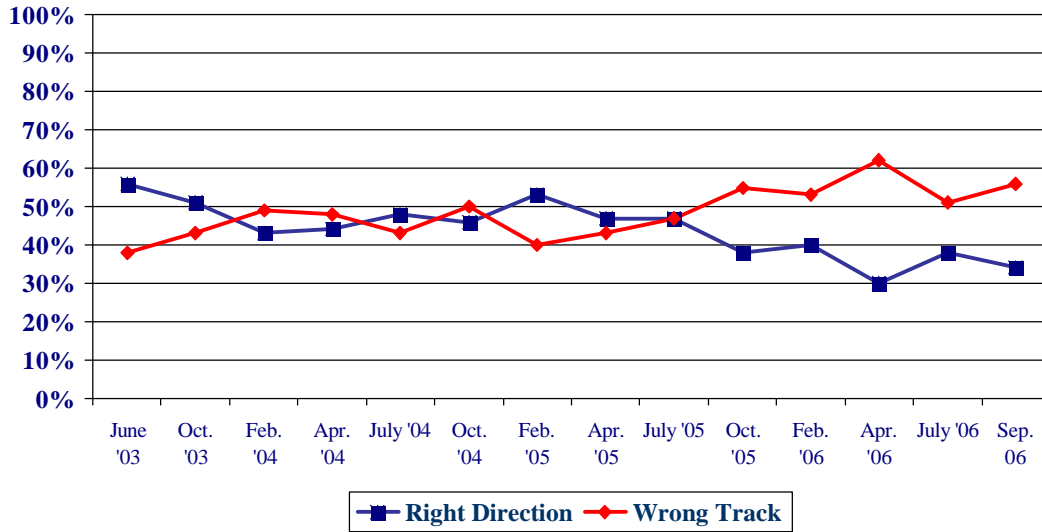
**Economic Approval Rating**  
 The conflict in Iraq has kept New Hampshire residents pessimistic about the economy in the U.S. Even though the U.S. and New Hampshire economies are growing at a brisk pace, only 39 percent of New Hampshire residents say they approve of the job President Bush is doing handling the economy, 55 percent disapprove, and 6 percent are neutral.



### Right Track – Wrong Track

New Hampshire residents are pessimistic about the direction the country is heading. Only 34 percent of New Hampshire residents think that things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 56 percent think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 10 percent don't know. Only Republicans and conservatives think that the U.S. is headed in the right direction..

### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from September 15 and September 24, 2006. A random sample of 515 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.3 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
