INCUMBENTS STRONG IN NH CONGRESSIONAL RACES

DURHAM, NH – Republican incumbents Jeb Bradley and Charlie Bass are holding solid leads over their Democratic challengers in races for New Hampshire’s First and Second Congressional seats.

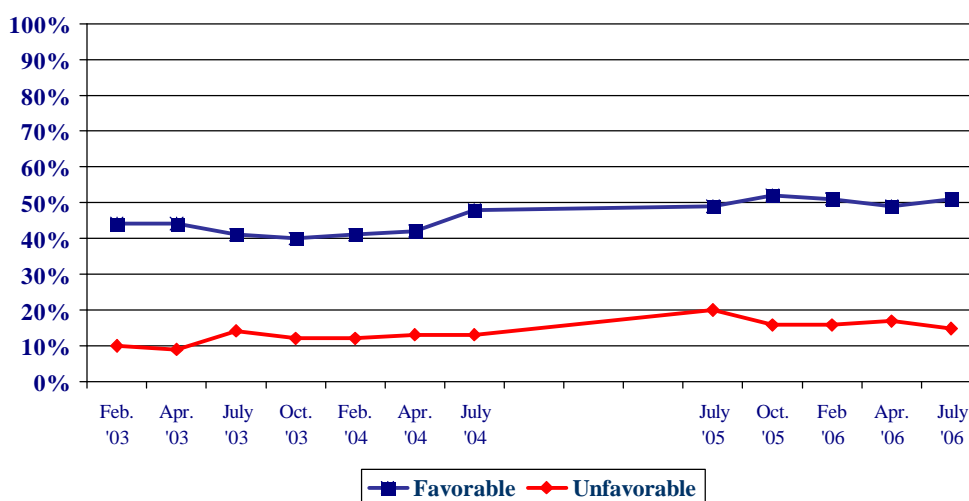
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,[?] conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. Five hundred ten (510) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed by telephone between July 21 and July 31, 2006. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.3 percent. Two hundred sixty-one (261) respondents lived in New Hampshire’s 1st Congressional District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.1%) and 249 lived in the 2nd District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.2%).

NH 1st District

New Hampshire voted for Democrats John Kerry for President and John Lynch for governor in 2004 and have their sights on winning one or both of New Hampshire’s congressional seats. In the 1st District, Republican incumbent Jeb Bradley is facing four challengers – State Representative and House Minority Leader Jim Craig, businessman Gary Dodds, Carol Shea-Porter, and David Jarvis. Bradley remains a popular Congressman -- 51 percent of 1st District residents have a favorable opinion of Bradley, only 15 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 13 percent are neutral and 22 percent don’t know enough about him to say. Bradley’s net favorability rating in the 1st District, the percentage who have a favorable opinion of him minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is a strong +36 percent and has changed little since he was elected.

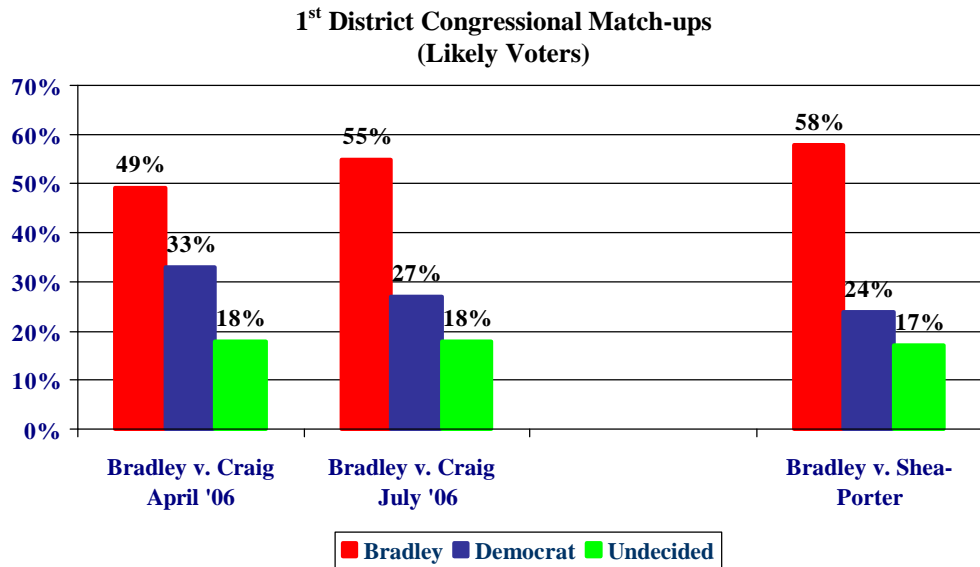
Bradley’s best funded challengers are Jim Craig and Carol Shea-Porter. Of the two, Craig is better known – 22 percent of 1st District adults have a favorable opinion of Craig, 6 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8 percent are neutral and 64 percent don’t know enough about him to say. Craig’s net favorability rating in the 1st District is +16 percent. Carol Shea-Porter, a Democratic activist from Rochester, is unknown to 1st District residents. Only 7 percent of 1st District adults have a favorable opinion of Shea-Porter, no one in the survey said they had an unfavorable opinion of her, 7 percent are neutral, and 86 percent say they don’t know enough about her to say. Shea-Porter’s net favorability rating is +7 percent.

Favorability Ratings – Jeb Bradley NH 1st District

When likely voters in the 1st District are asked who they plan to vote for in November, Bradley holds comfortable leads over both Craig and Shea-Porter. In a match-up between Bradley and Craig, 55 percent of likely voters say they will vote for Bradley, 27 percent say they will vote for Craig, and 18 percent are undecided. Bradley led Craig 49 percent to 33 percent in April. When Bradley is matched with Shea-Porter, 58 percent of likely 1st District voters say they will vote for Bradley, 24 percent say they will vote for Shea-Porter, and 17 percent are undecided. Bradley holds considerable advantages over both Craig and Shea-Porter in both name recognition and funding and will be difficult to upset in November.

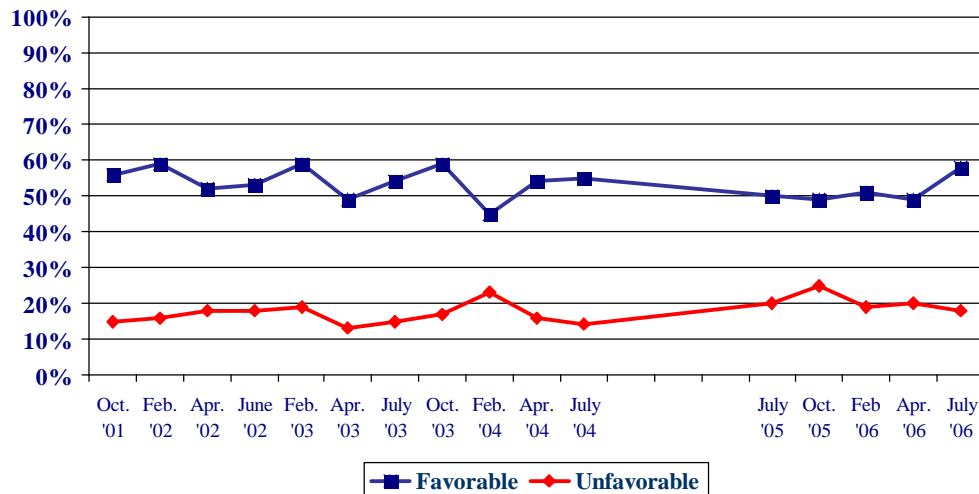


NH 2nd District

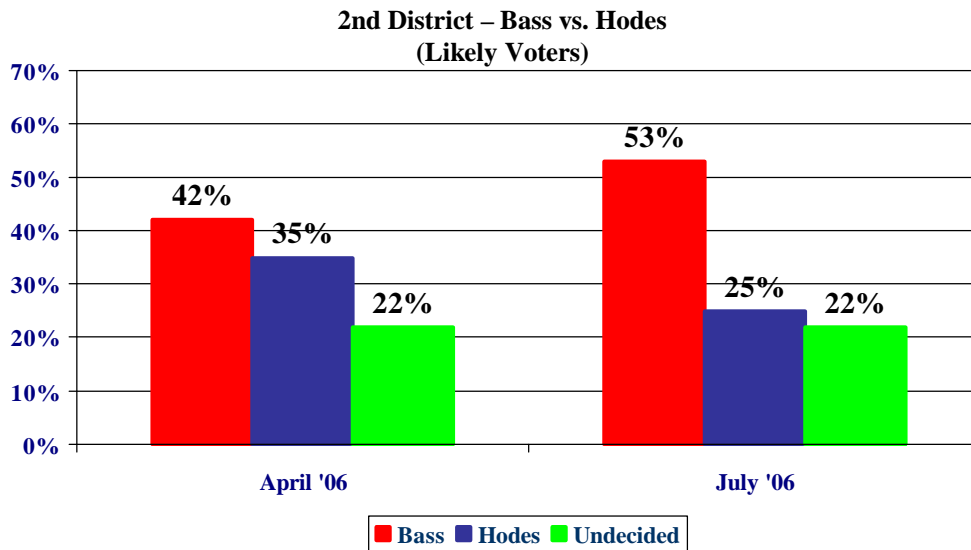
In the 2nd District, Republican incumbent Charlie Bass has a re-match of his 2004 race with Concord Attorney Paul Hodes. In 2004, Bass beat Hodes 59% to 38%. Democrats have seen New Hampshire’s Second District as one that ought to elect a Democratic Congressman, but have been unsuccessful unseating Bass since he was first elected in 1994. Bass remains popular with residents of the 2nd District -- 58 percent have a favorable opinion of him, 18 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 10 percent are neutral and 13 percent don’t know enough about him to say. Bass’ net favorability rating in the 2nd District is a strong +40 percent.

Paul Hodes has been working hard to raise money for the November election and does not face a primary challenger. But despite running in 2004, Paul Hodes is still largely unknown to most 2nd District residents – 11 percent say they have a favorable opinion of Hodes, 4 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 9 percent are neutral, and 77 percent say they know too little about him to say. Hodes’ net favorability rating is +7 percent .

Favorability Ratings – Charlie Bass NH 2nd District

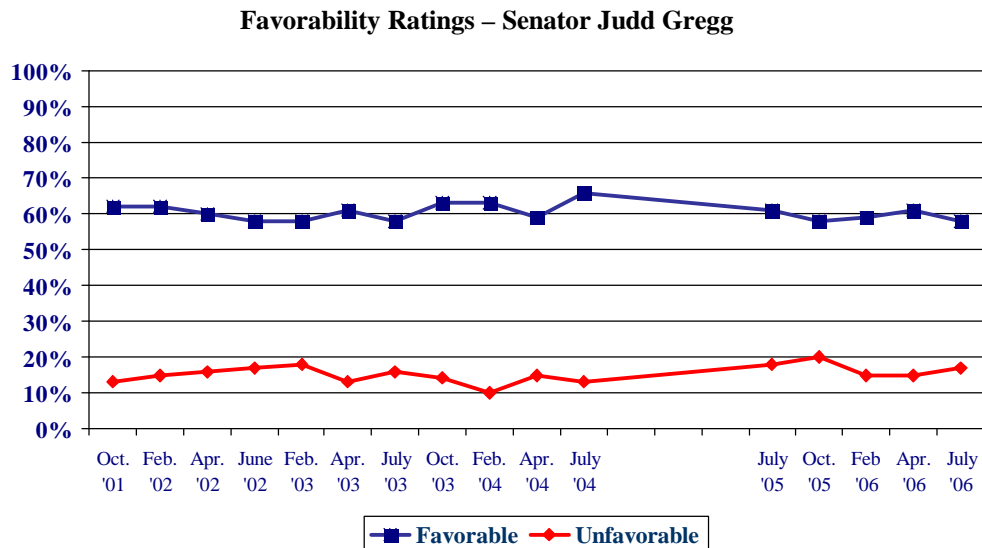


When likely voters in the 2nd District are asked who they plan to vote for in November, Bass has extended his lead over Hodes. Currently, 53 percent of likely voters say they will vote for Bass, 25 percent say they will vote for Hodes, and 22 percent are undecided. In the April, 2006 Granite State Poll, Bass looked to be in a bit of trouble, holding a narrow 7 percentage point lead over Hodes. But this seems to have been largely due to Granite Staters perceptions of President Bush, whose job approval rating was only 30 percent in April. Bush approval ratings have improved since then, benefiting Republican candidates.



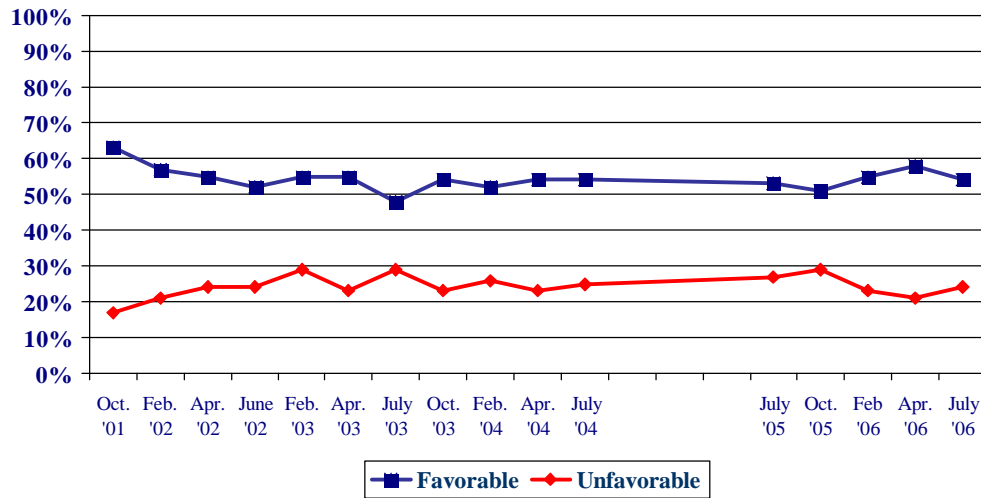
Favorability Ratings of NH Senators

The New Hampshire Senatorial delegation continues to get high favorability ratings from Granite Staters. Senator Judd Gregg remains the most popular -- 58 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Gregg, 17 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 11 percent are neutral and 14 percent don't know enough to say. Gregg's net favorability rating is a very strong +41 percent.



John Sununu, New Hampshire's junior Senator is also viewed favorably with 54 percent of New Hampshire adults having a favorable opinion of him, 24 percent having an unfavorable opinion, 11 percent are neutral and 11 percent don't know enough to say. Sununu's net favorability rating is +30 percent.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from July 21 to July 31, 2006. A random sample of 510 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.3 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population. Two hundred sixty-one (261) respondents lived in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.1%) and 249 lived in the 2nd District (margin of sampling error = +/-6.2%).

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
