### BUSH APPROVAL RATINGS PLUMMET

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DURHAM, NH – President Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire have dropped to the lowest levels of his presidency. The ongoing conflict in Iraq is dragging down Bush’s overall ratings as well as views about his handling of the economy.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,<sup>?</sup> conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. Five hundred eleven (511) randomly selected adults were interviewed by telephone between October 25 and October 30, 2005. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.4 percent.

#### Presidential Approval

Despite an improved national and state economy, President George W. Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire have dropped dramatically over the past three months. In the most recent Granite State Poll, only 39 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Bush is doing as president, 55 percent disapprove, and 6 percent are neutral. Approval of Bush as president has dropped 10 percent since the July Granite State Poll. “Outside of Republicans, Bush has lost his political support in New Hampshire,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “And Bush is even starting to lose support among Republicans.” Seventy-three percent of Republicans approve of the job Bush is doing as President, down from 87 percent in July. Ninety percent of Democrats disapprove of the job Bush is doing. It is also quite significant that the percentage of New Hampshire adults who say they strongly disapprove of Bush has increased to 44 percent, from 35 percent in July.

A USA Today/CNN/Gallup poll conducted during the same time period showed Bush with a similar approval rating nationally -- 41 percent approve, 56 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are unsure.

Bush’s personal favorability rating has also dropped to its lowest levels of his presidency. Currently, only 42 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Bush, 52 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 6 percent are neutral. Bush’s net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is -10%, down from +6% in July. Currently, 78 percent of Republicans have a favorable opinion of Bush, down from 91 percent in July while 91 percent of Democrats have an unfavorable opinion of him.

## **Foreign Affairs**

Bush's dramatic loss of support in New Hampshire is tied to the continuing problems faced in Iraq and the lingering questions over the U.S. decision to go to war with Iraq. When asked about how the president is handling foreign affairs, only 38 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve, 59 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral. The percentage who approve of the way Bush is handling foreign affairs has dropped from 47 percent in July. Turning specifically to Iraq, only 38 percent of Granite State adults approve of the way Bush has handled the situation there, 60 percent disapprove, and 2 percent are neutral. This measure is also at its lowest level of the Bush presidency.

Support for the U.S. having gone to war with Iraq continues to wane in New Hampshire. Currently, 45 percent support the U.S. having gone to war in Iraq, 50 percent oppose the U.S. having gone to war, and 4 percent are neutral. Support for the U.S. having gone to war with Iraq is at its lowest level since the war began in 2003.

## **Economic Approval Rating**

Dissatisfaction with the war in Iraq has colored how New Hampshire views President Bush's handling of the economy. While the U.S. economy seems to have weathered the September hurricanes, and while the New Hampshire economy continues to grow, only 41 percent of New Hampshire residents say they approve of the job President Bush is doing handling the economy, 55 percent disapprove, and 4 percent are neutral. The percentage who approve of Bush's handling of the economy has dropped from 48 percent in July and matches the lowest level of his presidency.

## **Right Track – Wrong Track**

The angst caused by Iraq and high gasoline prices have left New Hampshire wondering about the direction the U.S. is headed. Only 38 percent of New Hampshire residents think that things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 55 percent think things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 7 percent don't know. This measure is also at its lowest level of the Bush presidency.

## **Subgroup Analysis**

Bush continues to get his highest approval ratings from Republicans, conservatives, and people who attend church weekly. Democrats, liberals, people who have never married, people who do not attend church, and people with post-graduate educations are most likely to give Bush low approval ratings.

Republicans, conservatives, young adults, men, and regular churchgoers are most supportive of the war in Iraq while Democrats, liberals, union households, people 50 and older, women, people with post-graduate educations, people who are divorced, and non-churchgoing residents are most opposed to the war in Iraq.

## **Granite State Poll Methodology**

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from October 25 to October 30, 2005. A random sample of 511 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.4 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
