### BUSH APPROVAL RATINGS – STATUS QUO

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DURHAM, NH – President Bush’s job approval ratings in New Hampshire have remained essentially unchanged over the past year.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**,<sup>7</sup> conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. Five hundred four (504) randomly selected adults were interviewed by telephone between July 7 and July 17, 2005. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.4 percent.

#### **Presidential Approval**

Despite an improved national and state economy, and in the face of continuing problems in Iraq, President George W. Bush’s job approval ratings are hovering in a mediocre range in New Hampshire. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 49 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve of the job Bush is doing as president, 47 percent disapprove, and 4 percent are neutral. These figures are unchanged since April and are only slightly better than they were one year ago. “New Hampshire has settled on how it feels about Bush,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “Republicans strongly support his job as President while Democrats strongly disapprove.” More than 80 percent of Republicans and conservatives approve of Bush’s performance as president while more than 75 percent of Democrats and liberals disapprove.

Another measure of Bush’s popularity is his personal favorability rating. Currently, 52 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Bush, 46 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 2 percent are neutral. Bush’s net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion minus the percentage having an unfavorable opinion, is fairly low +6%. More than 90 percent of Republicans have a favorable opinion of Bush while 80 percent of Democrats have an unfavorable opinion of him, another indicator of how polarized New Hampshire is regarding President Bush.

#### **Economic Approval Rating**

While New Hampshire’s unemployment rate is below 3 percent, and home sales remain strong, gasoline continues to cost more than \$2 per gallon. These mixed economic signals are reflected in the ratings President Bush gets on his handling of the economy. In the most recent Granite State Poll, 48 percent of New Hampshire residents say they approve of the job President Bush is doing handling the economy, 48 percent disapprove, and 4 percent are neutral. The percentage who approve of Bush’s handling of the economy has also remained largely unchanged over the past year

## **Foreign Affairs**

New Hampshire, like the rest of the nation, was deeply divided over Bush's handling of foreign affairs and the war in Iraq during last fall's election campaign and New Hampshire adults remain deeply divided. When asked about how the president is handling foreign affairs, only 47 percent of New Hampshire adults say they approve, 50 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral, unchanged since before the November election.

Turning specifically to Iraq, 45 percent of Granite State adults approve of the way Bush has handled the situation there, 51 percent disapprove, and 3 percent are neutral, slightly higher than July 2004.

New Hampshire is evenly divided over whether the war in Iraq was a good idea. Currently, 48 percent support the US having gone to war in Iraq, 48 percent oppose the US having gone to war, and 5 percent neutral. This measure is down somewhat since April, but is at the same level as July 2004.

## **Right Track – Wrong Track**

In another measure of the difficulty President Bush is having, New Hampshire residents are even divided about the overall direction of the country. Forty-seven percent of New Hampshire residents think that things in this country are generally going in the right direction, 47 percent think they are on the wrong track, and 6 percent don't know.

## **Subgroup Analysis**

Bush gets his highest approval ratings from Republicans, conservatives, upper income residents people who attend church weekly and residents of Northern New Hampshire. Democrats, liberals, young adults (under 35), people who have never married, people who do not attend church, and people who want abortion legal in all circumstances are most likely to give Bush low approval ratings.

Republicans, conservatives, residents of Northern New Hampshire, and regular church goers are most supportive of the war in Iraq while Democrats, liberals, people with post-graduate educations, and non-religious residents are most opposed to the war in Iraq.

## **Granite State Poll Methodology**

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from July 7 to July 17, 2005. A random sample of 504 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.4 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
