REELECTION LIKELY FOR NH CONGRESSIONAL INCUMBENTS

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DURHAM, NH – Incumbent Senator Judd Gregg and Congressmen Charlie Bass and Jeb Bradley are well positioned for reelection in November. The entire New Hampshire Congressional delegation is viewed favorably.

These findings are based on the latest **WMUR Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by WMUR-TV, Manchester and the University of New Hampshire. Five hundred nine (509) randomly selected adults were interviewed by telephone between July 6 and July 20, 2004. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.3 percent. Included in this sample were 464 likely November 2004 voters. The margin of error for the likely voter sub-sample is +/- 4.5 percent. US Senate

Two-term Republican Senator Judd Gregg holds a very large lead over his Democratic challenger, Doris “Granny D” Haddock. Haddock, a political activist from Dublin, is best known for her support of campaign finance reform legislation. Gregg was widely considered a shoo-in for reelection even before his original Democratic challenger, State Senator Burt Cohen, was forced to drop out of the race after his campaign manager, and much of his campaign cash, disappeared in June. And now that he is facing a political novice, his reelection is all but guaranteed. In the latest WMUR Granite State Poll, 65 percent of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Gregg, 20 percent would vote for Haddock, and 15 percent are undecided.

Gregg is in such a strong position because he is well liked by both Republicans and Democrats in New Hampshire. Currently, 66 percent of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Gregg, only 13 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 8 percent are neutral, and 12 percent don’t know enough about him to say. Gregg’s net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion of him minus those having an unfavorable opinion, is a very high +53 percent. “Senator Gregg has been, for many years, the most popular politician in New Hampshire,” said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. “His popularity is bipartisan and is reflected in the large numbers of Democrats who support his reelection.” Gregg leads Haddock among self-identified Democrats 44 percent to 35 percent.

Despite the nationwide publicity she has received for her support of campaign finance reform, Doris “Granny D” Haddock is largely unknown in New Hampshire. Currently, only 19 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Haddock, 8 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 5 percent are neutral, and 68 percent don’t know enough about her to say. Granny D’s net favorability rating is +11 percent.

And while he is not up for reelection until 2008, Republican Senator John Sununu also receives high favorability ratings, although not as high as Senator Gregg. Fifty-five percent of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 25 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 10 percent are neutral, and 11 percent do not know enough about him to say. Sununu’s net favorability rating is +29 percent.

First Congressional District

In New Hampshire's First Congressional District, first term Republican Jeb Bradley is facing a number of Democratic and Republican challengers. His best known Democratic challenger is Justin Nadeau, an attorney from Portsmouth. Currently, 58 percent of First District voters say they will vote for Bradley, only 21 percent prefer Nadeau, 1 percent some other candidate, and 19 percent are undecided.

First District residents have a generally favorable opinion of Bradley -- 48 percent have a favorable opinion of him, 13 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 14 percent are neutral and 25 percent don't know enough about him to say. Bradley's net favorability rating in the First District is a solid +35 percent. And while Bradley is well known and liked, Nadeau is largely unknown in the First District -- only 9 percent have a favorable opinion of Nadeau, 2 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 5 percent are neutral, and 84 percent don't know enough about him to say.

Second Congressional District

In the Second Congressional District, 5-term Republican Charlie Bass is well-positioned to hold his seat against his best known challenger, Democratic Paul Hodes, an attorney from Concord. Currently, 57 percent of 2nd District voters say they will vote for Bass, 28 percent prefer Hodes, and 15 percent are undecided.

Bass has had very high favorability ratings in the Second District and this is helping his reelection. Fifty-five percent of Second District residents have a favorable opinion of Bass 14 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 12 percent are neutral, and 19 percent say they don't know enough about him to say. Bass' net favorability rating in the Second District is a high +41 percent. Hodes is still largely unknown in the Second District -- 8 percent said they have a favorable opinion of Hodes, 2 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8 percent are neutral, and 81 percent don't know enough about him to say.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from July 6 to July 20, 2004. A random sample of 509 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.3 percent. Included in this sample were 464 likely November 2004 voters. The margin of error for the likely voter sub-sample is +/- 4.5 percent. Two hundred sixty-nine (269) adults in the First Congressional District and 240 adults in the Second District were interviewed. The margin of error for the First and Second District is plus or minus 6 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
