### NH INCUMBENTS IN GOOD POSITION FOR NOVEMBER ELECTION

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DURHAM, NH – Congressmen Charlie Bass and Jeb Bradley, as well as Senators Judd Gregg and John Sununu, all have strong favorability ratings in New Hampshire. Gregg, Bradley and Bass are in strong positions for re-election in November.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll**, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. The Granite State Poll is sponsored by the University of New Hampshire. Five hundred forty-two (542) randomly selected adults were interviewed by telephone between April 19 and April 26, 2004. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-4.2 percent. #### **Senatorial Favorability**

New Hampshire's senior senator, Republican Judd Gregg, is up for re-election in November 2004. And while Democrats and Republicans nationwide will battle for control of the Senate, Gregg is in a strong position for re-election. Currently, 59 percent of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Gregg, only 15 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 11 percent are neutral, and 15 percent don't know enough about him to say. Gregg's net favorability rating, the percentage having a favorable opinion of him minus those having an unfavorable opinion, is at a very strong +44 percent. Gregg's favorability ratings have been high for several years. "Senator Gregg receives solid support from both Republicans and Democrats," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. "His high favorability ratings and strong name recognition will make him tough to beat in November."

Gregg's challenger for the Senate seat is State Senator Burt Cohen, Democrat from Portsmouth. Cohen is largely unknown in New Hampshire, even in the Seacoast. Currently, 13 percent of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Cohen, 4 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 9 percent are neutral, and 73 percent don't know enough about him to say.

Republican Senator John Sununu, New Hampshire's junior senator, also receives high favorability ratings, although not as high as Senator Gregg. In the April Granite State Poll, 54 percent say they have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 23 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11 percent are neutral, and 11 percent do not know enough about him to say. Mr. Sununu's net favorability rating is +31 percent.

#### **U.S. House of Representatives**

In New Hampshire's First Congressional District, first term Republican Jeb Bradley receives respectable favorability ratings even though he is still unknown to a significant portion of the district. In the First District, 42 percent have a favorable opinion of Bradley, 13 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 14 percent are neutral and 32 percent don't know enough about him to say. Bradley's net favorability rating in the First District is a solid +29 percent. As of now, no Democrat has announced their intention to run against Bradley.

In the Second District, 5-term Republican Charlie Bass continues to receive high favorability ratings. Currently, 54 percent of residents of the Second District have a favorable opinion of him, 16 percent have an unfavorable opinion, 12 percent are

neutral, and 17 percent say they don't know enough about him to say. Bass' net favorability rating in the Second District is a very solid +38 percent.

Bass' likely Democratic challenger is Concord attorney Paul Hodes. Hodes faces an uphill battle against Bass as he is largely unknown to residents of the Second District. Currently, 5 percent said they have a favorable opinion of Hodes, 2 percent have an unfavorable opinion of him, 5 percent are neutral, and 88 percent don't know enough about him to say.

**Granite State Poll Methodology**

These findings are based on the most recent Granite State Poll conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center from April 19 to April 26, 2004. A random sample of 542 New Hampshire adults was interviewed by telephone. In 95 of 100 cases, the statewide estimates will be accurate to plus or minus 4.2 percent. Results reported for other subgroups have potential for somewhat larger variation than those for the entire population.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households, respondent sex, and region of the state. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response.
