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SHAHEEN VIEWED FAVORABLY BY HALF OF GRANITE STATERS IN RUN-UP TO 2020 REELECTION CAMPAIGN

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DURHAM, NH – In the run-up to the 2020 elections, New Hampshire's senior senator Jeanne Shaheen continues to have high favorability. Shaheen's colleague in the Senate, Maggie Hassan, is slightly less popular, while Representative Annie Kuster is only somewhat popular in NH's Second District. Just over half of NH First District residents are neutral or aren't sure of their opinion of newly-elected Representative Chris Pappas.

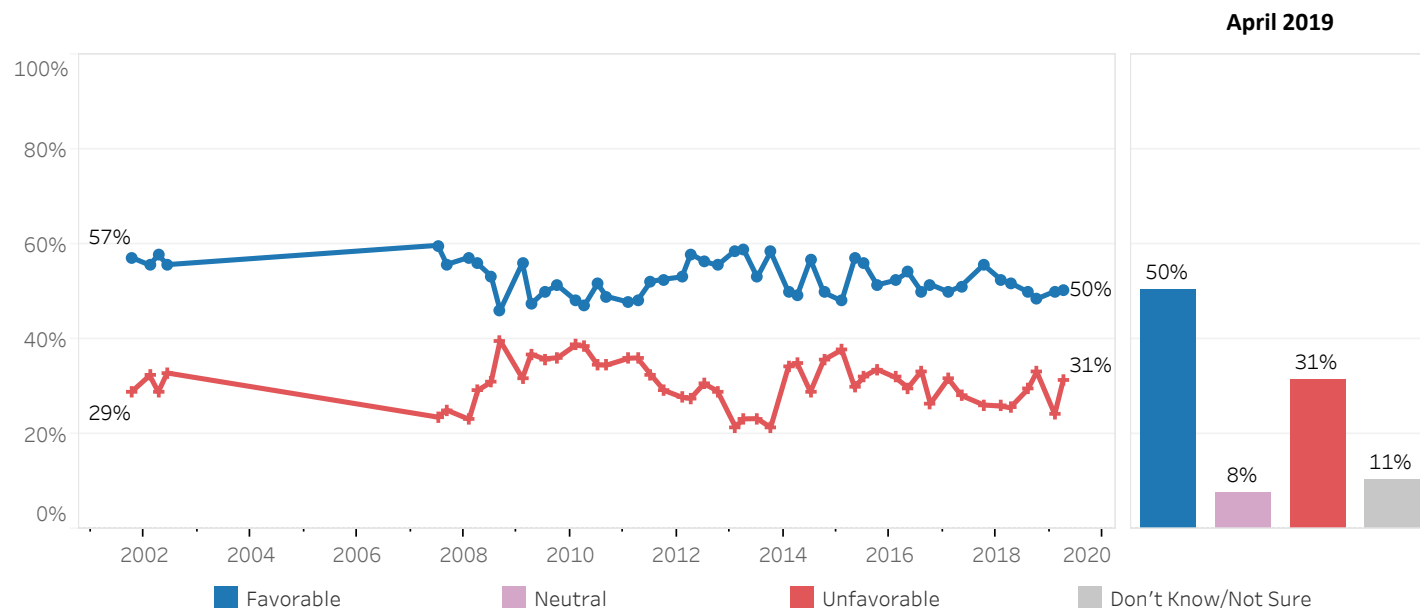
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred forty-nine (549) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 10 and April 18, 2019. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. Included were two hundred sixty-nine (269) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 6.0%) and two hundred eighty (280) from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.9%).

Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire senior senator Jeanne Shaheen, who is running for re-election in 2020, remains popular in the state. Currently, 50% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 31% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 11% don't know enough about her to say.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-identified Democrats, self-described liberals, those who have completed postgraduate work, NHPR listeners, Seacoast residents, and those who attend religious services once or twice a month are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-identified Republicans, self-described conservatives, those with a high school education or less, and Massachusetts Border residents are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen.

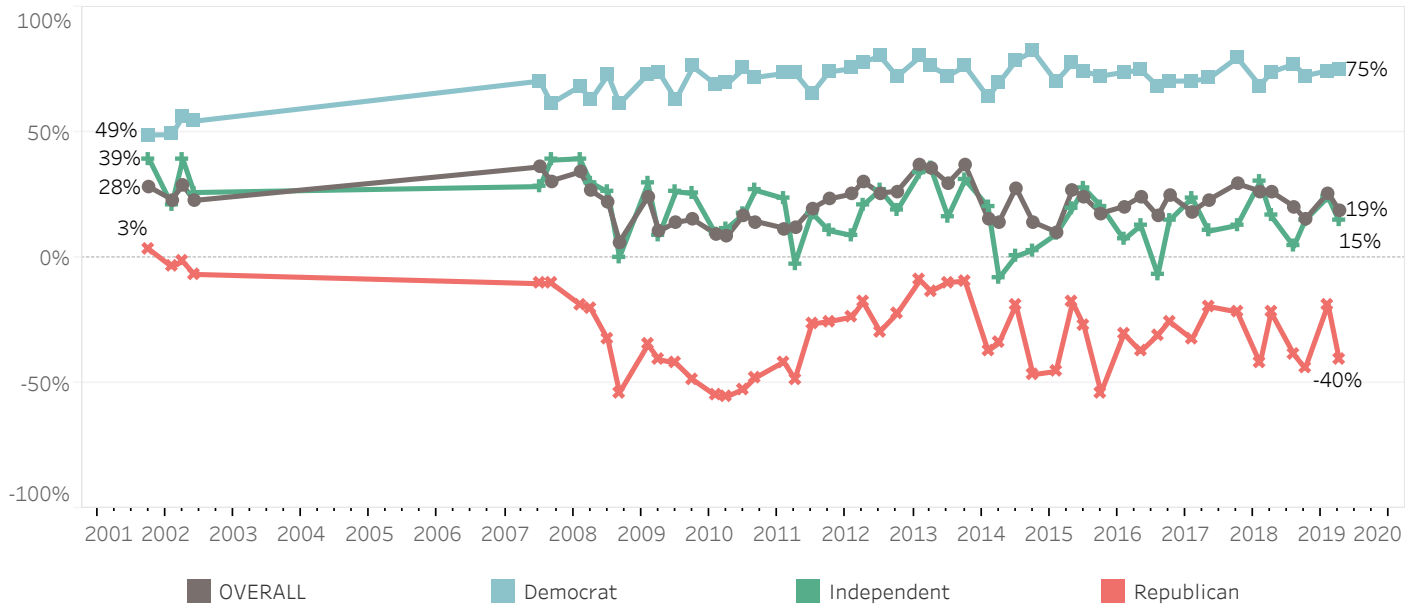
Jeanne Shaheen (D) Favorability

Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) is +19%, down from +26% in February. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +75%), somewhat popular among Independents (+15%), and unpopular among Republicans (-40%).

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

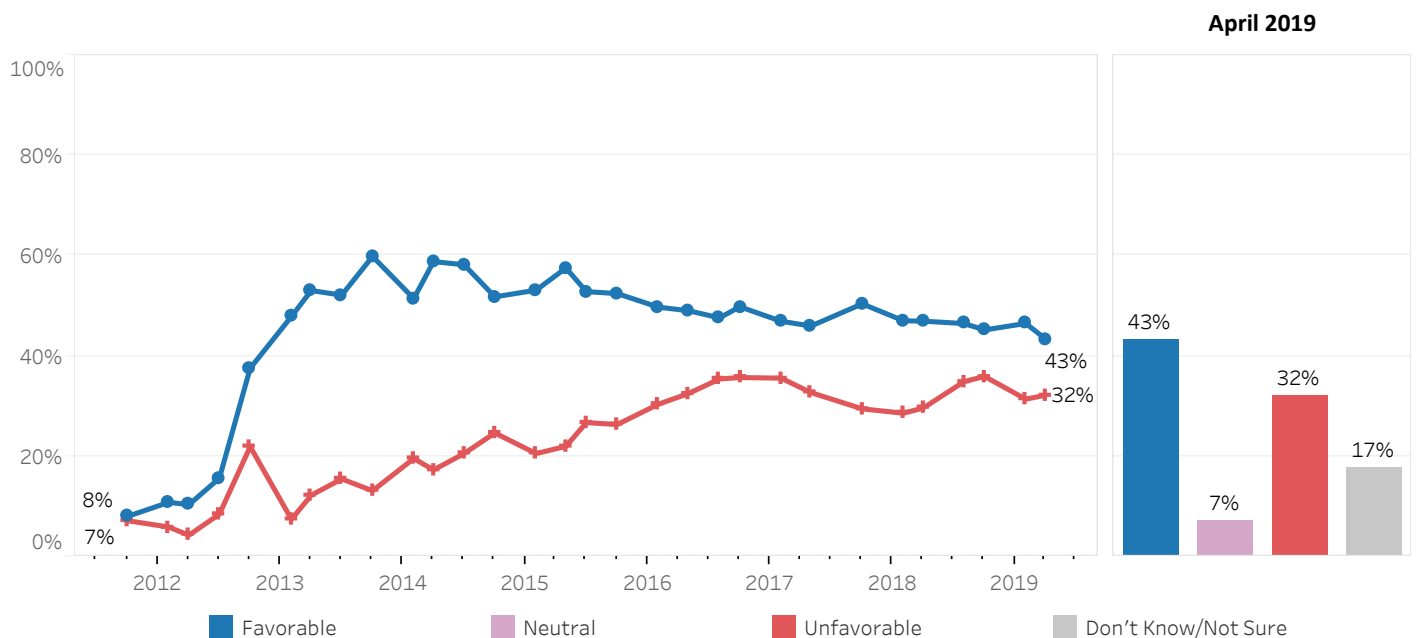


Favorability - Maggie Hassan

New Hampshire's junior senator Maggie Hassan is slightly less popular than Shaheen. Currently, 43% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 32% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral, and 17% don't know enough about her to say.

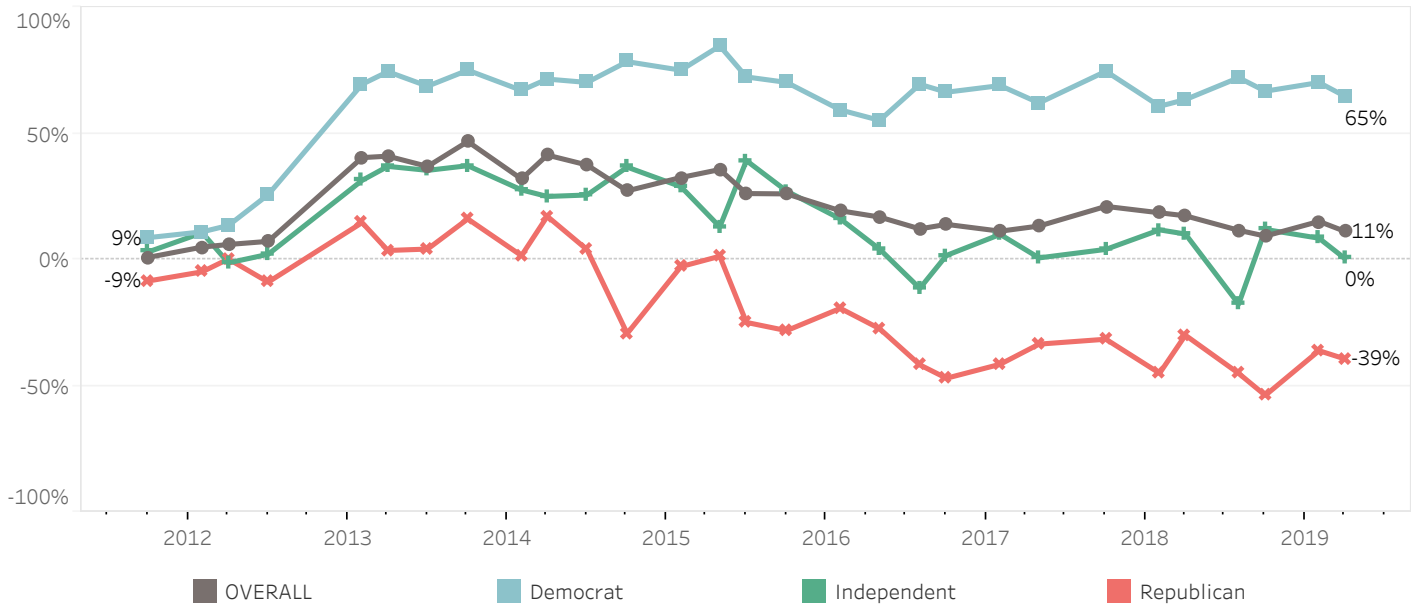
Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, self-identified Democrats, and NHPR listeners are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Conservative talk radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump or did not vote in 2016, self-identified Republicans, self-described conservatives, those with a high school education or less, those who attend religious services once a week or more often, and Massachusetts Border residents are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.

Maggie Hassan (D) Favorability



Hassan's net favorability rating is +11%, largely unchanged from +15% in February and +17% a year ago. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +65%) and unpopular among Republicans (-39%) while Independents (0%) are neutral.

 Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)

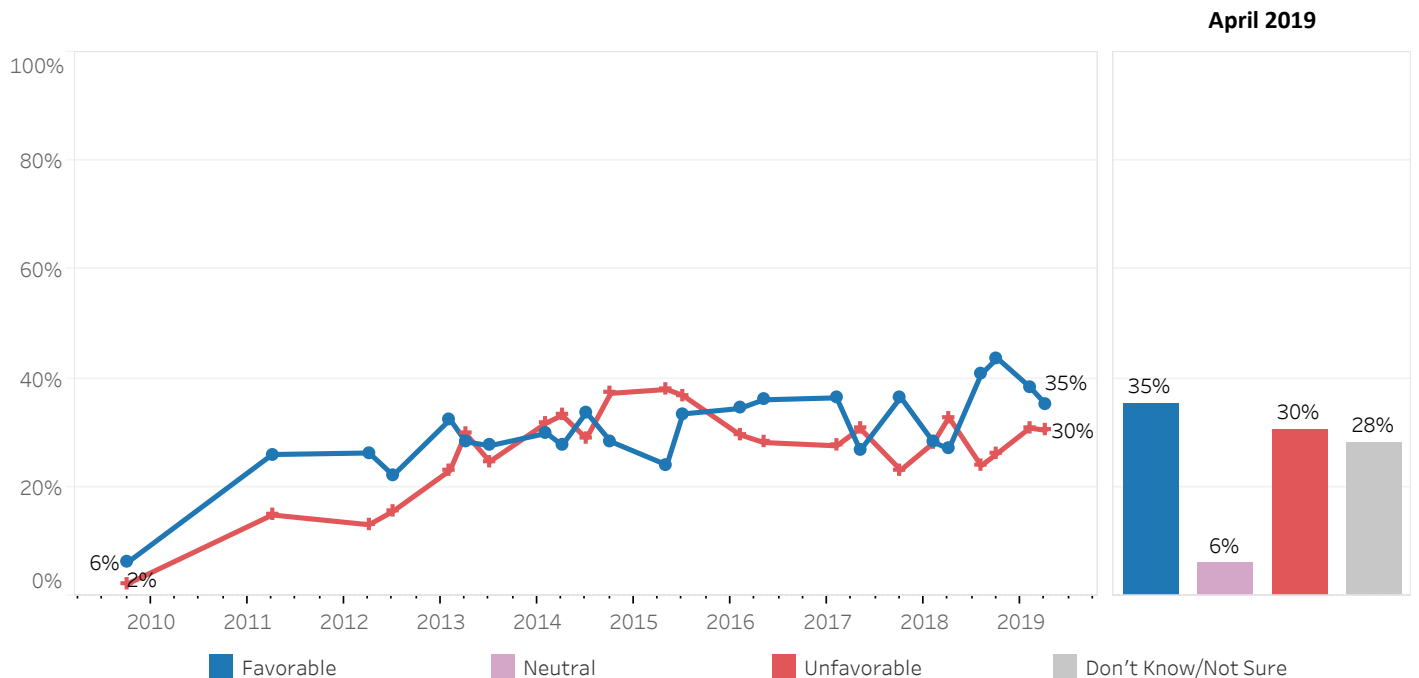


Favorability - Ann Kuster

Second Congressional District residents remain divided in their opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster. Thirty-five percent have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 30% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 6% are neutral, and 28% don't know enough about her to say. Kuster's net approval rating (+5%) has fallen since October 2018 (+18%).

Kuster is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +55%) and unpopular among Republicans (-39%) while Independents are neutral (+2%).

Ann Kuster (D) Favorability

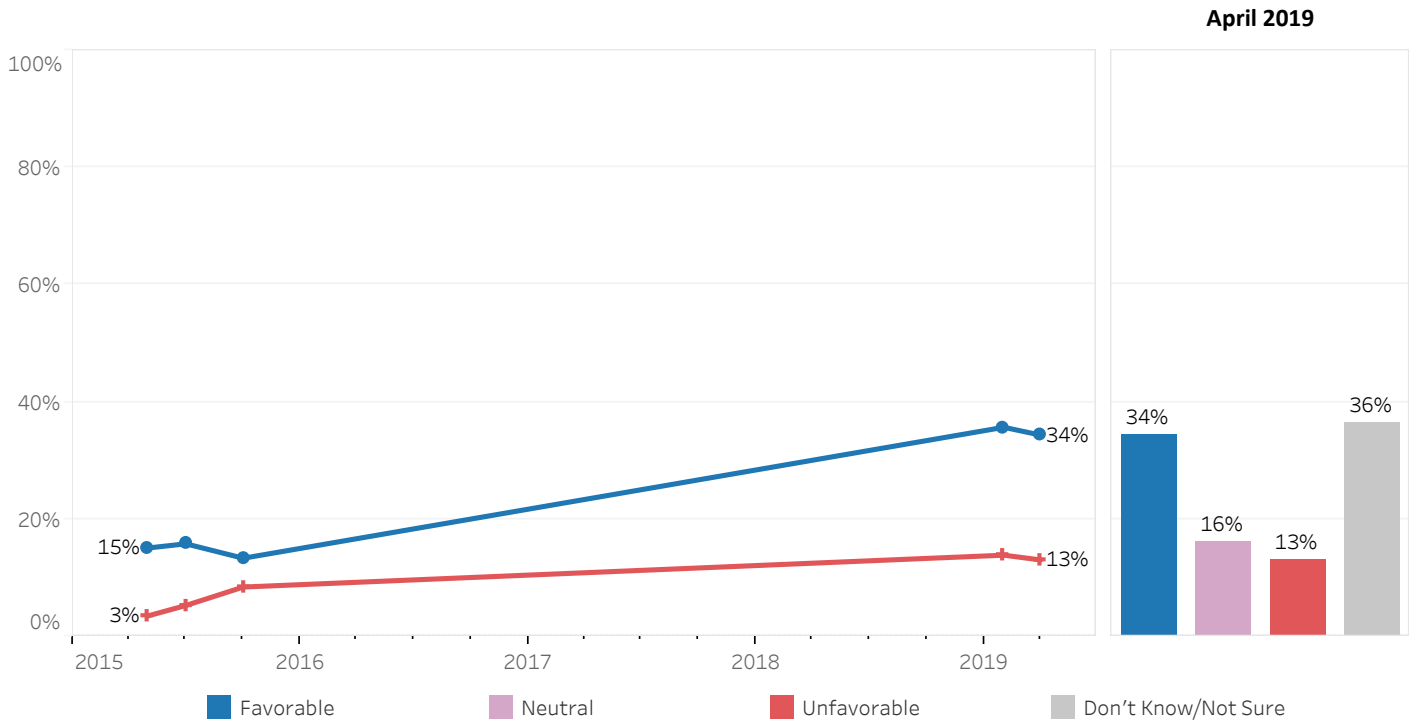


Favorability - Chris Pappas

Newly-elected Congressman Chris Pappas remains not very well-known among First Congressional District residents: 34% have a favorable opinion of Pappas, 13% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 16% are neutral, and 36% don't know enough about him to say. Pappas's net favorability rating (+21%) is largely unchanged since February (+22%).

Pappas is popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +49%) and somewhat popular (+21%) among Independents (+21%) but is somewhat unpopular (-13%) among Republicans.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred forty-nine (549) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between April 10 and April 18, 2019. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.2 percent. Included were two hundred sixty-nine (269) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 6.0%) and two hundred eighty (280) from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.9%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Rancho Santo Margarita, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
