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## SHAHEEN MAINTAINS FAVORABILITY IN NH; DECLARED GOP CHALLENGERS LARGELY UNKNOWN

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DURHAM, NH – As the 2020 Congressional elections approach, New Hampshire senator Jeanne Shaheen continues to enjoy high favorability, but residents are divided whether she should be reelected. Three of her declared Republican challengers have very low name recognition in the state. Representative Chris Pappas is somewhat popular in New Hampshire's First District, but residents are divided on whether he should be reelected. Second District residents are less positive about Representative Annie Kuster and a plurality would prefer that someone else be elected to Congress in 2020.

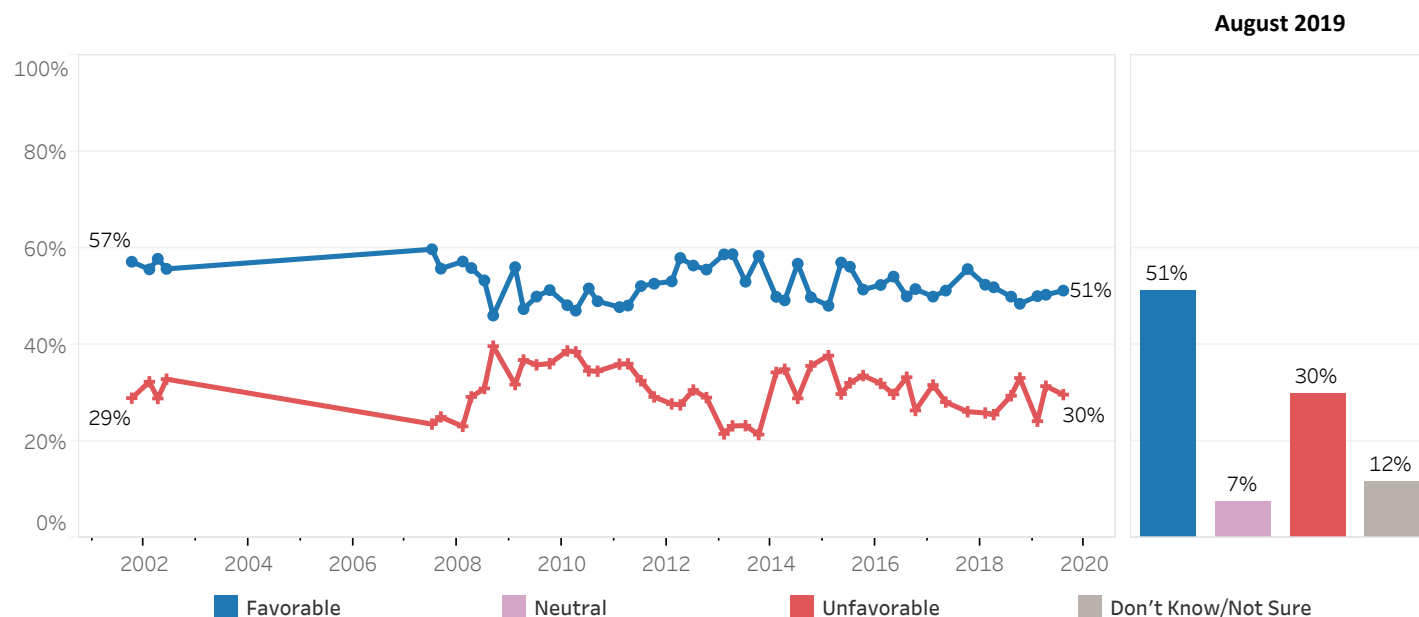
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll\***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred two (502) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between July 29 and August 8, 2019. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. Included were two hundred twenty-six (226) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 6.5%) and two hundred seventy-six (276) from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.9%).

### Favorability - Jeanne Shaheen

New Hampshire senior senator Jeanne Shaheen, who is running for re-election in 2020, remains popular in the state. Currently, 51% of New Hampshire adults have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 30% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 7% are neutral, and 12% don't know enough about her to say. Shaheen's favorability ratings have been near 50% since 2015.

Those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, local newspaper readers, NHPR listeners, those who have completed postgraduate work, self-described liberals, those who attend religious services once or twice a month, and those aged 65 and older are most likely to view Shaheen favorably. Conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, self-described conservatives, and those aged 18 to 34 are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Shaheen. Over the past year, the percentage of self-described liberals who have a favorable opinion of Shaheen has fallen by 14 points.

### Jeanne Shaheen (D) Favorability

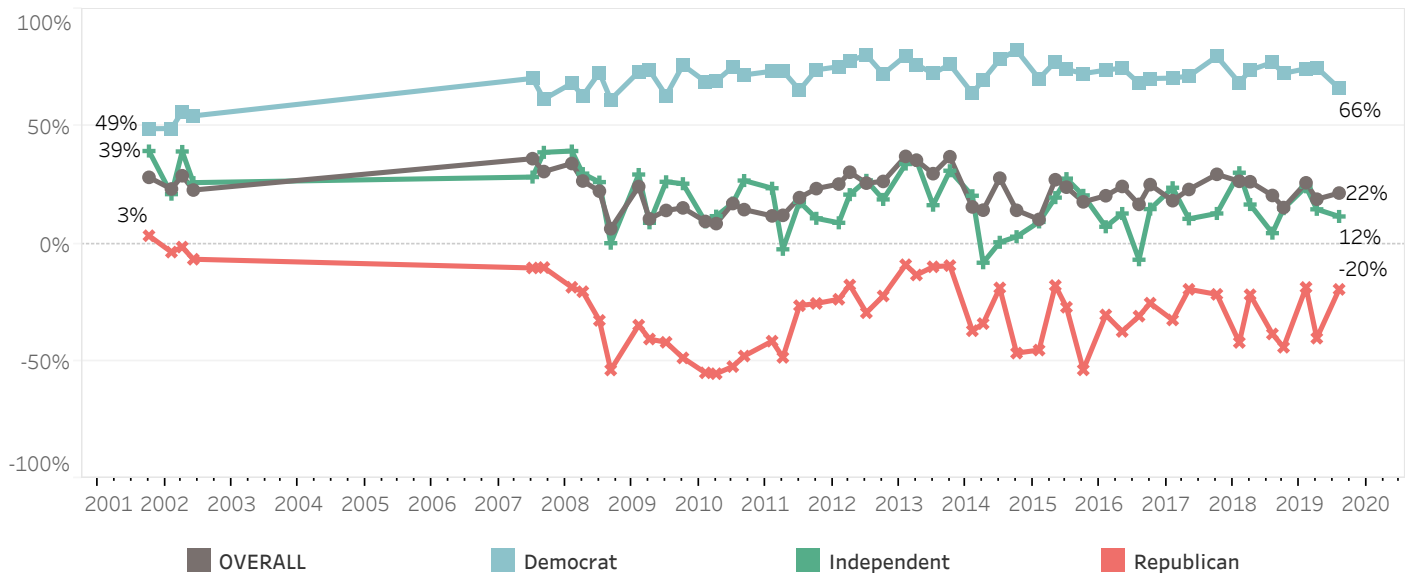

Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) is +22%, largely unchanged since April (+19%). She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +66%) and somewhat popular among Independents (+12%), while her popularity among Republicans (-20%) has increased since April (-40%).

### Net Favorability Rating - Jeanne Shaheen (D)

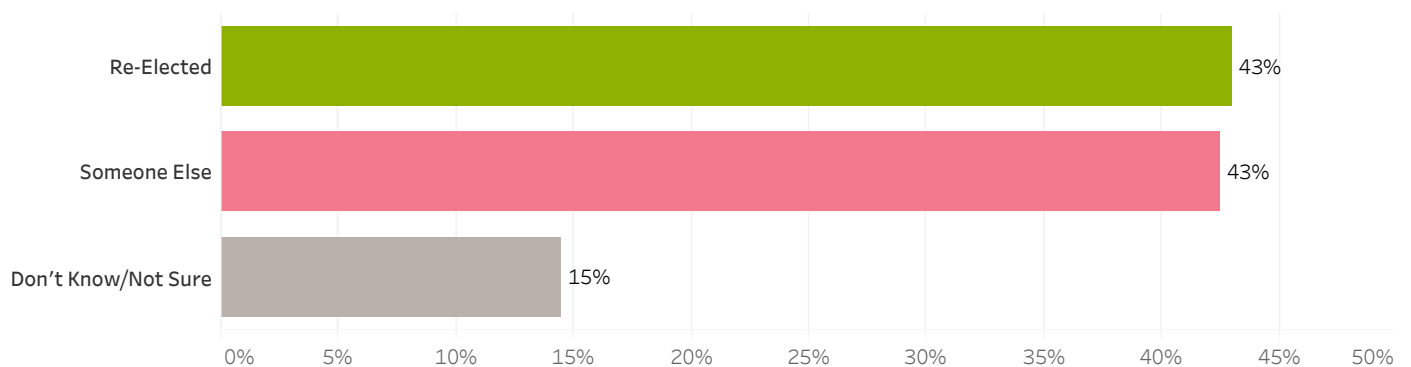
Net Favorability = (% Favorable - % Unfavorable)



While more than half of New Hampshire residents have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, respondents are divided on whether she should be reelected: 43% think Shaheen should be reelected to the Senate in 2020, another 43% think someone else should be elected, and 15% don't know or are unsure. New Hampshire residents ahead of her last reelection campaign in July of 2013 were more likely to favor her reelection: 51% said she should be reelected while 35% said someone else should be elected to the Senate.

Self-identified Democrats, those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, those who have completed postgraduate work, NHPR listeners, self-described liberals, those aged 65 and older, Connecticut Valley residents, and local newspaper readers are most likely to say Shaheen should be reelected, while self-identified Republicans, conservative radio listeners, self-described conservatives, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016, those who attend religious services once a week or more often, and gun owners are most likely to say someone else should be elected.

### Should Shaheen be Reelected or Should Someone Else be Elected?

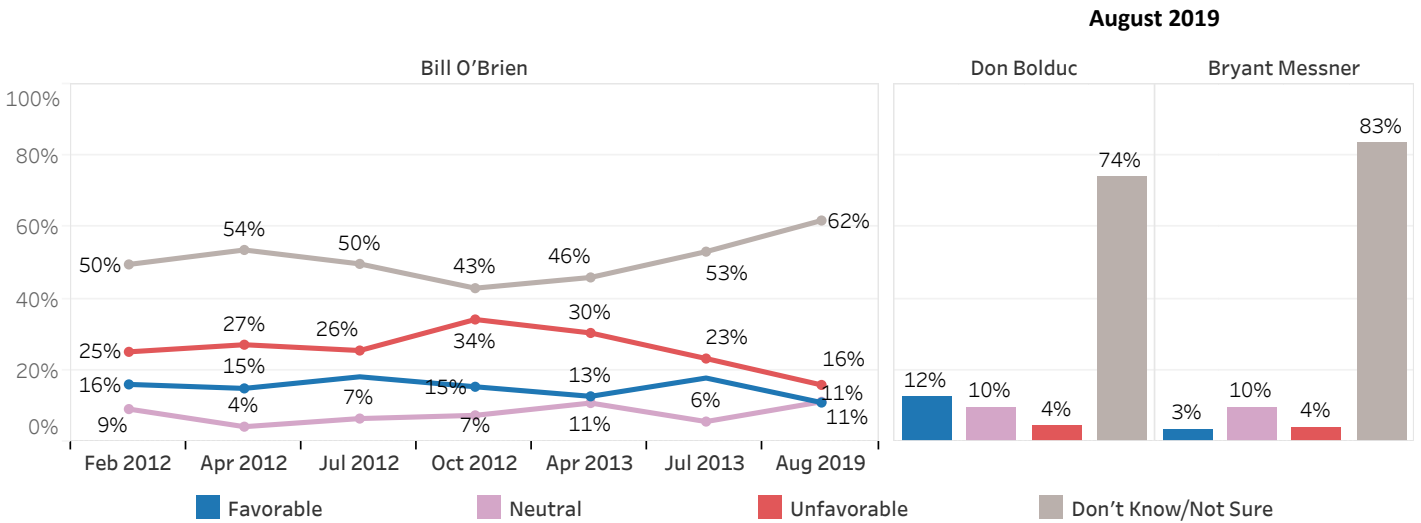


## Prospective 2020 Republican Senate Election Nominees

Former Speaker of the New Hampshire House Bill O'Brien, retired General Don Bolduc, and Attorney Bryant "Corky" Messner, have declared their candidacy for the Republican nomination for the 2020 Senate election against Shaheen. However, few New Hampshire residents have an opinion of them.

Eleven percent have a favorable opinion of O'Brien, 16% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11% are neutral, and 62% don't know enough about him to say. Twelve percent have a favorable opinion of Bolduc, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, 10% are neutral, and 74% don't know enough about him to say. Only 3% have a favorable opinion of Messner, 4% have an unfavorable opinion, 10% are neutral, and 83% don't know enough about him to say.

### Prospective Candidates Favorability

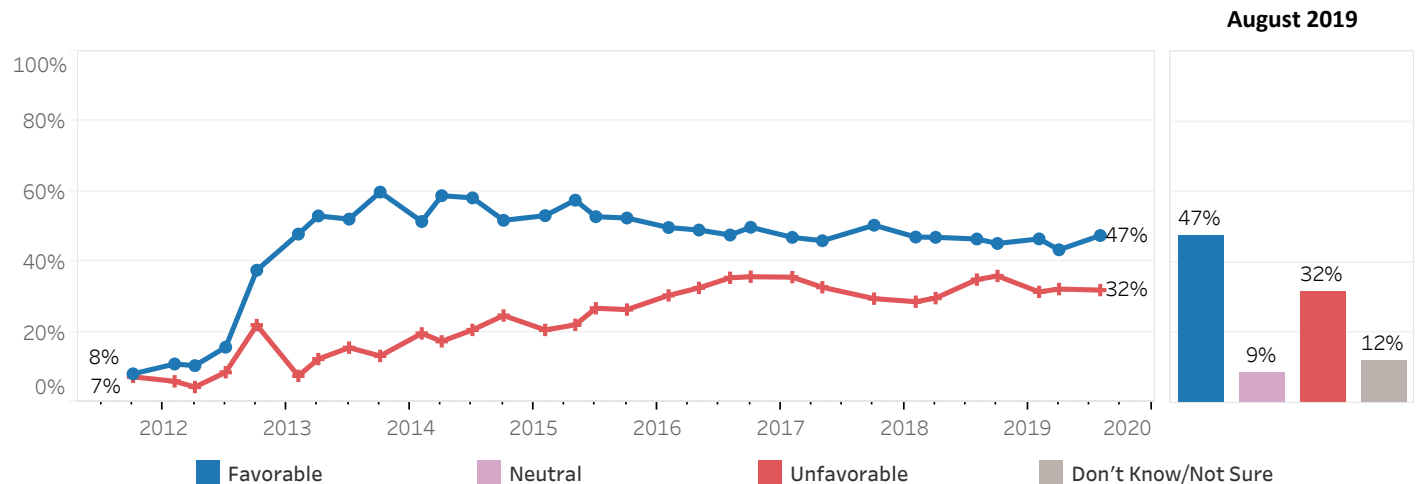


### Favorability - Maggie Hassan

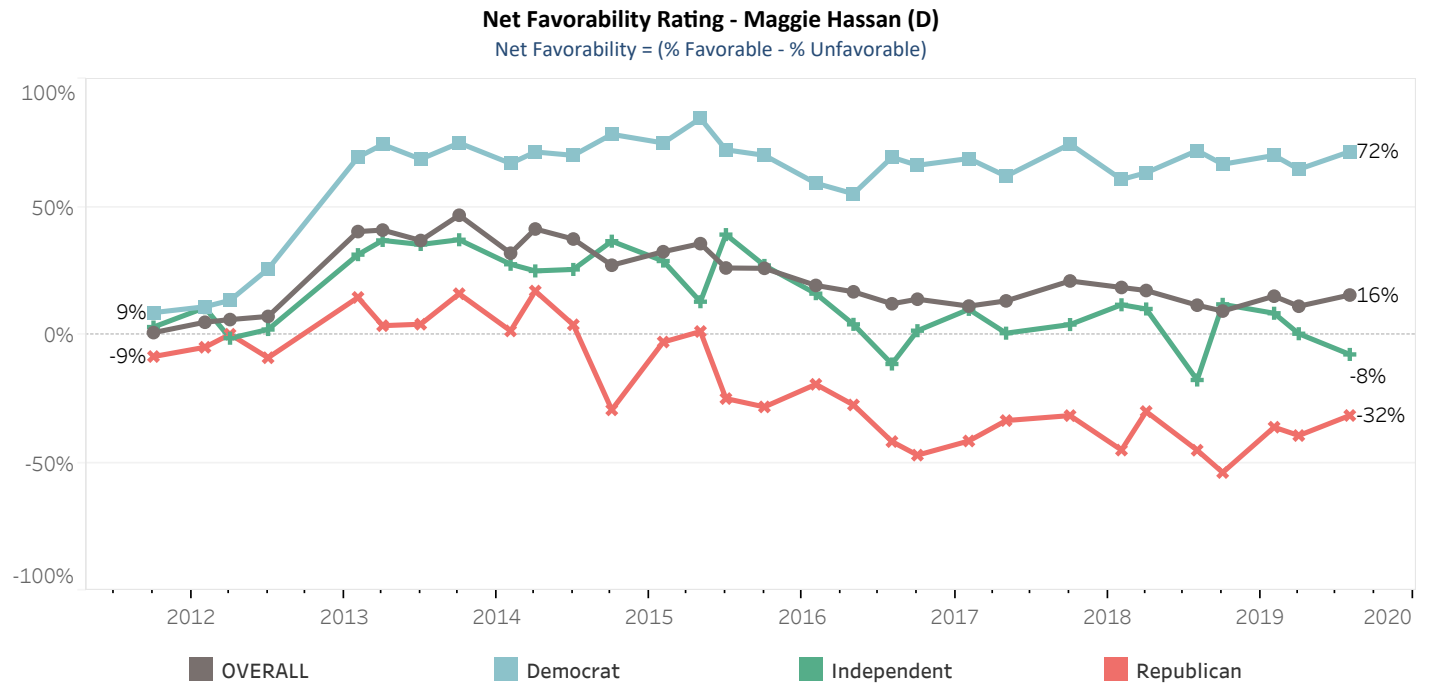
Forty-seven percent of New Hampshire residents have a favorable opinion of New Hampshire's junior senator Maggie Hassan, 32% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 9% are neutral, and 12% don't know enough about her to say. Hassan's favorability is virtually unchanged over the past year.

Self-identified Democrats, those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016, self-described liberals, NHPR listeners, those with a college degree or more education, local newspaper readers, those aged 65 and older, and Manchester Area residents are most likely to view Hassan favorably. Self-identified Republicans, conservative radio listeners, those who voted for Donald Trump in 2016 or did not vote, self-described conservatives, and those with a high school education or less are least likely to have a favorable opinion of Hassan.

### Maggie Hassan (D) Favorability



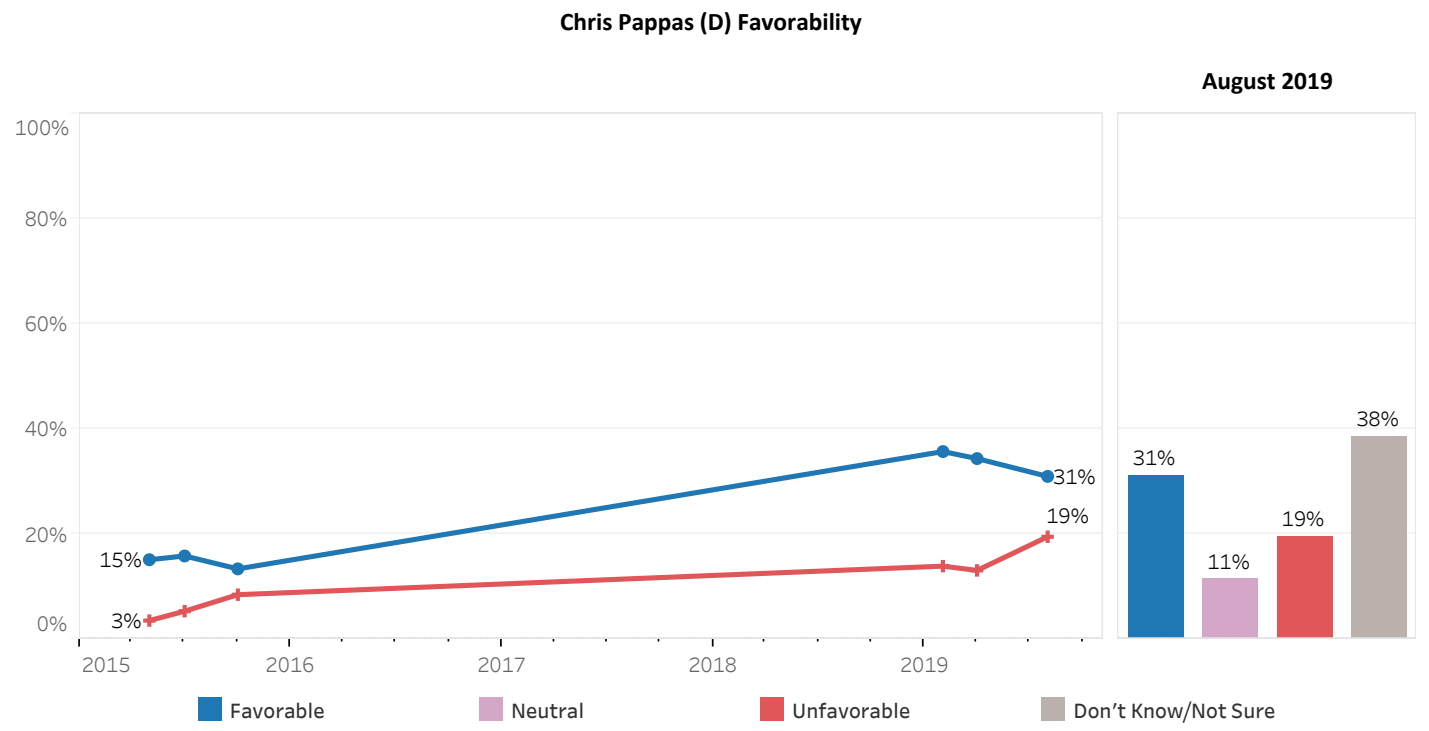
Hassan's net favorability rating is +16%, largely unchanged from +11% in April and +12% a year ago. She remains very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +72%) and unpopular among Republicans (-32%) while Independents (-8%) are largely neutral.



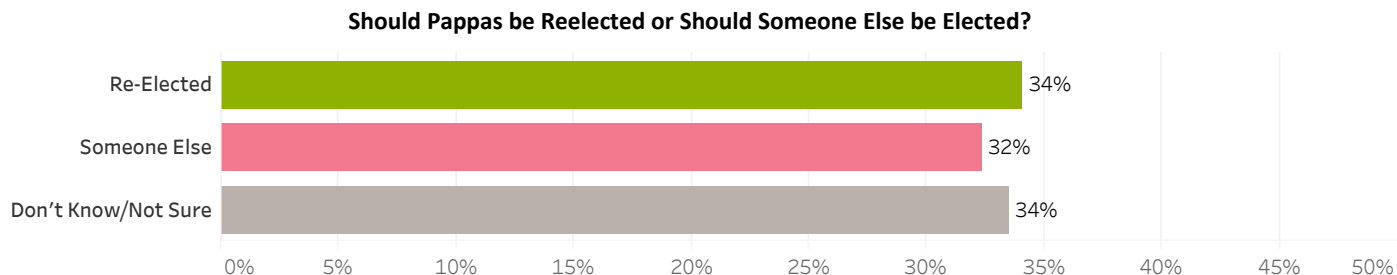
### Favorability - Chris Pappas

Thirty-one percent of First Congressional District have a favorable opinion of Congressman Chris Pappas, 19% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11% are neutral, and 38% don't know enough about him to say. Pappas's net favorability rating (+11%) has slightly declined since April (+21%).

Pappas is popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +34%) and Independents (+22%) but is somewhat unpopular (-20%) among Republicans.



First District residents are divided on whether Pappas should be reelected: 34% think Pappas should be reelected to Congress in 2020, 32% think someone else should be elected, and 34% don't know or are unsure.

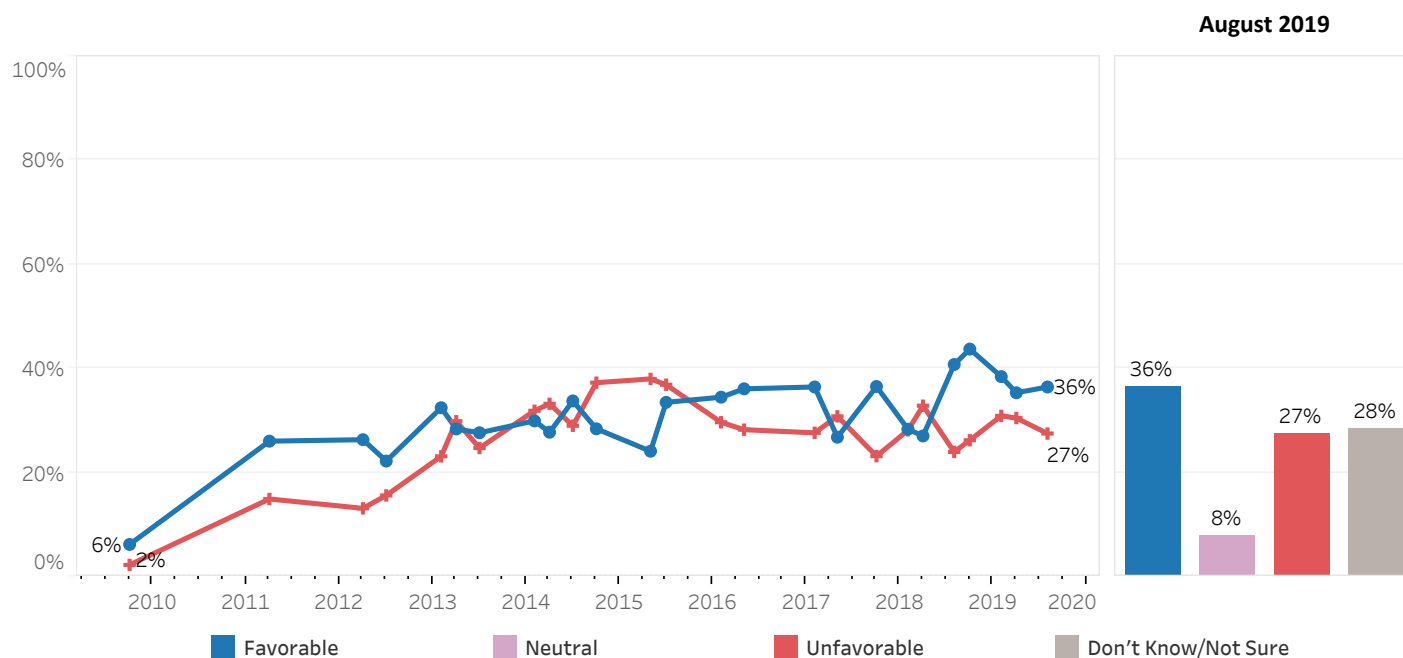


### Favorability - Ann Kuster

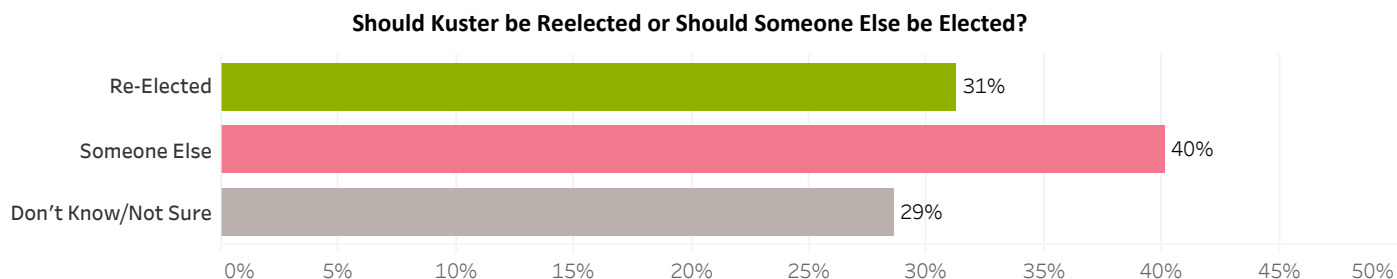
Thirty-six percent of Second Congressional District residents have a favorable opinion of Second District Congresswoman Ann Kuster, 27% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 8% are neutral, and 28% don't know enough about her to say. Kuster's net approval rating (+9%) is largely unchanged since April (+5%).

Kuster is very popular among Democrats (net favorability rating of +66%) but somewhat unpopular among Independents (-10%) and unpopular among Republicans (-38%).

A slight plurality of Second District residents (40%) would like to see someone other than Kuster elected to Congress in 2020. Thirty-one percent think Kuster should be reelected while 29% don't know or are unsure.



### Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred two (502) randomly selected New Hampshire adults were interviewed in English by landline and cellular telephone between July 29 and August 8, 2019. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.4 percent. Included were two hundred twenty-six (226) residents of New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE +/- 6.5%) and two hundred seventy-six (276) from the Second District (MSE +/- 5.9%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 1.2%.

The random sample used in the Granite State Poll was purchased from Scientific Telephone Samples (STS), Rancho Santo Margarita, CA. STS screens each selected telephone number to eliminate non-working numbers, disconnected numbers, and business numbers to improve the efficiency of the sample, reducing the amount of time interviewers spend calling non-usable numbers. When a landline number is reached, the interviewer randomly selects a member of the household by asking to speak with the adult currently living in the household who has had the most recent birthday. This selection process ensures that every adult (18 years of age or older) in the household has an equal chance of being included in the survey.

The data have been weighted to adjust for numbers of adults and telephone lines within households. Additionally, data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
