GRANITE STATERS APPROVE OF SUNUNU'S HANDLING OF CORONAVIRUS, STAY AT HOME ORDER


DURHAM, NH - Nine in ten Granite Staters approve of the job Governor Chris Sununu has done handling the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation. A similarly large majority support Sununu's "stay at home" order for the state. Granite Staters say maintaining the stay at home order is more important than re-opening the NH economy by a two-to-one margin. Majorities of Granite Staters believe that state beaches, gyms, and churches should be closed during the stay at home order, while a plurality believe that state parks should stay open during the order.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Panel*** survey, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and one hundred fifty-five (1,155) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between April 16 and April 20, 2020. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State. The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

Handling of Coronavirus (COVID-19) Situation by Governor Sununu

Nearly nine in ten New Hampshire residents (89%) approve of Governor Sununu's handling of the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation while just 7% disapprove and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Sununu's handling of the situation has increased by sixteen percentage points since March (73%).


Approval of Governor Sununu's Handling of Coronavirus (COVID-19) Situation

Large majorities of Republicans (93%), Independents (93%), and Democrats (86%) all approve of Sununu's handling of the coronavirus situation. Approval had differed much more along partisan lines in March.


Approval of Governor Sununu's Handling of Coronavirus (COVID-19) Situation - By Party Identification




Governor Sununu's Stay At Home Order

In mid-March, Governor Sununu issued a "stay at home" order for the state of New Hampshire, which is currently in effect until May 4th, 2020. The order requires New Hampshire residents to stay in their homes, with certain exemptions, and closes businesses in the state deemed to be non-essential. Most Granite Staters have seen, heard, or read about this order: 63% say a great deal, 31% a moderate amount, 5% only a little, and less than 1% say nothing at all.


How Much Seen, Heard, or Read About Stay At Home Order




Despite the inconvenience, four in five (81%) New Hampshire residents strongly (69%) or somewhat (13%) support Governor Sununu's stay at home order, 9% oppose it, 9% neither support nor oppose it, and 1% don't know or are unsure.



Support for the order is bi-partisan: 97% of Democrats, 82% of Independents, and 65% of Republicans support the order.




The large majority of Granite Staters (88%) believe it is very (65%) or somewhat (23%) important to maintain the stay at home order in New Hampshire to ensure public safety, 7% say it is not very important, and 5% say it is not at all important. Three-quarters (76%) say that re-opening the economy as soon as possible is very (35%) or somewhat (41%) important, 18% say it is not very important, and 6% say it is not at all important.




When asked to choose between these two policy options, two in three New Hampshire residents (68%) think that maintaining the stay at home order is more important than re-opening the economy, 29% think that re-opening the economy is more important than maintaining the stay at home order, and 4% are unsure which is more important.

Registered Democrats, self-identified Democrats, self-described liberals, *Boston Globe* readers, those who have completed postgraduate work, Seacoast residents, and North Country residents are more likely to feel that maintaining the stay at home order is more important than re-opening the economy. Registered Republicans, conservative radio listeners, self-identified Republicans, self-described conservatives, and those with a high school degree or less are more likely to feel that re-opening the NH economy is more important than maintaining the stay at home order.




What Should Be Open or Closed During NH Stay At Home Order

Under the current stay at home order, state beaches, gyms and other health clubs, and churches are closed, while state parks remain open. Granite State residents generally agree with these decisions: 49% believe state parks should be open during the order while 38% believe they should be closed, 31% believe state beaches should be open while 62% believe they should be closed, 17% believe churches should be open while 78% believe they should be closed, and 12% believe gyms and other health clubs should be open while 85% believe they should be closed.



There are significant partisan differences of opinion in what should be open during the NH stay at home order as Republicans and Independents are more likely than Democrats to be in favor of having each of the following open during the stay at home order.


What Should Be Open During NH Stay At Home Order - By Party Identification



Remote Learning In NH


As a result of the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation and the stay at home order, all New Hampshire public schools transitioned to remote learning where students are educated in their homes. A good deal of respondents have personal experience with remote learning as 33% are the parent or caregiver of a student who is learning through remote learning and 14% are a teacher, staff member, or administrator who is implementing remote learning.

Involvement in Remote Learning in New Hampshire




Granite Staters are generally positive about how well the NH Department of Education has implemented remote learning in the state; 29% say remote learning has been implemented very well, 36% say it has been implemented somewhat well, 5% say it has been implemented not very well, 2% say it has been implemented not well at all, and 28% don't know or are not sure.

Most Granite Staters have seen, heard, or read Governor Sununu discuss the state's response to the coronavirus situation through different sources; 65% say they have on television, 47% on social media, 42% on webpages, 25% on the radio, 24% in newspapers, and 6% through another source.

Granite State Panel Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Panel survey, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and one hundred fifty-five (1,155) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between April 16 and April 20, 2020. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire. Respondents to the Granite State Poll were asked if they wished to participate in further research and asked to provide an email address. Those who agreed and provided an email address were added to the panel. Panel members were also recruited by texting a random sample of cellular telephones in the state and inviting the recipient to take a short survey.

For each survey which they complete, panel members are entered into quarterly drawings to earn rewards, such as gift certificates from statewide and internet companies. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions.
