SHAHEEN AND SUNUNU LEAD CHALLENGERS IN REELECTION BIDS

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DURHAM, NH - Senator Jeanne Shaheen and Governor Chris Sununu hold large leads over their major challengers in their bids for reelection. Shaheen's leads over Republicans Don Bolduc and Corky Messner have remained steady since February. Sununu also has maintained wide leads over Democratic challengers Dan Feltes and Andru Volinsky.


These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Panel*** survey, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Two thousand twenty-two (2,022) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between July 16 and July 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2 percent. Included were one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three (1,893) likely 2020 general election voters (MSE = +/- 2.3%). Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

U.S. Senate Election

New Hampshire senior senator, Jeanne Shaheen, currently holds wide leads over her major Republican challengers for her second reelection bid. If the election were held today and her opponent was retired General Don Bolduc, 54% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 35% would vote for Bolduc, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 10% don't know or are undecided. Shaheen's 19 percentage point lead over Bolduc is slightly wider than it was in June (12 percentage points). If the election were held today and her opponent was Attorney Corky Messner, 54% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Shaheen, 35% would vote for Messner, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 11% don't know or are unsure. Shaheen's 19 percentage point lead over Messner is also slightly wider than it was in June (13 percentage points). There are no significant differences in the size or range of support for either Republican challenger, an indication that neither is particularly well known.

Shaheen is in a much better position in 2020 than she was in her last reelection fight. In August 2014, she and former Massachusetts senator Scott Brown were statistically tied. But 2014 was a midterm election with a Democratic president, and that led to big Republicans wins that year in New Hampshire and across the country. However, Shaheen managed to hold on for a narrow win over Brown.


2020 NH Senate Election

- Shaheen leads both Bolduc and Messner by 19 points in general election matchups.
- Shaheen leads Bolduc by 95 and Messner by 96 points among self-identified Democrats while Bolduc (+67) and Messner (+67) hold smaller leads among self-identified Republicans.
- Shaheen holds commanding leads over Bolduc and Messner among those aged 18 to 34 (+46 over Bolduc, +46 over Messner) and those aged 65 and older (+30 over Bolduc, +30 over Messner).
- Shaheen holds massive leads over Bolduc and Messner among women (+36 over Bolduc, +36 over Messner) while men are about evenly divided between Shaheen and either challenger.
- Shaheen's leads over Bolduc and Messner are particularly strong among men and women with a college degree.


2020 Senate Election - Difference in Support - July 2020



Senatorial Candidate Favorability


Forty-seven percent of New Hampshire likely voters say they have a favorable opinion of Shaheen, 34% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 16% are neutral, and 4% don't know or are unsure. Shaheen's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) is +13%, largely unchanged since June (+9%). Shaheen is very popular among Democrats (+79% net favorability rating) but very unpopular among Republicans (-60%) while Independents are neutral (-1%).

Shaheen (D) Favorability




Shaheen's challengers remain largely unknown to most New Hampshire likely voters, which is hampering their chances to win in November. Only 13% of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Bolduc, 16% are neutral, 18% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 54% don't know of him. Bolduc's net favorability rating is -5%, largely unchanged since June (-3%).

Among Republicans, 28% have a favorable opinion of Bolduc, 17% are neutral, 3% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 53% don't know of him, yielding a net favorability rating of +25%. The percentage of Republicans who have an opinion of Bolduc (47%) is unchanged since June (48%).



Messner is also relatively unknown to New Hampshire likely voters. Only 17% of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Messner, 15% are neutral, 26% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 43% don't know of him. Messner's net favorability rating is -9%. Messner has raised more money for his campaign for the GOP nomination than Bolduc and has spent much more than Bolduc on advertising over the past month. As a result, the percentage of New Hampshire adults who have an opinion, positive or negative, about Messner (57%) has increased considerably since June (36%).

Among Republicans, 36% have a favorable opinion of Messner, 17% are neutral, 7% have an unfavorable opinion, and 40% don't know of him, yielding a net favorability rating of +29%. Further evidence of his campaign spending is that the percentage of Republicans who have an opinion of Messner (60%) has increased significantly since June (39%).




New Hampshire Gubernatorial Election

Incumbent New Hampshire governor Chris Sununu holds large leads over two Democratic challengers. If the election were held today and his opponent was NH Senate Majority Leader Dan Feltes, 59% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Sununu, 28% would vote for Feltes, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 12% don't know or are undecided. Sununu holds a 31 percentage point lead over Feltes and has maintained a wide lead since Feburary.

If the election were held today and Sununu's opponent was Executive Councilor Andru Volinsky, 58% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Sununu, 29% would vote for Volinsky, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 12% don't know or are undecided. Sununu holds a 28 percentage point lead over Volinsky, down from a 40 point lead in June. Sununu's leads over both Feltes and Volinsky are nearly double the size of the leads he held over prospective opponents Molly Kelly and Steve Marchand during the summer of 2018.

2020 NH Gubernatorial Election




- Sununu leads Feltes by 31 points in a general election matchup and leads Volinsky by 28 points.
- Sununu holds very large leads over Feltes and Volinsky among self-identified Republicans and Independents, while Feltes holds only a 28 point lead over Sununu among Democrats and Volinsky holds only a 34 point lead.
- Sununu holds commanding leads over Feltes and Volinsky among those aged 50 to 64 and slightly smaller leads among those aged 35 to 49 and those aged 65 and older. Sununu holds a small lead over Feltes among those aged 18 to 34 while Volinsky holds a small lead over Sununu among this age group.
- Sununu holds large leads over Feltes and Volinsky among men, particularly those without a college degree, and slightly smaller leads over both candidates among women.



Gubernatorial Candidate Favorability

Sununu remains popular among New Hampshire likely voters - 56% say they have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 19% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 24% are neutral, and 1% don't know or are unsure. Sununu's net favorability rating is +37%, unchanged since June (+38%). Sununu is quite popular among Republicans (+82% net favorability rating) and Independents (+62%) but is somewhat unpopular among Democrats (-7%).






Feltes (D) Favorability


Sununu's challengers remain largely unknown to most New Hampshire likely voters. Only 13% of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Feltes, 20% are neutral, 16% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 51% don't know of him. Feltes's net favorability rating is -3%, largely unchanged since June (-6%).

Among Democrats, 26% have a favorable opinion of Feltes, 27% are neutral, 3% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 45% don't know of him, yielding a net favorability rating of +23%. As the primary campaign between Feltes and Volinsky has continued over the summer, the percentage of Democrats who have an opinion of Feltes has increased from 37% in June to 55% in July.



Only 14% of Granite Staters say they have a favorable opinion of Volinsky, 15% are neutral, 15% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 56% don't know of him. Volinsky's net favorability rating is -1%, up very slightly since June (-6%).

Among Democrats, 25% have a favorable opinion of Volinsky, 19% are neutral, 6% have an unfavorable opinion, and 50% don't know of him, yielding a net favorability rating of +19%. The percentage of Democrats who have an opinion of Volinsky (50%) has increased since June (35%).



Granite State Panel Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Panel survey, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Two thousand twenty-two (2,022) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between July 16 and July 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is \pm 2.2 percent. Included were one thousand eight hundred and ninety-three (1,893) likely 2020 general election voters (MSE = \pm 2.3%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.3%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 5,500 New Hampshire adults were recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center. The response rate for the July 2020 Granite State Panel is 38%.

The number or respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
