RESIDENTS DIVIDED ON REOPENING SCHOOLS; WIDE PARTISAN GAPS IN COMFORT WITH PUBLIC ACTIVITIES

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DURHAM, NH - New Hampshire residents are divided on reopening schools in the fall with equal support for entirely in-person and entirely remote learning while a plurality support a mix of the two. Residents are only somewhat more comfortable participating in most public activities than they were in June but large partisan gaps persist. An increasing number of Granite Staters say they know someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19.

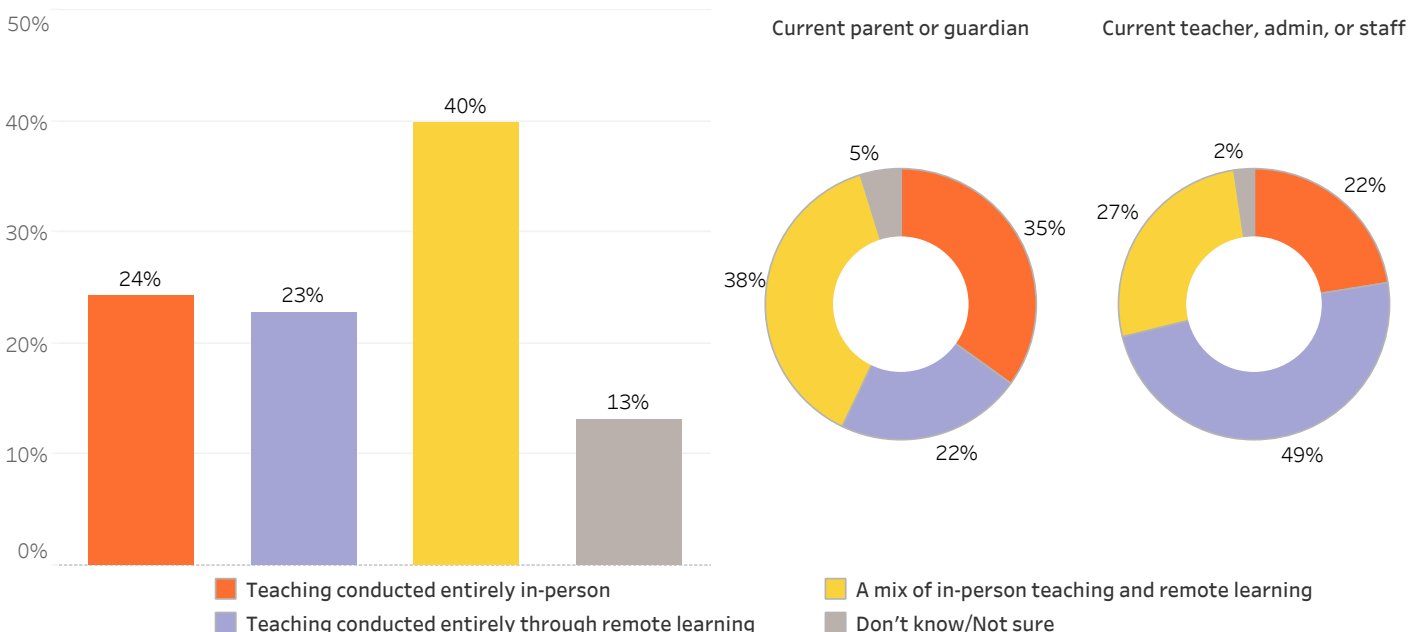
These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Panel*** survey, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Two thousand twenty-two (2,022) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between July 16 and July 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2 percent. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State. The Granite State Panel is a probability-based web panel recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire. Individual surveys are completed by panel members by computer, tablet, or smart phone.

K-12 Education in NH

New Hampshire schools are considering a range of options for educating students in the coming school year while coping with COVID-19. When asked broadly how they would prefer teaching be conducted at their local K-12 public school, a quarter (24%) of New Hampshire residents would like teaching to be conducted entirely in-person, 23% would like it to be conducted entirely through remote learning, 40% would prefer a mix of in-person teaching and remote learning, and 13% don't know or are unsure.

Parents and guardians of K-12 students (N=384) are slightly more in favor of in-person teaching: 35% prefer in-person instruction, 22% prefer entirely remote learning, and 38% would prefer a mix. By contrast, half (49%) of K-12 teachers, administrators, and staff (N=110) prefer remote learning, only 22% prefer in-person teaching, and 27% would prefer a mix.

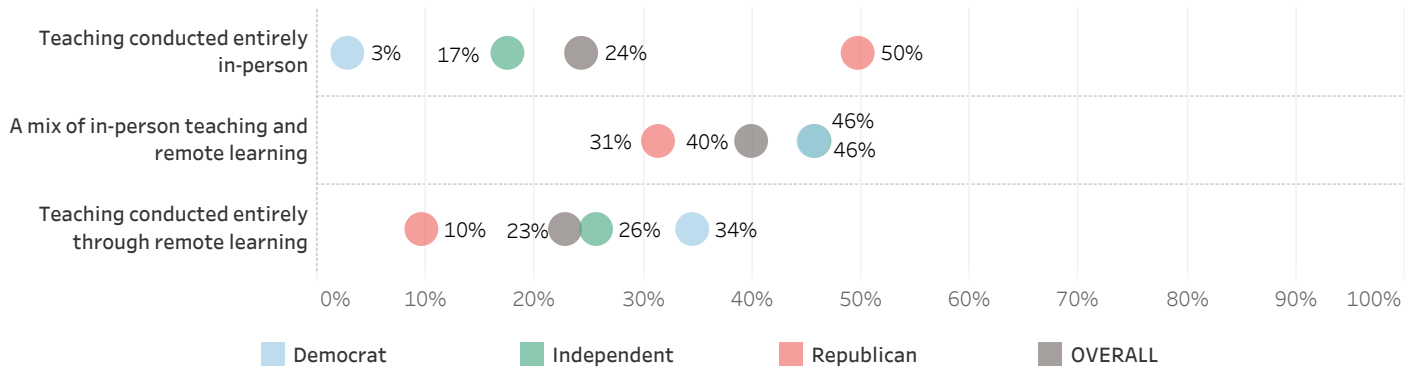
Preferred K-12 Teaching Method at Local Public School

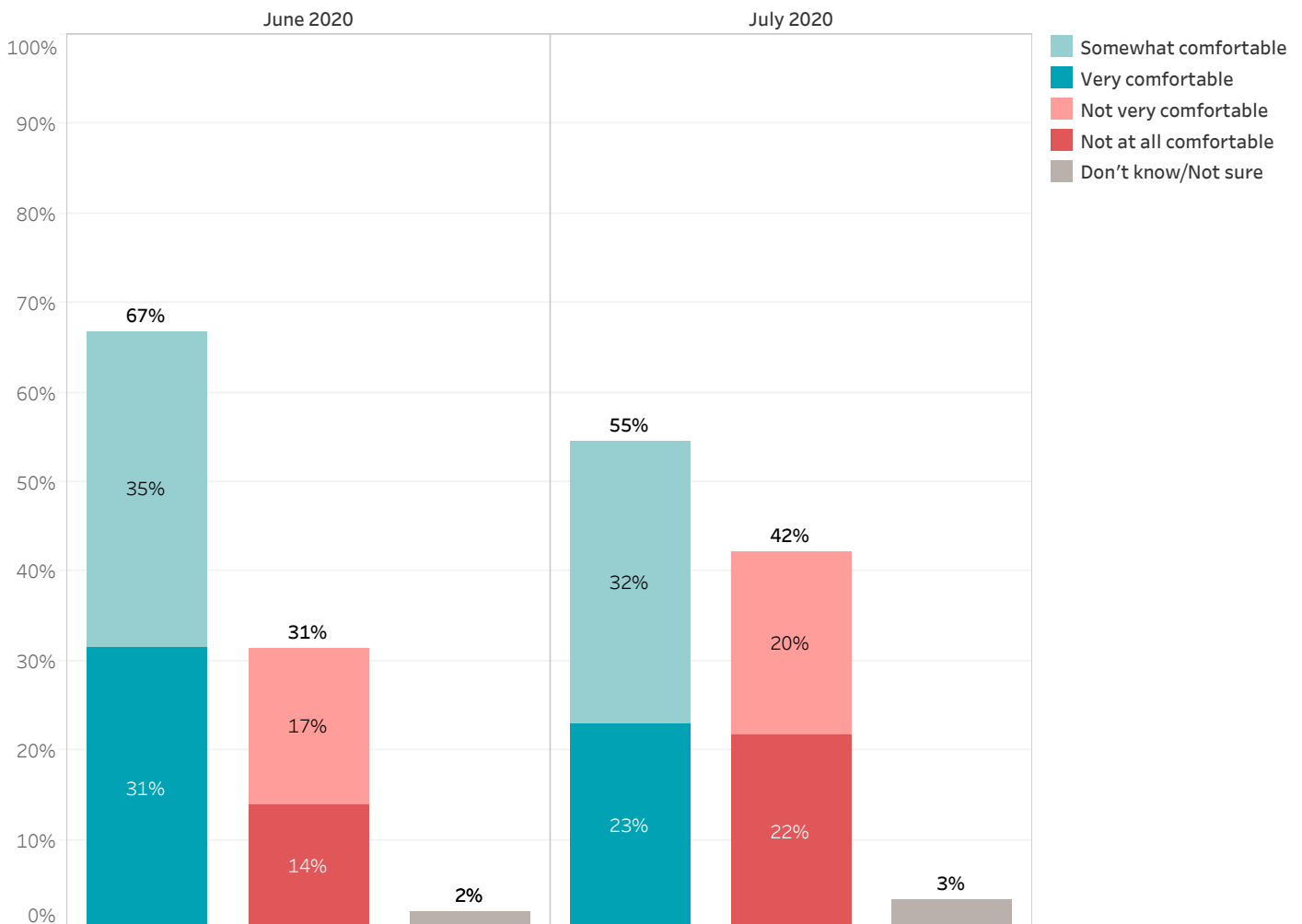
Republicans and Democrats have markedly different opinions on school instruction. Among Republicans, half (50%) prefer in-person teaching, only 10% prefer instruction to be conducted entirely through remote learning, and 31% would prefer a mix of the two. By contrast, one-third (34%) of Democrats prefer teaching be conducted entirely through remote learning, only 3% would prefer it be done entirely in-person, and 46% would prefer a mix of the two. Independents are more divided: 17% prefer in-person teaching only, 26% prefer remote learning only, and 46% prefer a mix of the two. Preferred K-12 Teaching Method at Local Public School - By Party Identification - July 2020



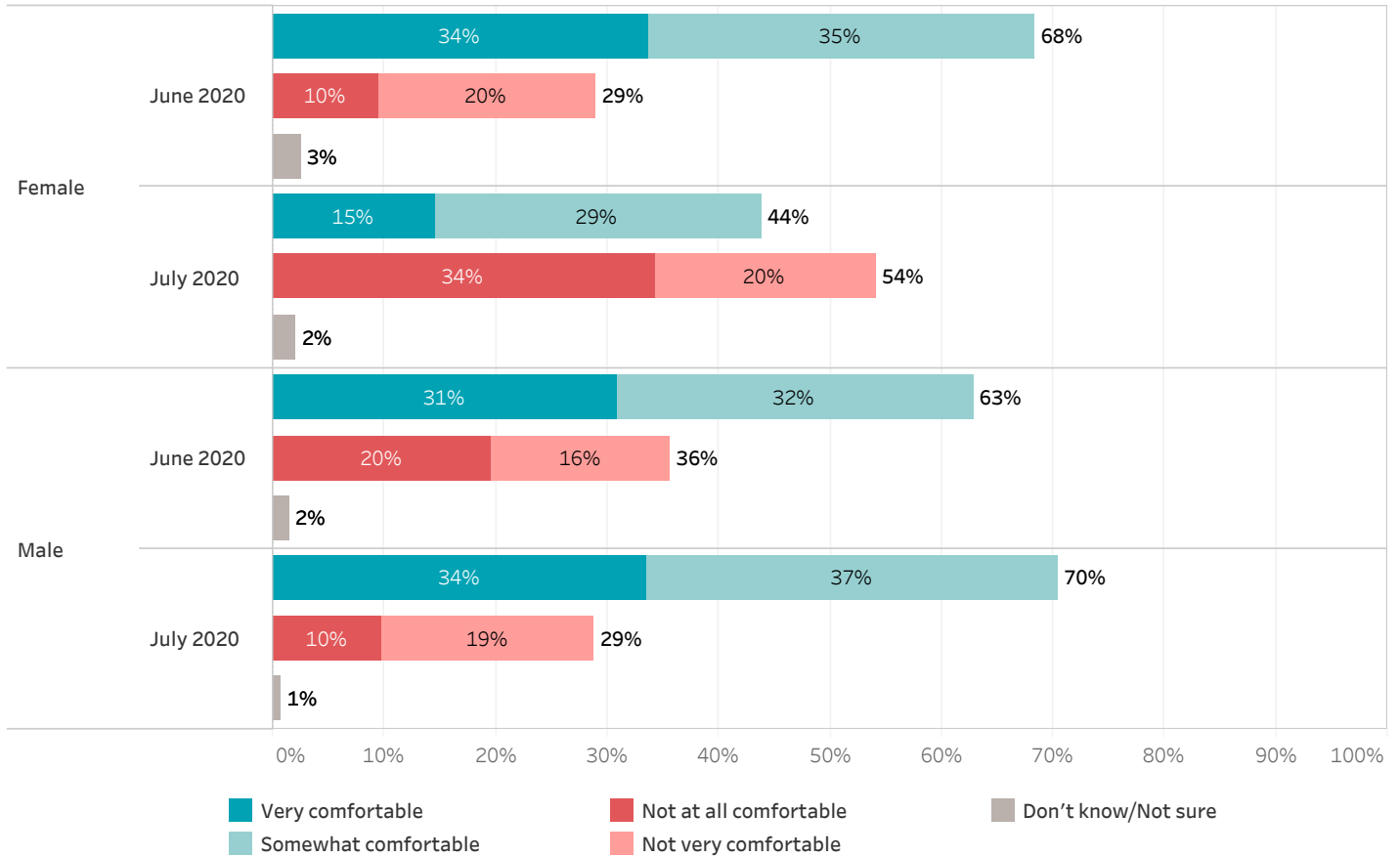
Among parents and guardians of K-12 students (N=384), just over half (55%) say they are very (23%) or somewhat (32%) comfortable sending their child or children to their local public school when classes begin later this summer, 42% say they are not very (20%) or not at all (22%) comfortable sending their children back to school, and 3% don't know or are unsure. The percentage of parents and guardians who are comfortable sending their child or children back to school has declined since June (67%).

Comfort with sending one's children back to school differs markedly by gender among New Hampshire parents and guardians. Only 44% of women say they are very (15%) or somewhat (29%) comfortable sending their children back to school while more than half (54%) say they are not very (20%) or not at all (34%) comfortable doing so. By contrast, 70% of men say they are very (34%) or somewhat (37%) comfortable sending their children back to school and only 29% are not very (19%) or not at all (10%) comfortable doing so. In June, women and men were about equally comfortable sending their children back to school, but since that time, women have become a good deal less comfortable and men have become slightly more comfortable.

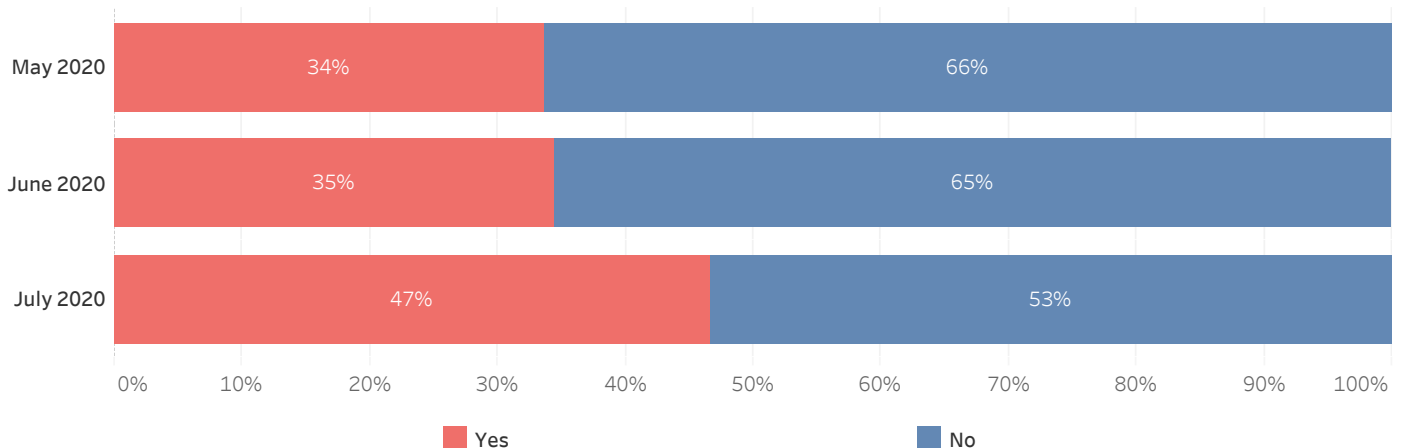
How Comfortable Sending Child or Children to Local Public School for New School Year - By Gender



Personal Experience with COVID-19

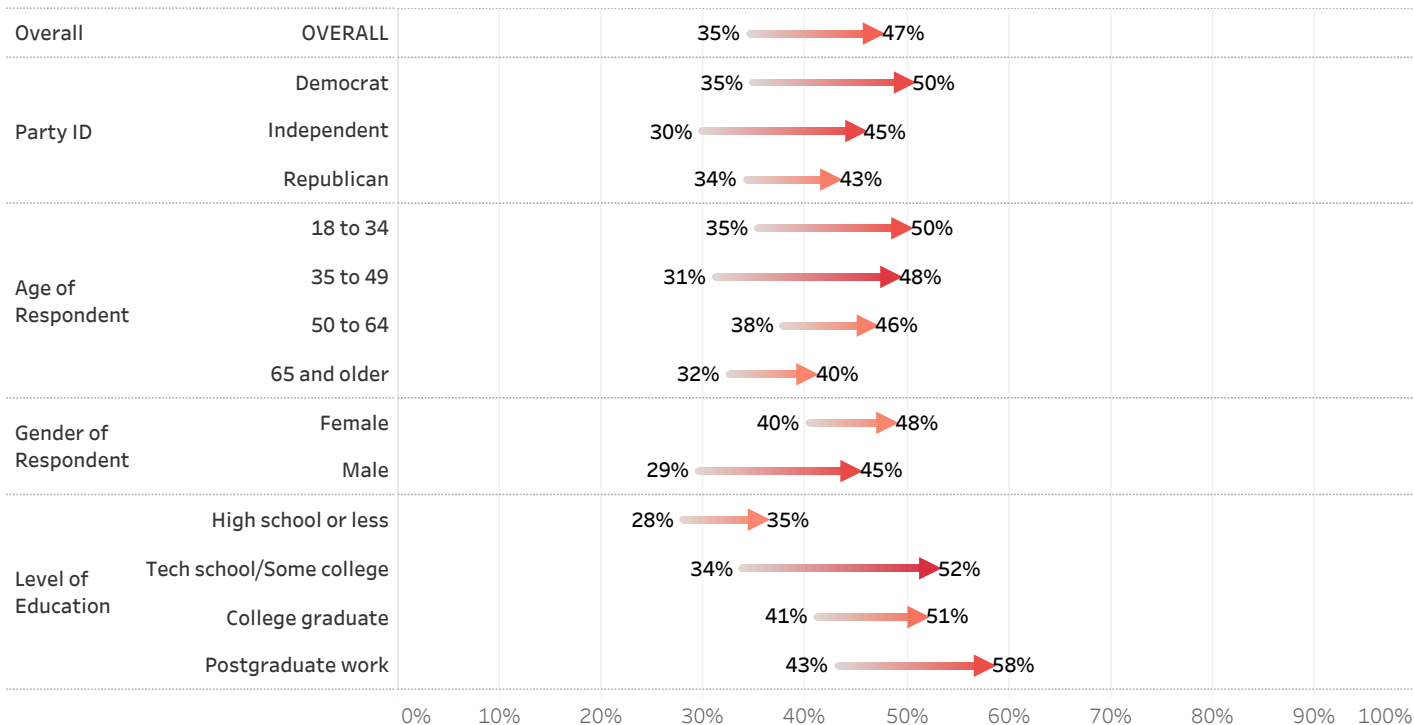
Nearly half (47%) of New Hampshire residents say that they know someone who has contracted COVID-19 while 53% do not know anyone who has. The percentage who know someone who has contracted COVID-19 has increased since June (35%) and May (34%).

Respondents from all of the groups below are more likely than in June to know someone who has contracted COVID-19, with the large increases among self-identified Democrats and Independents, as well as those aged 18 to 49 and men.

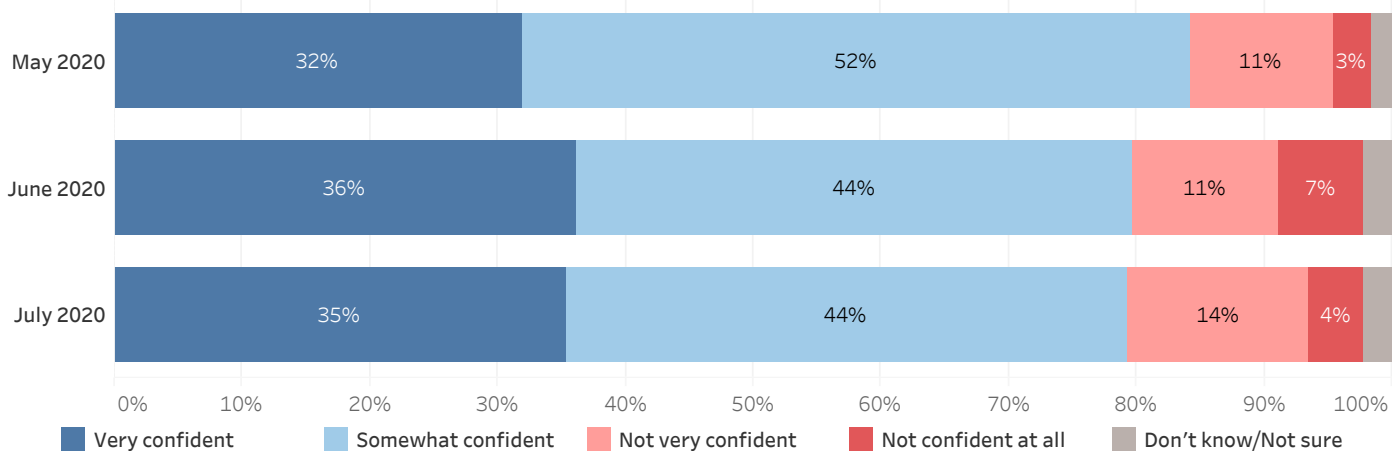
Know Anyone Who Has Contracted COVID-19 - Change from June to July 2020



More than three-quarters (79%) of Granite Staters say that they are very (35%) or somewhat (44%) confident in the state government's ability to respond effectively to the COVID-19 crisis. Fourteen percent say they are not very confident, 4% are not confident at all, and 2% don't know or are unsure. This confidence is largely bipartisan: 71% of Democrats, 76% of Independents, and 90% of Republicans are confident in the government's ability to respond effectively.

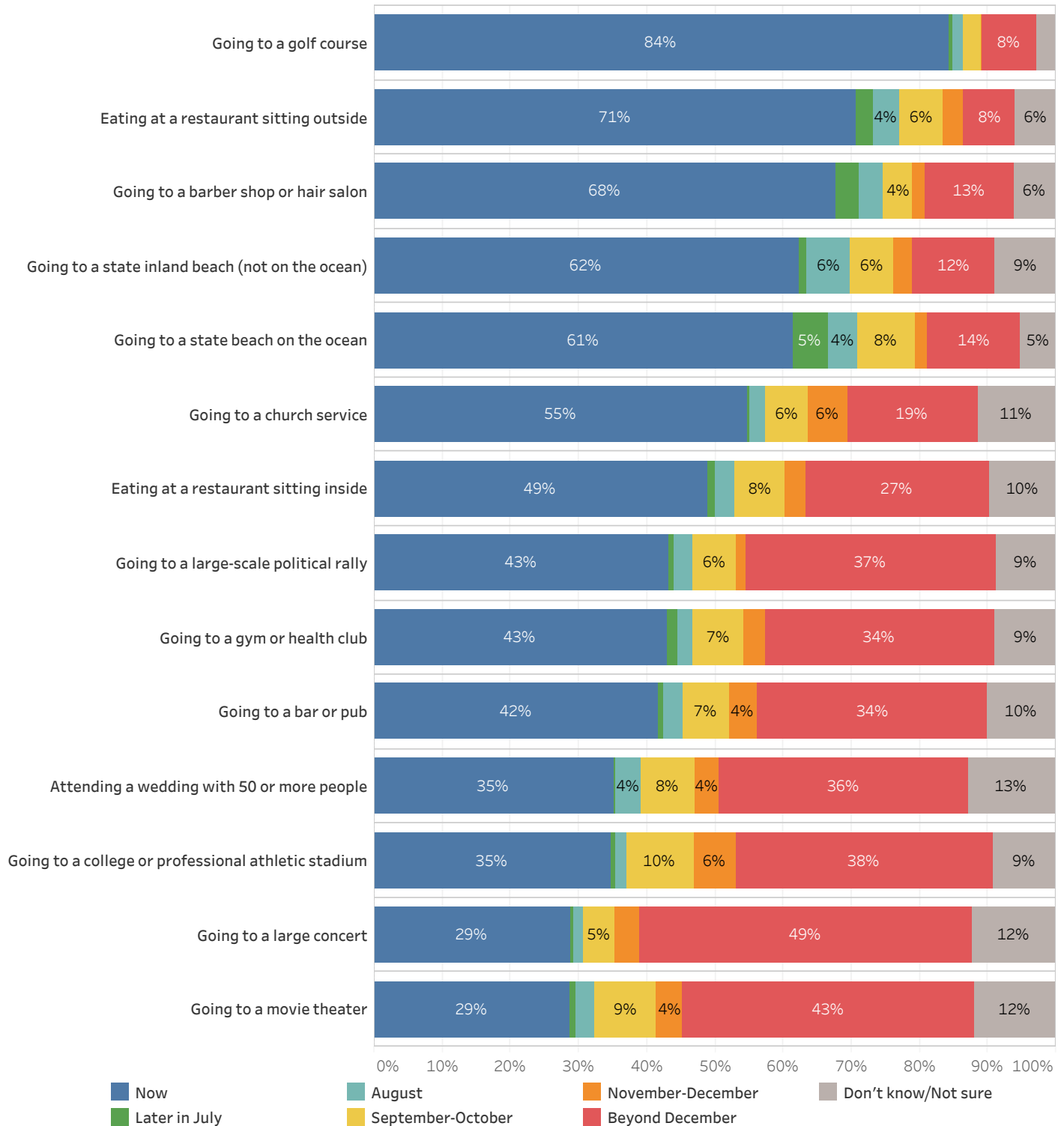
Confidence in the state government's ability to respond effectively contrasts sharply with Granite Staters' confidence in the federal government. Only 36% are very or somewhat confident in the federal government's ability to respond effectively, compared to 79% who are confident in the state government.

Confidence in State Government's Ability to Respond Effectively to COVID-19 Crisis



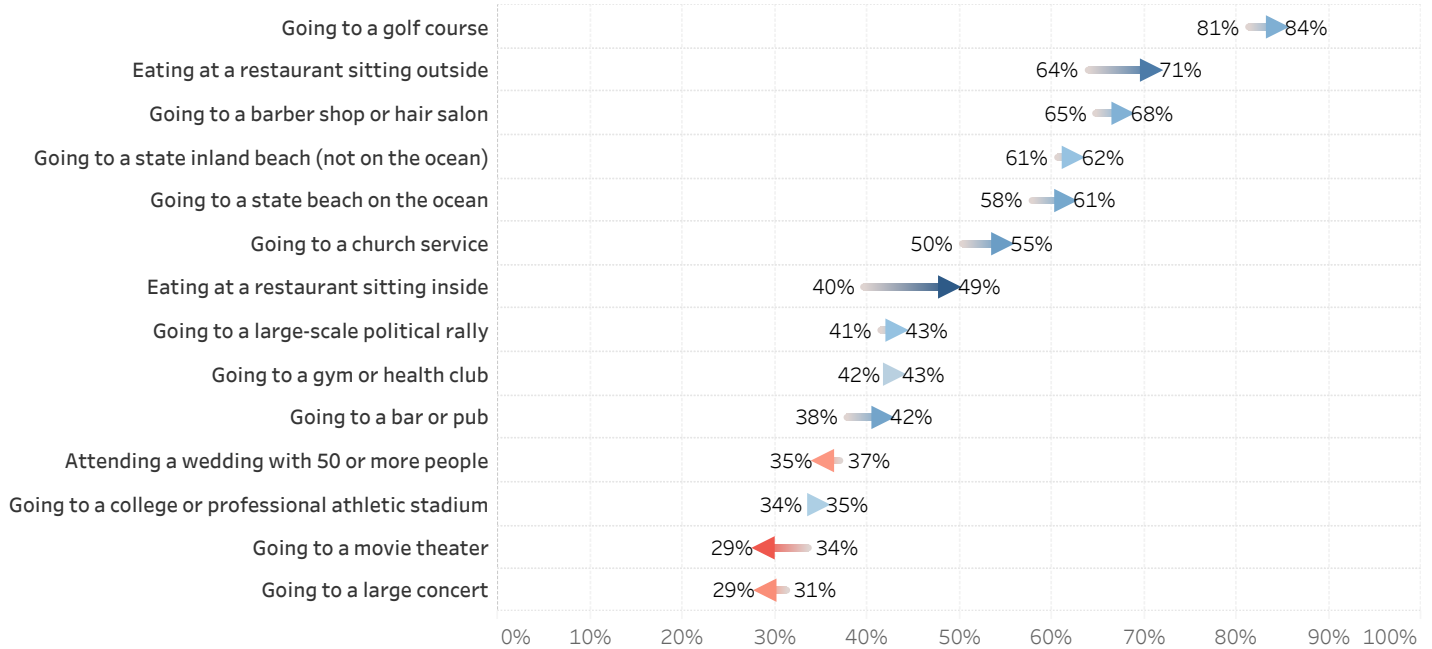
Respondents were asked when they would be comfortable engaging in several activities outside of their homes. Majorities of New Hampshire residents who plan to participate in the activity are currently comfortable going to a golf course (84%), eating outdoors at a restaurant (71%), going to a barber shop or hair salon (68%), going to a state inland beach (62%), going to a state beach on the ocean (61%), and going to a church service (55%). Slightly fewer respondents are currently comfortable eating indoors at a restaurant (49%), going to a large political rally (43%), going to a gym or health club (43%), or going to a bar or pub (42%). Most residents are still not comfortable attending a wedding with 50 or more people (35% comfortable now), going to a college or professional athletic stadium (35%), going to a large concert (29%), or going to a movie theater (29%). One-third or more of respondents say they will not be comfortable doing these things until sometime in 2021.

When Expect to Feel Comfortable Going to or Doing Following Things - July 2020



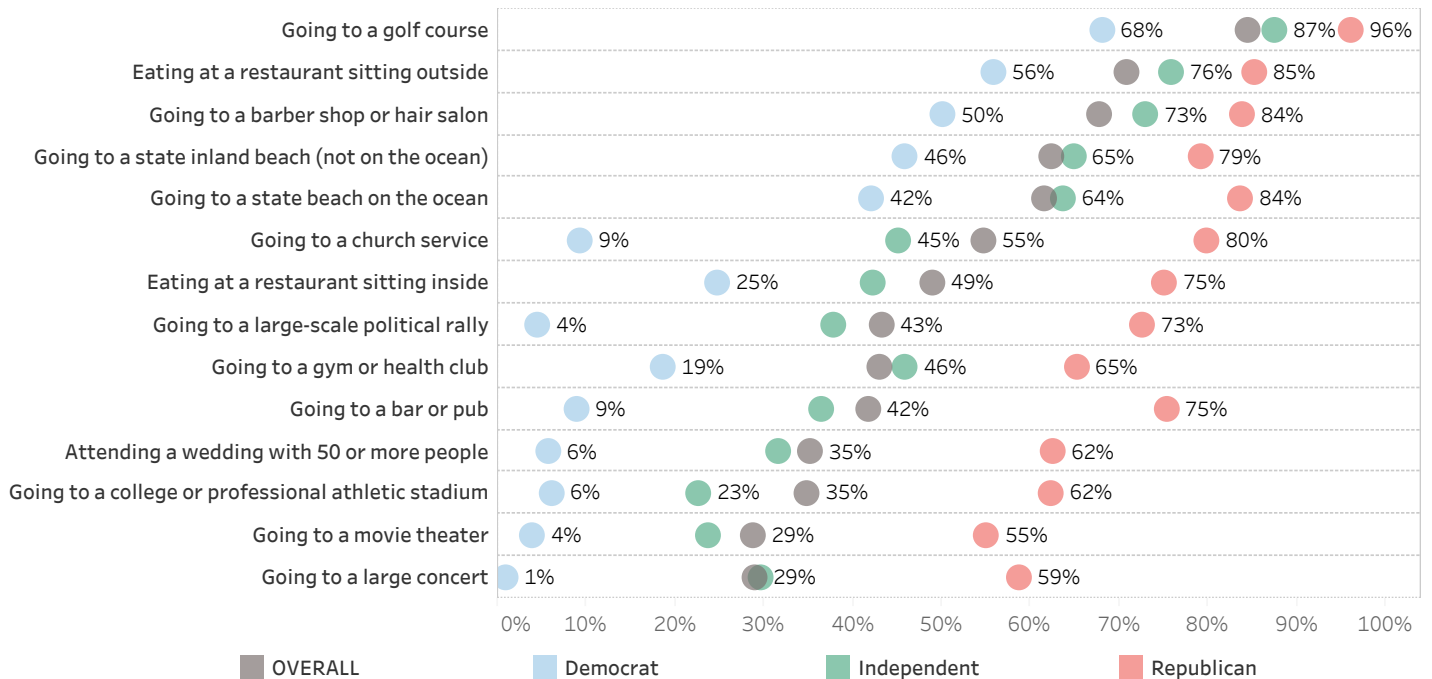
Granite Staters are slightly more comfortable currently participating in many of these activities than they were in June. The percentage of respondents who plan to do these things who are currently comfortable eating indoors at a restaurant (+9) and eating at a restaurant sitting outside (+7) have increased the most since June. Most other activities have experienced only small increases in the percentage of residents comfortable engaging in them, while slightly fewer (-5) residents than in June say they are currently comfortable going to a movie theater.

Currently Comfortable Going to or Doing Following Things - Change from June to July 2020



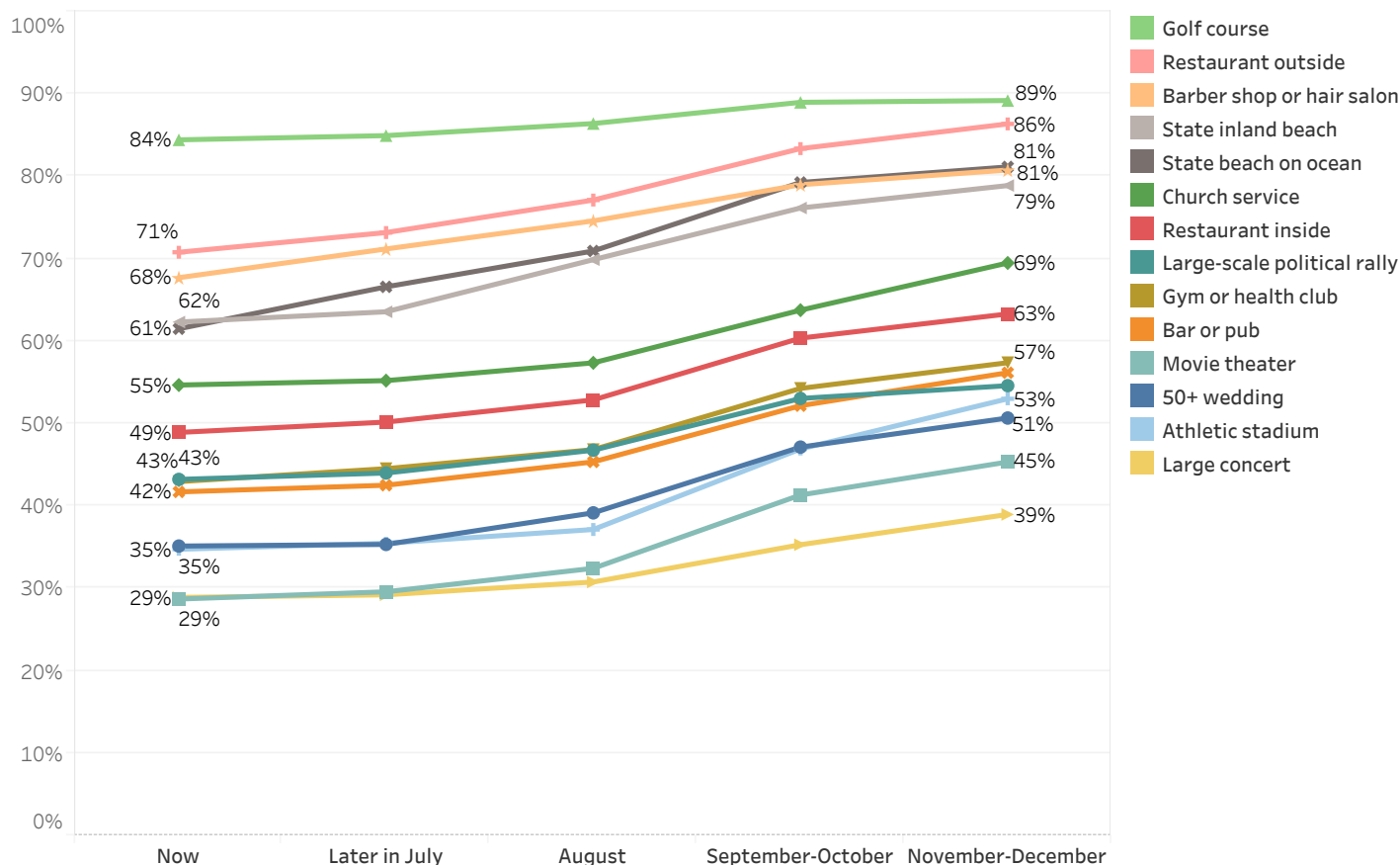
As in June, Democrats and Republicans have very different comfort levels engaging in these activities. More than half of Republicans are currently comfortable participating in all of these activities, while less than half of Democrats are comfortable participating in all but three. Republicans are 71 percentage points more likely than Democrats to say they are currently comfortable going to a church service and are similarly far more likely than Democrats to be comfortable going to a large-scale political rally (+68), going to a bar or pub (+66), going to a large concert (+58), attending a wedding with 50 or more people (+57), and going to a college or professional athletic stadium (56%).

Currently Comfortable Doing the Following Things - July 2020 - By Party Identification

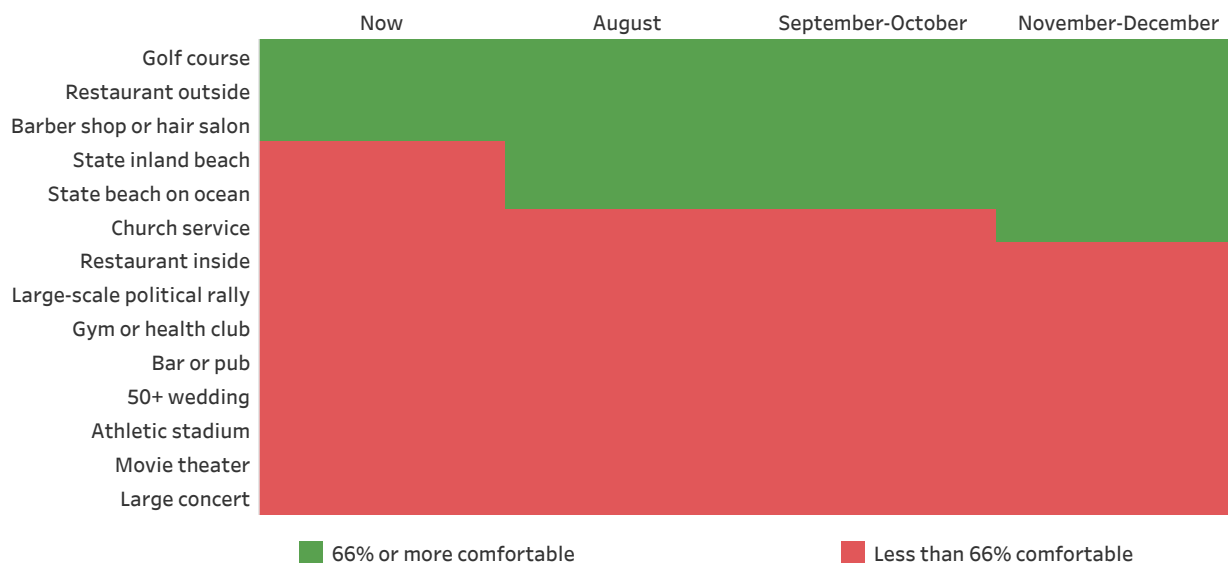


While Granite Staters are becoming slightly more likely to be comfortable participating in these activities, a significant percentage of Granite Staters expect that they will still not be comfortable doing many of these activities even months from now. This could significantly slow economic recovery in the state. Currently, at least two-thirds of state residents are comfortable going to a golf course, eating outside at a restaurant, and going to a barber shop or hair salon. By August, at least two-thirds say they will feel comfortable going to an inland beach and to a state beach on the ocean, and by November or December, at least two-thirds say they will be comfortable going to a church service. However, less than two-thirds expect even by December that they will be comfortable eating inside at a restaurant or going to a large-scale political rally, a gym or health club, a bar or pub, a wedding with fifty or more people, a college or professional athletic stadium, a movie theater, or a large concert.

Granite State Panel Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Panel survey, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Two thousand twenty-two (2,022) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between July 16 and July 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.3%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 5,500 New Hampshire adults were recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center. The response rate for the July 2020 Granite State Panel is 38%.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
