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SUNUNU KEEPS HIGH APPROVAL, LEADS FELTES IN NH GOVERNOR RACE

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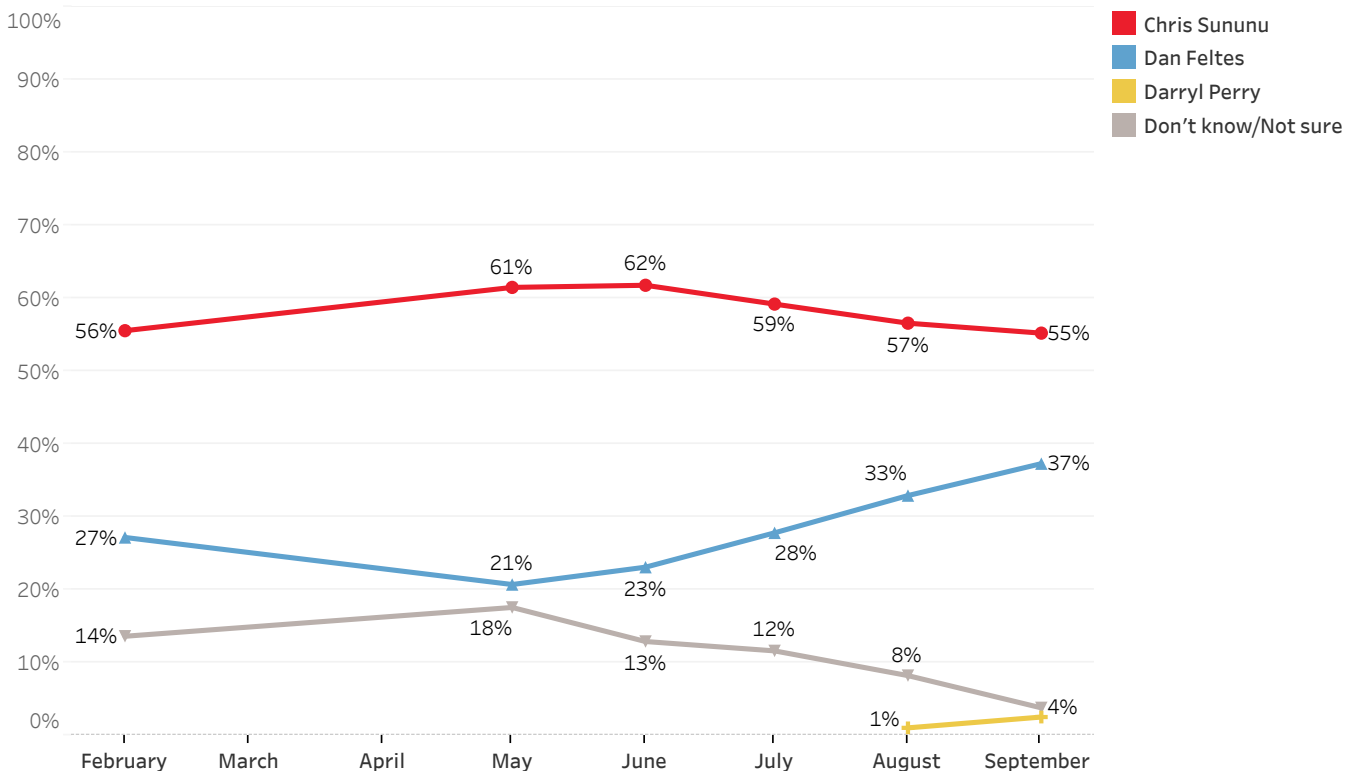
DURHAM, NH – Governor Chris Sununu maintains a comfortable lead over State Senate Majority Leader Dan Feltes. More than seven in ten approve of his overall job performance and his handling of the COVID-19 pandemic.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and thirty (1,030) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 24 and September 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. Included were 972 likely 2020 general election voters (MSE = +/- 3.1%). Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State and 2016 election results in NH. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

2020 New Hampshire Gubernatorial Election

New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu continues to lead Democratic nominee and State Senate Majority Leader Dan Feltes with only five weeks to go until election day. If the election were held today, 54% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Sununu while 35% would vote for Feltes, 1% would vote for Libertarian Darryl Perry, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 9% don't know or are undecided. When those who are leaning towards a candidate are included, 55% support Sununu, 37% support Feltes, and 3% support Perry. Sununu's lead over Feltes (+18 percentage points) has slightly declined since August (+24).

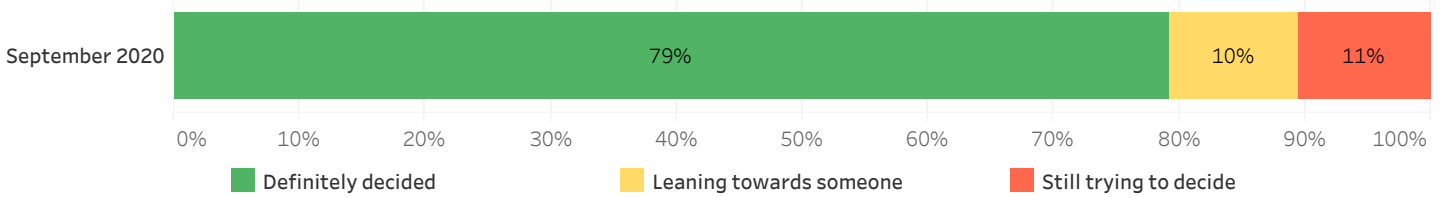
2020 Gubernatorial Election (With Leaners)

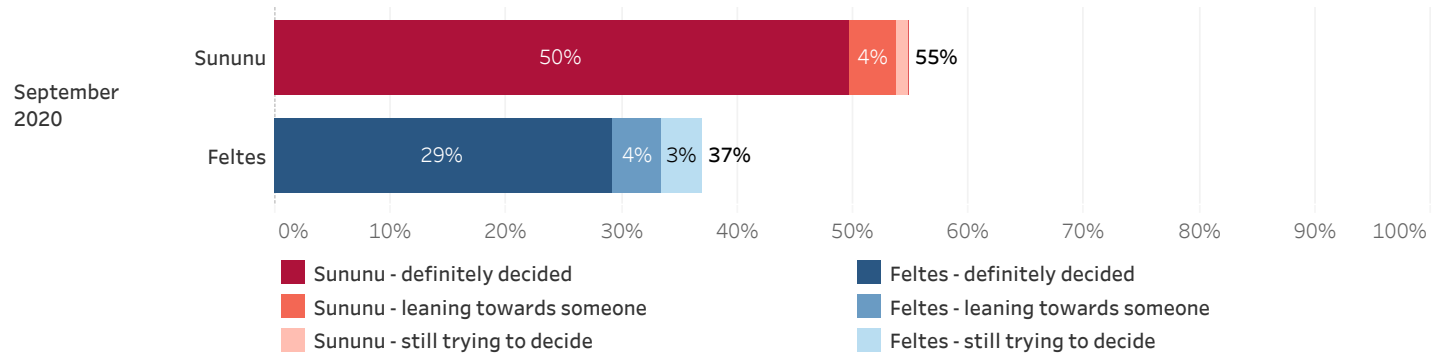
With the election only five weeks away, 79% of likely voters in New Hampshire say they have definitely decided for whom they will vote for Governor. By contrast, 92% of likely voters say they definitely decided how they will vote in the election for president.

Decided on Choice for Gubernatorial Election



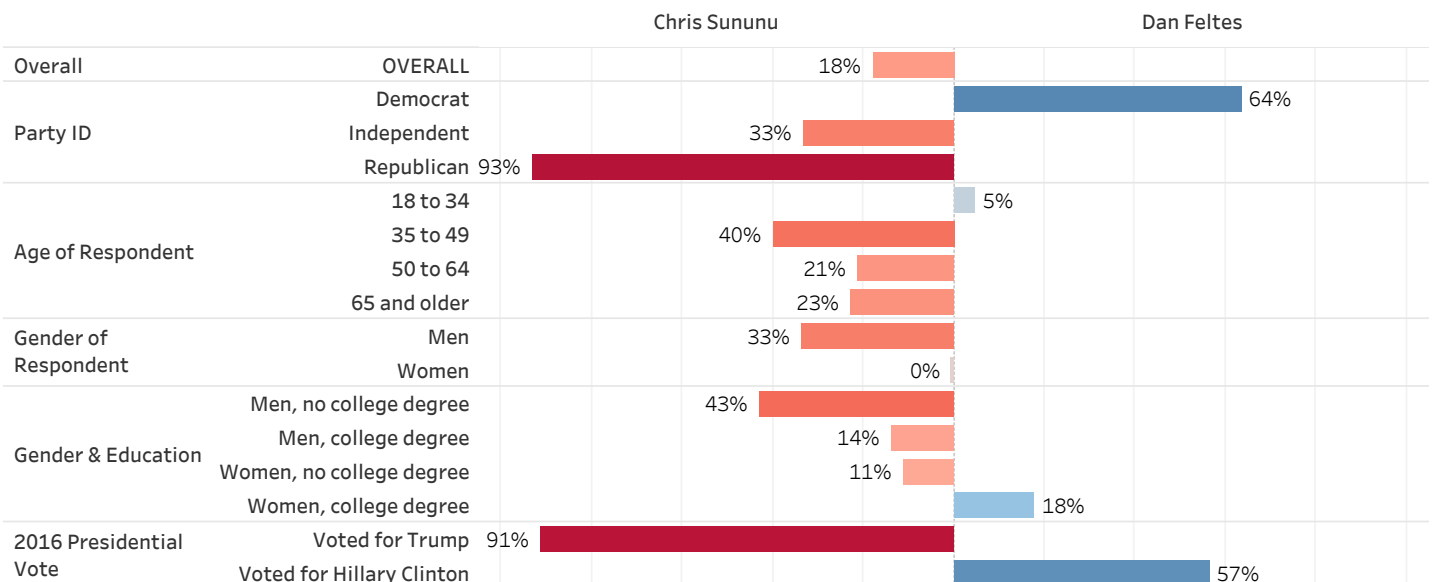
Half of likely voters (50%) say they have definitely decided to vote for Sununu, with smaller numbers of voters leaning toward Sununu (4%) or currently supporting Sununu but still trying to decide (1%). Twenty-nine percent of likely voters say they have definitely decided to vote for Feltes, 4% are leaning towards Feltes, and 3% are supporting Feltes but still trying to decide.

- Sununu leads Feltes by 93 percentage points among Republicans and by 33 points among Independents. Feltes holds a 64 point lead among Democrats.
- Sununu holds large leads over Feltes among those aged 35 to 49 (+40 percentage points), those aged 50 to 64 (+21), and those aged 65 and older (+23), while Feltes holds a very small lead among those aged 18 to 34 (+5).
- Sununu and Feltes are tied among women but Sununu holds a wide lead among men (+33 percentage points).
- Sununu holds a clear lead among men without a college degree (+43 percentage points) and smaller leads among men with a college degree (+14) and women without a college degree (+11) while Feltes leads among women with a college degree (+18).
- Sununu leads Feltes by 91 percentage points among those who supported Donald Trump in 2016 while Feltes holds a considerably smaller lead (+57) among those who voted for Hillary Clinton in 2016.

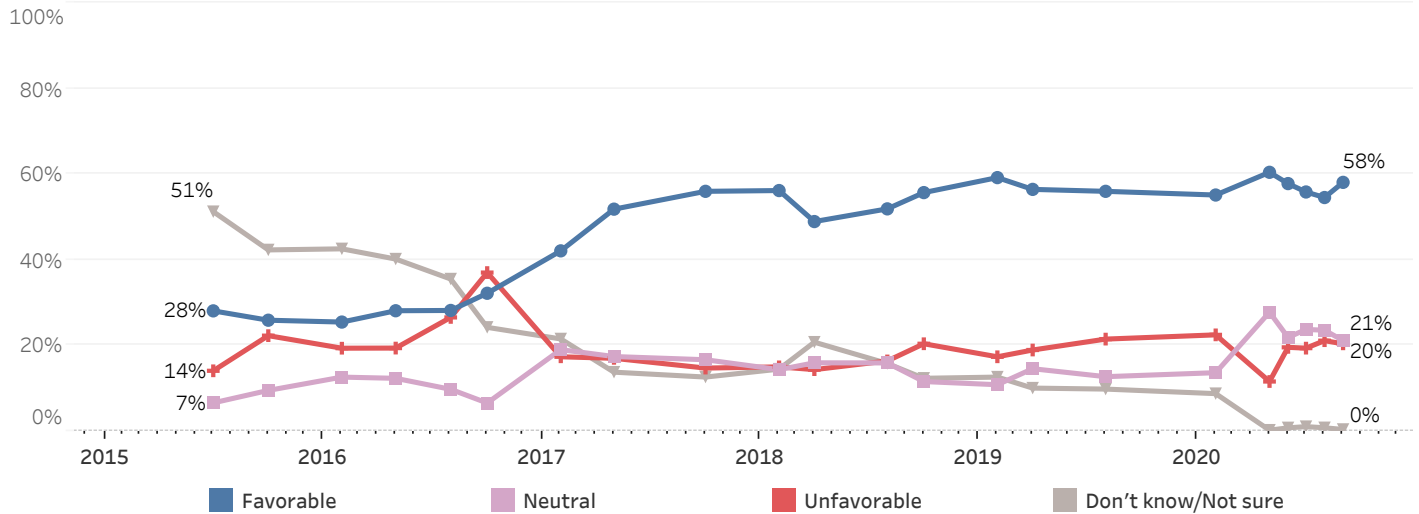
2020 Gubernatorial Election - Difference in Support - September 2020



Gubernatorial Candidates Favorability

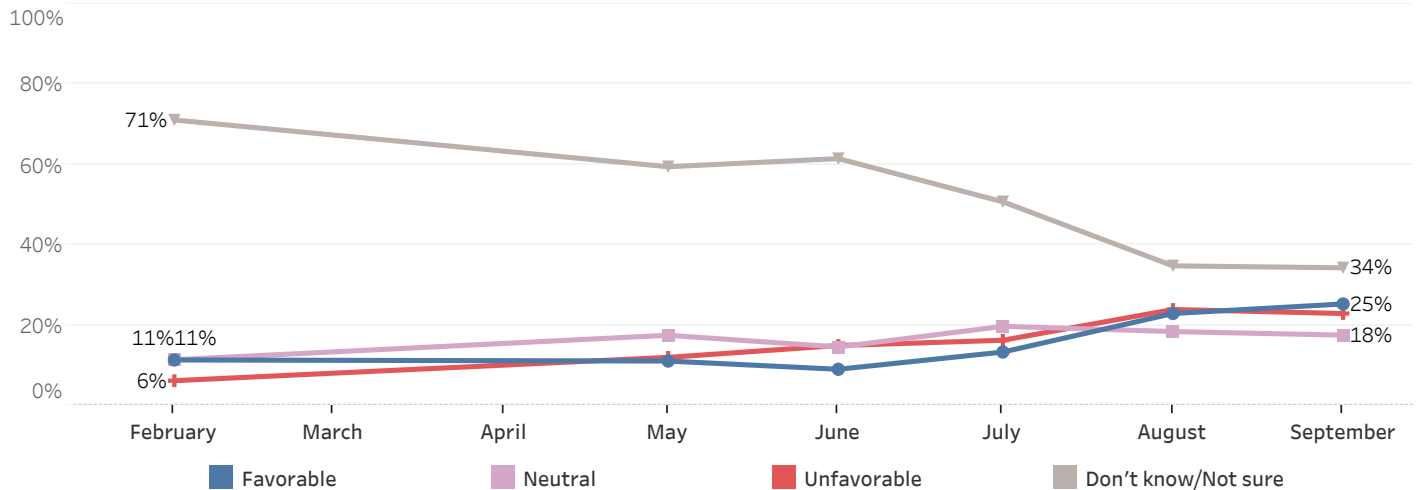
Fifty-eight percent of New Hampshire residents say they have a favorable opinion of Chris Sununu, 20% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 21% are neutral, and less than 1% don't know or are unsure. Sununu's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) is +38%, largely unchanged over the past three months. By contrast, President Trump's net favorability rating among Granite Staters is -12%.

Sununu (R) Favorability



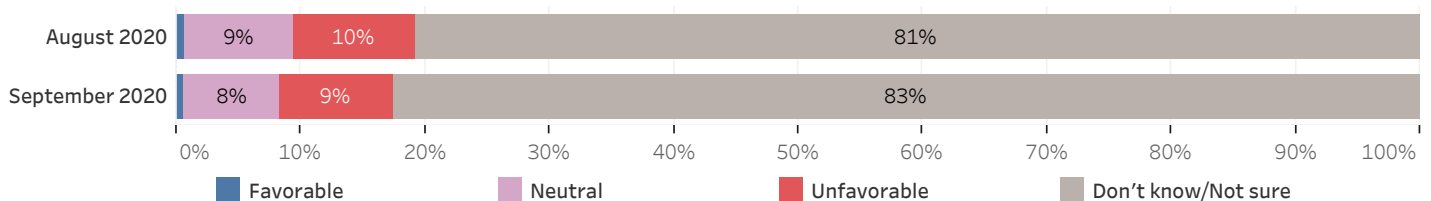
Granite Staters are largely neutral on Dan Feltes but a large percentage of state residents still have no opinion of him - 25% of New Hampshire residents say they have a favorable opinion of Feltes, 23% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 18% are neutral, and 34% don't know or are unsure. Feltes's net favorability rating is +2%, largely unchanged compared to August (-1%).

Libertarian gubernatorial nominee Darryl Perry is not well-known at all in the state - only 1% of New Hampshire residents have a favorable of him, 9% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral, and 83% don't know or are unsure.

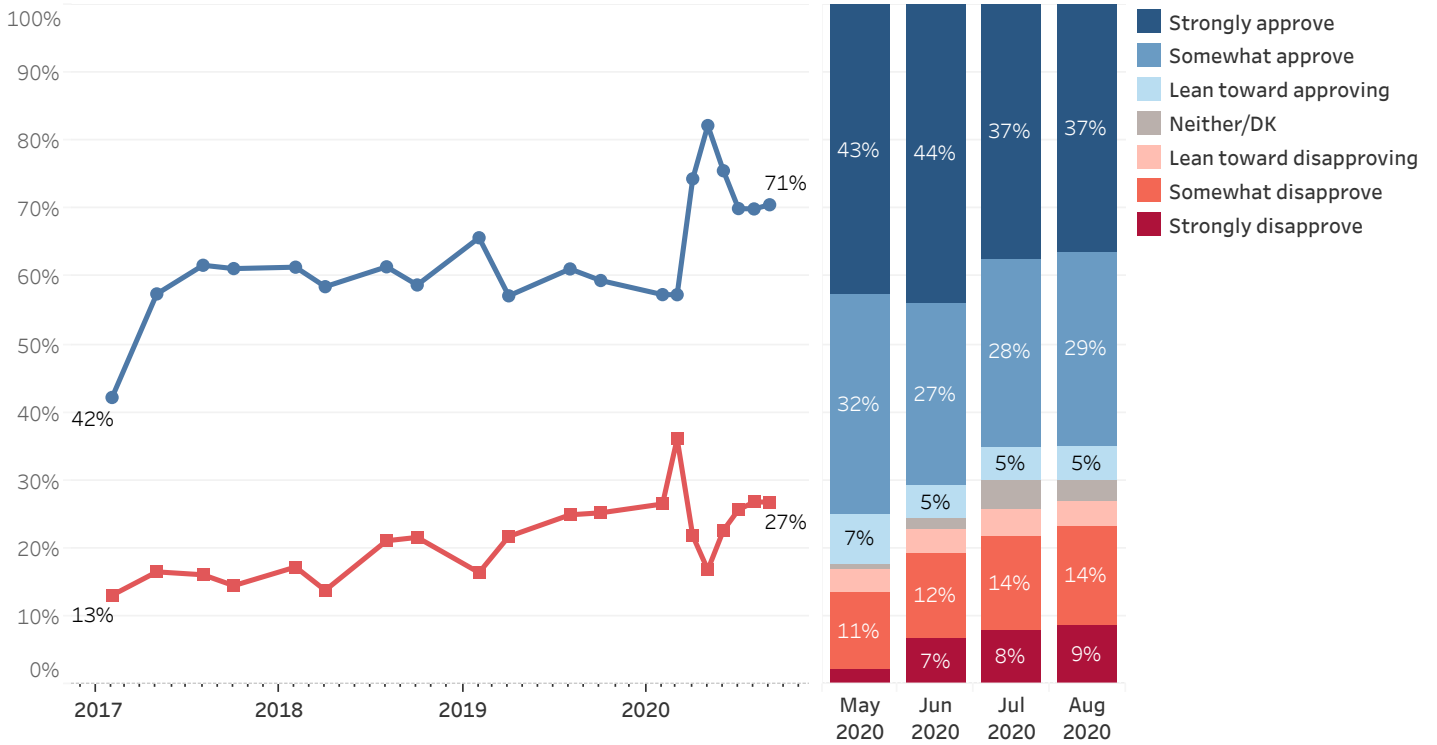
Perry (L) Favorability



Gubernatorial Approval

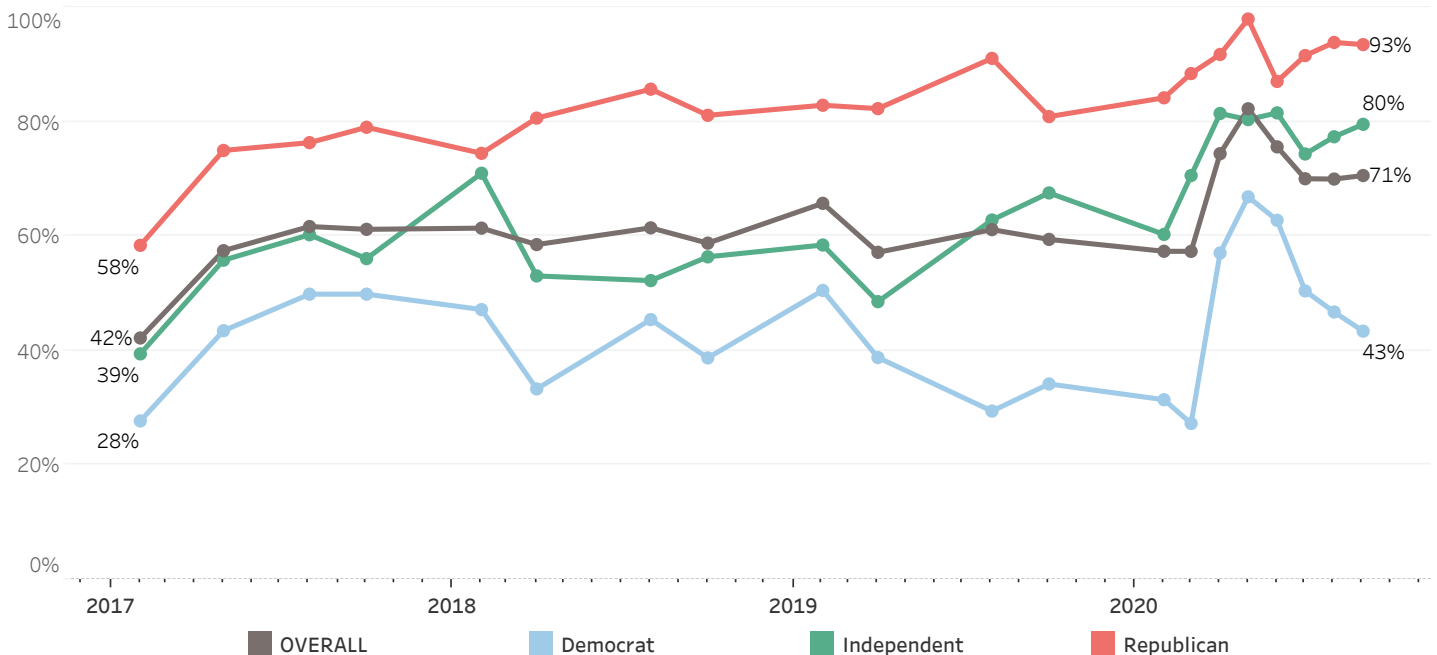
Sununu is in a strong position for re-election as most Granite Staters approve of the job he has done as governor - 71% approve of his performance as governor, 27% disapprove, and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Sununu's performance remains lower than in the late spring and early summer but also remains higher than before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Gubernatorial Approval - Chris Sununu



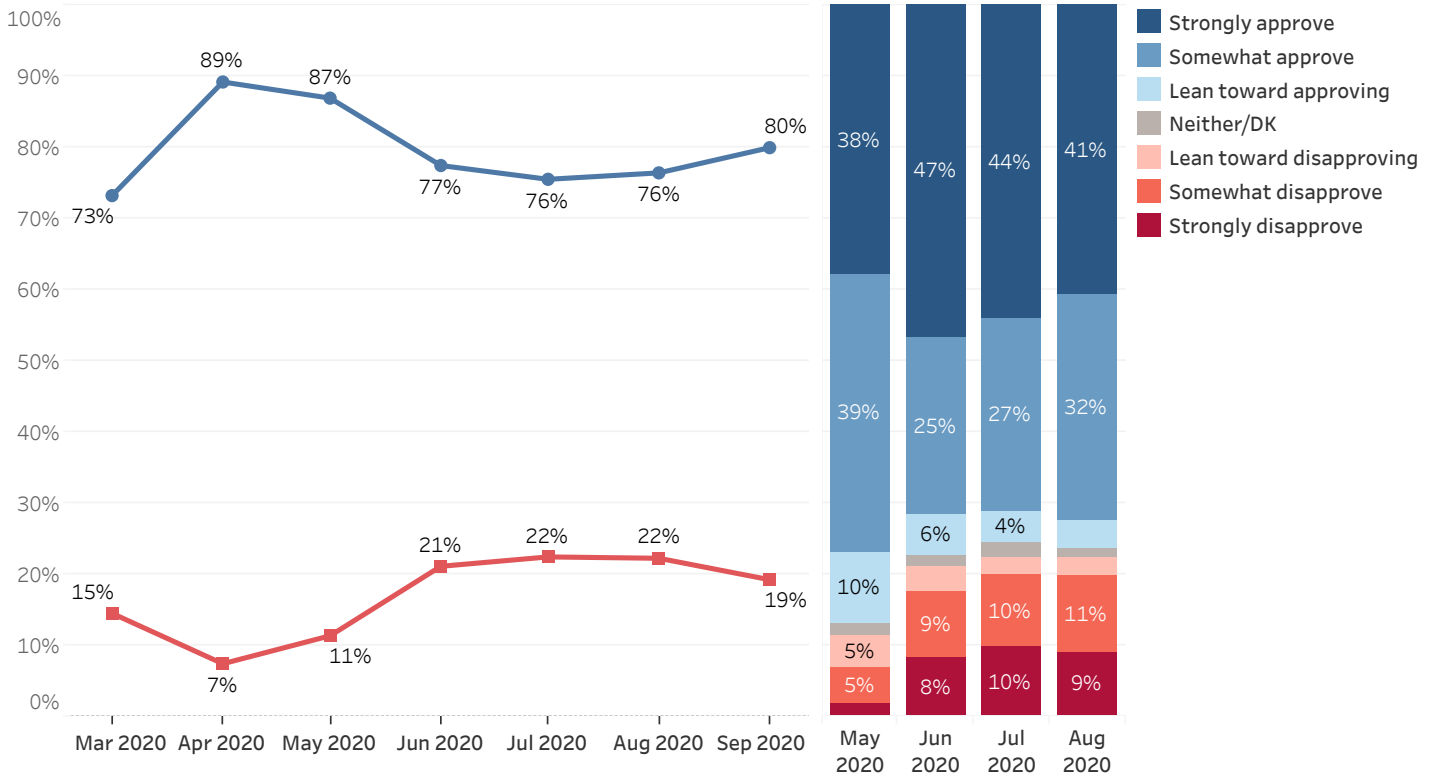
Approval of Sununu's job performance as governor is bi-partisan - 93% of Republicans and 80% of Independents approve of Sununu's job performance and a surprisingly high 43% of Democrats approve. Approval of Sununu's performance among Democrats (43%) has dropped since May (67%) which is not surprising as the election nears. His approval among Republicans and Independents has remained high since the onset of COVID-19.

Job Approval - Governor Chris Sununu - By Party Identification



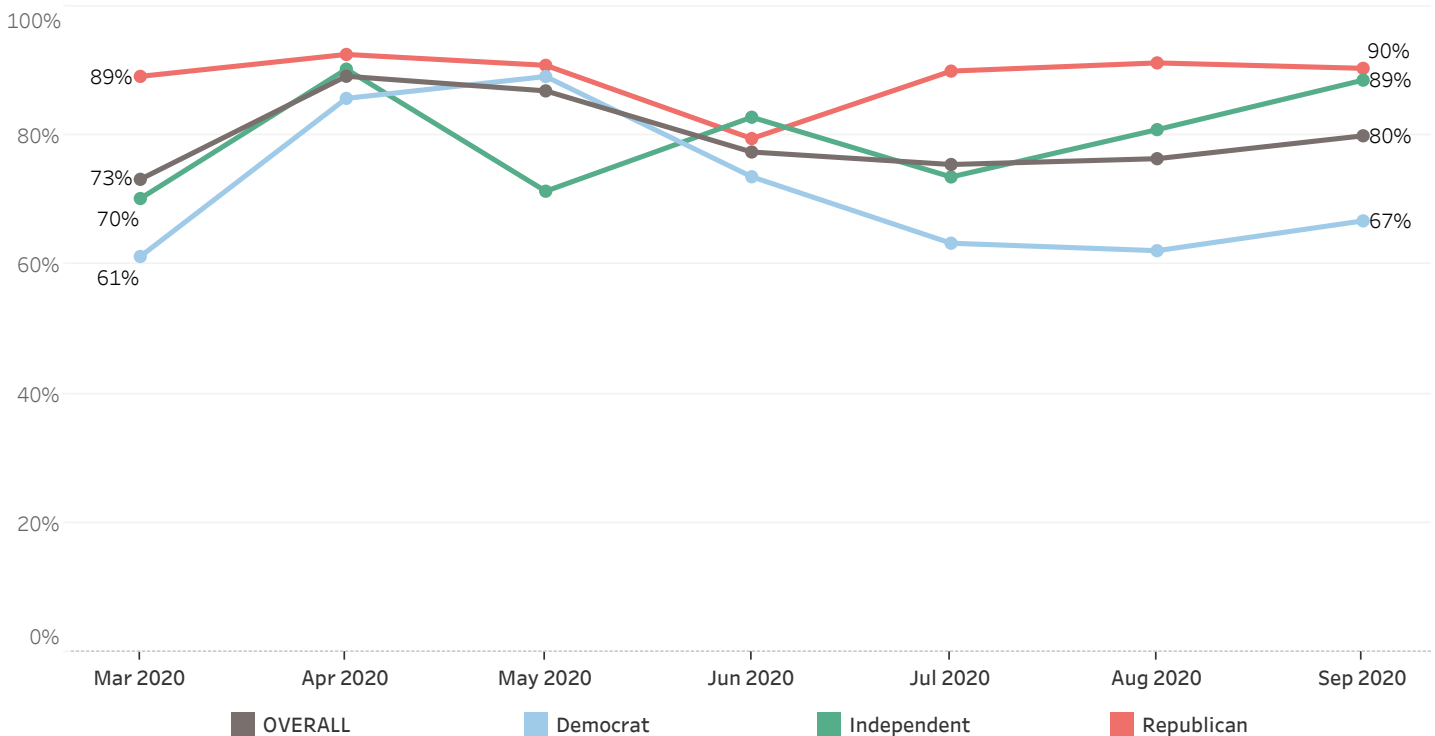
Four in five (80%) New Hampshire residents approve of Governor Sununu's handling of the coronavirus (COVID-19) situation while 19% disapprove and 1% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Sununu's handling of the COVID-19 situation (80%) has remained largely consistent since June but is slightly lower than in April (89%) and May (87%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

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Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State and to 2016 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 5,750 New Hampshire adults were recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
