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MAJORITY IN NH KNOW SOMEONE WHO HAS HAD COVID-19 BUT LESS THAN HALF WOULD BE WILLING TO GET VACCINE NOW

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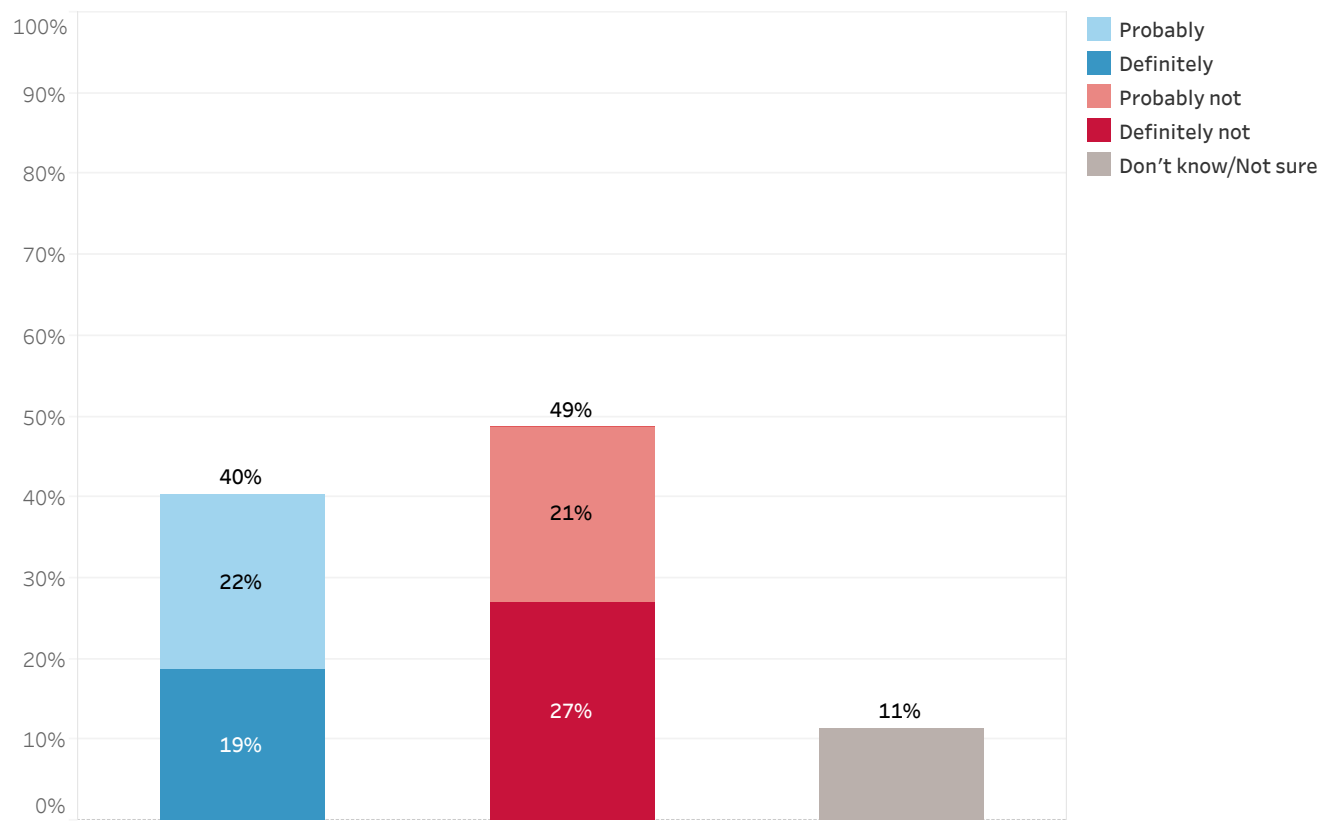
DURHAM, NH – A majority of New Hampshire residents now say they know someone who has contracted COVID-19. However, only 40% of state residents say they would definitely or probably get a COVID-19 vaccine if it were currently available. Despite the low number of COVID cases in New Hampshire, Granite Staters are generally less comfortable now than they were in the previous month engaging in public activities.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and thirty (1,030) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 24 and September 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State and 2016 election results in NH. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

Likelihood of Getting COVID-19 Vaccine

Only four in ten (40%) New Hampshire residents say that they would definitely (19%) or probably (22%) get a COVID-19 vaccine if it were available today. Nearly half (49%) of Granite Staters say they would definitely (27%) or probably (21%) not get the vaccine if it were available today, while 11% don't know or are unsure.

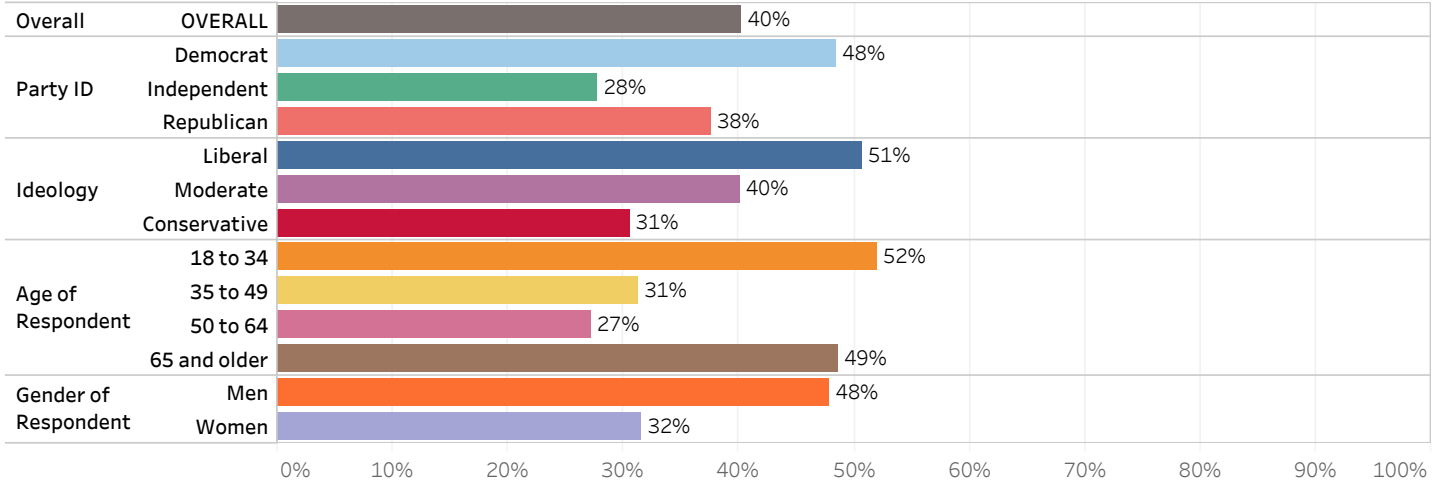
Likelihood of Getting COVID-19 Vaccine if Available Today - September 2020

- Self-identified Democrats (48%) are more likely than Republicans (38%) and Independents (28%) to say they would definitely or probably get a COVID-19 vaccine if it were available today.
- Self-described liberals (51%) are more likely than moderates (40%) and conservatives (31%) to say they would definitely or probably get a COVID-19 vaccine if it were available today.
- Residents aged 18 to 34 (52%) and those aged 65 and older (49%) are a good deal more likely than those aged 35 to 49 (31%) and those aged 50 to 64 (27%) to say they would definitely or probably get a COVID-19 vaccine if it were available today.
- Men (48%) are a good deal more likely than women (32%) to say they would definitely or probably get a COVID-19 vaccine if it were available today.

Definitely or Probably Would Get COVID-19 Vaccine if Available Today - By Demographics - September 2020

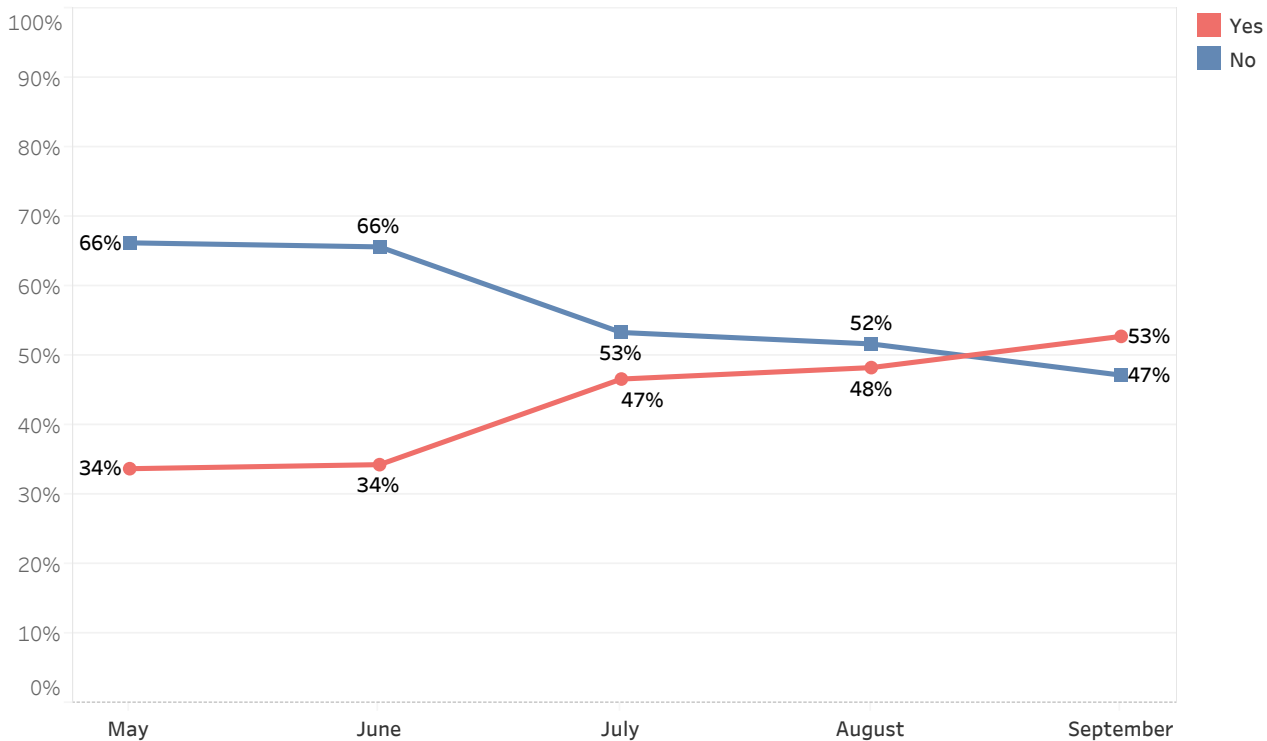


Personal Experience with COVID-19

For the first time since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, a majority (53%) of New Hampshire residents say that they know someone who has contracted COVID-19 while 47% do not know anyone who has.

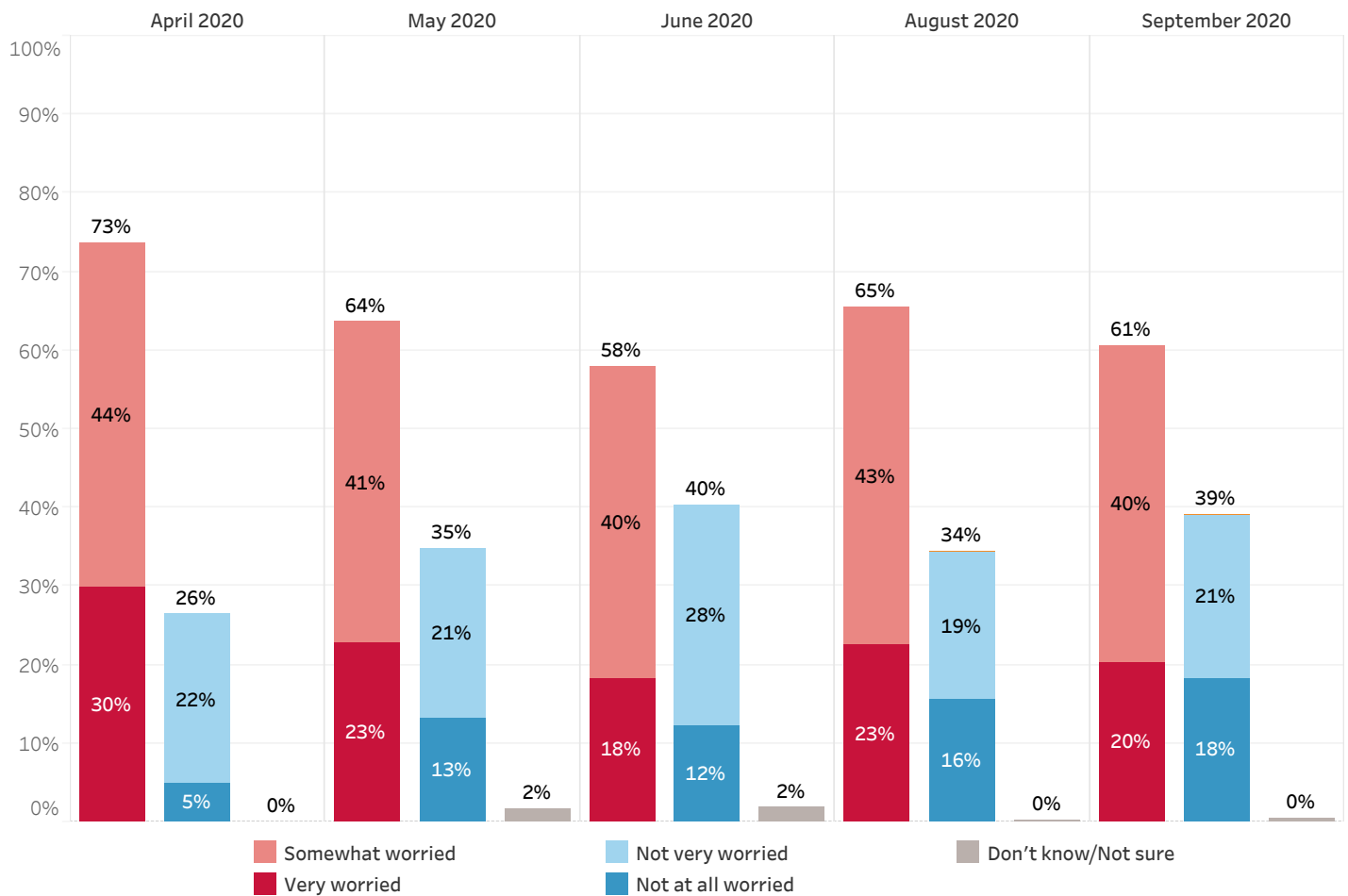
Residents between the ages of 18 and 34 (+26 percentage points) and self-identified Republicans (+7) are more likely than in August to say they know someone who has contracted COVID-19.

Know Anyone Who Has Contracted COVID-19



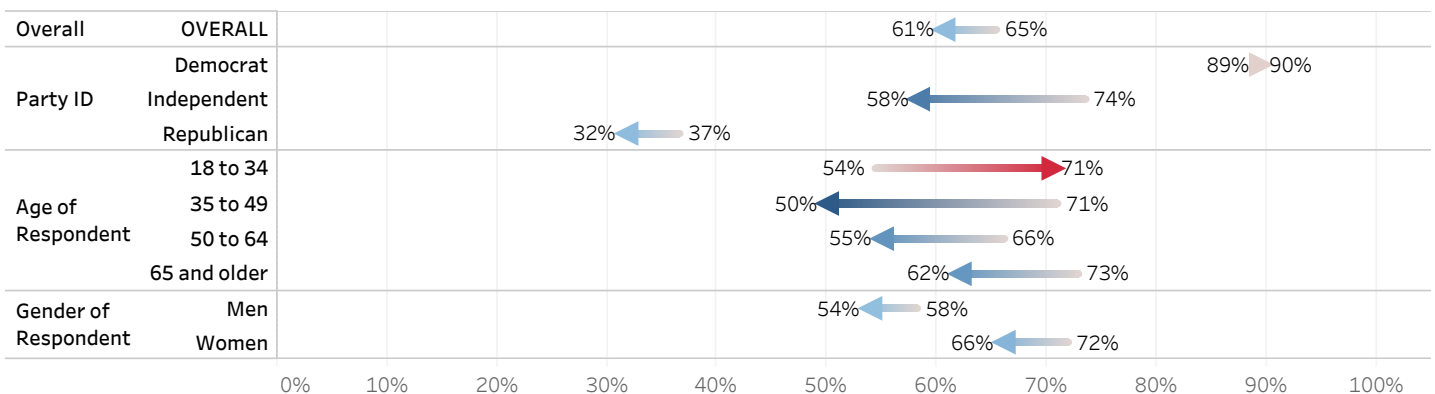
Three-fifths (61%) of New Hampshire residents say they are very (20%) or somewhat (40%) worried about themselves or an immediate family member contracting COVID-19; 39% are not very (21%) or not at all worried (18%) about this while less than 1% don't know or are unsure.

Worry Self or Someone in Immediate Family Might Contract COVID-19



- Concern about oneself or one's family contracting COVID-19 has declined since August among Independents (-15%). Democrats (90%) remain far more likely than Republicans (32%) to be very or somewhat worried.
- Respondents aged 18 to 34 (+16) are more likely than in August to be very or somewhat worried, while the percentage worried among those aged 35 to 49 has declined significantly in that time (-21%).
- Women (66%) remain slightly more likely than men (54%) to be very or somewhat worried about themselves or a family member contracting COVID-19.

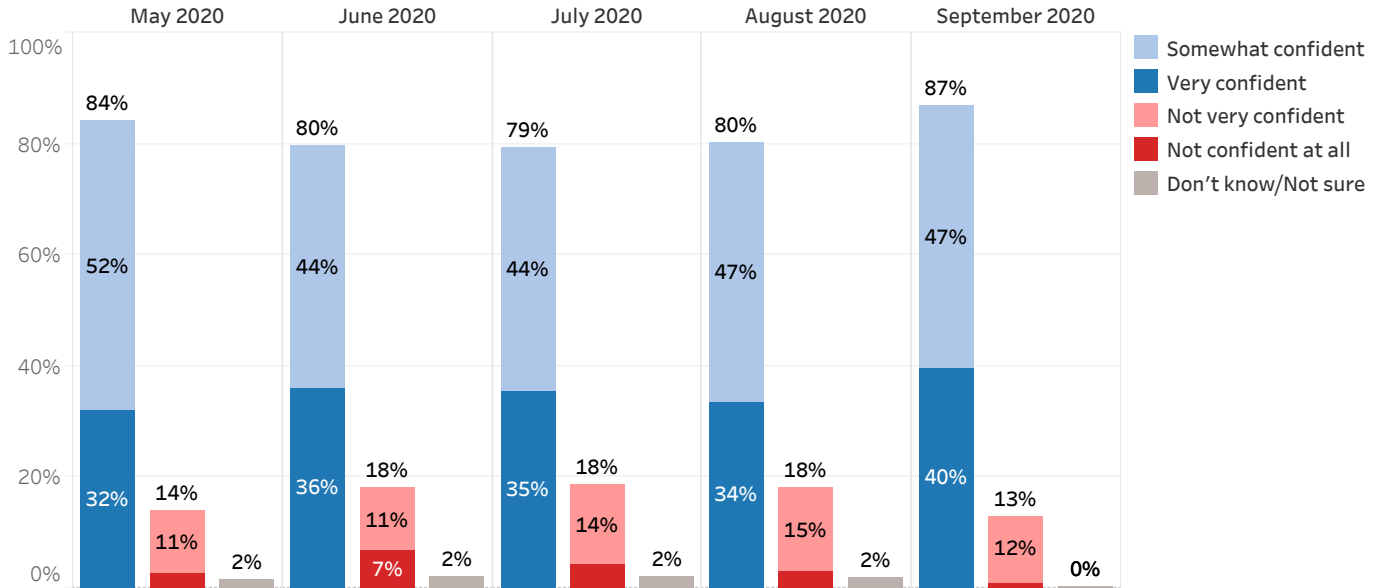
Very or Somewhat Worried Self or Someone in Immediate Family Might Contract COVID-19 - Change from August to September



Trust in State Government Handling of COVID-19

A large majority of residents have confidence in the state government's ability to respond effectively to COVID-19 in New Hampshire: 87% are very (40%) or somewhat (47%) confident, 13% are not very (12%) or not at all (1%) confident, and less than 1% don't know or are unsure. Confidence in the state government's ability to respond to COVID-19 has increased since August (80%) and is at its highest point since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.

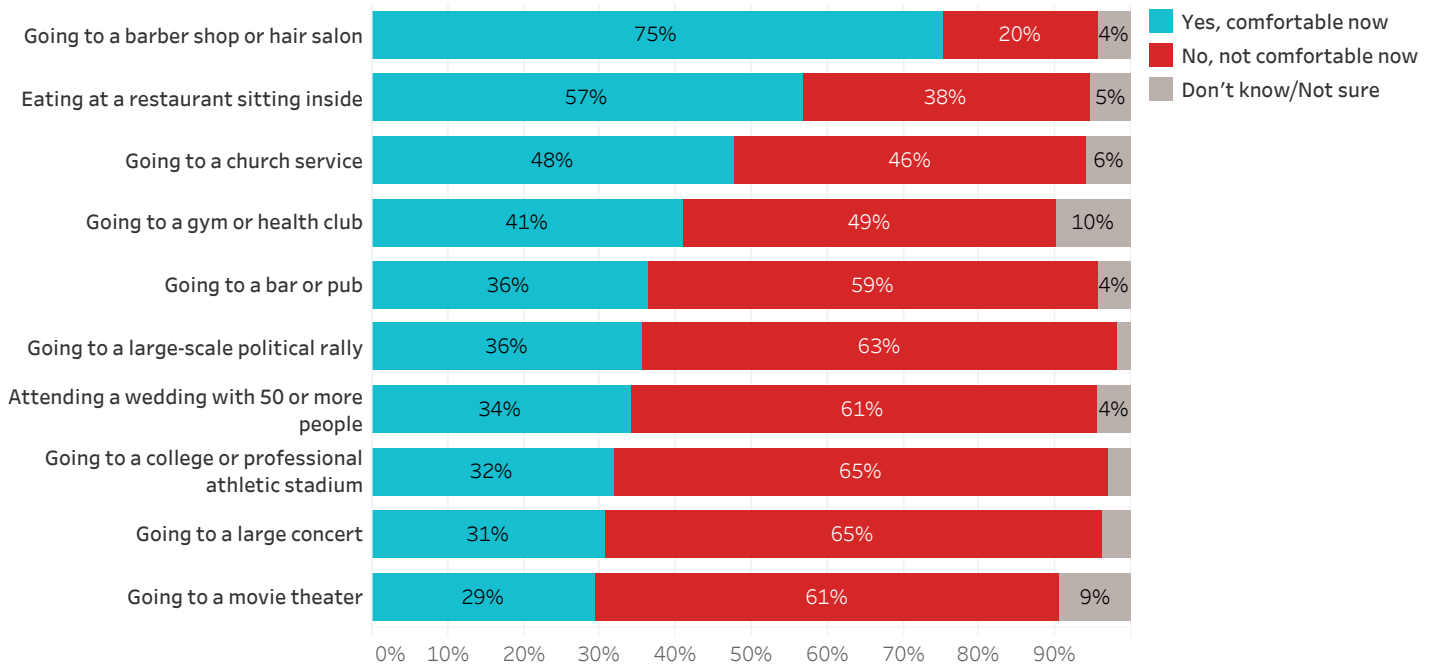
Confidence in State Government's Ability to Respond Effectively to Current Outbreak of Coronavirus in New Hampshire



Comfortable Engaging in Public Activities

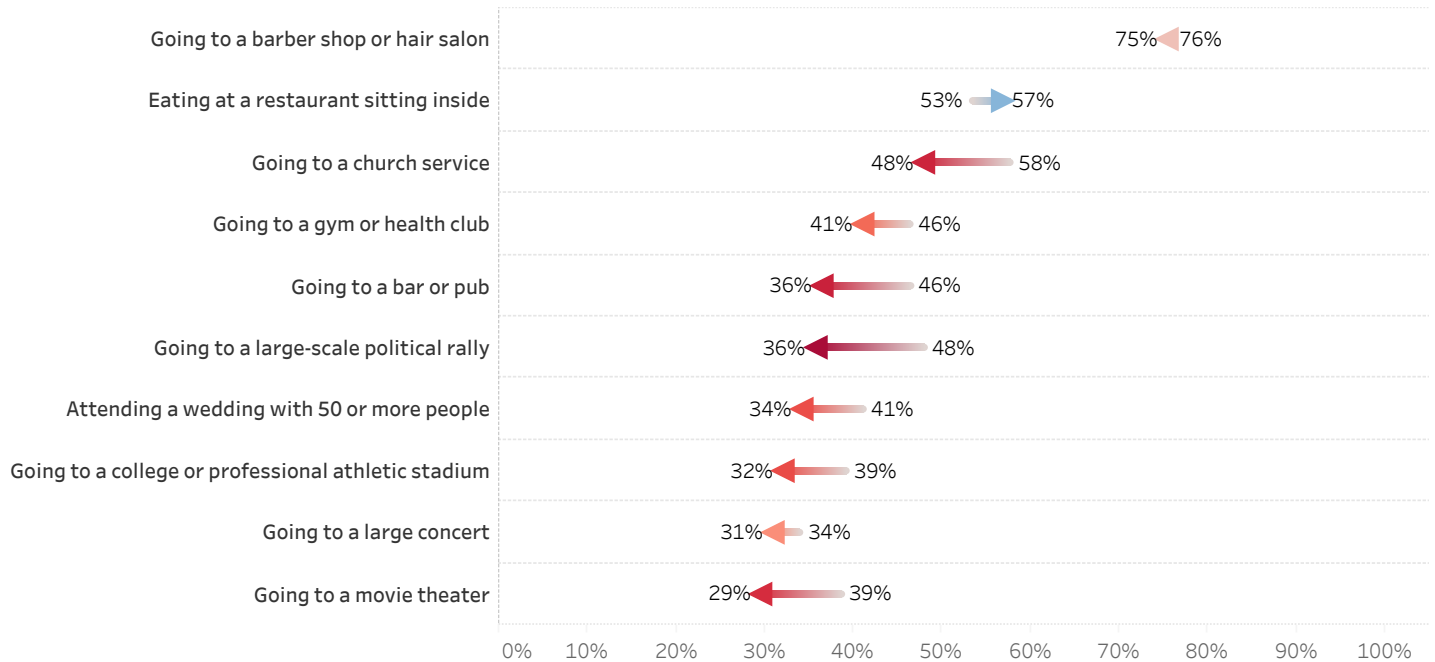
Three-quarters (75%) of Granite Staters who engage in these activities say they are currently comfortable going to a barber shop or hair salon and more than half (57%) are comfortable eating at a restaurant sitting inside. However, less than half of New Hampshire residents who plan to do these things are currently comfortable going to a church service (48%), going to a gym or health club (41%), going to a bar or pub (36%), going to a large-scale political rally (36%), or attending a wedding with 50 or more people (34%). Less than one-third are currently comfortable going to a college or professional athletic stadium (32%), going to a large concert (31%), or going to a movie theater (29%).

Feel Comfortable Going to or Doing Following Things



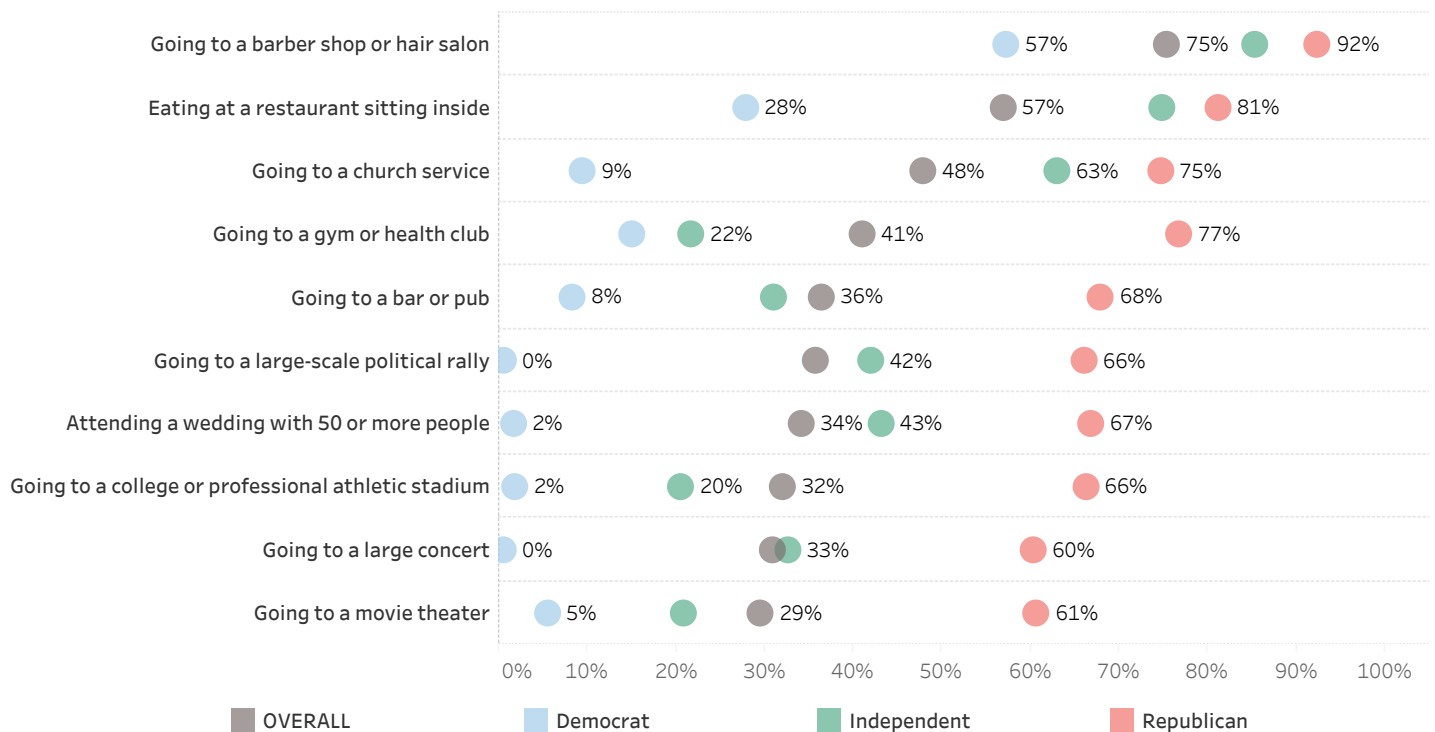
After becoming increasingly comfortable over the past few months engaging in these activities, Granite Staters are generally less comfortable doing these things now than they were in August. Granite Staters are particularly less likely to say they are comfortable going to a church service (-10 percentage points), going to a bar or pub (-10), going to a large-scale political rally (-12), and going to a movie theater (-9).

As in earlier months, Democrats and Republicans have very different levels of comfort participating in these activities. At least 60% of Republicans say they are currently comfortable doing each of these activities while among Democrats, less than a third are comfortable doing any of these activities apart from going to a barber shop or hair salon. Nearly all Democrats are not currently comfortable going to a large-scale political rally, attending a wedding with 50 or more people, going to a college or professional athletic stadium, or going to a large concert, while about two-thirds of Republicans are comfortable doing these things.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and thirty (1,030) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 24 and September 28, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the September 2020 Granite State Poll is 37%. The design effect for the survey is 2.5%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the New Hampshire Secretary of State and to 2016 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 5,750 New Hampshire adults were recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
