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TRUMP'S JOB APPROVAL & HANDLING OF COVID-19 UNCHANGED IN NH

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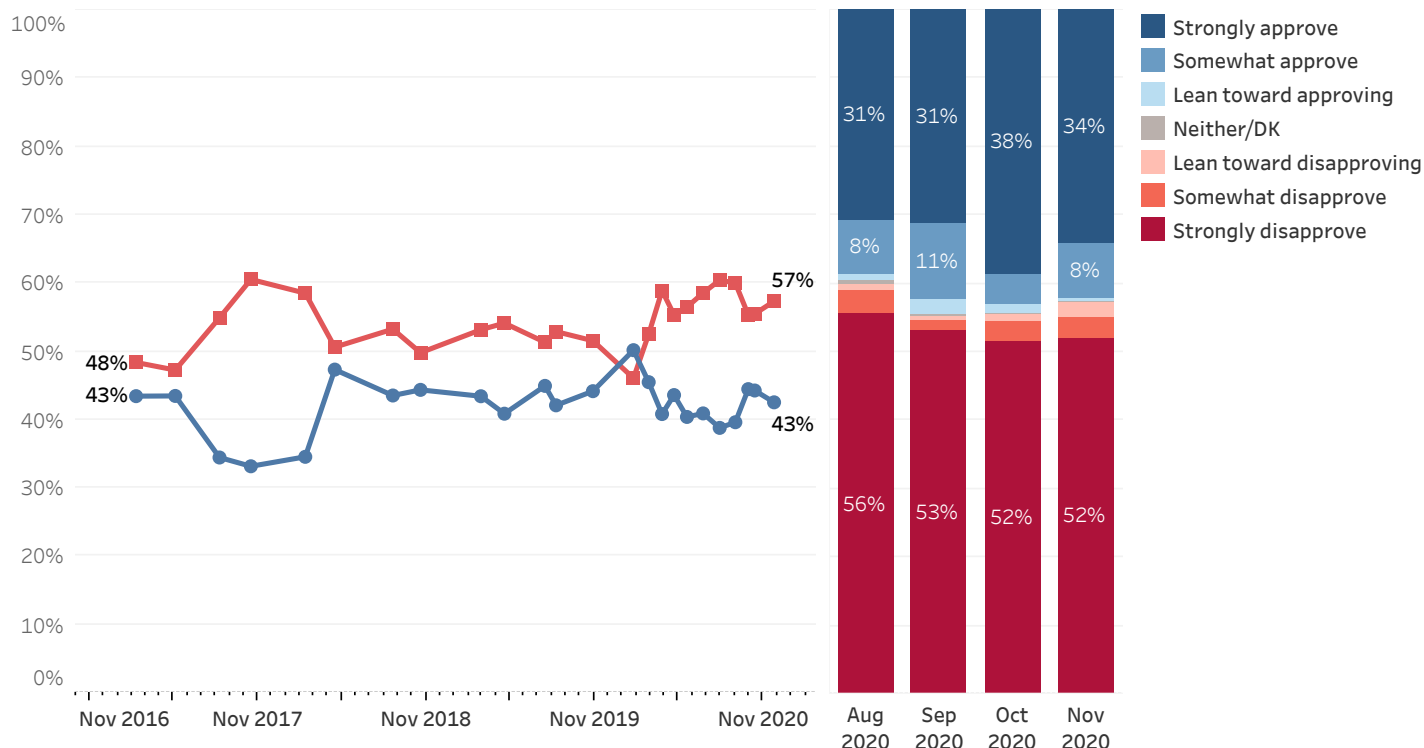
DURHAM, NH - Granite Staters' assessment of President Trump's handling of the COVID-19 pandemic is unchanged despite a spike in COVID-19 cases in New Hampshire and the country at large. Stress related to COVID-19 has increased since October among Granite Staters, particularly among men and older residents. Trump's loss to Joe Biden in the 2020 presidential election has had little impact on approval of his job performance or the overall direction of the country.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand nine hundred and seventeen (1,917) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between November 19 and November 23, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2 percent. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and 2020 election results in NH. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

Presidential Approval

Despite losing to Joe Biden in the 2020 presidential election, President Trump's approval rating in the Granite State has changed little. Currently, 43% of New Hampshire residents approve of Donald Trump's performance as President, 57% disapprove, and less than 1% don't know or are unsure. Trump's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) among Granite Staters is -15%, largely unchanged since October (-11%).

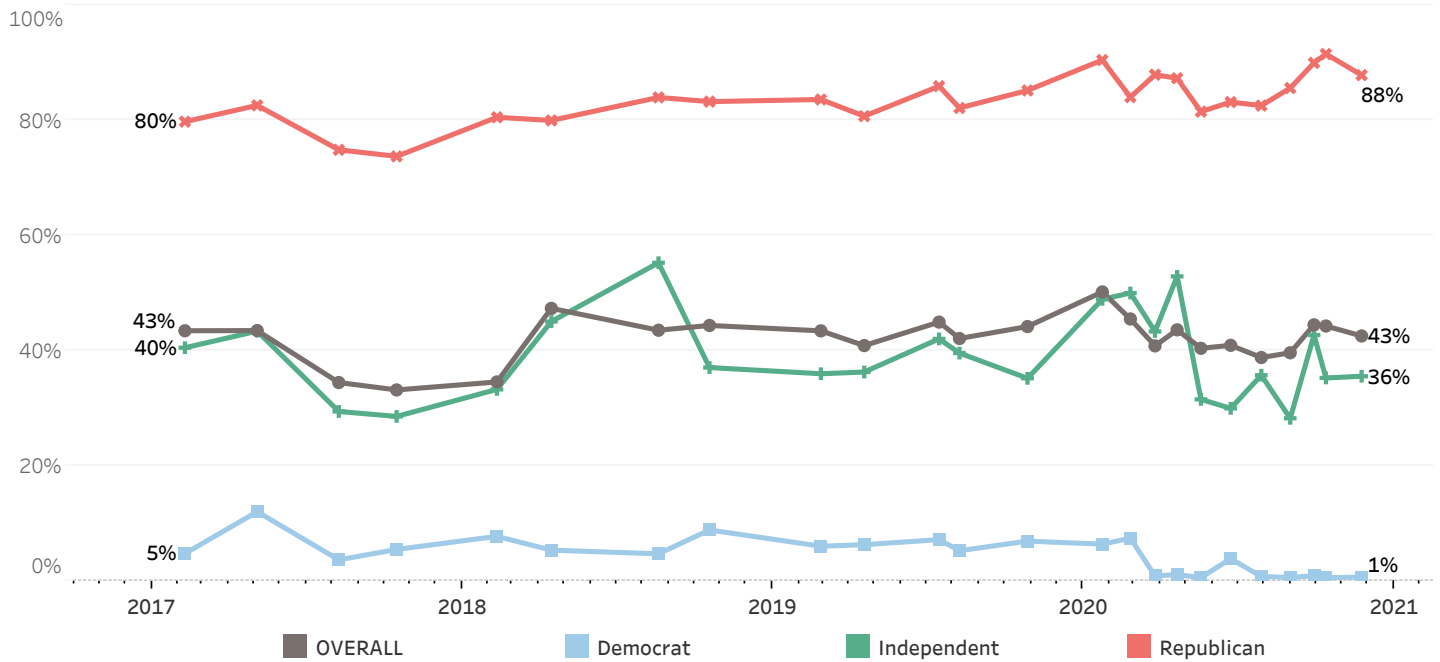
Presidential Approval - Donald Trump

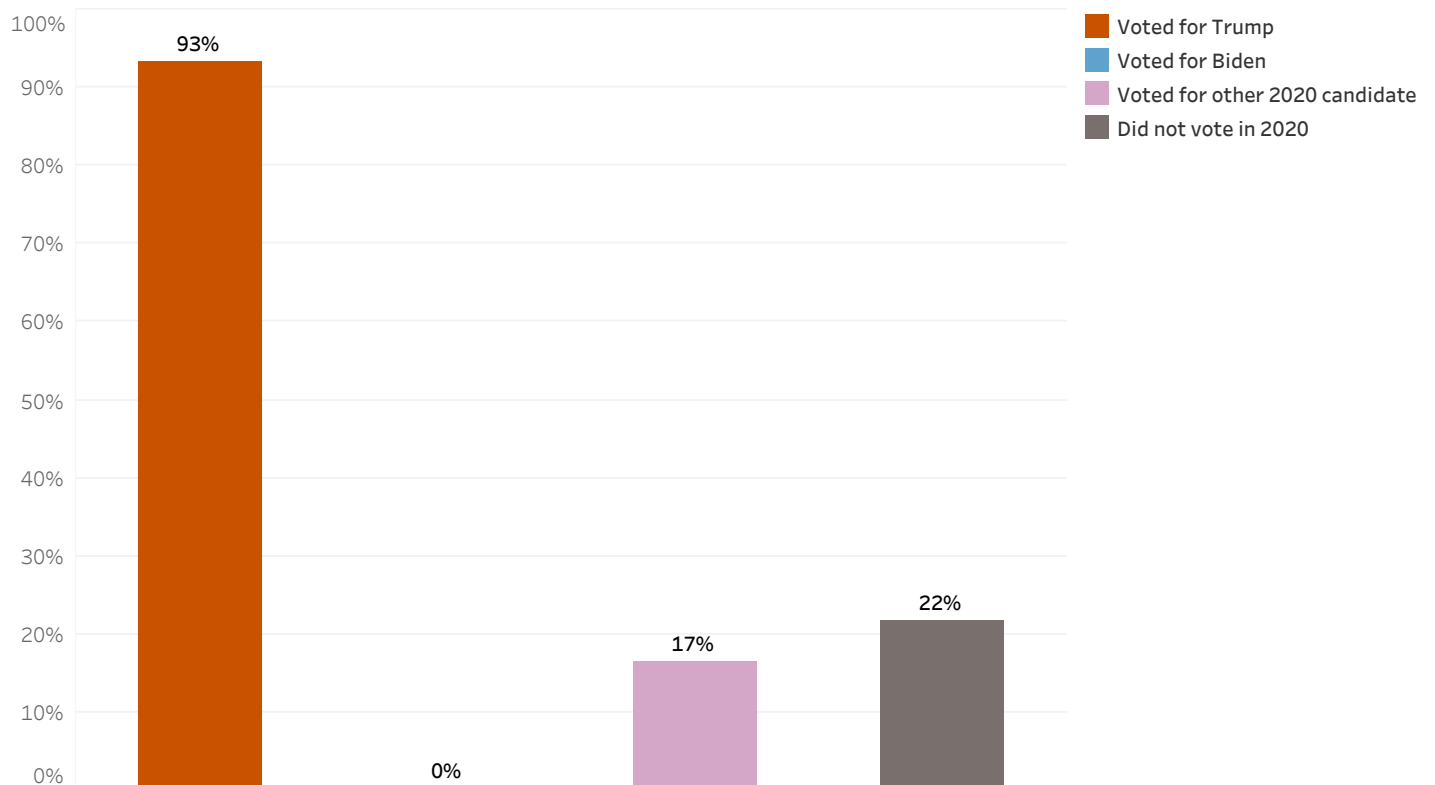
Eighty-eight percent of Republicans approve of Trump's job performance, while 36% of Independents and only 1% of Democrats approve. Support among Republicans (88%) remains near its highest point in Trump's presidency while support among Democrats (1%) remains at its lowest point.

Job Approval - President Donald Trump - By Party Identification



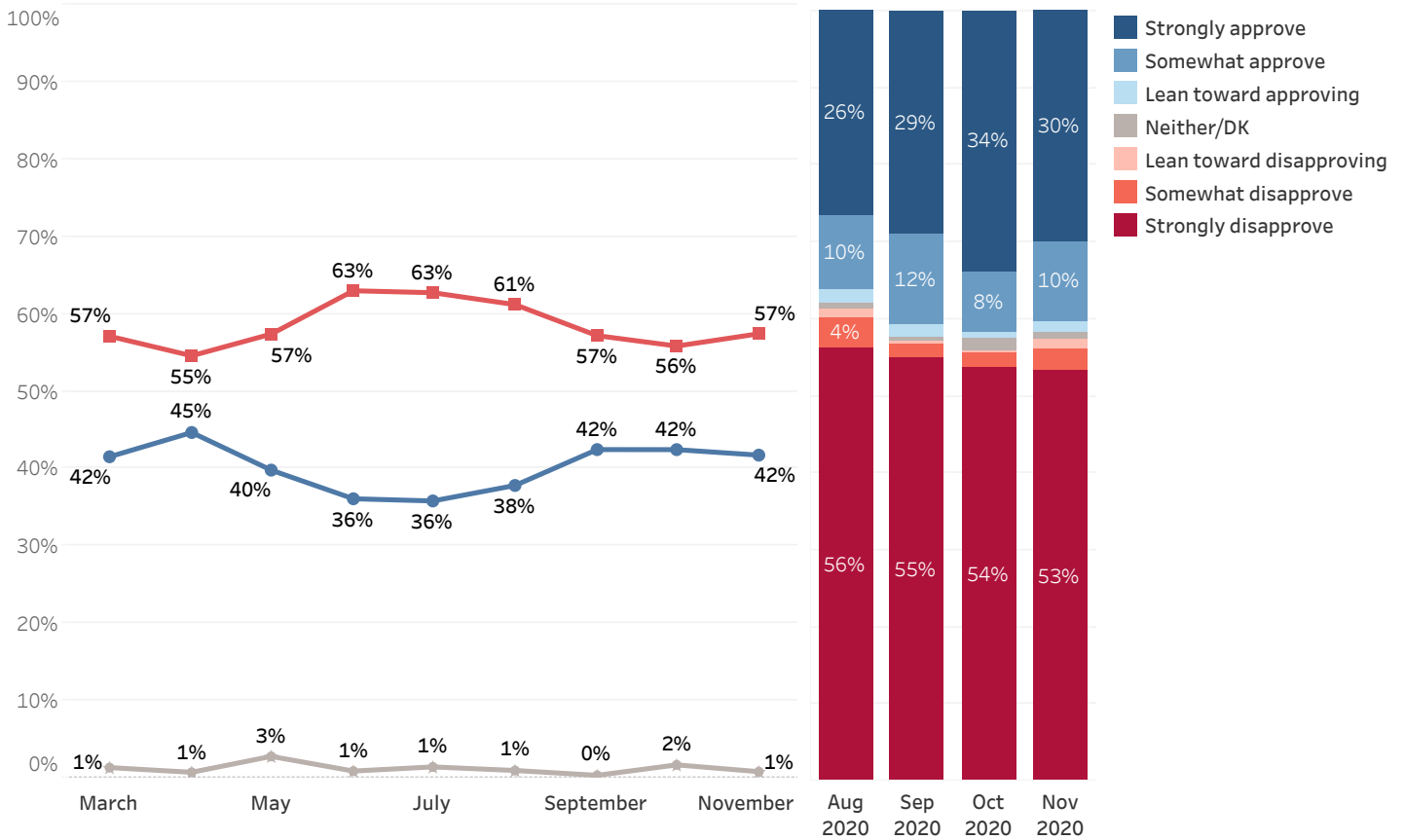
The great majority (93%) of those who voted for Trump in the 2020 election approve of his job performance but less than 1% of those who voted for Joe Biden, 17% of those who voted for another candidate, and 22% of those who did not vote in 2020 approve of Trump's job performance.

Despite a rapid rise in cases of COVID-19 in New Hampshire and the country as a whole, approval of President Trump's handling of COVID-19 has remained unchanged since September. Currently, 42% approve of Trump's handling of the situation while 57% disapprove, nearly all of whom strongly disapprove.

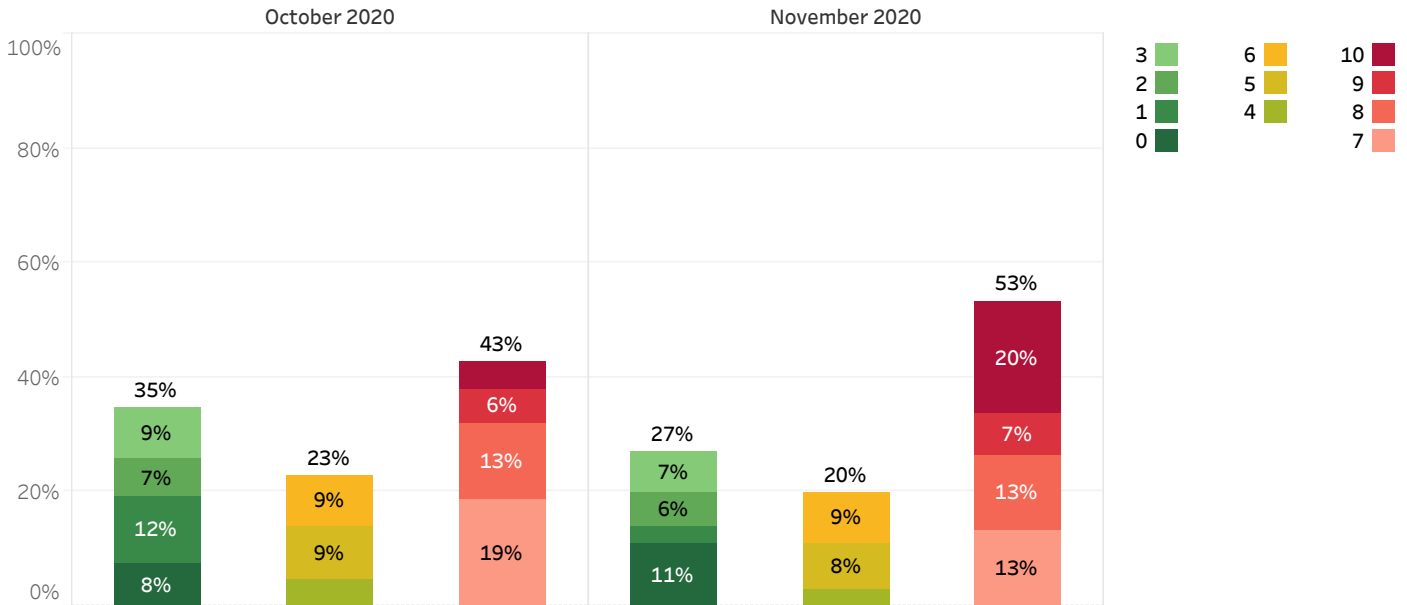
Approval of President Trump's Handling of Coronavirus (COVID-19) Situation



COVID-19-Related Stress

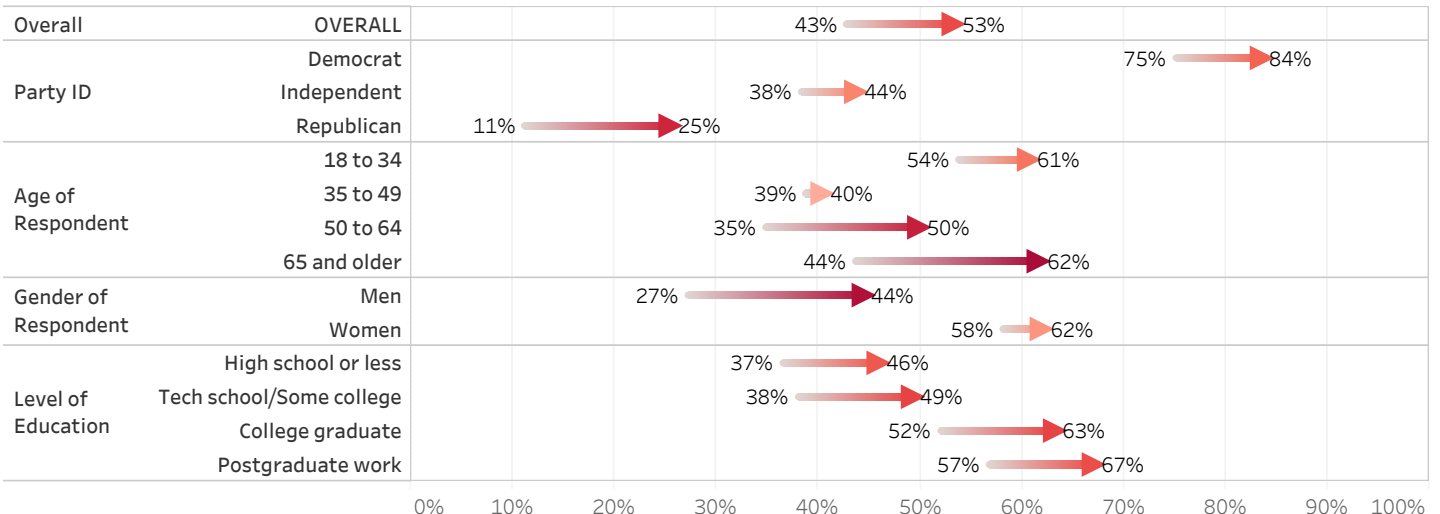
While approval of Trump's handling of COVID-19 is unchanged, the pandemic is causing New Hampshire residents increased stress. Fifty-three percent of New Hampshire residents place themselves at 7, 8, 9, or 10 when asked to place themselves on a 0-10 scale rating their overall level of stress as a result of COVID-19, up from 43% in October, 20% place themselves at a 4, 5, or 6 on a 0-10 scale, and 27% place themselves at 0, 1, 2, or 3. The percentage of Granite Staters who say they are highly stressed about COVID-19 (53%) matches the percentage who say they are highly stressed about the most recent election (54%).

- Democrats (+9 percentage points), Independents (+6), and Republicans (+14) are all more likely than in October to say they are highly stressed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, though Democrats remain far more likely than Independents and Republicans to be this stressed.
- Respondents aged 50 to 64 (+15) and those aged 65 and older (+18) are a good deal more likely than in October to say they are highly stressed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, while those aged 18 to 34 (+7) are slightly more likely than in October to be this stressed.
- Men (+17) are a good deal more likely than in October to say they are highly stressed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. Women (+4) are only very slightly more likely than in October to be this stressed but remain more stressed than men overall.
- Respondents of all education levels are more likely than in October to say they are highly stressed as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. College graduates and those who have completed postgraduate work remain more likely to be highly stressed than those without a college degree.

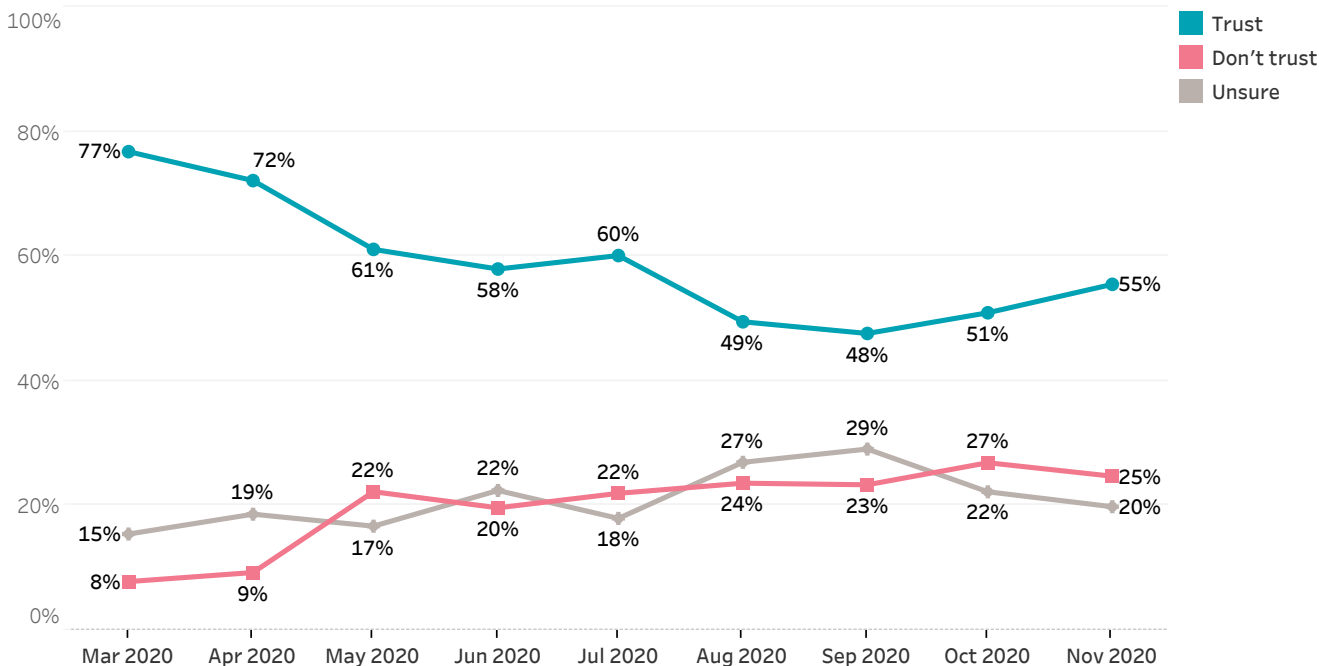
Highly Stressed (7-10 on 0-10 Scale) - Change from October 2020 to November 2020



Trust in Science Agencies

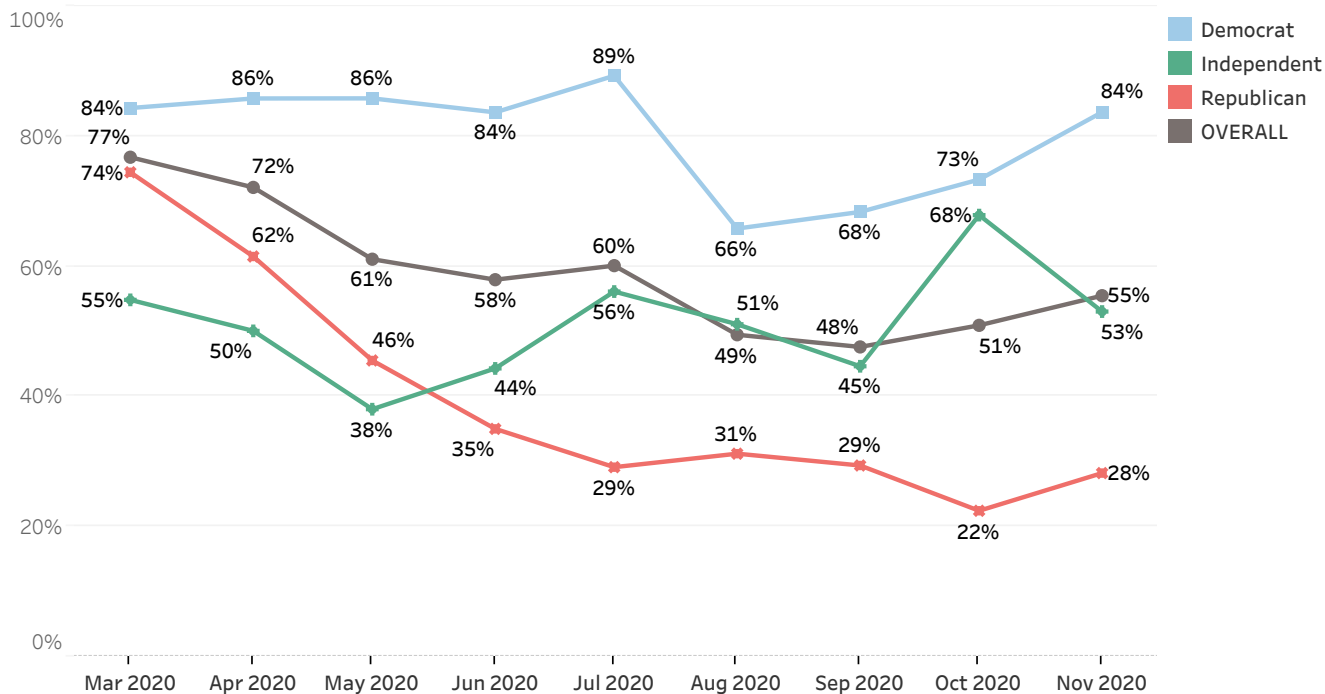
Trust in science agencies such as the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) as sources of information about COVID-19 has increased slightly in recent months but remains well below levels seen in March and April. Currently, 55% of New Hampshire residents say they trust such agencies as an information source, 25% don't trust them, and 20% are unsure. In March, 77% said they trusted such agencies and only 8% said they did not trust them.

Trust in science agencies like the CDC among Republicans has remained low since the beginning of the summer and remains in sharp contrast to March when 74% of Republicans trusted these agencies. Trust among Independents (53%) and Democrats (84%) largely matches results among both groups in March. Trust among Democrats dropped significantly during the summer but has since rebounded.

Trust Science Agencies Such as CDC as Source of Information About the Coronavirus - By Party Identification

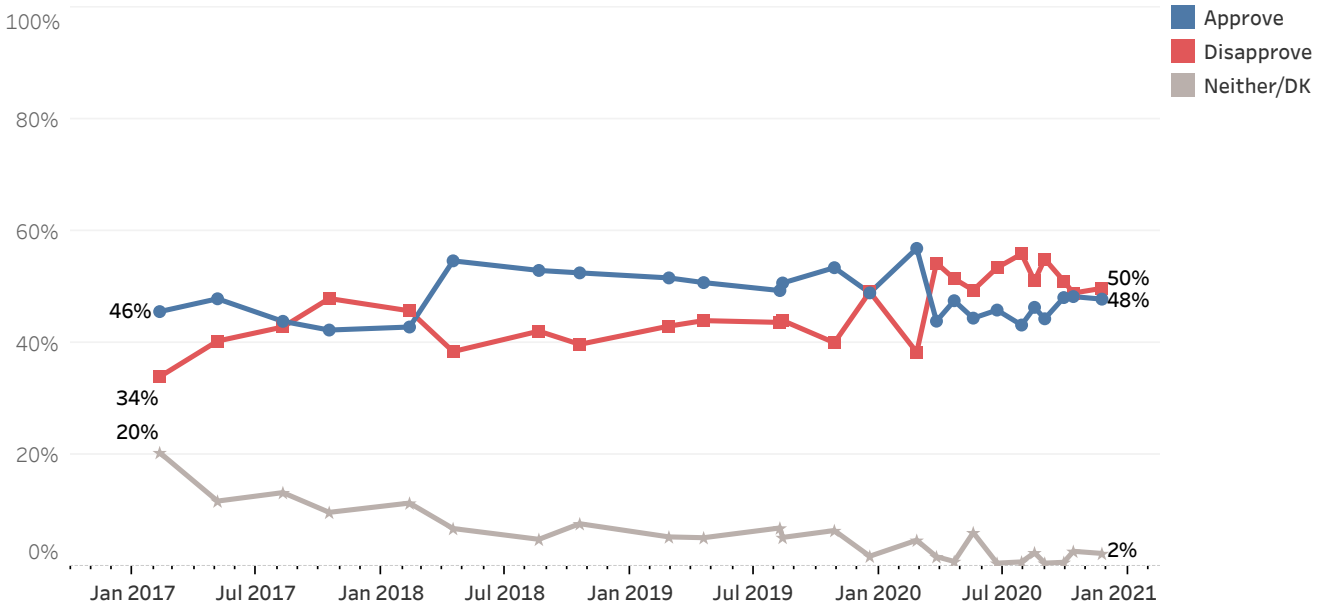


Economic Approval

Currently, 48% of New Hampshire residents approve of President Trump's handling of the economy, 50% disapprove, and 2% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Approval of Trump's handling of the economy remains lower than before the COVID-19 pandemic: in February 2020, 57% approved of Trump's handling of the economy and only 38% disapproved.

Nearly all (93%) Republicans approve of Trump's handling of the economy while 46% of Independents and only 4% of Democrats feel this way. Approval among Republicans is largely unchanged since the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic, while approval among Independents and Democrats has slightly fallen.

Approval of President Trump's Handling of the Economy

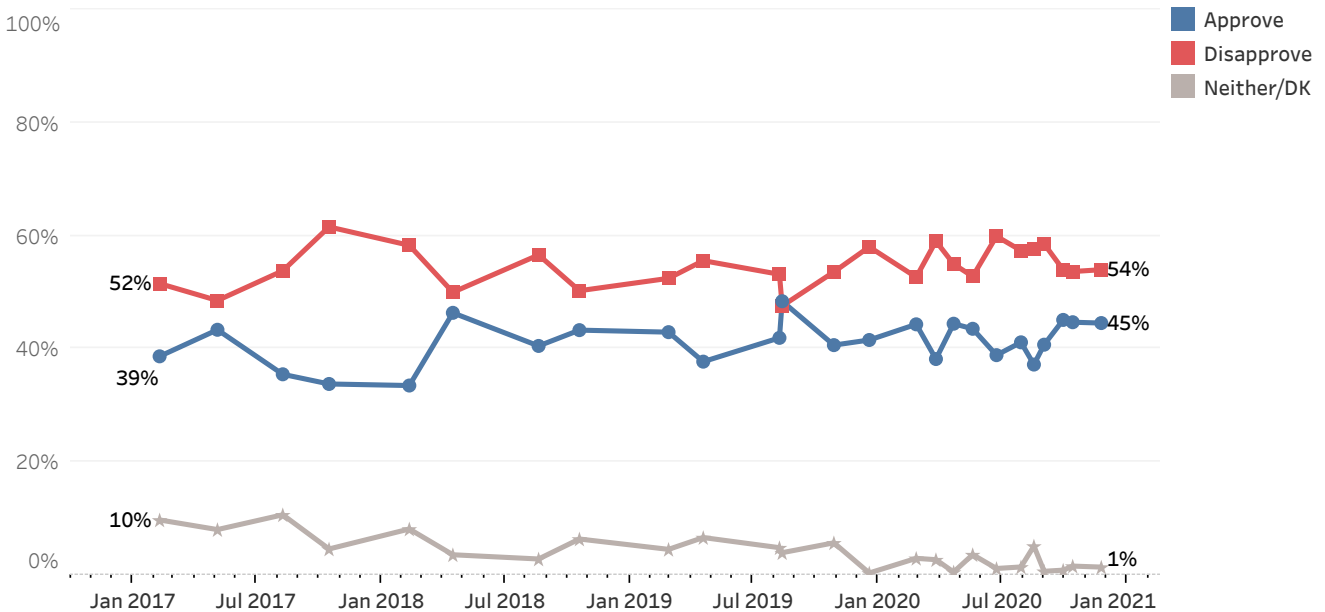


Foreign Affairs Approval

Forty-five percent of New Hampshire residents approve of President Trump's handling of foreign affairs, 54% disapprove, and 1% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know.

Ninety-one percent of Republicans approve of Trump's handling of foreign affairs, tied for an all-time high, but only 41% of Independents and 1% of Democrats feel this way.

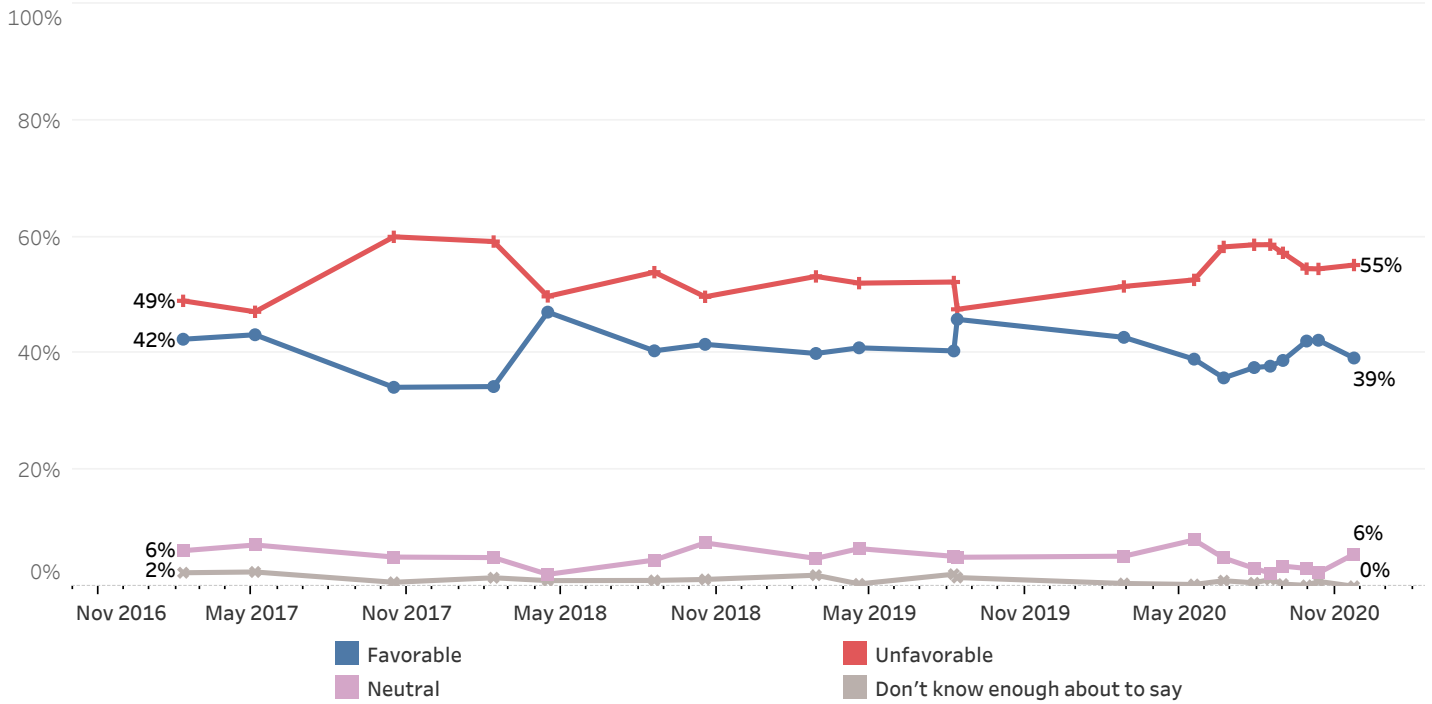
Approval of President Trump's Handling of Foreign Affairs



2020 Presidential Candidates Favorability

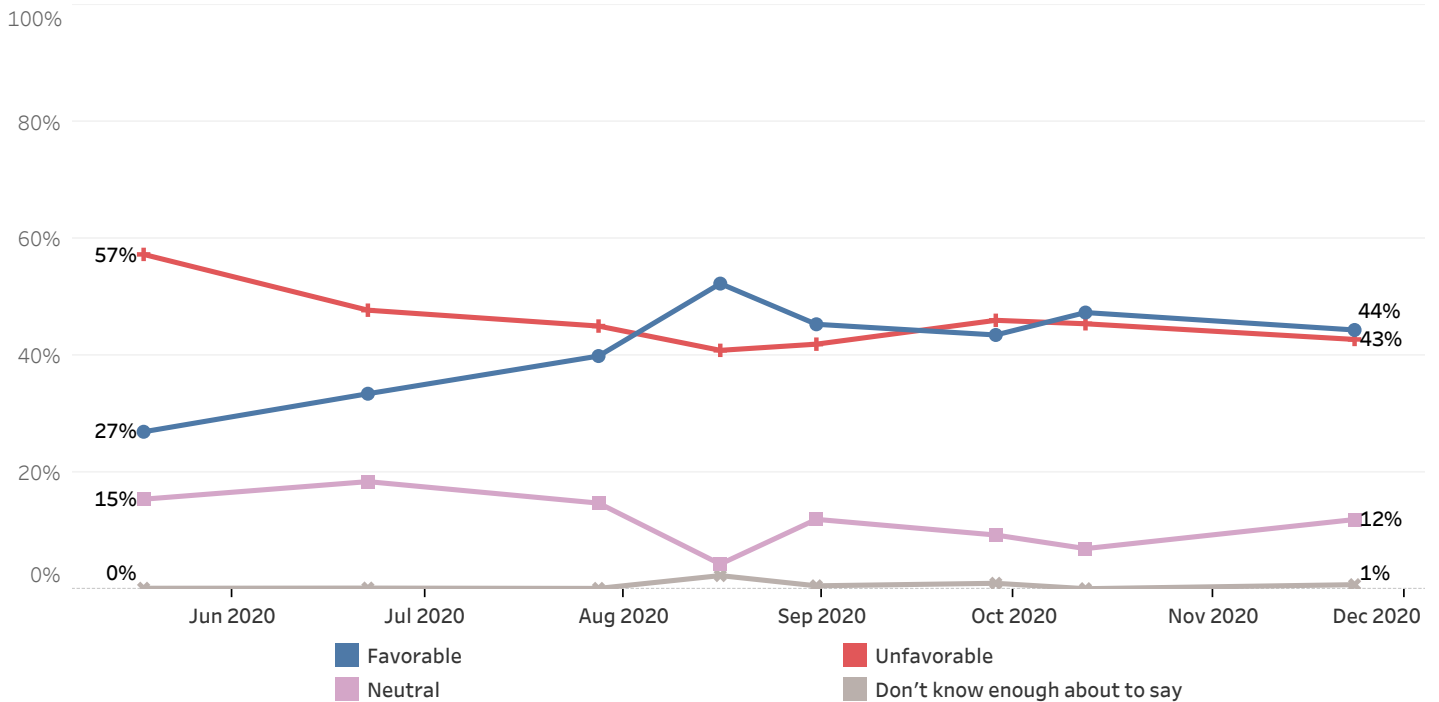
Only thirty-nine percent of New Hampshire residents say they have a favorable opinion of Donald Trump, 55% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 6% are neutral, and less than 1% are unsure. Trump's net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) is -16%, slightly lower than in October (-12%).

Joe Biden is more popular in New Hampshire than Trump – 44% of New Hampshire residents say they have a favorable opinion of Biden, 43% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 12% are neutral, and 1% are unsure. Biden's net favorability rating is +2%, unchanged since October (+2%).

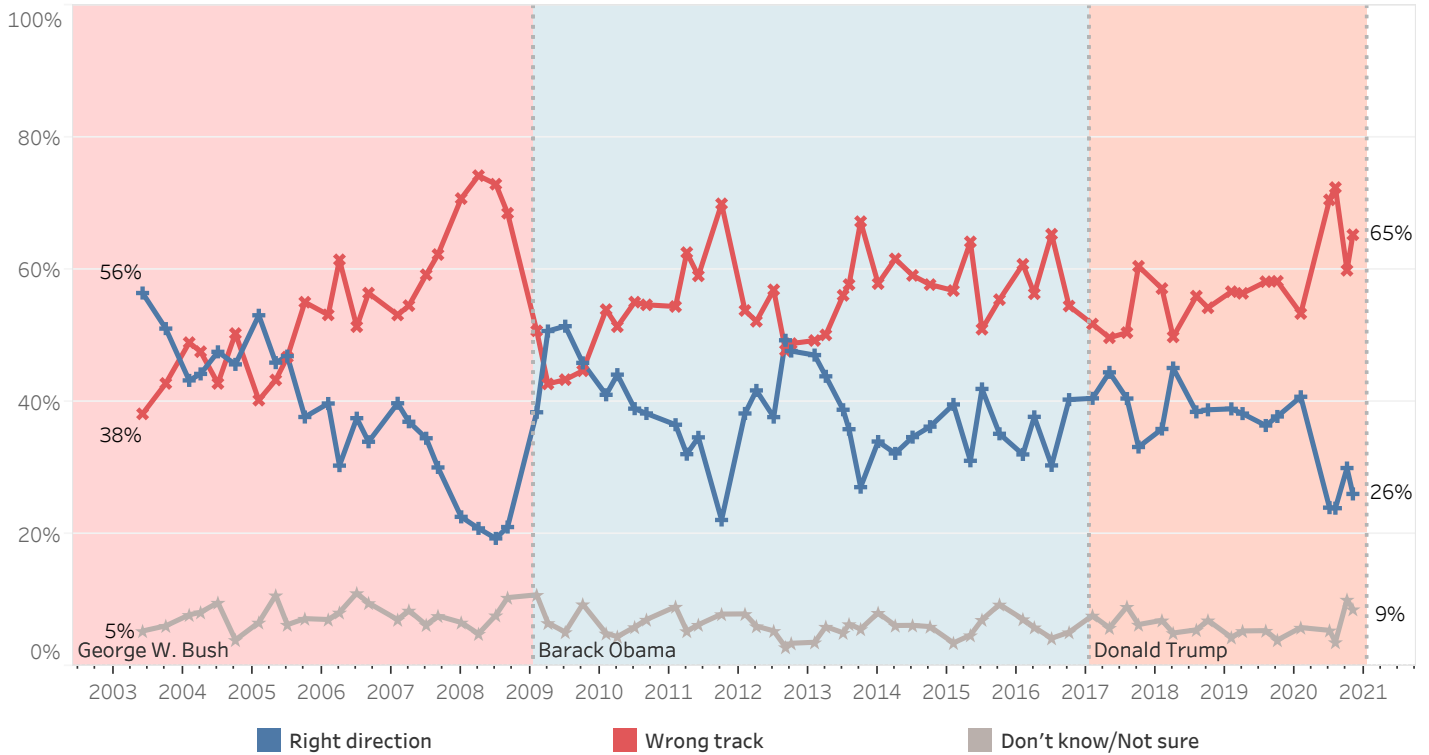
Biden (D) Favorability



U.S. Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

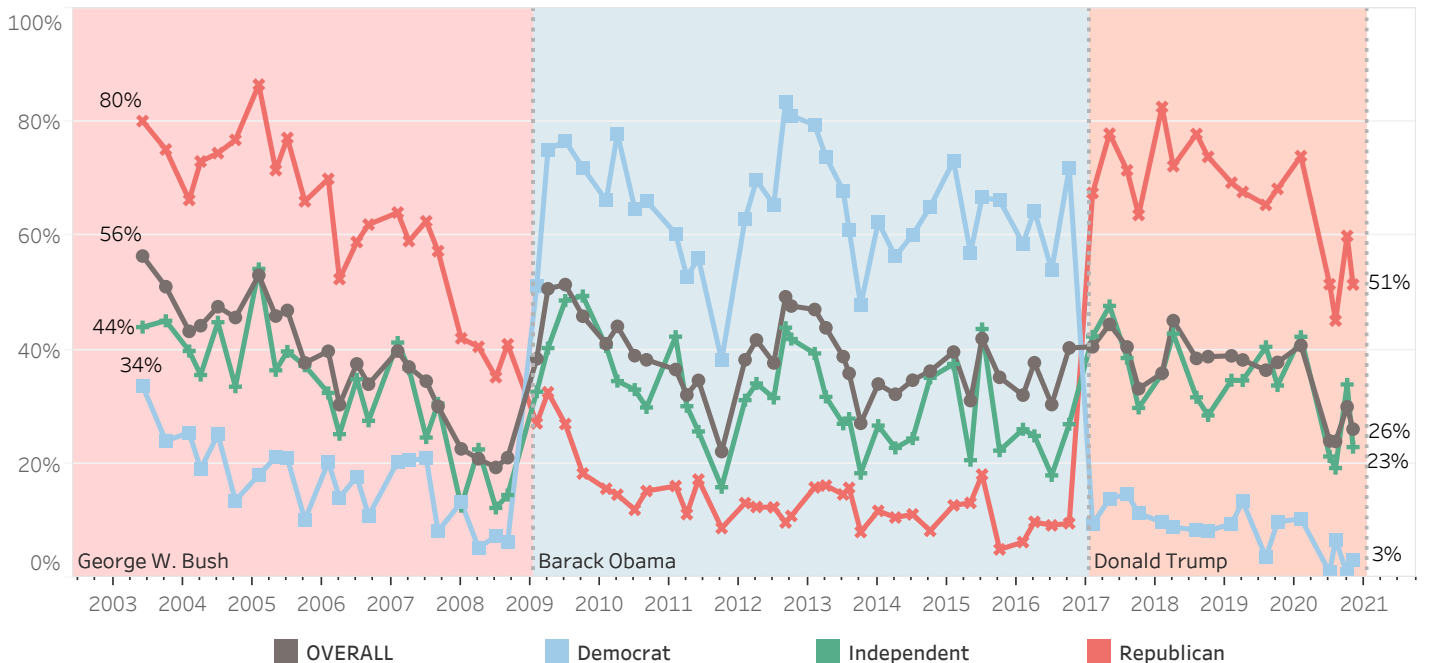
Nearly two-thirds (65%) of New Hampshire residents believe that things in the United States are seriously off on the wrong track, only 26% believe things are going in the right direction, and 9% are unsure. Granite Staters remain less likely to think the country is headed in the right direction (26%) than they were in February before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic (41%).

Despite President Trump's loss to Joe Biden in the recent presidential election, Republicans (51%) are far more likely than Democrats (3%) to believe the country is headed in the right direction while only 23% of Independents feel the country is headed in the right direction.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand nine hundred and seventeen (1,917) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between November 19 and November 23, 2020. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the November 2020 Granite State Poll is 34%. The design effect for the survey is 2.5%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 5,750 New Hampshire adults were recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
