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MOST IN NH SUPPORT ENDING ADDITIONAL UNEMPLOYMENT PAYMENTS; PAY RISES, BUT SO DO WORK RESPONSIBILITIES

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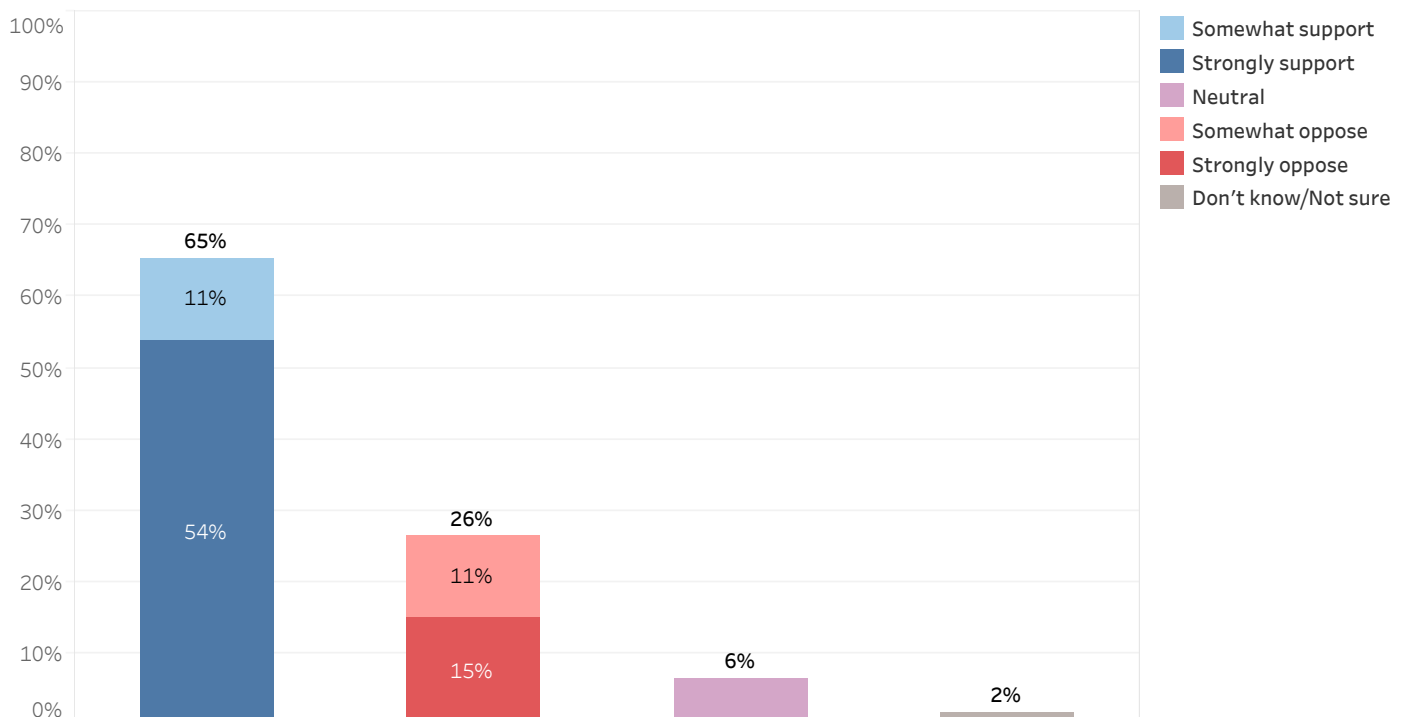
DURHAM, NH - Nearly two-thirds of New Hampshire residents support Governor Sununu's decision to end additional unemployment benefits and one-third believe it will do a lot to ease the labor shortage in the state. More than four in ten working Granite Staters have seen their pay increase at work over the past year, but six in ten say their responsibilities have increased and one-third have seen their hours increase. Nearly a quarter of working state residents are likely to look for a new job in the next year but less than half are confident they would be able to find a new job close to affordable housing or one with the pay they feel they deserve.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand six hundred and two (1,602) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between June 17 and June 21, 2021. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.4 percent. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and 2020 election results in NH. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

Additional Unemployment Payments

New Hampshire's unemployment rate stands at 2.5%, the lowest in the nation, and many employers say they can't find enough workers. In response to the worker shortage, Governor Chris Sununu has decided to end New Hampshire's participation in the federal pandemic unemployment program that gave unemployed workers an extra \$300 per week. To incentivize workers, Sununu has introduced a bonus for people who return to work. New Hampshire residents support this move: 65% strongly (54%) or somewhat (11%) support Sununu's decision, 26% strongly (15%) or somewhat (11%) oppose it, 6% are neutral, and 2% are unsure.

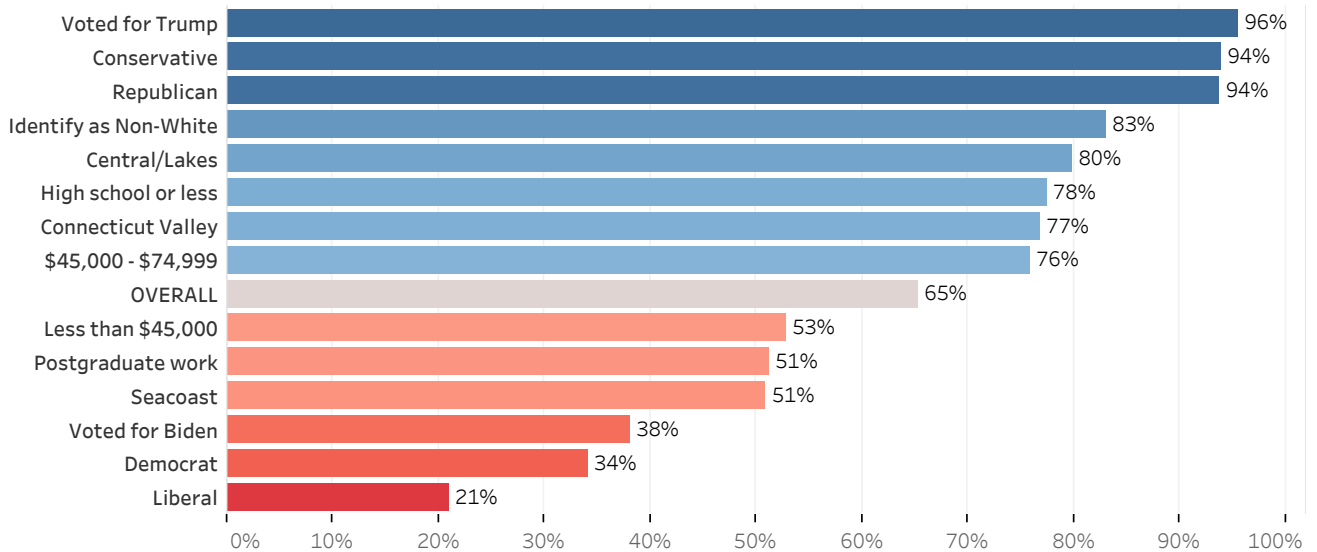
Support or Oppose Decision to End New Hampshire's Participation in Federal Additional Unemployment Program - June 2021

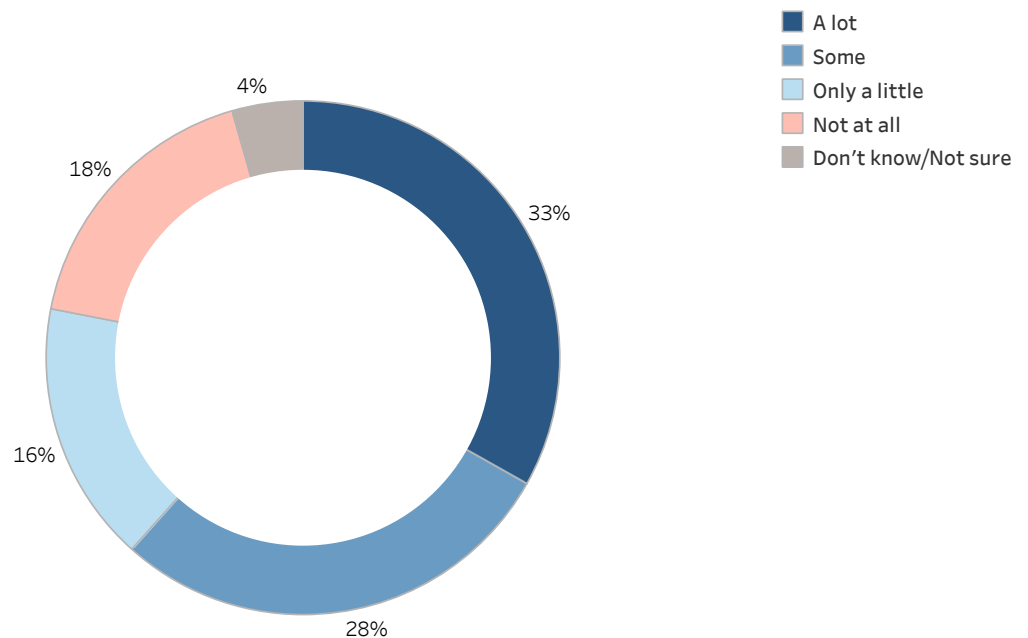
Support for this proposal is divided largely on partisan and ideological lines. New Hampshire residents who voted for Donald Trump in 2020, self-described conservatives, self-identified Republicans, those who identify as non-white, Central/Lakes Region and Connecticut Valley residents, those with a high school education or less, and those with a household income between \$45,000 and \$74,999 are more likely than others to support Governor Sununu's decision to end New Hampshire's participation in the federal pandemic unemployment program. Self-described liberals, self-identified Democrats, those who voted for Joe Biden in 2020, Seacoast residents, those who have completed postgraduate work, and those with a household income below \$45,000 are less likely to support this decision.

A majority of New Hampshire residents believe this move will ease the tight labor market. One-third of New Hampshire residents (33%) believe that ending the additional unemployment program will ease the state's ongoing labor shortage a lot, 28% believe it will ease the labor shortage some, 16% believe it will ease it only a little, 18% believe it will not ease the labor shortage at all, and 4% don't know or are unsure.

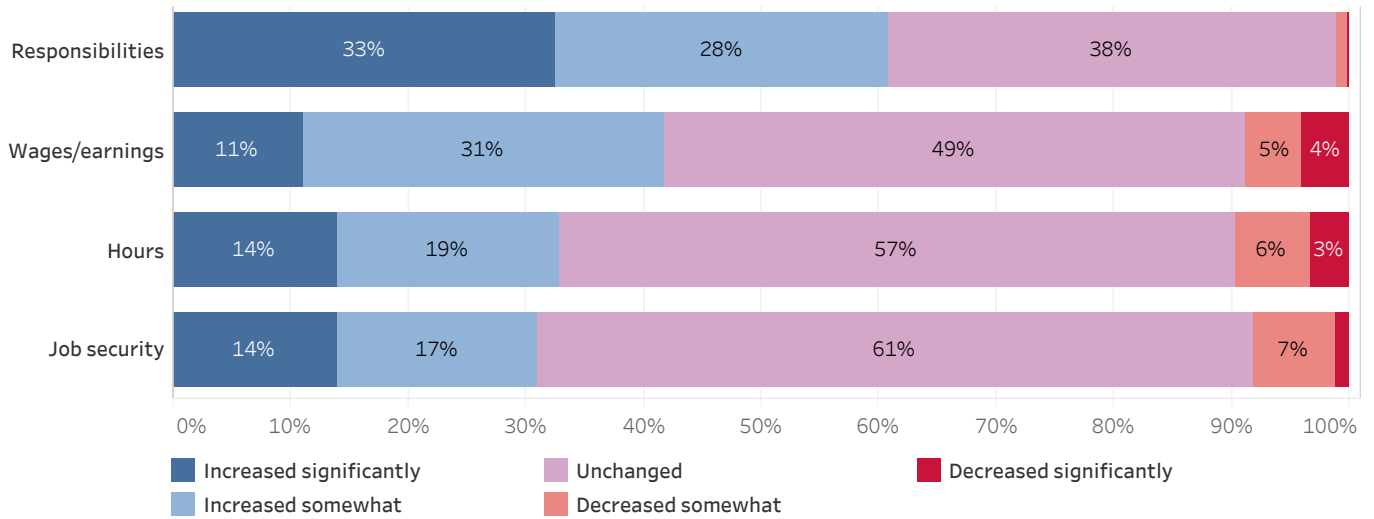
How Much Believe Ending Additional Unemployment Will Ease Labor Shortage - June 2021



Changes at Job in Past 12 Months

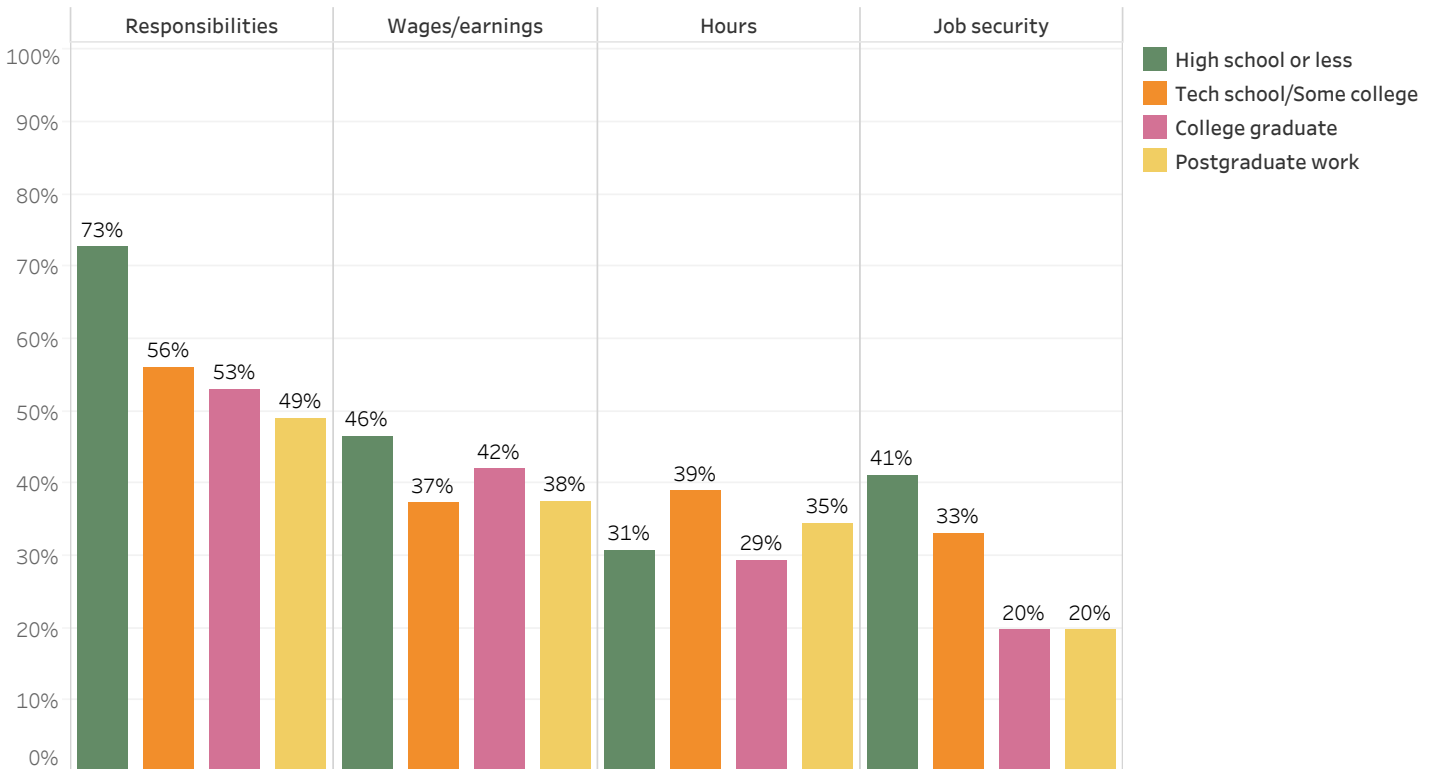
Many New Hampshire residents have had to adjust their work schedules and responsibilities during the COVID pandemic and in the current labor shortage. Among those who are currently employed (N=892), six in ten (61%) say that their responsibilities at their primary job have increased significantly (33%) or somewhat (28%) over the past year, only 3% say their responsibilities have decreased somewhat (3%) or significantly (<1%), and 38% say their responsibilities are unchanged. Forty-two percent say their wages or earnings from their primary job have increased significantly (11%) or somewhat (31%) in the past twelve months, 9% have seen their wages or earnings decrease somewhat (5%) or significantly (4%), and nearly half (49%) say their wages or earnings are unchanged over the past twelve months. About a third say that their hours (33%) and job security (31%) have increased in the past twelve months, while majorities say that their hours and job security are unchanged in that time.

Among those who are currently employed (N=892), those with a high school education or less are more likely than others to say their job responsibilities have increased in the past twelve months and they are also more likely than others to say their job security has increased in that time.

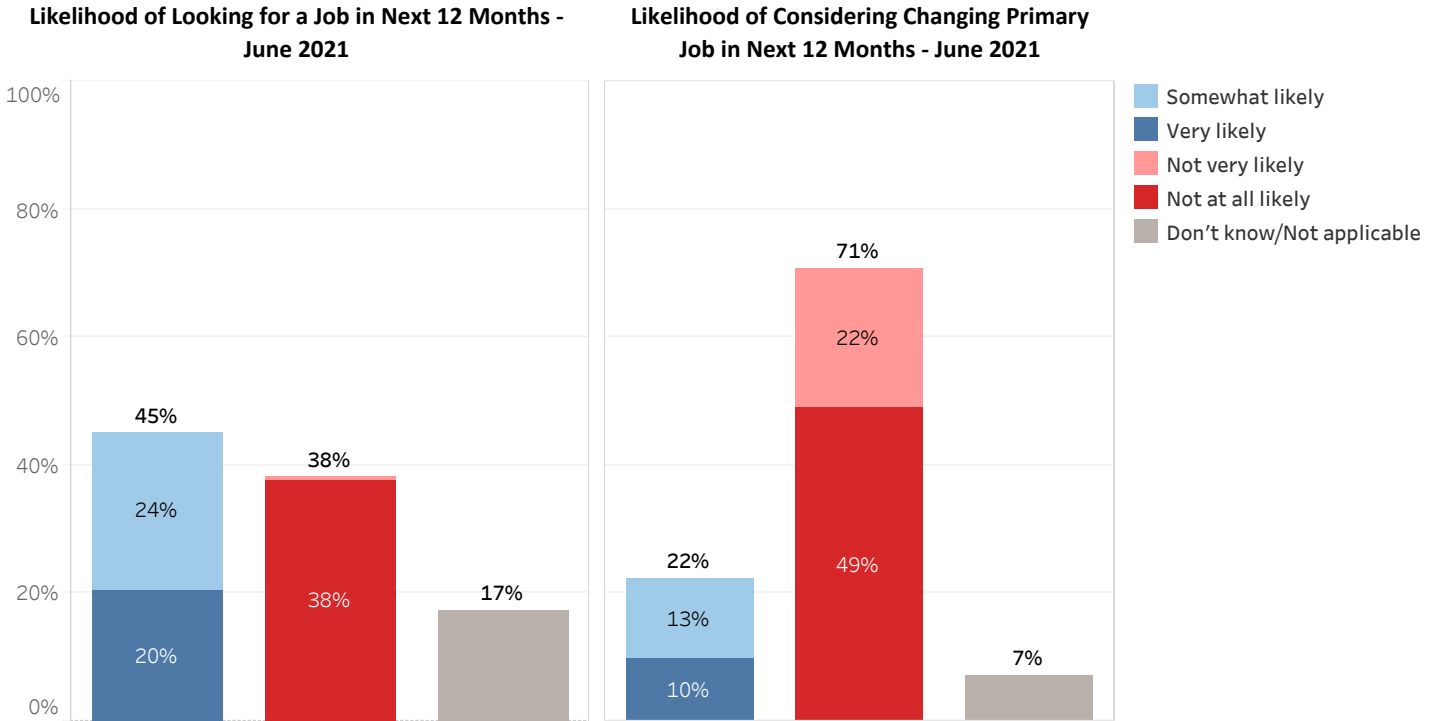
Increased in Past 12 Months at Primary Job - June 2021 - By Level of Education



Likelihood of Looking for a Job in Next 12 Months

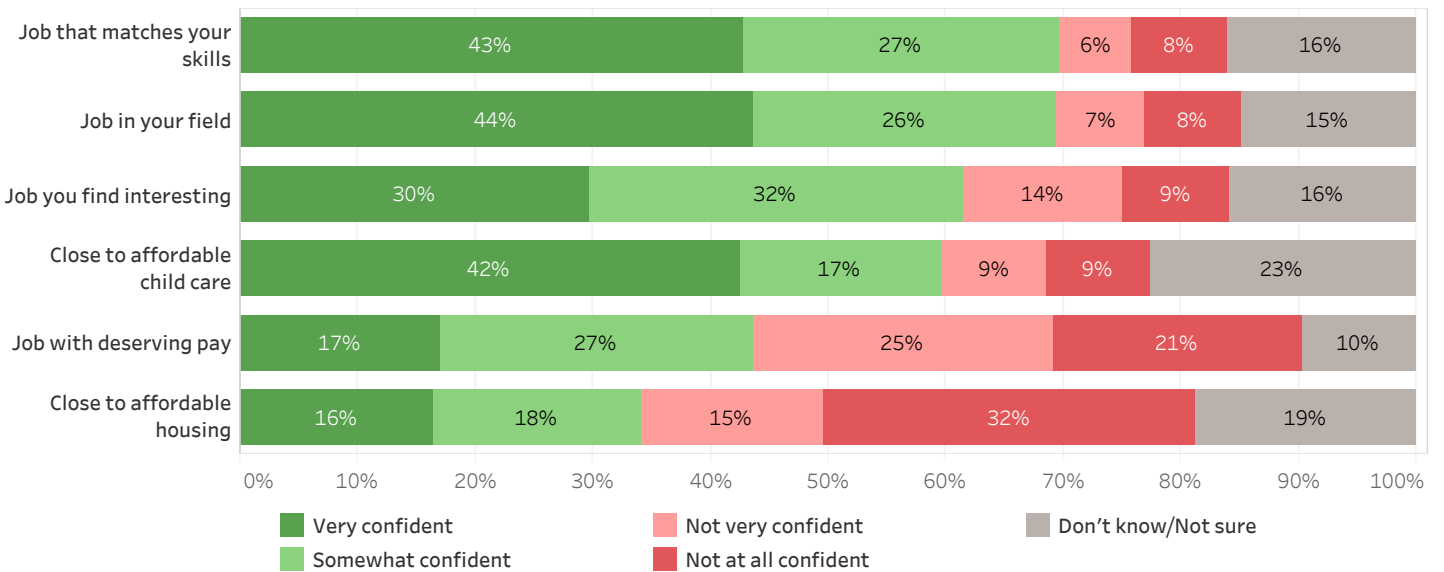
Among those who are not currently employed (N=114), 45% say it is very (20%) or somewhat (24%) likely that they will look for a job in the next twelve months, 38% say they are not very (<1%) or not at all (38%) likely to look for a job in that time, and 17% don't know.

Among those who are currently employed (N=939), 22% say it is very (10%) or somewhat (13%) likely that they will look for a new job in the next twelve months, 71% say they are not very (22%) or not at all likely (49%) to look for a new job, and 7% don't know. Respondents under the age of 50, women, and those with a household income below \$45,000 are more likely than others to say they are likely to considering changing jobs in the next twelve months.



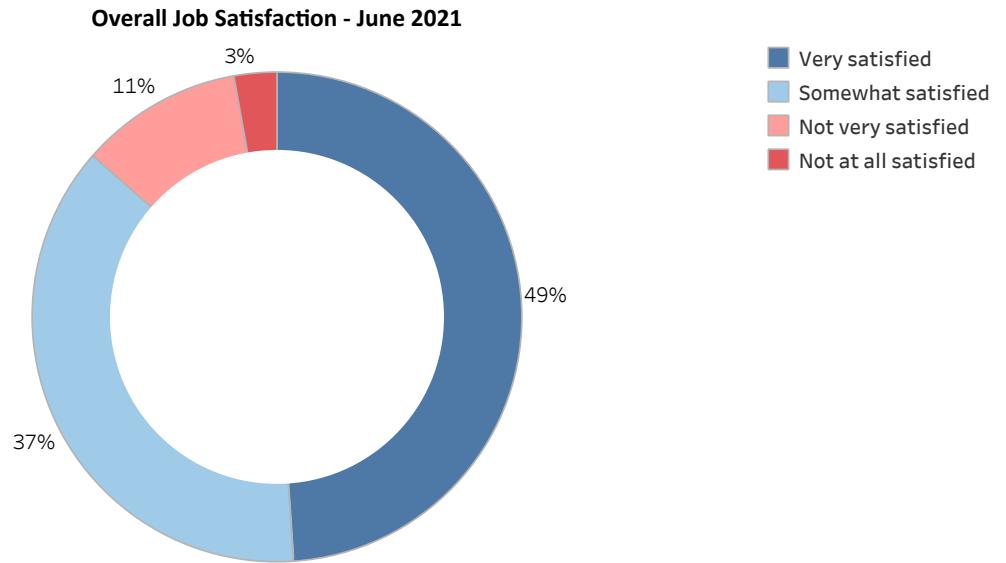
More than two-thirds of New Hampshire residents say that if they were to look for a job in the next twelve months they would be very or somewhat confident they could find a job that matches their skills (70%) and a job that is in their field (70%), while six in ten are confident they could find a job they would find interesting (61%) and a job close to affordable child care (60%). However, less than half of Granite Staters are confident that they could find a job with pay in keeping with what they feel they deserve (44%) or a job that is close to affordable housing (34%).

Job Satisfaction

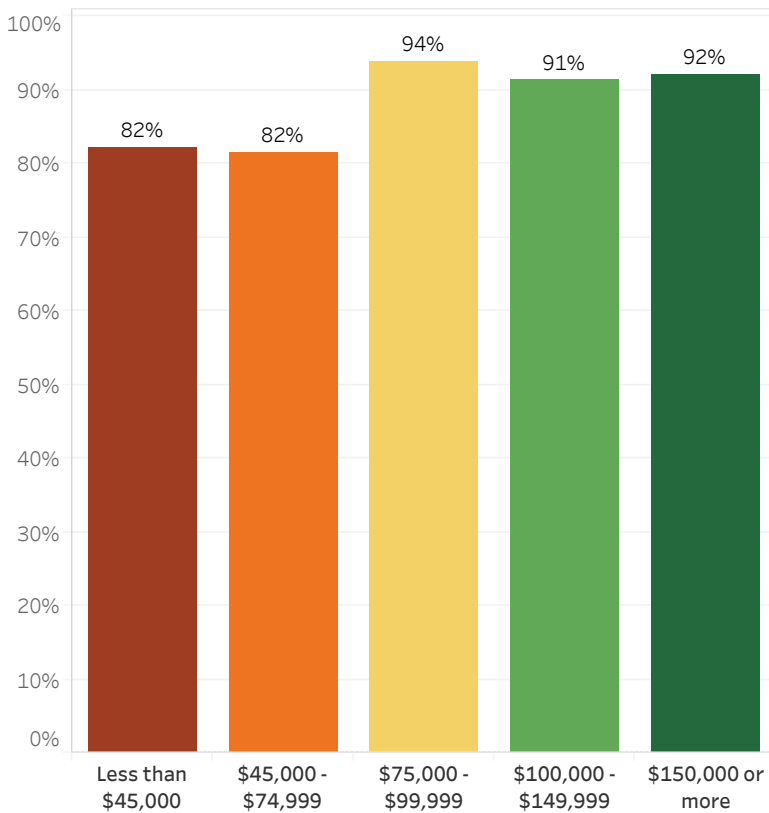
Among those who are currently employed, 49% say they are very satisfied with their current job, 37% are somewhat satisfied, 11% are not very satisfied, and 3% are not at all satisfied.



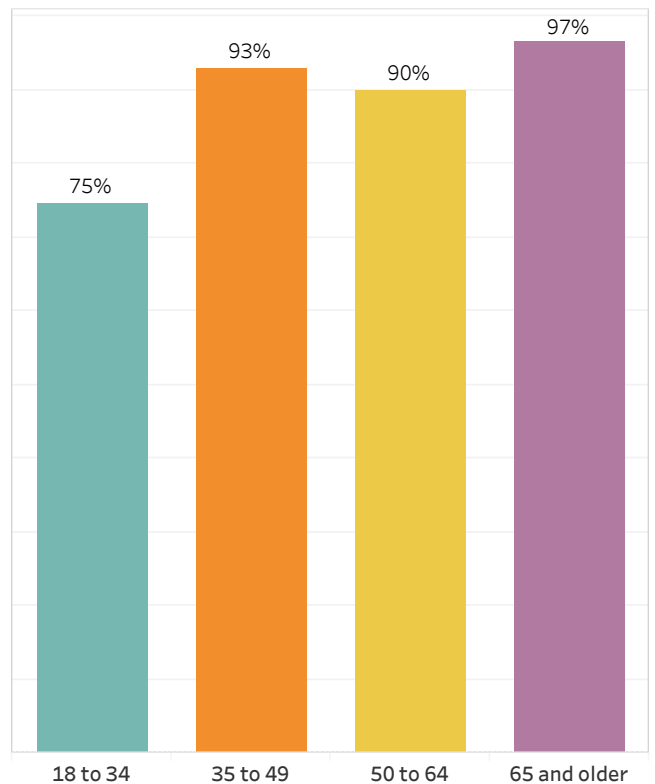
Granite Staters with a household income below \$75,000 are less likely than those with a household income of \$75,000 or more to say they are very or somewhat satisfied with their job.

Granite Staters aged 18 to 34 are a good deal less likely than those aged 35 and older to say they are very or somewhat satisfied with their job.

Very or Somewhat Satisfied with Primary Job - June 2021 - By Household Income



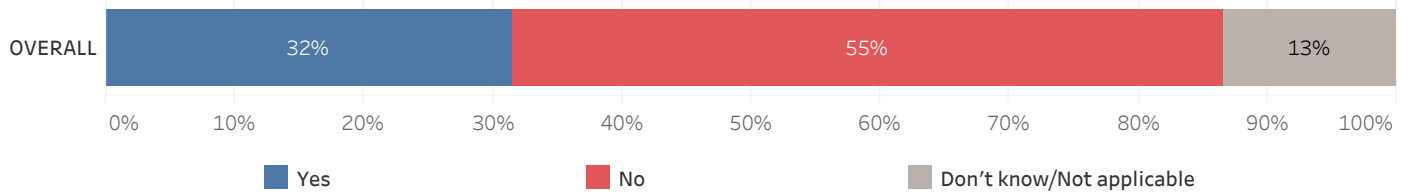
Very or Somewhat Satisfied with Primary Job - June 2021 - By Age



Working from Home

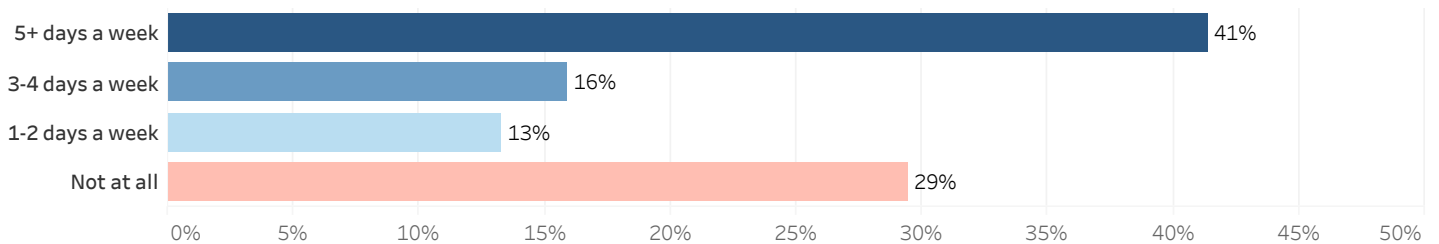
One-third of Granite Staters (32%) say that they worked from home for at least one week since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, 55% have not worked from home at all, and 13% don't know or say the question is not applicable. Respondents with at least a college degree, those with high incomes, and those under thirty-five are more likely than others to have worked from home.

Among those who have worked from home since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic (N=501), 41% say they are currently working from home five days a week or more, 16% are working three or four days a week from home, 13% are working one or two days a week from home, and 29% are not working from home at all currently.

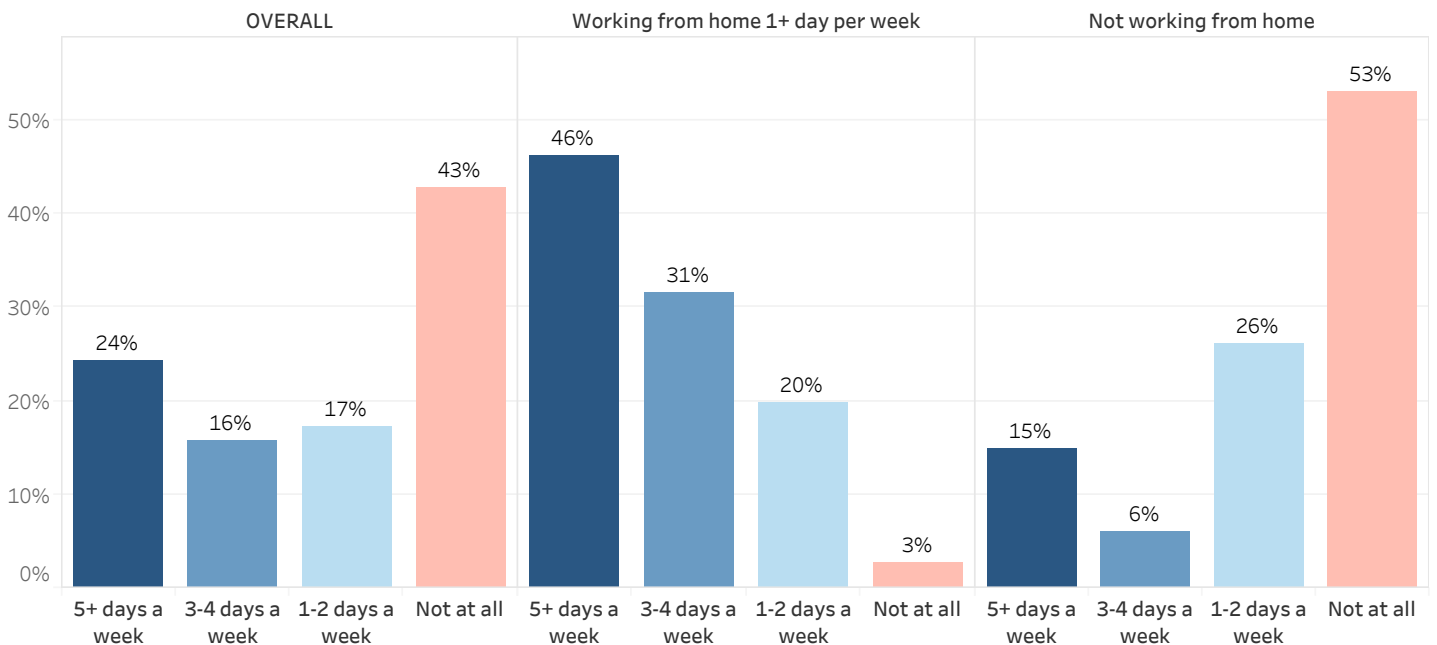
Frequency Working from Home Currently - June 2021



If they were given the choice, 57% of Granite Staters would prefer to work from home at least once a week: 24% would prefer to work from home five days a week or more, 16% would prefer to work from home three or four days per week, and 17% would prefer to work from home one or two days per week, while 43% would not like to work from home at all.

Nearly all of those who are currently working from home would like to continue doing so: only 3% would like to not work from home at all while nearly half (46%) would prefer to work five days a week or more at home. Among those not currently working from home, more than half (53%) are not interested in doing so even if they had a choice while a quarter (26%) would like to do so one or two days per week.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand six hundred and two (1,602) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between June 17 and June 21, 2021. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.4 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the June 2021 Granite State Poll is 27%. The design effect for the survey is 2.7%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 6,000 New Hampshire adults were recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
