GRANITE STATERS FEEL LESS SAFE THAN BEFORE 9/11 BUT MORE CONCERNED WITH OTHER CALAMITIES THAN FOREIGN TERRORISM

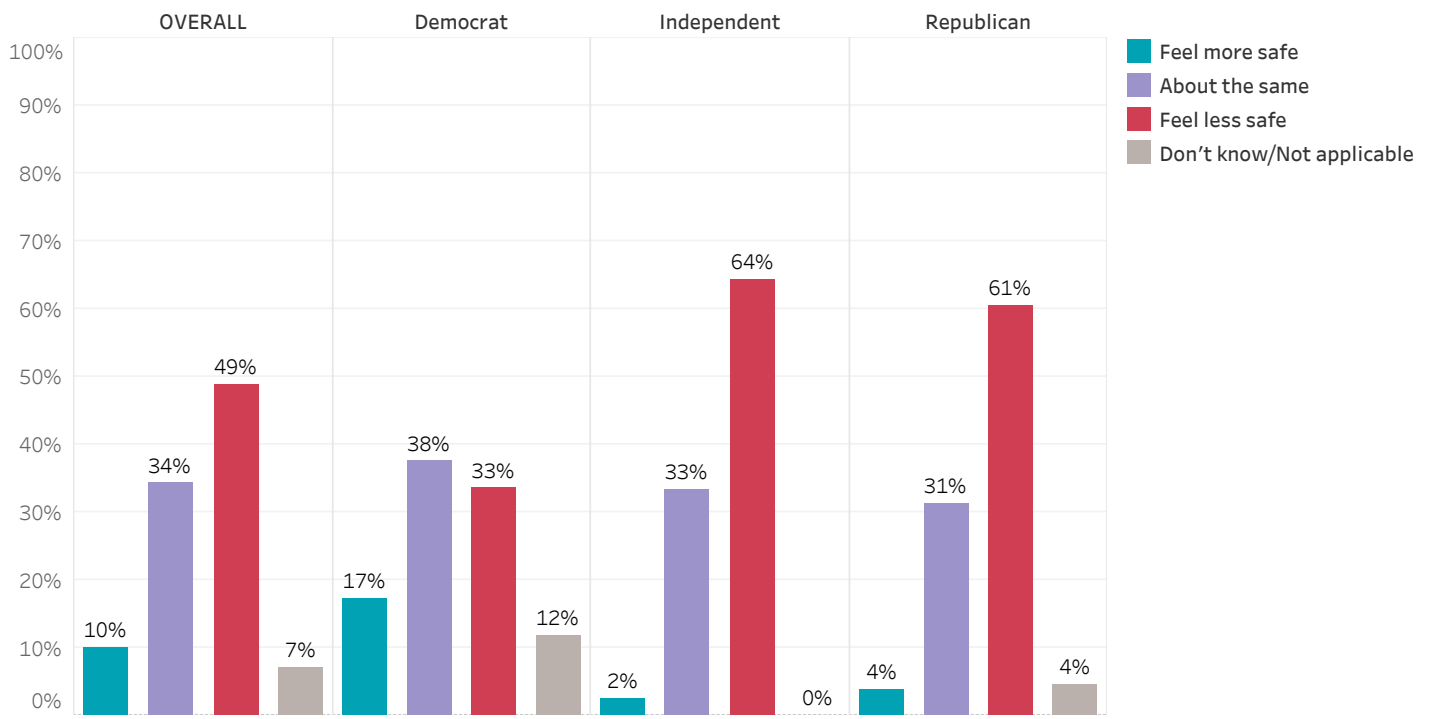
DURHAM, NH - Nearly half of New Hampshire residents feel less safe than they did before the September 11th terrorist attacks, but state residents are more concerned about domestic terrorism, mass shootings, natural disasters, and COVID-19 than they are about foreign terrorism. As in August, more than half of Granite Staters disapprove of President Biden's overall job performance, weighed down by low approval of Biden's handling of foreign affairs.

These findings are based on the latest **Granite State Poll***, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and eighty-one (1,081) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 16 and September 20, 2021. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.0 percent. Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and 2020 election results in NH. Granite State Panel members are recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers across New Hampshire and surveys are sent periodically to panel members.

Terrorism

Twenty years after the terrorist attacks on September 11th, 2001, nearly half (49%) of New Hampshire residents say that they currently feel less safe than they did before the September 11th attacks. Only 10% say that they feel more safe now than before September 11th, 34% say they feel about same amount of safety as they did before then, and 7% are unsure. Most Independents (64%) and Republicans (61%) say that they feel less safe than they did before the September 11th attacks but only 33% of Democrats feel this way, with a plurality (38%) saying they feel about as safe now as they did before the attacks. In October 2011, most respondents (55%) said they felt about as safe as they did before the September 11th attacks and only 30% felt less safe.

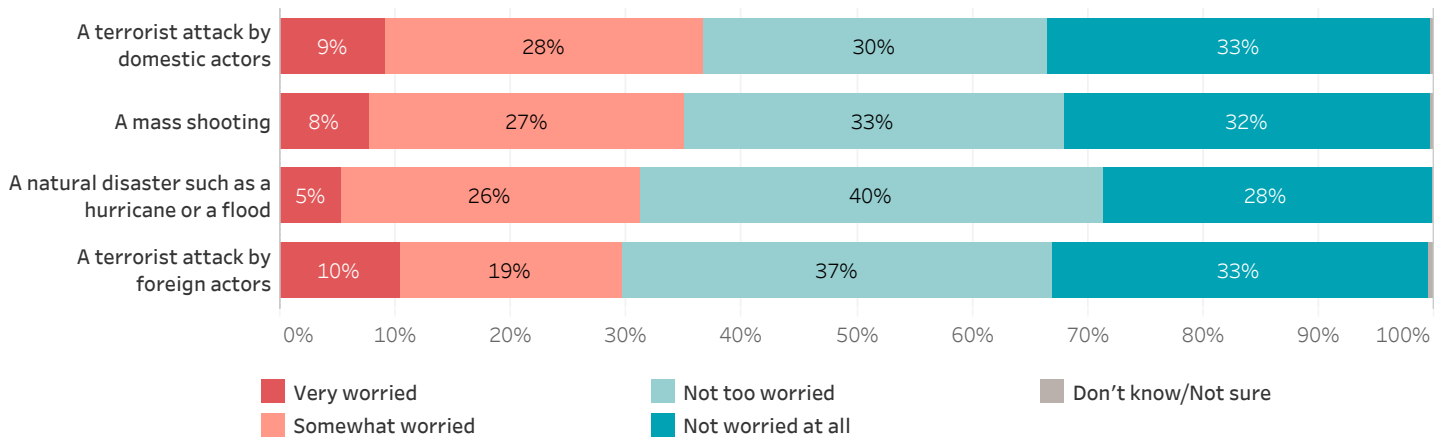
Feeling of Safety Compared to Before September 11th, 2001 - September 2021

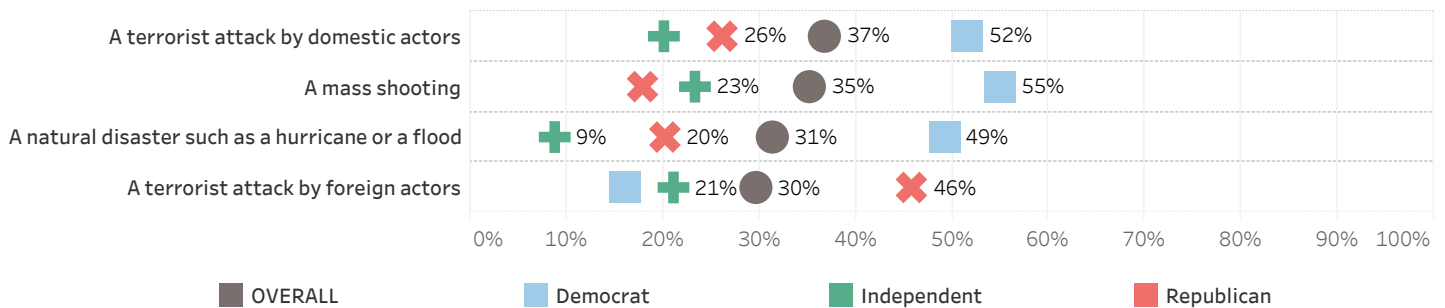
Despite many in New Hampshire feeling less safe now than they did before the September 11th attacks, Granite Staters are more worried about themselves or someone they know being victimized by other events than they are of being victimized by a terrorist attack carried out by foreign actors. Three in eight (37%) Granite Staters say they are very (9%) or somewhat (28%) worried about themselves or someone they know being victimized by a terrorist attack carried out by domestic actors, 35% are very or somewhat worried about a mass shooting, 31% are worried about a natural disaster, and 30% are worried about a terrorist attack by foreign actors.

Level of Worry Self or Someone You Know Will be Victimized by Following Things - September 2021



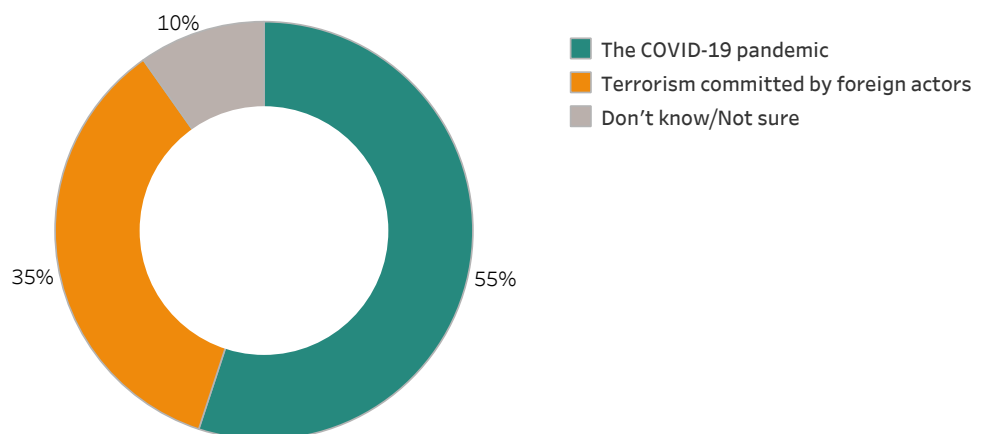
Democrats are at least twice as likely as Republicans and Independents to say they are very or somewhat worried about terrorist attacks by domestic actors, mass shootings, and natural disasters, while Republicans are more than twice as likely as Independents and nearly three times as likely as Democrats to be very or somewhat worried about a terrorist attack by foreign actors.

More than half (55%) of Granite Staters say that over the next twelve months they are more concerned about the effects of the COVID-19 pandemic than they are concerned about the possibility of terrorism committed by foreign actors. Only 35% say they are more concerned about foreign terrorism while 10% are unsure. Nearly all (95%) Democrats are more concerned about COVID-19, more than two-thirds of Republicans (68%) are more concerned about foreign terrorism, and Independents are about evenly divided, with 36% more concerned about COVID-19 and 33% more concerned about foreign terrorism.

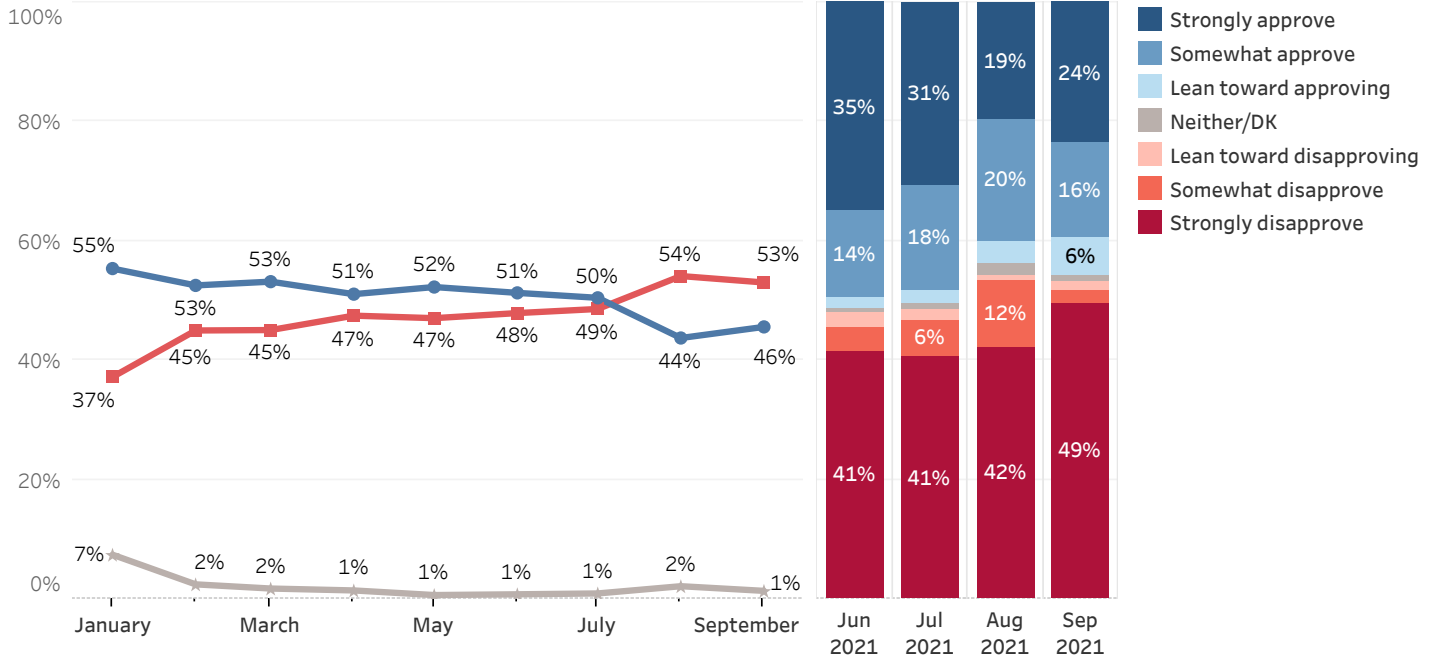
More Concerned Over Next Twelve Months with Foreign Terrorism or COVID-19 Pandemic - September 2021



Presidential Approval

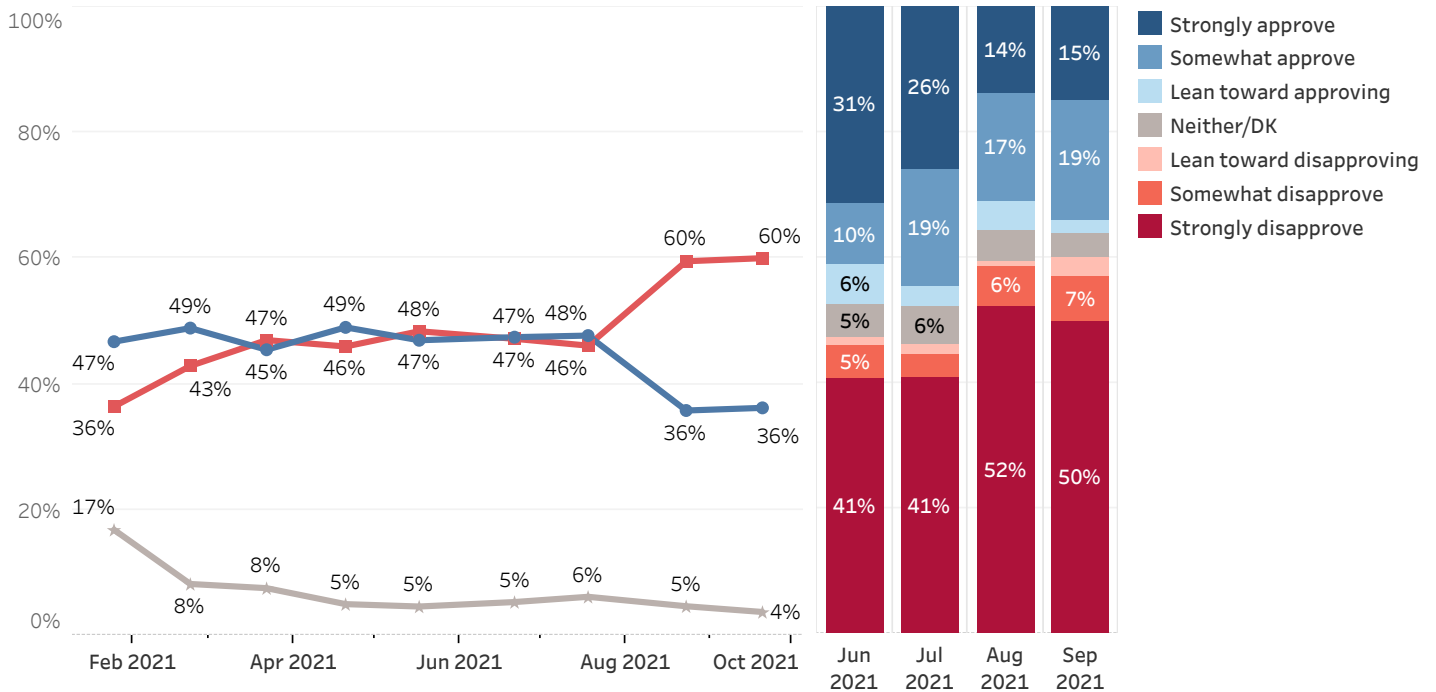
President Joe Biden's approval rating remains lower than earlier in the year: 46% of Granite Staters currently approve of Biden's performance as President, 53% disapprove, and 1% are unsure. Biden's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) among Granite Staters is -7, little changed since August (-10). Biden's approval rating is higher than President Trump's net approval rating in August 2017 (-21). Biden's net approval rating is +88 among Democrats, -52 among Independents, and -93 among Republicans.

Approval of President Biden's Job Performance



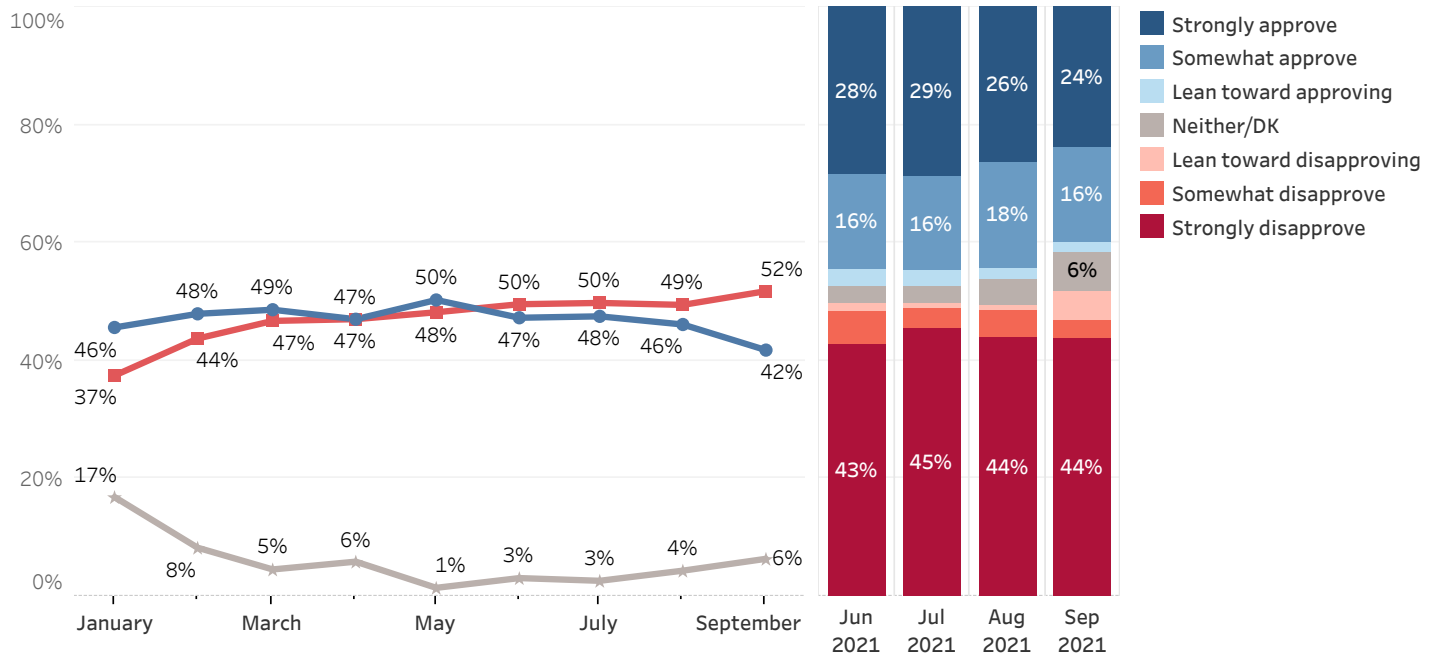
Only 36% of Granite Staters say that they approve of Biden's handling of foreign affairs, 60% disapprove, and 4% are unsure. Net approval of Biden's handling of foreign affairs (-24) is unchanged since August (-24) but remains far lower than earlier in Biden's presidency. Three-quarters (76%) of Democrats approve of Biden's handling of foreign affairs but only 17% of Independents and only 2% of Republicans approve.

A majority also disapprove of President Biden's handling of the economy: 42% of Granite Staters currently approve of Biden's performance as president, 52% disapprove, and 6% are unsure. Net approval of Biden's handling of the economy (-10) has declined since August (-3). The large majority of Democrats (85%) approve of Biden's handling of the economy but only 23% of Independents and 2% of Republicans approve.

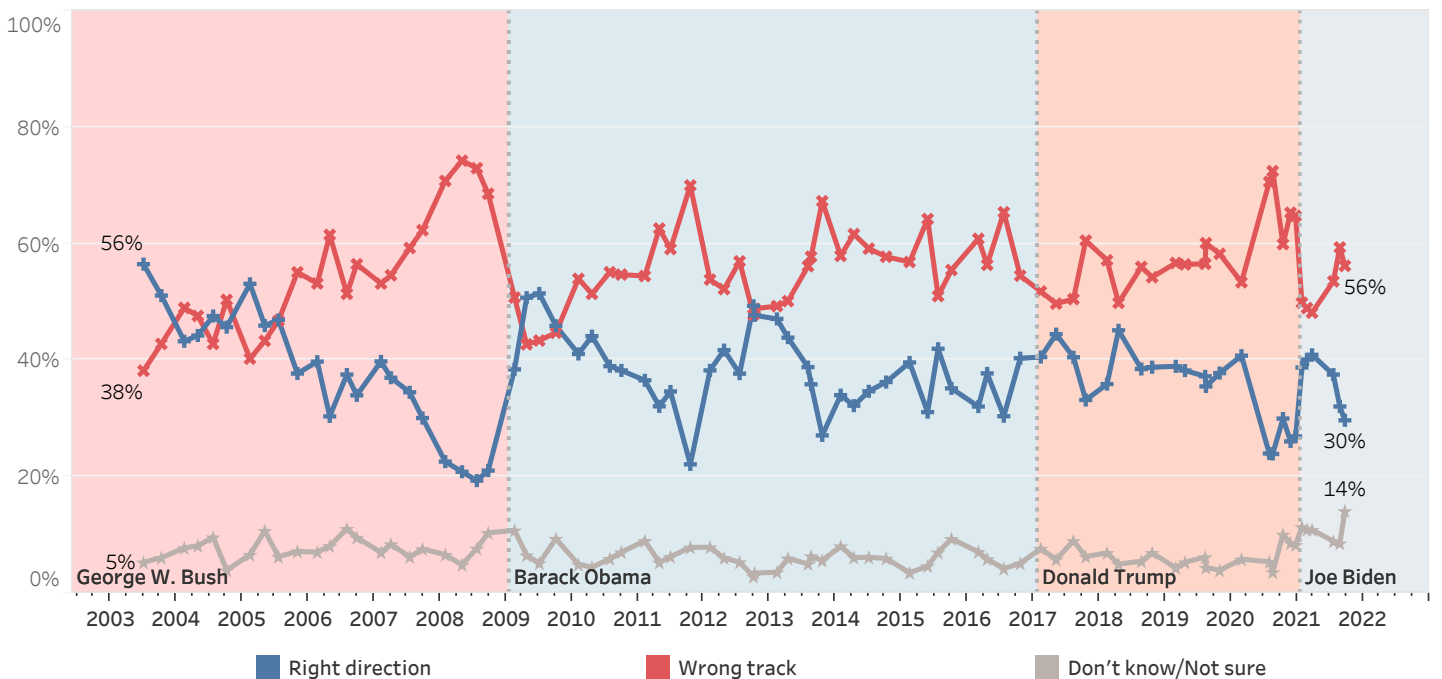
Approval of President Biden's Handling of the Economy



U.S. Heading in Right Direction or On Wrong Track

Only 30% of New Hampshire residents believe that things in the United States are headed in the right direction, 56% believe things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 14% are unsure. The percentage of Granite Staters who say the country is on the right track (30%) has fallen since March (41%). Sixty-two percent of Democrats say the country is headed in the right direction but only 10% of Independents and 3% of Republicans agree. The percentage of Independents who feel the country is headed in the right direction is at an all-time low.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand and eighty-one (1,081) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 16 and September 20, 2021. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.0 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the September 2021 Granite State Poll is 30%. The design effect for the survey is 2.7%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
