BIPARTISAN SUPPORT FOR NH MARIJUANA LEGISLATION; MOST CONSIDER LEGISLATURE'S REDISTRICTING MAPS UNFAIR

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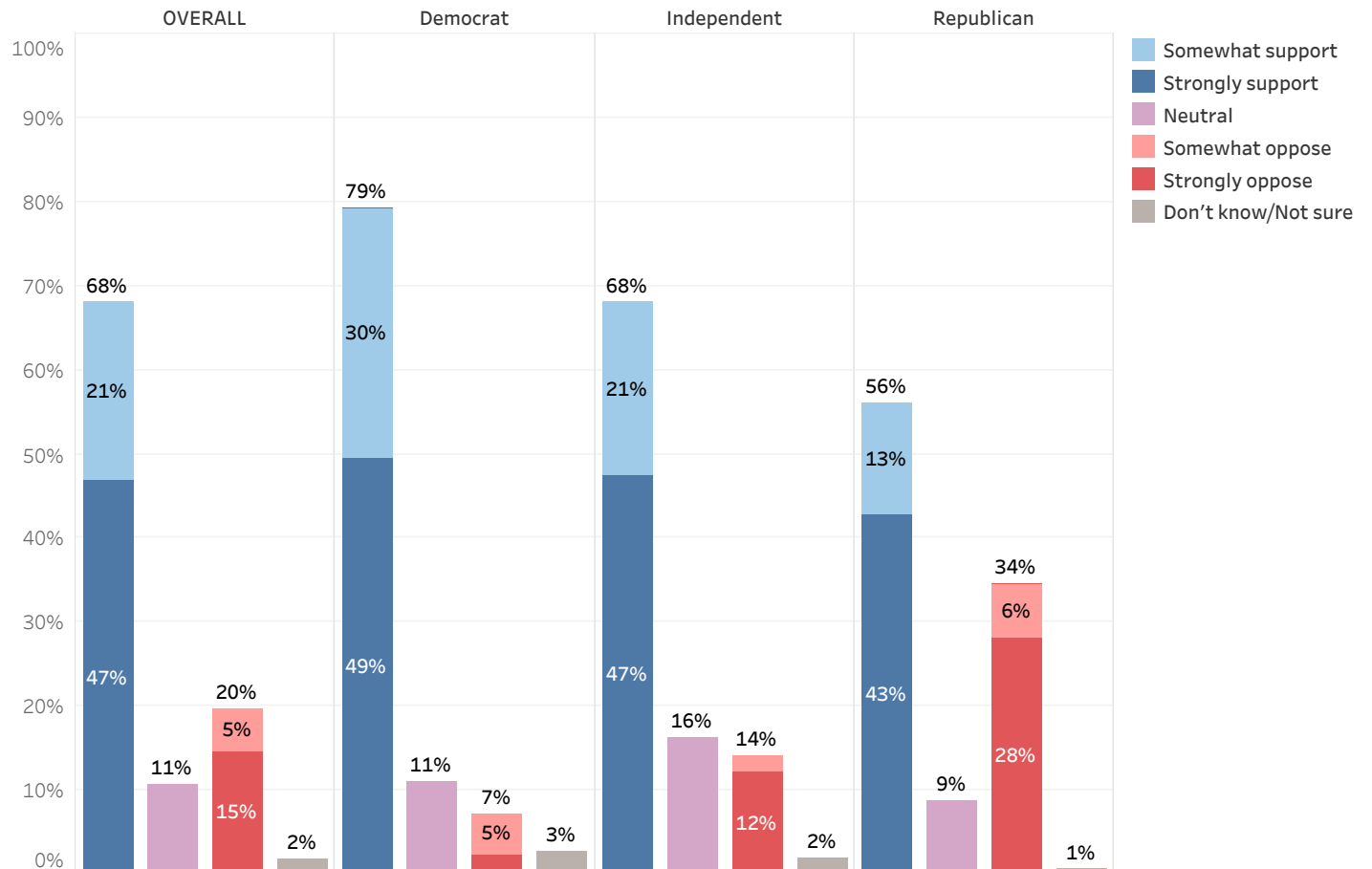
DURHAM, NH - More than two-thirds of Granite Staters support proposed legislation to legalize marijuana, allowing it to be sold in state Liquor stores. While only one-third of New Hampshire residents have seen the legislative redistricting maps proposed by the State Legislature, nearly all Democrats and Independents who have seen them consider them to be unfair, while even Republicans are closely divided. Residents are closely divided on another bill that would eliminate required yearly automobile inspections.

Marijuana Legalization

The State Legislature is considering a bill which would legalize recreational marijuana use for New Hampshire residents aged 21 and up and require marijuana sales to be conducted through the New Hampshire Liquor Commission. More than two-thirds (68%) of respondents are strongly (47%) or somewhat (21%) in support of this bill, 20% are somewhat (5%) or strongly (15%) opposed to it, 11% are neutral, and 2% are unsure.

Four in five Democrats (79%), more than two-thirds of Independents (68%), and a majority of Republicans (56%) are in favor of this bill.

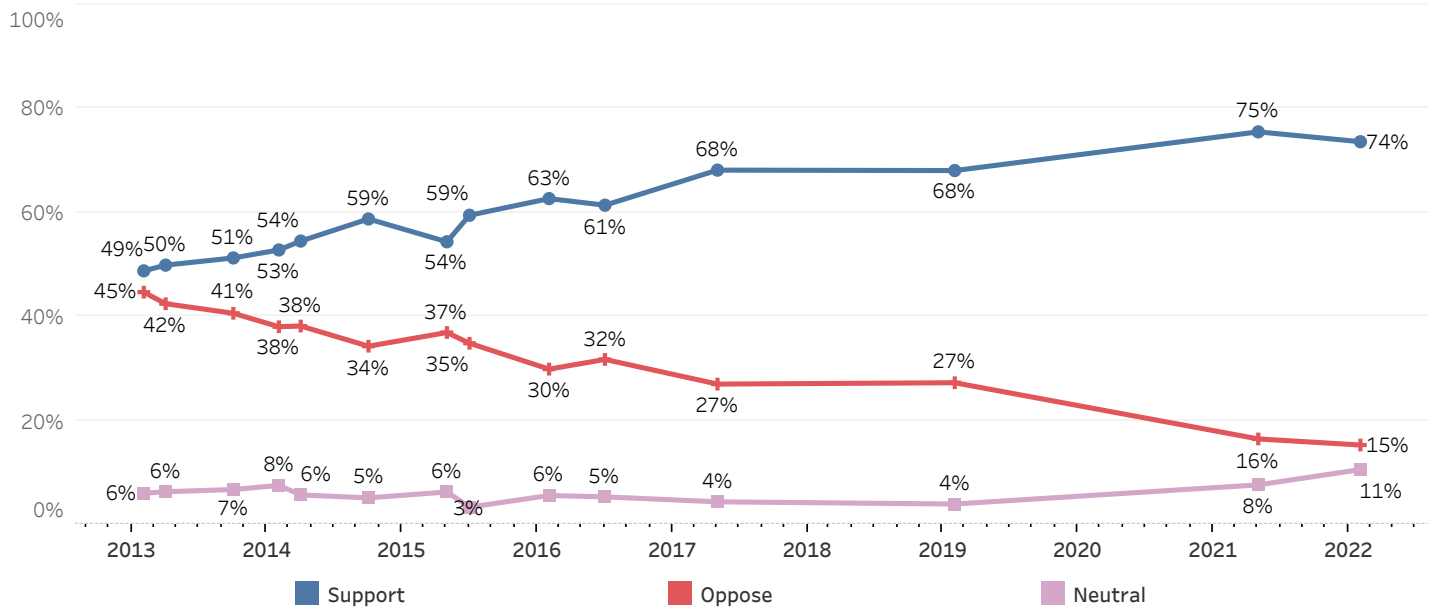
Support or Oppose Marijuana Legalization Bill with Sales through Liquor Commission - February 2022

Support for legalizing marijuana generally in New Hampshire has increased dramatically in the past decade. In 2013, Granite Staters were split nearly evenly, with 49% in support of legalizing marijuana and 45% opposed. Today, nearly three-quarters (74%) support legalizing marijuana and only 15% are opposed.

Support or Oppose Marijuana Legalization

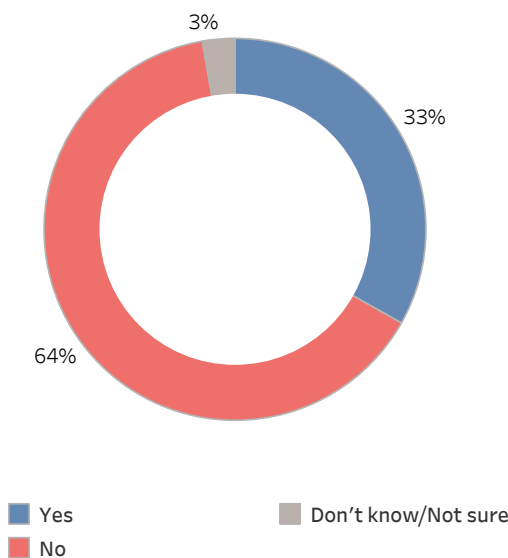


Congressional Redistricting

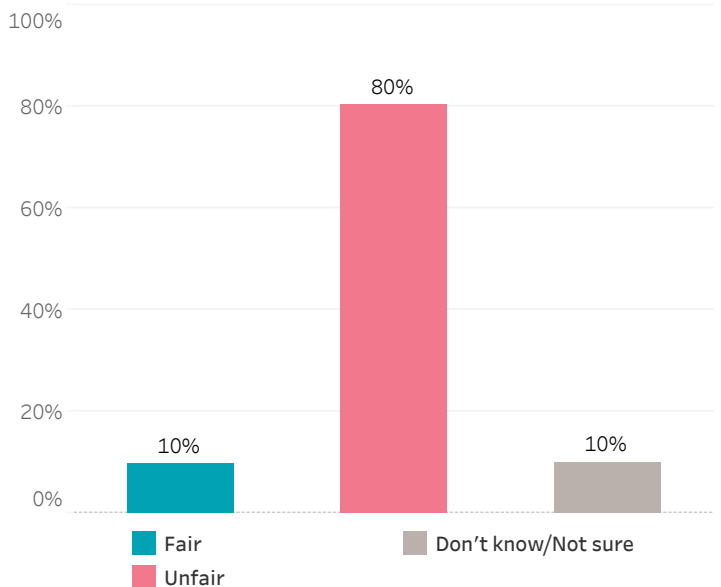
As part of the congressional redistricting process that occurs after each decennial census, the New Hampshire State Legislature has published maps for the two U.S. House of Representatives seats from New Hampshire. The proposed districts are very different from maps going back 50 years, moving many towns that have historically been in one district to the other. Despite the importance of redistricting to who gets elected to Congress in 2022, only 33% of New Hampshire residents say they have seen the new maps while 64% have not seen them. Independents (45%) and Democrats (42%) are considerably more likely than Republicans (20%) to say they have seen the maps.

Among those who have seen the maps (N=357), a large majority (80%) believe they are unfair while only 10% think they are fair. Nearly all Democrats (97%) and Independents (91%) who have seen the maps think they are unfair, while even Republicans are divided in their opinion: 36% find them to be unfair, 31% think they are fair, and 33% are unsure.

Seen 2022 Redistricting Maps Proposed by State Legislature - February 2022



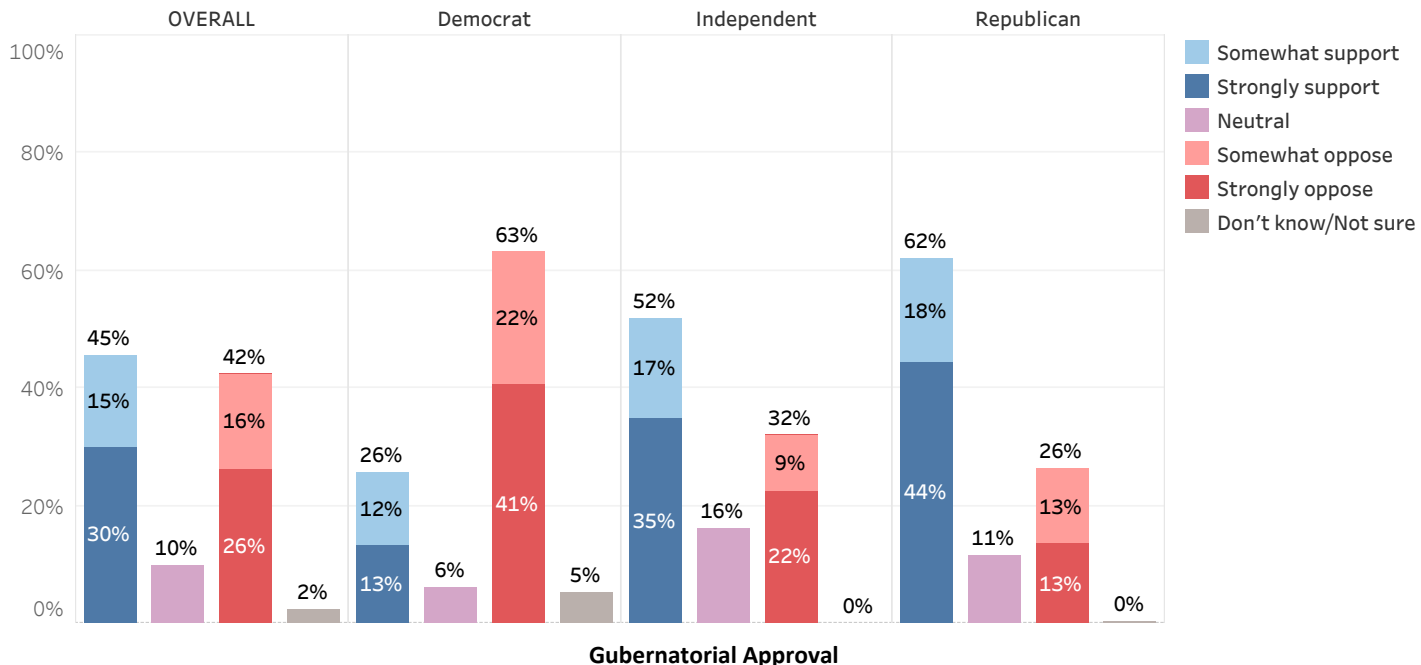
Perceived Fairness of Redistricting Maps Proposed by State Legislature - February 2022



Yearly Car Inspections

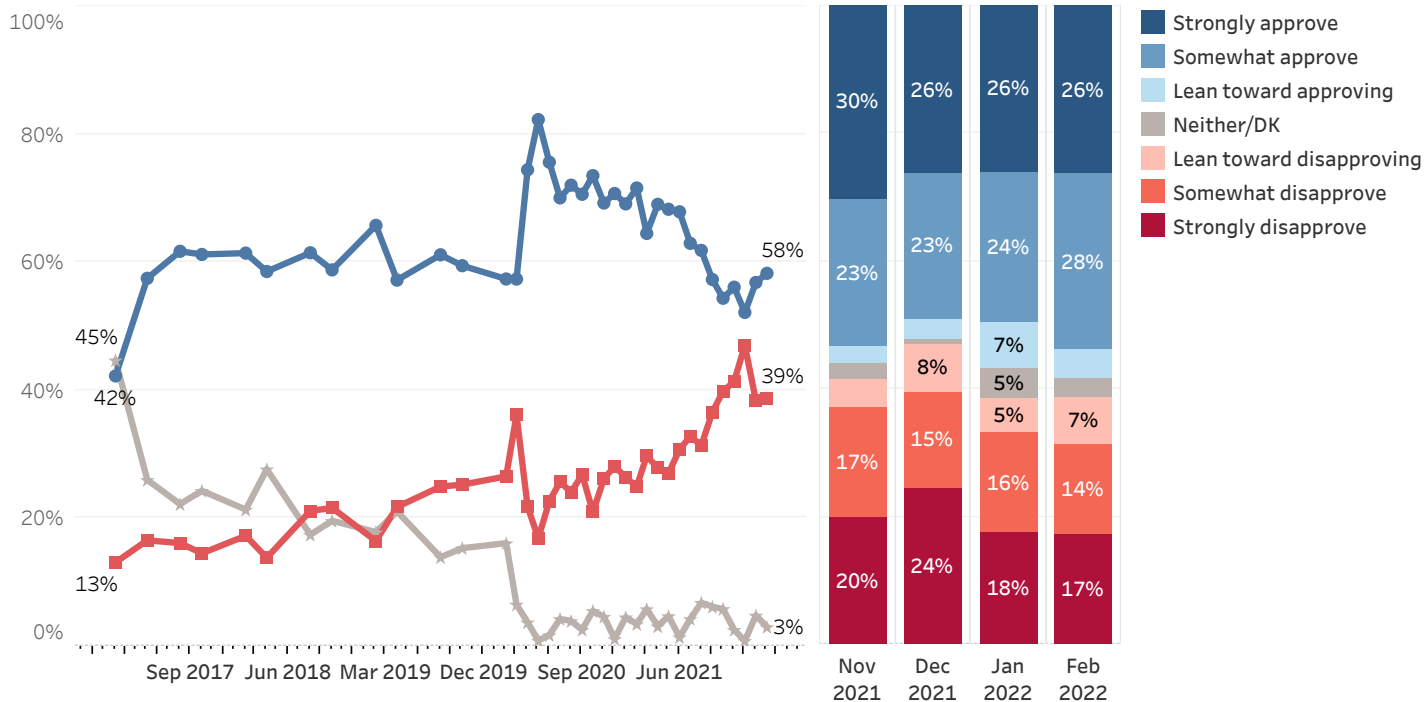
The State Legislature is also considering a bill that would eliminate the yearly vehicle inspection mandate for non-commercial vehicles in New Hampshire. Granite Staters are divided on this bill, with 45% strongly (30%) or somewhat (15%) in support, 10% are neutral, 42% are strongly (26%) or somewhat (16%) opposed, and 2% are unsure. More than half of Republicans (62%) and Independents (52%) support eliminating the yearly vehicle inspection mandate but only 26% of Democrats agree.

Nearly six in ten (58%) New Hampshire residents currently approve of Governor Sununu's job performance, 39% disapprove, and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Sununu's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) among Granite Staters is +20, largely unchanged since January (+18). Eighty-eight percent of Republicans and 54% of Independents approve of Sununu's performance as governor but only 29% of Democrats agree.

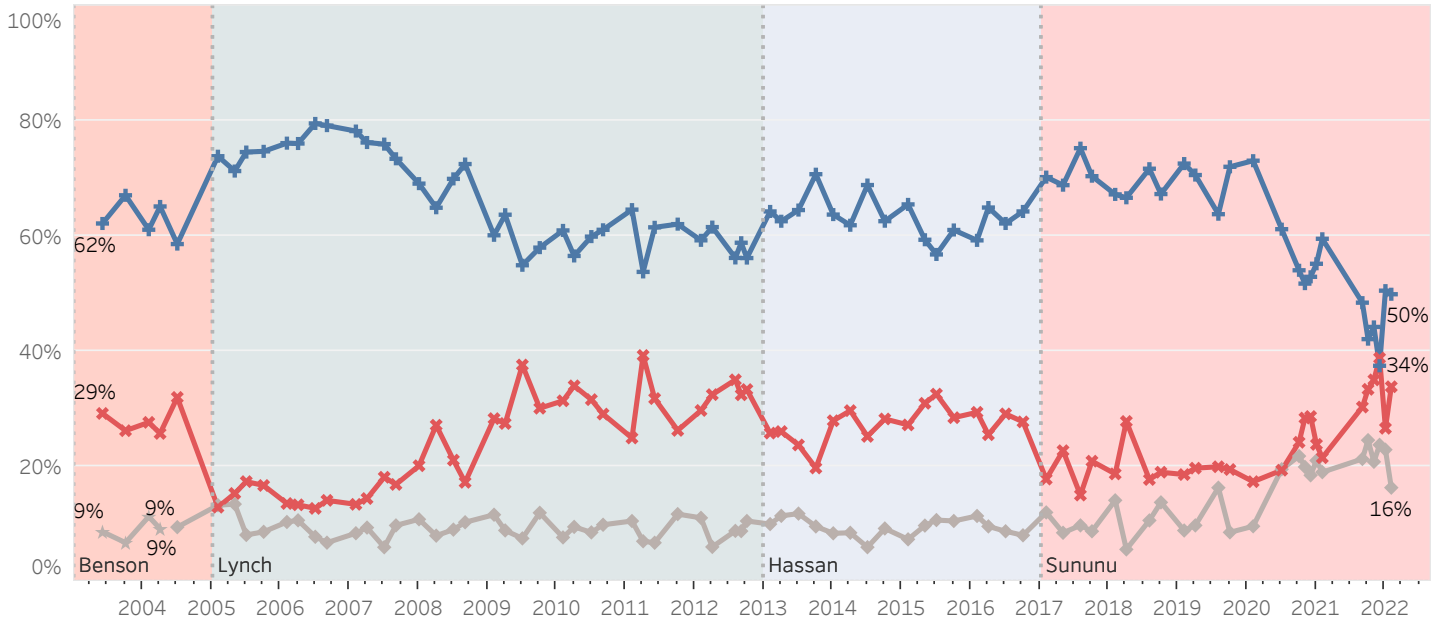
Approval of Governor Sununu's Job Performance



Direction of New Hampshire

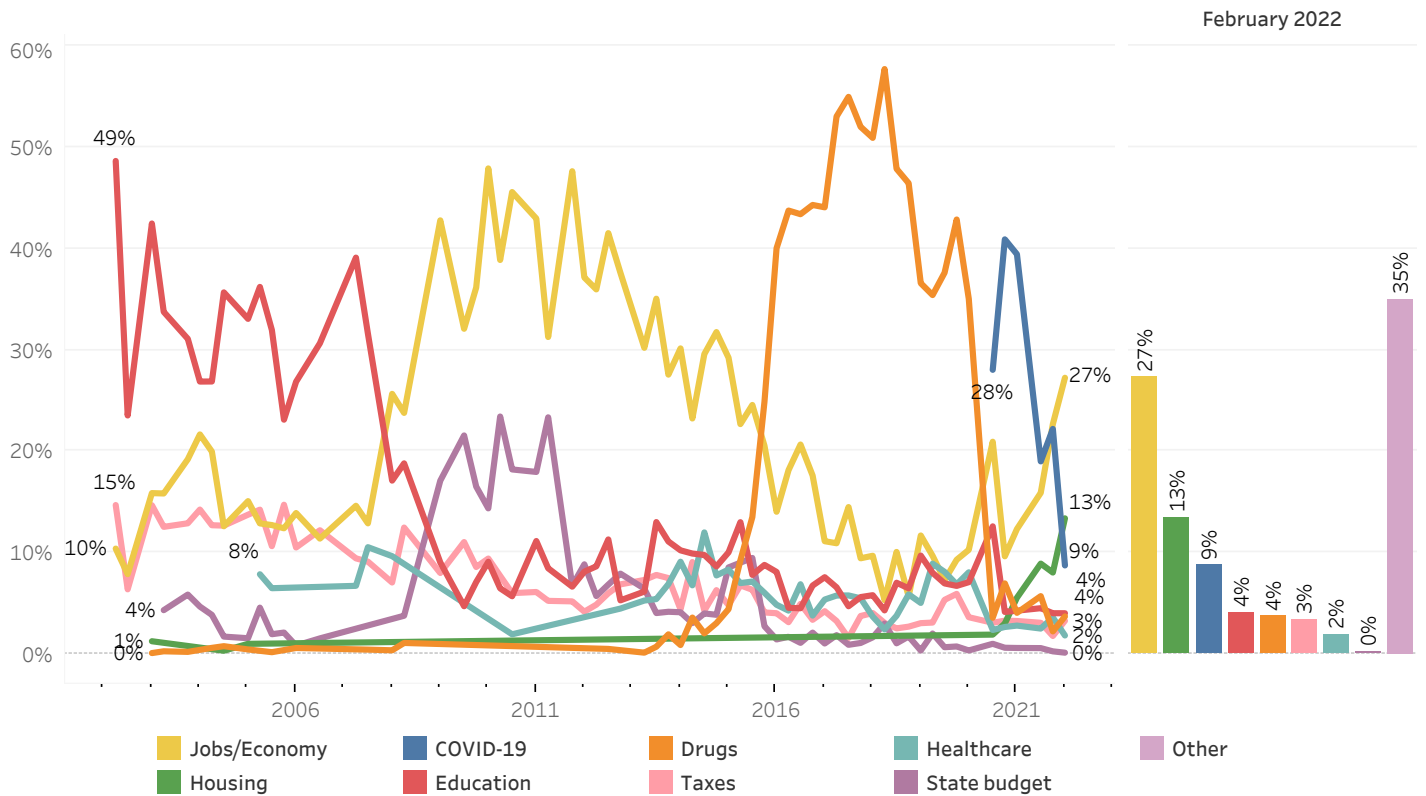
Half (50%) of New Hampshire residents believe that things in the state are headed in the right direction, 34% believe things are seriously off on the wrong track, and 16% are unsure. Four in five Republicans (79%) say the state is headed in the right direction, but only 36% of Independents and 25% of Democrats agree.

Twenty-seven percent of New Hampshire residents believe jobs or the economy is the most important problem facing the state while 13% believe housing is the most important problem and 9% believe the COVID-19 pandemic is the most important problem. Fewer cite education (4%), drugs (4%), taxes (3%), healthcare (2%), or the state budget (<1%) as the most important problem facing the state, while 35% say something else is the most important problem.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand eighty-one (1,081) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between February 18 and February 22, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.0 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the February 2022 Granite State Poll is 29%. The design effect for the survey is 2.9%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
