WELCH & DEMOCRATIC CANDIDATES LEAD IN VT CONGRESS MATCHUPS; MAJORITY WANT SCOTT TO RUN FOR GOVERNOR AGAIN

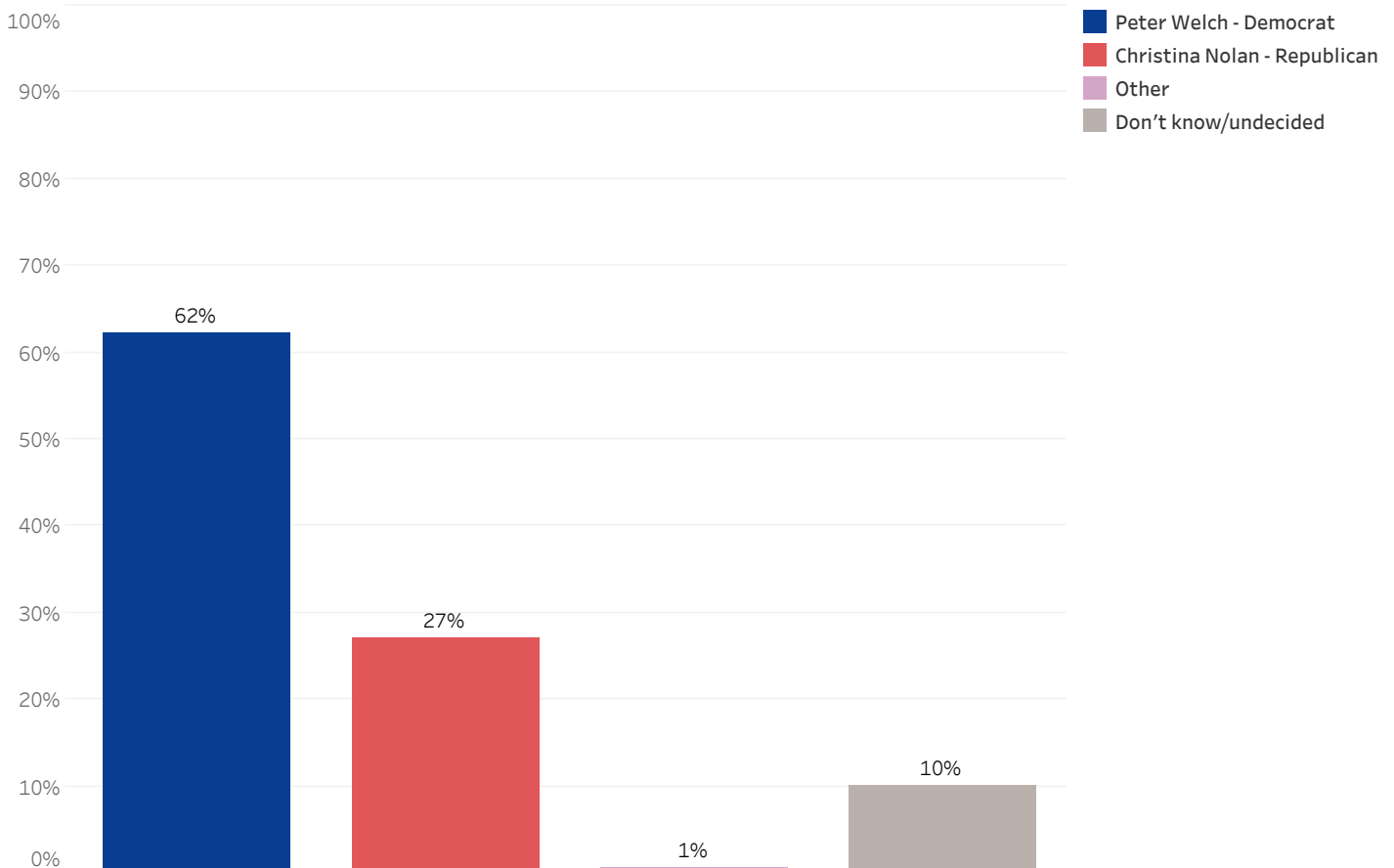

DURHAM, NH - Vermont Congressman Peter Welch is the clear leader in the race for the U.S. Senate seat currently held by retiring Senator Patrick Leahy. State Senate President Pro Tempore Becca Balint, Lieutenant Governor Molly Gray, and State Senator Kesha Ram Hinsdale are closely matched in the Democratic primary for the U.S. House seat being vacated by Welch but all three hold clear advantages over prospective Republican opponent Marcia Horne. Republican Governor Phil Scott has not decided whether to run for re-election, but most Vermonters want him to do so and half think he deserves to be re-elected.

2022 U.S. Senate Election

Vermont Democratic Senator Patrick Leahy announced his retirement after serving in the Senate since 1975. Long-time Democratic Congressman Peter Welch has announced his intention to run for Leahy's seat, as has Republican former U.S. Attorney Christina Nolan. Welch holds a clear lead if the election were held today - 62% of likely 2022 general election voters say they would vote for Welch, 27% would vote for Nolan, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 10% are undecided. Nearly all (93%) self-identified Democrats and nearly half (47%) of Independents say they would vote for Welch, while three-quarters (73%) of Republicans say that they would vote for Nolan.

2022 U.S. Senate Election - Welch vs. Nolan - April 2022

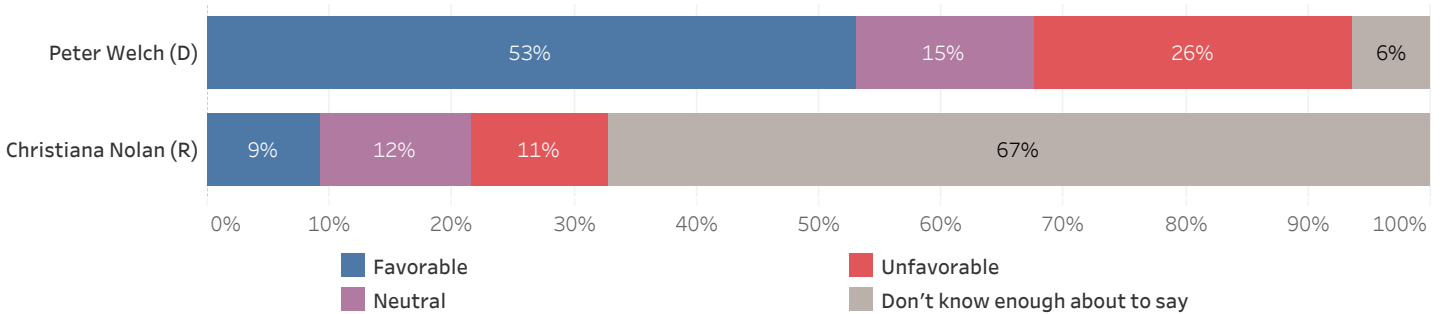

Welch is well-liked among Vermont residents - 53% view him favorably, 26% view him unfavorably, 15% have a neutral opinion of him, and 6% don't know enough about him to say. Welch is very popular among Democrats with a +84 net favorability rating (the percentage who view him favorably minus the percentage who view him unfavorably), while he is unpopular among Republicans (-57) and Independents are split (+9).

Nolan is far less well-known as only 9% view her favorably, 11% view her unfavorably, 12% have a neutral opinion of her, and 67% don't know enough about her to say. Republicans and Democrats are about equally likely to have an opinion of Nolan and she is about equally popular among both groups.

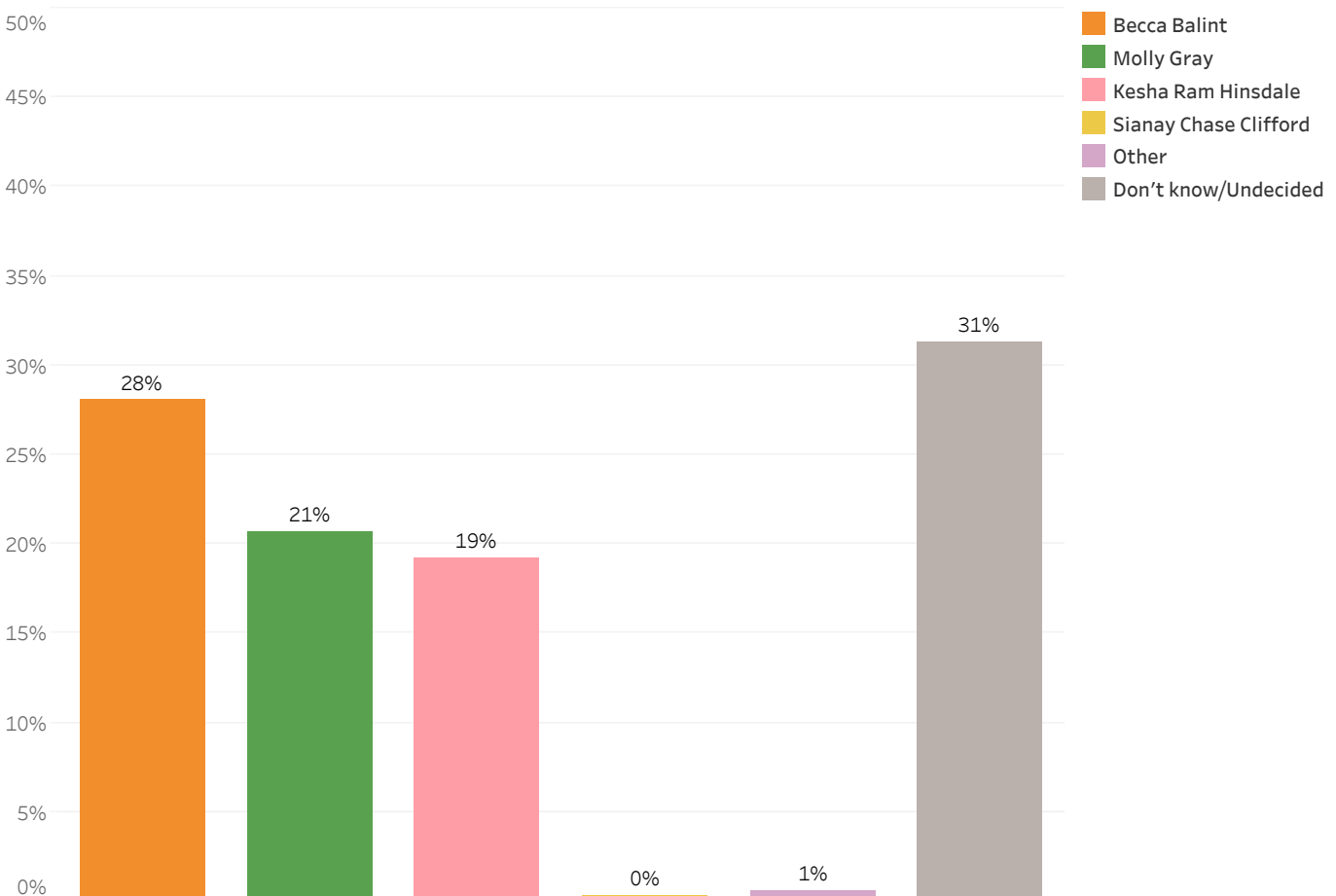
Favorability - 2022 U.S. Senate Candidates - April 2022



2022 U.S. House of Representatives Election

With Welch seeking a Senate seat, several Vermont Democrats are seeking the nomination for Vermont's U.S. House of Representatives seat which Welch has held since 2007. Among those who plan to vote in the Democratic primary in August (N=278), 28% plan to vote for State Senate President Pro Tempore Becca Balint, 21% plan to vote for Lieutenant Governor Molly Gray, 19% plan to vote for State Senator Kesha Ram Hinsdale, less than 1% would vote for former Congressional Staffer Sianay Chase Clifford, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 31% are undecided on who they will vote for.

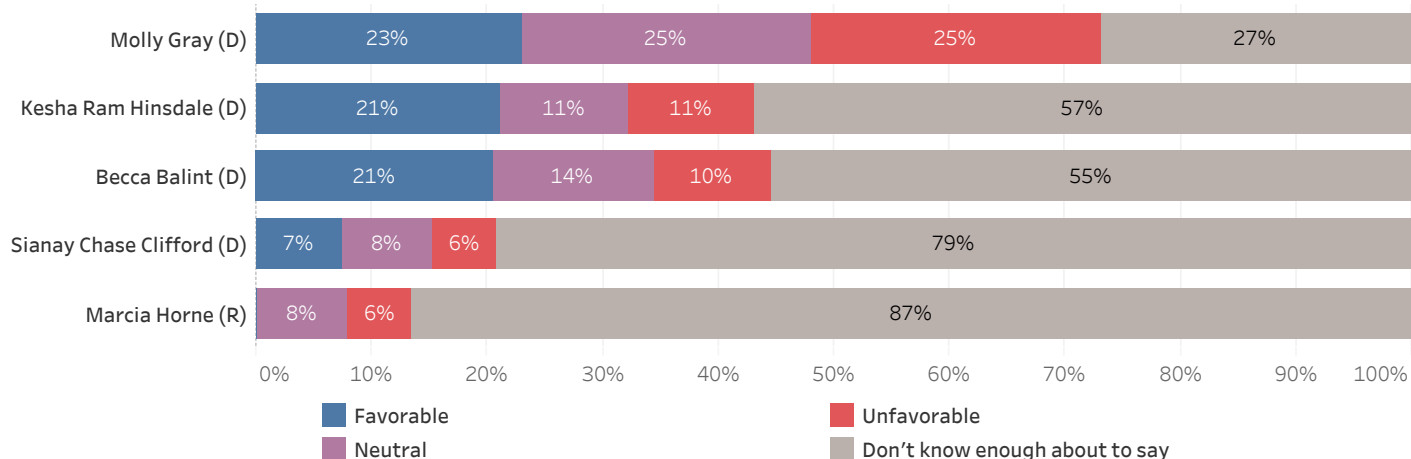
2022 U.S. House of Representatives Election - Democratic Primary Election - April 2022



Among these candidates, Gray is most well-known but Vermonters are split in their opinion of her: 23% view her favorably, 25% have a neutral opinion of her, 25% view her unfavorably, and 27% don't know enough about her to say. Hinsdale (+10) and Balint (+11) have slightly higher net favorability ratings but are unknown to a majority of Vermonters, while nearly four in five (79%) don't have an opinion of Clifford.

Meanwhile businesswoman Marcia Horne is seeking the Republican nomination for the House of Representatives. However, Horne is unknown to the vast majority (87%) of Vermonters.

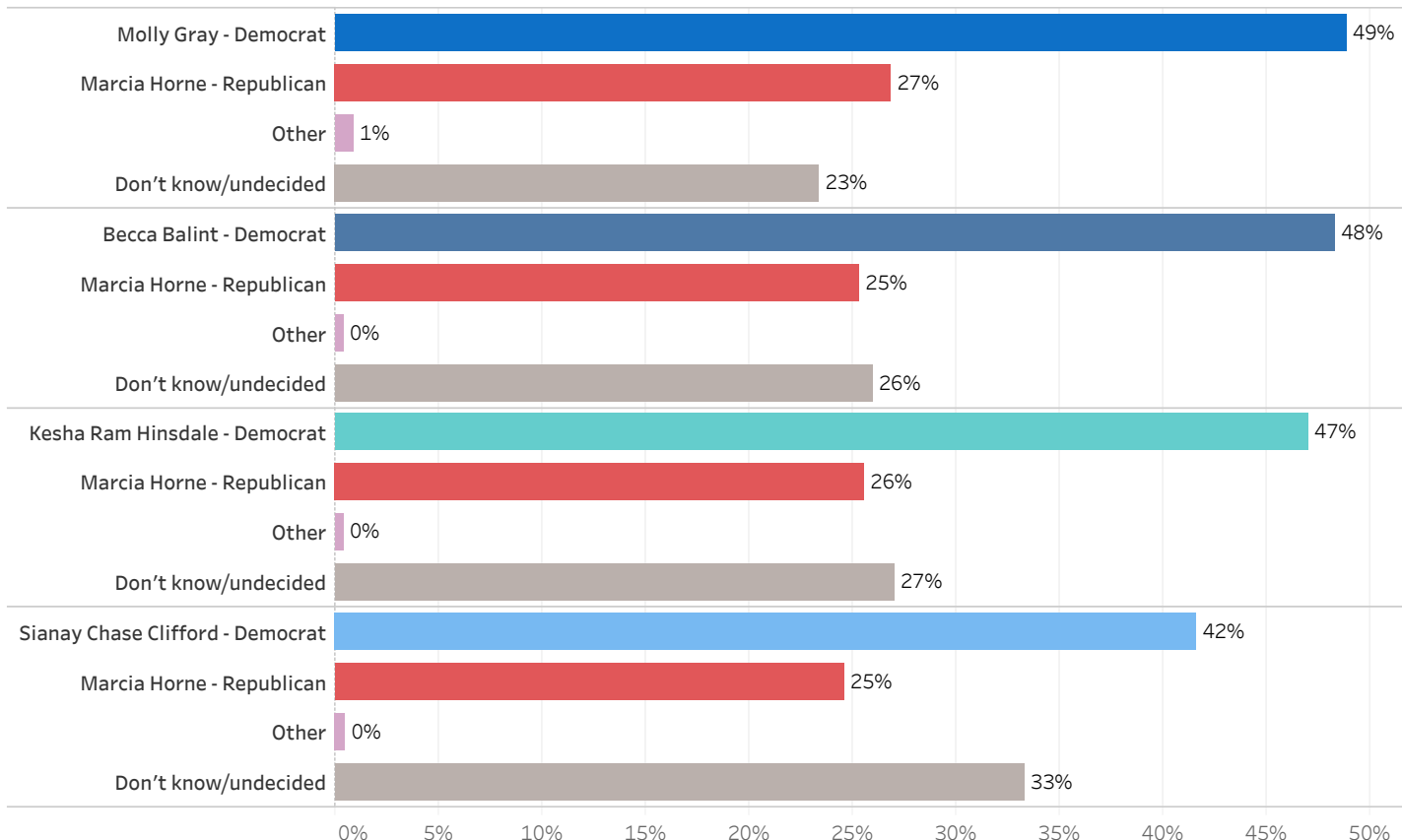
Favorability - 2022 U.S. House of Representatives Candidates - April 2022



2022 U.S. House of Representatives Election

When asked how they would vote in the 2022 general election for the U.S. House of Representatives, likely voters (N=583) support all of these four prospective Democratic nominees and hold wide leads over Horne. Balint holds a lead of 23 percentage points over Horne, Gray leads Horne by 22 points, Hinsdale leads Horne by 21 points, and Clifford leads by 17.

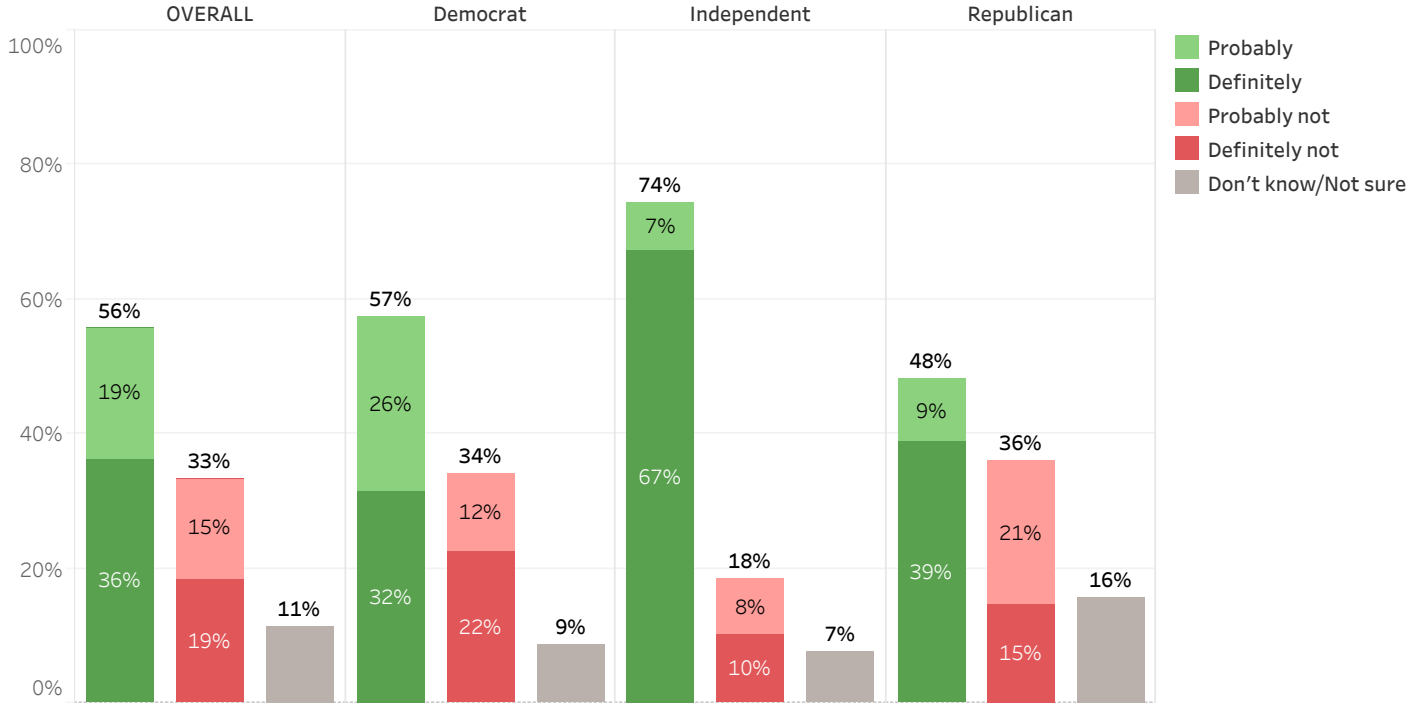
Possible 2022 U.S. House of Representatives Matchups - April 2022



2022 VT Gubernatorial Election

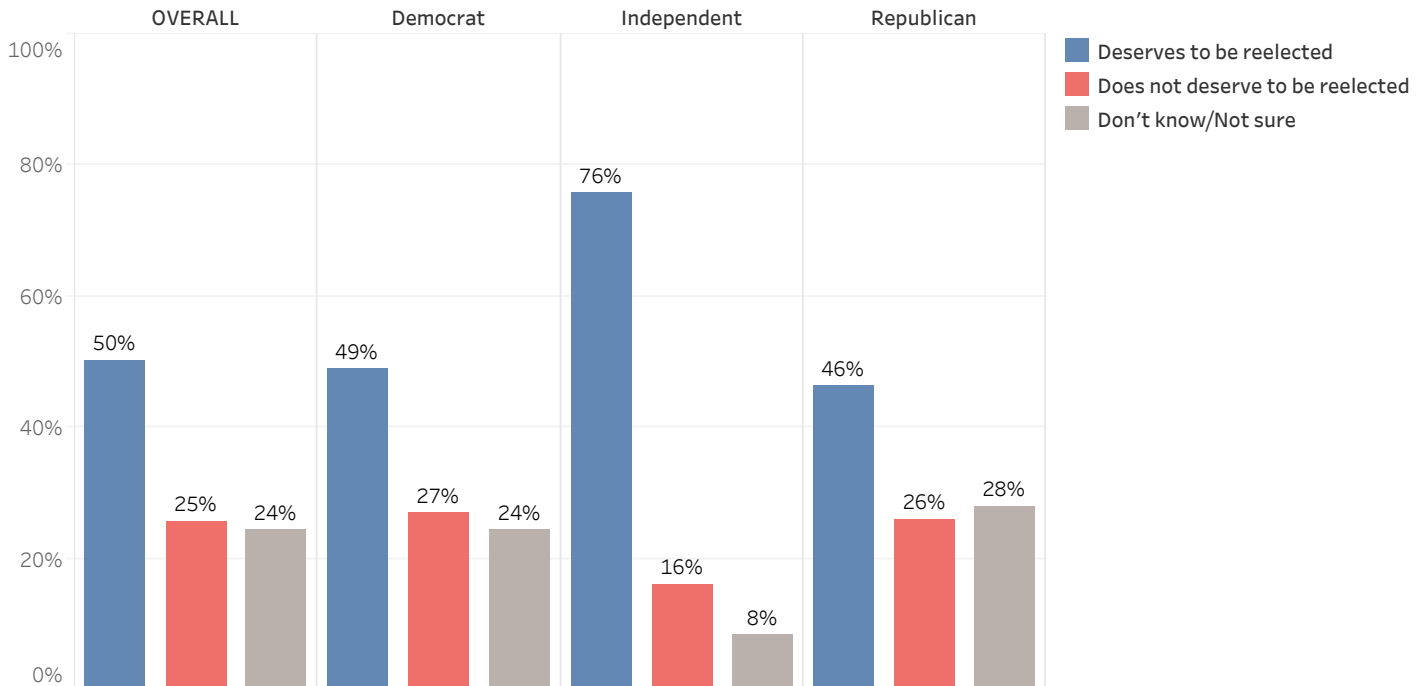
Vermont Governor Phil Scott remains undecided on whether he will seek another term as governor. A majority of Vermonters (56%) think that Scott definitely (36%) or probably (19%) should run for re-election, 33% think he probably (15%) or definitely (19%) should not run, and 11% are unsure. Despite Scott being a member of the Republican party, self-identified Democrats (57%) are more likely than Republicans (48%) to say that Scott should run again.

Half (50%) of Vermonters think that Scott deserves to be re-elected, while 25% don't believe he deserves to be re-elected and 24% are undecided. Democrats (49%) and Republicans (46%) are about equally likely to agree that Scott deserves to be re-elected, while three-quarters of Independents (76%) agree.

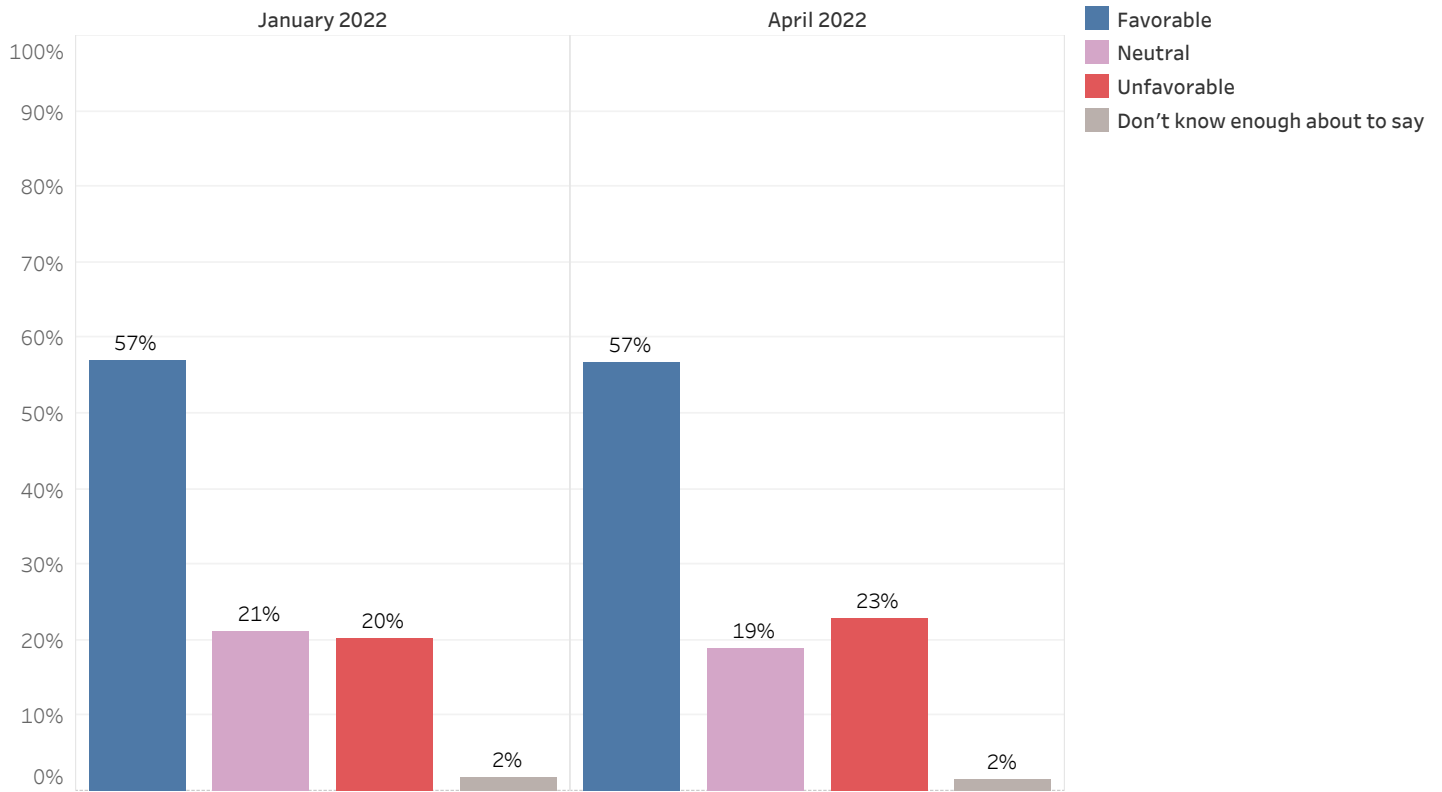
Does Scott Deserve Re-Election - April 2022



Vermonters continue to have a positive view of Scott personally: 57% view him favorably, 19% have a neutral opinion, 23% view him unfavorably, and 2% don't know enough to say. Scott's net favorability (+34) is largely unchanged since January (+37).

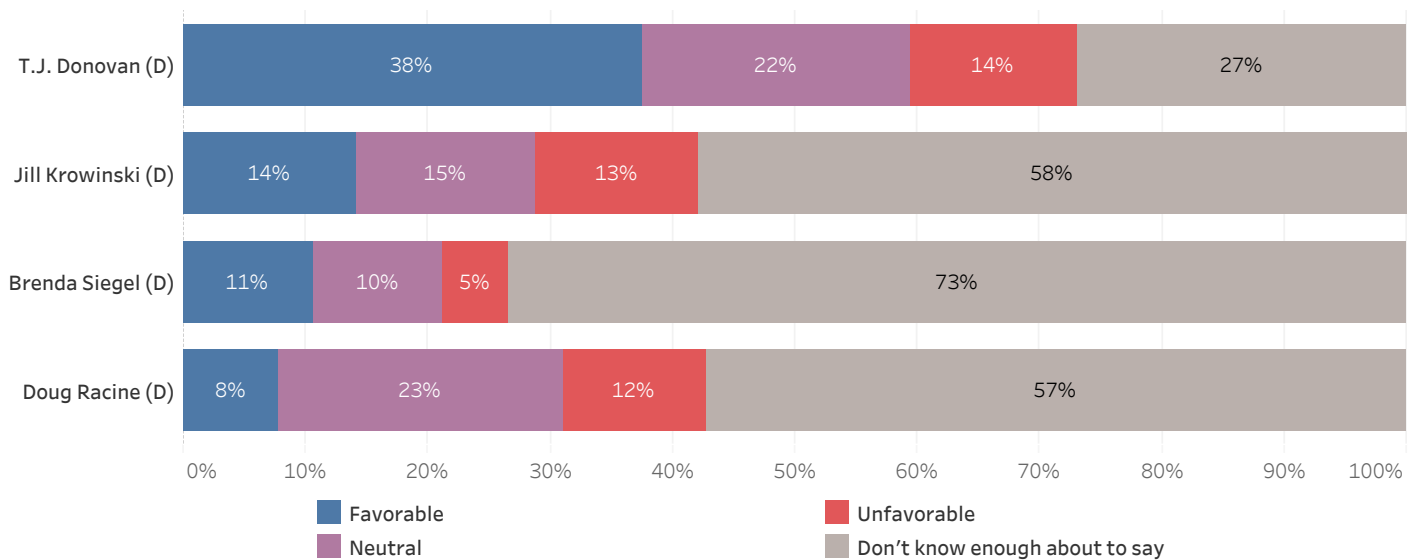
Scott is popular among Independents (+60 net favorability rating) and Democrats (+43) but is only somewhat popular among Republicans (+13).

There are several Vermont Democrats who are thought to possibly seek the Democratic nomination for governor. Among these candidates, Attorney General T.J. Donovan is best known and is largely popular: 38% view him favorably, 14% view him unfavorably, 22% have a neutral opinion of him, and 27% don't know enough about him to say. Speaker of the Vermont House of Representatives Jill Krowinski and former Vermont Lieutenant Governor Doug Racine are not as well-known and an equal proportion of Vermonters view them favorably and unfavorably, while nearly three-quarters (73%) don't know enough to have an opinion about nonprofit executive Brenda Siegel.

Green Mountain State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Green Mountain State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred forty-six (646) Green Mountain Panel members completed the survey online between April 14 and April 18, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.9 percent. Included were 583 likely 2022 general election voters (MSE = +/-4.1 percent) and 278 likely Democratic primary voters (MSE = +/- 5.9 percent). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the April 2022 Green Mountain State Poll is 32%. The design effect for the survey is 2.4%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as to 2020 election results in Vermont.

The Green Mountain State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of Vermont residents. Approximately 2,000 Vermont adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
