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GRANITE STATERS SUPPORT *ROE*, DIVIDED ON SUPPORT FOR UKRAINE

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
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DURHAM, NH - Six in ten Granite Staters oppose overturning *Roe v. Wade*. Of those who are opposed to overturning *Roe*, one-third say it would make them more likely to vote in November if overturned. Half of New Hampshire residents approve of President Biden's handling of the war in Ukraine. However, most who disapprove say it is because the U.S. is doing too much to help Ukraine. Most Granite Staters disapprove of Biden's overall job performance and only one in six, a record low, believe the country is headed in the right direction.

Abortion Rights


Debate over abortion rights has been reignited by a leaked draft decision by the U.S. Supreme Court which would overturn *Roe v. Wade*, the 1973 decision which established a right to abortion prior to fetal viability. New Hampshire residents are clearly opposed to this development: only 33% strongly (26%) or somewhat (6%) support overturning *Roe v. Wade*, 5% are neutral, 61% either strongly (57%) or somewhat (4%) oppose this, and 1% are unsure. Support for overturning *Roe v. Wade* (33%) has increased since September 2020 (21%) but a majority continue to oppose overturning it. Nearly all Democrats (99%) and six in ten Independents (61%) are opposed to overturning *Roe v. Wade*, while nearly two-thirds (63%) of Republicans support overturning it.

Support or Oppose Overturning *Roe v. Wade*



One-fifth (21%) of New Hampshire residents say that they would be more likely to vote in the upcoming general election in November if the Supreme Court does vote to overturn *Roe v. Wade*, 78% say overturning *Roe* would make no difference to their likelihood of voting, and less than 1% say it would make them less likely to vote. Opponents of overturning *Roe* would be energized to vote if it were to be overturned as nearly one-third (32%) say they would be more likely to vote, but very few (5%) of those who support overturning *Roe* (N=303) say they would be more likely to vote if it is overturned.




More than half (55%) of New Hampshire residents say that the best way to describe their overall position on abortion is that it should be legal in all circumstances; just over one-third (35%) say it should be legal in limited circumstances while only 10% say it should not be legal in any circumstance. The percentage of Granite Staters who say that abortion should be legal in all circumstances (55%) has increased sharply since March 2021 (38%). Nearly three-quarters (72%) of those who never attend religious services think that abortion should be legal in all circumstances but only 37% of those who at least occasionally attend religious services agree.



The War in Ukraine

Looking at foreign policy issues, half of Granite Staters (50%) approve of Biden's handling of the war in Ukraine, 46% disapprove, and 4% are unsure. Biden's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) on his handling of the war in Ukraine among Granite Staters is +4, up from -9 in April. His net approval is +85 among Democrats but is -16 among Independents and -73 among Republicans.


Approval of President Biden's Handling of the War in Ukraine



Overall, 18% of Granite Staters think that the U.S. is doing too little to support Ukraine, 41% think we are doing about the right amount, 29% think we are doing too much, and 13% are unsure. The percentage of respondents who believe the U.S. is doing too little to help Ukraine (18%) has fallen dramatically since April (45%) while the percentage who say the U.S. is doing too much (29%) has increased significantly since April (6%).

Among those who disapprove of Biden's handling of the war in Ukraine (N=428), a majority (58%) say that the U.S. is doing too much to help Ukraine. By contrast, in April, a majority (61%) of those who disapproved of Biden's handling of Ukraine said that the U.S. was doing too little to help Ukraine.


Believe U.S. Doing Too Much or Too Little to Support Ukraine



Presidential Approval


Approval of Biden's overall handling of foreign affairs is slightly lower than approval of his handling of the war in Ukraine. Less than half of Granite Staters (48%) approve of Biden's handling of foreign affairs, 49% disapprove, and 3% are unsure. Net approval of Biden's handling of foreign affairs (-1) is largely unchanged since April (-4). Ninety-six percent of Democrats approve of Biden's handling of foreign affairs while 30% of Independents and only 5% of Republicans approve.

Approval of President Biden's Handling of Foreign Affairs




Overall, 45% of Granite Staters approve of Biden's performance as President, 53% disapprove, and 3% are unsure. Biden's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) among Granite Staters is -8, largely unchanged since April (-6). Approval for Biden is sharply divided on party lines: 90% of Democrats approve of his performance but only 30% of Independents and 3% of Republicans approve.


Approval of President Biden's Job Performance



Granite Staters continue to give Biden poor marks for his handling of the economy. Only 37% of Granite Staters approve of Biden's handling of the economy, 58% disapprove, and 4% are unsure. Net approval of Biden's handling of the economy (-21) has fallen slightly since April (-15). Seventy-seven percent of Democrats approve of Biden's handling of the economy, down from 85% in April. Only 22% of Independents and 2% of Republicans approve.



Only 15% of Granite Staters believe that things in the United States are headed in the right direction, a new low for New Hampshire residents, 72% believe things are seriously off on the wrong track and 13% are unsure. Thirty-two percent of Democrats say the country is headed in the right direction, down from 57% in April, while only 8% of Independents and 2% of Republicans feel things are on the wrong track.



Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred thirty (930) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between May 20 and May 24, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the May 2022 Granite State Poll is 26%. The design effect for the survey is 2.7%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
