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GRANITE STATERS THINK NH ELECTIONS ARE TRUSTWORTHY AND EASY BUT NOT SO SURE ABOUT REST OF U.S.

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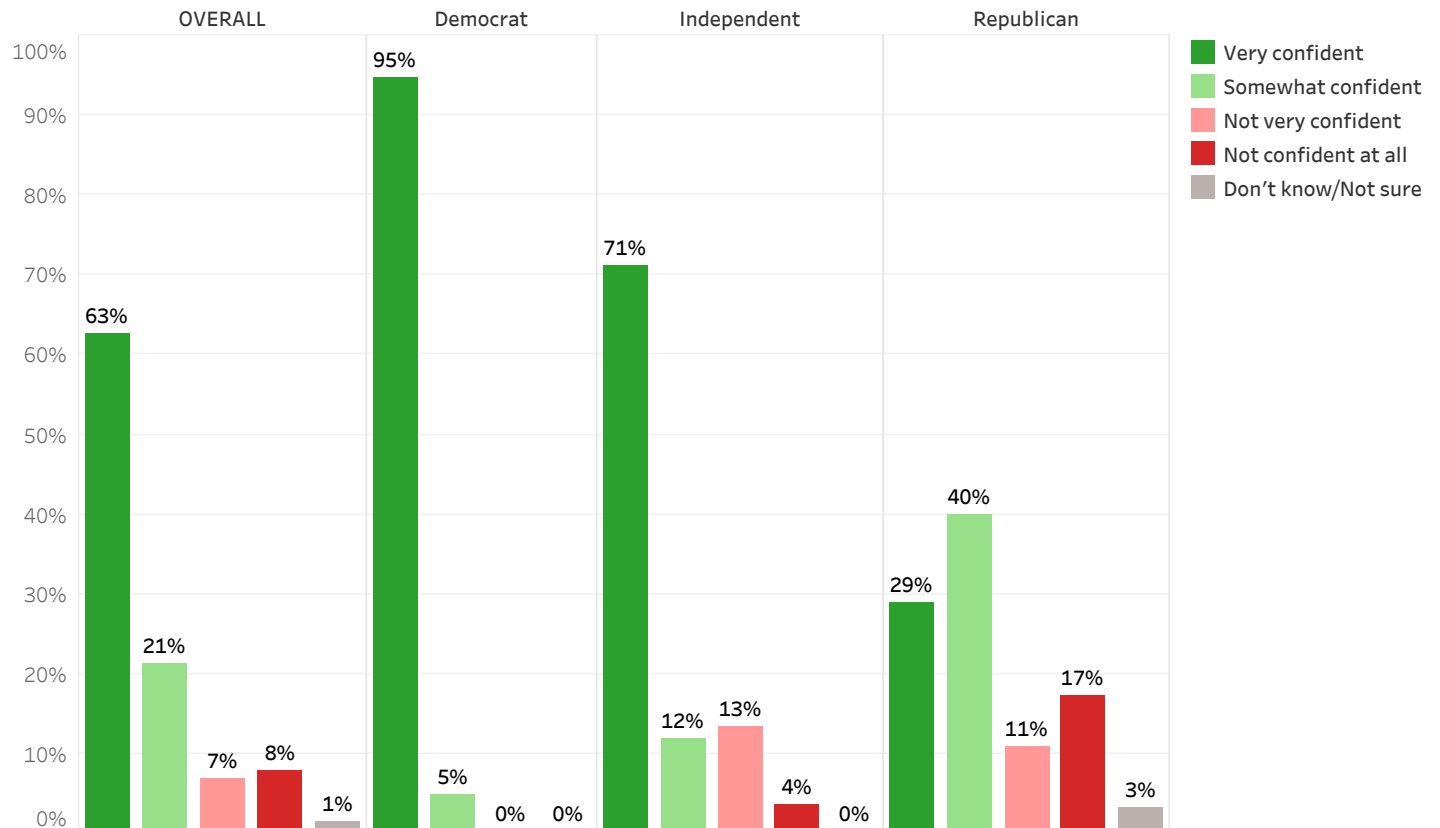
DURHAM, NH - Most 2020 voters in New Hampshire say it was easy to vote and are very confident their vote was counted accurately. Likely 2022 voters are slightly less certain about their vote this November, particularly Republicans. Less than a quarter of Granite Staters think voter fraud is a serious problem in New Hampshire but nearly half, including nine in ten Republicans, think it is a serious problem in the country as a whole.

Voting in New Hampshire

In the wake of the 2020 presidential election, former President Donald Trump and his supporters have maintained he lost because of voter fraud. In New Hampshire, most 2020 voters believe their votes were accurately counted. Nearly two-thirds (63%) of Granite Staters who voted in 2020 say they are very confident that their vote was accurately counted, 21% are somewhat confident it was accurately counted, 7% are not very confident, 8% are not at all confident, and 1% are unsure. In November 2020, shortly after that year's election, respondents gave very similar responses when asked how confident they were that their vote had been accurately counted.

Responses differ markedly by party: nearly all (95%) Democrats and 71% of Independents are very confident that their vote was accurately counted in 2020 but only 29% of Republicans agree and more than a quarter of Republicans (29%) are not very or not at all confident that their vote was accurately counted.

Confidence 2020 General Election Vote Was Accurately Counted - June 2022 - By Party ID

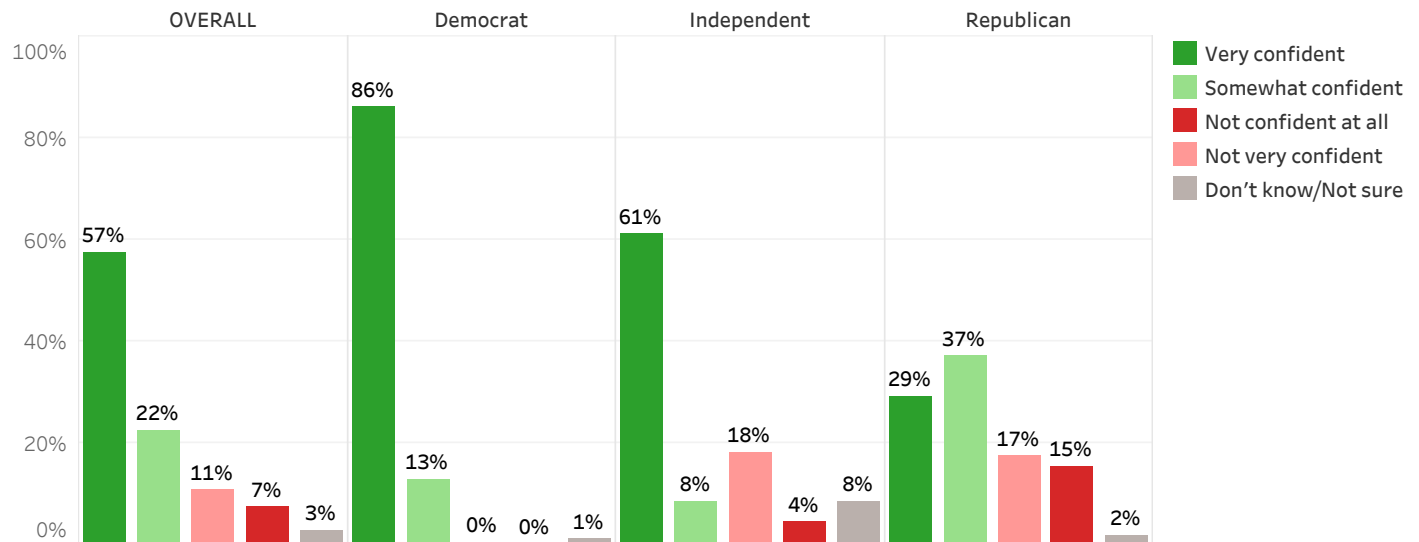

Thinking ahead to the 2022 election, 57% of Granite Staters who plan to vote in 2022 say they are very confident that their vote will be accurately counted, 22% are somewhat confident it will be accurately counted, 11% are not very confident, 7% are not at all confident, and 3% are unsure.

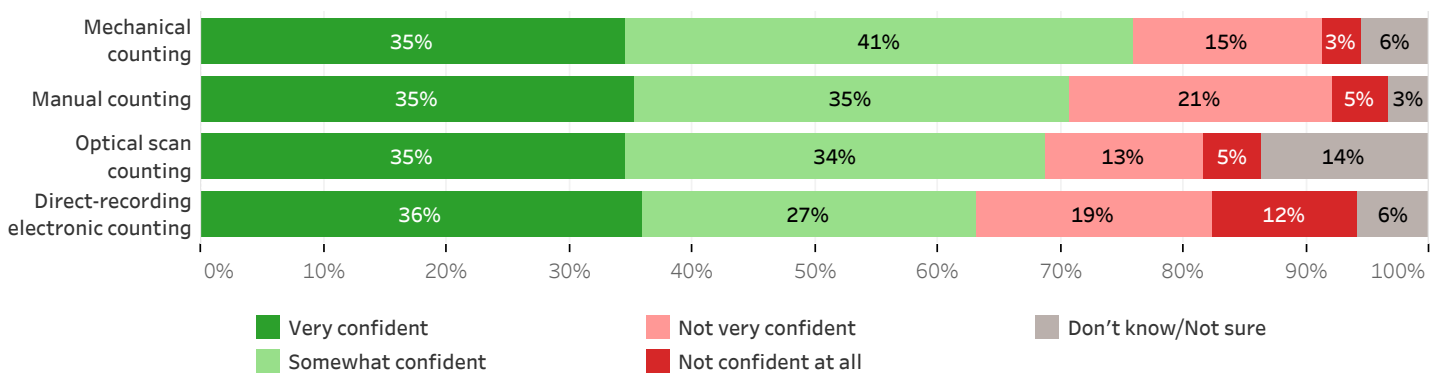
The great majority of Democrats (86%) and a majority of Independents (61%) are very confident that their vote will be accurately counted in 2022. However, Republicans are more divided, with 29% very confident their vote will be accurately counted, 37% somewhat confident, 17% not very confident, and 15% not confident at all.

Confidence 2022 General Election Vote Will Be Accurately Counted - June 2022 - By Party ID



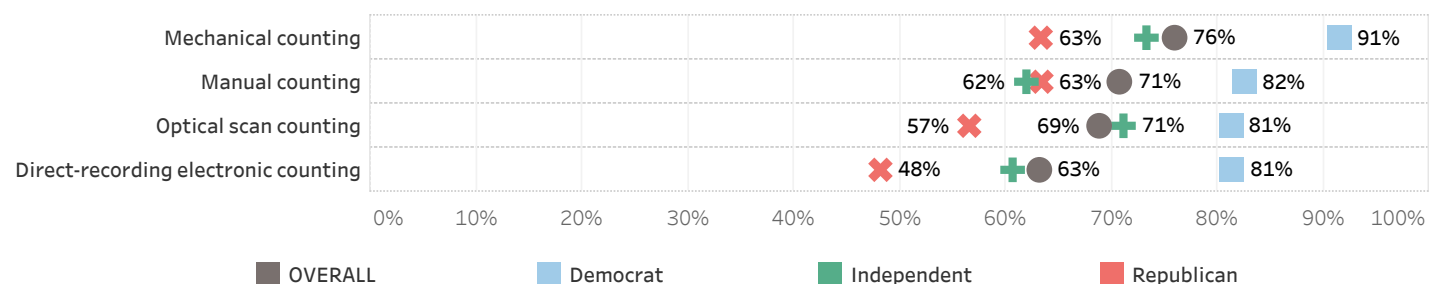
When asked how confident they are in various methods of counting votes, more than three-quarters (76%) of New Hampshire residents say they are very or somewhat confident in the accuracy of mechanical counting, 71% are confident in manual counting, 69% are confident in optical scan counting, and 63% are confident in direct-recording electronic counting.

More than four-fifths of Democrats are very or somewhat confident in each of these vote counting methods, but Independents and Republicans are less likely to be confident in each method. Republicans are particularly less likely to be very or somewhat confident in optical scan voting (57%) and direct-recording electronic counting (48%).

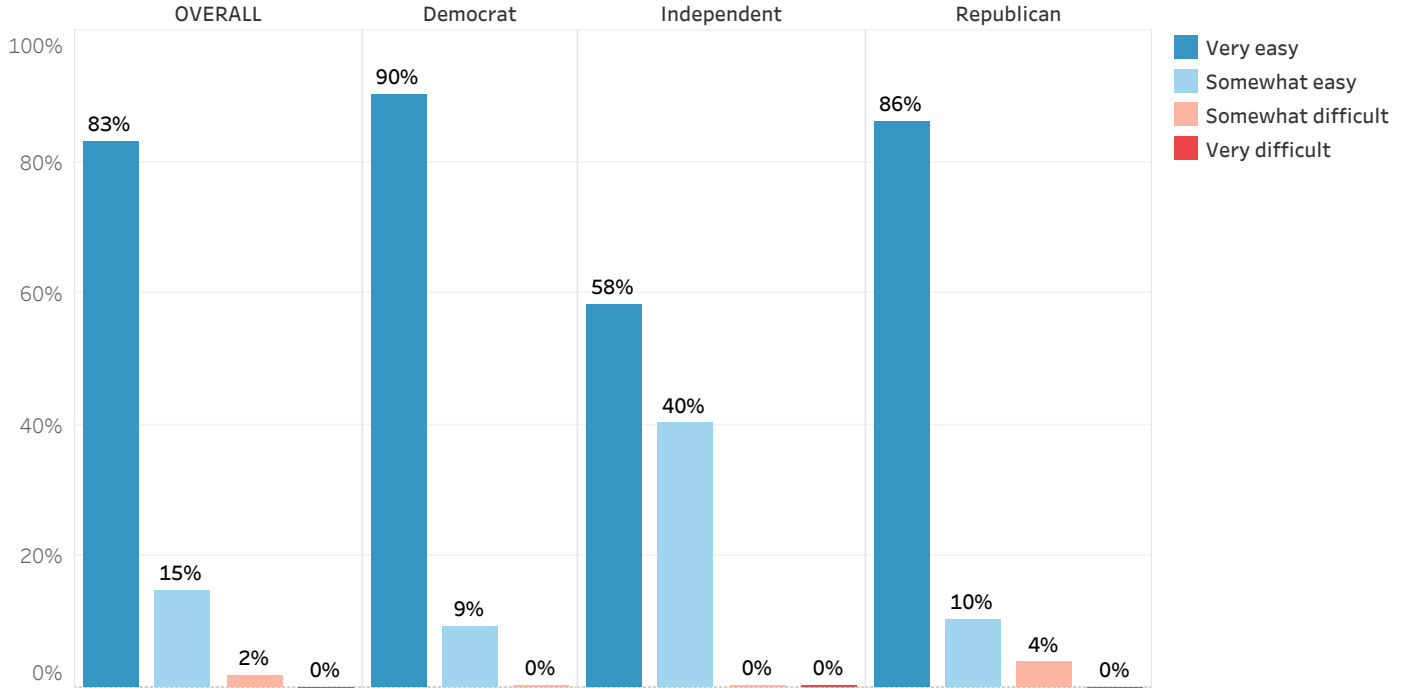
Very or Somewhat Confident in Vote Counting Method - By Party ID - June 2022



Ease of Voting

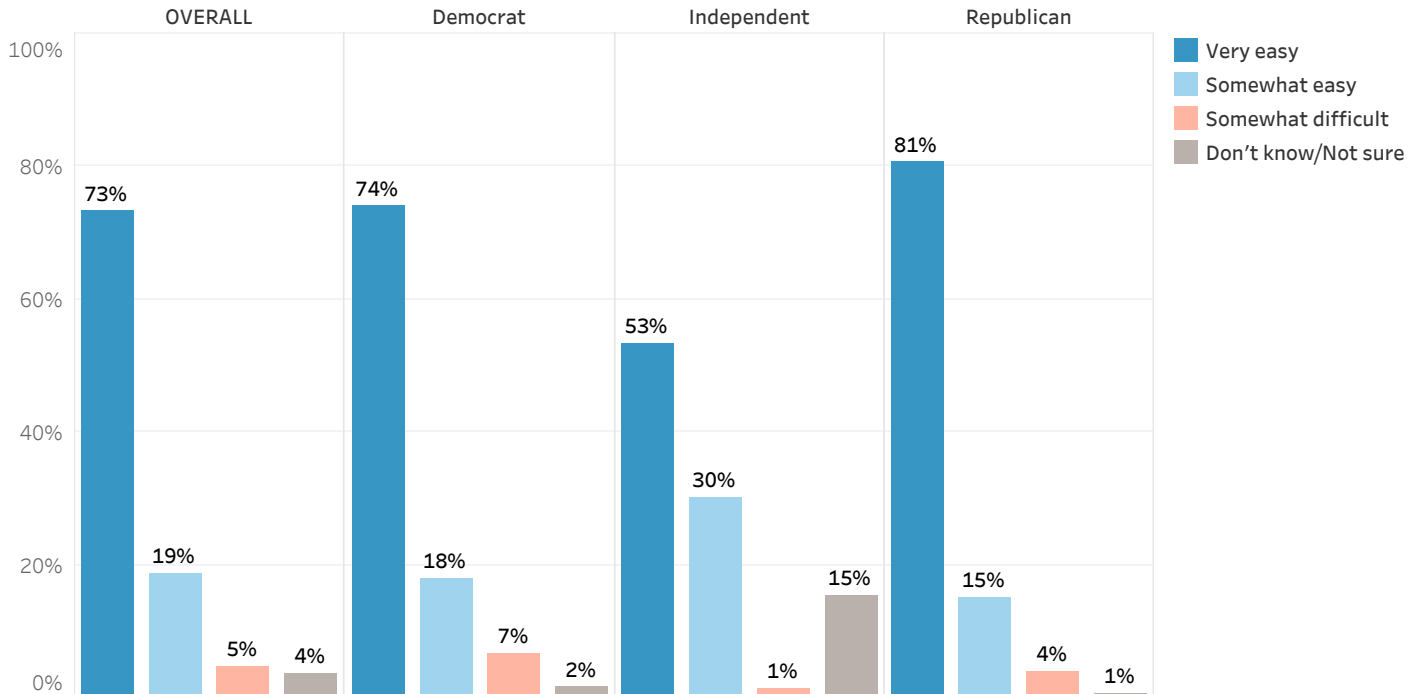
2020 New Hampshire voters overwhelmingly say it was easy to vote: 83% describe voting in 2020 as very easy and 15% say it was somewhat easy. Only 2% say voting in 2020 was somewhat difficult and less than 1% say it was very difficult. Democrats (90%) and Republicans (86%) are more likely than Independents (58%) to say that they found voting in 2020 to be very easy. Respondents in November 2020 gave similar answers when asked how easy they found it to vote in that month's election.

Most New Hampshire residents who plan to vote in 2022 expect it will be easy to vote: 73% believe voting in 2022 will be very easy and 19% expect it will be somewhat easy. Only 5% predict voting in 2022 will be somewhat difficult while 4% are unsure what to expect. Democrats (92%) and Republicans (96%) are more likely than Independents (82%) to expect voting in 2022 to be very or somewhat easy.

Expected Ease of Voting in 2022 Election - June 2022 - By Party ID

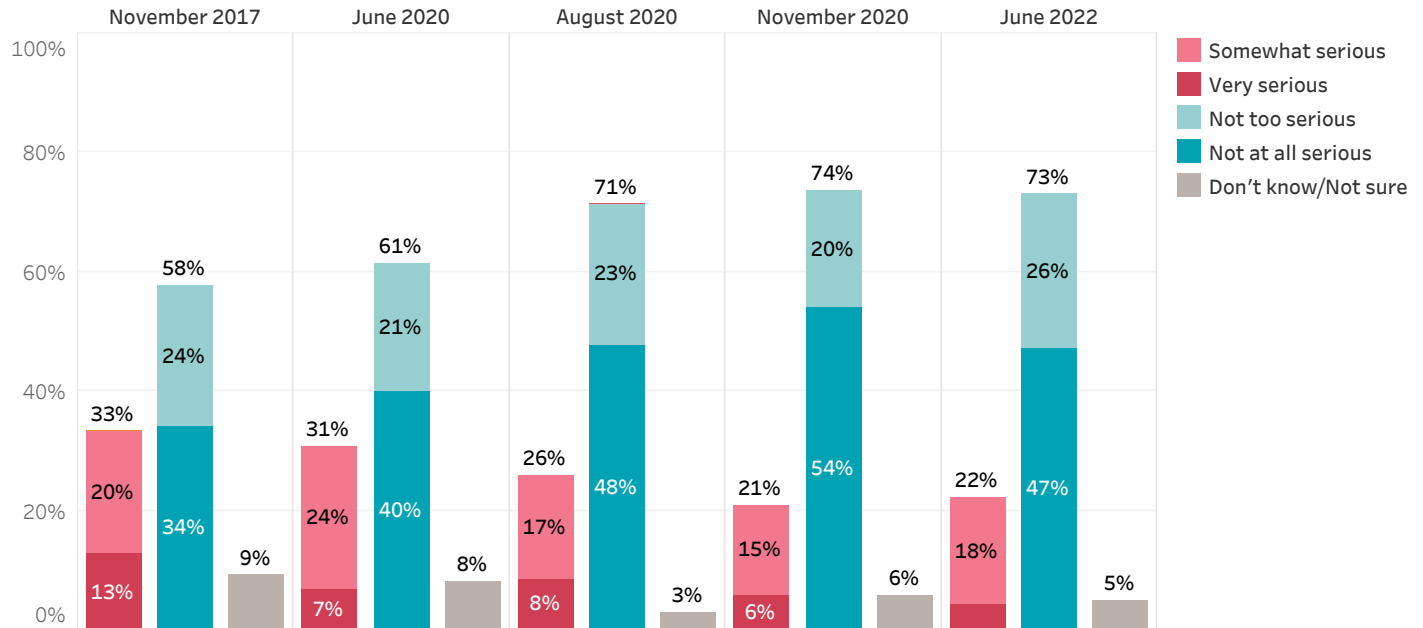


Voter Fraud

Only 22% of New Hampshire residents believe that voter fraud is a very (4%) or somewhat (18%) serious problem in New Hampshire, 73% think it is not too serious (26%) or not at all serious (47%), and 5% are unsure. Feelings about voter fraud in the state are unchanged since the November 2020 election.

Republicans (39%) are more likely than Independents (23%) and Democrats (2%) to believe that voter fraud is a very or somewhat serious problem in the state.

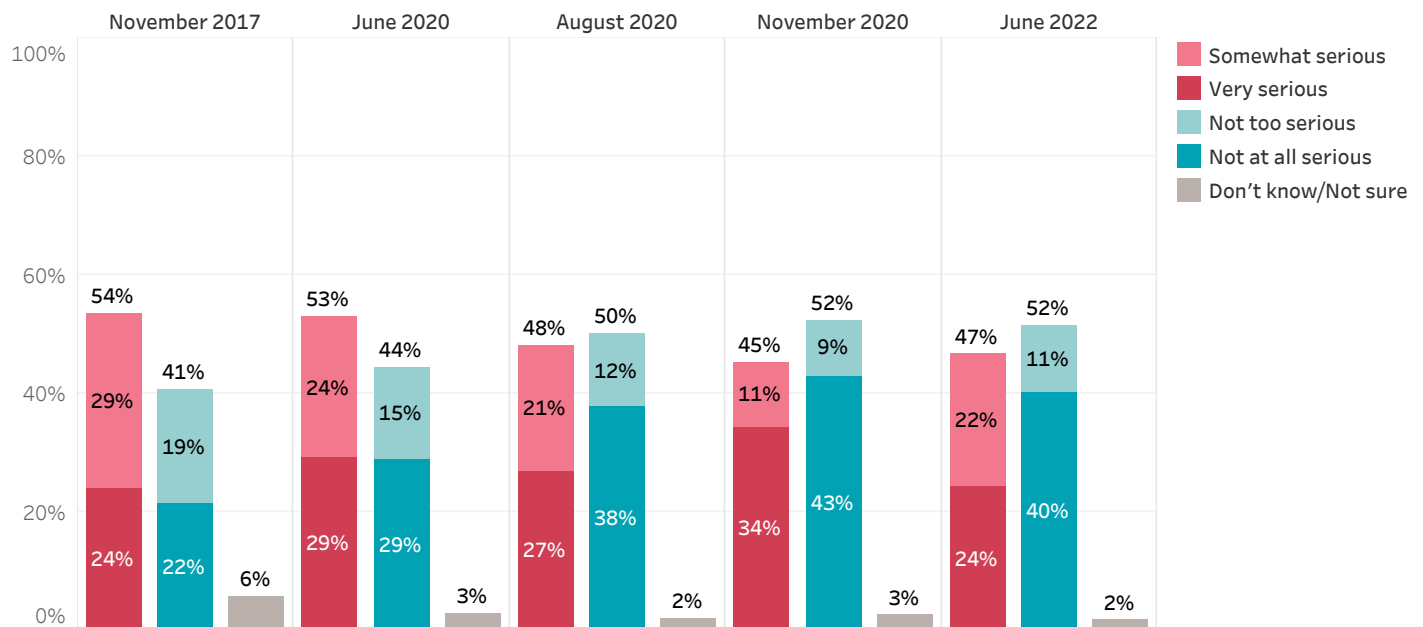
Perceived Seriousness of Voter Fraud in New Hampshire



Granite Staters are far less positive in their assessment of voter fraud in the country as a whole: 47% believe that voter fraud is a very (24%) or somewhat (22%) serious problem in the United States, 52% think it is not too serious (11%) or not at all serious (40%), and 2% are unsure. Feelings about voter fraud in the country are virtually unchanged since directly after the previous election in November 2020.

Partisan differences on this question are even more stark: 89% of Republicans believe that voter fraud is a very or somewhat serious problem in the country as a whole but only 39% of Independents and 4% of Democrats feel this way.

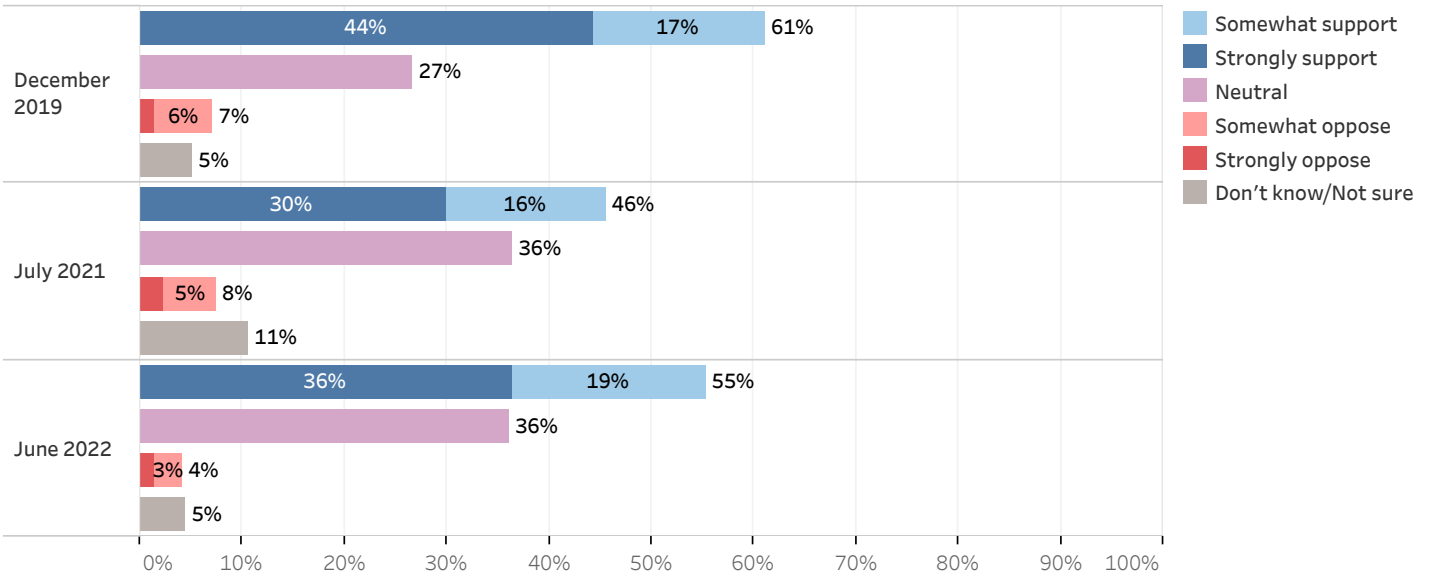
Perceived Seriousness of Voter Fraud in United States



"First in the Nation" New Hampshire Presidential Primary

A majority (55%) of New Hampshire residents strongly (36%) or somewhat (19%) support New Hampshire's state law requiring the state's presidential primary to be held seven days or more prior to any similar election in another state. Thirty-six percent say they are neutral on this issue, only 4% somewhat (3%) or strongly (1%) oppose this law, and 5% are unsure. Support for New Hampshire's law (55%) has ticked upward somewhat since July 2021 (46%). Sixty-five percent of Independents, 60% of Republicans, and 45% of Democrats support this law.

Support or Oppose State Law Requiring NH Presidential Primary Being First

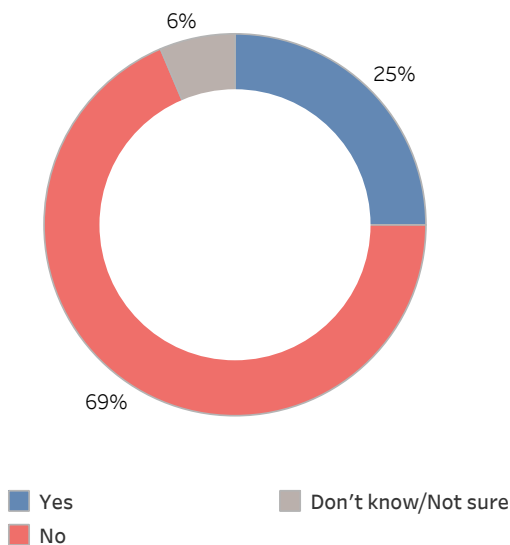


Congressional Redistricting

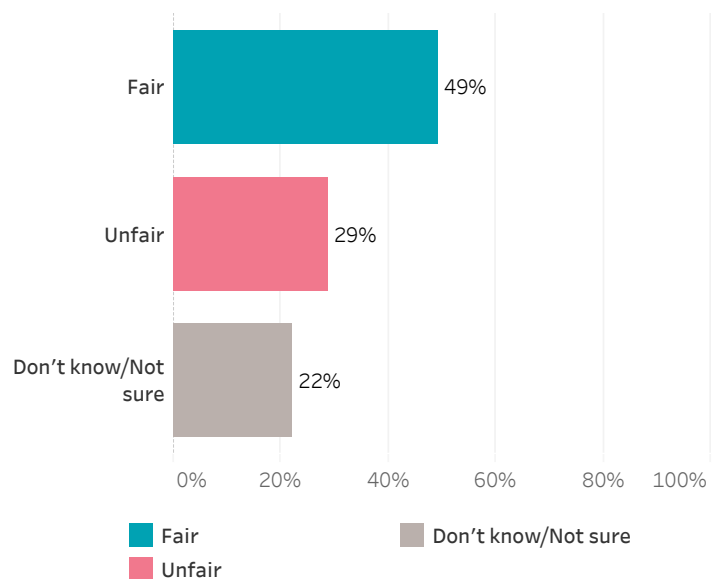
As part of the congressional redistricting process that occurs after each decennial census, the New Hampshire State Legislature published several maps for the two U.S. Congressional Districts in New Hampshire, many of which made substantial changes to the current districts. These maps were rejected by Governor Chris Sununu as unfair in his judgment, resulting in the NH Supreme Court drawing a new map that made very few changes.

Only 25% of New Hampshire residents say they have seen this new map. Among those who have seen the map (N=236), 49% believe it is fair, 29% think it is unfair, and 22% are unsure. By contrast, 80% of those who had seen the Court's maps in February believed that they were unfair.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred forty-four (944) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between June 16 and June 20, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the June 2022 Granite State Poll is 26%. The design effect for the survey is 2.8%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
