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MOWERS & LEAVITT LEAD NH'S 1ST DISTRICT GOP PRIMARY; BURNS LEADS IN 2ND, MANY UNDECIDED

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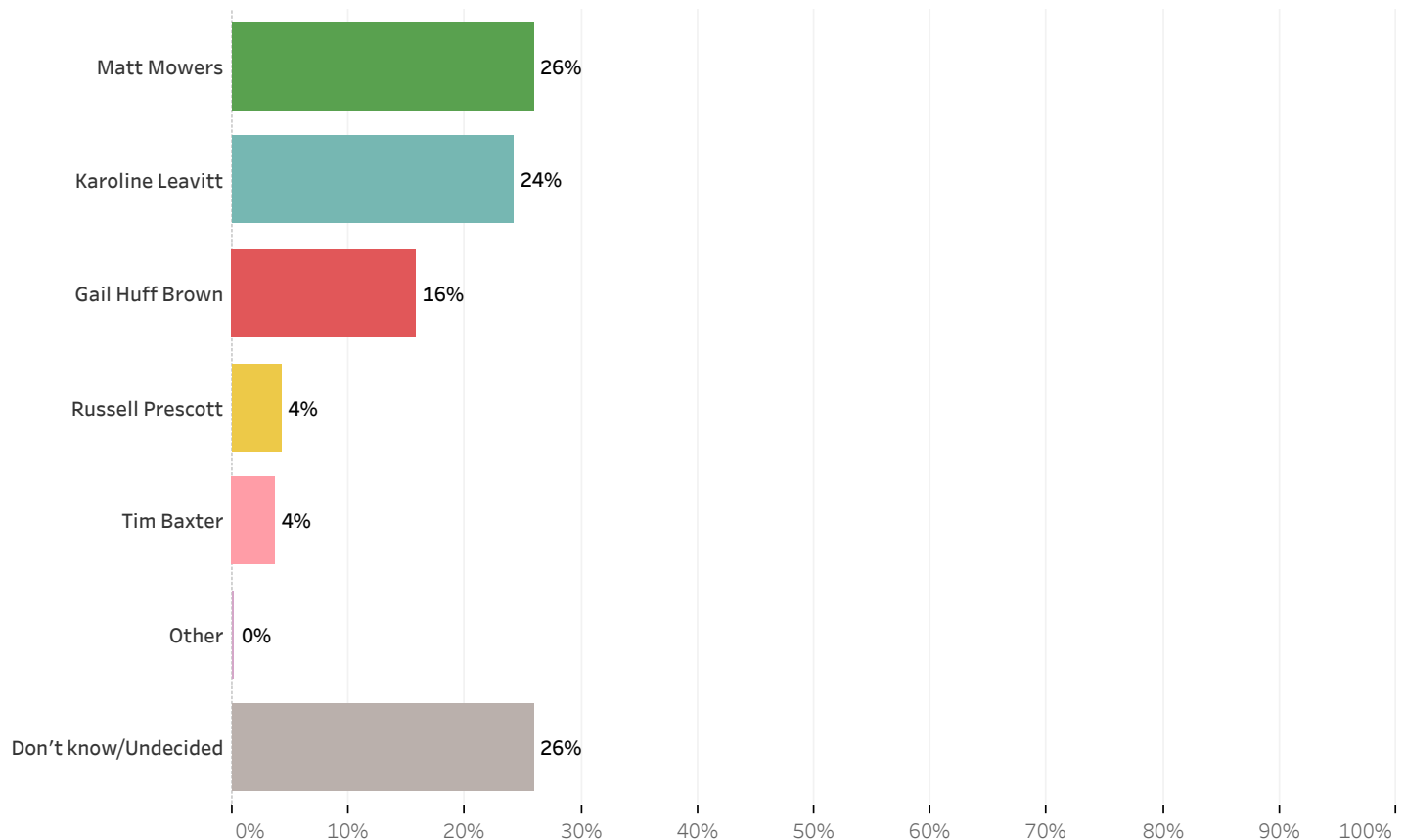
DURHAM, NH - Matt Mowers and Karoline Leavitt lead the field in the race for the GOP nomination in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District, with Gail Huff Brown in third. In the 2nd District, Robert Burns leads George Hansel and Lily Tang Williams. However, a plurality of likely primary voters are undecided in both districts and most candidates remain largely unknown to voters.

2022 NH 1st Congressional District Republican Primary

Republicans in New Hampshire's 1st Congressional District are competing to challenge two-term incumbent Chris Pappas. If the 2022 Republican primary election was being held today, 26% of likely Republican primary voters would vote for former State Department official and 2020 nominee Matt Mowers, 24% would vote for former White House aide Karoline Leavitt, and 16% support journalist Gail Huff Brown. Trailing in the race are former NH Executive Councilor Russell Prescott (4%) and NH State Representative Tim Baxter (4%), while less than 1% would vote for another candidate. With two weeks remaining in the campaign, 26% of likely voters say that they are undecided, making this contest wide open.

Leavitt leads among men but trails both Mowers and Huff Brown among women. Leavitt and Mowers are closely matched among Fox News viewers but Mowers leads Leavitt and Huff Brown among conservative radio listeners and *The Joe Rogan Experience* listeners.

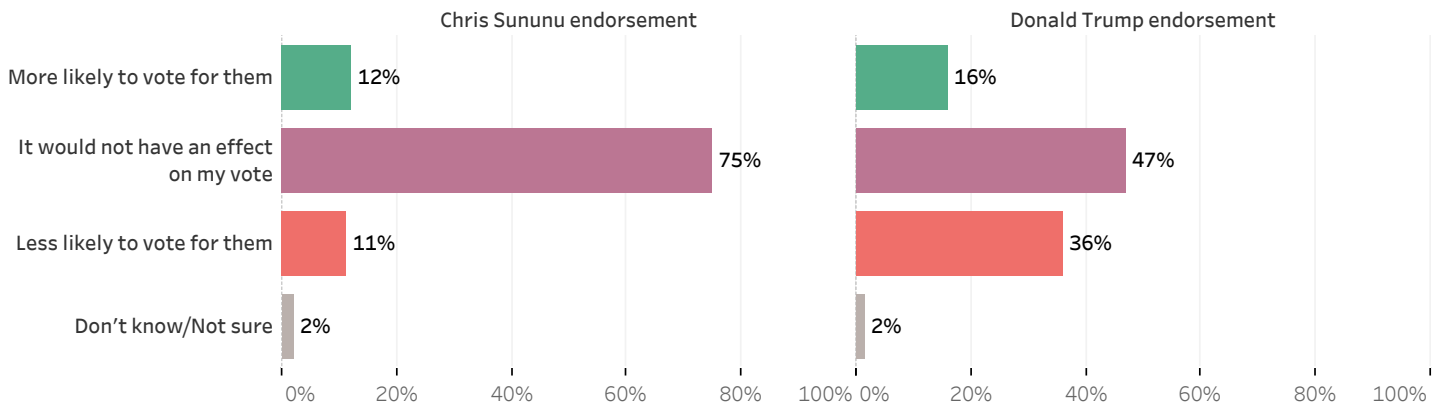
2022 New Hampshire Republican 1st Congressional District Primary - Preferred Candidate - August 2022

Neither Republican Governor Chris Sununu nor former President Donald Trump have endorsed a candidate in this race. And while most undecided Republican primary voters say that an endorsement by either person would not affect their vote, a Trump endorsement would repel more than twice as many voters as it would attract. A Sununu endorsement is a wash - among likely Republican primary voters who are undecided (N=107), 12% say an endorsement from Sununu would make them more likely to vote for that candidate, 11% say a Sununu endorsement would make them less likely to vote for that candidate, and most say a Sununu endorsement would have no effect (75%). A Trump endorsement is likely to do more harm than good for a candidate among remaining undecided voters. Sixteen percent of undecided voters say a Trump endorsement would make them more likely to support a candidate but 36% say that they would be less likely to support a candidate endorsed by Trump and 47% say it would have no effect on their vote.

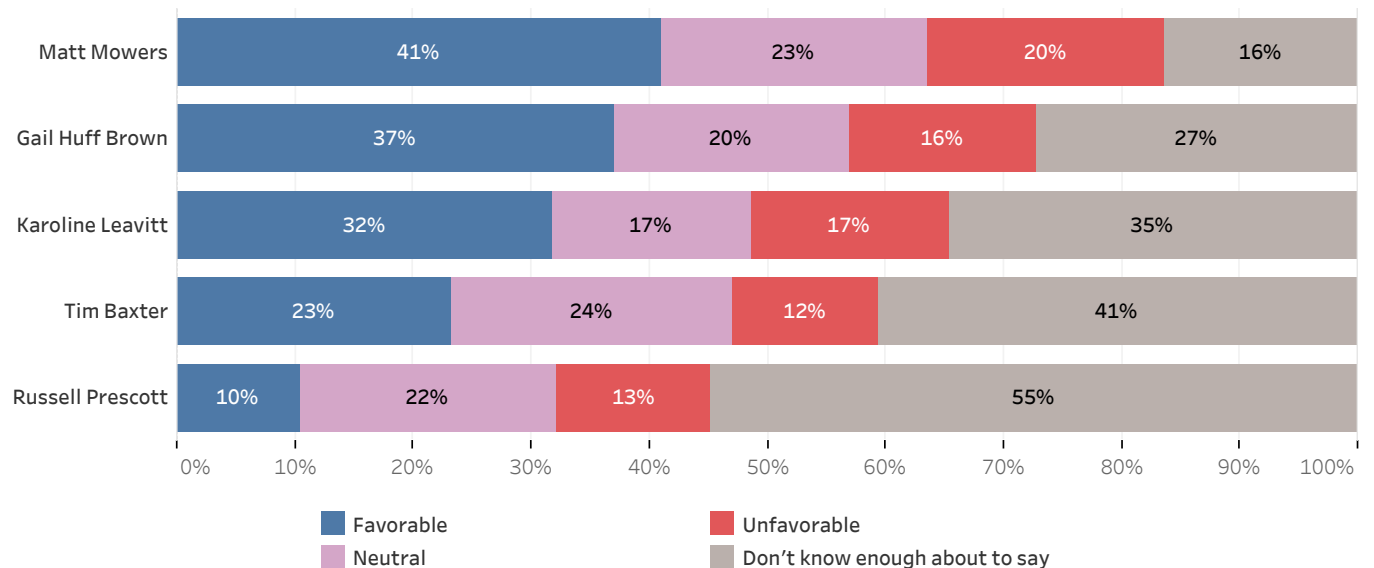
Effect of Possible Sununu & Trump Endorsement - Among Undecided 1st District Republican Primary Voters - August 2022



Mowers, who was the Republican 1st CD nominee in 2020, is the best known Republican candidate among likely Republican primary voters - 84% know enough to have an opinion about him, followed by Huff Brown (73%), Leavitt (65%), Baxter (59%), and Prescott (45%).

Mowers and Huff Brown are equally popular among likely Republican primary voters; each have a net favorability rating (the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) of +21, followed by Leavitt (+15), Baxter (+11) and Prescott (-3%).

Favorability - U.S. Congress First District Candidates - Among Likely GOP Primary Voters - August 2022

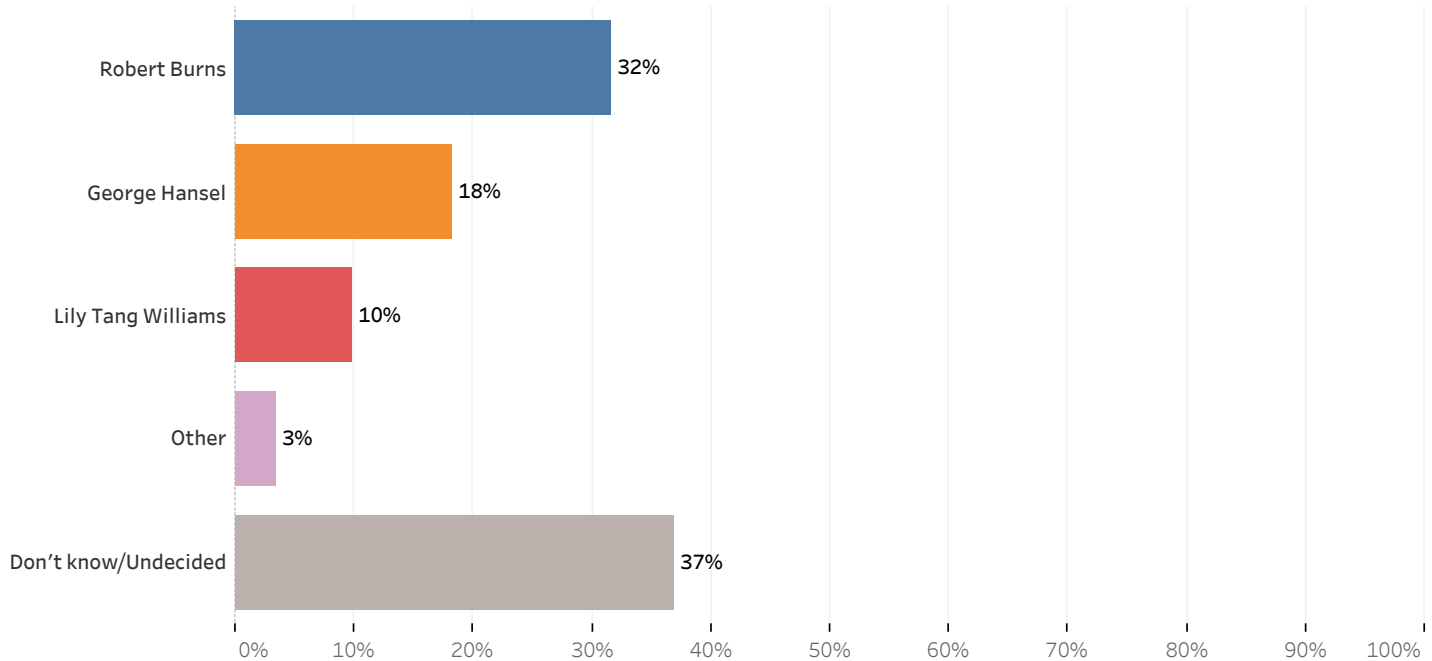


2022 NH 2nd Congressional District Republican Primary

Republicans in New Hampshire's Second Congressional District are seeking the nomination to challenge long-time incumbent Anne Kuster. The Republicans who are running are largely unknown to likely Republican primary voters with less than two weeks until the September 13th election. If the 2022 Republican primary election for the U.S. House of Representatives in New Hampshire's Second District was being held today, 32% of likely Republican primary voters would vote for former Hillsborough County Treasurer Robert Burns, 18% support Keene Mayor George Hansel, 10% support entrepreneur Lily Tang Williams, 3% would vote for another candidate, and 37% say that they are undecided.

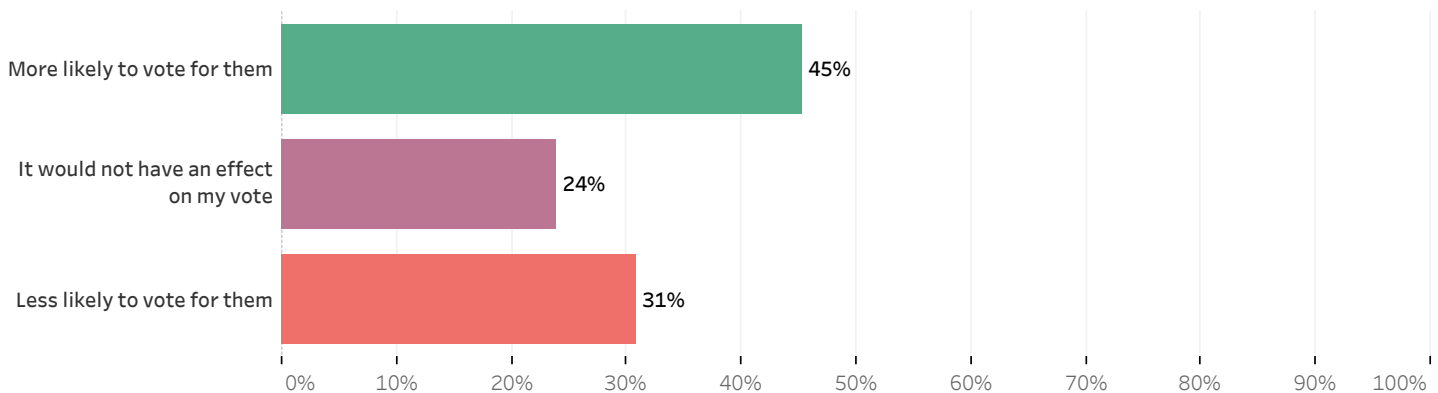
Burns holds clear leads among women and those without a college degree while Hansel leads among men and those with a college degree. Hansel and Burns are closely matched among Fox News viewers but Hansel trails Burns among conservative radio listeners and trails both Burns and Williams among *The Joe Rogan Experience* listeners.

2022 New Hampshire Republican 2nd Congressional District Primary - Preferred Candidate - August 2022



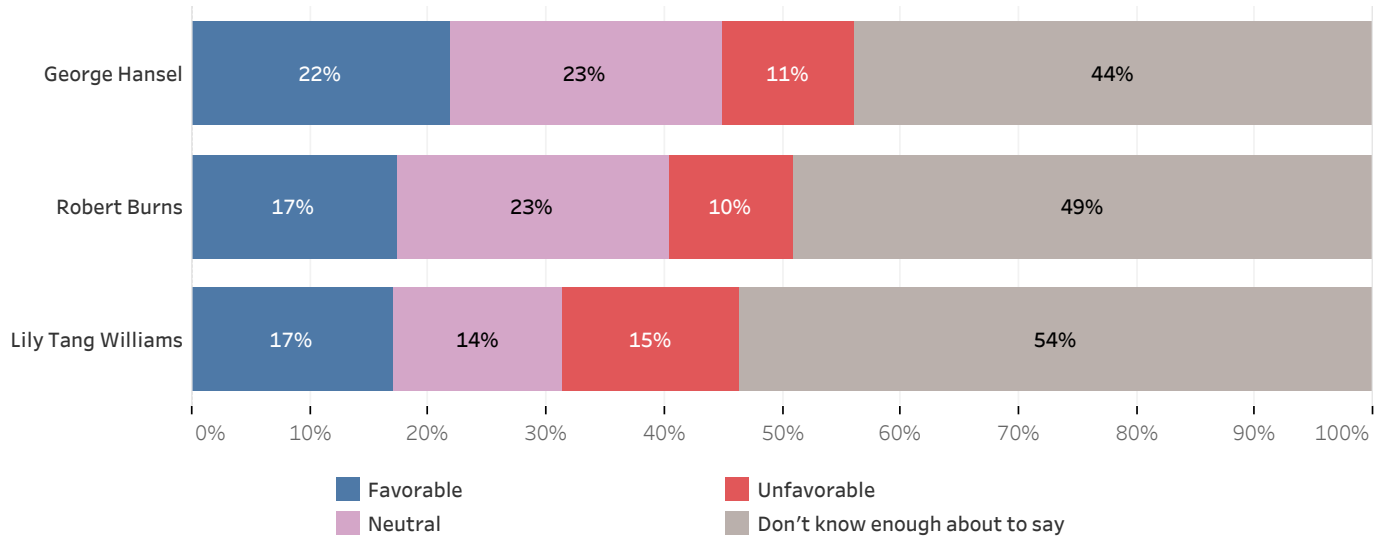
Turning to the power of endorsements, Governor Sununu has endorsed Hansel in this race while former President Trump has not endorsed a candidate. Among likely Republican primary voters who are undecided in the 2nd District (N=168), 45% say that a Trump endorsement would make them more likely to support that candidate but 31% say that they would be less likely to support a candidate endorsed by Trump.

Candidates for the 2nd District GOP nomination are not well-known among likely Republican primary voters: only 56% know enough to have an opinion about Hansel, 51% have an opinion about Burns, and 46% have an opinion about Williams. Hansel is the most popular of these candidates among likely Republican voters with a net favorability rating of +11, followed by Burns (+7) and Williams (+2).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, nine hundred and ninety-three (1,993) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between August 25 and August 29, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.2 percent. Included in the sample were 892 likely 2022 Republican primary voters (MSE = +/- 3.3%). Among likely Republican primary voters, 419 (MSE = +/- 4.8%) were First District residents and 469 (MSE = +/- 4.5%) were Second District residents. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the August 2022 Granite State Poll is 26%. The design effect for the survey is 2.9%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
