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POST PRIMARY: SUNUNU HOLDS DOUBLE-DIGIT LEAD OVER SHERMAN IN NH GOVERNOR RACE

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DURHAM, NH - Incumbent Governor Chris Sununu leads his little-known Democratic challenger Tom Sherman in the 2022 race for Governor of New Hampshire. Sununu enjoys near universal support among Republicans and holds a commanding lead among Independents. A majority of New Hampshire adults continue to approve of Sununu's job performance but residents are less likely to approve than they were in September 2020, directly before Sununu's previous re-election. Democrats and Republicans are largely equally matched in elections to the Executive Council and State Senate while Republicans hold a small lead in elections for the State House of Representatives.

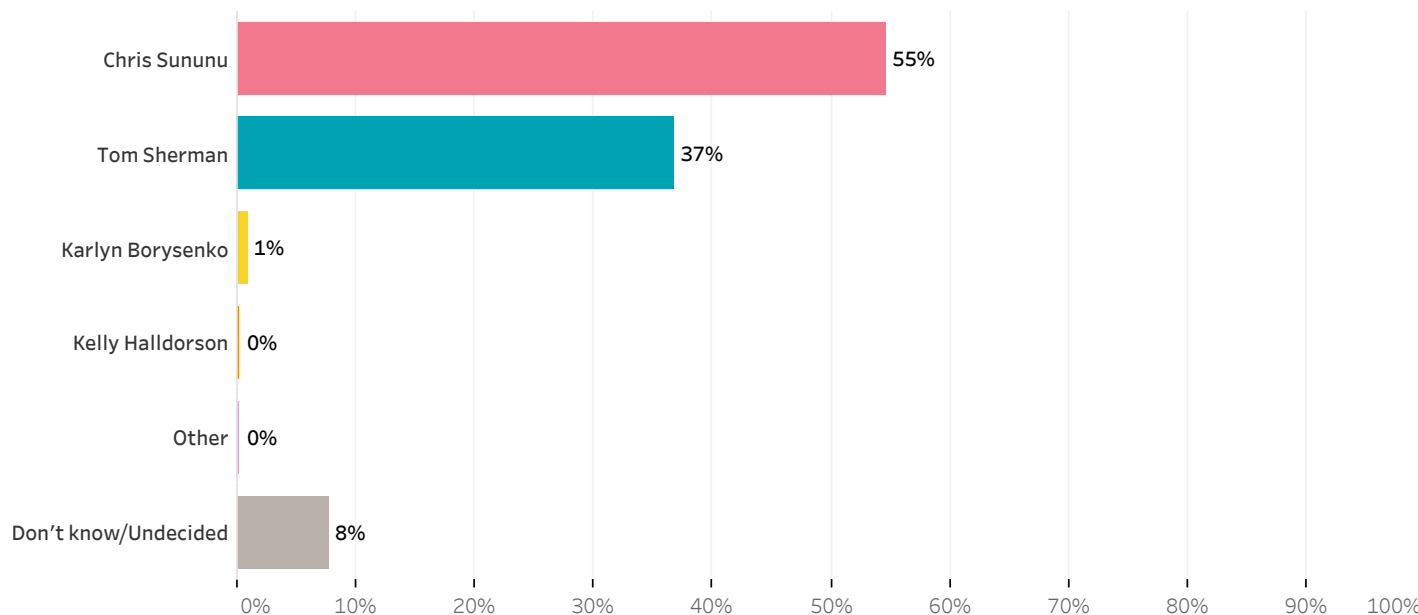
2022 NH Gubernatorial General Election

The New Hampshire state primary elections were held on September 13th, and neither major party candidate for Governor faced significant competition. Three-term incumbent Republican Chris Sununu will face Rye State Senator Tom Sherman, the Democratic Party nominee, in the general election in November. Following the primary, Sununu holds a double-digit lead over Sherman - 55% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Sununu, 37% would vote for Sherman, 1% prefer Libertarian Karlyn Borysenko, less than 1% favor Libertarian Kelly Halldorson, less than 1% would vote for some other candidate, and 8% are undecided.

Sherman holds a clear lead over Sununu among Democrats (79%-9%), but Sununu holds an even larger lead among Independents (84%-8%) and a larger still lead among Republicans (95%-1%). Sherman and Sununu are closely matched among those under the age of fifty, but Sununu holds a clear lead among those aged fifty and older. Men favor Sununu by a margin of more than two-to-one but the two candidates are closely matched among women. Sununu holds a very large lead among those without a college degree but Sherman leads among those with a college degree.

In September 2020, Sununu held a similar lead over his then Democratic challenger, Dan Feltz, whom he eventually defeated 65%-34%.

2022 New Hampshire Gubernatorial Election - September 2022

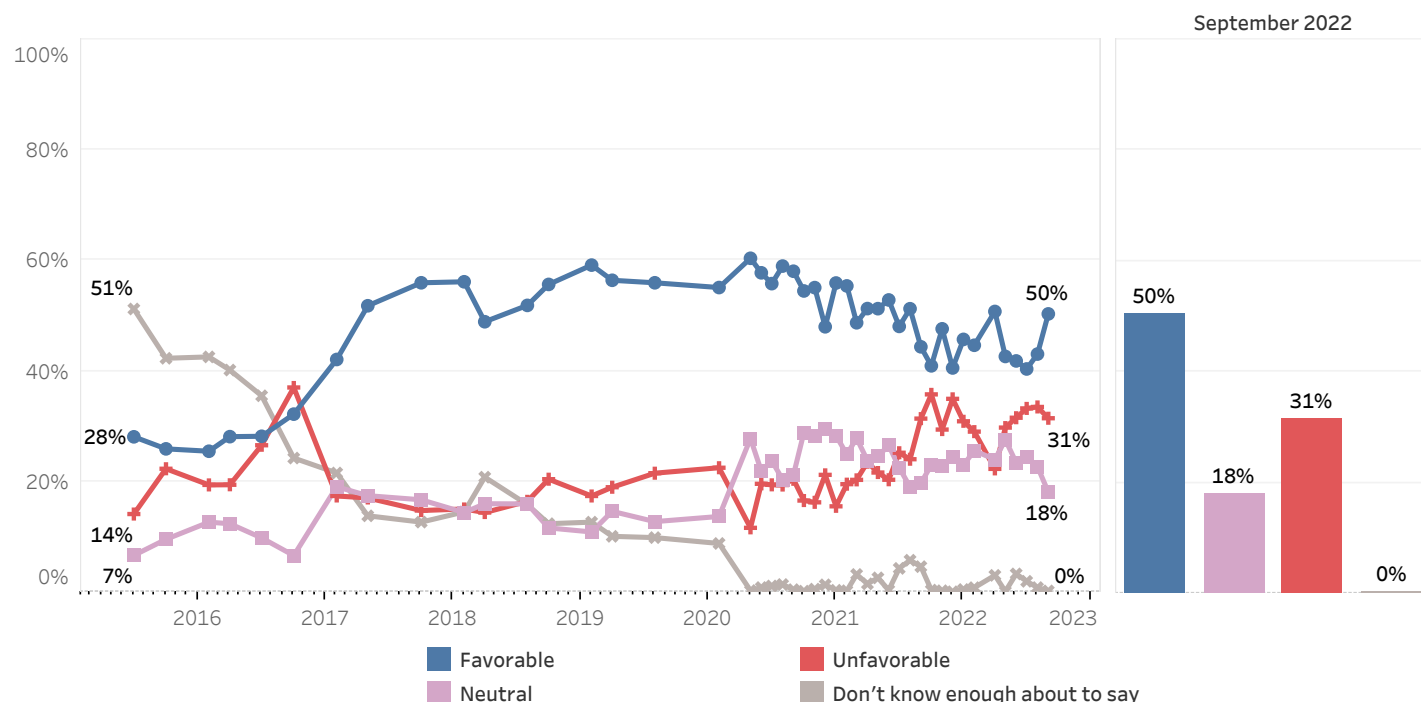

Half (50%) of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Sununu, 18% have a neutral opinion of him, and 31% have an unfavorable opinion of him. Sununu's net favorability rating (the percentage who have a favorable opinion of him minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion), is +19, up from +10 in August.

Sununu is very popular among Republicans (+68) and Independents (+57) in the state but is unpopular among Democrats (-43).

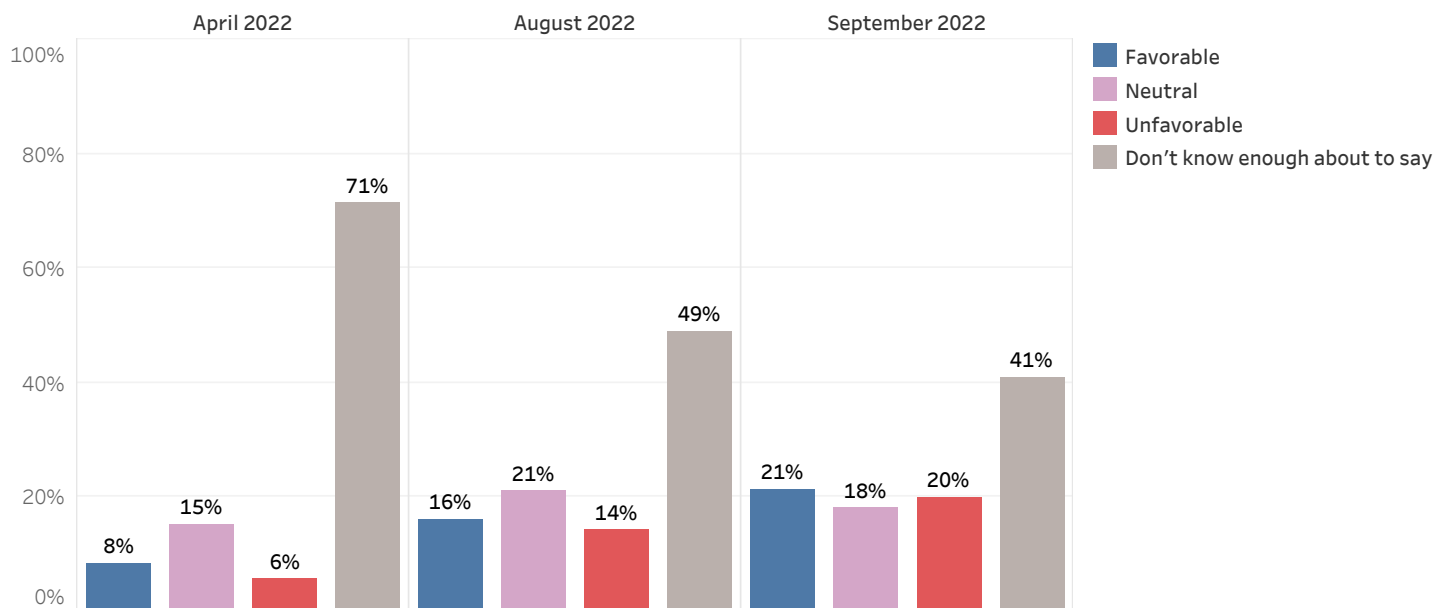
Favorability - Chris Sununu



Sherman is not well-known in New Hampshire, in part a consequence of not facing a primary challenger. Twenty-one percent of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Sherman, 18% have a neutral opinion of him, 20% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 41% don't know enough about him to say. Sherman's net favorability rating is +2, unchanged since August (+2), but the percentage who know enough about Sherman to have an opinion has slightly increased since August.

Sherman is popular among Democrats in the state (+47) but is somewhat unpopular among Independents (-17) and is unpopular among Republicans (-34).

Favorability - Tom Sherman

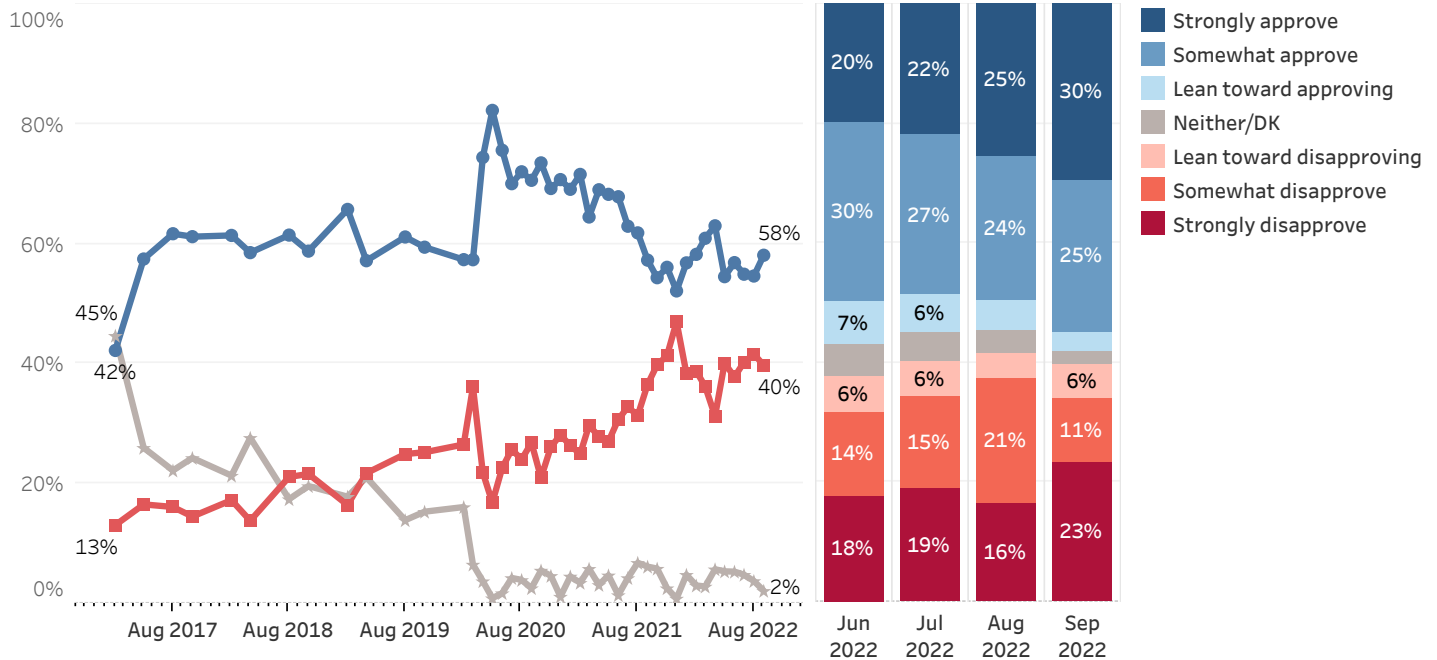


Gubernatorial Approval

Sununu continues to enjoy high marks from a majority of Granite Staters - 58% of New Hampshire residents approve of Governor Sununu's job performance, 40% disapprove, and 2% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Sununu's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) is +18, slightly higher than in August (+13), but far lower than at the same point in the 2020 electoral cycle (+44).

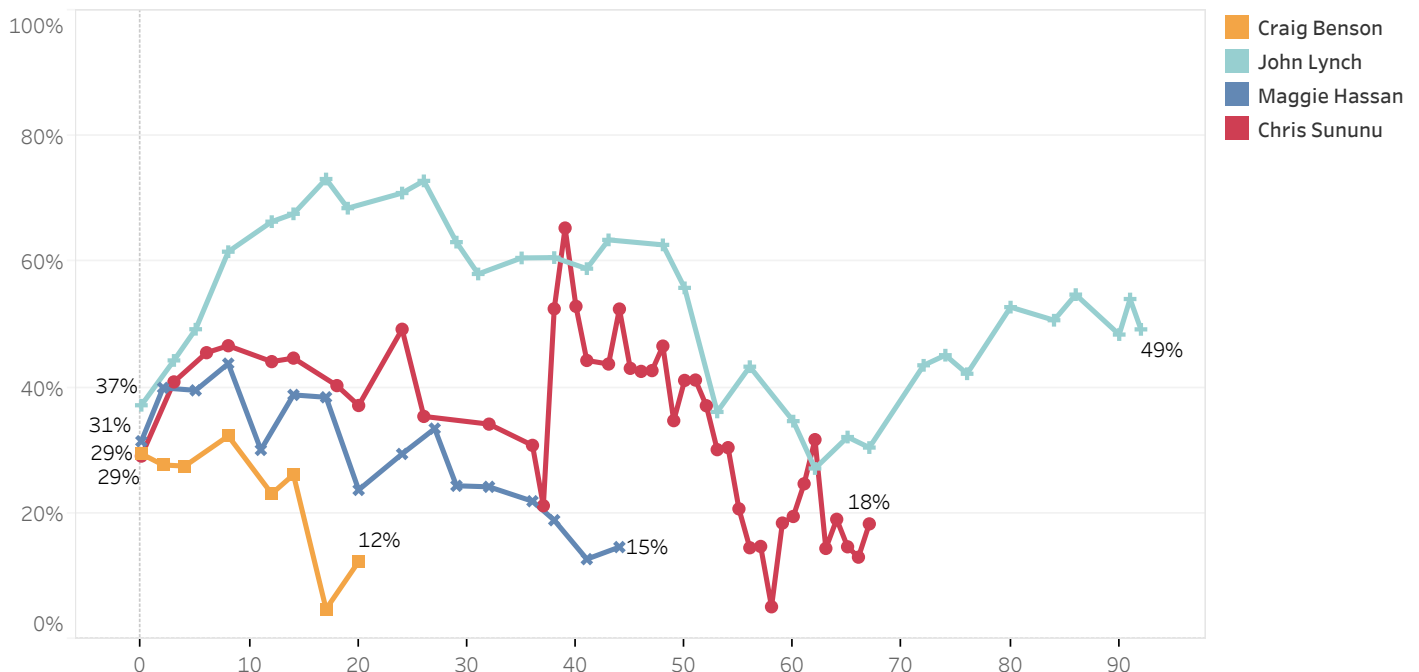
Eighty-six percent of Republicans and 80% of Independents approve of Sununu's performance as Governor but only 23% of Democrats agree.

Sununu's net approval (+18%) is comparable to the final net approval ratings of his predecessor, Maggie Hassan (+15%), and former Governor Craig Benson (+12%).

Net Job Approval of NH Governor - By Months of Governorship

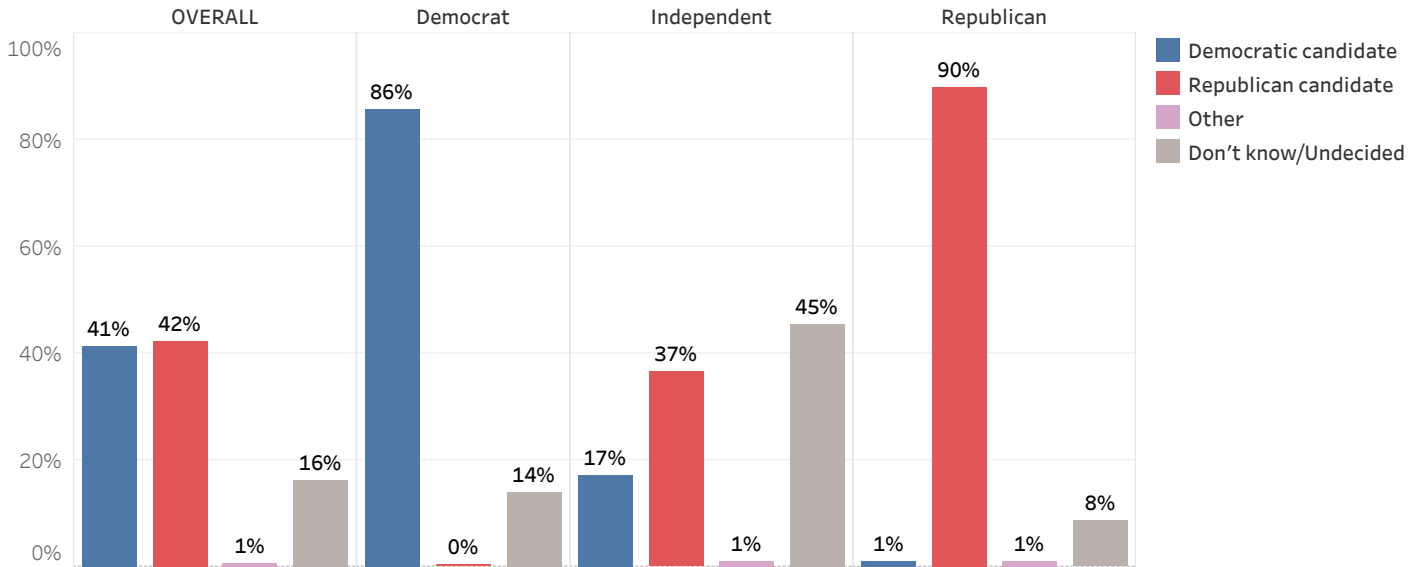


2022 New Hampshire Executive Council Election

When asked the party of the Executive Council candidate they would vote for if the election were held today, 41% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 42% say they would vote for the Republican candidate, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 16% are undecided.

Among Democrats, only 86% plan on voting for the Democratic candidate while 14% are undecided, while among Republicans, 90% plan to vote for the Republican candidate and 8% are undecided. Among Independents, 17% plan for vote for the Democratic candidate, 37% plan to vote for the Republican candidate, and 45% are undecided.

2022 New Hampshire Executive Council Election - September 2022

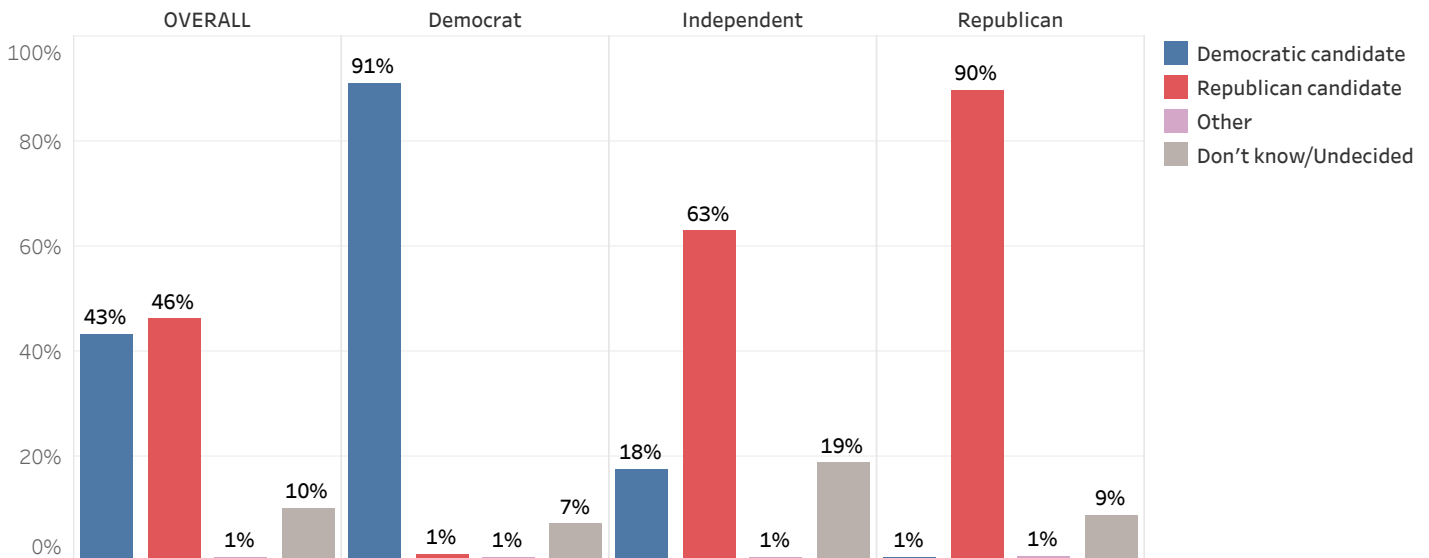


2022 New Hampshire State Senate Election

When asked the party of the State Senate candidate they would vote for if the election were held today, 43% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 46% say they would vote for the Republican candidate, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 10% are undecided.

Among Democrats, 91% plan on voting for the Democratic candidate while 7% are undecided, while among Republicans, 90% plan to vote for the Republican candidate and 9% are undecided. Among Independents, 18% plan for vote for the Democratic candidate, 63% plan to vote for the Republican candidate, and 19% are undecided.

2022 New Hampshire State Senate Election - September 2022

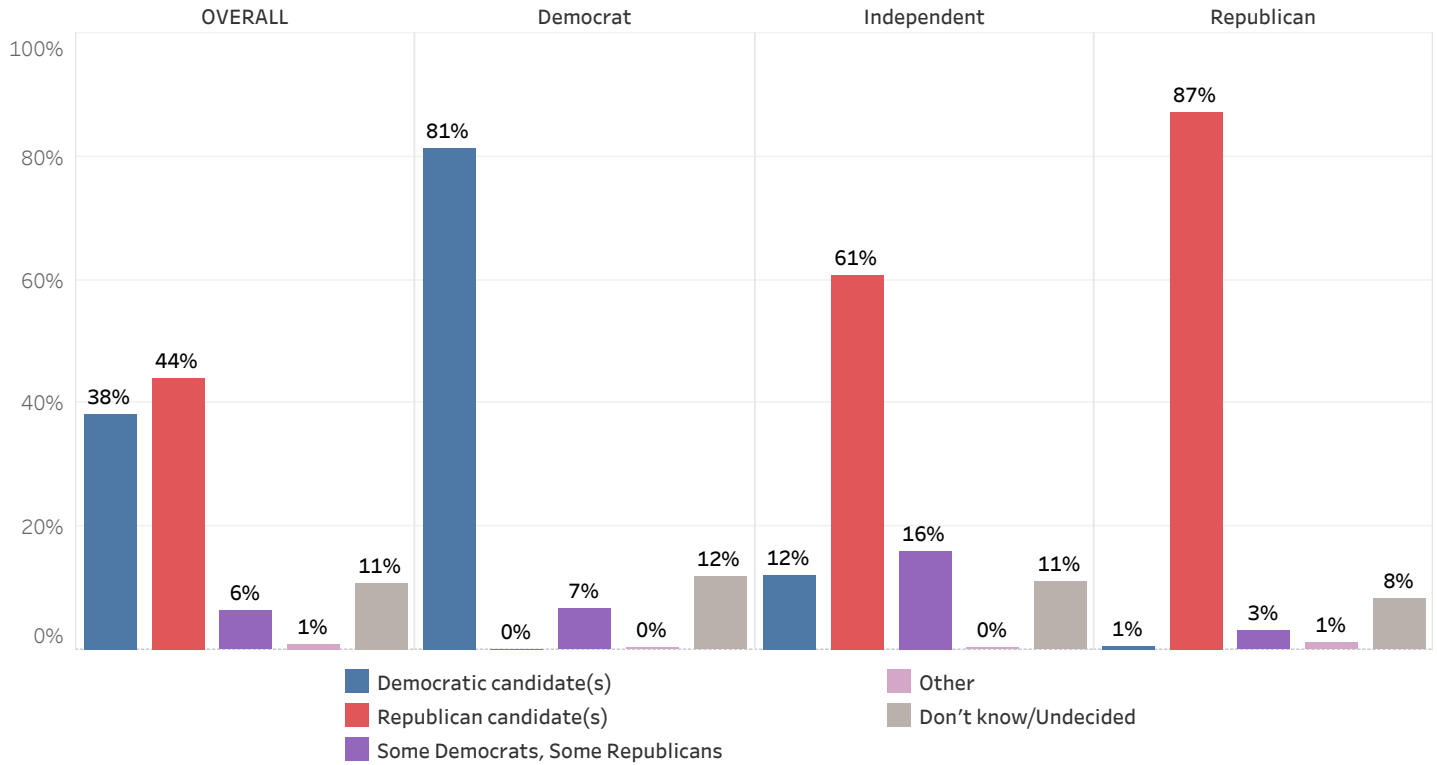


2022 New Hampshire State House Election

When asked the party of the State House of Representative candidate or candidates they would vote for if the election were held today, 38% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Democratic candidate(s), 44% say they would vote for the Republican candidate(s), 6% would vote for some Democrats and some Republicans, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 11% are undecided.

Among Democrats, 81% plan on voting for the Democratic candidate(s) while 12% are undecided, while among Republicans, 87% plan to vote for the Republican candidate(s) and only 8% are undecided. Among Independents, 12% plan to vote for the Democratic candidate(s), 61% plan to vote for the Republican candidate(s), and 11% are undecided.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred seventy-six (976) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 15 and September 19, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. Included in the sample were 870 likely 2022 general election voters (MSE = +/- 3.3%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the September 2022 Granite State Poll is 27%. The design effect for the survey is 2.9%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,250 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
