**POST PRIMARY: HASSAN LEADS BOLDUC FOR U.S. SENATE; CD1 & CD2 CLOSE**

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DURHAM, NH - Democratic incumbent Senator Maggie Hassan holds a slim lead over Republican Don Bolduc in the race for U.S. Senate in New Hampshire. Incumbent Democratic Representatives Chris Pappas and Ann Kuster are closely matched in their races with their Republican challengers, Karoline Leavitt and Robert Burns. When asked which issues are most likely to motivate them to vote, three-quarters of Republicans cite the economy or inflation while a similar percentage of Democrats cite abortion or women's rights.

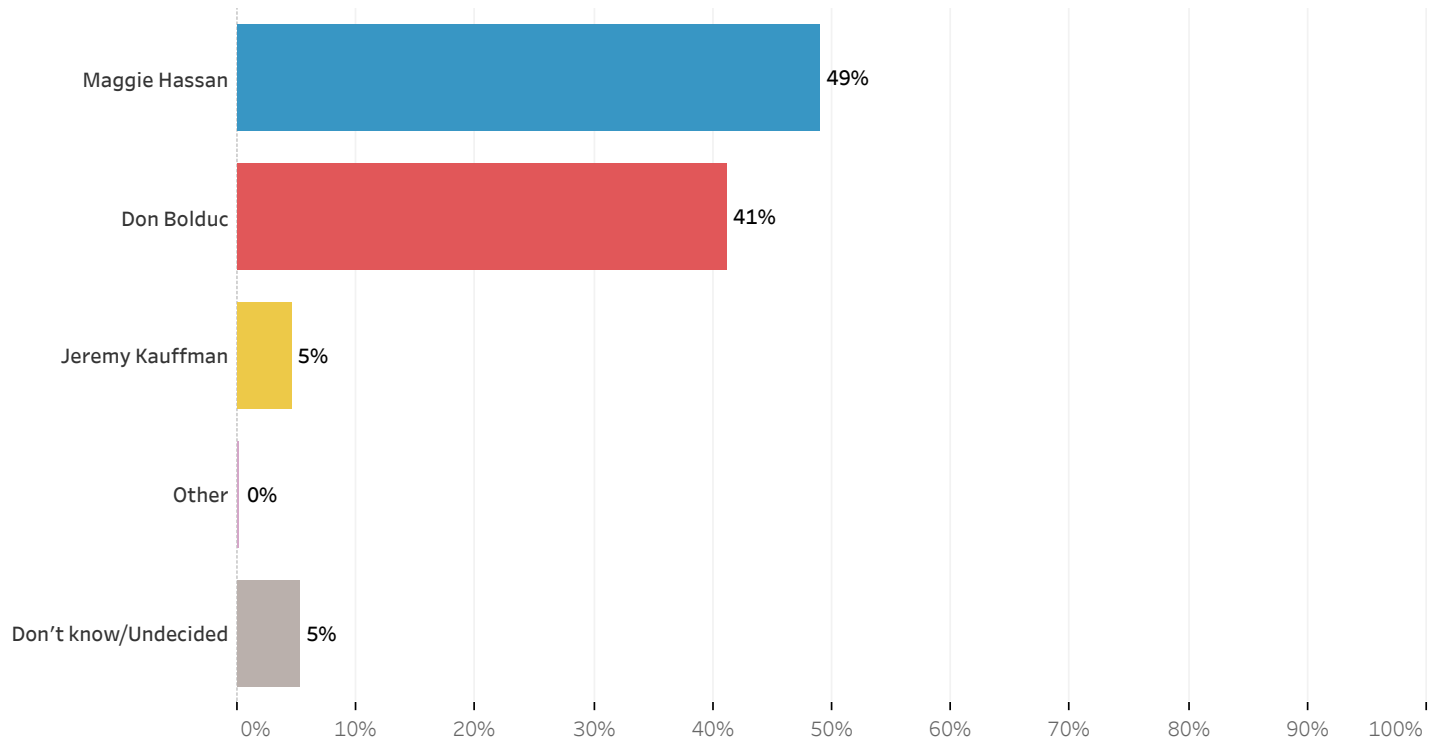
**2022 U.S. Senate Election**

After a narrow win in the September 13th Republican primary, retired General Don Bolduc trails Maggie Hassan in her bid for a second term in the U.S. Senate. If the election for U.S. Senate were held today, 49% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Hassan, 41% would vote for Bolduc, 5% would vote for Libertarian Jeremy Kauffman, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 5% are undecided.

Hassan enjoys near universal support among Democrats (98%), while among Republicans, just 83% support Bolduc, 5% support Kauffman, 3% support Hassan, and 9% are undecided. Bolduc garners the support of just under half of Independents (45%), while 30% support Hassan and 21% support Kauffman. "Bolduc will need to heal the intraparty divide and increase his support among Republicans if he is to have a chance at defeating Hassan," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center.

Significant majorities of those under the age of fifty, women, and people with a college degree or higher favor Hassan, while Bolduc leads among those aged sixty-five and older, men, and those without a college degree.

**2022 U.S. Senate Election - September 2022**

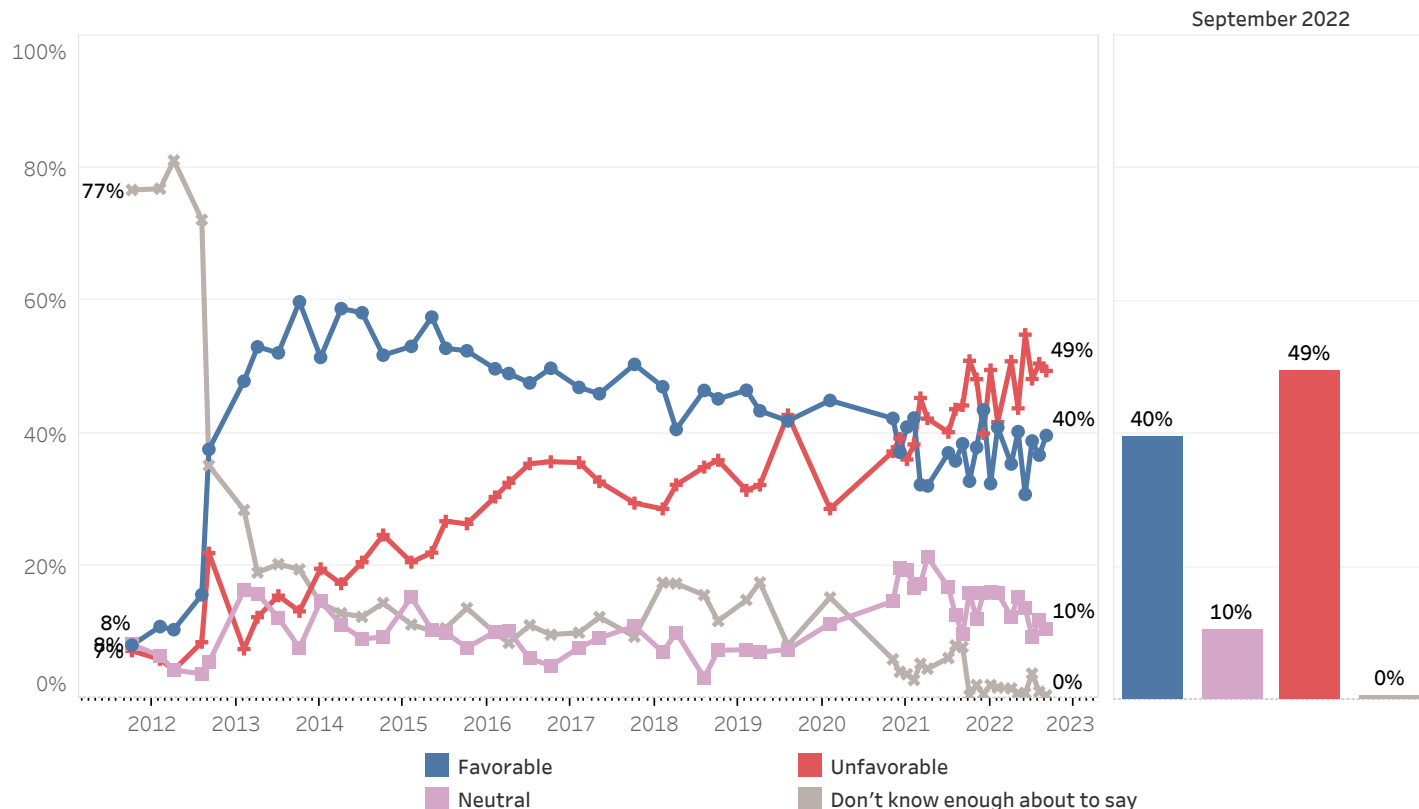

Despite leading in the race, Senator Hassan is not viewed favorably in New Hampshire - 40% of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Hassan, 10% have a neutral opinion of her, and 49% have an unfavorable opinion of her. Hassan's net favorability rating (the percentage who have a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion), is -10, largely unchanged since August (-14).

Hassan is very popular among Democrats (+85) in the state but is unpopular among Independents (-50) and is very unpopular among Republicans (-83).

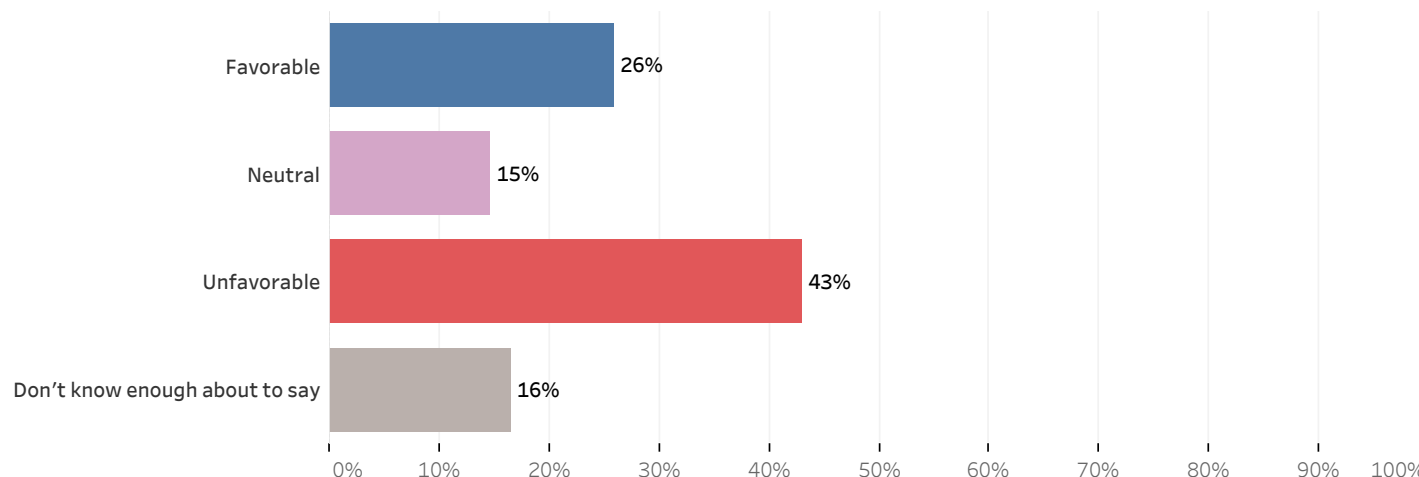
### Favorability - Maggie Hassan



Bolduc is less popular than Hassan. Only 26% of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of him, 15% have a neutral opinion, 43% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 16% don't know enough about him to say. Bolduc's net favorability rating is -17.

Bolduc is popular among Republicans in the state (+43) but is somewhat unpopular among Independents (-20) and is very unpopular among Democrats (-82).

### Favorability - Don Bolduc - September 2022

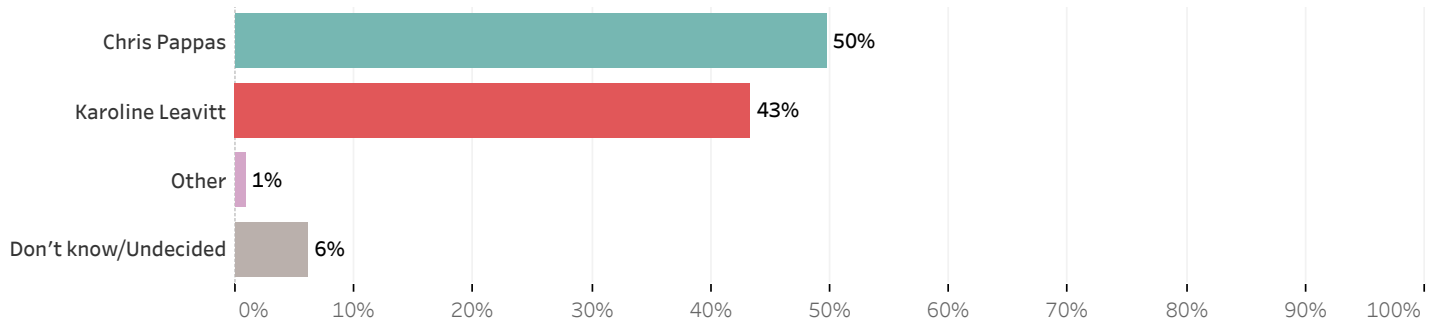


## 2022 U.S. First Congressional District Election

Turning to New Hampshire Congressional races, former Trump White House Aide Karoline Leavitt emerged as the victor in a close primary election for the Republican nomination in New Hampshire's First Congressional District. If the election for the First Congressional District were held today, 50% of likely voters say they would vote for incumbent Chris Pappas, 43% would vote for Leavitt, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 6% are undecided.

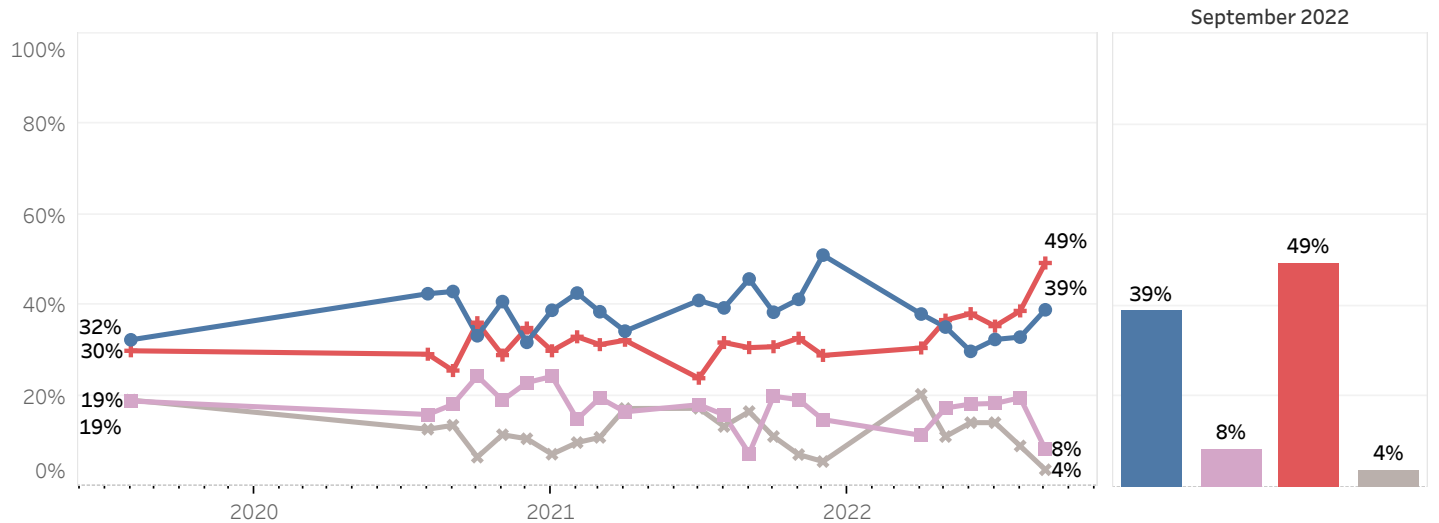
Nearly all Democrats (96%) support Pappas while more than two-thirds (68%) of Independents and 87% of Republicans support Leavitt. Pappas leads among those under the age of sixty-five, women, and those with college degrees, while Leavitt leads among men and those aged sixty-five and older.

### 2022 First Congressional District Election - September 2022



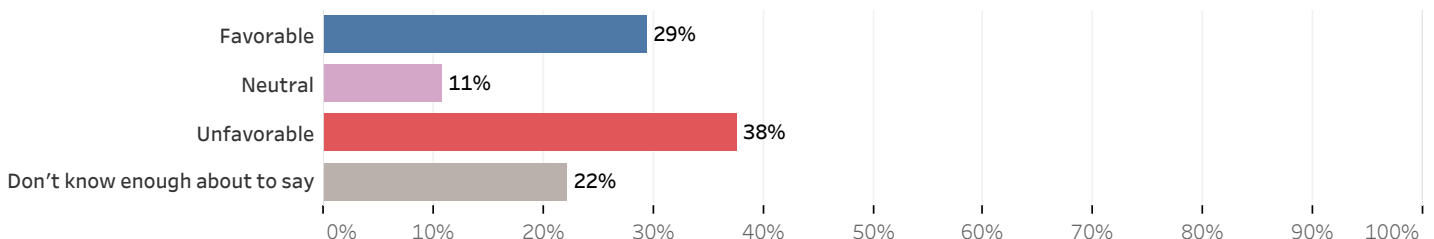
Only 39% of First District residents have a favorable opinion of Pappas, 8% have a neutral opinion of him, and 49% have an unfavorable opinion of him. Pappas's net favorability rating is -10, largely unchanged since August (-6). Pappas is very popular among Democrats (+85) in the First District but is unpopular among Independents (-46) and is very unpopular among Republicans (-86).

Leavitt is also an unpopular in the First District - only 29% of First District residents have a favorable opinion of her, 11% have a neutral opinion, 38% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 22% don't know enough about her to say. Leavitt's net favorability rating is -8. Leavitt is only somewhat popular among Republicans (+42) and Independents (+26) but is very unpopular among Democrats (-71).

### Favorability - Karoline Leavitt - September 2022



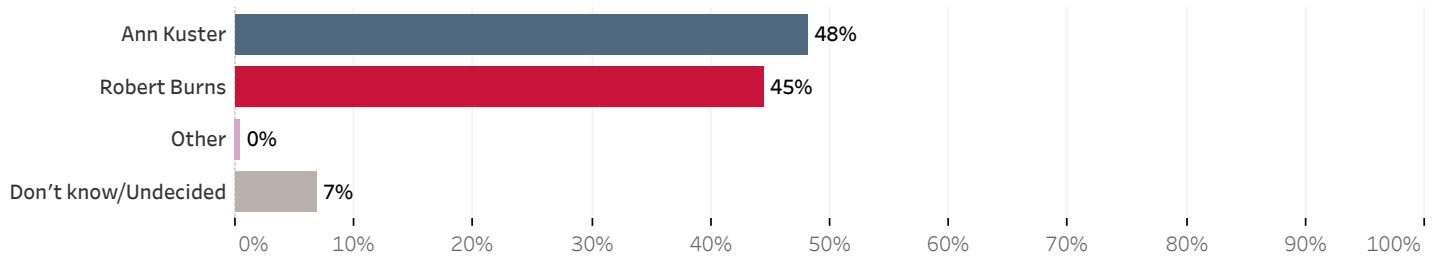
## 2022 U.S. Second Congressional District Election

In the Second District, former Hillsborough County Treasurer Robert Burns narrowly defeated Keene Mayor George Hansel in the Republican primary. Burns is statistically tied with incumbent Congresswoman Ann Kuster. If the election for the Second Congressional District were held today, 48% of likely voters say they would vote for Kuster, 45% would vote for Burns, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 7% are undecided.

Nearly all Democrats (99%) support Kuster while a majority (58%) of Independents and 85% of Republicans support Burns. Kuster leads among those under the age of thirty-five, women, and those with college degrees, while Burns leads among men and those without a college degree.

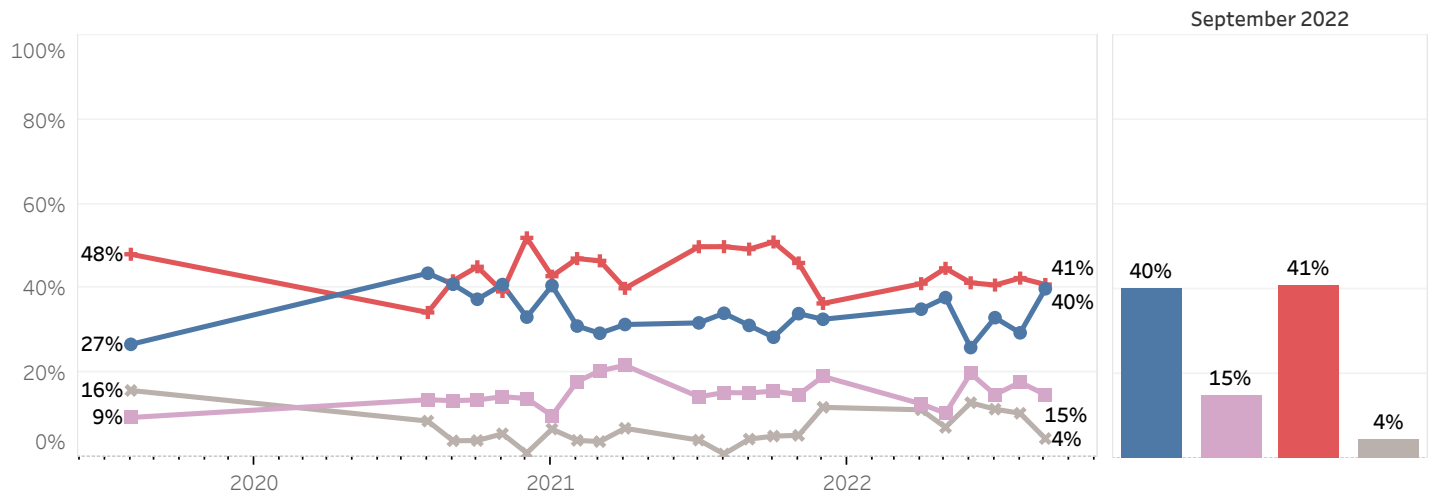
"In both the First and Second Congressional Districts, Democrats are leading because they have nearly universal support from Democrats," said Smith. "The Republican Party has not unified behind either of their Congressional candidates after bruising primaries."

### 2022 Second Congressional District Election - September 2022



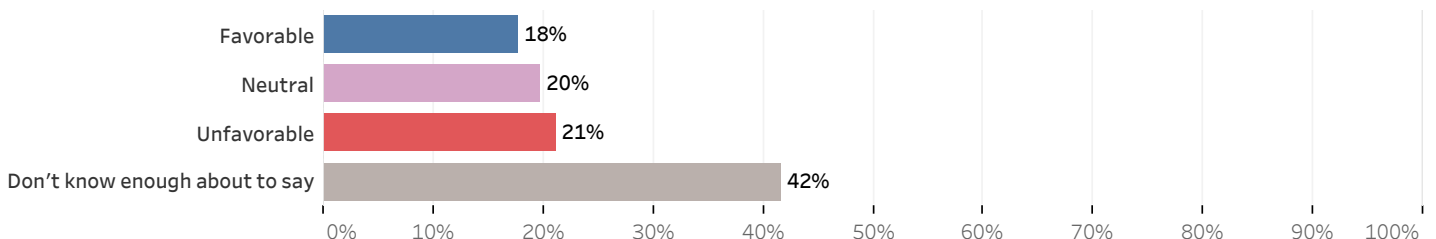
Forty percent of Second District residents have a favorable opinion of Kuster, 15% have a neutral opinion of her, and 41% have an unfavorable opinion of her. Kuster's net favorability rating is -1, up from -13 in August. Kuster is very popular among Democrats (+87) in the Second District but is unpopular among Independents (-33) and is very unpopular among Republicans (-73).

Burns is unknown to many Second District residents. Only 18% have a favorable opinion of him, 20% have a neutral opinion, 21% have an unfavorable opinion of him, and 42% don't know enough about him to say. Burns's net favorability rating is -3. Burns is somewhat popular among Republicans (+25) and somewhat unpopular among Democrats (-38), while Independents are divided (+10).

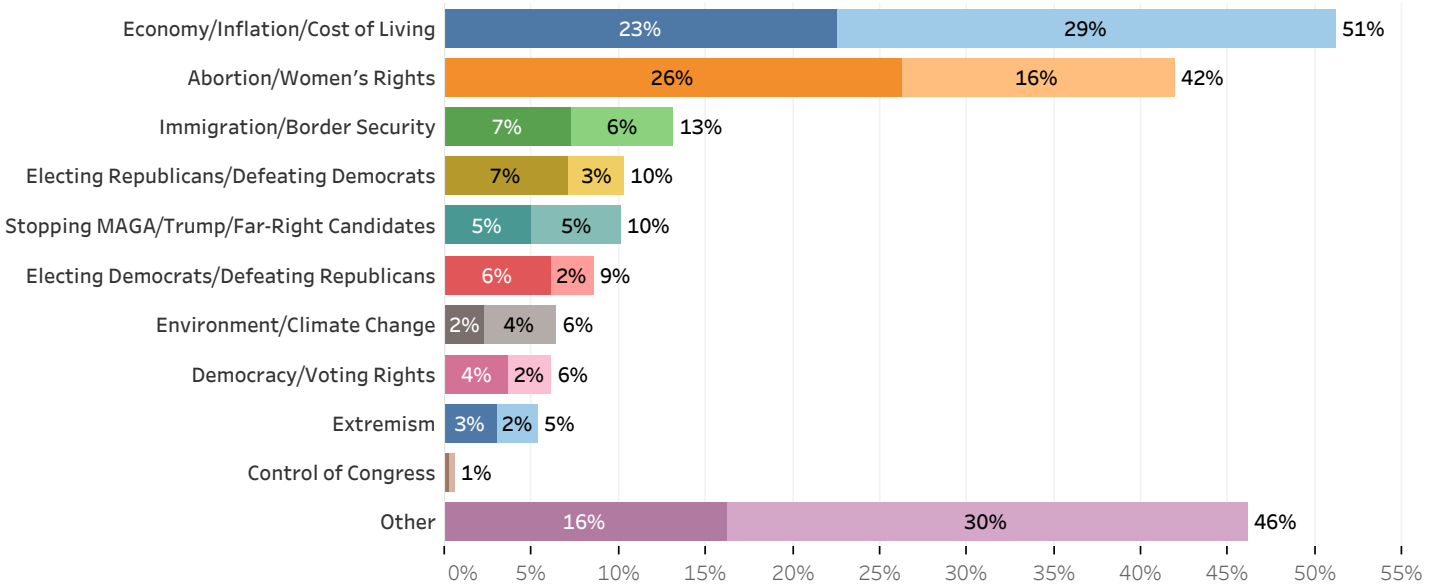
### Favorability - Robert Burns - September 2022



## Voting Issues

When asked to name the two most important issues that will make them more likely to vote in the November general election, just over half of Granite Staters (51%) mention economic issues (the economy, inflation, or the cost of living) as most important (23%) or second most important (29%), while 42% mention abortion or women's rights as most important (26%) or second most important (16%) to them. Fewer respondents cite immigration or border security (13%), electing Republicans or defeating Democrats (10%), stopping MAGA, Trump, or far-right candidates (10%), electing Democrats or defeating Republicans (9%), the environment or climate change (6%), democracy or voting rights (6%), extremism (5%), or control of Congress (1%).

### First and Second Most Important Issues to Encourage Voting - Coded - September 2022

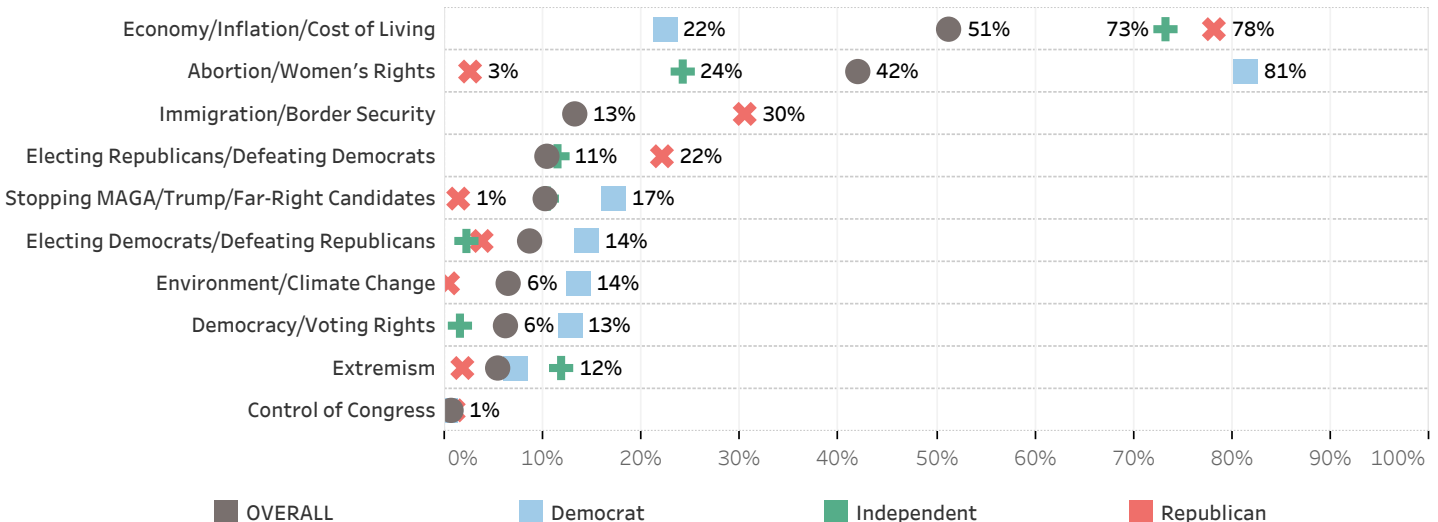


Darker colors = Most important issue to encourage voting

About three-quarters of Republicans (78%) and Independents (73%) cite the economy, inflation, or the cost of living as the most or second most important issue to them, while a smaller percentage of Republicans cite immigration or border security (30%) or electing Republicans or defeating Democrats (22%). Democrats are far less likely to mention the economy, inflation, or the cost of living than Republicans (22%), but 81% cite abortion or women's rights as among the two issues making them more likely to vote.

"The responses to this question illustrate the campaign themes of both parties," said Smith. "Republicans will try to tie Democrats to economic problems while Democrats hope to motivate their base to come to the polls to protect abortion rights."

## Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred seventy-six (976) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between September 15 and September 19, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. Included in the sample were 870 likely 2022 general election voters (MSE = +/- 3.3%), with 423 from New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 4.8%) and 445 from New Hampshire's Second Congressional District (MSE = +/- 4.6%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the September 2022 Granite State Poll is 27%. The design effect for the survey is 2.9%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,250 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
