GOLDEN LEADS POLIQUIN IN MAINE SECOND CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICT REMATCH; PINGREE FAR AHEAD OF THELANDER IN FIRST


DURHAM, NH - Incumbent Democratic Congressman Jared Golden leads former Congressman Bruce Poliquin and Independent Tiffany Bond in the race for Maine's Second Congressional District. In the First District, Congresswoman Chellie Pingree holds a large lead over the relatively unknown Republican nominee Ed Thelander.

2022 U.S. Congressional Second District Election

Maine's Second Congressional District is one to watch. Donald Trump won the District in 2016 and 2020 even though he lost statewide. Republican Bruce Poliquin held the seat from 2015 to 2019, losing to current Congressman Jared Golden in the 2018 election. This year is a rematch of the 2018 race and Golden currently holds a lead. If the election were held today, 44% of likely voters say they would vote for Golden, 33% say they would vote for Poliquin, 8% favor Independent Tiffany Bond, 2% would vote for another candidate, and 13% are undecided. "Golden won in 2018 in a very close election with the help of second-choice votes under Maine's ranked choice voting system," said Andrew Smith, Director of the UNH Survey Center. "Ranked choice voting could again prove decisive given that both major party candidates are below 50% in this poll. The second choices of Bond voters could determine the winner."

Eighty-eight percent of Democrats support Golden but only 69% of Republicans support Poliquin. Independents are divided, with 33% supporting Bond, 30% supporting Poliquin, and 16% supporting Golden. Golden holds a clear lead among those under the age of thirty-five, women, and Central Maine residents, while Poliquin leads among those aged 50-64 and Northern Maine residents. Bond does particularly well among those aged 65 and older.


2022 Second Congressional District Election - September 2022


Thirty-one percent of Second District residents have a favorable opinion of Golden, 32% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 33% are neutral, and 4% don't know enough about him to say. Golden's net favorability rating (the percentage who have a favorable opinion of him minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion) is -1.

Golden is popular among Democrats (+67) in the district but is unpopular among Independents (-42) and Republicans (-54).




Poliquin is a much less popular among Maine Second District residents than Golden. Only 17% have a favorable opinion of him, 47% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 27% are neutral, and 9% don't know enough about him to say. Poliquin's net favorability rating is -29.

Poliquin is only somewhat popular among Republicans (+21) in the district but is somewhat unpopular among Independents (-21) and is very unpopular among Democrats (-84).



Despite having been on the ballot in 2018, most Second District residents are unfamiliar with Bond. Only 4% have a favorable opinion of her, 14% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 70% don't know enough about her to say. Bond's net favorability rating is -9.


Bond is relatively well-known among Independents in the district as 56% know enough to have an opinion of her, but only 27% of Democrats and 24% of Republicans know enough about her to have an opinion.



2022 U.S. Congressional First District Election

In Maine's First Congressional District, incumbent Congresswoman Chellie Pingree, who was first elected in 2008, is currently running well ahead of first-time candidate and retired Navy SEAL Ed Thelander. If the election were held today, 57% of likely voters say they would vote for Pingree, 32% would vote for Thelander, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 10% are undecided.

Ninety-five percent of Democrats support Pingree while 79% of Republicans support Thelander. Pingree holds a large lead among Independents, earning 63% of the vote compared to only 22% for Thelander. Pingree holds a large lead among those under the age of thirty-five, women, those with a college degree, and Southern Maine residents, while Thelander holds a small lead among those with a high school degree or less education.



Forty-four percent of Maine First District residents have a favorable opinion of Pingree, 31% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 15% are neutral, and 11% don't know enough about her to say. Pingree's net favorability rating is +13. Pingree is very popular among Democrats (+72) and somewhat popular among Independents (+21) in the district but is very unpopular among Republicans (-78).





Most First District residents are unfamiliar with Thelander. Only 11% have a favorable opinion of him, 14% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 10% are neutral, and 65% don't know enough about him to say. Thelander's net favorability rating is -3.

Thelander is only somewhat popular among Republicans (+25) in the district but is somewhat unpopular among Democrats (-23), while Independents (+1) are largely neutral overall.



Pine Tree State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Pine Tree State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Seven hundred fifty-two (752) Pine Tree State Panel members completed the survey online between September 15 and September 19, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/-3.6 percent. Included in the sample were 694 likely 2022 general election voters (MSE = +/-3.7%), with 351 from Maine's First Congressional District (MSE = +/-5.2%) and 333 from Maine's Second Congressional District (MSE = +/-5.4%). These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the September 2022 Pine Tree State Poll is 32%. The design effect for the survey is 2.4%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the ME Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in Maine.

The Pine Tree State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of Maine residents. Approximately 2,500 Maine adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
