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NEARLY HALF OF GRANITE STATERS REPORT HAVING TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19

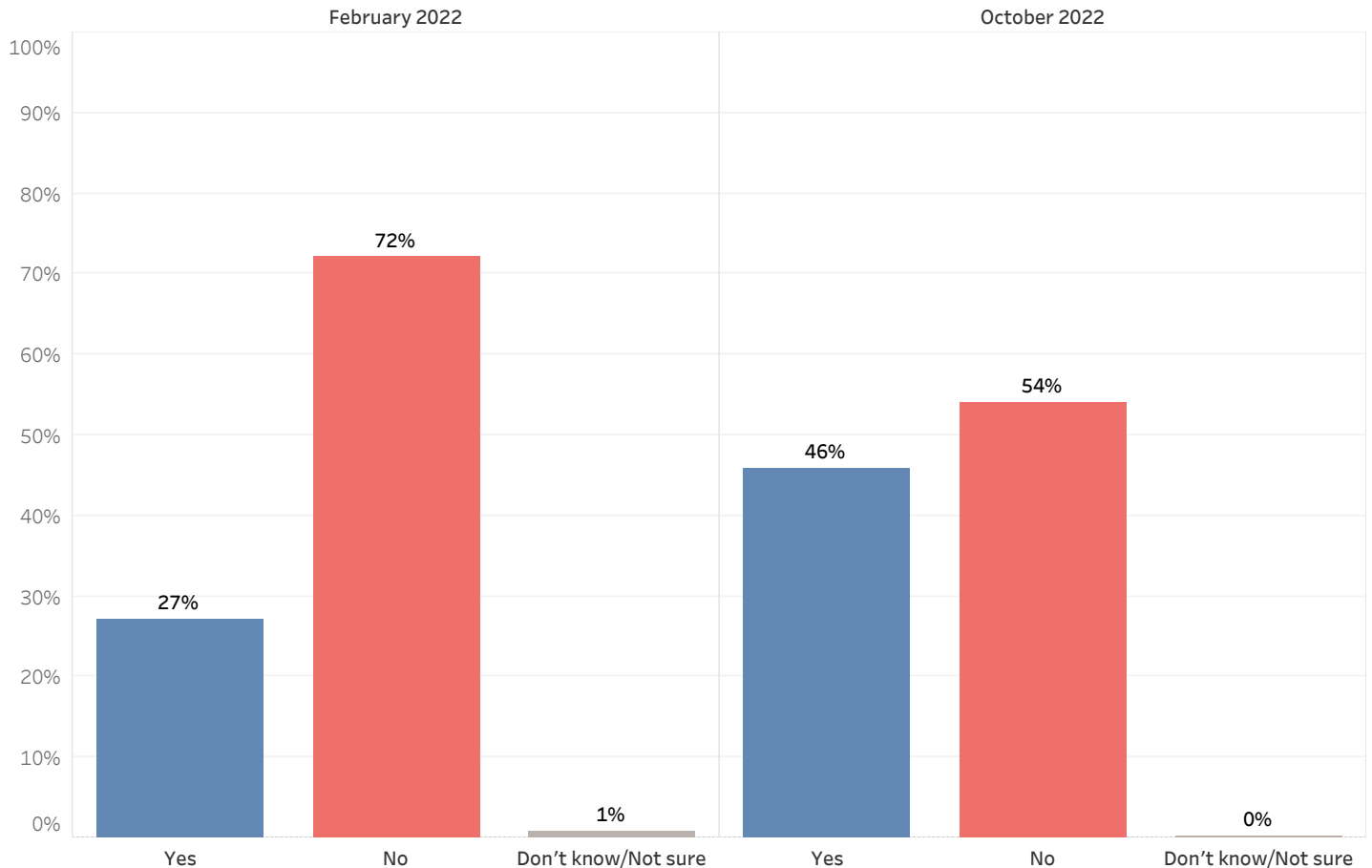
DURHAM, NH - Nearly half of New Hampshire residents say they have tested positive for COVID-19 at least once, up significantly since February. Seven in ten adults in the state say they are fully vaccinated and have received at least one booster. Nearly all who have not been vaccinated say they will not do so. Most who have received at least one booster plan to receive another within the next year. Stress related to the pandemic has declined since February but remains higher among women than men.

The COVID-19 Pandemic

Nearing the third anniversary of the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, 46% of New Hampshire adults say that they have tested positive for COVID-19 at least once since the beginning of the pandemic, 54% have never tested positive, and less than 1% don't know or are unsure. This represents a significant increase since February, when only 27% reported that they had ever tested positive.

Those aged 18-34 and women are more likely than others to report having tested positive at least once while those aged 35-49 and self-described conservatives are less likely to report having ever tested positive.

Ever Tested Positive for COVID-19

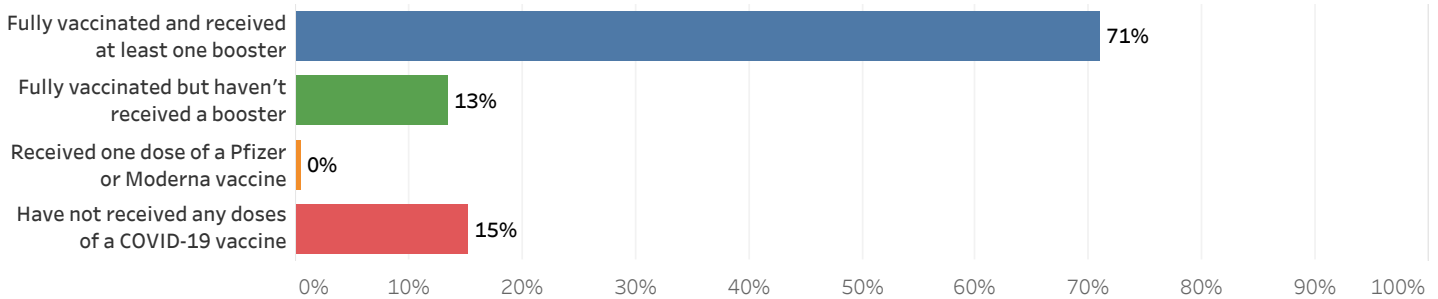

Seventy-one percent of New Hampshire residents say they are fully vaccinated and have received at least one booster, 13% are fully vaccinated but haven't received a booster, less than 1% are partially vaccinated, and 15% have not received any doses of a COVID-19 vaccine. The percentage who say they have not received any doses has remained stable for some time. Overall, 90% of Granite Staters indicate they have some protection from COVID-19, having either been vaccinated against it, tested positive, or both.

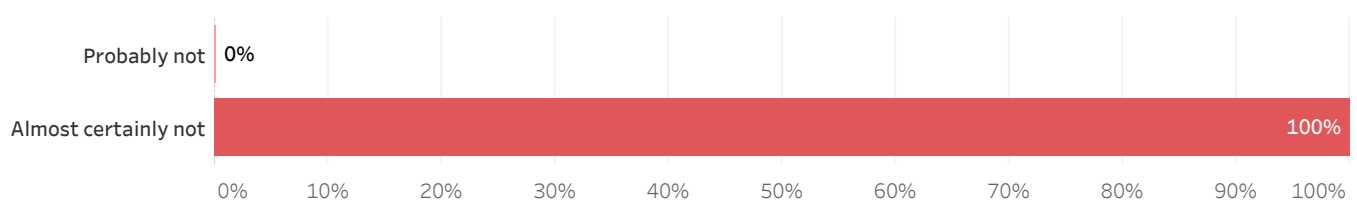
Nearly all self-identified Democrats (97%) are fully vaccinated and have received at least one booster but only 61% of Independents and 47% of Republicans are fully vaccinated and have received a booster. Among those aged sixty-five and older, 88% are vaccinated and boosted and only 7% have not received any COVID-19 vaccine, while among those aged 35-49, only 54% are vaccinated and boosted and 19% are not vaccinated at all.

COVID-19 Vaccination Status - October 2022



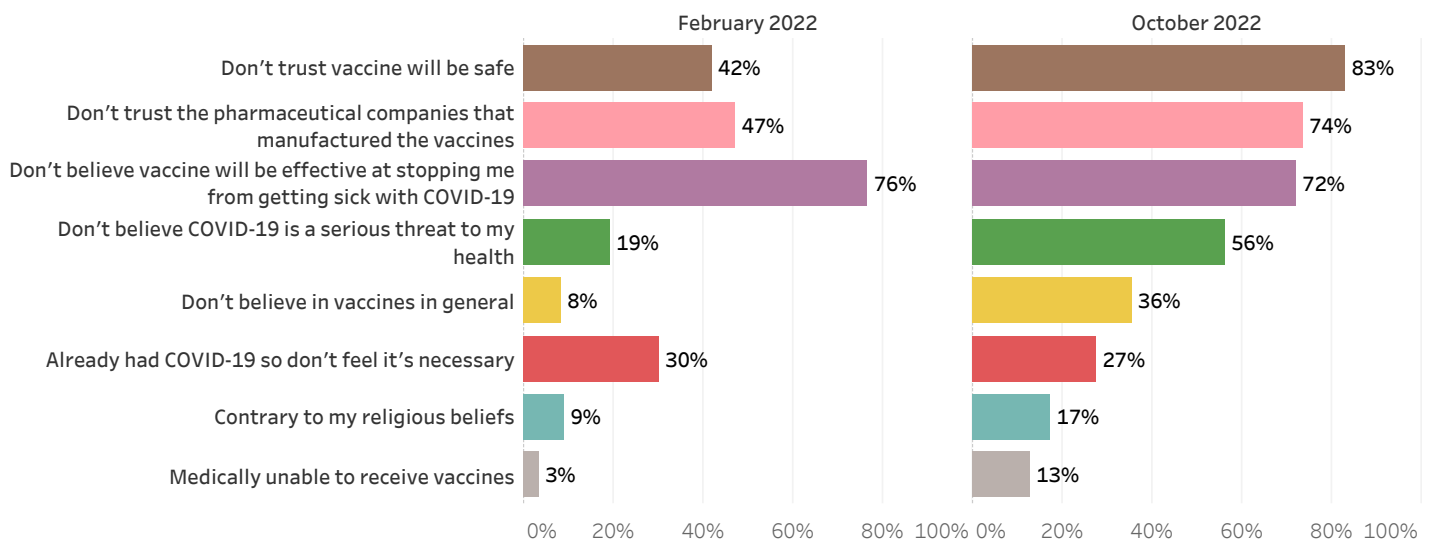
Among those who are unvaccinated against COVID-19 (N=146), nearly all (100%) say they will almost certainly not get vaccinated while less than 1% say they will probably not get vaccinated.

Likelihood Will Get COVID-19 Vaccine (Among those who are unvaccinated) - October 2022



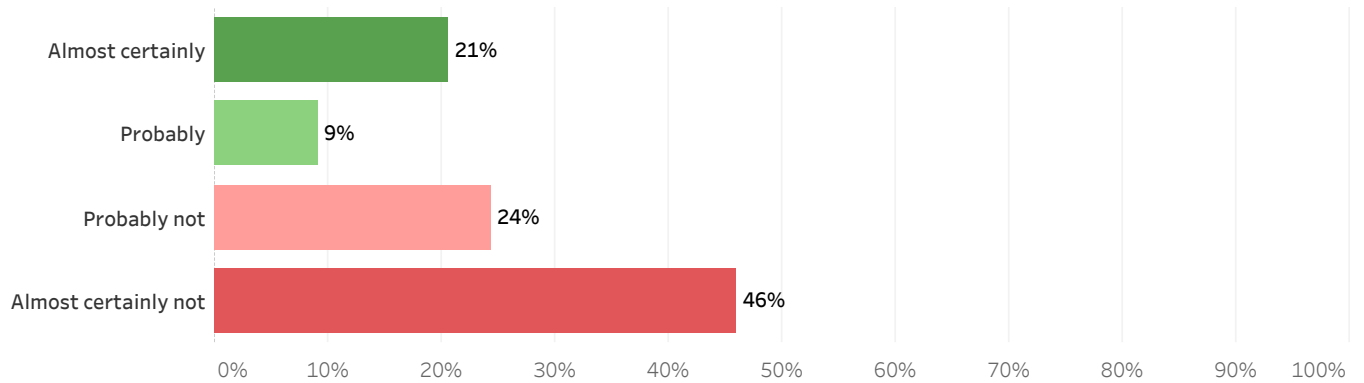
More than half say they are unlikely to get vaccinated because they don't trust the vaccine will be safe (83%), because they don't trust the pharmaceutical companies that manufactured it (74%), they don't believe the vaccine will be effective (72%), or they don't believe COVID-19 is a serious threat to their health (56%). Smaller numbers of people say they don't believe in vaccines in general (36%), that they already have had COVID-19 so they don't feel it's necessary (27%), that the vaccine is contrary to their religious beliefs (17%), or that they are medically unable to take vaccines (13%). Significantly more unvaccinated people than in February say they will not get vaccinated because they don't trust it will be safe, they don't trust the pharmaceutical companies, they don't believe COVID-19 is a serious threat to their health, or they don't believe in vaccines in general.

Why Unlikely to Get COVID-19 Vaccine (Select all that apply)



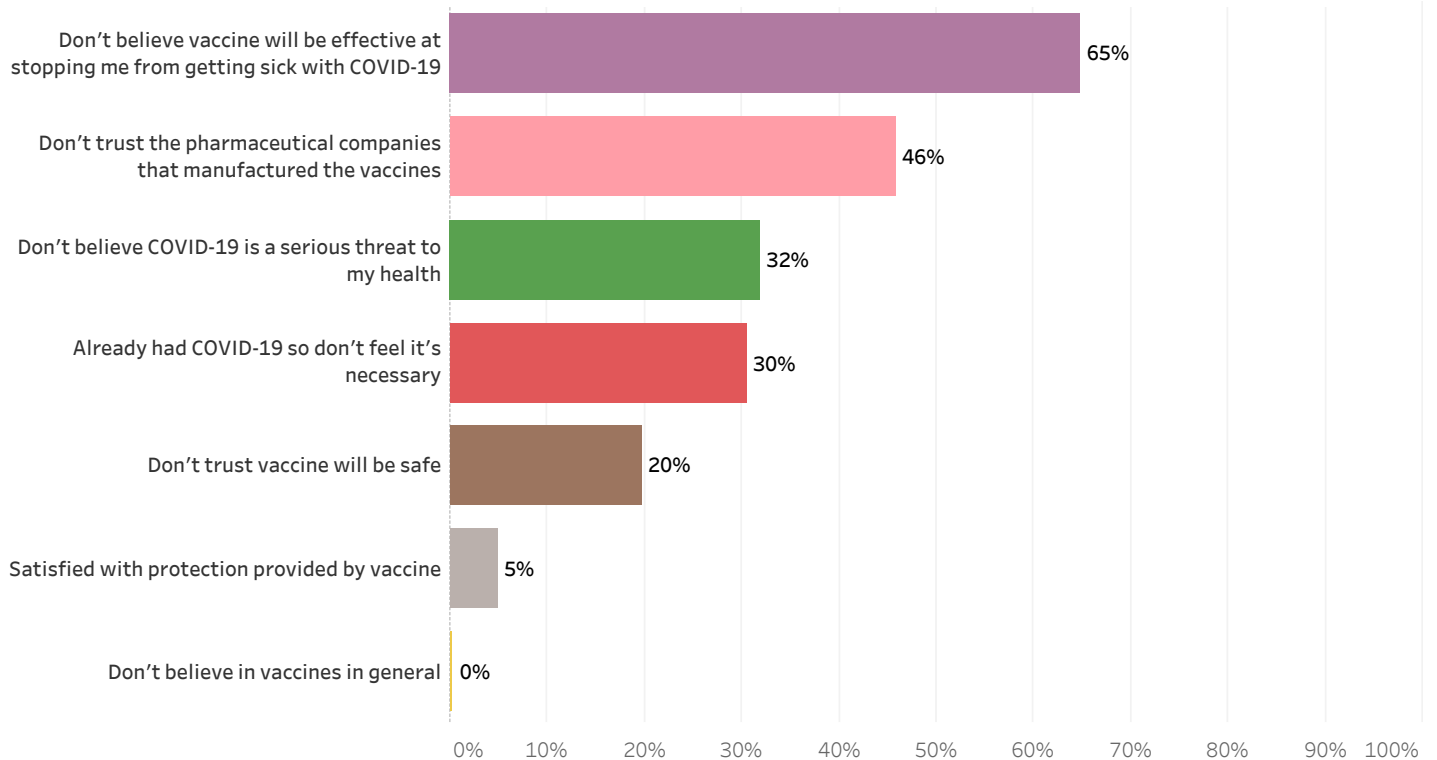
Among those who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 but have not received a booster (N=129), 21% say they will almost certainly get a booster, 9% say they will probably get one, 24% say they probably will not, and 46% say they will almost certainly not get a booster.

Likelihood Will Get COVID-19 Booster (Among those who are vaccinated but not boosted) - October 2022



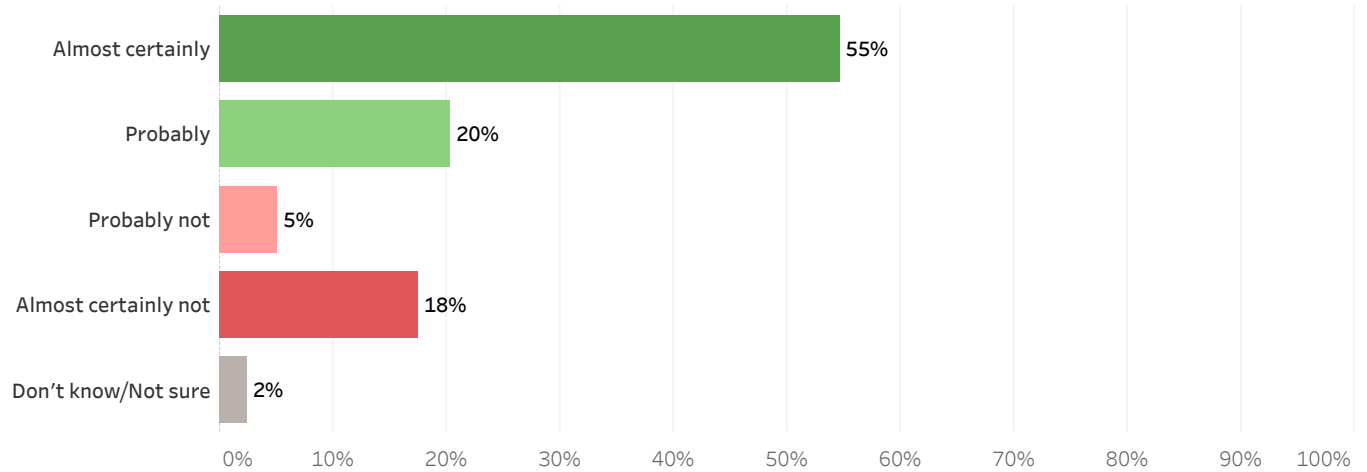
Among those who say they will probably not or almost certainly not get a COVID-19 booster (N=90), two-thirds (65%) say they are unlikely to do so because they don't believe the vaccine will be effective, 46% don't trust the pharmaceutical companies that manufactured the vaccines, 32% don't believe COVID-19 is a serious threat to their health, 30% say they have already had COVID-19 so they don't feel it is necessary, 20% don't trust that the vaccine will be safe, 5% say they are satisfied with the protection by the initial vaccine, and less than 1% don't believe in vaccines in general.

Why Unlikely to Get COVID-19 Booster (Select all that apply) - October 2022



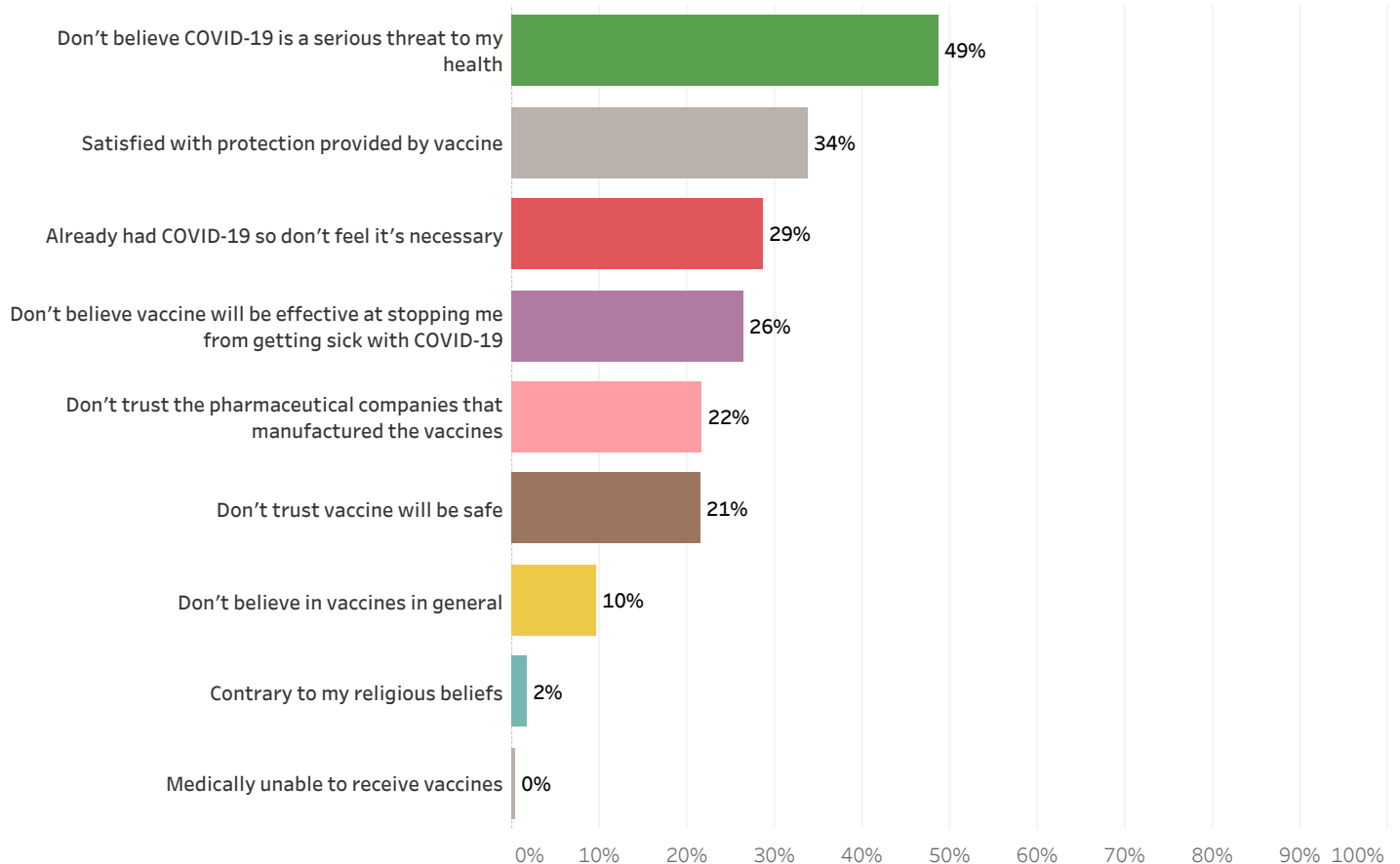
Among those who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 and have received at least one booster (N=682), 55% say they will almost certainly get another booster within the next year, 20% say they will probably get one in that time, 5% say they probably will not, 18% say they will almost certainly not get another booster, and 2% don't know or are unsure.

Likelihood Will Get Another Booster in Next Year (Among those who are vaccinated and boosted) - October 2022



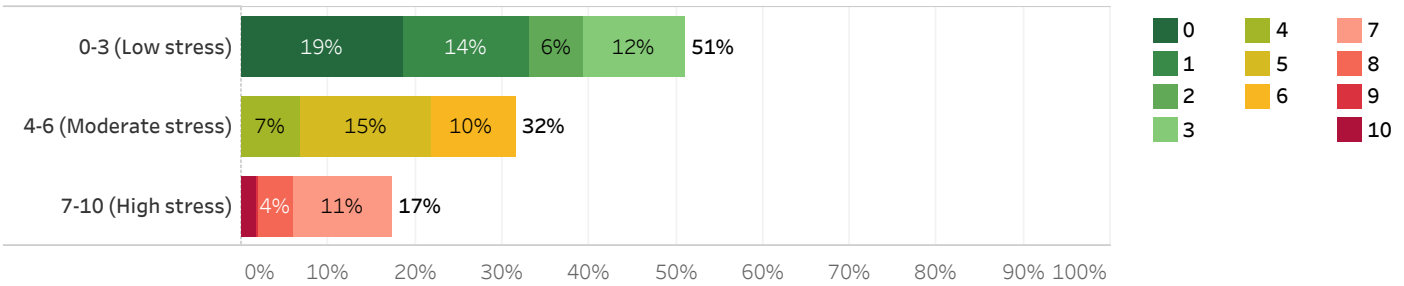
Among those who say they will probably not or almost certainly not get another COVID-19 booster (N=153), half (49%) say they are unlikely to do so because they don't believe COVID-19 is a serious threat to their health, while one-third (34%) say they are satisfied with the protection by the initial vaccine and booster, 29% say they have already had COVID-19 so they don't feel it is necessary, and 26% say they don't believe the vaccine will be effective. Less than a quarter say they are unlikely to get another booster because they don't trust the pharmaceutical companies that manufactured the vaccines (22%), because they don't trust the vaccine will be safe (21%), because they don't believe in vaccines in general (10%), because it is contrary to their religious beliefs (2%), or because they are medically unable to receive vaccines (<1%).

Why Unlikely to Get Another COVID-19 Booster (Select all that apply) - October 2022



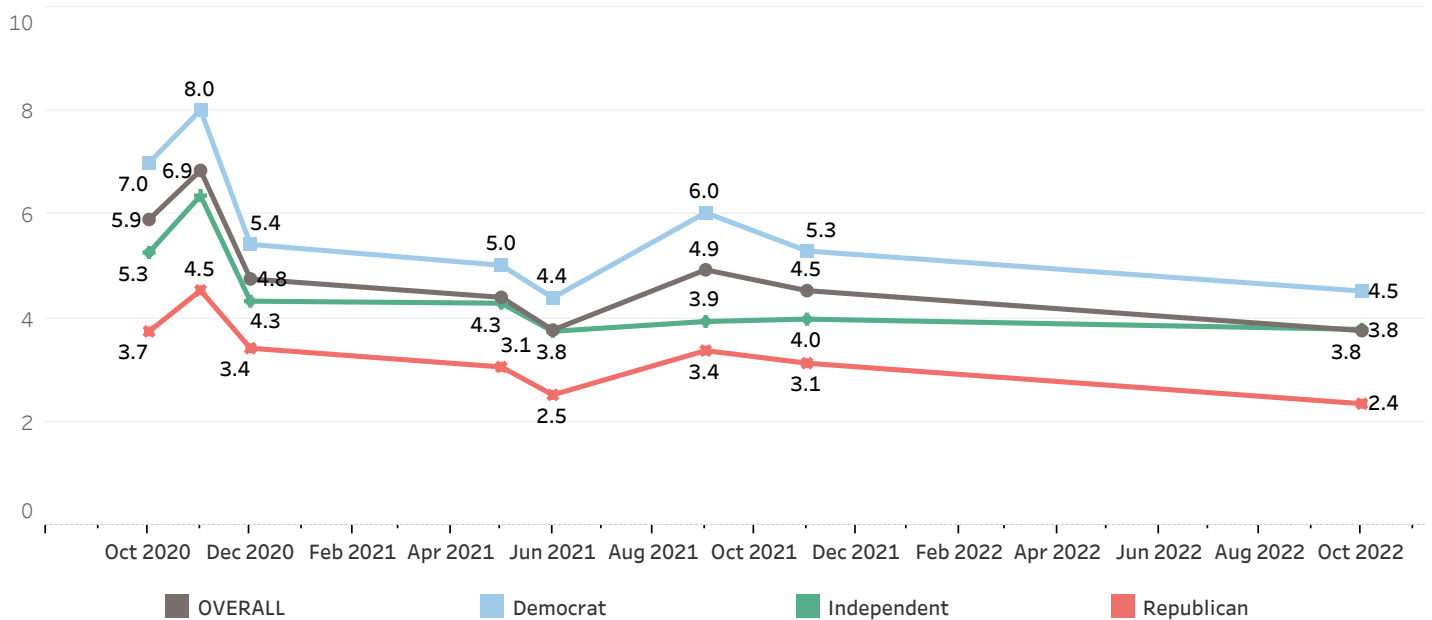
Half (51%) of New Hampshire adults place themselves at a 0, 1, 2, or 3 on a 0-10 scale rating their overall level of stress as a result of COVID-19, 32% report moderate stress (4, 5, or 6 on a 0-10 scale), and 17% report high stress (7, 8, 9, or 10 on a 0-10 scale).

General Stress Related to COVID-19 - October 2022



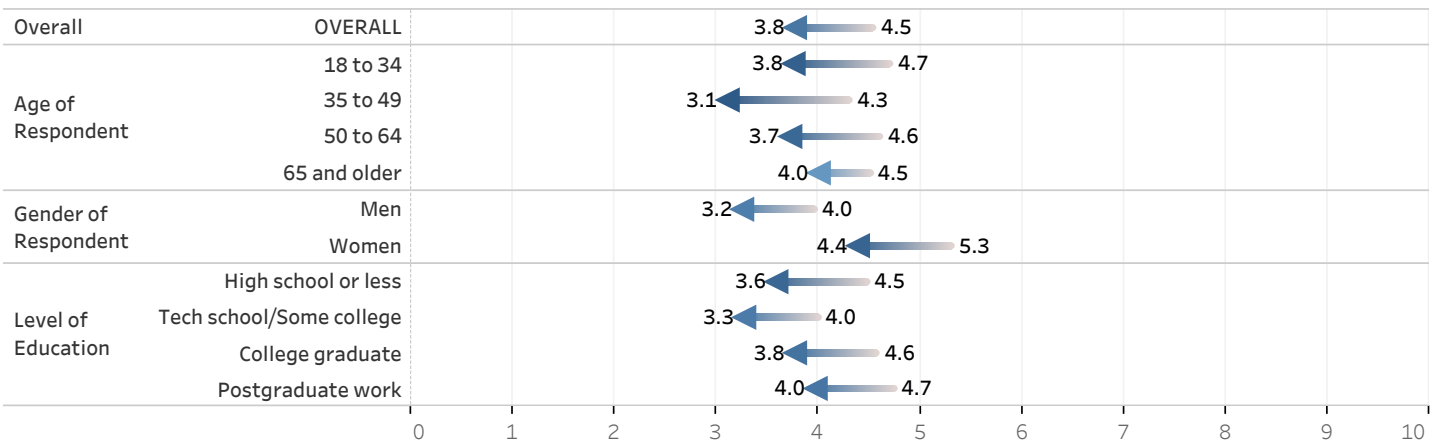
The average New Hampshire resident reports experiencing stress related to the COVID-19 pandemic of 3.8 on a 0-10 scale, down from 4.5 in November 2021 and down from 5.9 in October 2020. Democrats (4.5) remain more stressed as a result of COVID-19 than Independents (3.8) or Republicans (2.4).

General Stress Related to COVID-19 - By Party ID



Average stress about the COVID-19 pandemic has declined since November 2021 most significantly among those aged 35 to 49 (-1.2) but has declined only marginally among those aged sixty-five and older (-.5). Stress has declined among both men (-.7) and women (-.9) since November but women remain more stressed about COVID-19 than men.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred sixty-six (966) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between October 13 and October 17, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the October 2022 Granite State Poll is 27%. The design effect for the survey is 2.8%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,250 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
