## GRANITE STATERS BELIEVE TEACHERS UNDERPAID; MANY THINK NH SCHOOLS TEACH CRITICAL RACE THEORY

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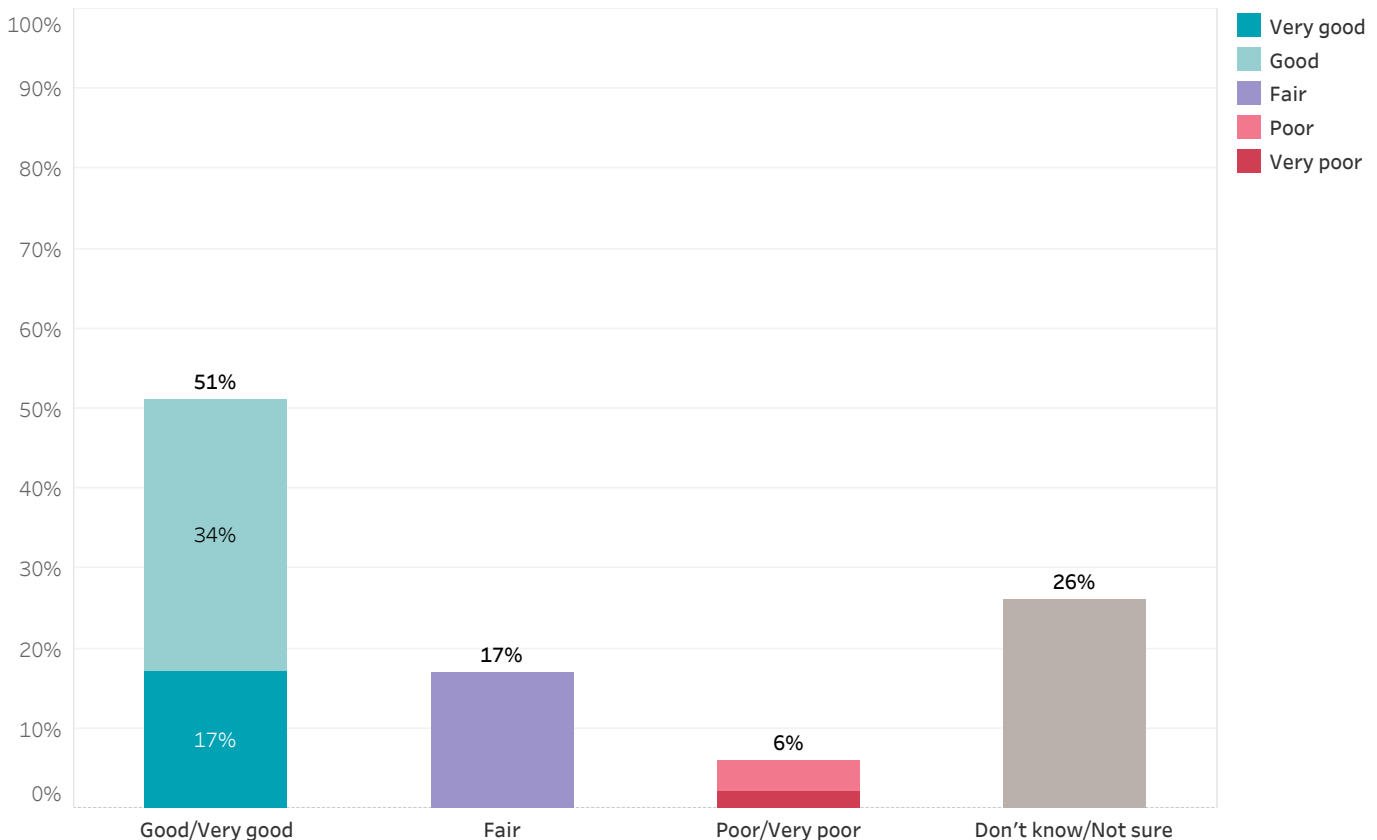
DURHAM, NH - Half of New Hampshire residents think local teachers are underpaid and bipartisan pluralities support raising their pay even if their local school budget increased. Most residents think that parents or guardians should have primary responsibility for sexual education of children but that the local school should also play a role. Four in ten Granite Staters believe critical race theory is being taught at least to some degree in primary schools, while a large percentage believe it is taught in colleges and universities in the state. Only one-third of state residents support the 2021 law banning the teaching of "divisive concepts" in public schools in the state.

### New Hampshire Teachers

Half (51%) of New Hampshire residents believe the quality of teachers at their local school district is good (34%) or very good (17%), 17% describe them as fair, 6% describe them as poor (4%) or very poor (2%), and 26% don't know or are unsure. Parents with kids in school rate the quality of teachers significantly lower than people without kids in school. Seventy-nine percent of state residents without a K-12 student in their household think their local school district's teachers are very good or good, but only 46% of those with at least one K-12 student in their household agree.

Self-identified Democrats, progressives, those aged 65 and older, and Seacoast and Massachusetts Border residents rate their local school district's teachers highest, while self-described libertarians and conservatives give their local teachers the lowest ratings.

Quality of Local School District Teachers - October 2022

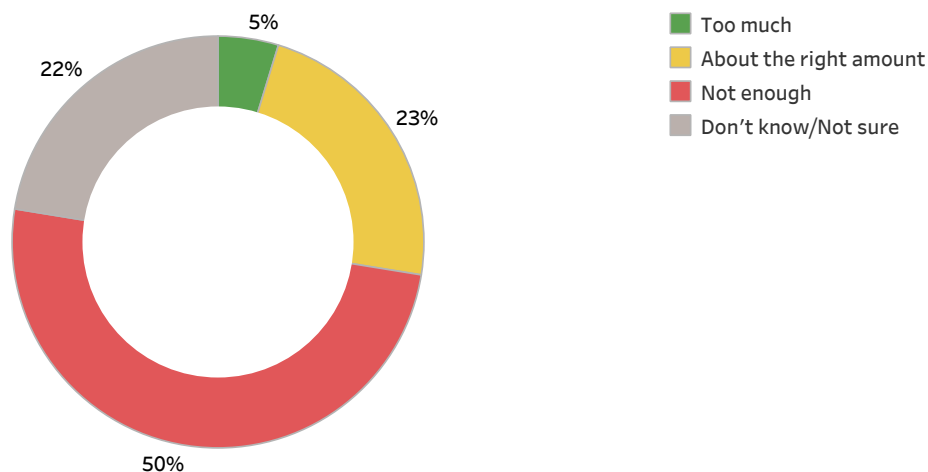

Half (50%) of Granite Staters think that teachers in their local school district are not paid enough, 23% think they are paid about the right amount, 5% think they are paid too much, and 22% are unsure. Those who believe that the quality of their local district's teachers is poor or very poor are slightly more likely to say that local teachers are overpaid than those who think their local district's teachers are good or very good.

Opinion on teacher pay divides on partisan lines. Self-identified Democrats and self-described liberals, socialists, and progressives are most likely to say that teachers in their local school district are not paid enough while self-identified Republicans and self-described conservatives and libertarians are least likely to say this.

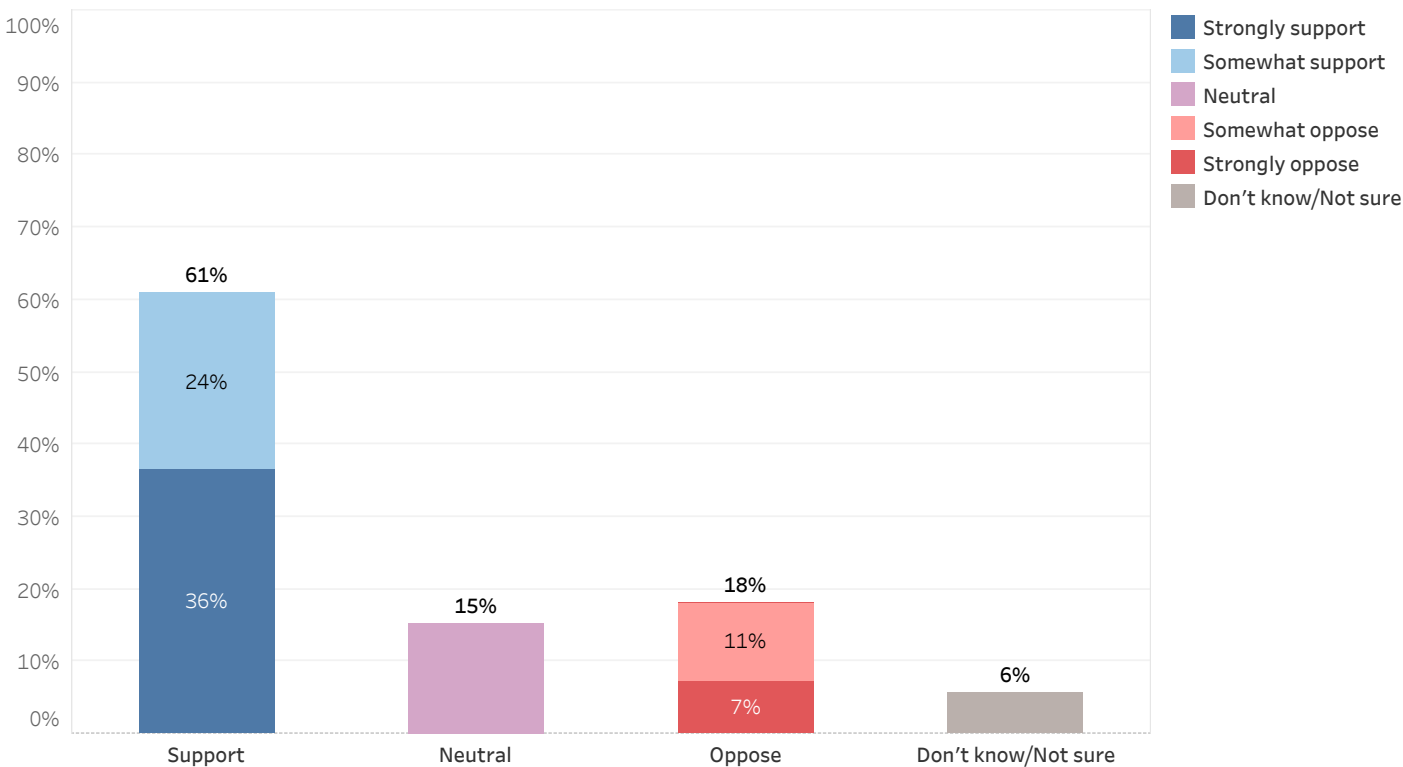
**Local School District Teacher Pay Too High or Too Low - October 2022**



Six in ten (61%) New Hampshire residents strongly (36%) or somewhat (24%) support their local school district raising teacher pay, even if it meant increasing the overall school district budget, 18% strongly (7%) or somewhat (11%) oppose raising teacher pay, 15% are neutral, and 6% are unsure. Nearly three-quarters (73%) of those who believe their local district has very good or good teachers support raising teacher pay but 76% of those who believe their local district has poor or very poor teachers oppose it.

A majority of Democrats (83%) and pluralities of Independents (48%) and Republicans (40%) support raising teacher pay.

**Support or Oppose Local School District Raising Teacher Pay Even if Budget Rises - October 2022**

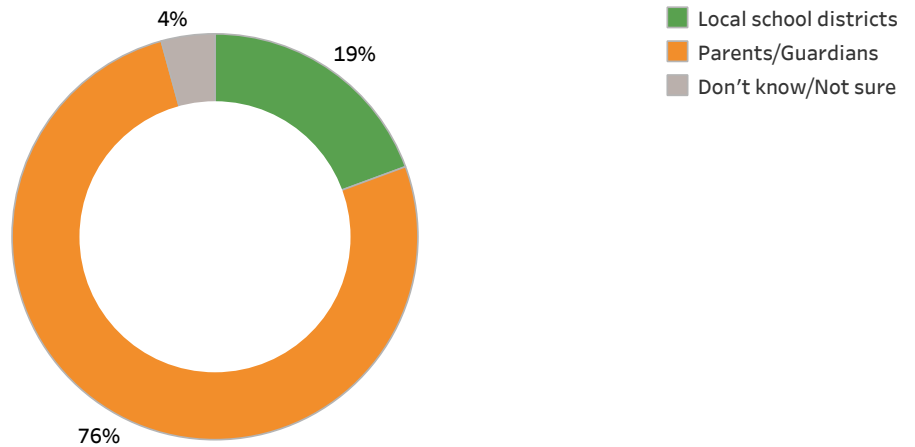


### Sexual Education in Schools

Concern over what is taught in public schools has been an issue in recent elections, both in New Hampshire and across the country, and who should teach children about sex has been an ongoing source of controversy. Three-quarters (76%) of Granite Staters believe parents or guardians should have primary responsibility for the sexual education of children, 19% think local school districts should take primary responsibility and 4% are unsure.

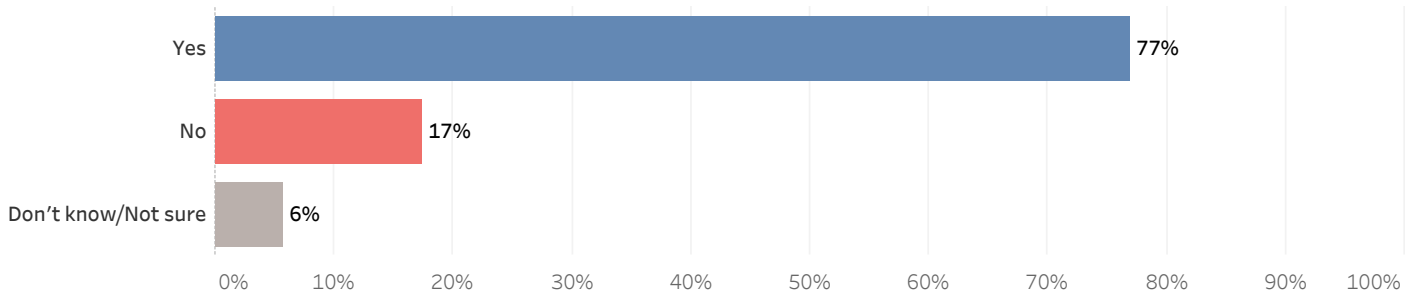
Self-identified Republicans and Independents, self-described libertarians and conservatives, people with a high school degree or less education, and North Country residents are most likely to say that parents or guardians should have primary responsibility, while self-identified Democrats, self-described socialists and progressives, and people under the age of thirty-five are most likely to say that school districts should have primary responsibility.

**Who Should Have Primary Responsibility for Sex Ed - October 2022**



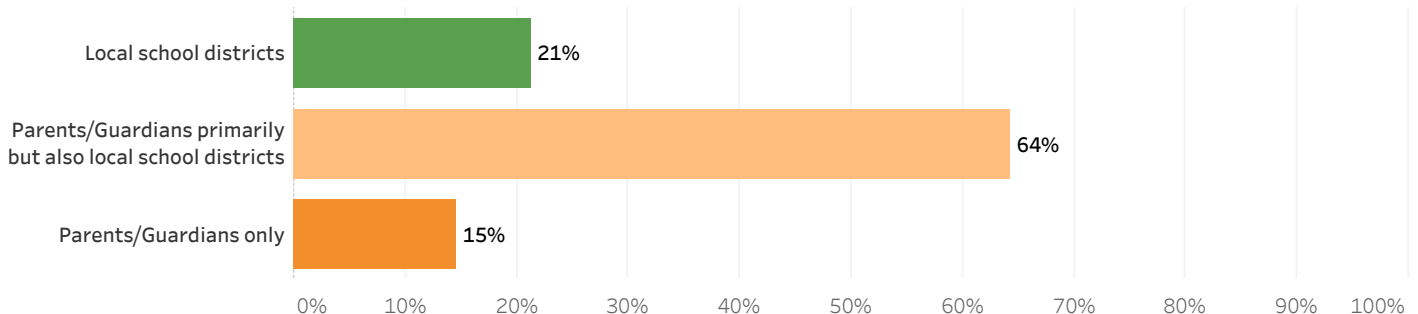
Among those who think that parents or guardians should take primary responsibility for sex ed (N=737), 77% think that sex ed should be taught in schools, 17% don't think it should be taught in school at all, and 6% are unsure.

Overall, 21% of Granite Staters who have an opinion think that local school districts should have primary responsibility for sexual education for children, 64% think parents or guardians should have primary responsibility but that school districts should also play a role, and 15% think that only parents or guardians should teach sex ed to children and schools should play no role at all.

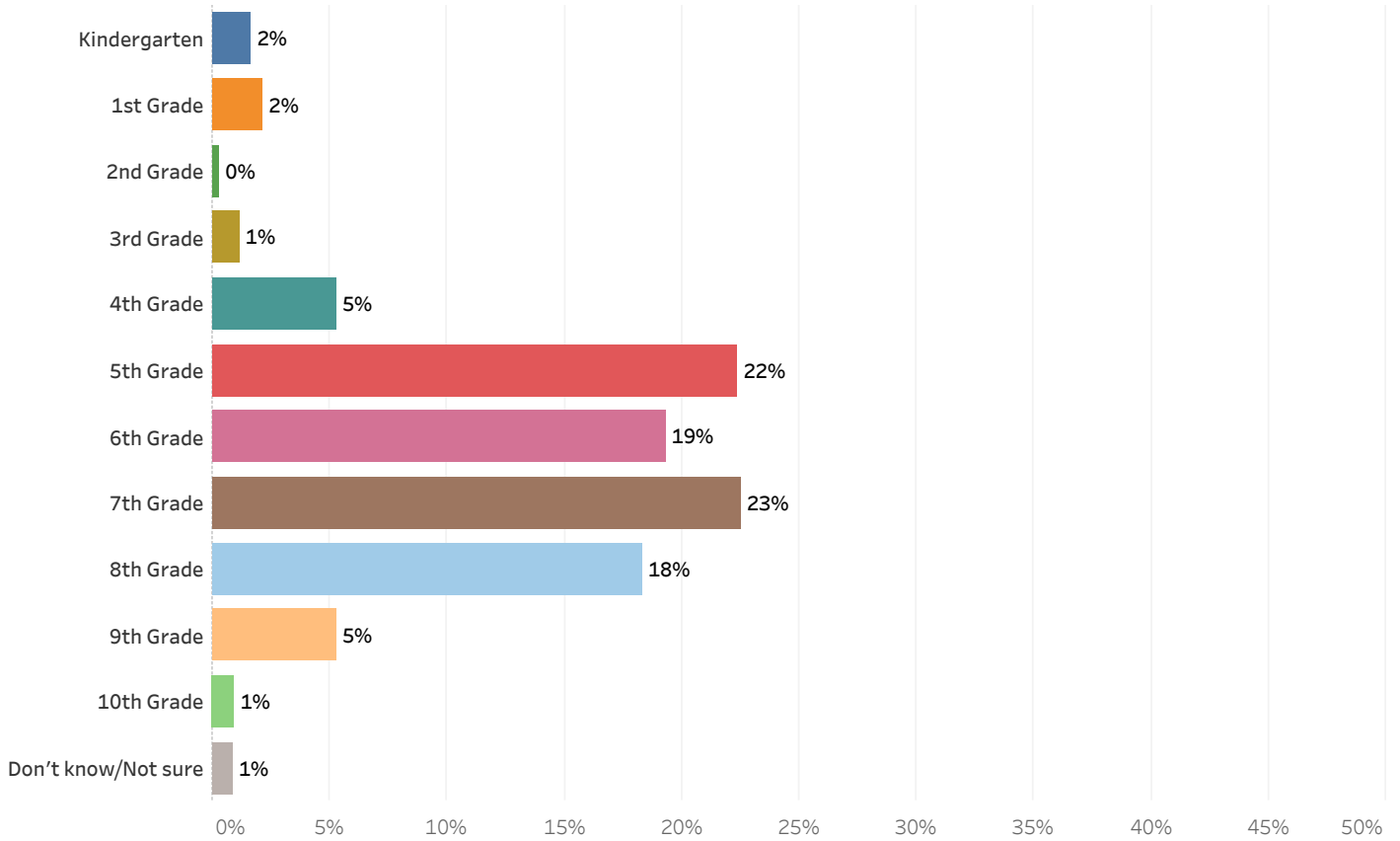
**Who Should Have Primary Responsibility for Sex Ed - October 2022**



Among people who think that sex ed should be taught in schools (N=746), very few believe sex education should begin in elementary schools. Only 10% think sex ed should be taught in kindergarten or grades 1 to 4, 82% think it should be taught in grades 5-8, 6% think it should begin in 9th or 10th grade, and 1% are unsure.

A majority of self-identified Democrats, self-described progressives and liberals, and those who have completed a postgraduate degree think sex education should begin in 5th grade or earlier, while a majority of Republicans believe it should begin in 7th grade or later.

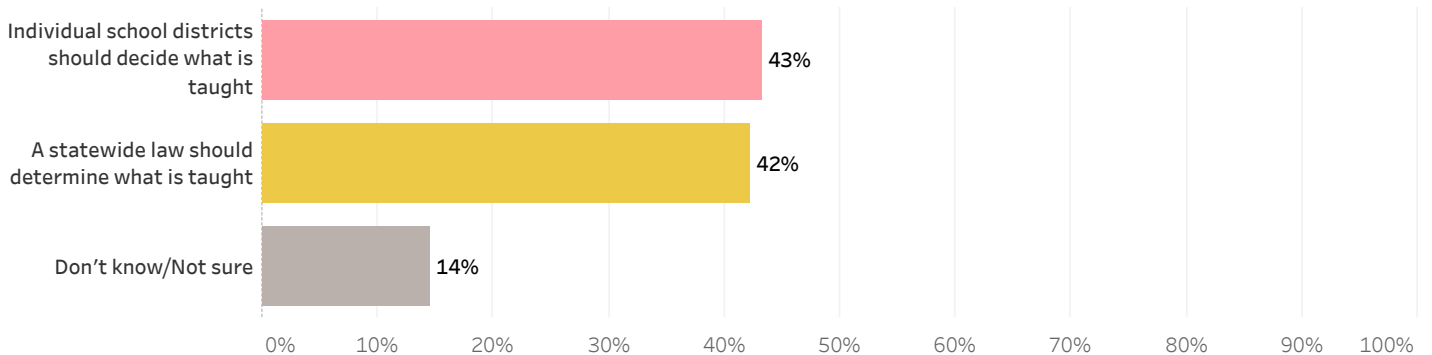
**When Should Sex Ed Be Taught - October 2022**



Granite Staters are split over who should determine school policy on teaching of sexual orientation and gender identity. Forty-three percent think individual school districts should decide what is taught, 42% think a statewide law should determine what is taught, and 14% are unsure.

A majority of Independents (69%) believe individual school districts should determine what is taught, but less than half of Democrats (42%) or Republicans (38%) believe a statewide law should determine what is taught. Majorities of self-described conservatives (66%) and socialists (65%) believe a statewide law should determine what is taught, but majorities of liberals (62%), moderates (56%), and libertarians (54%) think individual school districts should decide.

**Should State or Local School Boards Determine School Policy on Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity - October 2022**

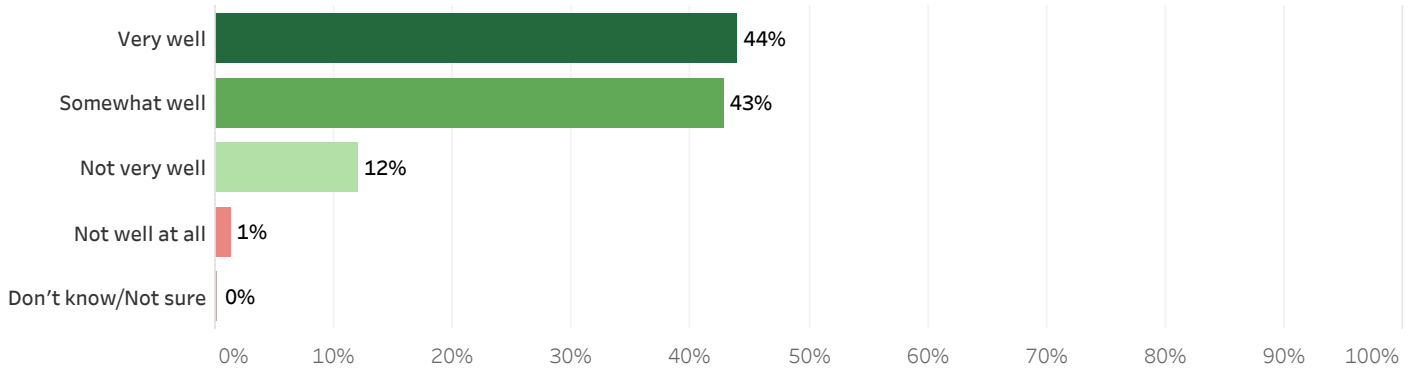


### Critical Race Theory & Divisive Concepts

The teaching of critical race theory (CRT) has become a hot button issue in recent state elections. Nine in ten (91%) New Hampshire residents say they have heard a lot (56%) or some (35%) about critical race theory. Forty-four percent of Granite Staters say they understand the concept of critical race theory very well, 43% say they understand it somewhat well, 12% say they do not understand it very well, 1% say they do not understand it well at all, and less than 1% are unsure.

Half of self-identified Republicans and Independents and men say that they understand critical race theory very well but only one-third of self-identified Democrats and women say the same.

**How Well Feel You Understand Critical Race Theory - October 2022**

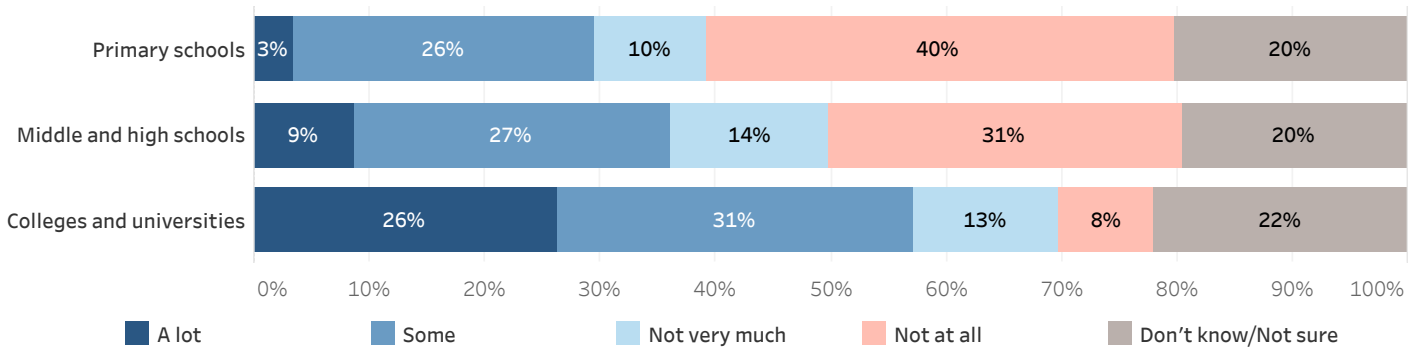


Only 3% of Granite Staters think that critical race theory is taught a lot in primary schools in the state, while 26% think there is some teaching of it, 10% think there is not very much, 40% don't think it is taught at all in primary schools, and 20% don't know or are unsure.

In middle and high schools in the state, 9% think that critical race theory is taught a lot, 27% think there is some teaching of it, 14% think there is not very much, 31% don't think it is taught at all, and 20% don't know or are unsure.

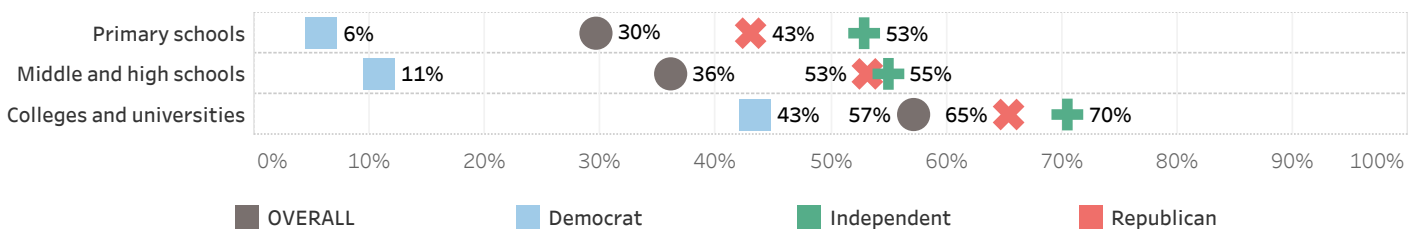
In colleges and universities in the state, 26% think that critical race theory is taught a lot, 31% think there is some teaching of it, 13% think there is not very much, 8% don't think it is taught at all, and 22% don't know or are unsure.

Perceptions of where CRT is taught varies greatly by partisanship. Few self-identified Democrats think that critical race theory is taught a lot or some in primary, middle, or high schools in the state, but half of Republicans and Independents believe this to be the case. There is less disagreement by partisanship about it being taught in colleges and universities, where at least four in ten of all three groups believe it is taught a lot or some.

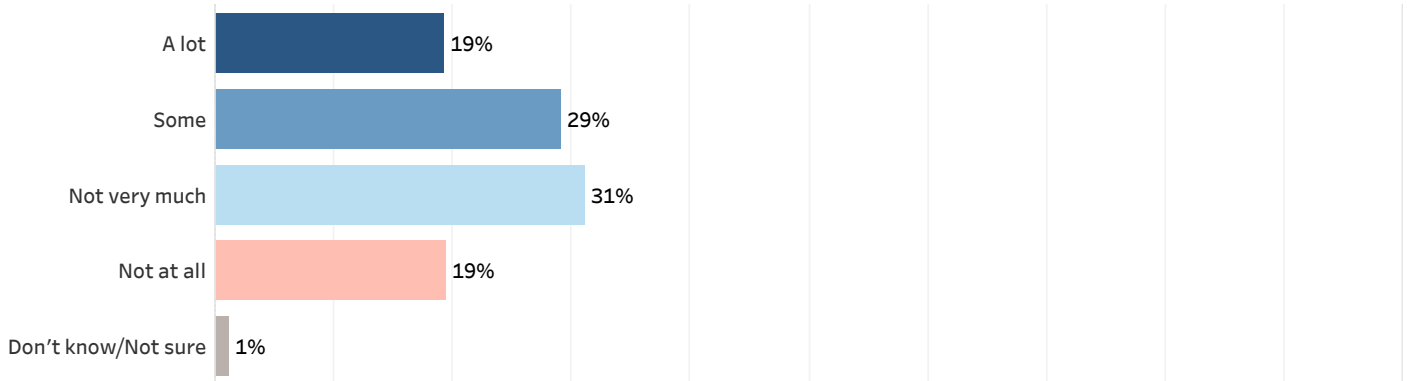
**Believe Critical Race Theory is Taught a Lot or Some in Following Places in NH - October 2022 - By Party ID**



In June 2021, New Hampshire passed a law banning the teaching of "divisive concepts" in public schools in the state.

Only 19% of Granite Staters say they have heard a lot about this law, 29% have heard some about it, 31% have heard not very much, 19% have not heard about it at all, and 1% don't know or are unsure.

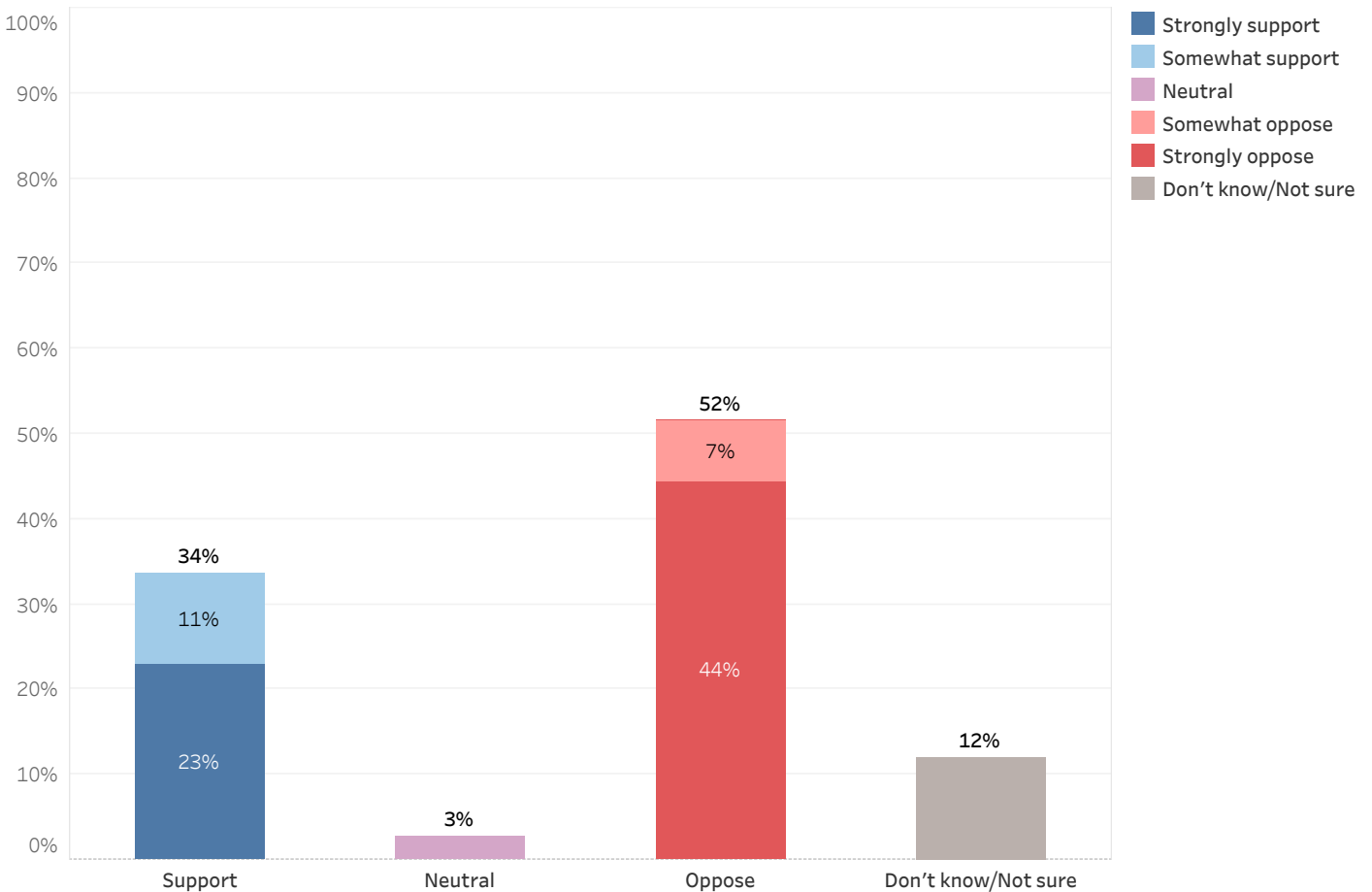
**How Much Heard About 2021 NH Divisive Concepts Law - October 2022**



Among those who say they have heard about this law (N=766), just over half (52%) say they are strongly (44%) or somewhat (7%) opposed to the law, 34% percent strongly (23%) or somewhat (11%) support the law, 3% are neutral, and 12% are unsure. Shortly after its passage in July 2021, Granite Staters were more divided, with 42% in support and 44% opposed.

Nearly two-thirds (64%) of those who believe their local school district has good or very good teachers oppose the law but 71% of those who believe their local teachers are poor or very poor support it. The great majority of Democrats (93%) and a majority of Independents (57%) oppose this law but 63% of Republicans support it.

## Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Nine hundred sixty-six (966) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between October 13 and October 17, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.2 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the October 2022 Granite State Poll is 27%. The design effect for the survey is 2.8%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,250 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
