## MAINE CD2 TOO CLOSE TO CALL, MILLS MAINTAINS LEAD OVER LEPAGE, PINGREE HOLDS LARGE LEAD IN CD1

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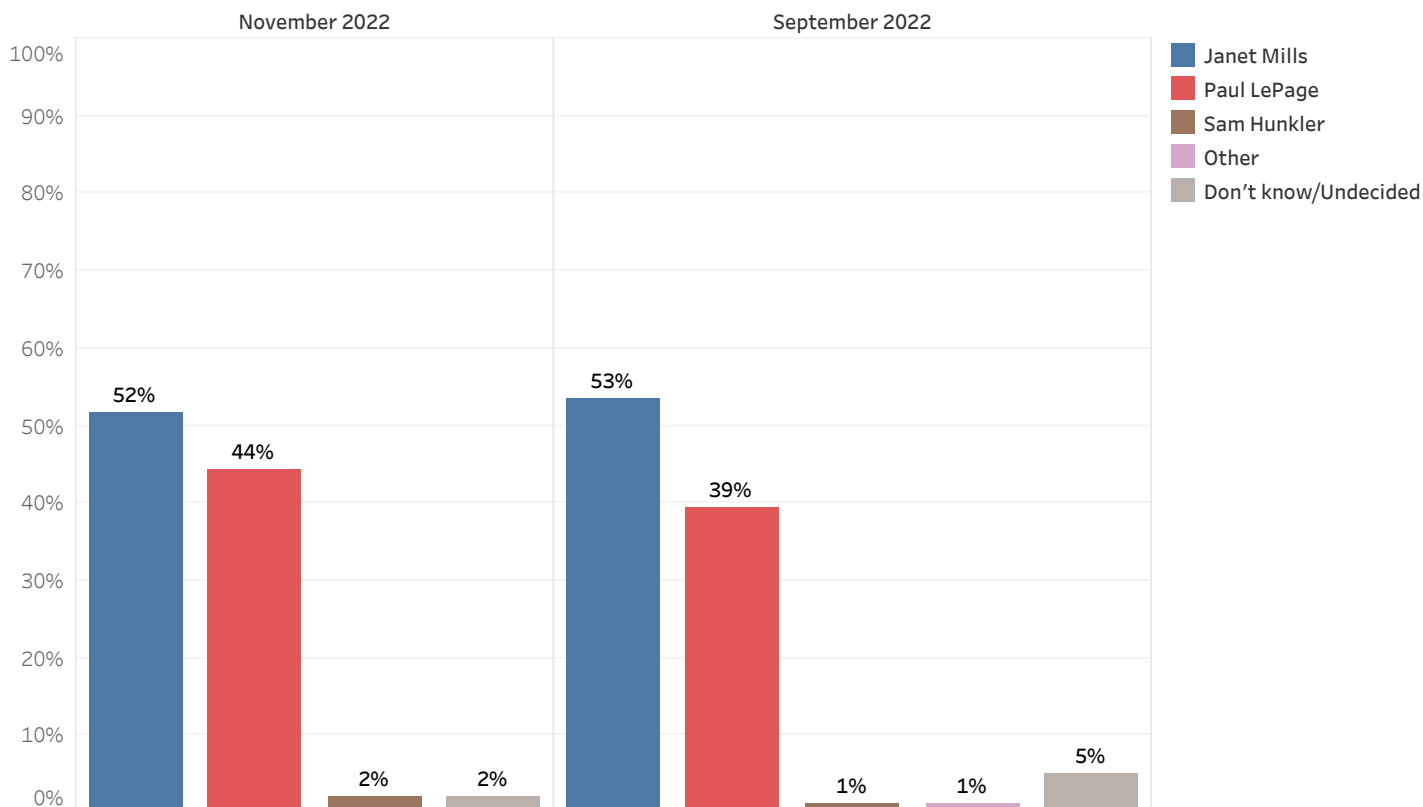
DURHAM, NH - Maine Governor Janet Mills continues to hold a lead over former Governor Paul LePage only days away from Tuesday's election. In the Second Congressional District, ranked-choice voting could be decisive as Democratic incumbent Jared Golden is tied with former Republican Congressman Bruce Poliquin, but neither have a majority. In the First Congressional District, incumbent Democrat Chellie Pingree holds a sizeable lead over Republican nominee Ed Thelander.

### 2022 Maine Gubernatorial Election

Seeking a second term in office, Maine Democratic Governor Janet Mills holds a lead over her Republican opponent, former Governor Paul LePage. If the election for Governor were held today, 52% of likely Maine voters say they would vote for Mills, 44% would vote for LePage, 2% would vote for Independent Sam Hunkler, and 2% are undecided.

The race has tightened somewhat since September, when Mills held a fourteen-point lead. Nearly all (98%) Democrats support Mills, largely unchanged since September (97%), while 96% of Republicans support LePage, up from 86% in September. Independents slightly favor LePage, with 45% indicating they will vote for the former Governor, 34% supporting Mills, and 8% supporting Hunkler. The vast majority of Mills (97%) and LePage (95%) supporters say they have definitely decided who they will vote for or have already voted. Mills is far more personally popular among Mainers, with a net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) of +5, compared to LePage's net favorability rating of -14.

### 2022 ME Gubernatorial Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)



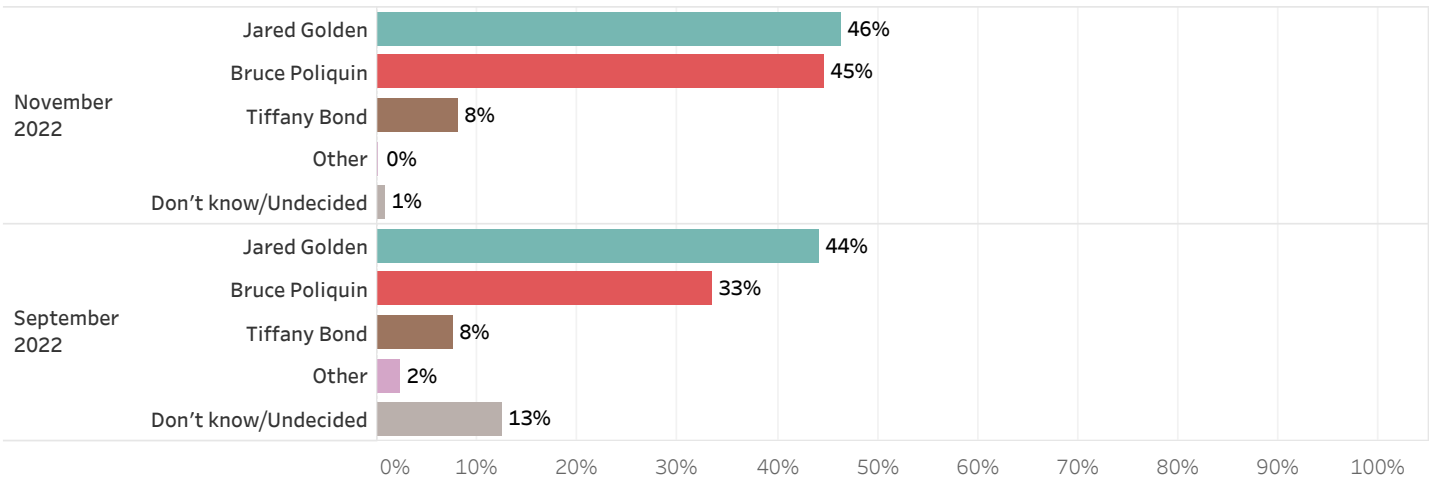

## 2022 Maine Second Congressional District Election

Democratic incumbent Jared Golden is locked in a statistical tie with his Republican challenger, former Congressman Bruce Poliquin, in Maine's Second Congressional District. If the election were held today, 46% of likely voters say they would vote for Golden, 45% would vote for Poliquin, 8% would vote for Independent Tiffany Bond, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 1% are undecided. As neither Golden nor Poliquin have support from a majority of voters, this election is likely to be decided by Maine's ranked-choice election voting system, as it was in 2018.

The race has tightened considerably since September, when Golden led Poliquin by eleven percentage points. Ninety-four percent of Democrats support Golden, up from 88% in September, while 93% of Republicans support Poliquin, up from 69% in September. Independents are divided, with 36% supporting Golden, 32% supporting Poliquin, and 32% supporting Bond. Ninety-two percent of Golden supporters have definitely decided or have already voted, while 83% of Poliquin supporters and only 49% of Bond supporters say the same. Both Golden (-13) and Poliquin (-24) are unpopular among Second District residents, while Bond is unknown to more than three-quarters (78%) of residents.

**2022 ME Second Congressional District Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)**

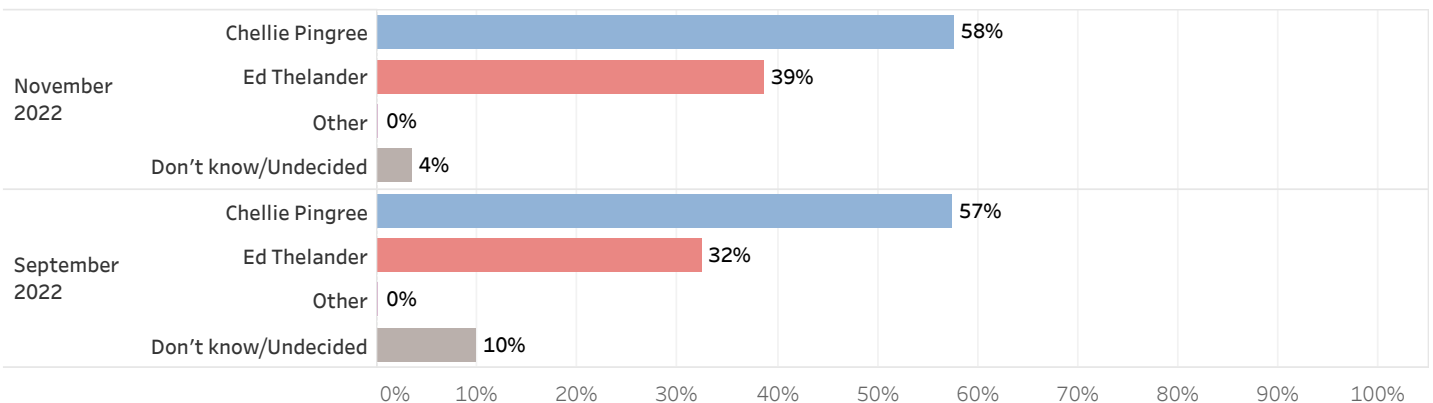


## 2022 Maine First Congressional District Election

Democratic incumbent Chellie Pingree holds a clear lead over her Republican opponent, retired Navy SEAL Ed Thelander, in Maine's First Congressional District. If the election were held today, 58% of likely voters say they would vote for Pingree, 39% would vote for Thelander, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 4% are undecided.

The race has narrowed only very slightly since September, when Pingree held a twenty-five point lead over Thelander. Democrats remain united behind their candidate while Republicans have increasingly united around Thelander; >99% of Democrats support Pingree, largely unchanged since September (95%), while 87% of Republicans support Thelander, up from 79% in September. Independents lean towards Pingree, with 50% supporting her while 45% support Thelander. Nearly all (97%) Pingree supporters have definitely decided or have already voted, but only 80% of Thelander supporters say the same. Pingree is more personally popular among First District residents, with a net favorability rating of +12, while Thelander has a net favorability rating of -7 and is unknown to nearly half (45%) of residents.

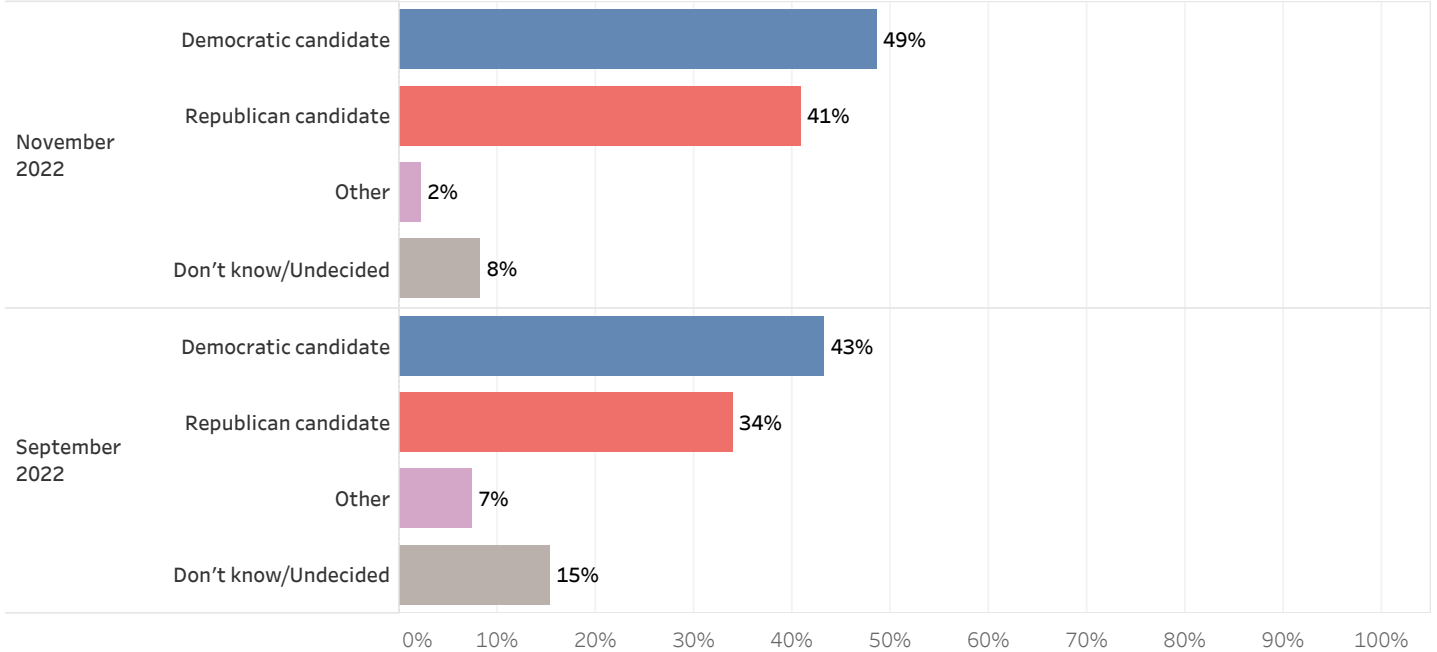
**2022 ME First Congressional District Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)**



### 2022 Maine House of Representatives Election

When asked the party of the State House of Representatives candidate they would vote for if the election were held today, 49% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 41% say they would vote for the Republican candidate, 2% would vote for another candidate, and 8% are undecided. The race is largely unchanged since September, when 43% said they supported the Democratic candidate, 34% supported the Republican candidate, and 15% were undecided.

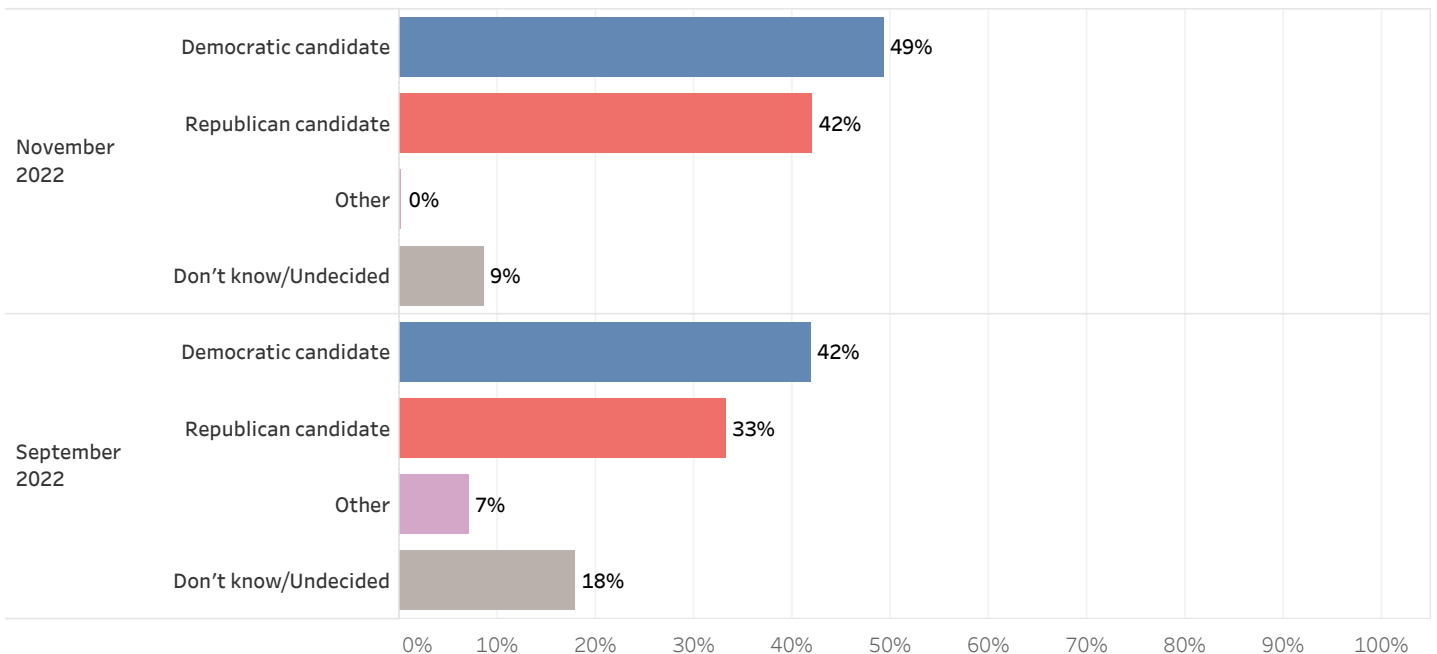
#### 2022 ME State House Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)



### 2022 Maine State Senate Election

When asked the party of the State Senate candidate they would vote for if the election were held today, 49% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 42% would vote for the Republican candidate, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 9% are undecided. In September, 42% said they planned to vote for the Democratic candidate, 33% planned to vote for the Republican candidate, and 18% were undecided.

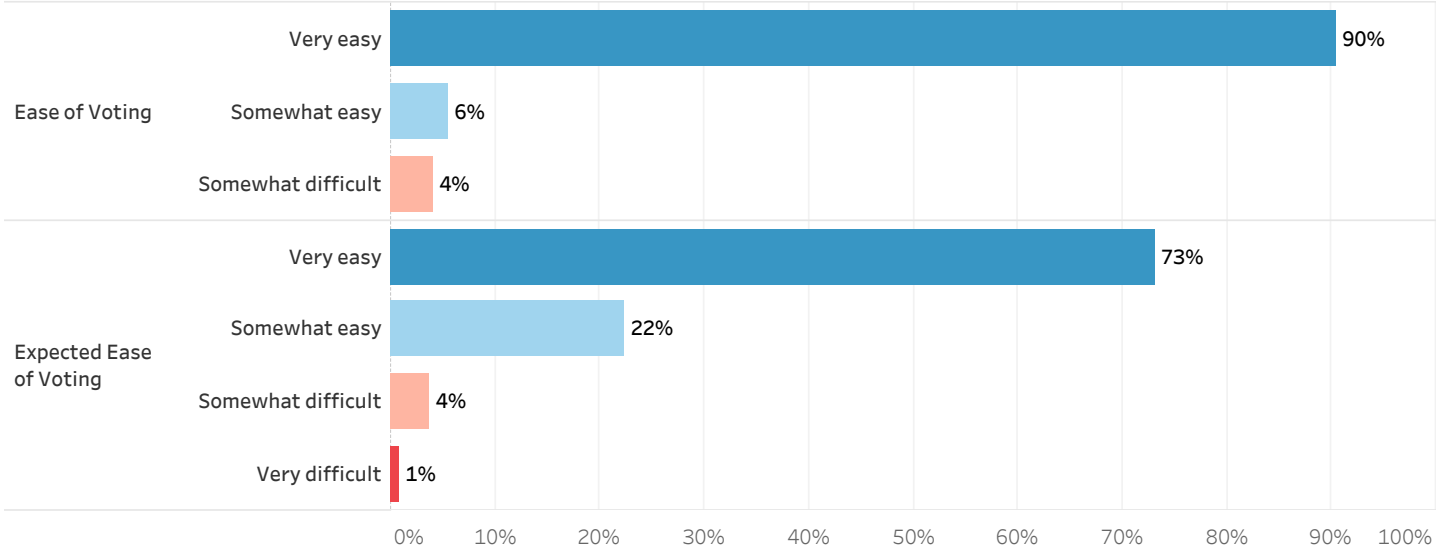
#### 2022 ME State Senate Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)



## Election Integrity

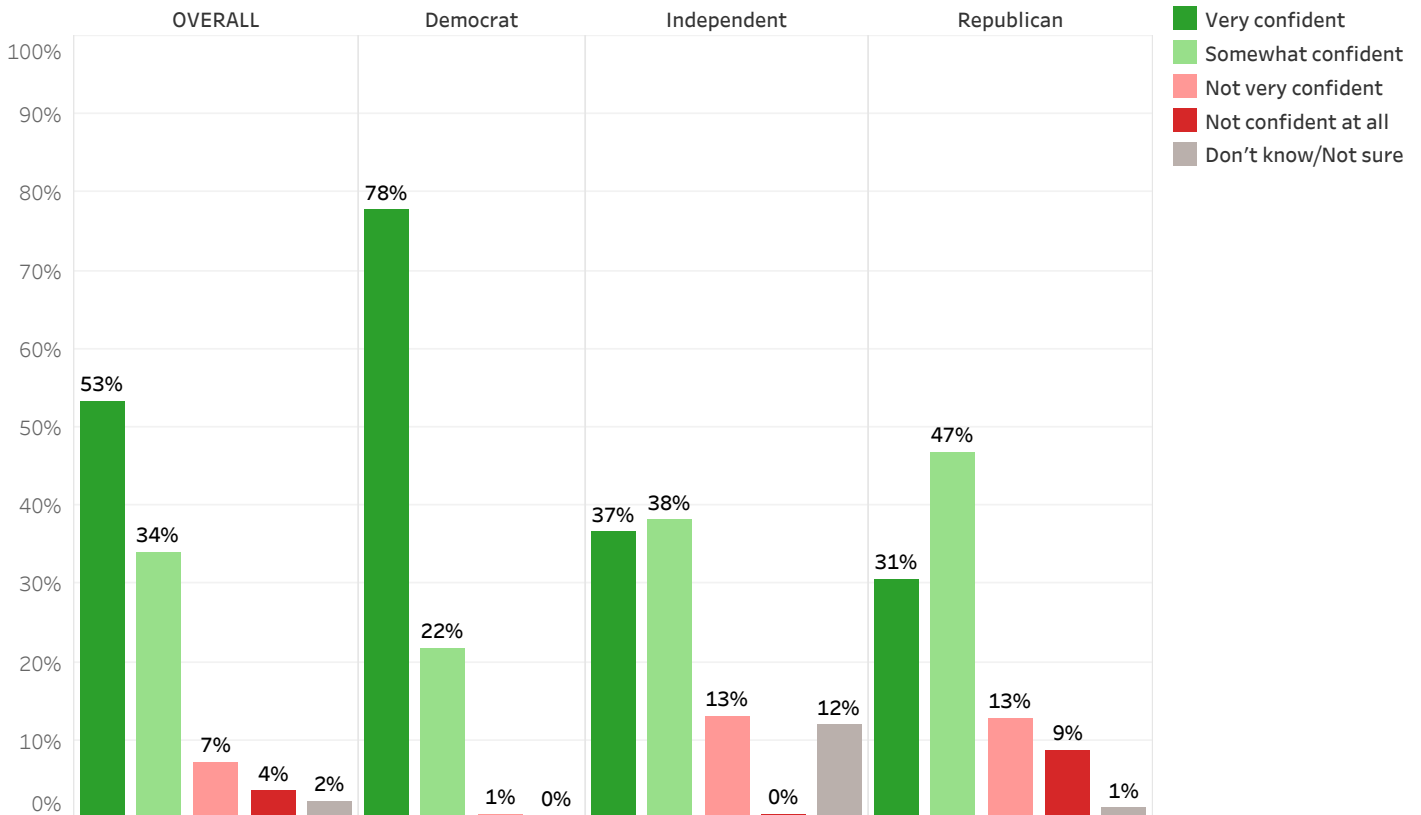
Maine voters who have already voted in the 2022 election overwhelmingly say it was easy to do so: 90% describe their voting experience as very easy, 6% say it was somewhat easy, and only 4% say it was somewhat difficult. Among those who have not voted but are likely to vote in the 2022 election, 73% expect it to be very easy to vote, 22% expect it to be somewhat easy, 4% expect it to be somewhat difficult, and 1% expect it to be very difficult.

Just over half (53%) of likely Maine voters and those who have already voted say they are very confident that their vote will be accurately counted, 34% are somewhat confident it will be accurately counted, 7% are not very confident, 4% are not confident at all, and 2% are unsure. More than three-quarters (78%) of Democrats are very confident that their vote will be accurately counted, but only 37% of Independents and 31% of Republicans feel that way.

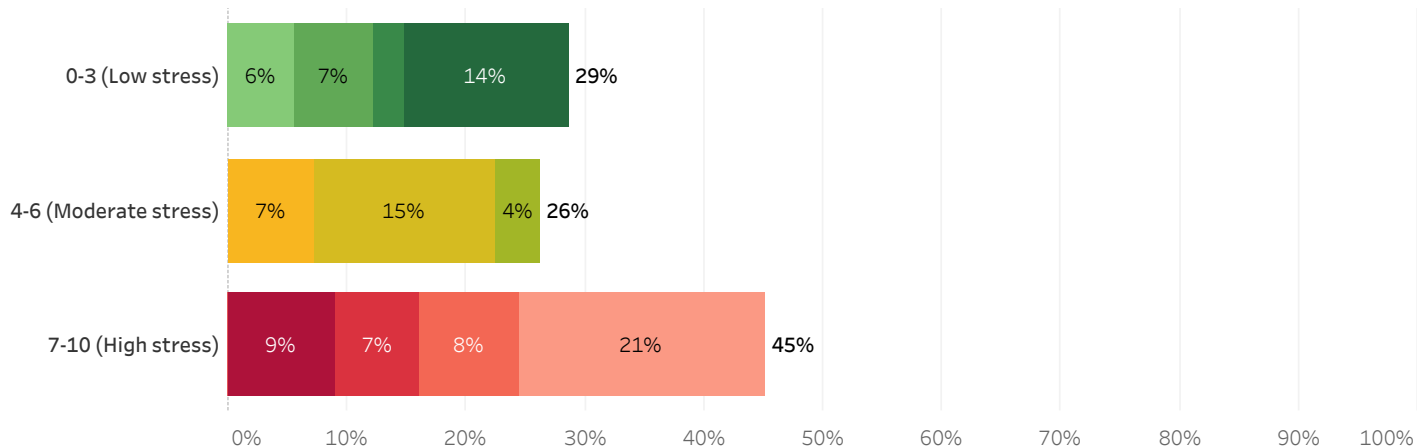
Confidence Vote Will Be Accurately Counted - By Party ID - November 2022



### Feelings About 2022 Maine General Election

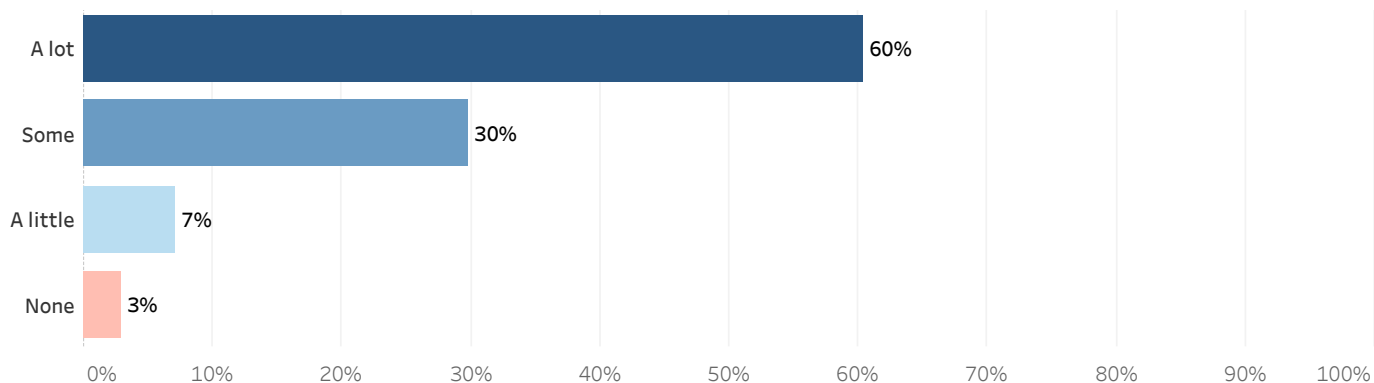
Forty-five percent of likely voters in Maine place themselves at a 7, 8, 9, or 10 on a 0-10 scale rating their overall level of stress as a result of the upcoming election, 26% report moderate stress (4, 5, or 6 on a 0-10 scale), and 29% report low stress (0, 1, 2, or 3 on a 0-10 scale). Six in ten Democrats (61%) say they are feeling high levels of stress about the election, but only 35% of Republicans and 20% of Independents feel that way.

**Stress Related to General Election - November 2022**



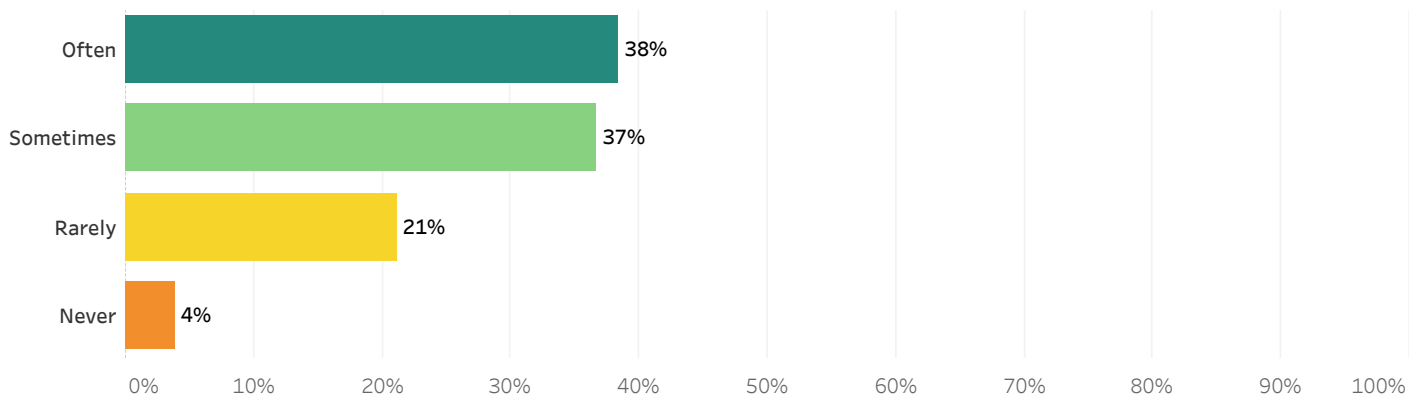
Sixty percent of Mainers say they have paid a lot of attention to the election, 30% say they have paid some attention, 7% have paid a little attention, and 3% say they have paid no attention. Ninety-four percent of Democrats, 90% of Republicans, and 86% of Independents say they have paid a lot of attention to the election.

Thirty-eight percent of Mainers say they discuss the election with their friends and family often, 37% sometimes do so, 21% rarely do so, and 4% never do so. Republicans (50%) are considerably more likely than Democrats (32%) and Independents (32%) to say that they discuss the election with friends and family often.

## Pine Tree State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Pine Tree State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Eight hundred eighty-three (883) Pine Tree State Panel members completed the survey online between November 2 and November 6, 2022. The response rate for the November 2022 Pine Tree State Election Poll is 35%. Maine residents were also randomly contacted through a text message to participate in the survey. One hundred and five (105) state residents completed the survey in this way between November 2 and November 6, 2022. Overall, nine hundred and eighty-eight (988) Maine residents completed the survey. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. Included in the sample were 922 likely 2022 general election voters (MSE = +/- 3.2%), with 477 from Maine's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 4.5%) and 433 from Maine's Second Congressional District (MSE = +/- 4.7%). The design effect for the survey is 2.5%. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the ME Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in Maine.

The Pine Tree State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of Maine residents. Approximately 2,500 Maine adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
