SENATE & CD1 TOO CLOSE TO CALL IN NH

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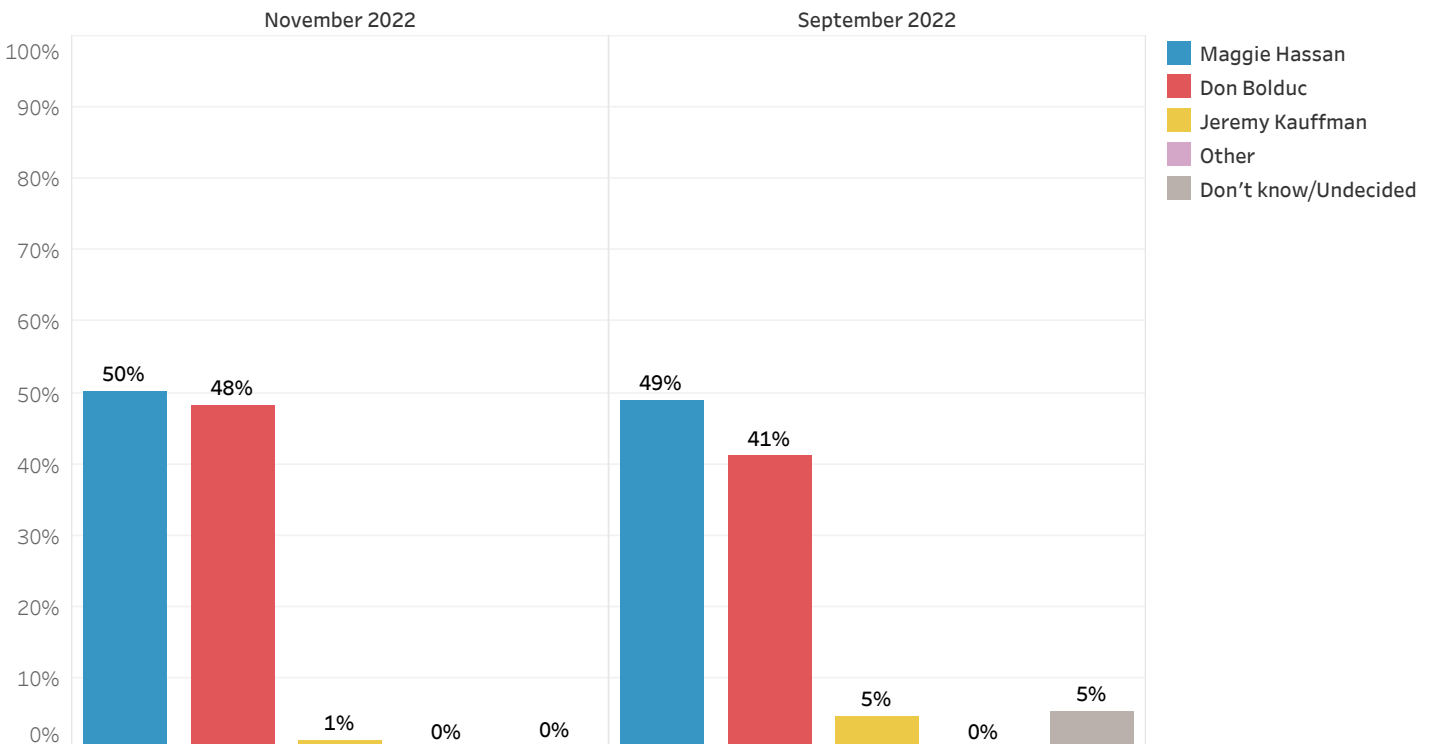
DURHAM, NH - New Hampshire Democratic Senator Maggie Hassan and her Republican opponent, Don Bolduc, are neck-and-neck only days away from Tuesday's election. In New Hampshire's First Congressional District, incumbent Democrat Chris Pappas and Republican Karoline Leavitt are also deadlocked. Incumbent Democrat Ann Kuster holds a small lead over Republican Robert Burns in New Hampshire's Second Congressional District. Governor Chris Sununu continues to lead Democrat Tom Sherman by double-digits.

2022 U.S. Senate Election

Incumbent Democratic Senator Maggie Hassan is in a statistical tie with her Republican opponent, retired General Don Bolduc, in the race for the U.S. Senate. If the election for the U.S. Senate were held today, 50% of likely New Hampshire voters say they would vote for Hassan, 48% would vote for Bolduc, 1% would vote for Libertarian Jeremy Kauffman, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and less than 1% are undecided.

In September, Hassan held an eight-point lead over Bolduc, while 5% supported Kauffman. The race has narrowed as Republicans have coalesced around Bolduc; 94% of Republicans would vote for Bolduc while only 83% said they would do so in September. As in September, Hassan enjoys nearly universal support (99%) among Democrats, while Independents are divided, with 47% supporting Hassan, 45% supporting Bolduc, and 5% supporting Kauffman. Nearly all (98%) Hassan supporters have definitely decided who they will vote for or have already voted, while 90% of Bolduc supporters have already decided. Hassan is less personally unpopular among Granite Staters, with a net favorability rating (the percentage with a favorable opinion of her minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion) of -8, while Bolduc has a net favorability rating of -16.

2022 U.S. Senate Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)



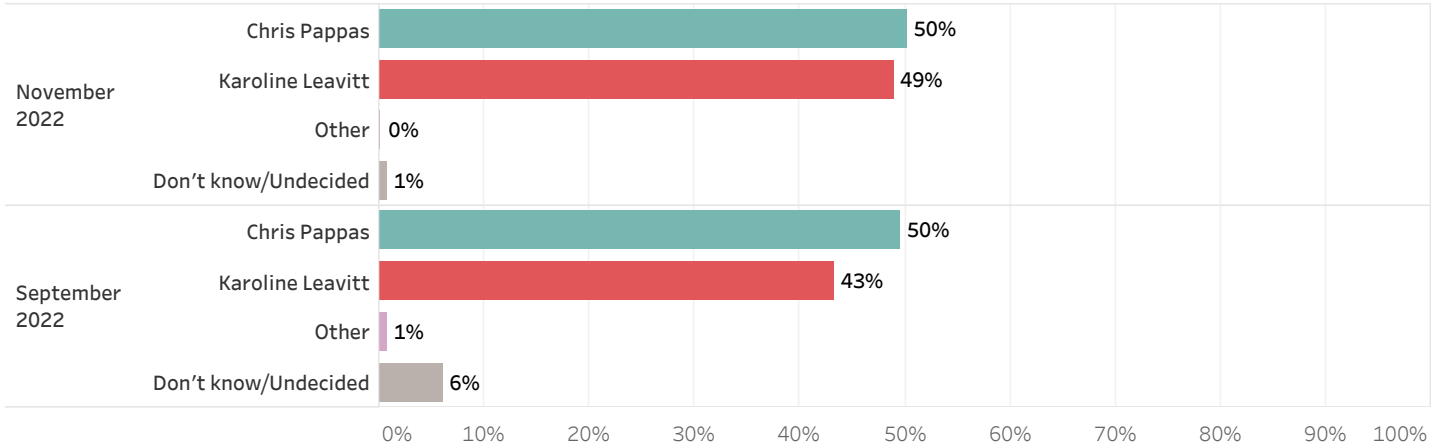

2022 New Hampshire First Congressional District Election

Incumbent Democrat Chris Pappas is also locked in a tight race with his Republican opponent, former Trump White House Aide Karoline Leavitt, in the race for the U.S. House in New Hampshire's First District. If the election were held today, 50% of likely voters say they would vote for Pappas, 49% would vote for Leavitt, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 1% are undecided.

In September, Pappas held a seven-point lead over Leavitt. As in the race for the U.S. Senate, Democrats remain united around their candidate while Republicans have increasingly united around their nominee. Ninety-nine percent of Democrats support Pappas, largely unchanged since September (96%), while 93% of Republicans support Leavitt, up from 87% in September. Independents are divided, with 52% supporting Pappas and 46% supporting Leavitt. Nearly all (97%) Pappas supporters have definitely decided or have already voted, while 90% of Leavitt supporters say the same. Pappas is less personally unpopular among First District residents, with a net favorability rating of -8, while Leavitt has a net favorability rating of -17.

2022 NH First Congressional District Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)

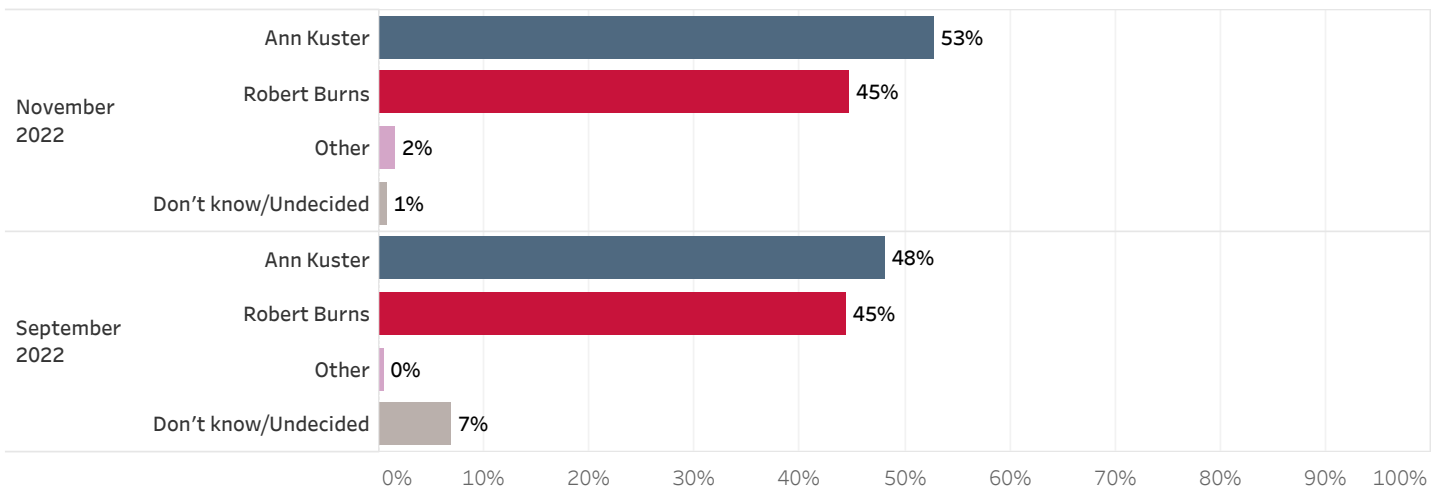


2022 New Hampshire Second Congressional District Election

Democratic incumbent Ann Kuster leads former Hillsborough County Treasurer Robert Burns in the race for the U.S. House in New Hampshire's Second District. If the election were held today, 53% of likely voters say they would vote for Kuster, 45% would vote for Burns, 2% would vote for another candidate, and 1% are undecided.

In September, Kuster led Burns by only three percentage points. Nearly all (>99%) Democrats support Kuster, unchanged since September (99%), while 95% of Republicans support Burns, up from 85% in September. Independents slightly favor Kuster, with 48% in support of the incumbent Congresswoman and 38% supporting Burns. Eighty-nine percent of Kuster supporters have definitely decided or have already voted, while 86% of Burns supporters say the same. Kuster is less personally unpopular among Second District residents, with a net favorability rating of -3, while Burns has a net favorability rating of -12.

2022 NH Second Congressional District Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)

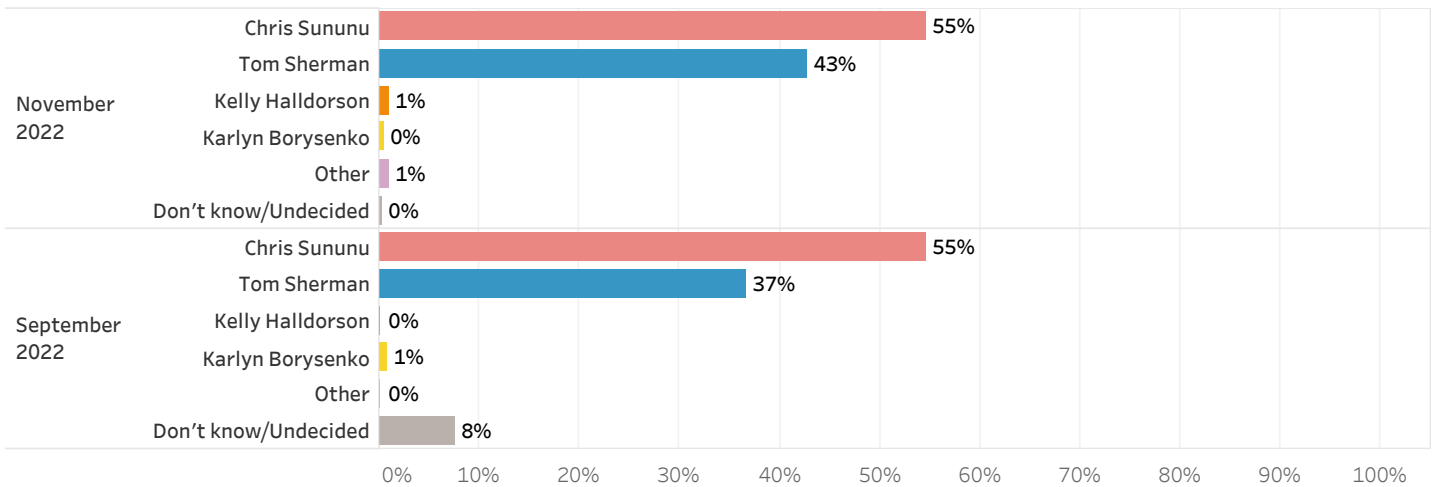


2022 New Hampshire Gubernatorial Election

Seeking his fourth term in office, New Hampshire Republican Governor Chris Sununu holds a double-digit lead over his Democratic opponent, Rye State Senator Tom Sherman. If the election for New Hampshire Governor were held today, 55% of likely voters say they would vote for Sununu, 43% would vote for Sherman, 1% would vote for Libertarian Kelly Halldorson, less than 1% would vote for Libertarian Karlyn Borysenko, 1% would vote for another candidate, and less than 1% are undecided.

The race has narrowed somewhat since September, when Sununu held an eighteen-point lead. Nearly all Republicans (96%) support Sununu, largely unchanged since September (95%), while 88% of Democrats support Sherman, up from 79% in September. Independents clearly favor Sununu, with 56% saying they will vote for the incumbent Governor, 35% support Sherman, 5% support Halldorson, and 2% support Borysenko. Most Sherman (91%) and Sununu (88%) supporters say they have definitely decided who to vote for. Sununu is more personally popular among Granite Staters, with a net favorability rating of +16, while Sherman has a net favorability rating of +9 but is unknown to more than a quarter (29%) of state residents.

2022 NH Gubernatorial Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)

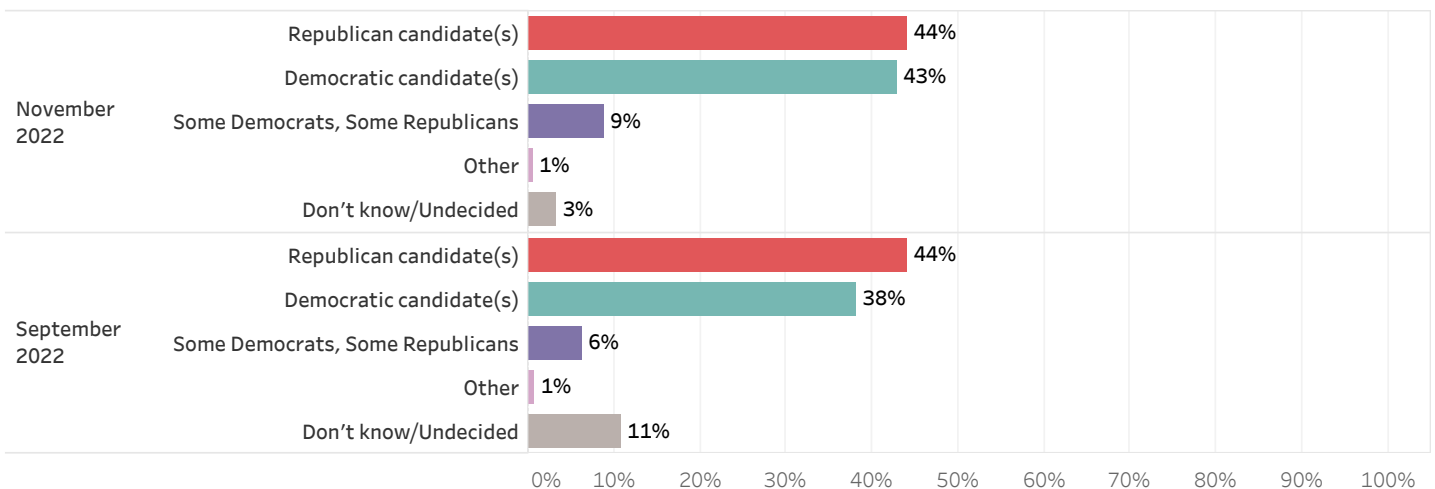


2022 New Hampshire House of Representatives Election

When asked the party of the State House of Representatives candidate or candidates they would vote for if the election were held today, 44% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Republican candidate(s), 43% say they would vote for the Democratic candidate(s), 9% would vote for some Democrats and some Republicans, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 3% are undecided. The race has narrowed somewhat since September, when 44% said they supported Republican candidates and 38% supported Democratic ones.

Based on evaluations of past "generic ballot" polling for the New Hampshire State House of Representatives and actual election results, these findings translate into an estimated 233 seats for Republicans and 167 seats for Democrats. Democrats typically need approximately 54% of the popular vote to win a majority of seats in the State House.

2022 NH State House Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)

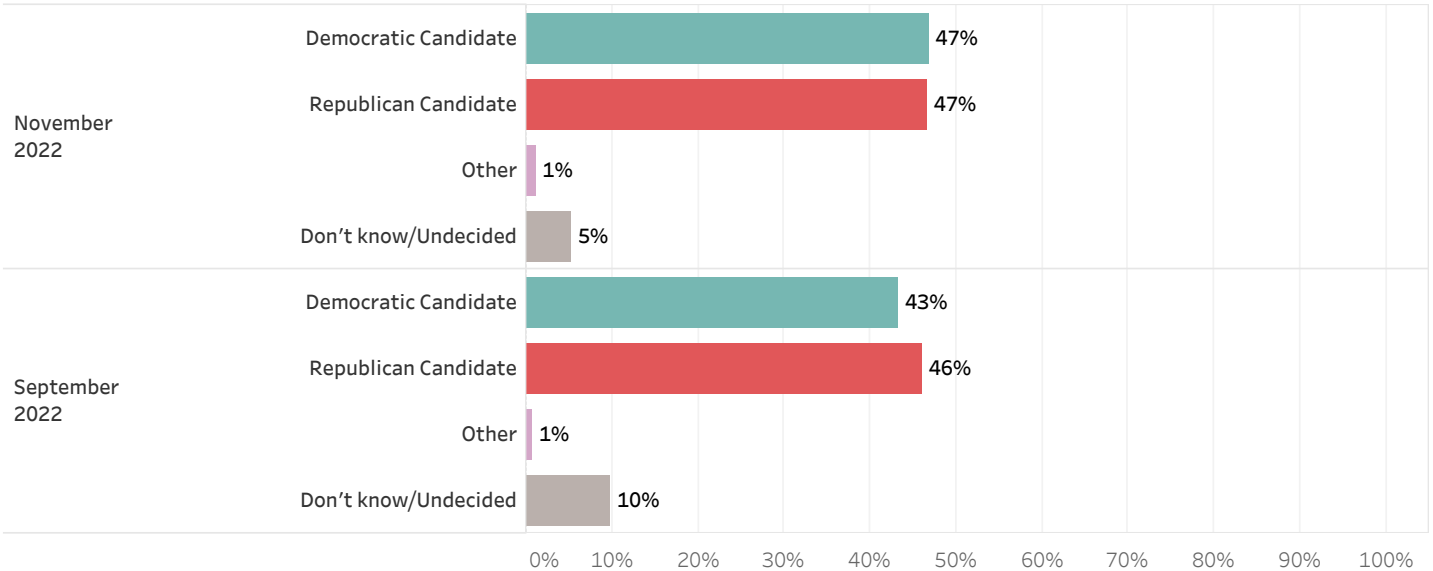


2022 New Hampshire State Senate Election

When asked the party of the State Senate candidate they would vote for if the election were held today, 47% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Democratic candidate, 47% would vote for the Republican candidate, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 5% are undecided. In September, 46% said they planned to vote for the Republican candidate, 43% planned to vote for the Democratic candidate, and 10% were undecided.

Based on evaluations of past "generic ballot" polling for the New Hampshire State Senate and actual election results, these findings translate into an estimated 14 seats for Republicans and 10 seats for Democrats. Democrats typically need approximately 54% of the popular vote to win a majority of Senate seats.

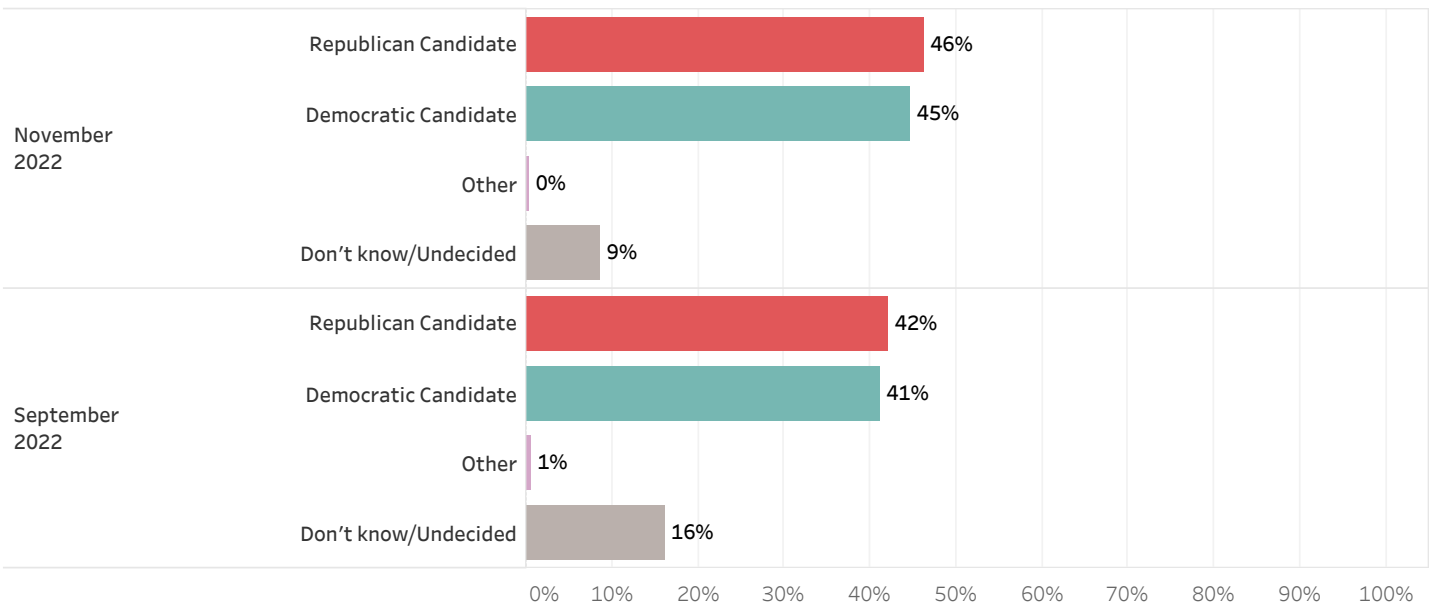
2022 NH State Senate Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)



2022 New Hampshire Executive Council Election

When asked the party of the New Hampshire Executive Council candidate they would vote for if the election were held today, 46% of likely voters say that they would vote for the Republican candidate, 45% would vote for the Democratic candidate, less than 1% would vote for another candidate, and 9% are undecided. In September, 42% said they planned to vote for the Republican candidate, 41% planned to vote for the Democratic candidate, and 16% were undecided.

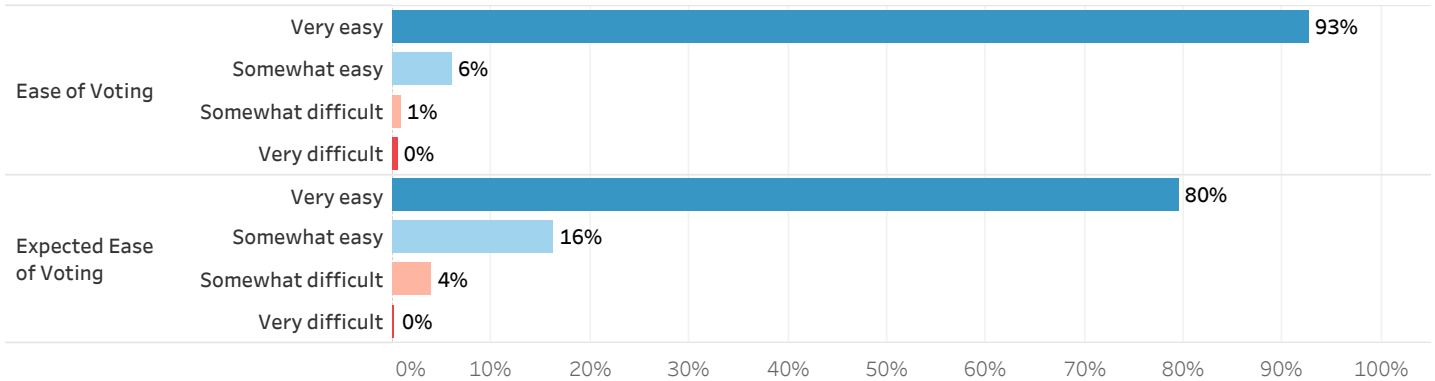
2022 NH Executive Council Election (With Leaners & Those Who Have Already Voted)



Election Integrity

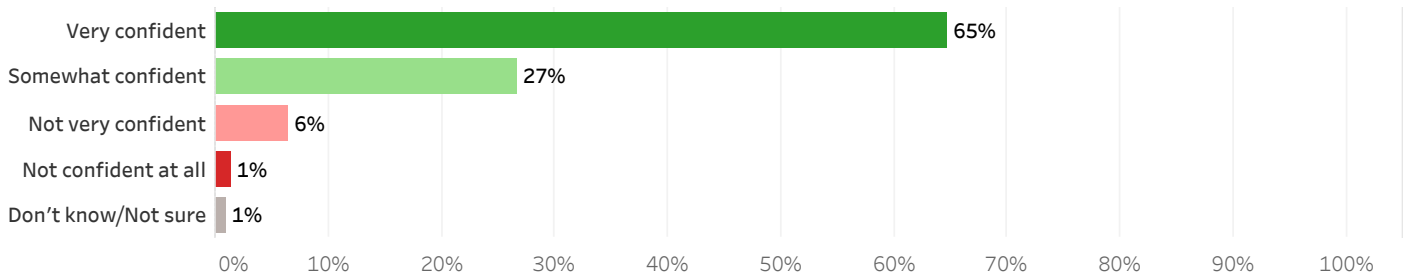
New Hampshire voters who have already voted in the 2022 election overwhelmingly say it was easy to do so: 93% describe their voting experience as very easy, 6% say it was somewhat easy, and only 1% say it was somewhat (1%) or very (<1%) difficult. Among those who have not voted but are likely to vote in the 2022 election, 80% expect it to be very easy to vote, 16% expect it to be somewhat easy, 4% expect it to be somewhat difficult, and less than 1% expect it to be very difficult. Shortly after the 2020 election, 88% of voters said it was easy for them to vote, 10% described it as somewhat easy, 1% said it was somewhat difficult, and less than 1% said it was very difficult.

Ease of Voting/Expected Ease of Voting - November 2022



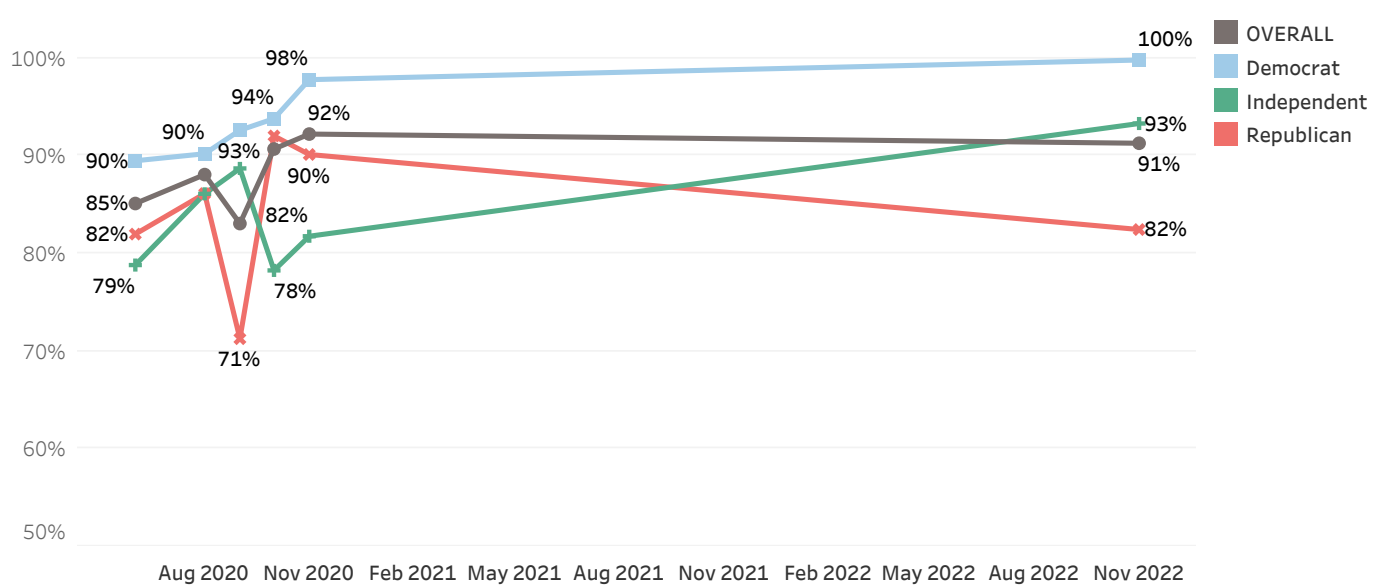
Nearly two-thirds (65%) of likely New Hampshire voters and those who have already voted say they are very confident that their vote will be accurately counted, 27% are somewhat confident it will be accurately counted, 6% are not very confident, 1% are not confident at all, and 1% are unsure.

The proportion of likely voters who are very or somewhat confident (91%) that their vote will be accurately counted largely matches the percentage who said so in November 2020 (92%), directly before the general election. Nearly all Democrats (>99%) say they are very or somewhat confident their vote will be accurately counted, but only 82% of Republicans feel that way.

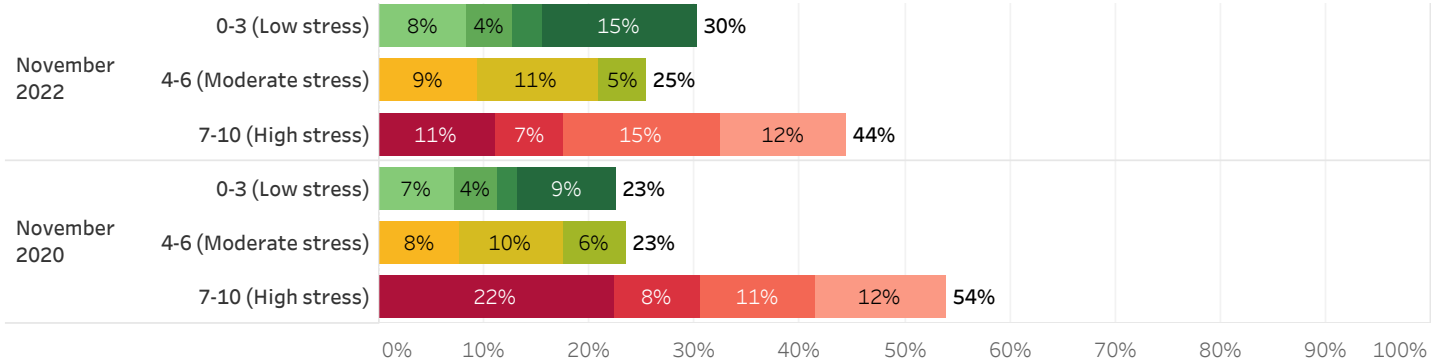
Very or Somewhat Confident Vote Will Be Accurately Counted - by Party ID



Feelings About 2022 New Hampshire General Election

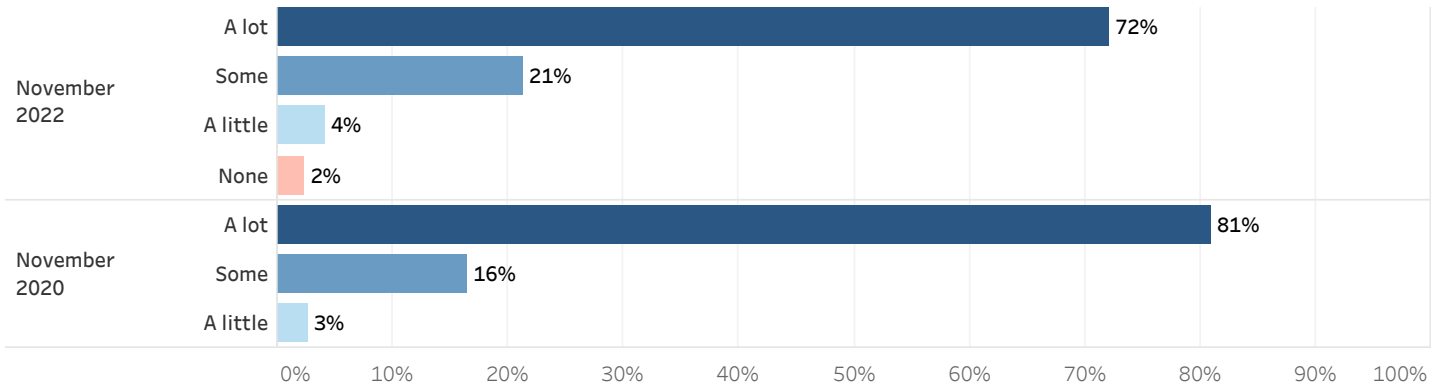
Forty-four percent of likely voters in New Hampshire place themselves at a 7, 8, 9, or 10 on a 0-10 scale rating their overall level of stress as a result of the upcoming general election, 25% report moderate stress (4, 5, or 6 on a 0-10 scale), and 30% report low stress (0, 1, 2, or 3 on a 0-10 scale). Respondents are slightly less likely to say they are experiencing high levels of stress about the upcoming election (44%) than they were in November 2020 (54%). Two-thirds of Democrats (66%) say they are feeling high levels of stress about the election, but only 34% of Independents and 26% of Republicans feel that way.

Stress Related to General Election



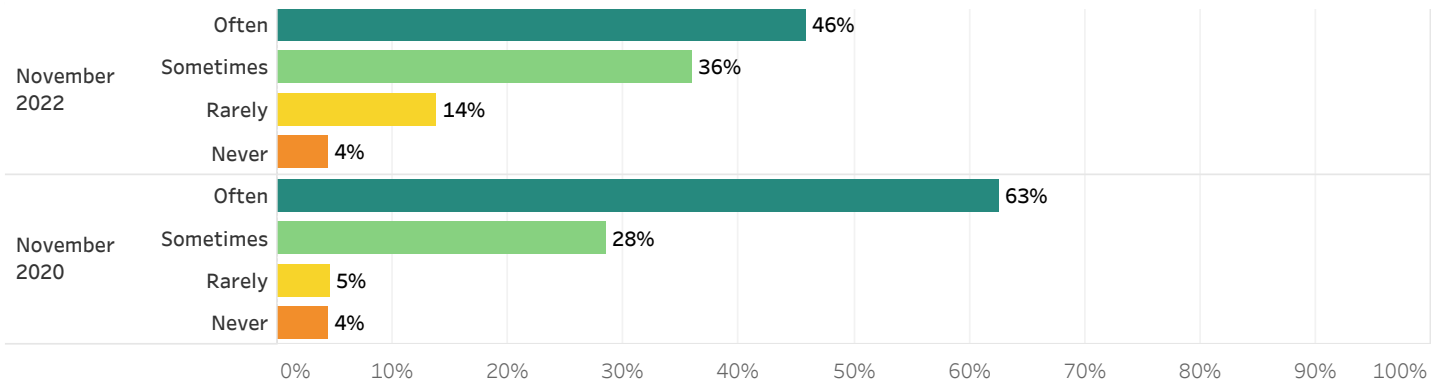
Seventy-two percent of Granite Staters say they have paid a lot of attention to the election, 21% say they have paid some attention, 4% have paid a little attention, and 2% say they have paid no attention. Respondents in November 2020 indicated that they paid slightly more attention, with 81% saying they were paying a lot of attention. Republicans (75%) and Democrats (72%) are about equally likely to say they have paid a lot of attention to the election, while Independents (62%) are slightly less likely to say so.

Just under half (46%) of Granite Staters say they discuss the election with their friends and family often, 36% sometimes do so, 14% rarely do so, and 4% never do so. Respondents in November 2020 indicated that they discussed the upcoming election with their friends and family more frequently; 63% said they discussed it often, 28% said they sometimes did, 5% said they rarely did, and 4% said they never did. Republicans (49%) are slightly more likely than Independents (42%) and Democrats (42%) to say that they discuss the election with friends and family often.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Two thousand, two hundred and fifty-seven (2,257) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between November 2 and November 6, 2022. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.1%. Included in the sample were 2,077 likely 2022 general election voters (MSE = +/-2.2%), with 1,043 from New Hampshire's First Congressional District (MSE = +/- 3.0%) and 1,027 from New Hampshire's Second Congressional District (MSE = +/- 3.1%). The design effect for the survey is 2.7%. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the November 2022 Granite State Election Poll is 32%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,200 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
