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NH ISSUES: STRONG SUPPORT FOR RECREATIONAL MARIJUANA USE & GUN CONTROL IN NEW HAMPSHIRE

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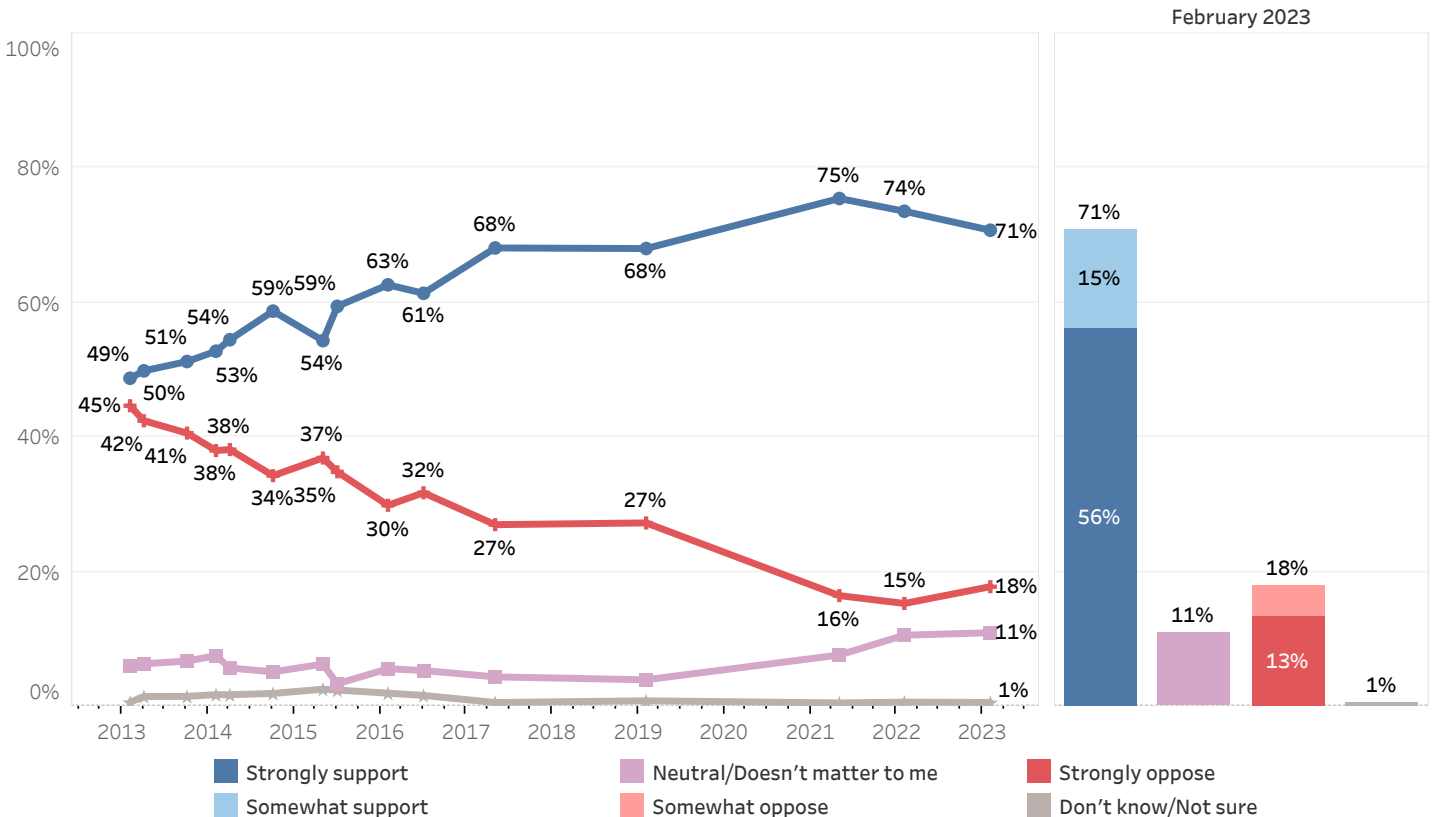
DURHAM, NH - Seven in ten New Hampshire residents support legalizing marijuana for recreational use. Majorities are also in favor of several gun control measures, including a background check and waiting period on all commercial gun sales, as well as a mechanism to prevent those who may be a risk to themselves or others from buying a gun. Very few Granite Staters support moving New Hampshire's state primary to June. State residents say jobs and the economy and housing are the most important problems facing the state and most residents see homelessness as a very or somewhat serious issue.

Marijuana Legalization

New Hampshire is the only state in New England which does not currently allow recreational use of marijuana. But Granite Staters are firmly in favor of legalizing marijuana for recreational use: 71% say they strongly (56%) or somewhat (15%) support such an action, 11% are neutral on the issue, 18% are strongly (13%) or somewhat (5%) opposed, and 1% are unsure. When this question was first asked to Granite State Poll respondents in February 2013, New Hampshire residents were evenly divided on this issue, with 49% in support of legalizing marijuana for recreational use and 45% opposed.

Nearly all self-described socialists (>99%) and liberals (95%), just over three-quarters of progressives (79%) and libertarians (78%), and majorities of moderates (65%) and conservatives (55%) support legalizing marijuana for recreational use.

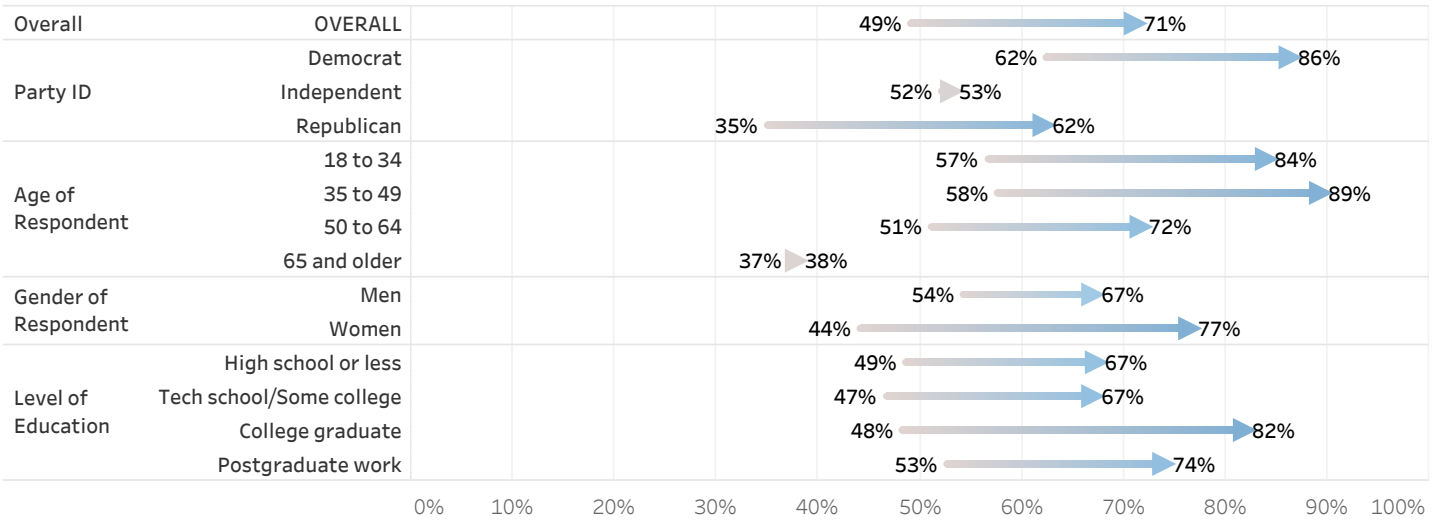
Support or Oppose Legalization of Marijuana for Recreational Use - February 2023

Support for legalizing marijuana for recreational use in New Hampshire has increased by 22 percentage points since 2013, with equal increases among Democrats (+24) and Republicans (+27) over that time period. Opinion among those aged 65 and older is unchanged since 2013 (+1) but support among those aged 18 to 34 (+27) and aged 35 to 49 (+32) has increased substantially.

Support Legalization of Marijuana for Recreational Use - Change from February 2013 to February 2023 - By Selected Demographics



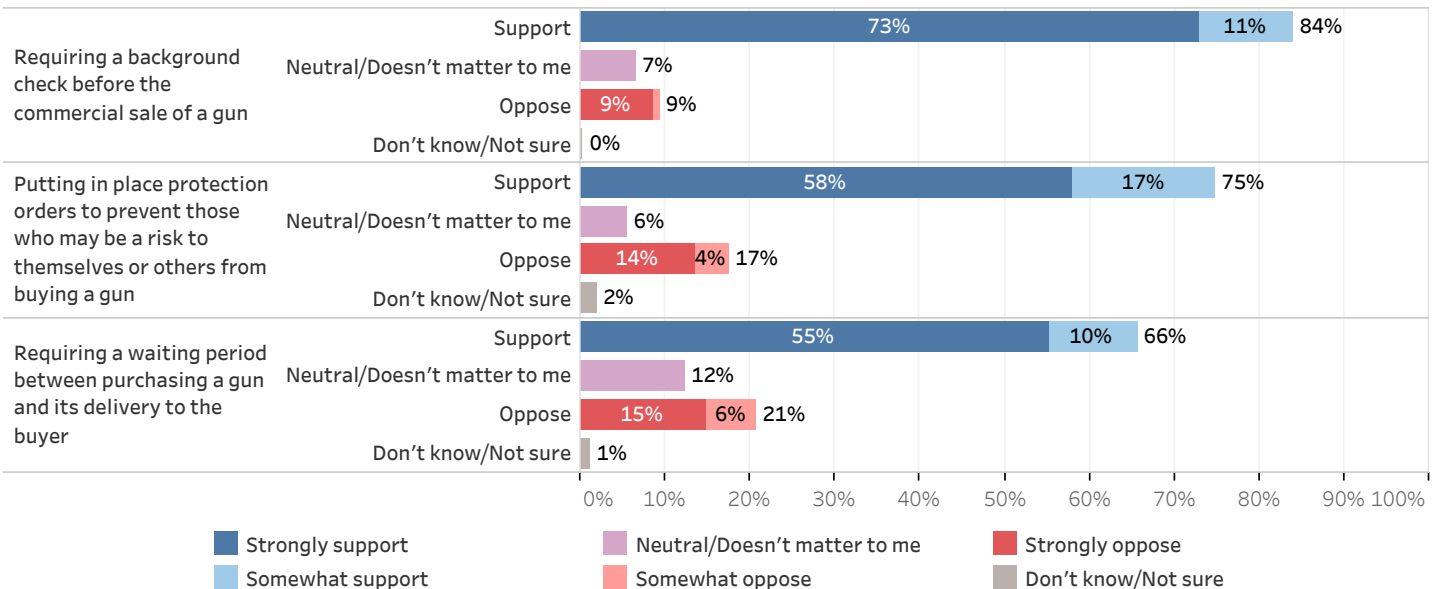
Gun Legislation

Granite State Poll respondents were asked whether they supported or opposed several gun control related laws. More than four-fifths (84%) of New Hampshire residents say they strongly (73%) or somewhat (11%) support requiring a background check before the commercial sale of a gun, 9% are somewhat (<1%) or strongly (9%) opposed, 7% are neutral on the issue or say it doesn't matter to them, and less than 1% are unsure.

Three-quarters (75%) of New Hampshire residents say they strongly (58%) or somewhat (17%) support putting in place protection orders to prevent those who may be a risk to themselves or others from buying a gun, 17% are somewhat (4%) or strongly (14%) opposed, 6% are neutral on the issue or say it doesn't matter to them, and 2% are unsure.

Two-thirds (66%) of New Hampshire residents say they strongly (55%) or somewhat (10%) support requiring a waiting period between purchasing a gun and its delivery to the buyer, 21% are somewhat (6%) or strongly (15%) opposed, 12% are neutral on the issue or say it doesn't matter to them, and 1% are unsure.

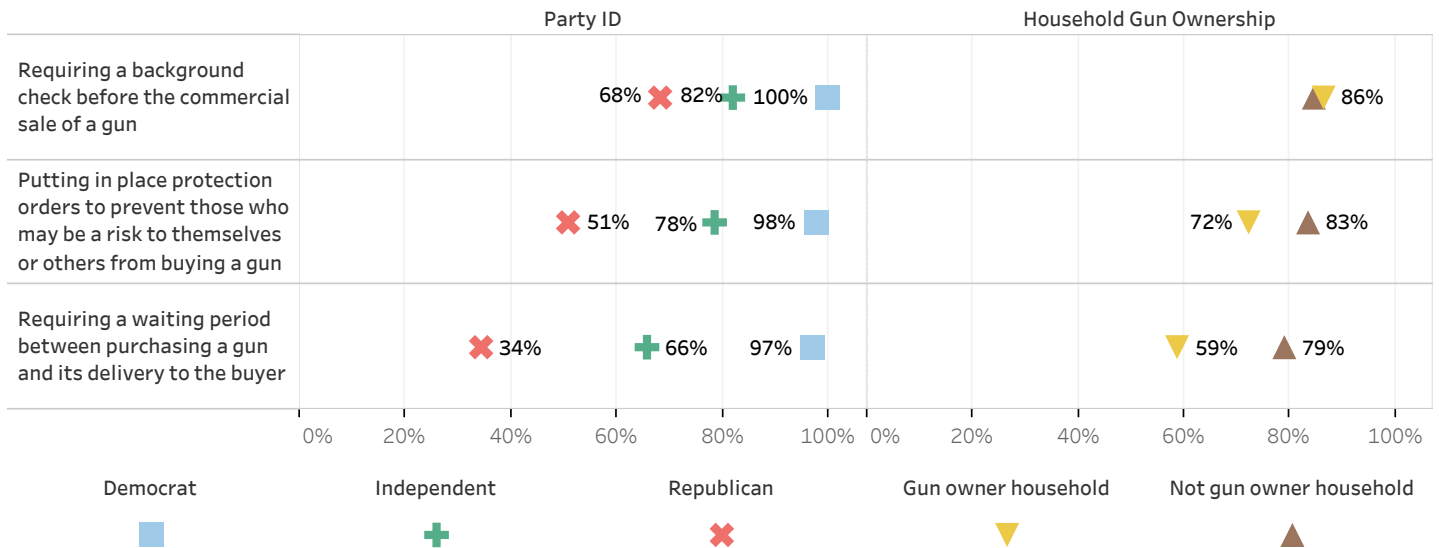
Opinion on Gun Control Proposals - February 2023



Nearly all Democrats support each of these gun control proposals, while just over two-thirds (68%) of Republicans support requiring a background check on all commercial sales, 51% support protection orders, and only one-third (34%) support a waiting period for gun sales.

Gun owner households and non-gun owner households have virtually identical opinions on requiring background checks on all gun sales, while non-gun owner households are slightly more likely to be in favor of protection orders and waiting periods. However, majorities of both groups favor all three measures.

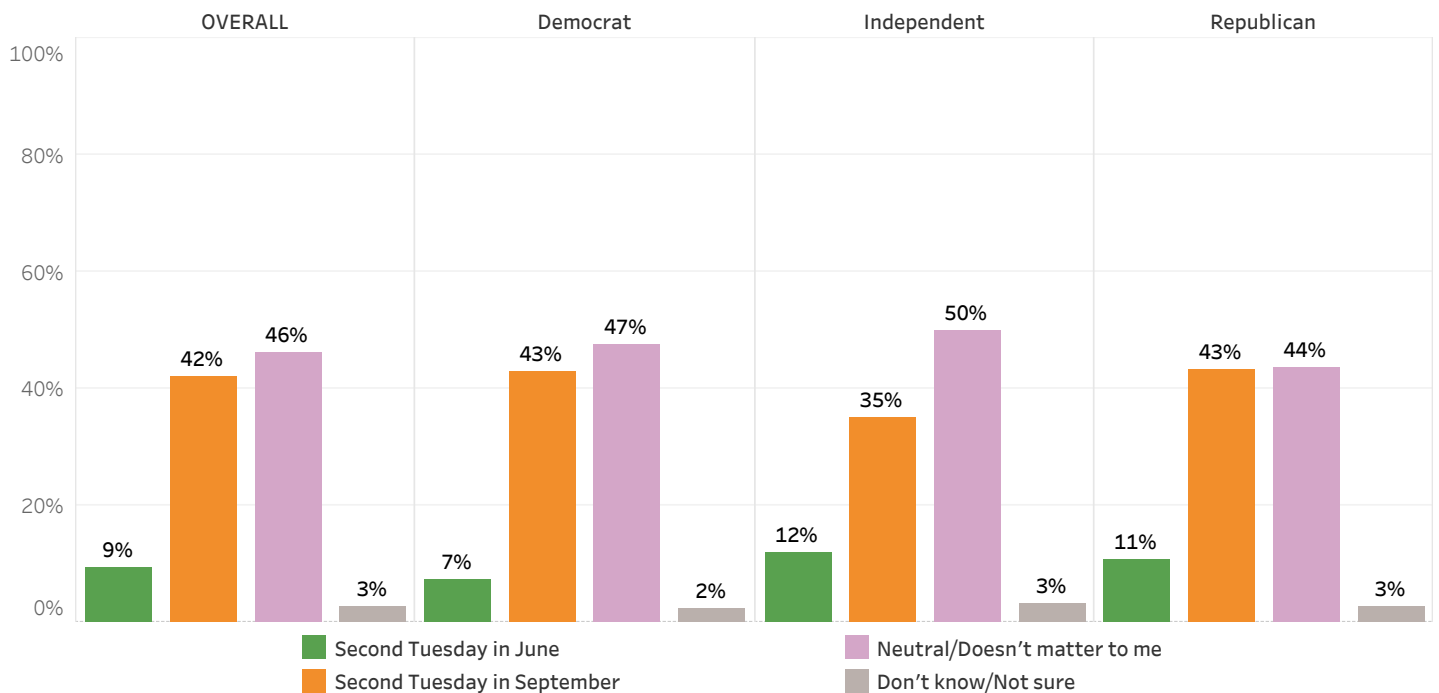
Support Gun Control Proposals - By Selected Demographics - February 2023



New Hampshire State Primary Date

The state primary election in New Hampshire is held on the second Tuesday in September. There is a bill in the New Hampshire House of Representatives that would change the date of this election to the second Tuesday in June. When asked which date they would prefer, only 9% choose the second Tuesday in June, 42% say they prefer the second Tuesday in September, 46% are neutral or say it doesn't matter to them, and 3% are unsure. Democrats (43%) and Republicans (43%) are equally likely to say they prefer the state primary happen in September.

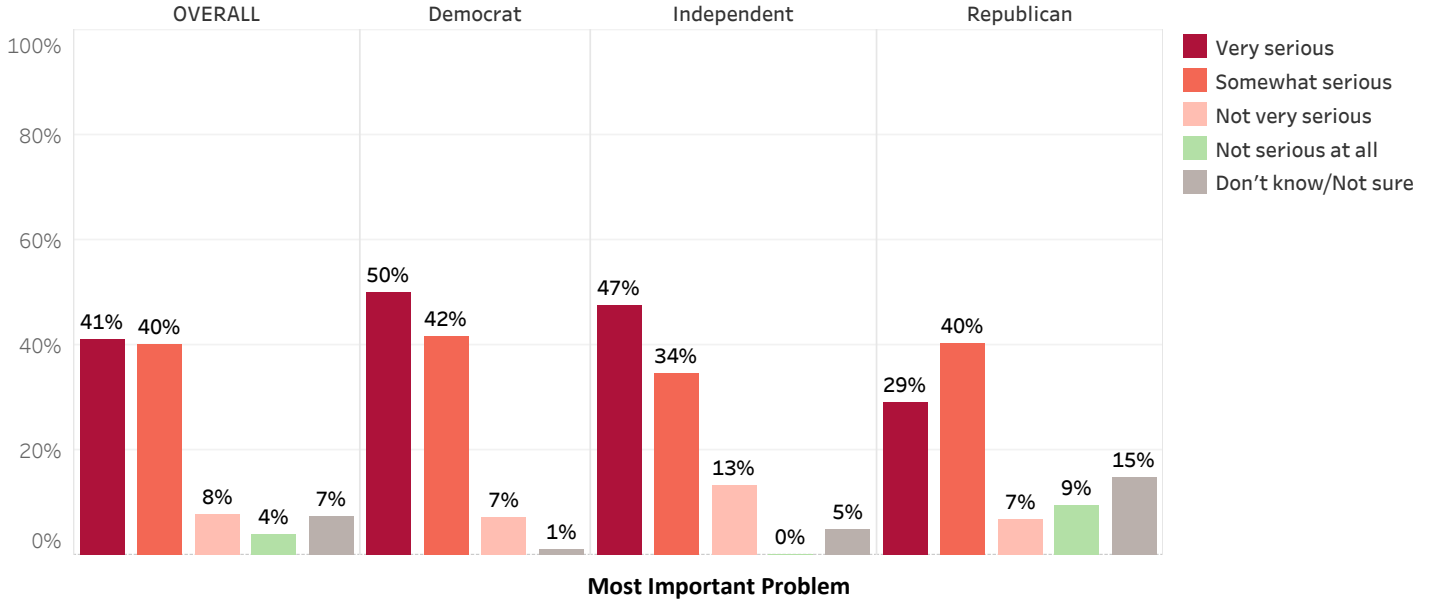
Prefer State Primary in June or September - By Party ID - February 2023



Homelessness

The issue of homelessness has been extensively covered by the media across the country and in New Hampshire in recent years. Forty-one percent of New Hampshire residents think that homelessness is a very serious problem in the state, 40% think it is somewhat serious, 8% think it is not very serious, 4% think it is not serious at all, and 7% are unsure. Democrats (50%) and Independents (47%) are more likely than Republicans (29%) to say that homelessness is a very serious problem in New Hampshire.

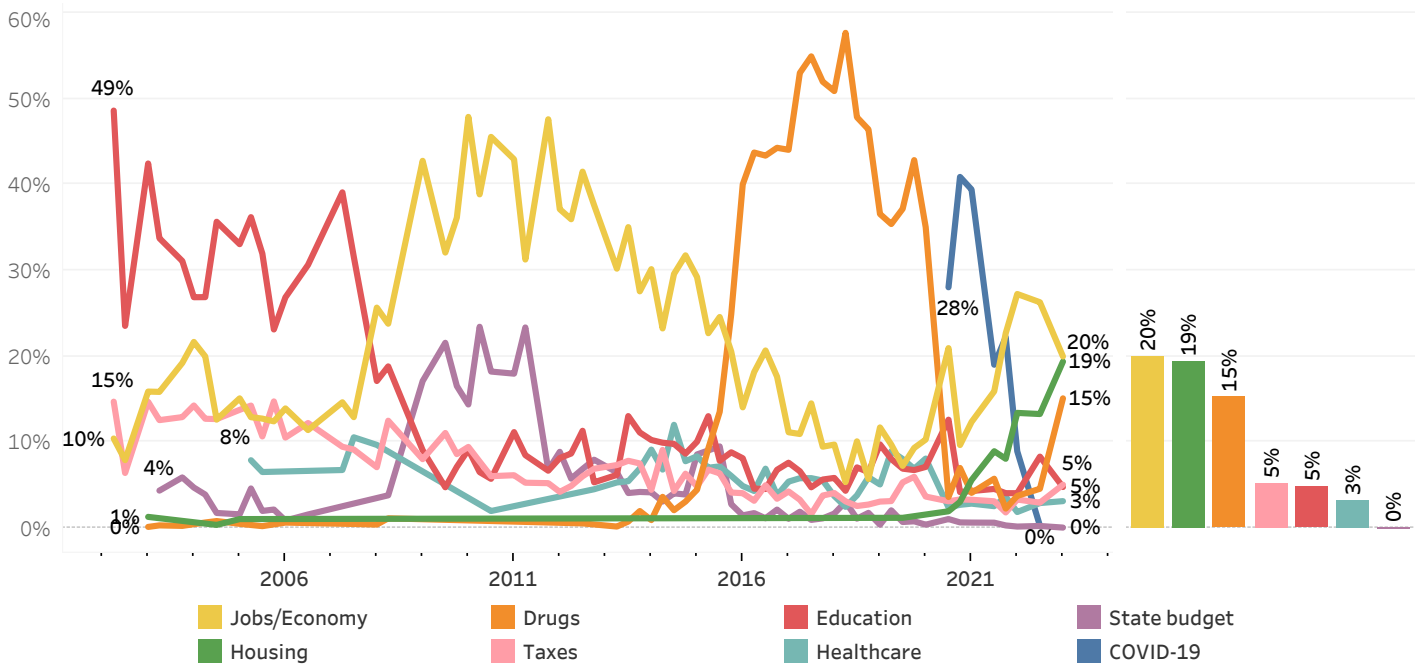
Seriousness of Homelessness Problem in New Hampshire - By Party ID - February 2023



Twenty percent of New Hampshire residents believe jobs or the economy is the most important problem facing the state, while 19% believe housing is the most important problem and 15% believe drugs are the most important problem. Fewer cite taxes (5%), education (5%), healthcare (3%), or the state budget (<1%) as the most important problem facing the state, while 31% say something else is the most important problem. The percentage of residents who say housing is the most important problem facing the state (19%) is at an all-time high, while COVID-19 has disappeared entirely after being the most frequently cited problem throughout much of 2020 and 2021.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Eight hundred sixty-three (863) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between February 16 and February 20, 2023. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.3 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the February 2023 Granite State Poll is 24%. The design effect for the survey is 3.3%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,000 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
