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VERMONTERS SAY HOUSING MOST SERIOUS PROBLEM IN STATE; MAJORITY FAVOR EXTENDING HOMELESS HOUSING PROGRAM


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DURHAM, NH - One-third of Vermont residents say housing is the most important problem facing the state and a majority support extending emergency housing for the homeless in motels. On other issues, majorities support raising the marriage age to 18 and making at least 10% of new recreational trails accessible to the disabled. Residents are divided over banning recreational trapping except in specific circumstances. Governor Scott's approval rating has fallen since November, particularly among Republicans, though he remains a popular governor.

Housing and Homelessness

The high cost of housing and related increase in homelessness has received extensive news coverage in Vermont and across the country in recent months. One-third (32%) of Vermont residents currently believe housing is the most important problem facing the state, while 9% each cite the cost of living or taxes, 7% mention the political left, 6% mention jobs or the economy, and 5% each mention climate change or the environment or education. Less than 5% believe that demographic problems (3%), a lack of workforce (2%), drugs (2%), healthcare (2%), the state budget (1%), abortion or women's rights (1%), or welfare (1%) is the most important problem facing the state.

Vermont currently operates a program whereby those experiencing homelessness can be housed at state expense in motels across the state. However, federal funding for this program will run out in the near future. Six in ten (60%) Vermonters strongly (33%) or somewhat (27%) support extending this program, 31% strongly (13%) or somewhat (18%) oppose extending the program, 5% are neutral, and 4% are unsure. Four in five (79%) Democrats support extending this program, a slim majority (54%) of Republicans oppose it, and Independents are about equally divided, with 50% in support of extending the program and 46% opposed to extending it.


Almost all Vermonters (91%) consider homelessness to be a very (49%) or somewhat (42%) serious problem in the state.

Recreational Issues


The Vermont Legislature is considering a bill which would ban recreational trapping of animals in Vermont except under special circumstances. Vermonters are divided on this question, with 46% strongly (35%) or somewhat (10%) in favor of such a ban, 11% are neutral, 39% are strongly (25%) or somewhat (13%) opposed to it, and 5% are unsure. Sixty-two percent of Democrats support banning recreational trapping, while 72% of Republicans and just over half (52%) of Independents oppose it.



Support or Oppose Banning Recreational Trapping of Animals - By Party ID


The Vermont Legislature is also considering a bill that would require at least 10% of all new recreational trails in the state to be accessible to those with physical disabilities. Nearly three-quarters (72%) of Vermonters strongly (42%) or somewhat (30%) favor such a measure, 13% are neutral, only 10% are strongly (5%) or somewhat (6%) opposed to it, and 5% are unsure. Eighty-two percent of Democrats, 71% of Independents, and 52% of Republicans support making at least 10% of new recreational trails accessible to those with physical disabilities.





On a different topic, the Vermont Legislature is also considering a bill which would raise the legal age for a person in Vermont to marry to from 16 to 18. More than three-quarters (77%) of Vermonters strongly (57%) or somewhat (20%) support raising the marriage age to 18, 15% are neutral, only 4% are strongly (2%) or somewhat (2%) opposed to it, and 3% are unsure. Support for this bill is bipartisan: 82% of Democrats, 75% of Independents, and 67% of Republicans support raising the marriage age to 18.


Support or Oppose Increasing Legal Marriage Age to 18 - By Party ID



Marijuana Advertisements

The state government in Vermont has recently enacted a law which restricts advertisements for marijuana in the state, including prohibiting cannabis stores from advertising through any media unless they can demonstrate that less than 15% of their audience is under the age of 21. Most Vermonters know little about this: only 14% say they have heard a lot about the state government's decision to restrict marijuana advertisements, 28% have heard some about it, 39% have heard not very much, and 19% have heard nothing at all about it.


Among those who have heard at least something about the restriction on marijuana advertisements in Vermont (N=555), 44% strongly (22%) or somewhat (22%) support this decision, 31% are neutral, 20% strongly (8%) or somewhat (12%) oppose it, and 5% are unsure. Democrats (47%) and Republicans (42%) are more likely than Independents (29%) to support this decision.




Support or Oppose State Government's Increased Regulation of Cannabis Ads - By Party ID

Town Meeting

After being suspended for several years due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Vermont voters were able to return to town meetings this spring. Vermonters are split on what they prefer for the format of these town meetings: 34% prefer a town meeting with one session for deliberation and voting and 28% prefer two separate sessions, one for deliberation and one for voting. But the plurality of residents are neutral on the question (32%) or are unsure (6%). More than half (55%) of those who attended town meeting in 2023 support having one session while those who did not attend are ambivalent, with a plurality (41%) saying they are neutral on the question.






Gubernatorial Approval


Phil Scott remains popular in Vermont, but his approval has slipped in the state since last fall. Currently, 58% of Vermont residents approve of Governor Scott's job performance, 39% disapprove, and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Scott's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) is +19, down from +39 in November.

Seventy-five percent of Independents, 62% of Democrats, and 46% of Republicans approve of Scott's performance as governor. Approval of Scott's performance among Republicans (46%) has declined considerably since November (66%).



Respondents were asked why they feel that way about Governor Scott's performance. Those who approve of Scott's performance (N=404) most often mention how they believe Scott is moderate or non-partisan (16%), how he represents people (14%), has handled a specific issue well (10%), is doing well or as well as possible (7%), is competent or able (7%), is a good person (6%), fights the opposition party (6%), handled a specific issue poorly (6%), or shows strong leadership (5%). Those who disapprove of Scott's performance (N=273) most often mention how they believe Scott displays weak leadership (11%), they disagree with his decisions (7%), believe he has handled a specific issue poorly (6%), is too far left (4%), doesn't represent residents (3%), or is too partisan (3%).

Green Mountain State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Green Mountain State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Six hundred ninety-eight (698) Green Mountain State Panel members completed the survey online between March 16 and March 20, 2023. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.7 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the March 2023 Green Mountain State Poll is 30%. The design effect for the survey is 2.6%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as 2020 election results in Vermont.

The Green Mountain State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of Vermont residents. Approximately 2,500 Vermont adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
