GRANITE STATE VIEW ON NATIONAL ISSUES: HALF THINK DEBT CEILING BREACH LIKELY, DIVIDED ON IMMIGRATION AND ASYLUM, PARTISAN LACK OF TRUST IN SUPREME COURT AND FBI

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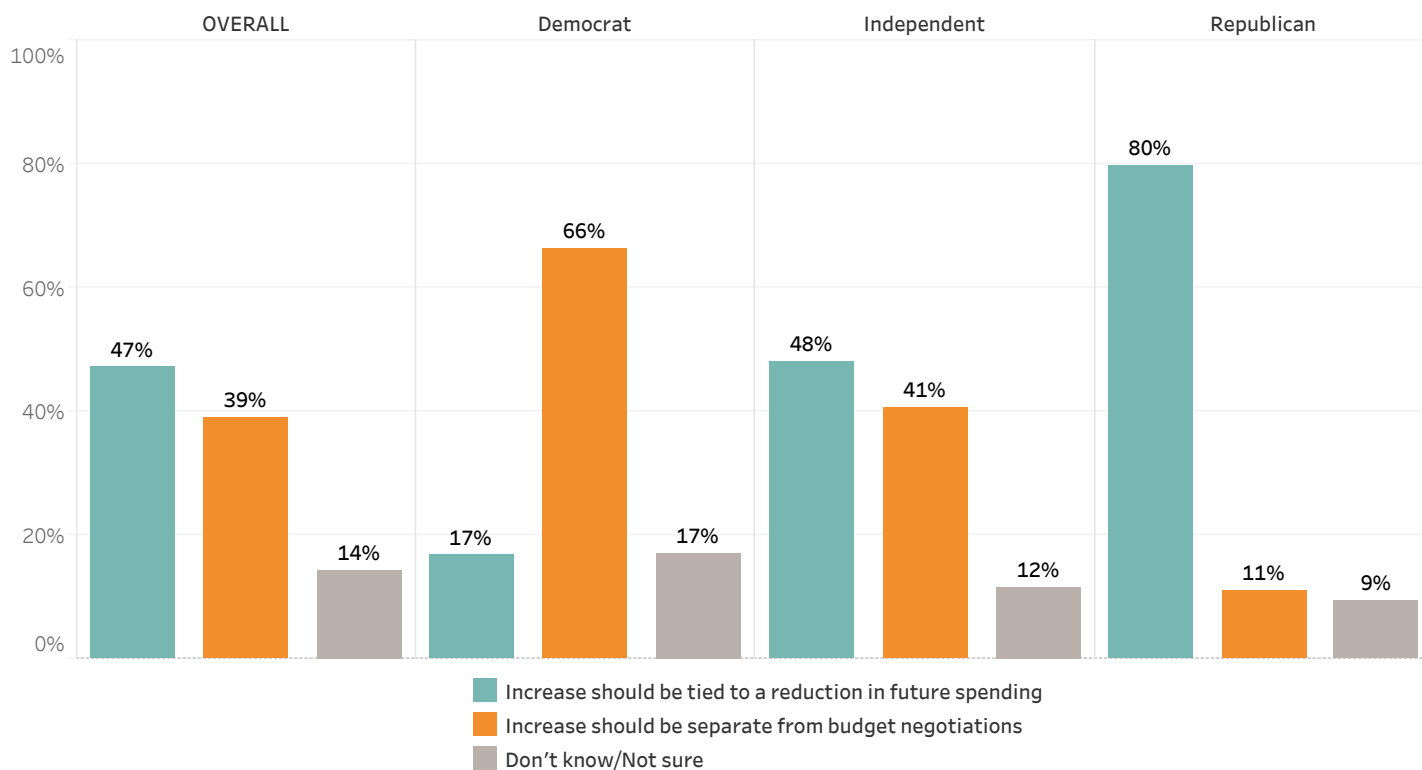
DURHAM, NH - State residents are divided on whether spending reductions should accompany an increase in the debt ceiling while half think it is likely the debt ceiling will be breached in the coming months. A plurality of Granite Staters support extending Title 42 immigration policies. Residents are divided on whether it should be easier or harder to seek asylum and immigrate to the U.S. Most Democrats lack trust in the Supreme Court while most Republicans lack trust in the FBI amid scandals clouding both institutions.

The Debt Ceiling

President Biden and Speaker of the U.S. House of Representatives Kevin McCarthy have been engaged in negotiations to raise the federal debt ceiling, the limit on how much the federal government is permitted to borrow, which Treasury Secretary Janet Yellin warns could be breached as soon as June 1st. Republicans have argued that an increase in the debt ceiling should be tied to a reduction in future federal spending, while Democrats argue that there should be a "clean" raising of the debt ceiling and negotiations over the future budget should take place separately.

A plurality of Granite Staters (47%) think an increase in the debt ceiling should be tied to future spending reductions, 39% think an increase in the debt ceiling should be separate from budget negotiations, and 14% are unsure. Two-thirds (66%) of Democrats believe that the budget and debt ceiling should be separate issues, 80% of Republicans think a debt ceiling increase should be tied to reductions in future spending, while Independents are divided.

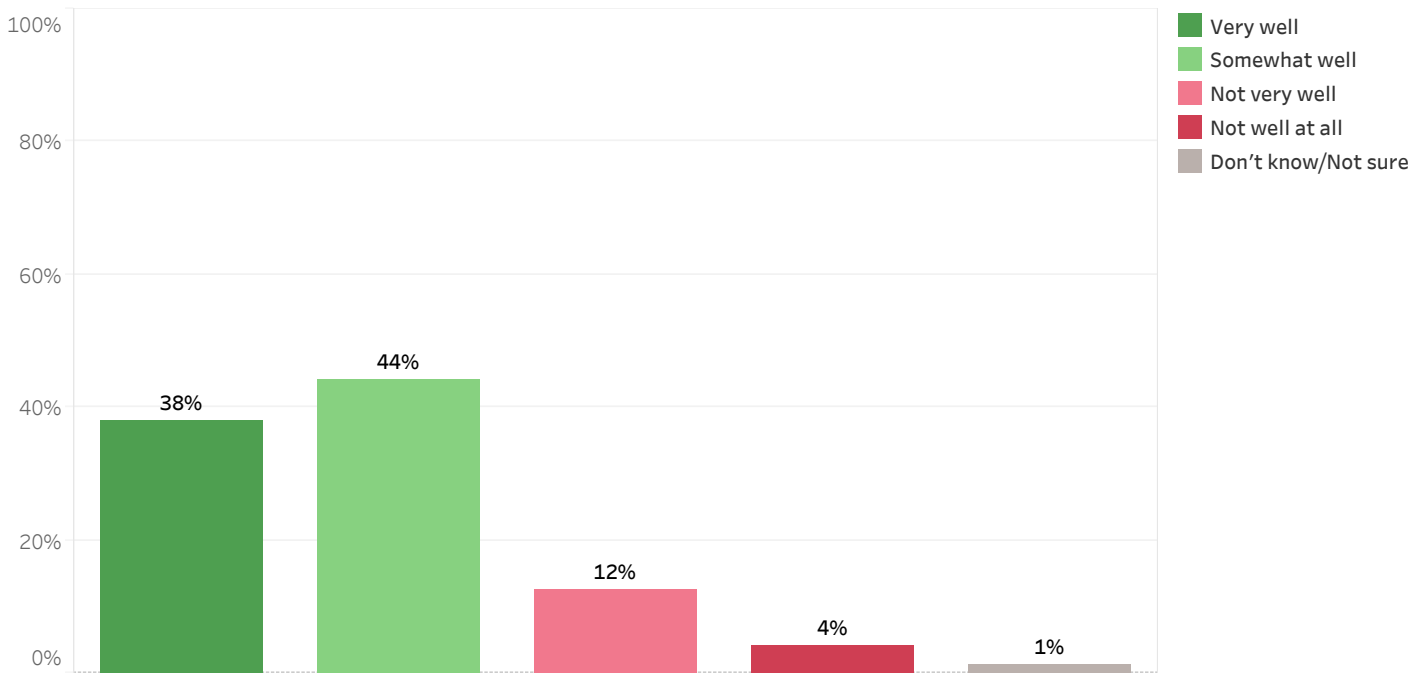
Should Debt Ceiling Increase be Tied to Budget Spending Reductions or Separate - By Party ID - May 2023

Despite most respondents having an opinion on the previous question, only 38% of New Hampshire residents say that they understand very well what the debt ceiling actually is. Forty-four percent say that they understand it somewhat well, 12% say they understand it not very well, 4% say they do not understand it well at all, and 1% are unsure. Ninety-four percent of Independents, 83% of Democrats, and 80% of Republicans say that they understand what the debt ceiling is very or somewhat well.

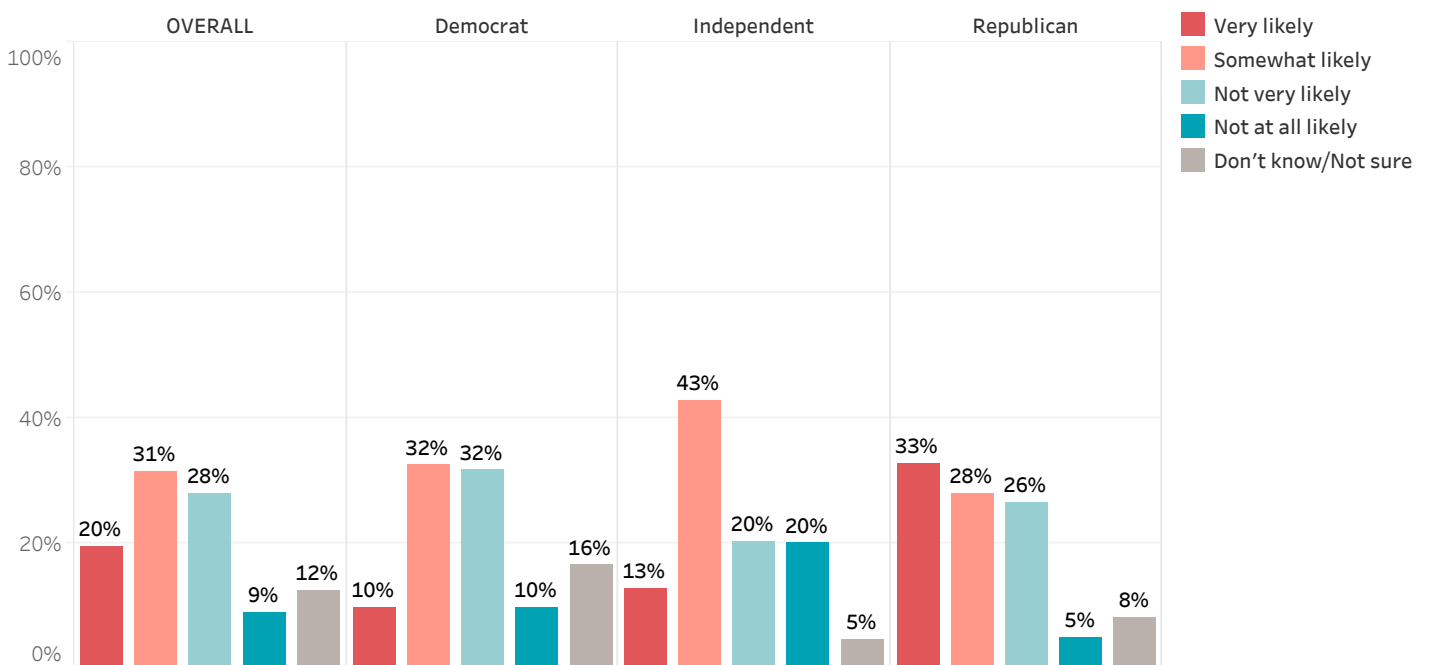
How Well Understand Debt Ceiling - May 2023



While negotiations about the debt ceiling continue, some observers are concerned that the debt ceiling could be breached in the coming months, which could lead to the federal government defaulting on its debts. Just over half (51%) of Granite Staters think it is very (20%) or somewhat (31%) likely that the debt ceiling will be breached in the coming months, 37% think it is not very likely (28%) or not at all likely (9%) that the debt ceiling will be breached, and 12% are unsure.

Majorities of Republicans (61%) and Independents (55%) think that it is very or somewhat likely that the debt ceiling will be breached but less than half of Democrats (42%) think that is very or somewhat likely to happen.

Perceived Likelihood of Breach of Debt Ceiling in Coming Months - By Party ID - May 2023

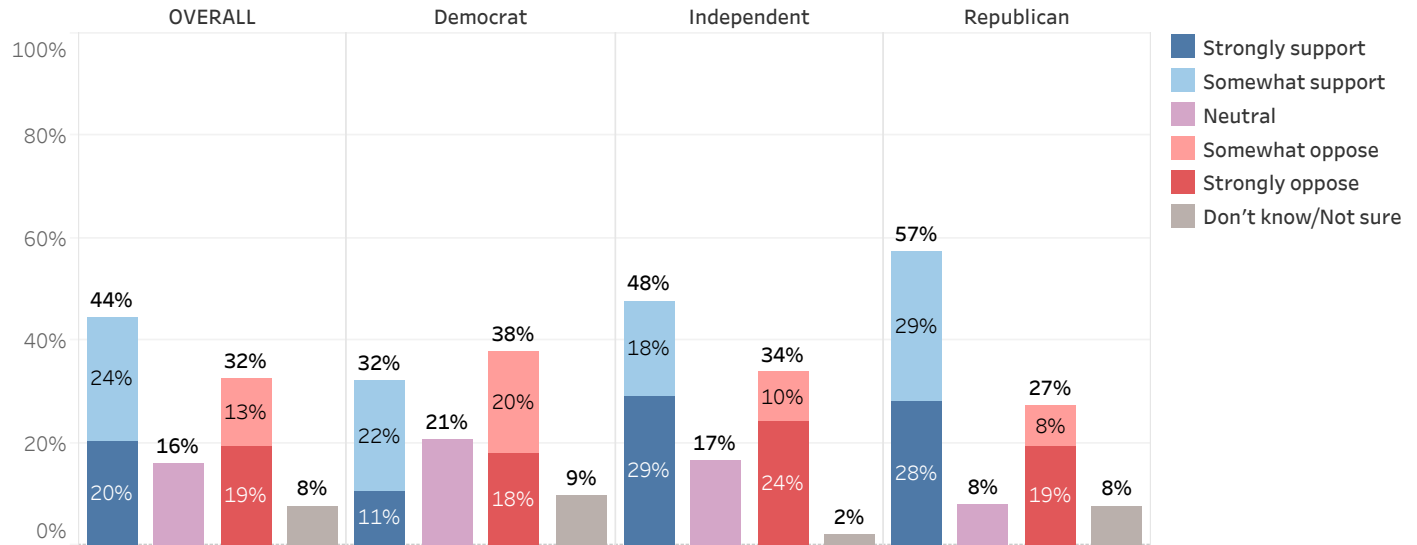


Immigration

Title 42 was an emergency health provision enacted in March 2020 which allowed U.S. officials to turn away migrants to help prevent the spread of COVID-19. Some in Congress have proposed granting the Biden administration emergency powers similar to Title 42 for the next two years to help control an increase in migrants trying to get into the U.S. across the Mexican border. More than half (53%) of Granite Staters say they have heard a lot about the end of Title 42, 32% have heard some about it, 7% have heard only a little, and only 7% have heard nothing about it at all.

Forty-four percent of New Hampshire residents strongly (20%) or somewhat (24%) support granting powers similar to Title 42 for the next two years, 32% are somewhat (13%) or strongly (19%) opposed, 16% are neutral on the question, and 8% are unsure. A majority of Republicans (57%) and a plurality of Independents (48%) support granting powers similar to Title 42 for the next two years, while Democrats are divided with 32% in support of such a measure, 38% opposed, and 30% neutral or unsure.

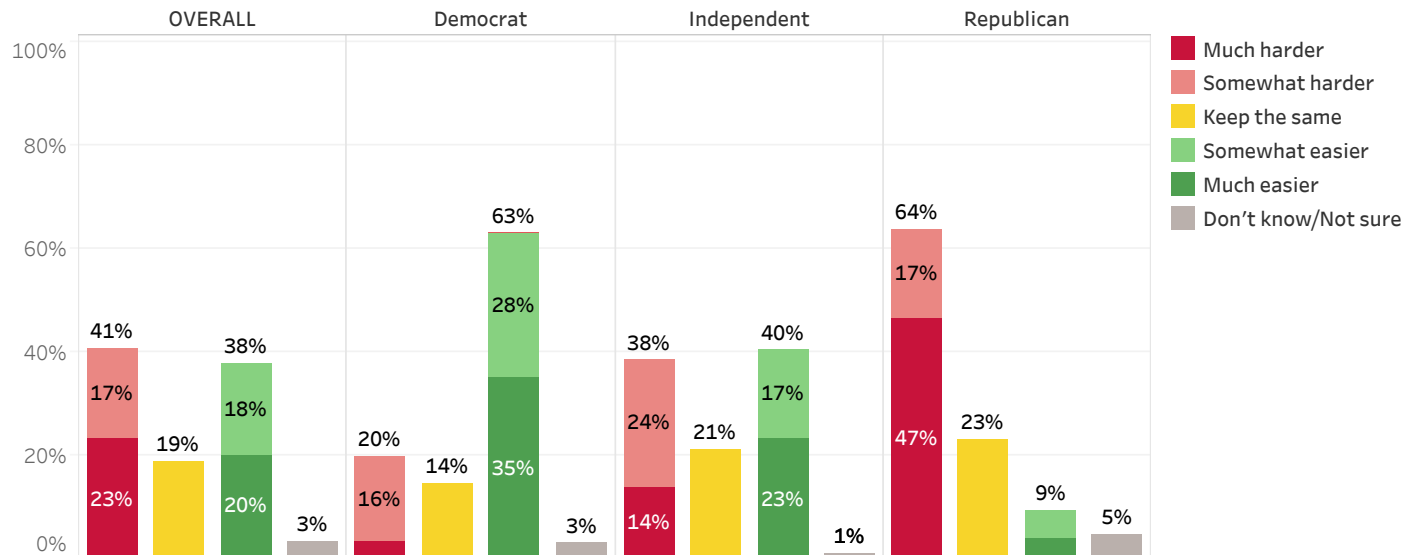
Support or Oppose Granting Powers Similar to Title 42 to Federal Government for Next Two Years - By Party ID - May 2023



Overall, 41% of New Hampshire residents think it should be much (23%) or somewhat (17%) harder for foreigners to seek asylum in the United States, 38% think it should be somewhat (18%) or much (20%) easier, 19% think it should remain about the same as it is now, and 3% are unsure.

There is a significant partisan divide on this issue: 64% of Republicans believe it should be harder for foreigners to seek asylum, 63% of Democrats think it should be easier to do so, and Independents are divided, with 38% saying seeking asylum should be harder and 40% saying it should be easier.

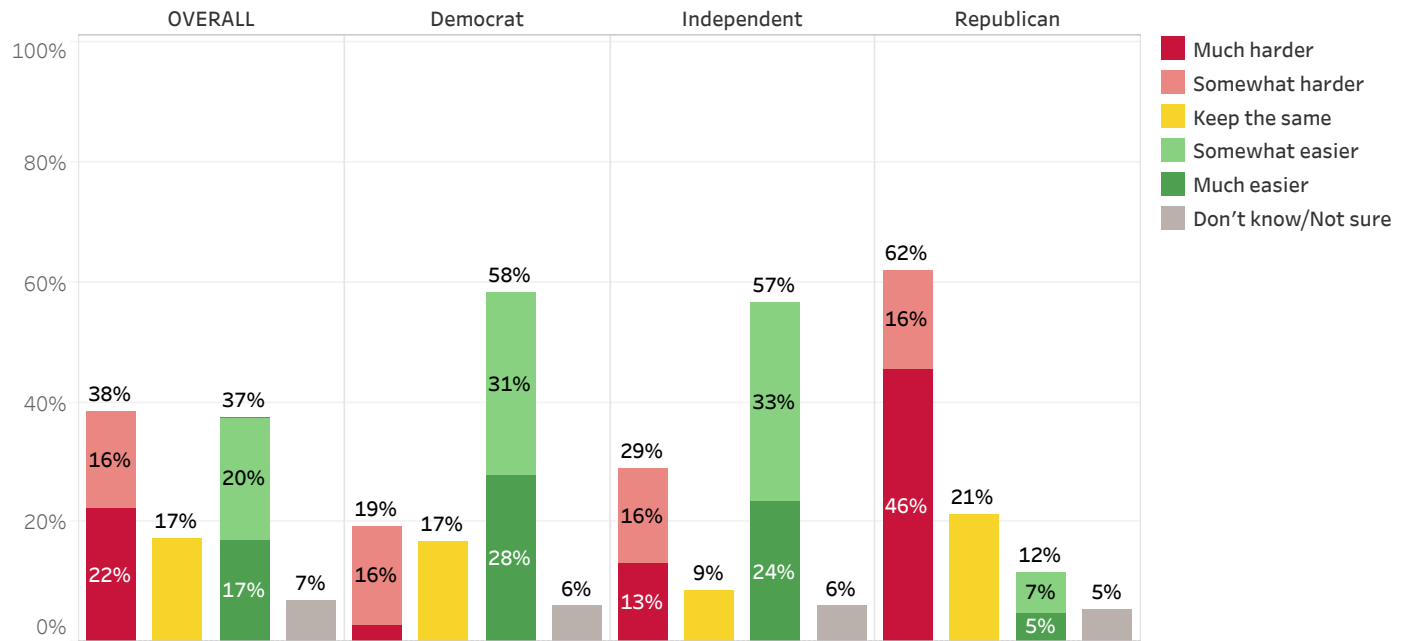
Should be Easier or Harder for Foreigners to Seek Asylum in U.S. - By Party ID - May 2023



New Hampshire residents are divided about making it harder or easier for people to immigrate to the U.S. -- 38% think it should be much (22%) or somewhat (16%) harder for foreigners to immigrate to the United States, 37% think it should be somewhat (20%) or much (17%) easier, 17% think it should remain about the same as it is now, and 7% are unsure.

A majority of Republicans (62%) believe it should be harder for foreigners to immigrate but majorities of Democrats (58%) and Independents (57%) feel it should be easier for them to do so.

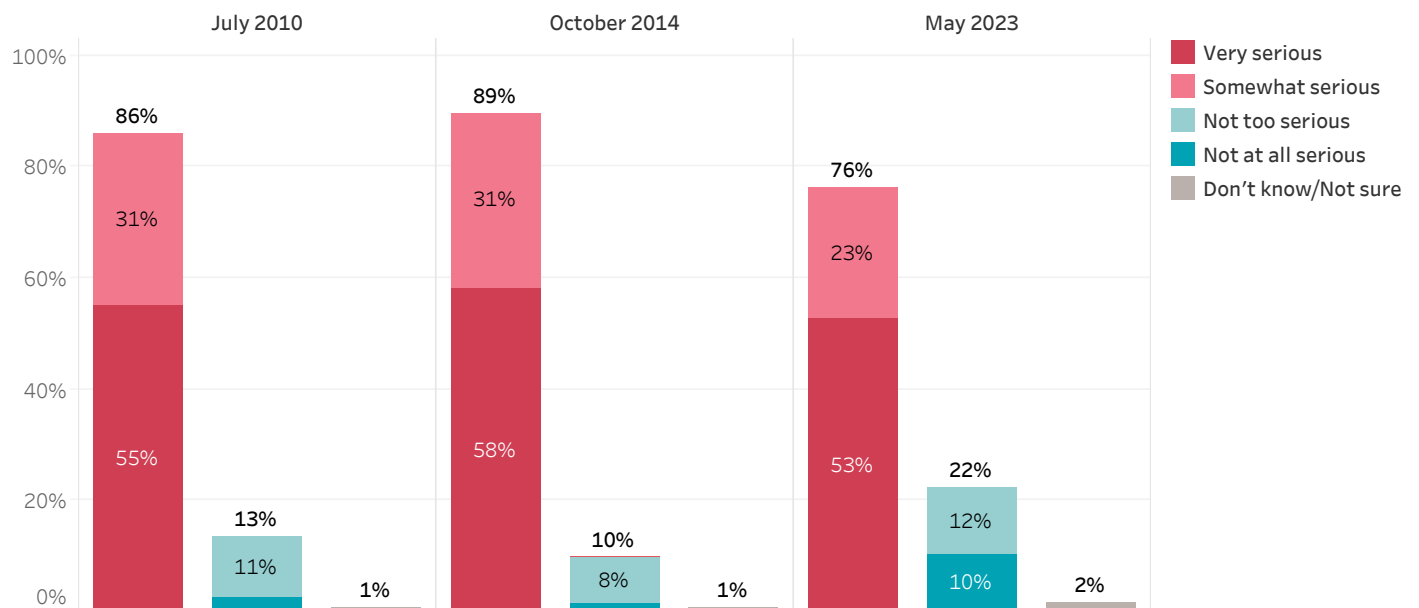
Should be Easier or Harder for Foreigners to Immigrate to U.S. - By Party ID - May 2023



Three-quarters (76%) of New Hampshire residents believe illegal immigration is a very (53%) or somewhat (23%) serious problem, 22% think it is not too serious (12%), or not at all serious (10%), and 2% are unsure. While most Granite Staters believe illegal immigration is a very or somewhat serious problem, a larger percentage believed this to be true in October 2014 (89%) and in July 2010 (86%).

Nearly all Republicans (99%) and two-thirds (67%) of Independents believe illegal immigration is a very or somewhat serious problem, but only 56% of Democrats agree. Democrats are less likely to think illegal immigration is a very or somewhat serious problem (56%) than they were in October 2014 (82%).

Seriousness of Illegal Immigration Problem in U.S.

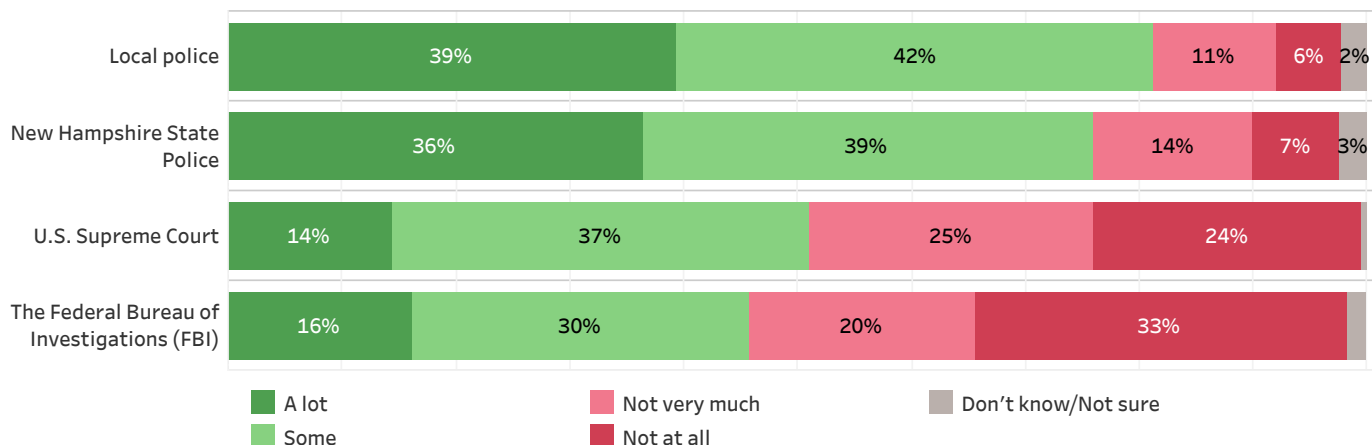


Trust in Institutions

Local and state law enforcement are more trusted by New Hampshire residents than either the Supreme Court or the FBI. Four in five (81%) say that they have a lot (39%) or some (42%) trust in their local police, only 17% say they have not very much trust (11%) or no trust at all (6%) in their local police and 2% are unsure. Similarly, 76% say they have a lot (36%) or some (39%) trust in the New Hampshire State Police.

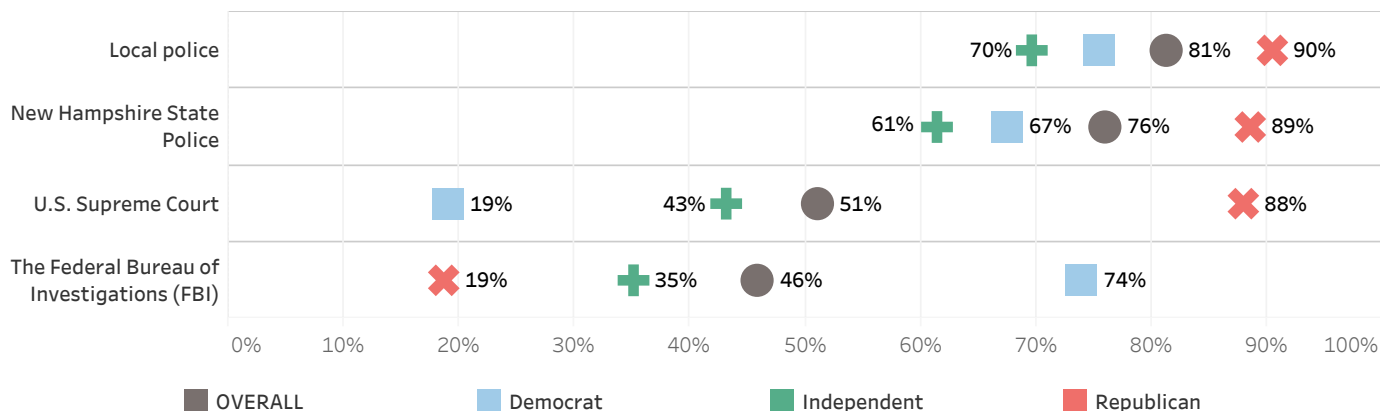
However, amid political concerns about both institutions, Granite Staters feel the U.S. Supreme Court and Federal Bureau of Investigations (FBI) are less trustworthy. Only 51% say they have a lot (14%) or some (37%) trust in the U.S. Supreme Court, 25% have not very much trust, 24% have no trust at all, and 1% are unsure. Similarly, only 46% say they have a lot (16%) or some (30%) trust in the FBI, 20% have not very much trust, 33% have no trust at all, and 2% are unsure.

Majorities of New Hampshire Republicans, Independents, and Democrats say that they have a lot or some trust in their local police and the New Hampshire State Police. However, opinions sharply diverge about the Supreme Court and the FBI. Eighty-eight percent of Republicans place a lot or some trust in the U.S. Supreme Court but only 43% of Independents and 19% of Democrats agree. By contrast, 74% of Democrats have a lot or some trust in the FBI but only 35% of Independents and 19% of Republicans feel that way.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, one hundred and five (1,105) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between May 18 and May 22, 2023. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.9 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the May 2023 Granite State Poll is 28%. The design effect for the survey is 2.6%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
