STOP EATING LOBSTERS? MAINERS SAY NO

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
DURHAM, NH - Few Maine residents say they will heed a recommendation by Seafood Watch to avoid the state's most famous food because of the potential threat to right whales because of lobster fishing. Majorities support making the COVID-era "to-go" alcohol sale policy permanent and a proposed ban on the sale of flavored cigarettes, while a plurality support banning pharmacies from selling tobacco products. Housing, the cost of living, and jobs or the economy are most often cited by residents as the most important problem facing the state.

Lobster Policy

In 2022, Seafood Watch, a conservation program operated by the Monterey Bay Aquarium in California, recommended that seafood customers avoid lobster from the U.S. and Canada due to the threat posed to right whales getting entangled in lobster fishing gear.

Few Mainers say they will heed this recommendation: only 7% say that Seafood Watch's recommendation will make them less likely to eat lobster, 19% say that it actually makes them more likely to eat lobster, 56% say it makes no difference, 15% say that they never eat lobster, and 3% are unsure. Self-described conservatives and libertarians and those aged 65 and older are more likely than others to say that Seafood Watch's recommendation makes them more likely to eat lobster, while socialists and progressives and those under the age of thirty-five are more likely than others to say that this makes them less likely to eat lobster.

Effect of Seafood Watch Recommendation to Avoid Maine Lobster on Likelihood of Eating Lobster



Alcohol Policy


A recently passed law in Maine makes permanent a rule allowing restaurants and bars to serve alcoholic beverages to-go. The bill requires these drinks to be labeled and be placed in the trunk of a vehicle. A majority (55%) of Mainers say they strongly (36%) or somewhat (19%) support this measure, 18% are neutral, 25% are somewhat (8%) or strongly (17%) opposed to it, and 1% are unsure. Most of those under the age of thirty-five (79%) and a slim majority of those aged 35 to 49 (52%) support this measure while pluralities of those aged 50 to 64 (47%) and 65 and older (46%) support this measure.

Support Allowing Alcohol "To-Go" Permanently - June 2023 - By Age




The Maine State Legislature is considering a bill which would ban the sale of flavored cigarettes in Maine. A slim majority (51%) of Mainers say they strongly (41%) or somewhat (10%) support banning the sale of flavored cigarettes in Maine, 16% are neutral on the question, 31% strongly (23%) or somewhat (8%) oppose banning flavored cigarettes, and 1% are unsure. Most Democrats (70%) support banning flavored cigarettes, but only a plurality of Independents (44%) support banning them and a plurality of Republicans (43%) oppose banning them.

The State Legislature is also considering a bill which would prohibit pharmacies from selling any tobacco products. Just under half (46%) of Mainers say they strongly (37%) or somewhat (8%) support banning pharmacies from selling tobacco products in Maine, 33% strongly (24%) or somewhat (9%) oppose this, 20% are neutral on the question, and 2% are unsure. A majority of Democrats (63%) support banning pharmacies from selling tobacco products, nearly half (49%) of Republicans oppose it, and Independents are more divided, with 27% in support, 37% opposed, and 35% neutral or unsure.


Support Ban on Pharmacies Selling Tobacco Products - By Party ID



Gubernatorial Approval

Governor Janet Mills continues to be a popular governor among Maine residents but her approval rating has fallen slightly over the past two months. Currently, 55% of Maine residents approve of Governor Mills' job performance, 42% disapprove, and 4% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Mills' net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) is +13, down from +23 in April.

Ninety-three percent of Democrats and 48% of Independents approve of Mills' performance as governor, but only 12% of Republicans approve.




Most Important Problem

A quarter (25%) of Maine residents believe housing is the most important problem facing the state, while 16% believe the cost of living is the most important problem and 14% believe jobs or the economy is most important. Seven percent mention the political left or leftist politicians, 6% mention climate change or the environment, 4% each mention a lack of workforce, taxes, or immigration, and 3% each mention homelessness or healthcare. Two percent or less say the most important problem facing the state is the state budget (2%), drugs or addiction (2%), the political right or rightist politicians (2%), education (1%), demographic problems (1%), infrastructure (1%), welfare issues or abuse (1%), or abortion or women's rights (1%). Mainers are more likely than in February to cite housing as the most important problem facing the state while they are slightly less likely to mention the cost of living.

Democrats are most likely to cite housing as the most important problem facing the state, Independents are most likely to mention jobs or the economy or the cost of living, and Republicans are about equally split in mentioning housing, the political left, the cost of living, and jobs or the economy.

Pine Tree State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Pine Tree State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Seven hundred and sixty-nine (769) Pine Tree State Panel members completed the survey online between June 15 and June 19, 2023. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.5 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the June 2023 Pine Tree State Poll is 29%. The design effect for the survey is 2.3%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the ME Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in Maine.

The Pine Tree State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of Maine residents. Approximately 2,500 Maine adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
