MOST GRANITE STATERS HAVE 4TH OF JULY PLANS, PLURALITY SEE OUT-OF-STATE TOURISTS AS NET POSITIVE FOR NH

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
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DURHAM, NH - More than four-fifths of New Hampshire residents plan to celebrate the 4th of July holiday in some way and more than three-quarters plan to travel on a vacation this summer. Three-quarters of state residents say that out-of-state tourists contribute a lot or some to traffic and noise in their local area but about the same amount also say they contribute a lot or some to the local economy and a plurality say they have a positive effect on New Hampshire overall.

4th of July Holiday & Summer Vacations

With the Fourth of July holiday around the corner, most New Hampshire residents have made plans for celebrating the holiday. Nearly half (47%) of Granite Staters say that they plan on visiting friends or family, 34% plan on attending a cookout, 25% will go to a fireworks show, 10% plan on attending a parade, 9% will go to the beach, 7% plan on going for a hike, and 17% say they plan to do something else. Only 17% say they don't plan to do anything for the 4th of July holiday.

Those with a household income below \$75,000 are more likely than those with higher incomes to say they don't plan on doing anything to celebrate the 4th of July.




4th of July Holiday Plans

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Forty-one percent of New Hampshire residents plan to travel somewhere in New Hampshire for vacation this summer, 34% plan to travel somewhere else in the United States, 27% plan to stay at their home on vacation, 8% plan to travel outside of the United States, and 25% don't plan on taking any vacations this summer at all. Those with a college degree are more likely than those without a college degree to plan on taking a vacation this summer.

Those who plan to take vacation days off from their work between now and Labor Day (N=468) plan to take a median of ten days off from work. Those under the age of thirty-five plan on taking slightly fewer vacation days than those aged thirty-five or older.




Summer Travel Plans - June 2023

Impact of Tourists on New Hampshire

Forty-four percent of Granite Staters believe that tourists from outside of New Hampshire contribute a lot to the local economy, 30% say they contribute some to the local economy, 11% say they contribute only a little, 3% say they do not contribute at all, and 12% are unsure or say the question is not applicable. Respondents gave similar answers in June 2021.


North Country and Seacoast residents are most likely to say that out-of-state tourists contribute a lot to the local economy.



How Much Out of State Tourists Contribute to Local Economy

The downside of tourism is the additional traffic. Forty-nine percent of Granite Staters say that tourists from outside of New Hampshire contribute a lot to traffic and noise in their local area, 26% say they contribute some, 12% say they contribute only a little, 6% say they do not contribute at all, and 8% are unsure or say the question is not applicable. Respondents gave similar answers in June 2021.


North Country, Seacoast, and Manchester Area residents are most likely to say that out of state tourists contribute a lot to traffic and noise in their local area.



How Much Out of State Tourists Contribute to Local Traffic and Noise

Overall, 42% of Granite Staters feel that the overall impact of tourists from outside of New Hampshire is very (16%) or somewhat (26%) positive for the state, 37% think they have a mixed effect, only 13% think that tourists from outside the state have a very (4%) or somewhat (9%) negative impact, and 8% are unsure.

Central/Lakes Region and Seacoast residents, those aged 65 and older, and self-identified Democrats are more likely to say that the overall impact of tourists from outside New Hampshire is very or somewhat positive.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, one hundred and thirty-six (1,136) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between June 15 and June 19, 2023. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.3 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the June 2023 Granite State Poll is 28%. The design effect for the survey is 2.7%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 8,000 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
