DURHAM, N.H. – Northeast Passage is partnering with the American Canoe Association to offer a four-day Adaptive Paddling Workshop, training regional kayaking instructors and enthusiasts in the theory and techniques of adaptive paddling.

On the final day of the course, students with disabilities are teamed with instructors to practice their new skills and test their adaptations in an open water group paddle.

The Adaptive Paddling Workshop includes instruction on how to compensate for a paddler's loss of function due to disability, adaptation techniques for equipment and instruction, how to focus on the paddler's ability, and facility and program accessibility. The course involves classroom and hands-on learning.
