SUNUNU JOB APPROVAL STAYS HIGH; COST OF HOUSING MOST IMPORTANT PROBLEM

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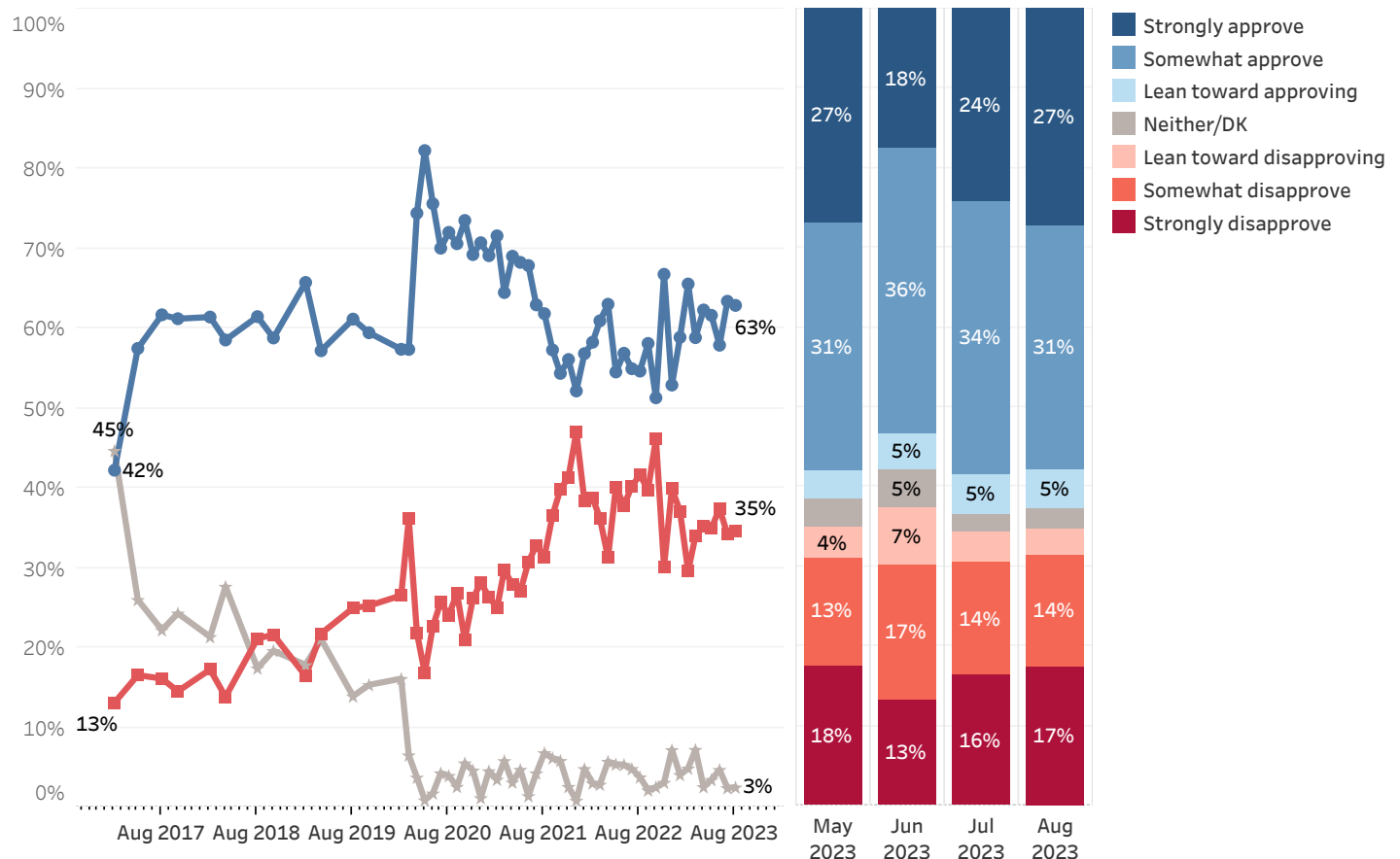
DURHAM, NH - New Hampshire Governor Chris Sununu continues to have high approval ratings after his announcement not to run in 2024. Nearly half of state residents say Sununu is above average or one of NH's best governors. Former Senator Kelly Ayotte is the best-known of several candidates seeking to replace Sununu. The high cost of housing remains the most important problem facing the state.

Gubernatorial Approval

Chris Sununu, first elected governor in 2016, has announced he will not seek reelection in 2024. He will leave office as a popular governor. Currently, 63% of New Hampshire residents approve of Governor Sununu's job performance, 35% disapprove, and 3% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Sununu's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) is +28, unchanged since July (+29).

Ninety-one percent of Republicans and 69% of Independents approve of Sununu's performance as governor but only 34% of Democrats agree.

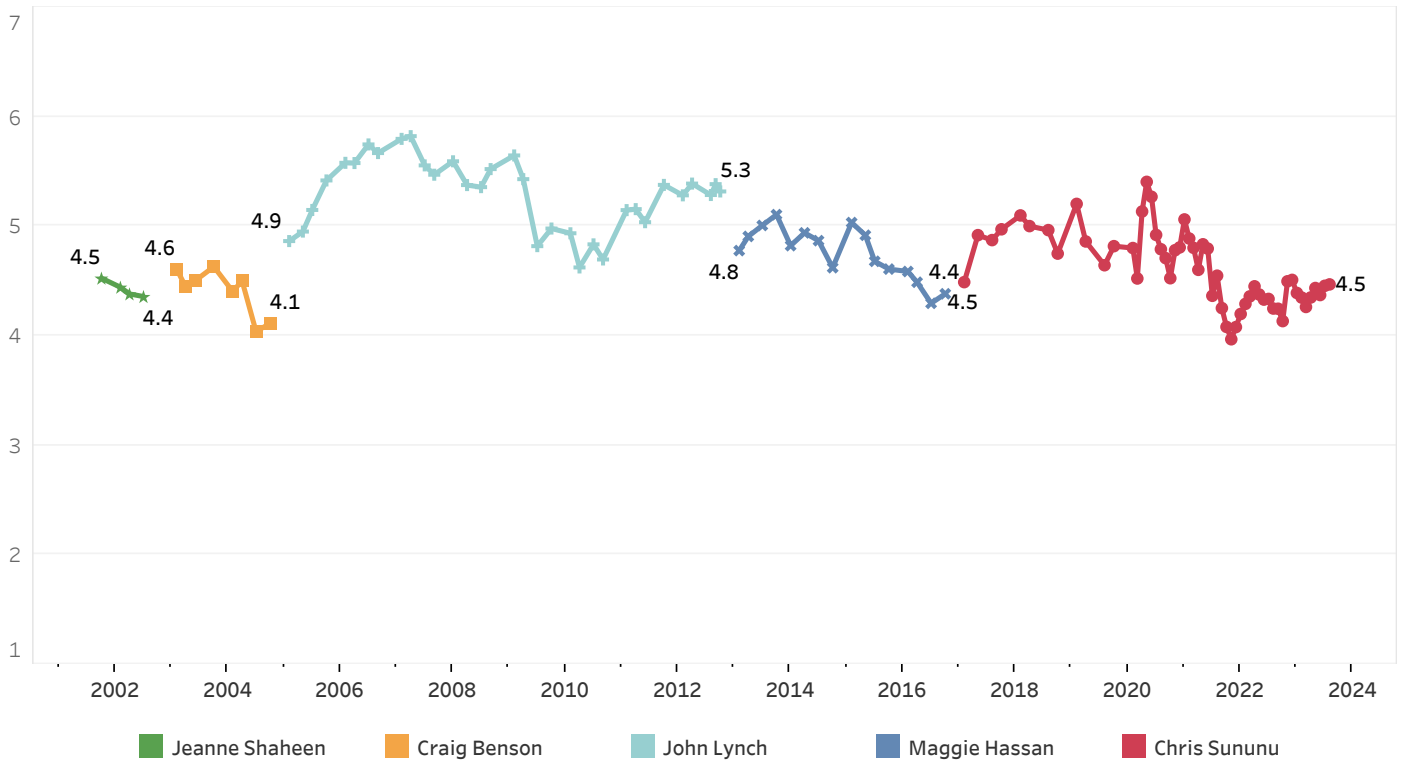
Approval of Governor Sununu's Job Performance

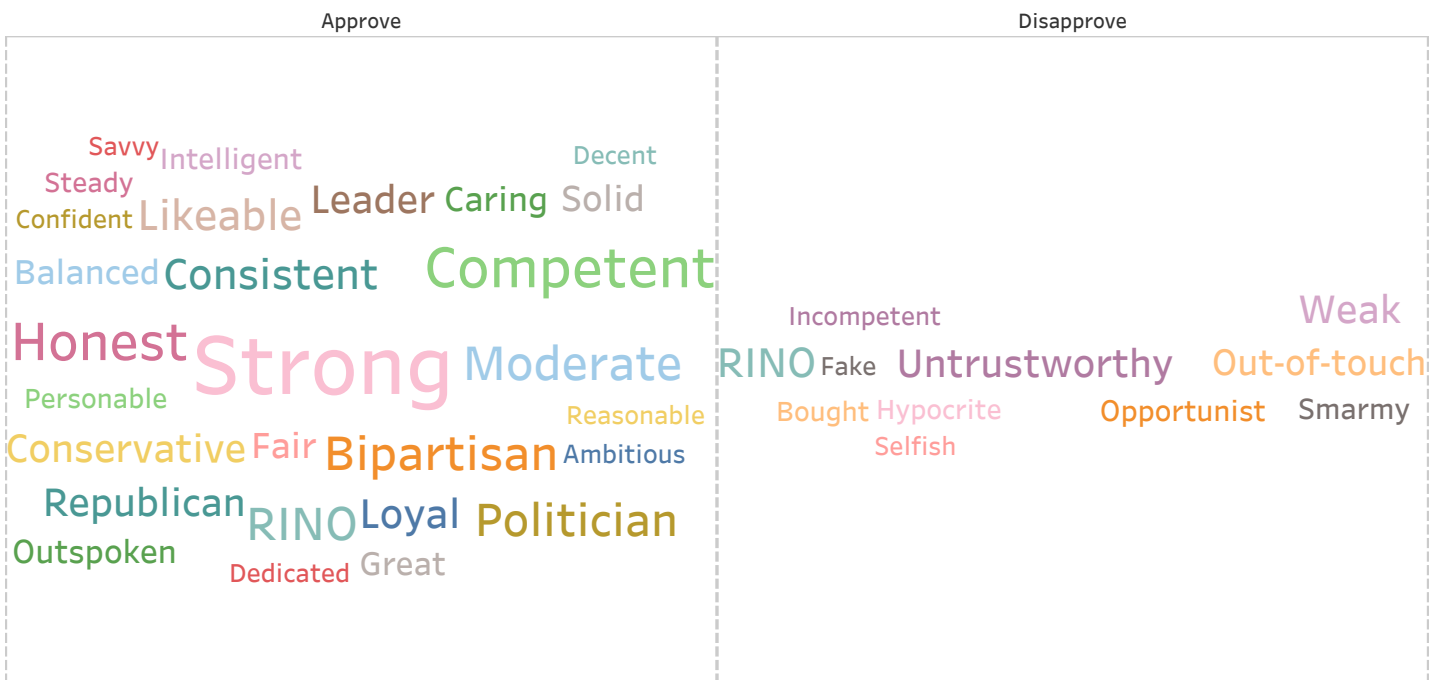
On a scale where "strongly approve" equals 7 and "strongly disapprove" equals 1, Sununu's average approval score (4.5) has been largely unchanged since May. Sununu's approval score is slightly lower than that of his predecessors Maggie Hassan (4.7) and John Lynch (5.0) in the penultimate summer of their governorships.

Respondents were asked what one word they would use to describe Governor Sununu. Those who approve of Sununu's performance as governor most use often the words "strong," "competent," "honest," "bipartisan," and "moderate." Those who disapprove of Sununu's performance most often mention the words "unprepared," "RINO," "untrustworthy," "weak," and "unfit."

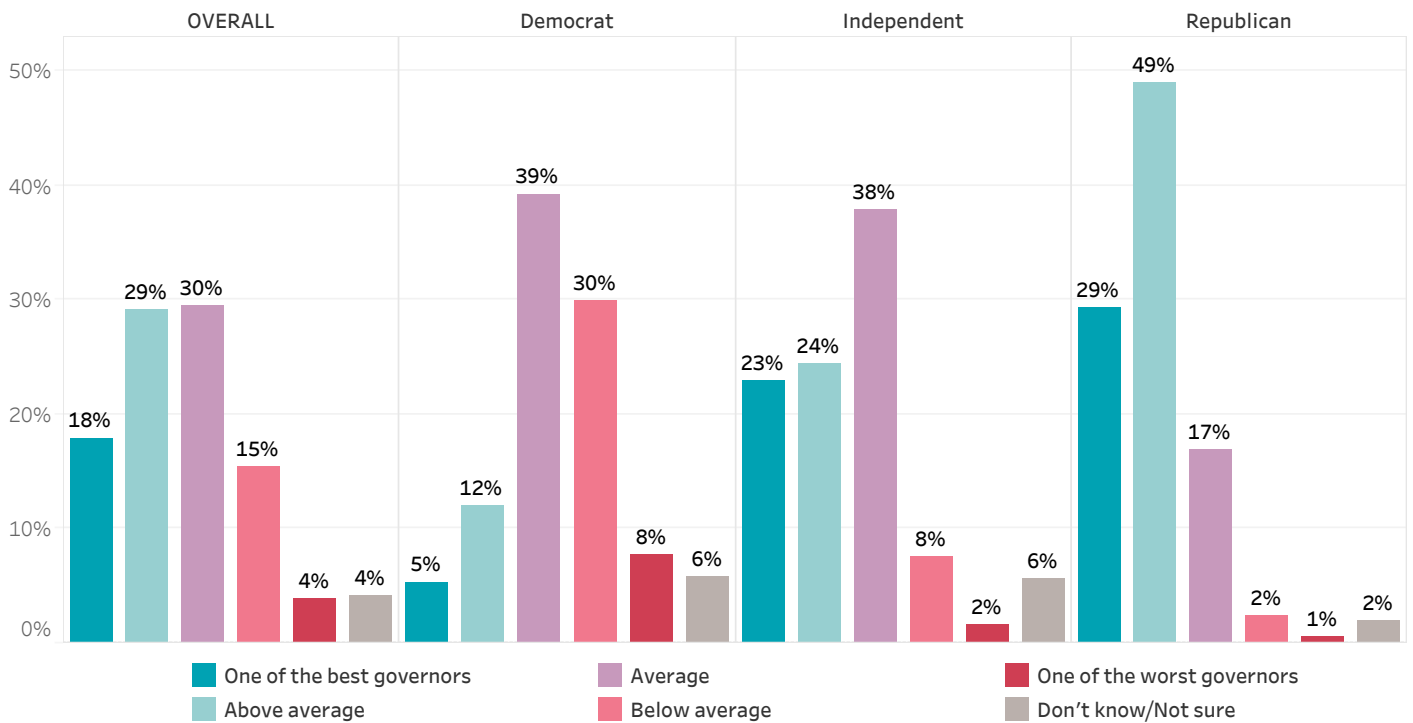
One Word to Describe Sununu



Overall, Granite Staters have a positive view of Sununu's tenure: 18% believe that Sununu is one of the best governors in the state's history, 29% think he is above average, 30% think he is an average governor, 15% think he is below average, 4% think he is one of the worst governors in the state's history, and 4% are unsure.

Among Democrats, 17% think Sununu is one of the best governors in the state's history or above average while 38% think he is below average or one of the worst governors. Independents are more positive, with 47% believing he is one of the best governors or above average and only 9% believing he is below average or one of the worst governors. Republicans are very positive in their assessment of Sununu: 29% think he is one of the state's best governors and 49% think he is above average.

Sununu Compared to Other Governors - by Party ID

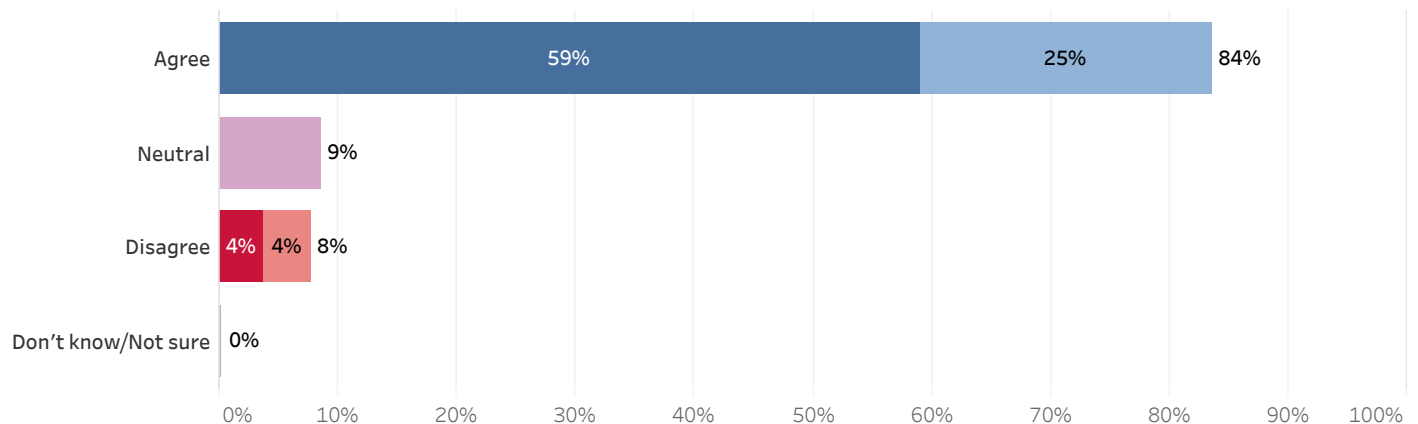


In his announcement that he will not seek another term as governor, Sununu stated that:

"Public service should never be a career...Four terms is a lot, to be sure, but it's just time to understand that it's not a public career. It's public service, right?"

The vast majority (84%) of New Hampshire residents strongly (59%) or somewhat (25%) agree with Sununu that holding elected office should not be a person's career, 9% are neutral, 8% strongly (4%) or somewhat (4%) disagree and less than 1% are unsure. This assessment is bipartisan: 90% of Republicans, 80% of Democrats, and 75% of Independents agree that holding elected office should not be a person's career.

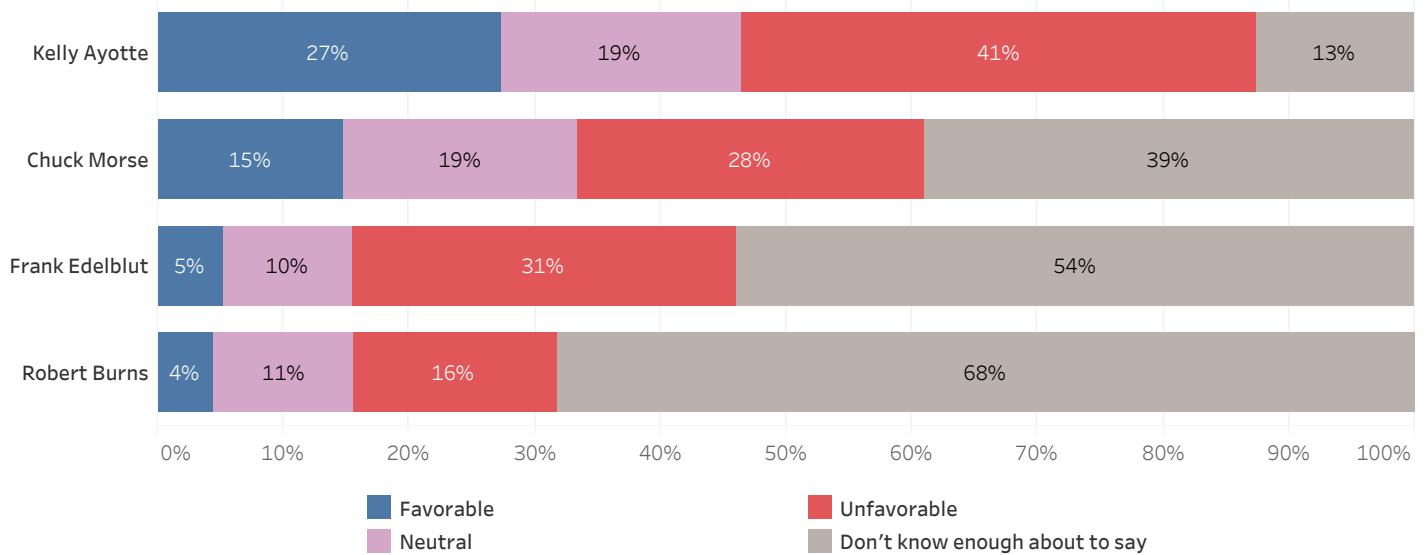
Agree or Disagree with Sununu's Statement About Politics as a Career



Prospective 2024 Gubernatorial Candidates

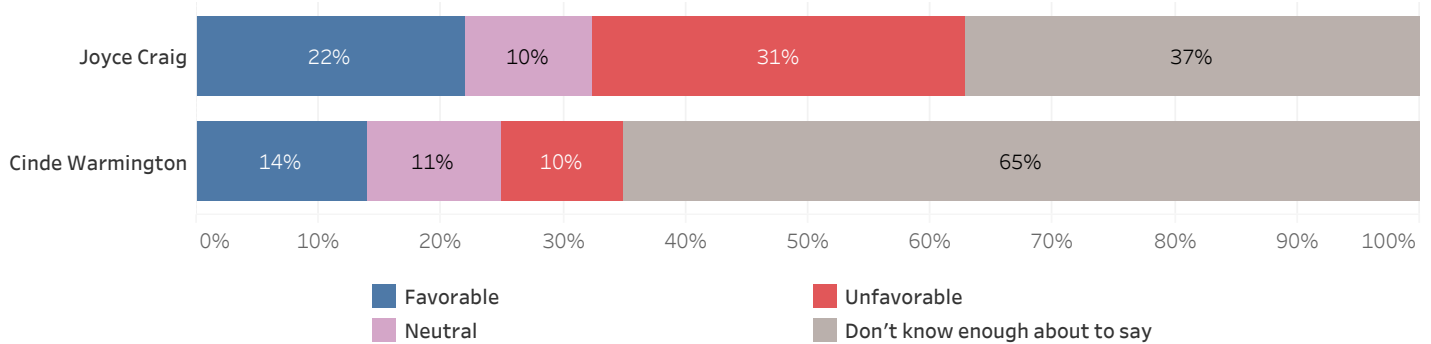
Since Sununu announced that he will not seek another term, several Republican candidates have either announced they will seek the office or are believed to be considering running. Former Senator Kelly Ayotte is the best-known candidate by a considerable margin, over a quarter (27%) of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Ayotte, 19% are neutral, 41% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 13% don't know enough about her to say. Ayotte's net favorability rating, the percentage who have a favorable opinion her minus the percentage who have an unfavorable opinion, is -14. Former Hillsborough County Treasurer Robert Burns (-12) and former New Hampshire Senate President Chuck Morse (-13) have similar net favorability ratings, but are less well-known. New Hampshire Department of Education Commissioner Frank Edelblut (-25) is the least popular of potential GOP candidates.

Turning to prospective Democratic candidates, 22% have a favorable opinion of Manchester Mayor Joyce Craig, 10% are neutral, 31% have an unfavorable opinion of her, and 37% don't know enough about her to have an opinion. Craig's net favorability rating is -9. Executive Councilor Cinde Warmington is less well-known: 14% have a favorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, 10% have an unfavorable opinion, and 65% don't know enough to have an opinion. Warmington's net favorability rating is +4.

Favorability of Prospective 2024 Democratic Gubernatorial Candidates

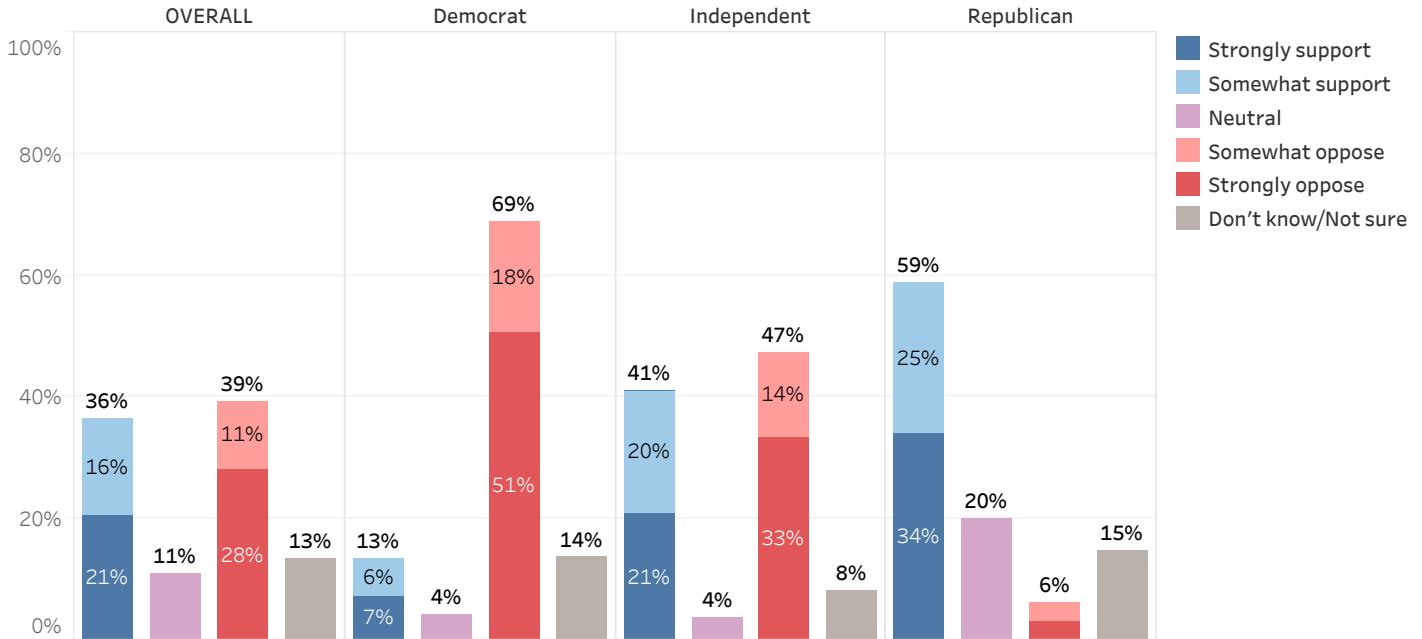


Education Freedom Accounts

In 2021, the New Hampshire Legislature passed a law creating "Education Freedom Accounts," allowing eligible New Hampshire students to use state education funds to pay for private or religious schools. This law is not well-known in the state with only 18% saying they have heard a lot about this, 34% have heard some about it, 29% have not heard very much, and 18% have heard nothing at all about it.

Granite Staters are divided about Education Freedom Accounts: 36% strongly (21%) or somewhat (16%) support the law, 11% are neutral, 39% strongly (28%) or somewhat (11%) oppose it, and 13% are unsure. More than two-thirds (69%) of Democrats oppose this law while 59% of Republicans support it.

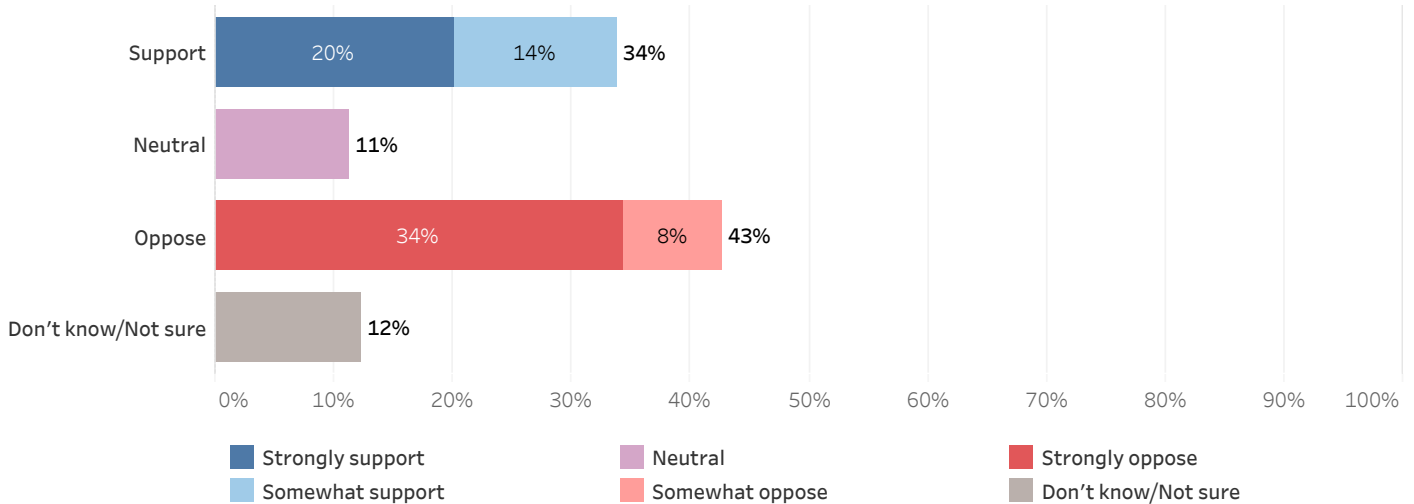
Support Education Freedom Accounts - By Party ID - August 2023



Currently, only students from low to middle-income families are eligible for Education Freedom Accounts. Several candidates for governor of New Hampshire have called for eliminating this eligibility requirement so that all New Hampshire students would be eligible for Education Freedom Accounts.

A plurality of New Hampshire residents (43%) strongly (34%) or somewhat (8%) oppose making all students eligible for Education Freedom Accounts, 11% are neutral, 34% strongly (20%) or somewhat (14%) support doing this, and 12% are unsure. Half (50%) of Republicans support making all students eligible for Education Freedom Accounts but only 29% of Independents and 20% of Democrats agree.

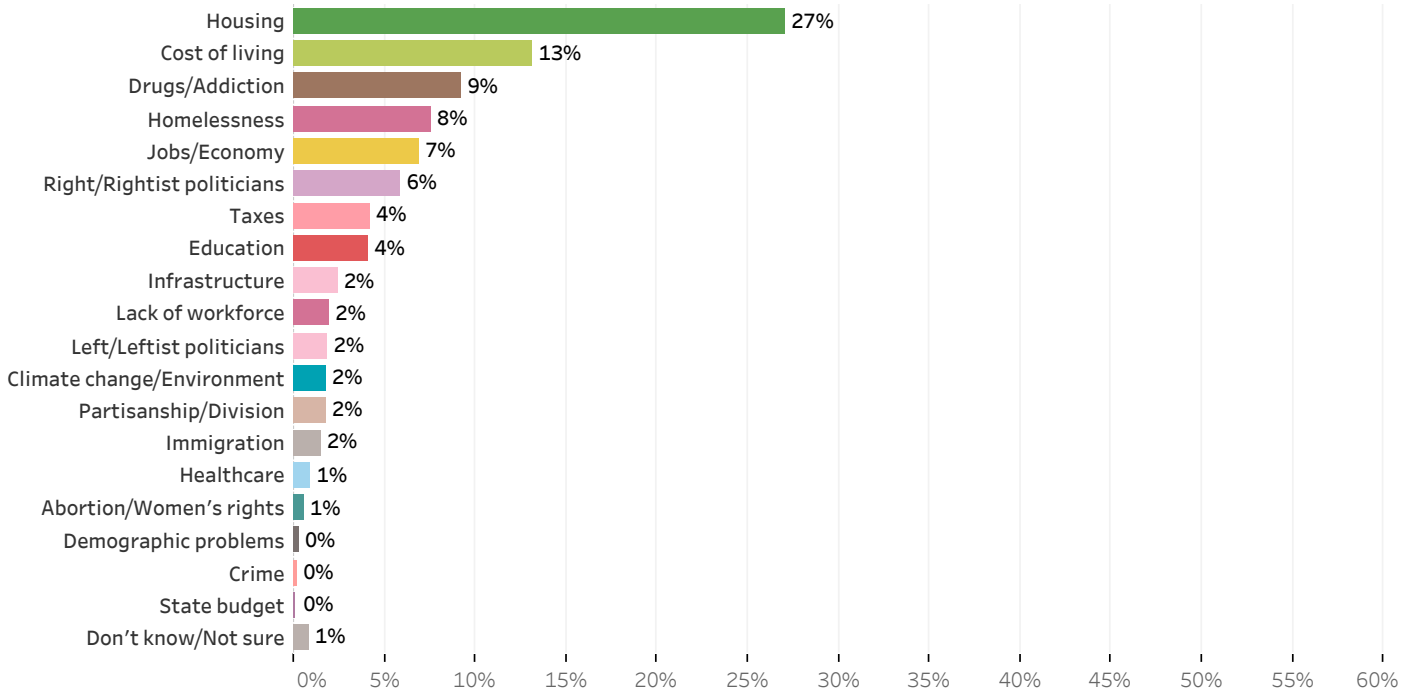
Support Making Education Freedom Accounts Available to All Students - August 2023



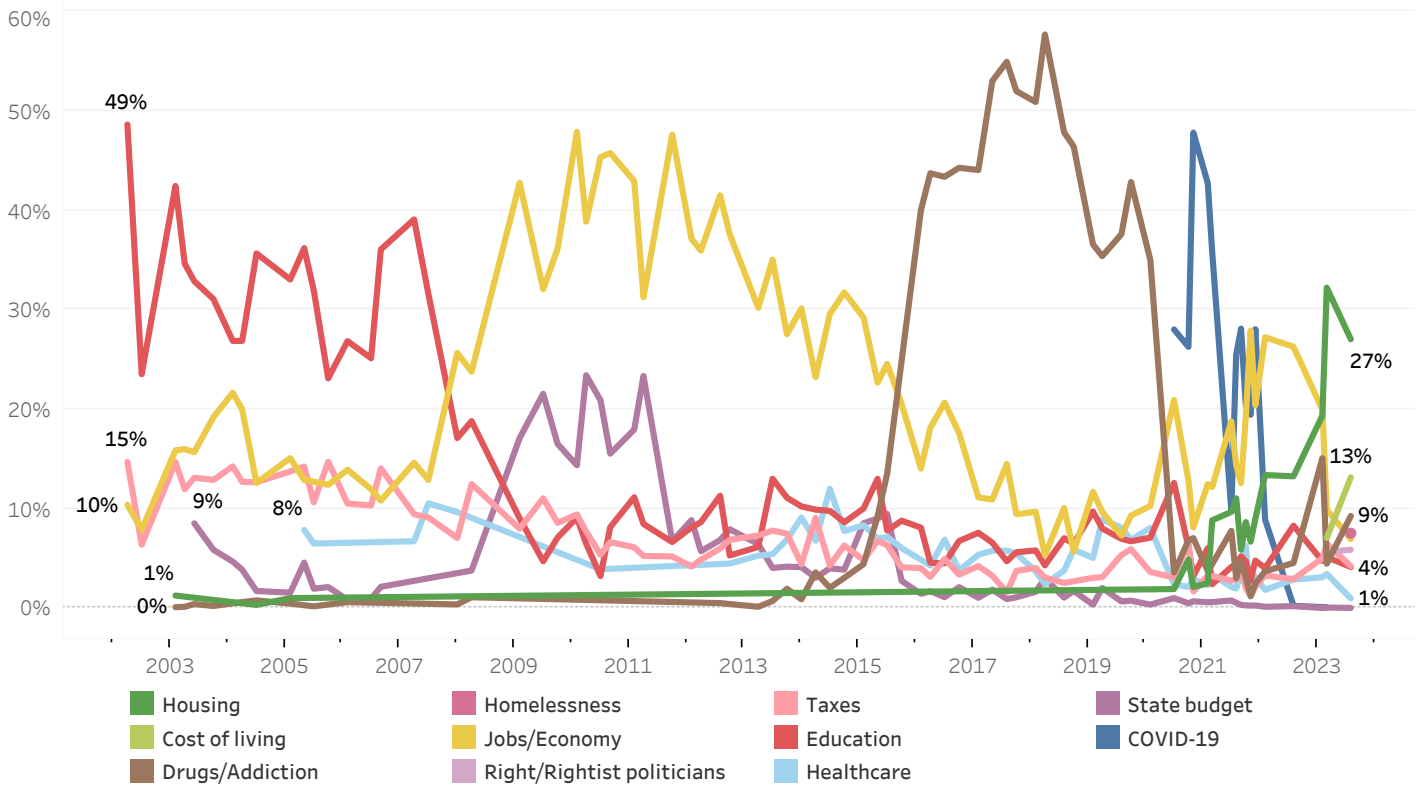
Most Important Problem

When asked what they believe is the most important problem facing New Hampshire, 27% of Granite Staters mention housing, followed by the cost of living (13%), drugs or addiction (9%), homelessness (8%), jobs or the economy (7%), the political right or rightist politicians (6%), taxes (4%), and education (4%). The percentage of people who cite the cost of living as the most important problem in the state (13%) has increased since March (7%).

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, one hundred and fifty-six (1,156) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between August 17 and August 21, 2023. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.9 percent. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the August 2023 Granite State Poll is 28%. The design effect for the survey is 2.9%.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire.

The Granite State Panel is part of an effort by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center to investigate new ways of gathering and understanding the opinion of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,250 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from randomly-selected landline and cell phone numbers to participate in the panel. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%.
