SUN GOES OUT OVER NEW HAMPSHIRE, GRANITE STATERS TOOK NOTE

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
DURHAM, NH - Fifteen percent of New Hampshire residents traveled to get a better look at the April 2024 solar eclipse and another 48% took time out of their day to view. Among those who traveled to see the eclipse, half spent more than five hours traveling but nearly all said they were satisfied with their trip. Many who did not travel to see the eclipse said that traffic was the reason.

April Solar Eclipse

A solar eclipse passed over New Hampshire on April 8th. A small part of Northern New Hampshire experienced a total eclipse while the rest of the state experienced a partial eclipse. Fifteen percent of Granite Staters traveled outside of their town to see the eclipse, another 48% stayed home, but took time out of their day to see the eclipse, 22% did not purposefully take time out of their day but saw at least some of the eclipse, 12% did not see the eclipse at all, and 2% don't know or can't remember.

Democrats and women are more likely than others to have traveled outside of their hometown or taken time out of their day to see the eclipse while Republicans, men, and those with a high school education or less are less likely to have done this.


What Did You Do for April 8th Eclipse - April 2024


Among those who saw at least some of the eclipse (N=1,164), only 16% saw a total eclipse, 81% saw a partial eclipse, and 3% are unsure. Among those who traveled outside of their town to see the eclipse (N=210), 66% saw a total eclipse, 26% saw a partial eclipse, and 7% are unsure. By contrast, only 6% of those who stayed at home but took time out of their day to see the eclipse and 4% of those who did not purposefully take time out of their day to view the eclipse but saw some of it, saw a total eclipse.

Viewed Partial or Total Eclipse - By What Did for Eclipse - April 2024




Among those who traveled outside of their town or city to see the eclipse (N=210), 26% say that they spent less than an hour in total traveling to see the eclipse, 11% spent 1-2 hours traveling, 16% traveled for 3-4 hours, 10% traveled for 5-6 hours, 8% traveled for 6-8 hours, and 30% spent more than 8 hours traveling.

Total Time Spent Traveling on Eclipse Trip - April 2024




Despite widespread interest, the April eclipse was not much of a money maker for New Hampshire businesses. Among those who traveled outside of their town or city to see the eclipse, 28% say that they spent nothing on their trip to see the eclipse, 22% say that they spent between \$1 and \$49, 19% spent between \$50 and \$99, 24% spent between \$100 and \$499, and 8% spent \$500 or more. The median respondent reports spending \$20 in total.





Among those who traveled outside of their town to see the eclipse, the majority (92%) were very (69%) or somewhat (22%) satisfied with their trip, 2% were neither satisfied nor dissatisfied, 6% were somewhat (4%) or very (2%) dissatisfied, and less than 1% were unsure. Eighty-four percent of those who traveled and saw a total eclipse were very satisfied with their trip while only 52% of those who traveled, but saw only a partial eclipse, were very satisfied.

Overall Satisfaction with Eclipse Trip - By Seeing Total or Partial Eclipse - April 2024




Among those who stayed at home but took time out of their day to see the eclipse (N=652), 55% said that they decided not to travel to see the eclipse because they were happy with their viewing opportunities locally, but 42% were concerned about traffic. Smaller percentages said they didn't travel because of a lack of interest (8%), the cost being too high (8%), not being available during the eclipse (8%), or being unable to find accommodations (2%).





Among those who did not purposefully take time out of their day to see the eclipse but saw some of it or did not see the eclipse at all (N=466), 39% decided not to take time to view the eclipse because of a lack of interest, 34% say that they weren't available during the eclipse, 20% say the cost was too high, and 4% say they were outside of the state at the time.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, three hundred and fifty-nine (1,359) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online between April 18 and April 22, 2024. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 2.7 percent. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the April 2024 Granite State Poll is 32%. The design effect for the survey is 2.1%.

The Granite State Panel is a probability-based web panel of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 7,500 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted by human coders.
