HEALEY'S POPULARITY DECLINES, HOUSING & IMMIGRATION SEEN AS MOST IMPORTANT PROBLEMS



DURHAM, NH - Massachusetts residents are divided on Maura Healey's performance as governor and her approval rating has declined since May. Housing and immigration are cited most often as the most important problems facing Massachusetts and half of state residents feel the commonwealth is headed in the right direction. A plurality support the 2021 MBTA Communities law requiring communities with access to the MBTA to zone for multifamily housing. Bay Staters show very little interest in renaming Logan Airport after Bill Russell, though many residents are ambivalent or have no opinion on the issue.

Gubernatorial Approval

Currently, 45% of Massachusetts residents approve of Healey's job performance as governor, 46% disapprove, and 10% neither approve nor disapprove or are unsure. Healey's net approval rating (the percentage who approve minus the percentage who disapprove) is -1, down from +15 in May. Seventy-one percent of Democrats approve of Healey's performance as governor but only 24% of Independents and 6% of Republicans approve.

Approval of Governor Healey's Job Performance



Direction of the Commonwealth


Half of Bay Staters (49%) believe that overall, Massachusetts is heading in the right direction, 38% think the commonwealth is on the wrong track, and 14% are unsure. Three-quarters (76%) of Democrats think Massachusetts is headed in the right direction but 91% of Republicans feel it is on the wrong track. Independents are mixed in their assessment: 31% think that Massachusetts is headed in the right direction, 38% think it is on the wrong track, and 30% are unsure.





When asked to name the most important problem facing Massachusetts, 36% of Bay Staters mention housing, while 28% mention immigration. Far fewer residents mention the cost of living (6%), climate change or the environment (6%), jobs or the economy (5%), healthcare (4%), infrastructure (4%), taxes (3%), or the political left or leftist politicians (2%). More than half of Democrats (54%) mention housing while an equal number of Republicans (54%) mention immigration as the most important problem.


Most Important Problem Facing Massachusetts - July 2024



MTBA Communities Law

The MBTA Communities Law, enacted in 2021, requires cities and towns in Massachusetts with access to the MBTA system to zone for additional multi-family housing. Only a quarter (25%) of Massachusetts residents say that they have heard a lot about this, 36% have heard some about it, 25% have heard not very much, and 15% have heard nothing at all about it.


Among those who have heard at least a little about this law (N=393), 50% strongly (34%) or somewhat (16%) support this law, 15% are neutral, 22% strongly (12%) or somewhat (9%) oppose it, and 13% are unsure. Majorities of Democrats (69%) and Independents (54%) support the MBTA Communities Law but a plurality of Republicans (46%) oppose it.

Logan Airport

Journalist Mark Leibovich has proposed renaming Logan Airport after former Celtics player and coach Bill Russell and government leaders in Massachusetts have said they are open to considering it. However, there appears to be little support for the idea among Bay Staters. Only 14% of state residents strongly (5%) or somewhat (9%) support renaming Logan Airport to honor Bill Russell, 38% strongly (24%) or somewhat (14%) oppose renaming the airport, 42% are neutral or have no opinion, and 6% are unsure. Most Republicans (74%) oppose renaming Logan.

Bay State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Bay State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Five hundred nine (509) Bay State Panel members completed the survey online between July 11 and July 15, 2024. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 4.3 percent. In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The response rate for the July 2024 Bay State Poll is 33%. The design effect for the survey is 2.7%.

The Bay State Panel is a probability-based web panel of Massachusetts residents. Approximately 2,000 Massachusetts adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the MA Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in Massachusetts. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted by human coders.
