NH DEMOCRATS LINE UP BEHIND HARRIS, WHO HOLDS SMALL LEAD OVER TRUMP

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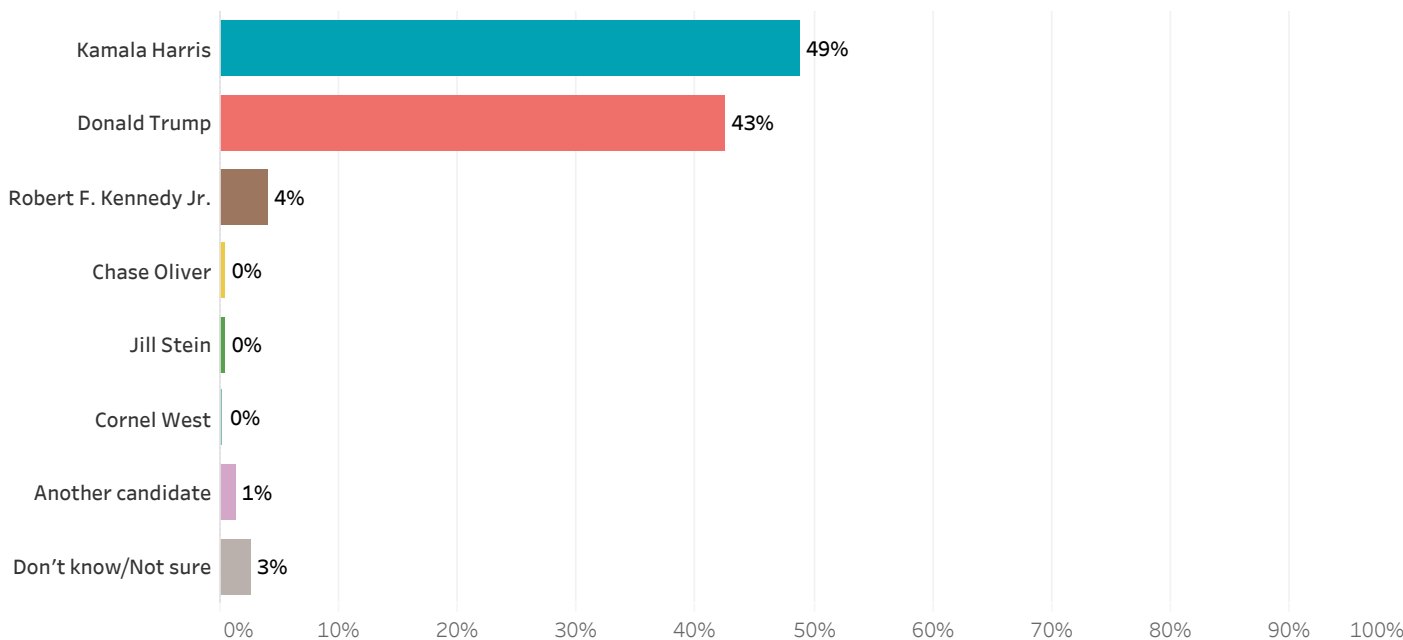
DURHAM, NH - Following President Biden's withdrawal from the 2024 presidential race, Democrats in New Hampshire clearly favor Vice President Kamala Harris as the Democratic nominee. Harris holds a slim lead over former President Donald Trump and is slightly more popular than Trump or Biden. While a majority of Granite Staters do not believe Biden should resign as President, many state Democrats are relieved and hopeful in the wake of his withdrawal from the race. And in the wake of the assassination attempt on Trump, most state Republicans do not trust the FBI to conduct a thorough investigation. More than three-quarters of state residents are concerned about future attacks on political leaders, leaders using violence or illegal methods to obtain power, or people violently or illegally interfering in upcoming elections.

2024 Presidential Race

President Biden's decision to drop out of the presidential race and back Vice President Harris has shaken the dynamics of the 2024 campaign. While Harris is not yet the official Democratic nominee, the party has clearly closed ranks behind her. In a matchup between Harris and Trump, 49% of New Hampshire likely voters say they would vote for Harris if the election were held today, 43% would vote for former president Trump, 4% support Independent Robert F. Kennedy Jr., and less than 1% would vote for Libertarian candidate Chase Oliver, Green Party candidate Jill Stein, or Independent Cornel West. If they could only vote for Harris or Trump, 53% of likely voters say that they would vote for Harris and 46% say they would vote for Trump. In May 2024, before the first presidential debate and Biden's withdrawal from the race, Biden held a three percentage point lead over Trump in New Hampshire.

Ninety-four percent of self-identified Democrats support Harris, up from 84% who supported Biden in May. Eighty-eight percent of Republicans support Trump, while 45% of Independents support Harris and 33% support Trump. Harris has a slightly larger lead (+13 percentage points) among voters aged 18 to 34 than Biden had over Trump in May (+9)

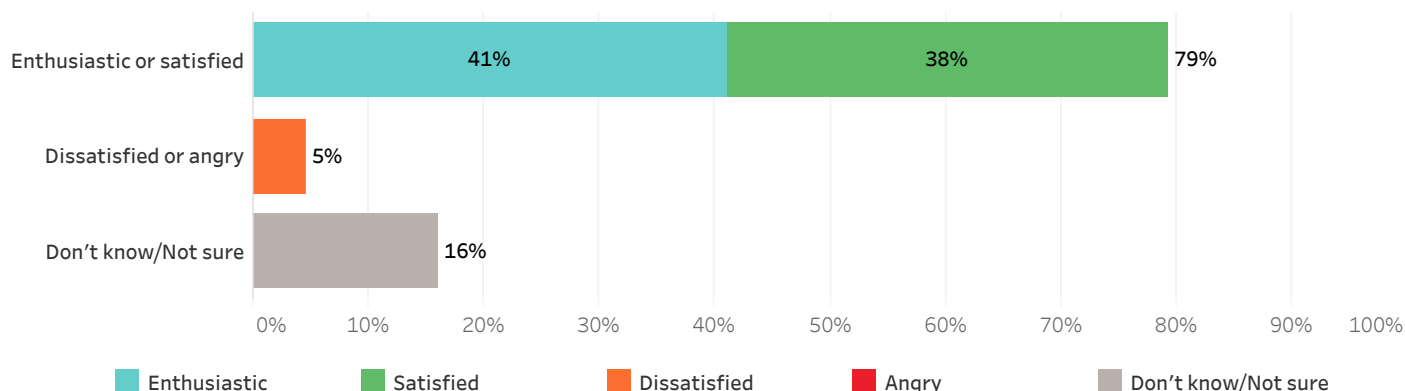
2024 Presidential General Election Matchup - Harris, Trump, et al - July 2024

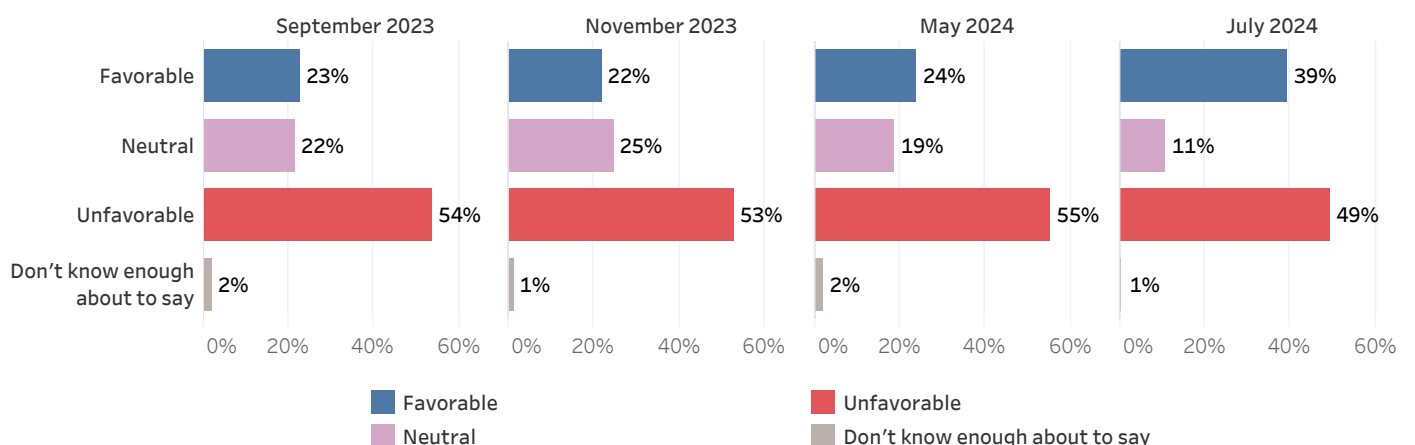
Ohio Senator J.D. Vance, the 2024 Republican Party's vice presidential nominee, has satisfied most Trump voters. Among Trump supporters (N=1,273), 79% say that they are enthusiastic (41%) or satisfied (38%) with this selection, only 5% say that they are dissatisfied (5%), or angry (<1%), and 16% are unsure how they feel.

Feelings on Vance's Selection as Trump's Running Mate - Among Trump Supporters - July 2024



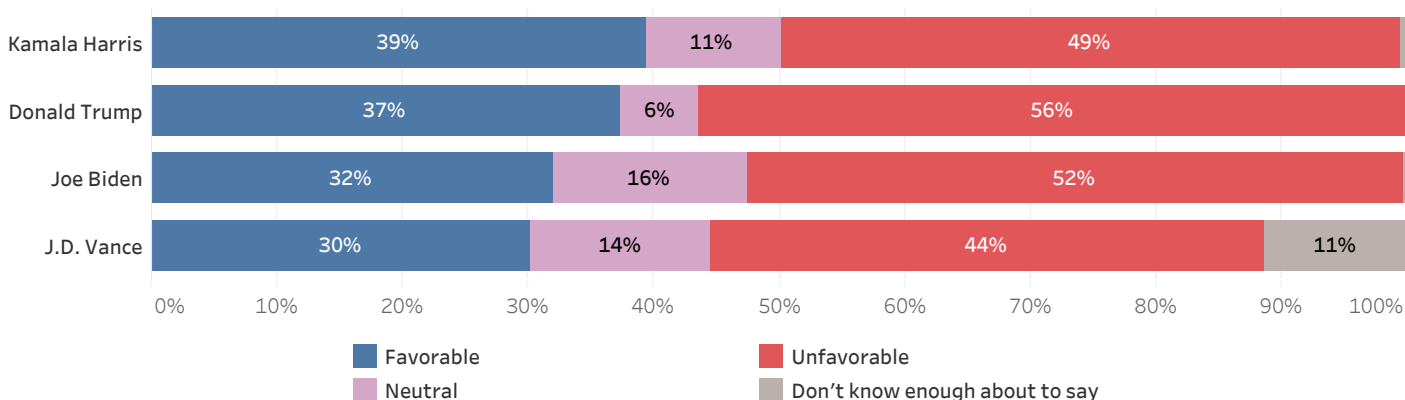
Turning to the personal favorability of the candidates, 39% of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Harris, 49% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 1% don't know enough about her to say. Harris's net favorability rating (the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion), is -10, up from -37 in May. Harris's net approval rating among Democrats (+77) has increased significantly since May (+30).

While Harris does not enjoy widespread favorability, she has higher ratings than Biden, Trump, or Vance. Thirty-seven percent of Granite Staters have a favorable opinion of Trump, 56% have an unfavorable opinion, and 6% are neutral, yielding a net favorability rating of -19, largely unchanged since May (-21). Biden's net favorability rating (-20) is unchanged since May (-20) and is statistically the same as Trump's. Only 30% have a favorable opinion of Vance, 44% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 14% are neutral, and 11% don't know enough about him to say, yielding a net favorability rating of -14.

Favorability - July 2024

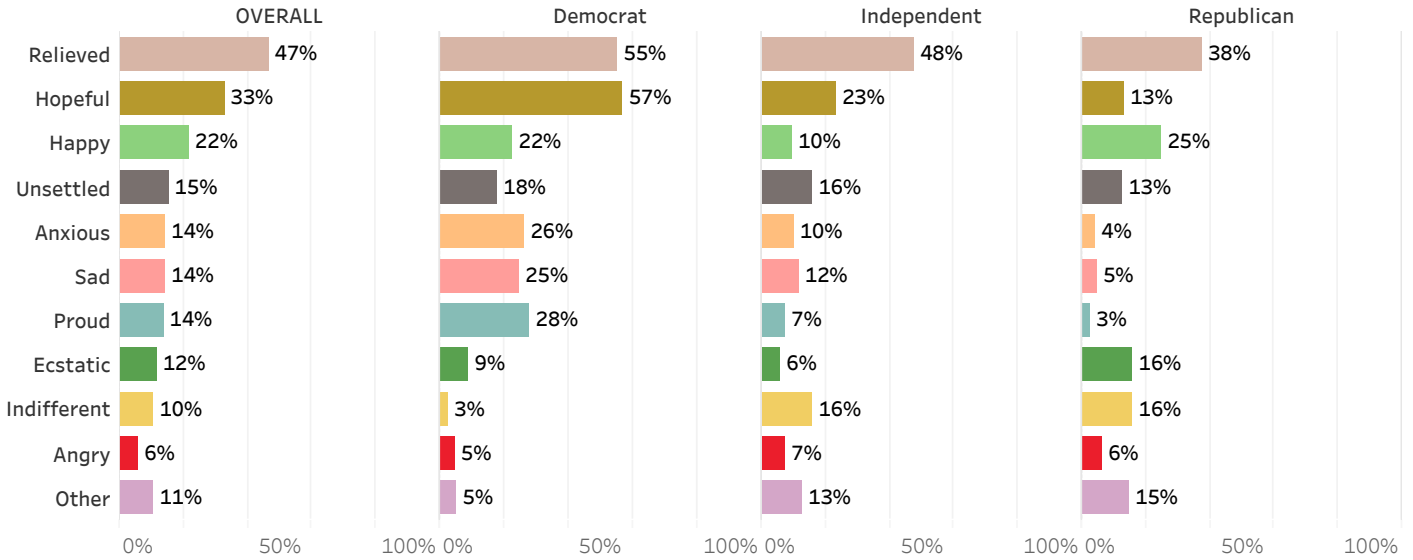


Biden Withdrawal

Three-quarters (75%) of New Hampshire residents have heard a lot about Biden's decision to withdraw from the 2024 presidential race, 23% heard some about it, only 3% heard not very much, and less than 1% heard nothing at all.

Among those who heard at least a little about it, 47% say that they felt relieved after hearing the news, 33% felt hopeful, and 22% felt happy. Less than 20% felt unsettled (15%), anxious (14%), sad (14%), proud (14%), ecstatic (12%), indifferent (10%), or angry (6%). Democrats were more likely than others to feel hopeful, anxious, sad, and proud, while Republicans and Independents were more likely to describe themselves as indifferent.

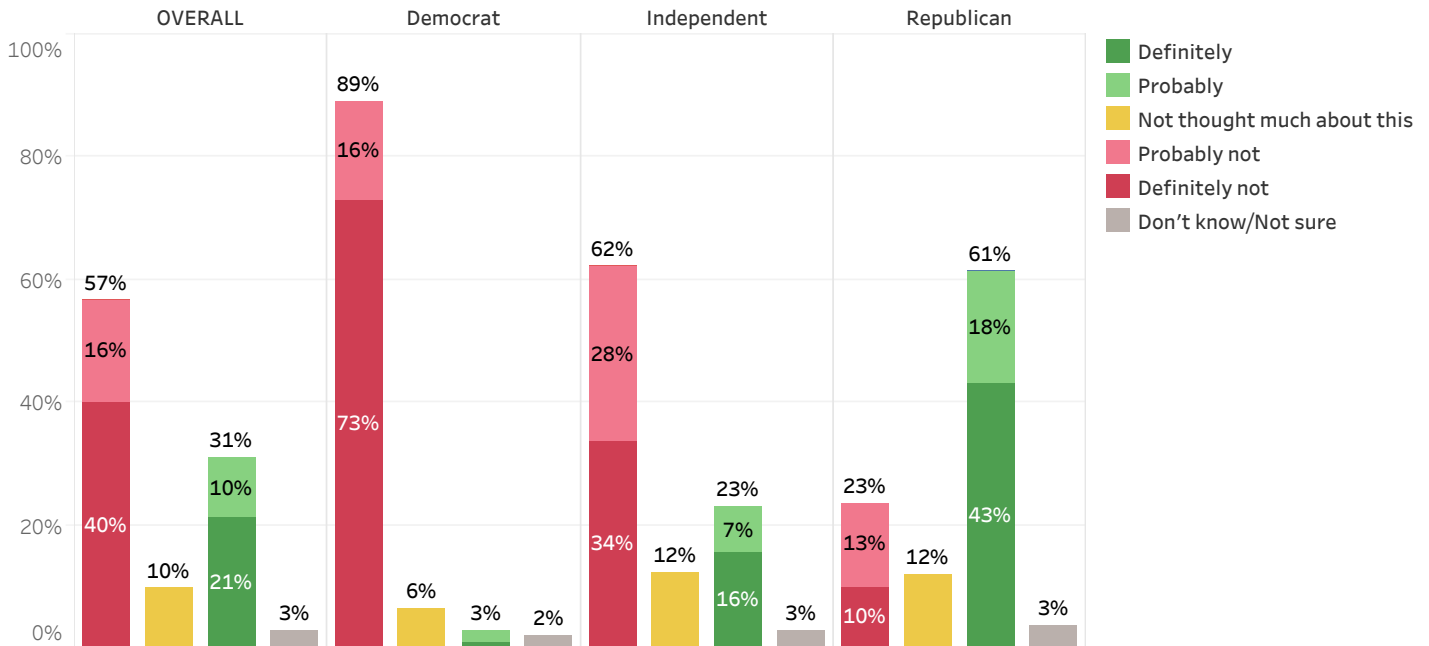
How Felt After Hearing About Biden Withdrawal from Presidential Race (Select all that apply) - by Party ID - July 2024



Now that he has decided to withdraw from the 2024 presidential election, some commentators have argued that Biden should resign the presidency immediately rather than serving the remainder of his term.

More than half (57%) of Granite Staters think Biden definitely (40%) or probably (16%) should not resign as president before the end of his term, 31% think he definitely (21%) or probably (10%) should, 10% have not thought much about this, and 3% are unsure. A majority of Republicans (61%) think Biden definitely or probably should resign but only 23% of Independents and 3% of Democrats agree.

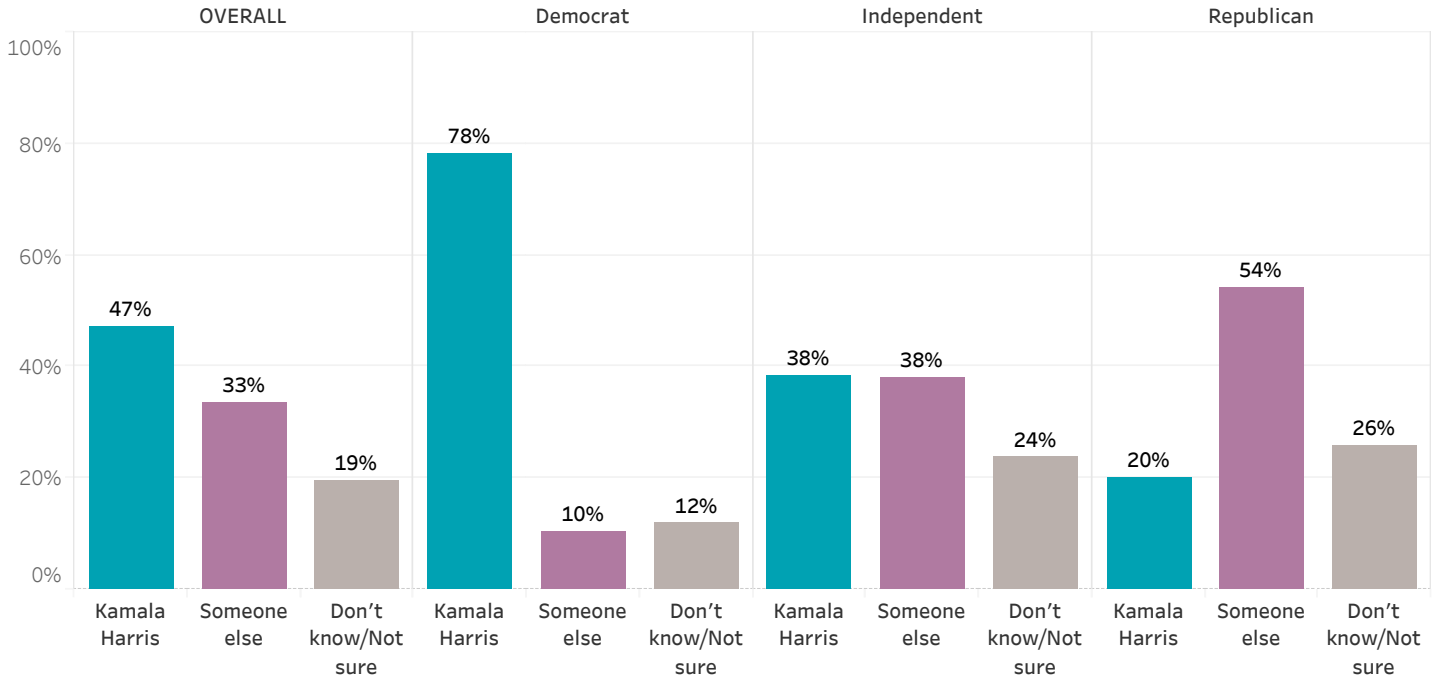
Should Biden Resign Presidency - by Party ID - July 2024



2024 Democratic Ticket

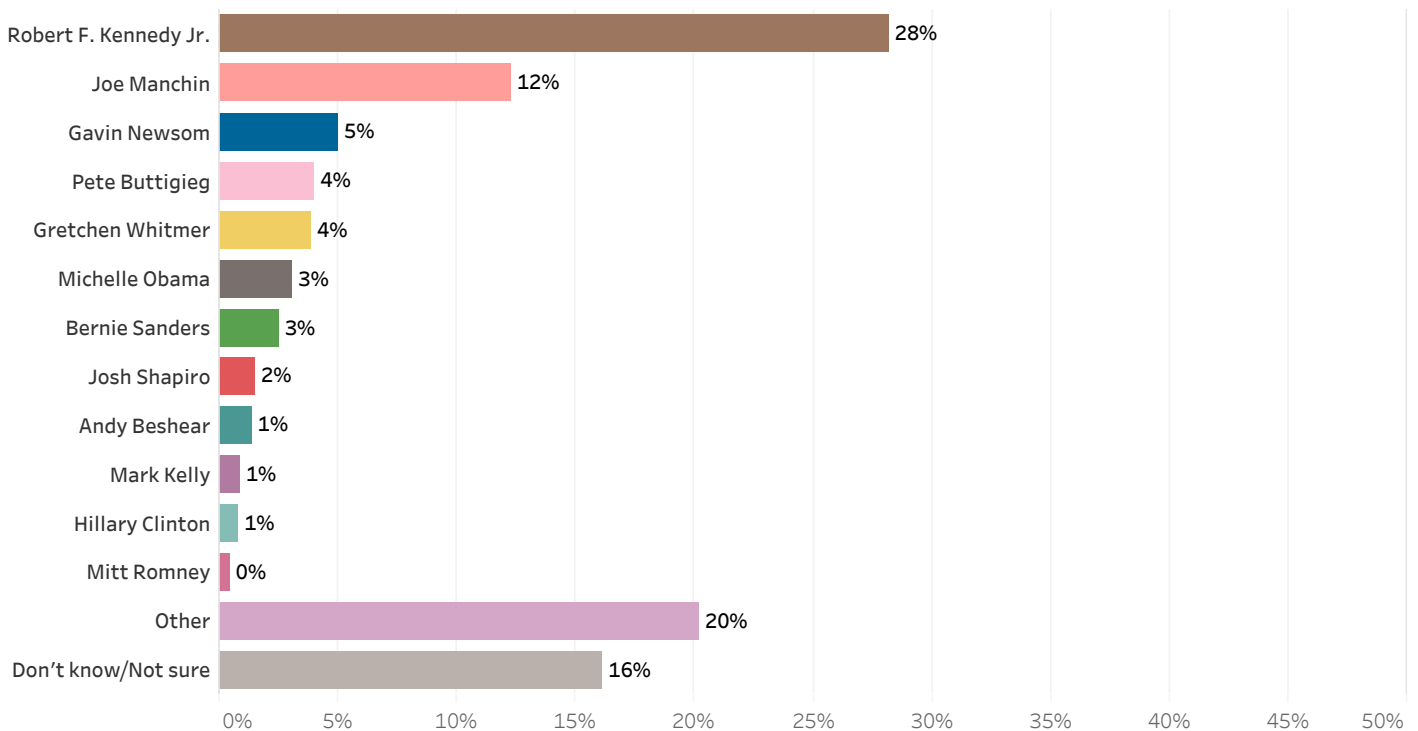
Biden has endorsed Harris as his successor on the Democratic ticket. Forty-seven percent of Granite Staters agree that Harris should be the Democratic nominee for president in 2024, 33% would like someone else, and 19% are unsure. More than three-quarters (78%) of New Hampshire Democrats want Harris to be the party's nominee while 54% of Republicans feel someone else should be the Democratic nominee.

Among those who would like a nominee other than Harris (N=432), 28% want Robert F. Kennedy Jr., 12% mention West Virginia Senator Joe Manchin, 5% name California Governor Gavin Newsom, 4% each prefer Transportation Secretary Pete Buttigieg or Michigan Governor Gretchen Whitmer, and 3% each mention former First Lady Michelle Obama or Vermont Senator Bernie Sanders.

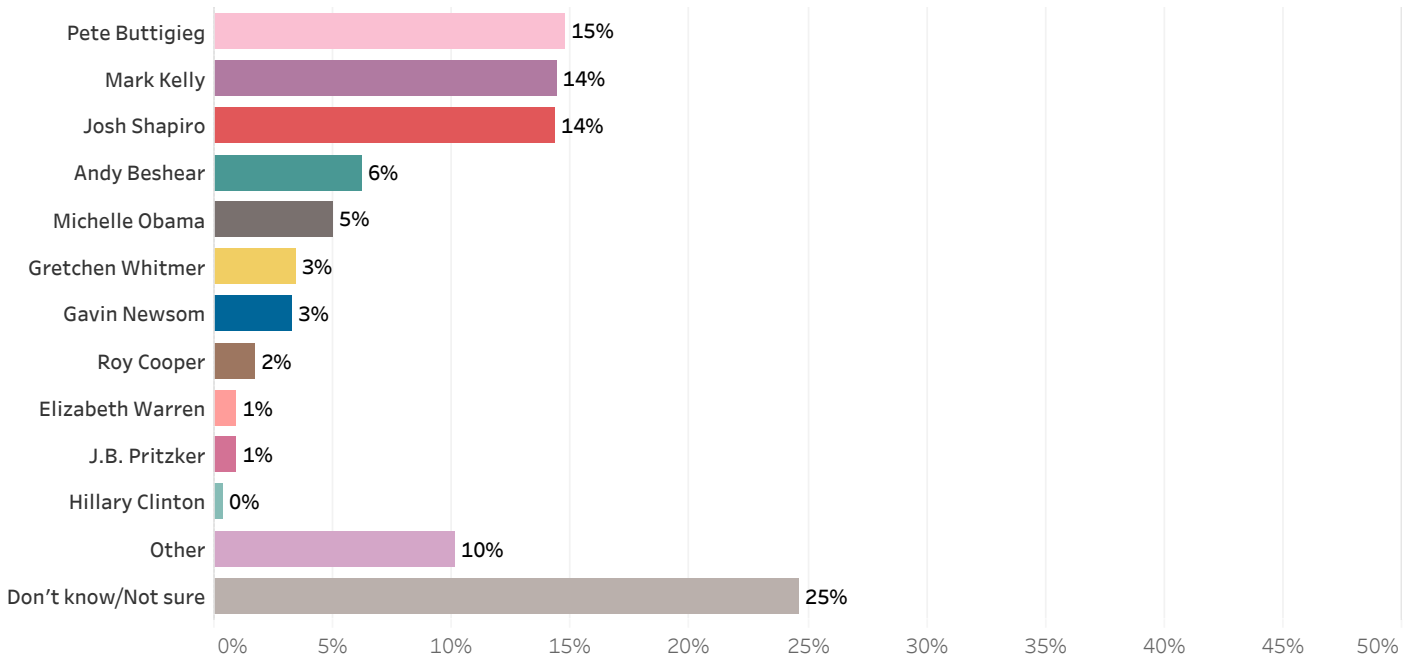
Preferred Democratic Presidential Nominee (coded) - Among non-Harris Supporters - July 2024



Harris has emerged as such a favorite for the Democratic nomination that discussion in some circles has turned to whom she will pick as her running mate. There is no clear favorite among Harris supporters as of yet.

Among those who want Harris to be the Democratic nominee (N=881), 15% say Secretary of Transportation Pete Buttigieg should be her pick for VP, 14% each mention Arizona Senator Mark Kelly or Pennsylvania Governor Josh Shapiro. Fewer respondents mention Kentucky Governor Andy Beshear (6%), Michelle Obama (5%), Whitmer (3%), Newsom (3%), or North Carolina Governor Roy Cooper (2%).

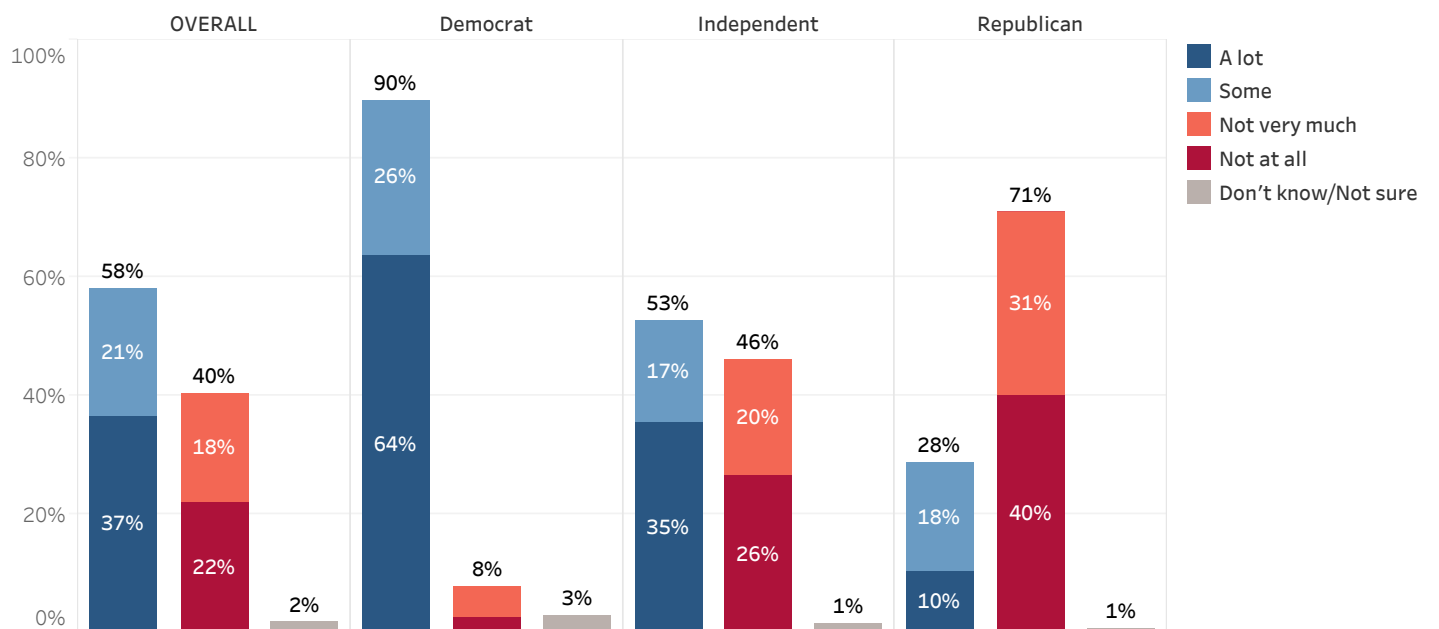
Preferred Harris Running Mate (coded) - Among Harris Supporters - July 2024



Political Violence

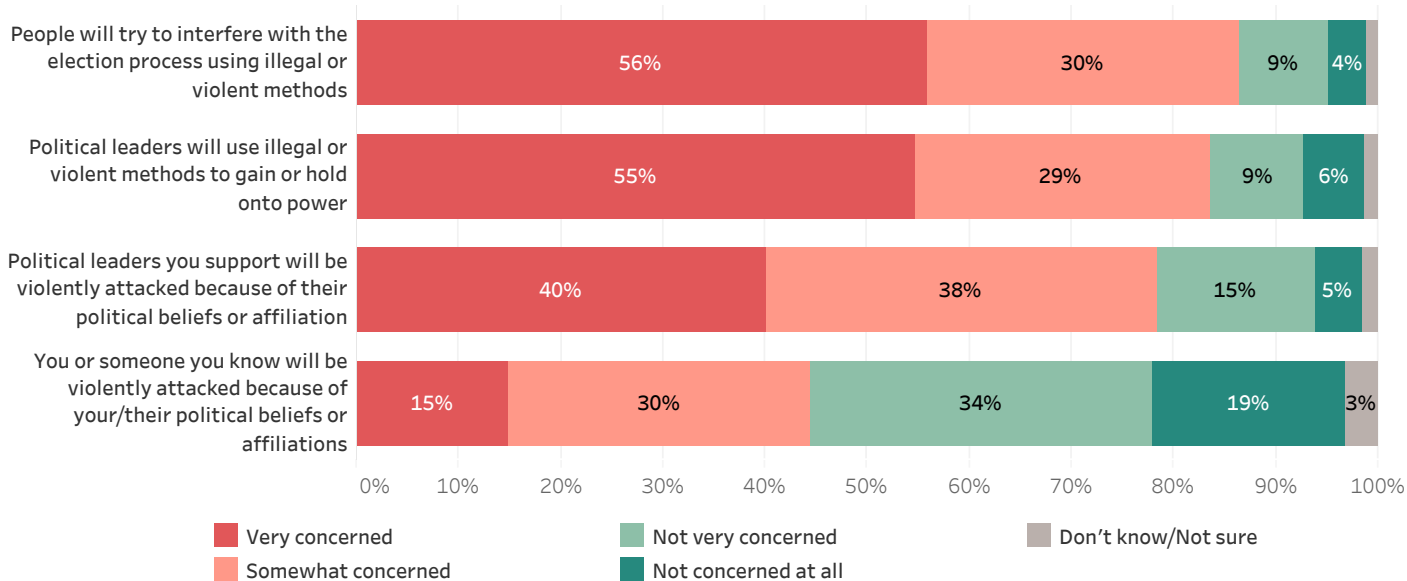
The Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) is investigating the attempted assassination of former President Donald Trump in Butler, Pennsylvania. A majority (58%) of Granite Staters say that they have a lot (37%) or some (21%) trust in the FBI to conduct a thorough investigation of the attempted assassination, 40% say they do not trust the FBI very much (18%) or at all (22%), and 2% are unsure. Nine in ten Democrats (90%) and 53% of Independents have a lot or some trust in the FBI to carry out a thorough investigation but only 28% of Republicans feel this way.

Trust in FBI to Conduct Thorough Investigation of Attempted Trump Assassination - by Party ID - July 2024



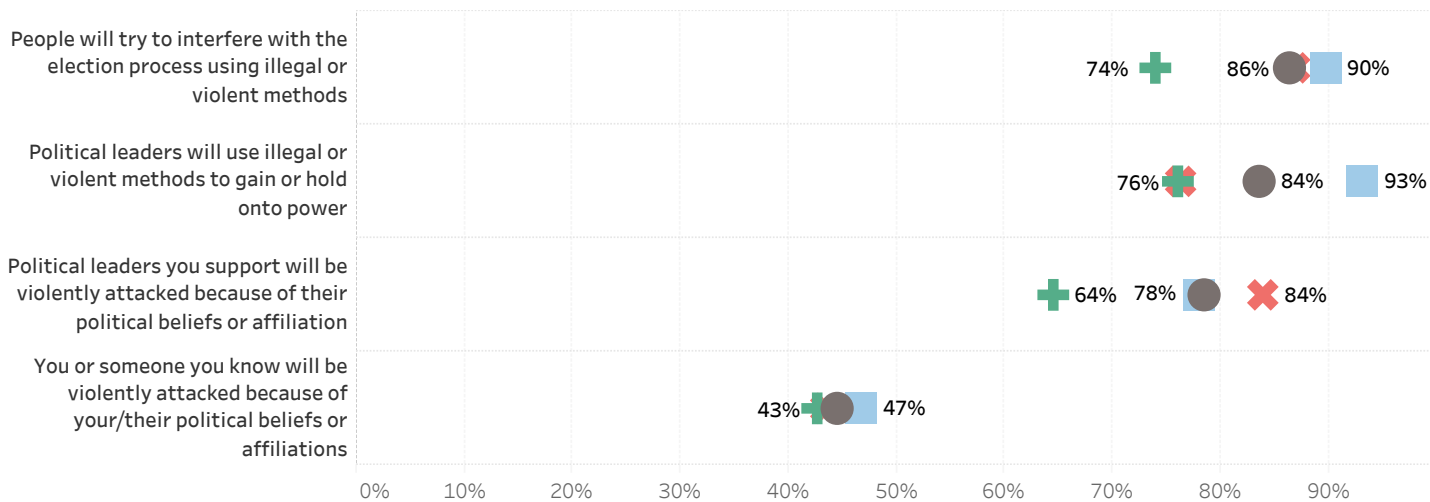
Eighty-six percent of New Hampshire residents say they are very (56%) or somewhat (30%) concerned that in the next year people will try to interfere with the election process using illegal or violent methods, 9% are not very concerned about this happening, 4% are not concerned at all, and 1% are unsure. Most Granite Staters are also very or somewhat concerned that in the next year, political leaders will use illegal or violent methods to gain or hold onto power (84%) or that political leaders they support will be violently attacked because of their political beliefs or affiliation (78%). There is less concern about potential violence perpetrated on respondents themselves or people they know: only 44% are very (15%) or somewhat (30%) concerned that in the next year they or someone they know will be violently attacked because of their political beliefs or affiliation while more than half (53%) are not very (34%) or not at all concerned (19%) about this happening.

Democrats are more likely than Republicans to be worried that in the next year political leaders will use illegal or violent methods to gain or hold onto power, while Republicans are slightly more likely to be worried that political leaders they support will be violently attacked because of their political beliefs or affiliation.

Granite State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Granite State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. One thousand, nine hundred and seventy-three (1,973) Granite State Panel members completed the survey online. The response rate for panel respondents to this July 2024 Granite State Poll is 42%. In addition, 1,043 New Hampshire residents completed the survey after receiving an invitation via text message to complete the survey online. Overall, 3,016 individuals completed the survey between July 23 and July 25, 2024. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 1.8 percent. Included in the sample were 2,875 likely general election voters (margin of sampling error +/- 1.8 percent). In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.0%.

The Granite State Panel is a probability-based web panel of New Hampshire residents. Approximately 8,000 New Hampshire adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau, as well as party registration levels provided by the NH Secretary of State and to 2020 election results in New Hampshire. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted by human coders.

How Much Heard or Seen About Biden Withdrawal from Presidential Race
