### SCOTT, SANDERS, BALINT HOLD WIDE LEADS IN VERMONT RE-ELECTION BIDS

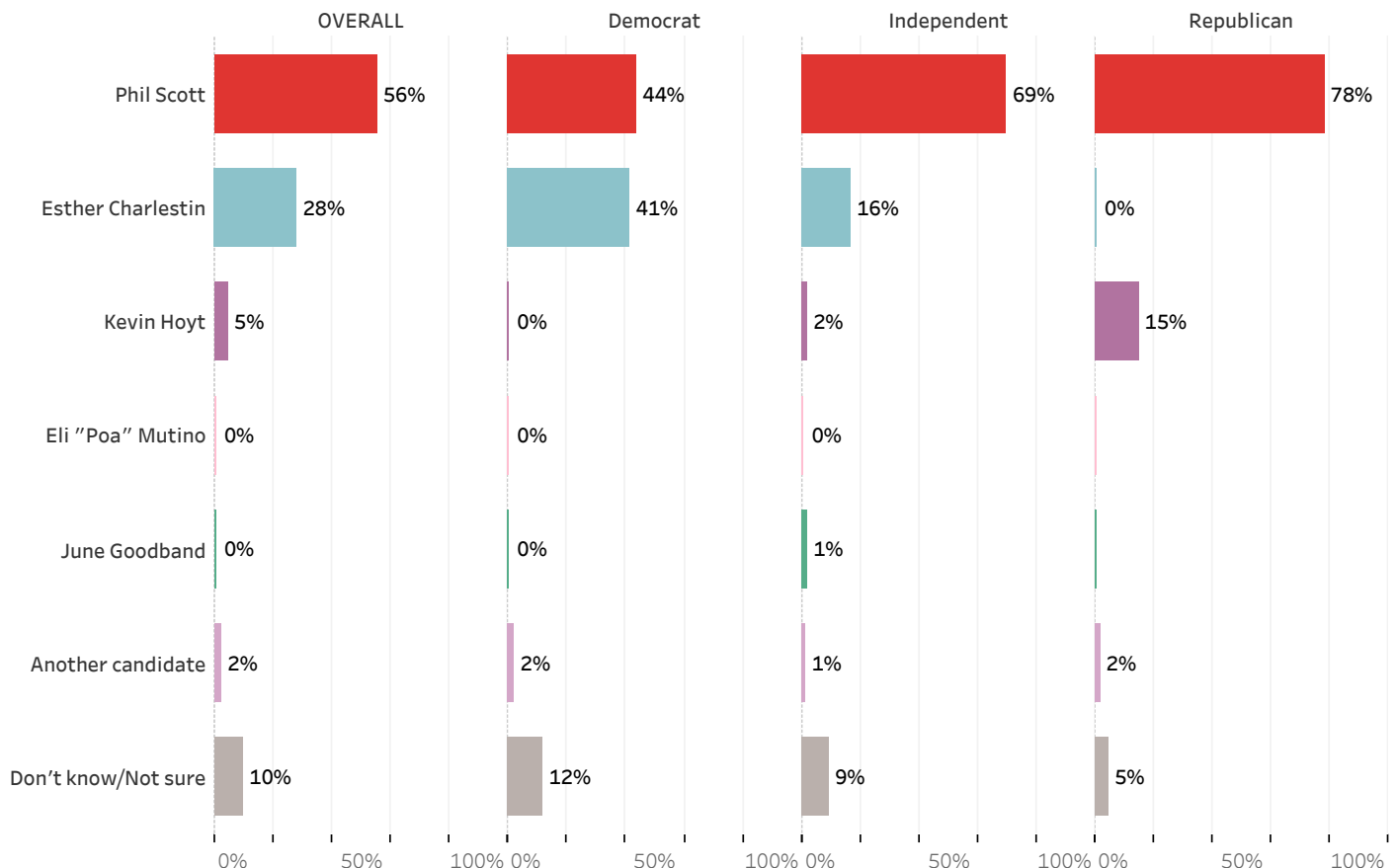
DURHAM, NH - Vermont Republican Governor Phil Scott holds a substantial lead over Democratic nominee Esther Charlestin. Incumbent Senator Bernie Sanders and Representative Becca Balint are both far ahead of their opponents in their races for re-election. Housing and taxes are cited as the most important problems in Vermont, and half of Vermonters feel the state is headed in the wrong direction.

### 2024 Vermont Gubernatorial General Election

Incumbent Republican Governor Phil Scott is seeking a fifth term in office and holds a wide lead over his opponents. If the general election were held today, 56% of likely voters say that they would vote for Scott, 28% would vote for Democratic nominee Esther Charlestin, 5% would vote for Independent Kevin Hoyt, less than 1% would vote for Independent Eli "Poa" Mutino or Green Mountain Peace and Justice Party nominee June Goodband, 2% would vote for another candidate, and 10% are undecided.

More than three-quarters (78%) of Republicans and more than two-thirds (69%) of Independents support Scott, while among Democrats Scott (44%) and Charlestin (41%) are neck-and-neck. Scott enjoys particularly high levels of support among older voters, men, those with a high school education or less, and residents of the Northern Counties.

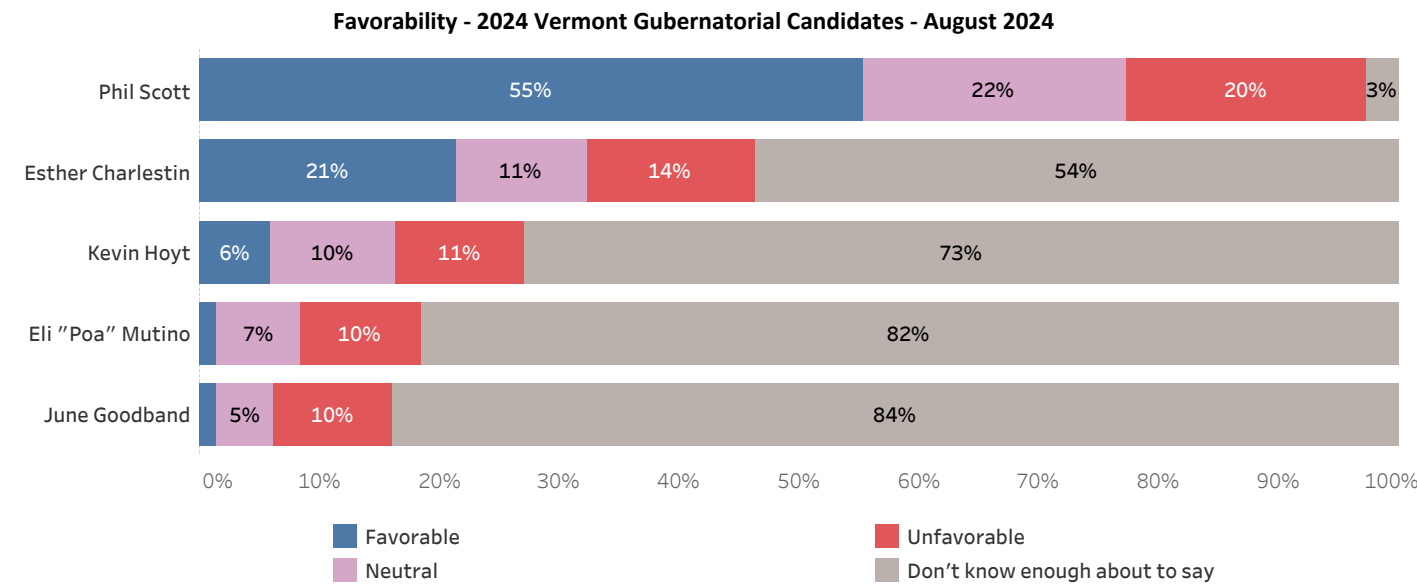
### 2024 Vermont Gubernatorial General Election - by Party ID - August 2024

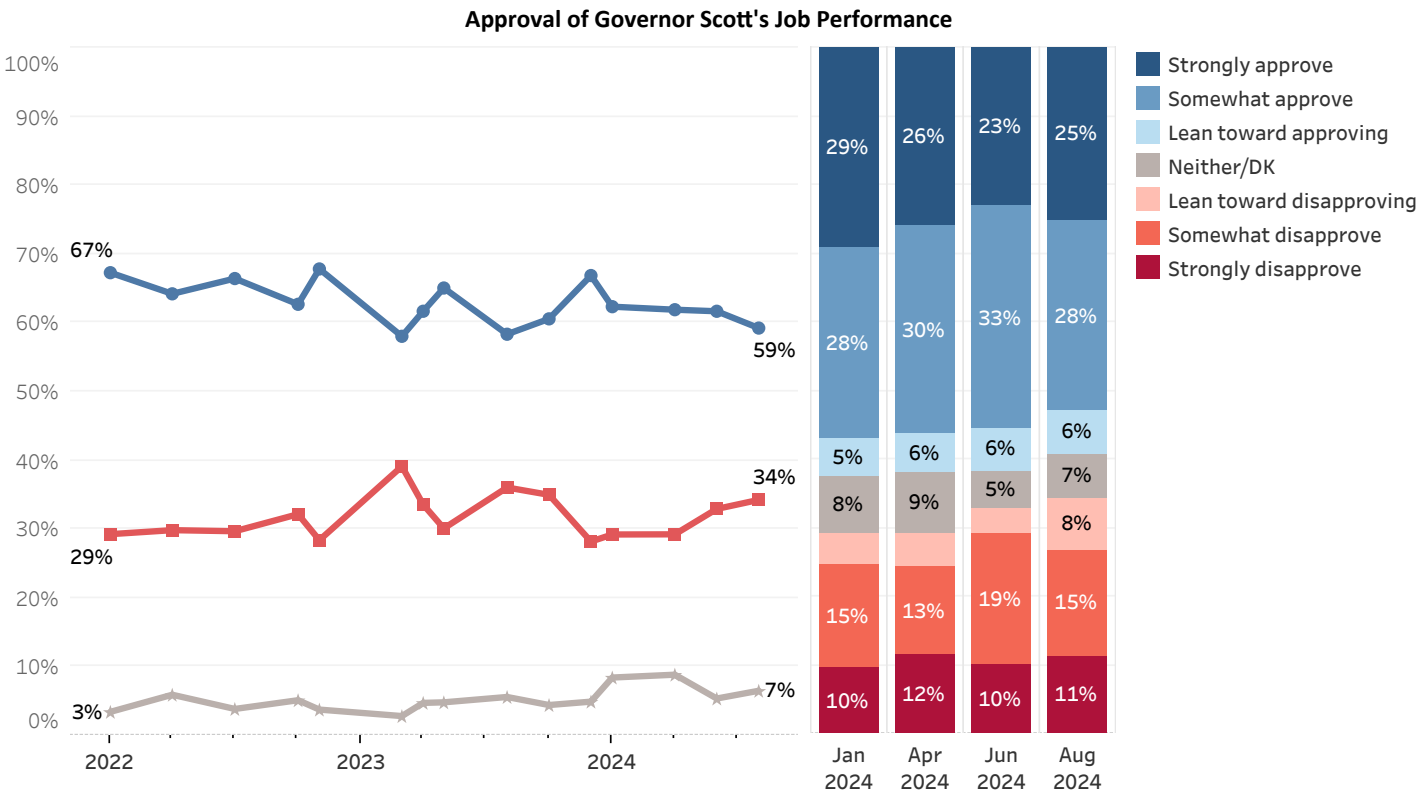
Turning to the personal favorability of the candidates, 55% of likely voters have a favorable opinion of Scott, 20% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 22% are neutral, and 3% don't know enough about him to say. Scott's net favorability rating among likely voters (the percentage who have a favorable opinion minus the percentage with an unfavorable opinion), is +35. Scott's popularity is bipartisan as his net favorability rating is +46 among Republicans, +39 and Independents, and +30 among Democrats.

Charlestin is largely unknown in Vermont: 21% of likely voters have a favorable opinion of Charlestin, 14% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 54% don't know enough about her to say, yielding a net favorability rating of +8. More than two-thirds of likely voters in Vermont do not know enough to have an opinion on the other three gubernatorial candidates.



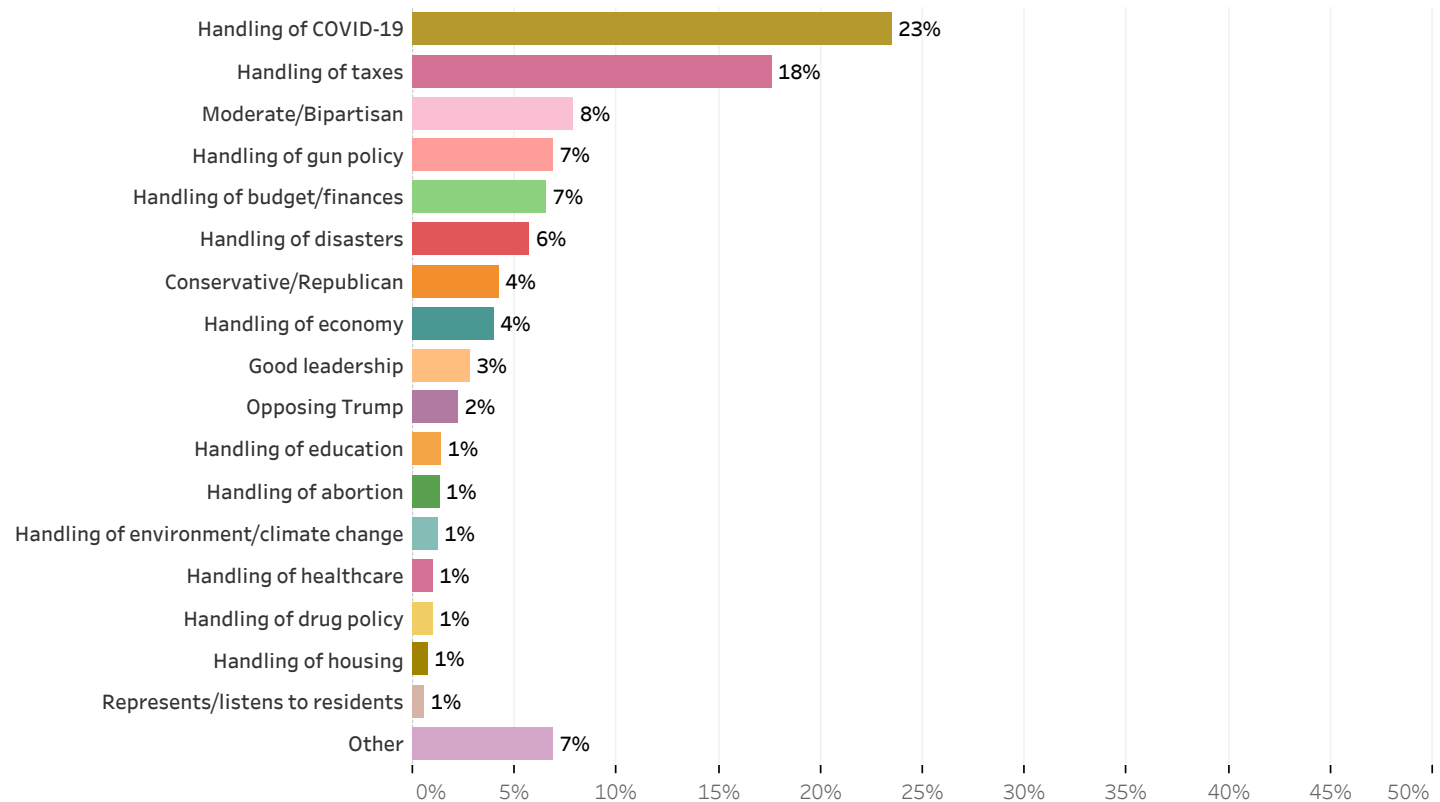
**Assessment of Scott's Governorship**

Currently, 59% of Vermont residents approve of Governor Scott's job performance, 34% disapprove, and 7% neither approve nor disapprove or don't know. Scott's net approval rating is +25. Approval of Scott's performance is bipartisan: 63% of Democrats, 56% of Republicans, and 50% of Independents approve of Scott's performance as governor.



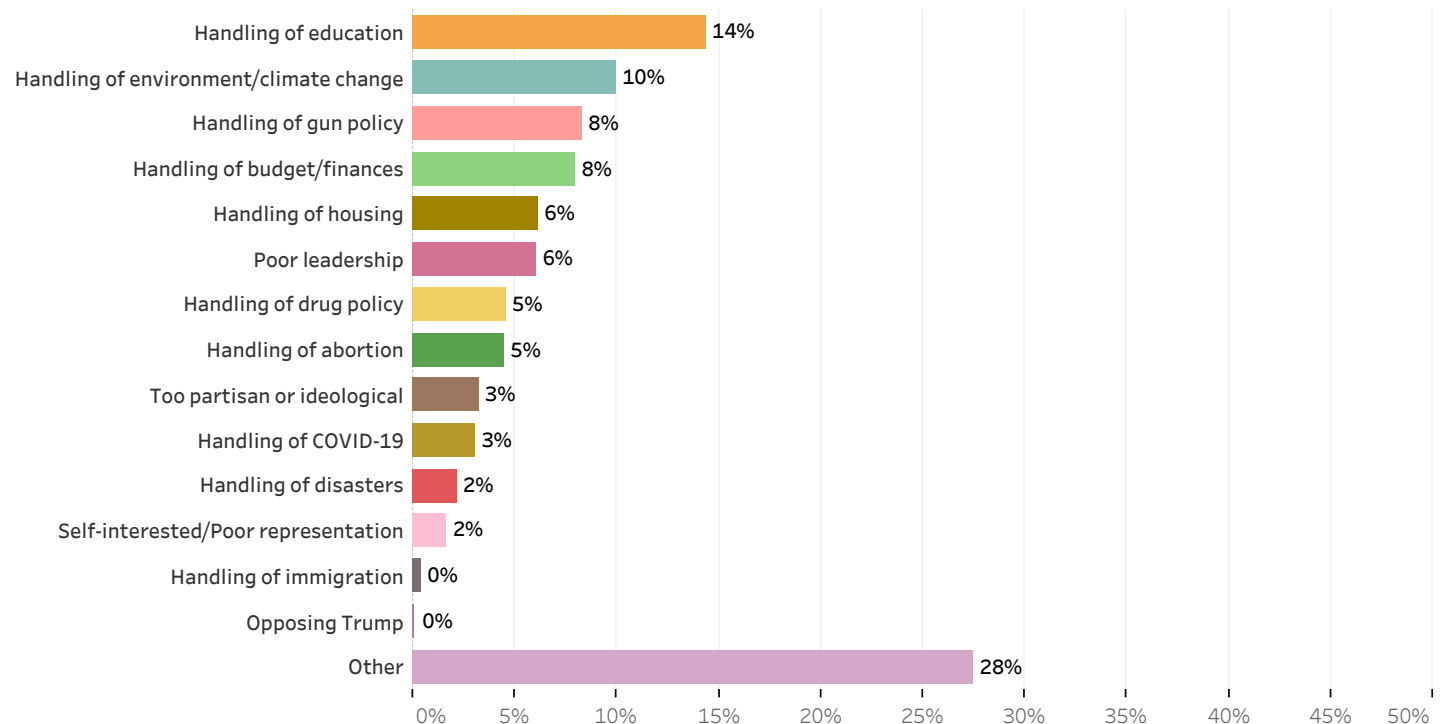
Those who approve of Scott's performance as governor (N=509) most often mention his handling of COVID-19 (23%) and taxes (18%) as the most important decisions he has made that makes them approve of his job performance, followed by being moderate or bipartisan (8%), his handling of gun policy (7%), his handling of the budget or finances (7%), and his handling of disasters (6%).

Those who disapprove of Scott's performance as governor (N=285) most often mention his handling of education (14%), the environment or climate change (10%), gun policy (8%), the budget or finances (8%), or housing (6%), or exhibiting poor leadership (6%).

**Most Important Decision Scott Made Which Made Disapprove - August 2024**

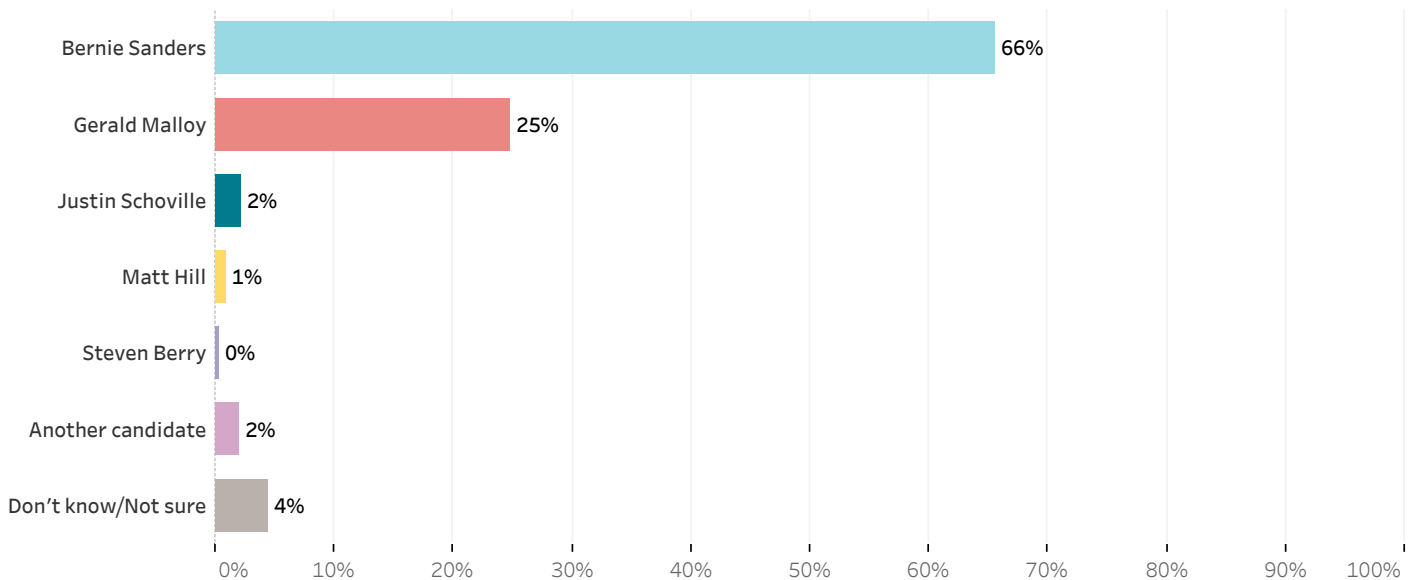


## 2024 Vermont U.S. Senate Election

Incumbent Democratic Senator Bernie Sanders is on track for to win a fourth term in the U.S. Senate. If the general election were held today, 66% of likely voters say that they would vote for Sanders, 25% would vote for Republican nominee Gerald Malloy, 2% would vote for Green Mountain Peace and Justice Party nominee Justin Schoville, 1% would vote for Libertarian Matt Hill, less than 1% would vote for Independent Steven Berry, 2% would vote for another candidate, and 4% are undecided.

Nine in ten Democrats (91%) and two-thirds of Independents (66%) support Sanders, while 82% of Republicans support Malloy. Sanders enjoys particularly high levels of support among women, those who have completed postgraduate work, and Chittenden County residen..

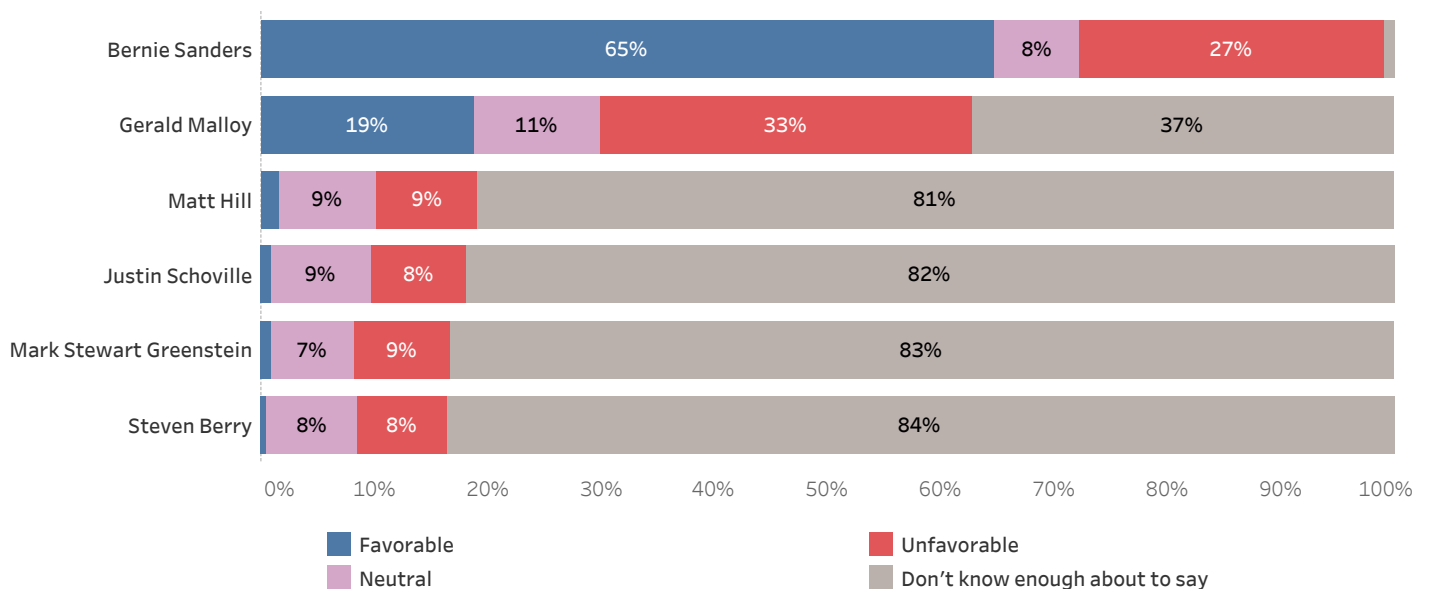
### 2024 Vermont U.S. Senate General Election - August 2024



Nearly two-thirds (65%) of likely voters have a favorable opinion of Sanders, 27% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 8% are neutral, and 1% don't know enough about him to say. Sanders' net favorability rating among likely voters is +38. Sanders is very popular among Democrats (+90) and is somewhat popular among Independents (+20) but is very unpopular among Republicans (-75).

Malloy is less well regarded in Vermont: 19% of likely voters have a favorable opinion of Malloy, 33% have an unfavorable opinion of him, 11% are neutral, and 37% don't know enough about him to say, yielding a net favorability rating of -14. Malloy is popular among Republicans (+57) but is unpopular among Democrats (-45). Vermonters are largely unfamiliar with the other four candidates in this race, as four in five or more say that they do not know enough about each to have an opinion of them.

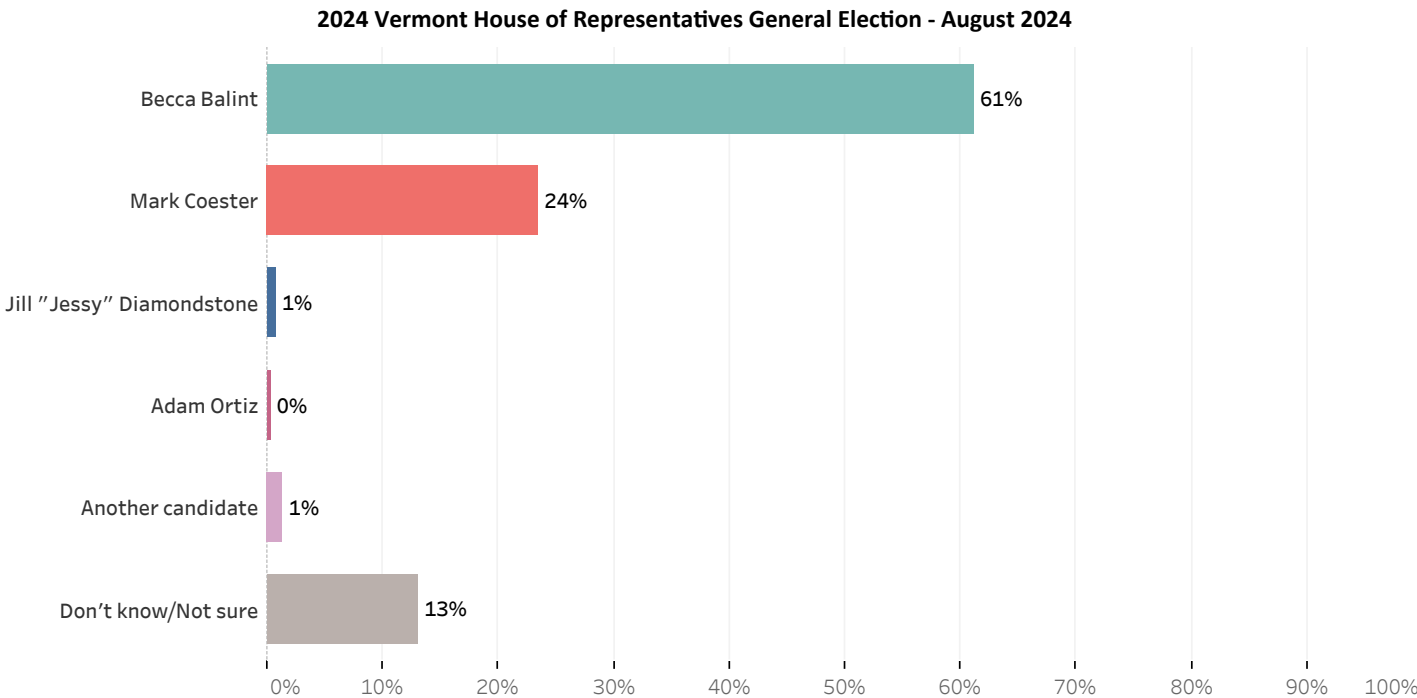
### Favorability - 2024 Vermont U.S. Senate Candidates - August 2024



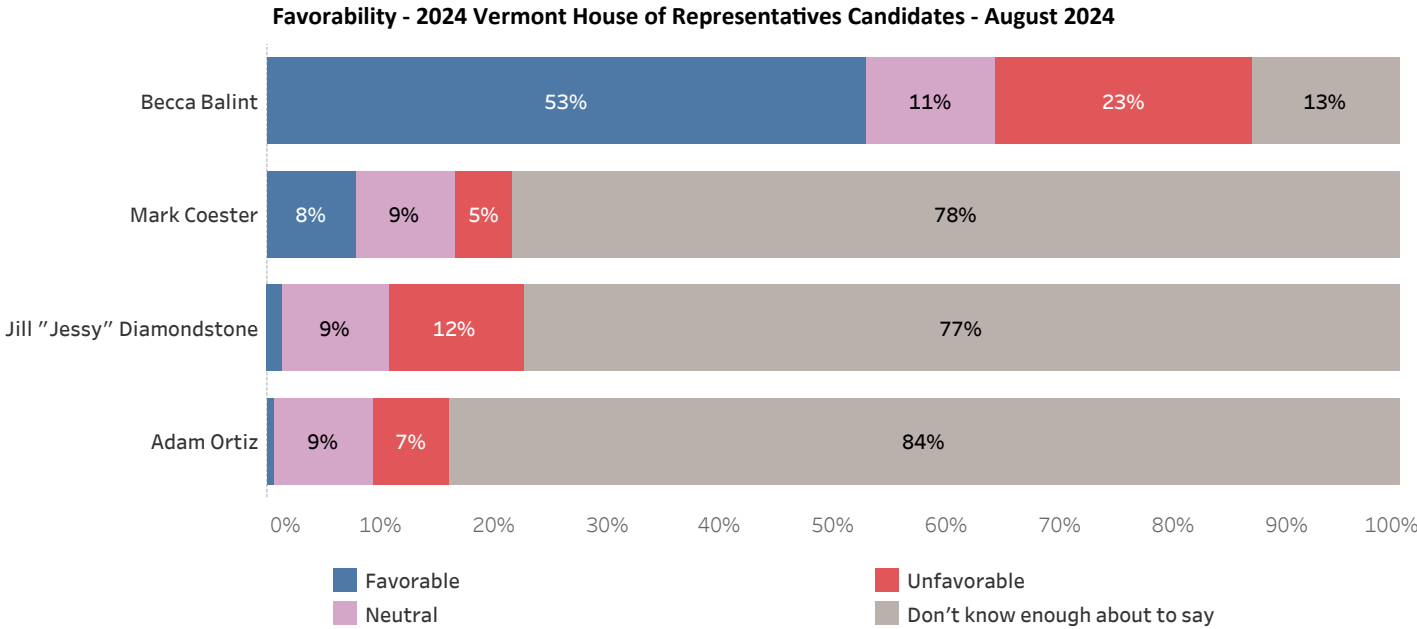
2024 Vermont U.S. Congressional Election

Incumbent Democratic Congresswoman Becca Balint also holds a large lead over other candidates in the race to represent Vermont in the U.S. House of Representatives. If the general election were held today, 61% of likely voters say that they would vote for Balint, 24% would vote for Republican nominee Mark Coester, 1% would vote for Green Mountain Peace and Justice Party nominee Jill "Jessy" Diamondstone, less than 1% would vote for Independent Adam Ortiz, 1% would vote for another candidate, and 13% are undecided.

Seven in eight Democrats (87%) support Balint and 81% of Republicans support Coester. Among Independents, 41% support Balint, 11% support Coester, 10% support Diamondstone, and 30% are undecided. Balint enjoys particularly high levels of support among women, those aged 65 and older, those who have completed postgraduate work, and Chittenden County residents.



More than half (53%) of likely voters have a favorable opinion of Balint, 23% have an unfavorable opinion of her, 11% are neutral, and 13% don't know enough about her to say. Balint's net favorability rating among likely voters is +30. Balint is very popular among Democrats (+77) and is somewhat popular among Independents (+12) but is very unpopular among Republicans (-73). More than three-quarters of Vermont residents don't know enough about the other three candidates in this race to have an opinion of them.

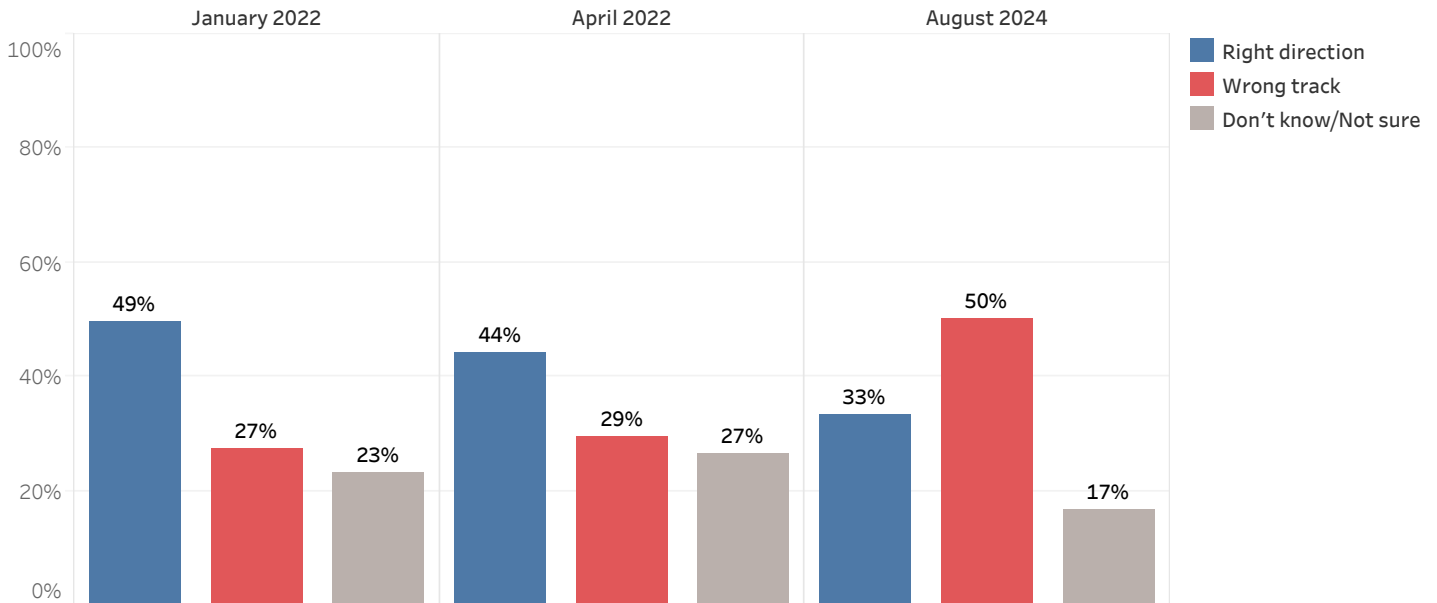


## Direction of the State

Despite majority approval of Governor Scott's performance as governor and widespread support for reelection of other incumbent politicians, only 33% of Vermonters feel that things in the state are generally going in the right direction, 50% think things in the state are seriously off on the wrong track, and 17% are unsure. In April 2022, 44% felt that the state was going in the right direction.

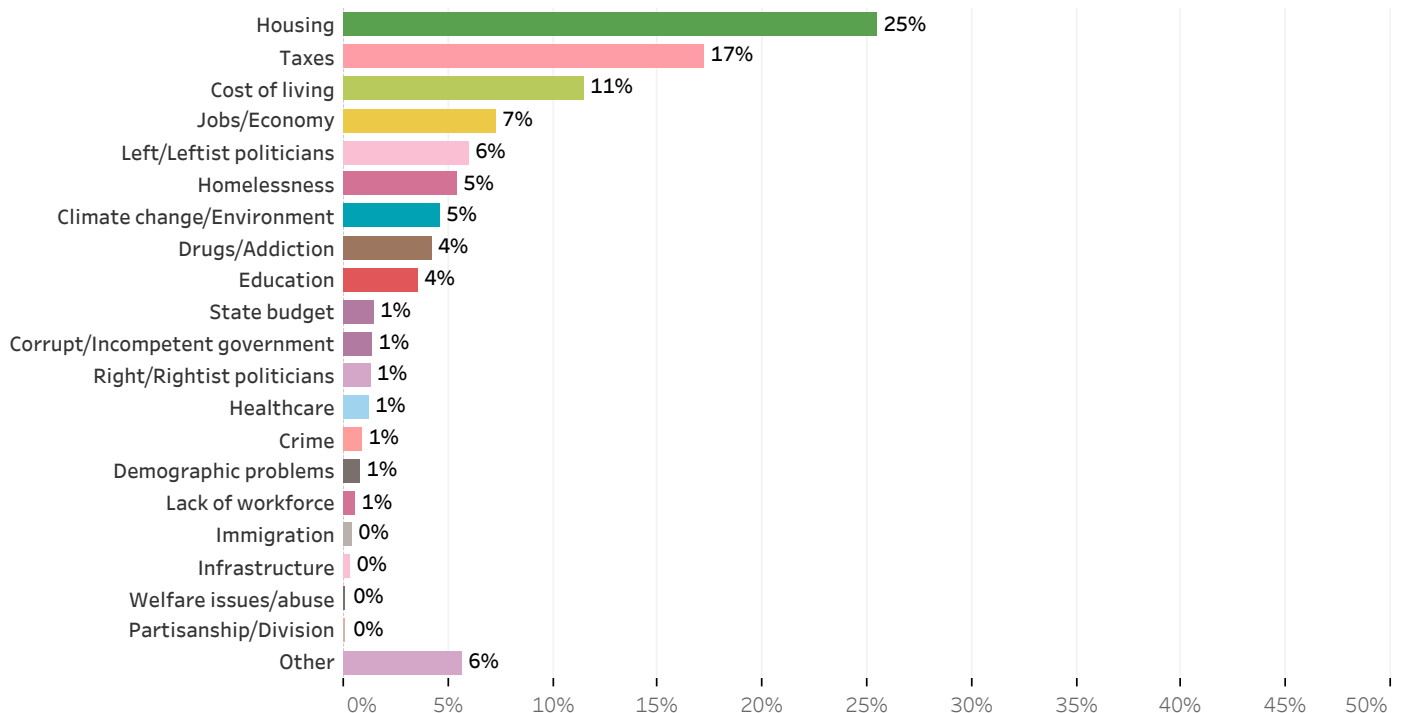
More than half (51%) of Democrats feel that things in Vermont are going in the right direction but only 7% of Republicans and 6% of Independents feel that way.

A quarter (25%) of Vermonters say that housing is the most important problem facing the state, 17% mention taxes, 11% cite the cost of living, 7% mention jobs or the economy, and 6% mention the political left or leftist politicians. Democrats in Vermont are more likely than others to mention housing. Independents are more likely to mention homelessness or a corrupt or incompetent government, and Republicans are more likely to mention taxes, the cost of living, or the political left or leftist politicians.

## Green Mountain State Poll Methodology

These findings are based on the latest Green Mountain State Poll, conducted by the University of New Hampshire Survey Center. Eight hundred forty-one (841) Green Mountain State Panel members completed the survey online. The response rate for panel respondents to the August 2024 Green Mountain State Poll is 37%. In addition, 147 Vermont residents completed the survey after receiving an invitation via text message to complete the survey online. Overall, 988 individuals completed the survey between August 15 and August 19, 2024. The margin of sampling error for the survey is +/- 3.1 percent. Included in the sample were 924 likely general election voters (margin of sampling error +/- 3.2 percent). In addition to potential sampling error, all surveys have other potential sources of non-sampling error including question order effects, question wording effects, and non-response. These MSE's have not been adjusted for design effect. The design effect for the survey is 2.2%.

The Green Mountain State Panel is a probability-based web panel of Vermont residents. Approximately 2,750 Vermont adults have been recruited from phone, text-to-web, or mail-to-web surveys sent to randomly-selected phone numbers or addresses. Panelists are then asked to participate in online surveys sponsored by the UNH Survey Center.

Data were weighted by respondent sex, age, education, and region of the state to targets from the most recent American Community Survey (ACS) conducted by the U.S. Census Bureau and to 2020 election results in Vermont. Surveys were taken in English, all respondent data included passes Qualtrics data quality checks, and single-use survey links were used to prevent multiple submissions by respondents.

The number of respondents in each demographic below may not equal the number reported in cross-tabulation tables as some respondents choose not to answer some questions. Due to rounding, percentages may not sum to 100%. All coding of open-ended responses is conducted by human coders.
