## DR. L. SPENCER TO TEACH HERE

Six Noted Agricultural Economists to Assist With Credit Courses Here in July

After ten years of research, teaching, and extension work in the field of dairy marketing, Dr. Leland Spencer of Cornell University comes to the University of New Hampshire this summer with six other noted agricultural economists to assist with the credit courses sponsored by the American Institute of Cooperation. The courses are given from July 18 to August 13 and the institute meets for the first time in New England— from August 1 to 6 inclusive.

This professor of marketing at Cornell recently served as research director of the report of the milk commission appointed by the commissioner of health of New York City. His previous important work was a study of the Los Angeles milk market, published by the Giannini foundation of the University of California. Doctor Spencer will teach "Co-operative Milk Marketing" here, giving special attention to the milk-marketing problems in New England markets.

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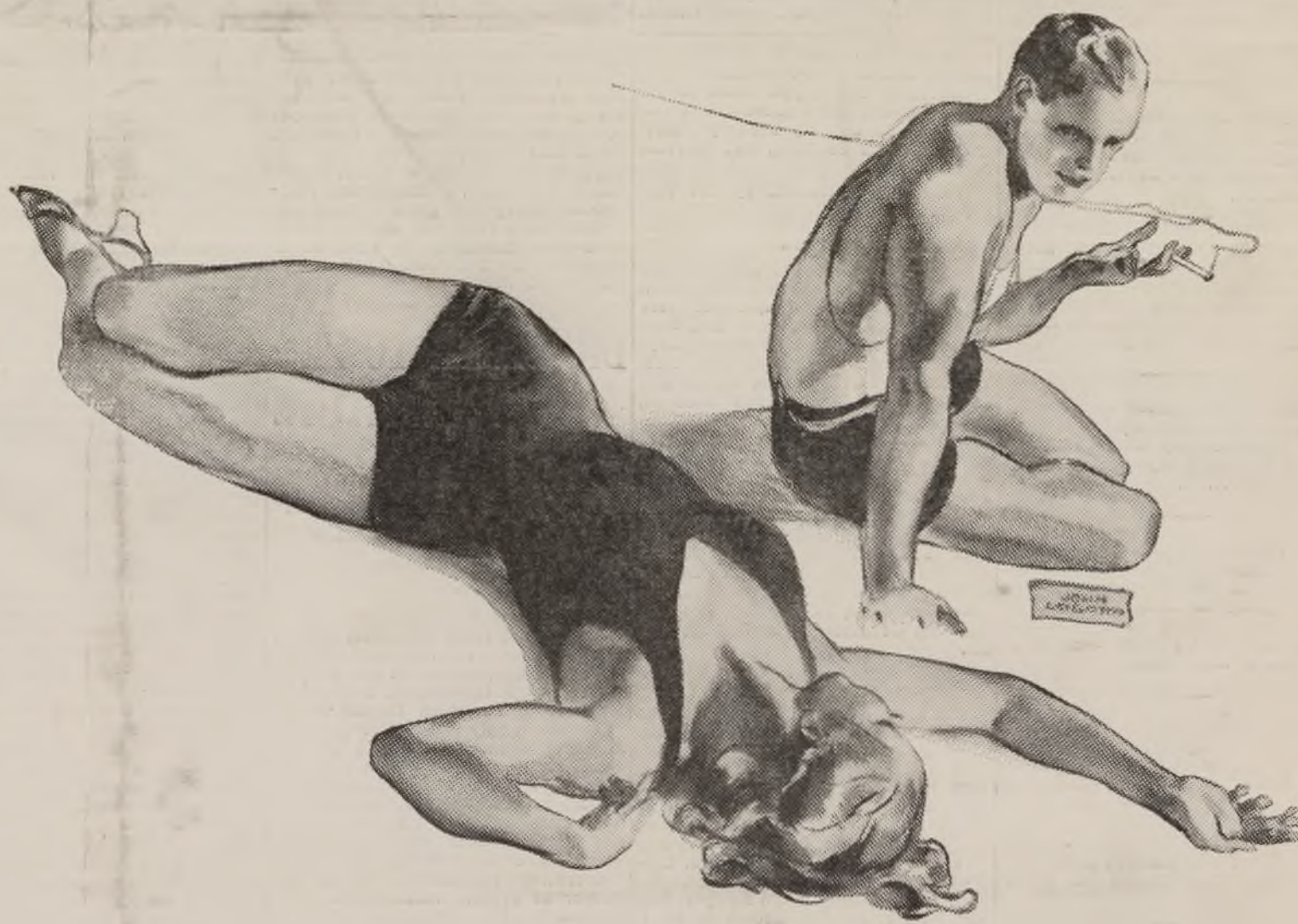
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
