General Rules for 4-H Animal Exhibitors

ENTRY INFORMATION

- How to enter: Enter online at **deerfieldfair.fairentry.com**
- Entry deadline: **Monday, September 5, 2022**
- Deerfield Fair Open Show: See Deerfield Fair website for more information: deerfieldfair.com

ANIMALS

- All animals must be owned or leased by the exhibitor, meet the NH Department of Agriculture's health standards, and be vaccinated for rabies.
- Animals must have been born by June 1 of the current year.
- All exhibitors are expected to check and maintain their individual animals throughout the length of the fair.
- Exhibitors must bring their own feed and containers for water unless otherwise noted.
- As animals are the 4-H'er's project, only 4-H'ers will be permitted to work on animals after they have arrived at the fair. No adult assistance.
- Each exhibitor is limited to two breeds (goats 3 to include grades, and swine 3 to include cross breeds) and only one premium per class for each breed.
- **All group entries must have been shown as individuals.**
- Grade male animals can be shown only in feeder or market classes.
- In NH 4-H shows, where type (breed) classes are stipulated for registered animals, a youth may exhibit a grade female in the show if they own or lease no more than one other eligible animal of that species.

EXHIBITOR ARRIVAL

- Exhibitors need to check in with show superintendents and show Intent to Show forms, lease forms, and original registration papers. Intent to Show and Record of 4-H Lease Forms must be available at all times. No animals other than those listed on both Intent to Show and entry forms may be brought. (Intent to Show forms are no longer required for sheep exhibitors.)
- Health checks will be done. **Any sick animals will be sent home at the discretion of the superintendent.**
- See specific shows for check-in times.
- Exceptions are for school days, and arrangements must be made through the superintendent prior to arrival at the fair.

SHOW PARTICIPATION

- 4-H members are solely responsible for showing and handling their animal(s) in the ring. If a 4-H member receives assistance from another 4-H'er, the owner must be at head of animal.

- All youth must participate in a Fitting & Show class, and that animal must also be exhibited in a type or market class.
- If a youth decides to advance to Junior Fitting & Show division at any time during the show year, they may not go back to showing as a Novice.
- Exhibitors are responsible to know what classes they show in. If a class is missed, it cannot be made up. Any exhibitor who misses Fitting & Show classes may exhibit in type classes but for ribbon only, no premiums will be awarded.
- Classes will be placed according to the Danish System. Judges' decisions are final.
- Direct criticism or interference with judge or fair/show officials before, during, or after the show is prohibited.
- A knowledge quiz may be given during the fair.
- All 4-H project animals are shown at the risk of the 4-H owner/lessor. Any damage to persons or property are the legal and financial responsibility of the 4-H member/family who owns/leases the animals.

CONDUCT AND SUPERVISION

- 4-H members, parents, and leaders shall at all times conduct themselves with honesty and good sportsmanship and treat others with respect, cooperation, and courtesy.
- 4-H members are the sole responsibility of and under direct supervision of parent/guardian or designated adult appointed by parent/guardian during the entire duration of the fair.
- All 4-H exhibitors staying at the fairgrounds overnight must have the parent/ guardian signed permission and name a chaperone over 21 years old, designated by parent(s), who has agreed to be responsible for the 4-H'er.
- Rockingham County 4-H assumes no responsibility for supervision of youth at the fair.

APPEARANCE OF EXHIBITORS

- 4-H'ers must be neatly and cleanly dressed. 4-H attire is white shirt or blouse and skirt or pants that are a solid color in green, khaki, or white, and shoes that are closed at the toe and in the back.
- 4-H'ers must wear numbers provided in the show ring.
- Corporate/farm sponsorship identification is unacceptable at a 4-H show ring.

CAMPER SPACE

- Youth need to be staying in camper units with parents/designated chaperone. No tents allowed.
- Reserve camper space through Deerfield Fair by **September 15**. See Deerfield Fair website for details.

SHOW ENTRY

- All 4-H entries must be completed online through **deerfieldfair.fairentry.com** by **Monday, September 5, 2022**.
- FairEntry is also integrated with 4-H Online. This will allow you to connect your 4-H Online animal intent registration information with FairEntry.

CAMPERS AND PARKING

- **If you have animals that are participating in these events, you are required to provide care and supervision at all times while they are on the grounds, overnight included.** If you will not be staying on the grounds overnight, you are required to make arrangements for another responsible party to supervise your animals; the arrangements must be approved by your superintendent.
- You may reserve camper space by pre-registering with the Deerfield Fair administration office. Refer to camping forms on the Deerfield Fair website. Space for campers must be reserved with Deerfield Fair by **September 15**. No tents allowed.
- Parking in the G Gate area will be in restricted areas by department and will be very limited.
- If you have not prepaid for an outside camper space, you must get a DFA-O sticker from the oxen superintendent to park any vehicles or trailers in this area. Most vehicles will park in the general parking lot. All vehicles/campers must have a DFA-O sticker visible on the windshield or they will be towed.
- **No vehicle can move on the fairgrounds until given permission from fair authorities.**
- Absolutely no vehicles may be parked on the fairgrounds; G Gate is to be used for unloading.

ARRIVAL AND DEPARTURE

- Animals need to arrive on the fairgrounds by 8:00 a.m. on Thursday.
- Exhibitors may not leave until 7:00 p.m. or until dismissed by superintendent on Sunday. Leaving early will result in loss of premiums.

ANIMALS

- **All steers must be vaccinated for rabies** at least 30 days and not more than one year prior to the first day of the fair.
- All steers must originate from non-quarantined Tuberculosis-negative herds.

- Steers housed out-of-state but owned by NH 4-H members must have a NH permit of entry and must conform to all NH regulations in effect for out-of-state cattle crossing into NH.

SHOW

- All classes are judged using the Danish system. Each teamster is awarded a ribbon in each class.
 - A: Blue Ribbon
 - B: Red Ribbon
 - C: White Ribbon

Fitting and Showing

Age Divisions:

- **Senior:** 14–18 years old as of January 1 of the current year
- **Junior:** 9-13 years old as of January 1 of the current year
- **Novice:** 8-13 years old as of January 1 of the current year, and showing for the first time with 4-H

Condition and appearance of team, equipment, and teamster's knowledge of the project will be considered.

Stoneboat Performance

- **Junior and Novice:** Team must pull dead weight, equal to approximately 50 percent of the weight of the team, within a specified time period.
- **Junior and Senior:** Team must pull 70 percent of the weight of the team, within a specified time period.

The course and time limit will be determined by the judge. Gee and haw turns are included. Log Scoot class maybe substituted for Stoneboat Performance at the discretion of the Superintendents.

Obstacle Course—Two-wheeled Cart

Each teamster must hitch their team to a two-wheeled cart and negotiate an obstacle course demonstrating the ability of the cattle to work and the teamster's ability to control their cattle. The specific course and time allotted to complete the course are at the discretion of the judge. Control of the team without unnecessary use of the whip or stick and the attitude of the teamster are considered.
