This yearlong technical support from UMaine and UNH Extension educators is at no charge to you. Once you sign up with the project, we will come to your farm and have a walk-around with you to help identify and prioritize needed food safety modifications. Then, together we will develop a plan to improve food safety and increase the keeping-quality of your fresh produce. We will also help you via phone calls and emails, whatever works for you. After providing this technical support for one year, all, or at least important parts, of your Farm Food Safety Plan could be in place.

Farms of any size can participate. However, we will give priority to small and medium-sized farms to enter the project and receive technical support.
