DURHAM, N.H. -- Suki Kim, author of "The Interpreter," a debut novel that is a unique blend of mystery, immigrant identity, what it means to be Korean-American and female, and translation between opposing worlds, will talk about and read from her work Thursday, April 22, 2004, at 5 p.m. in Hamilton Smith Hall room 127 at the University of New Hampshire.
