Community Leader of the Year winner is Anneliese Fisher, of Newmarket, for her work with the Newmarket Recreation Department. The Community-Supporting Organization of the Year goes to Antioch New England Institute of Keene for its outreach and partnerships with communities across New Hampshire.

Within UNH, senior Anna Boudreau of Dover won Student Community Leader of the Year and the Therapeutic Horseback Riding Program won the UNH Community-Supporting Organization of the Year.
