4-H is committed to providing a welcoming community and an inclusive culture that allows all youth to feel a sense of belonging and to participate fully and safely. Our values include civility and mutual respect among our youth participants. 4-H has very high standards and expectations for conduct. Parents/guardians and participants are responsible for reviewing and agreeing to follow these expectations.

- 1. Be on time and participate fully.
- 2. Be respectful, use good manners, and follow instructions.
- 3. Be honest. We expect integrity.
- 4. Show mutual respect for each other's differences and ideas.
- 5. 4-H events are tobacco, drug, vaping and alcohol-free.
- 6. Youth are expected to use appropriate language.
- 7. Abide by specific program rules and regulations, including all health and safety procedures.
- 8. Treat program areas, lodging areas and transportation vehicles with respect. You will be responsible for any damage, theft, or misconduct in which you participate.
- 9. Dress appropriately for 4-H programs. Follow the dress code if there is one. If you're not sure, ask.
- 10. Conduct that is harmful to the safety and well-being of self or others is not tolerated.
- 11. The possession of fireworks, firearms, knives or any other weapons is not permitted at 4-H events unless specifically approved for the program by the staff or volunteers in charge.
- 12. Live up to your highest expectations for yourself so that you can return home proud of who you are and what you have done.
- 13. 4-H events are free of bullying (including cyberbullying), hazing, and harassment.
- 14. Help all persons in your group feel that they belong by making every attempt to include all participants in all activities.
- 15. Code of Conduct expectations apply to the use of social media before, during and after the event.
- 16. For remote learning activities, participants are expected to refrain from:
  - 1. Taking and/or sharing photos or screenshots of images/videos of classmates or instructors without permission.
  - 2. 'Chatting' privately between classmates or instructors during a group meeting or activity.
  - 3. Publicly sharing login/connection information to a private meeting.
  - 4. Private one-to-one interaction between adults and youth.

## Code of Conduct for 4-H Parent/Guardian/Family Behavior



In 4-H, we promote positive youth development, where we focus on creating safe environments where youth can explore, learn, and grow. To help us achieve these goals for all youth in the program, we ask that parents, guardians, and family members abide by the following Code of Conduct:

- Abide by the policies, guidelines, and rules outlined for 4-H programs, events, activities, and clubs.
- Be respectful of all attendees. Exhibit reasonable and generous behavior. Treat and accept others as you want to be treated before, during, and after all 4-H programs and activities.
- Communicate calmly and positively. The use of abusive and vulgar language is not acceptable. Difficult conversations will need to happen at times, do it respectfully and calmly. Understand that there are many paths to a solution.
- Help create a safe and inclusive environment for youth. The safety of youth is the responsibility of everyone. Actions that put youth at risk or create a hostile environment, such as sexual innuendo, slander, profane language, racial/ethnic slurs, disparaging remarks, or bullying behavior, are unacceptable.
- Maintain an alcohol-free and controlled substance-free 4-H setting. The possession, selling, offering, or using of alcohol or controlled substances is prohibited at 4-H events, programs, activities, and clubs. Attending while under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances is also prohibited.
- Supervise your family and guests. We encourage the involvement of family and guests in our 4-H programs when appropriate. We also expect those that attend to abide by our code of conduct. We ask that during 4-H Club meetings, programs, activities, or events, you be responsible for the direct supervision and behavior management of those attendees. Failure to supervise could result in the loss of privileges to attend future events.

As a parent/guardian/family member, I understand that my failure to abide by this Code of Conduct, or participating in other inappropriate conduct that does not support the goal of creating a positive youth development environment as determined by UNH (University of New Hampshire) Extension representatives, may result in my loss of privilege to attend 4-H programs, events, activities, or clubs, or in extreme cases, my child's exclusion as well (as deemed by the 4-H State Leader).
