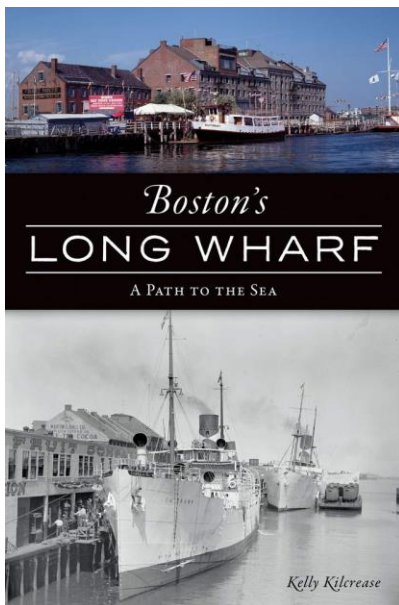


Business Professor Pens New Book
